WESTERN CAROLINA – INDIANA SERIES:

Western Carolina continues its out of conference swing, coming out of final exams for two games in the mid-west, first visiting the nationally-ranked Indiana Hoosiers ... Entering the game, the Hoosiers are ranked 13th in both the AP poll and 14th the Coaches' poll ... It is the first-ever meeting between Western and Indiana on the hardwood in men's basketball – and in any team sport for that matter ... Indiana faced SoCon-member Chattanooga back on Nov. 12 in their season-opener – the Hoosiers closed the game with a 34-to-10 run to pull out the 99-77 victory over the Mocs ... IU is a combined 7-0 all-time against current members of the Southern Conference (*more on the SoCon, see page 8*).

CATAMOUNTS AT HOOSIERS

WESTERN CAROLINA vs. THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE:

Western Carolina is 0-9 lifetime against current members of the Big Ten Conference: Iowa, (0-2); Minnesota, (0-2); Northwestern, (0-1); Penn State, (0-1); Purdue, (0-2); Wisconsin, (0-1) ... After this road trip, including stops in Bloomington, Ind., and Champaign, Ill., WCU will have face eight of the 11 Big Ten members, squaring off against three during the 2004 season (L vs. Penn State, 78-63; L at Iowa, 88-75; L, at Wisconsin 89-49).

CATAMOUNTS VS. HOOSIERS STORYLINES:

* Western Carolina is looking for its first road win of the season ... the Catamounts did down Bowling Green to open the season in a game played on Cincinnati's home court in the Peggy Cronin Classic – otherwise, WCU has fallen at Cincinnati and at Elon ;

* Western will look to snap the fourth-longest home winning streak in NCAA basketball held by the Hoosiers at Assembly Hall ... Two seasons ago (2005-06), in Larry Hunter's first year at the helm, the Catamounts snapped the Davidson Wildcats' 19-game home winning streak, which was the third-longest in the nation at the time, with a 77-70 victory at Belk Arena.

TWO OF NCAA'S WINNINGEST HEAD COACHES SQUARE OFF:

Tonight's game features two very successful collegiate basketball head coaches ... Western Carolina's Larry Hunter enters the game ranked 12th all-time on the active winningest head NCAA basketball coaches chart with 536 victories spanning his 28-year career ... Indiana head coach Kelvin Sampson has 485 career wins to currently rank 18th on the overall chart (*see full chart on page 4*) ... It is the third-time this season that Hunter has faced a fellow coaching adversary that was ranked in the top 20 among active head coaches – WCU lost to Belmont and head coach Rick Byrd (16th, 522 wins) and the Bobby Cremins' led College of Charleston squad (19th, 480 wins).

WESTERN CAROLINA UNIVERSITY – DID YOU KNOW:

* Western Carolina currently is the only school in the Southern Conference to have representation in the Major Leagues, NBA and NFL ... **Jared Burton** is a pitcher for the Cincinnati Reds; **Kevin Martin** plays for the Sacramento Kings; **Brad Hoover** is with the Carolina Panthers and **David Patten** with New Orleans; * Western Carolina's Ronnie Carr hit the first 3-point field goal in NCAA men's basketball history during the 1980-81 season (Nov. 29, 1980) ... WCU defeated Middle Tennessee State, 77-70, at Reid Gym in Cullowhee; * Western Carolina is the home of two current NBA players – Kevin Martin, who left WCU after his junior year after being a first-round pick with Sacramento, averaged over 22.0 ppg as the Kings' starting shooting guard. Also, 2003 lottery pick Jarvis Hayes of the Washington Wizards was the 2000 Southern Conference Freshman of the Year while at Western before transferring to Georgia and playing two years with the Bulldogs;

THIS IS WESTERN CAROLINA UNIVERSITY

WESTERN CAROLINA UNIVERSITY, a regional comprehensive university within the University of North Carolina system, is located on 589 acres in a picturesque valley between the Blue Ridge and Great Smoky mountains in southwestern North Carolina. Western offers career-focused education through nationally accredited programs, as well as abundant opportunities for research and recreation in the nearby mountains.



Western's student enrollment, including 9,000 undergraduate, graduate and online students, is at an all-time high. The university attracts students

from across North Carolina and the United States, and from around the world, with special emphasis on serving the people of Western North Carolina. As a major public resource, Western engages with the region by assisting individuals and agencies through the expertise of its students, faculty and staff.

With a student-faculty ratio of 16-to-1, Western continues its long tradition of offering small class sizes and personal attention from its outstanding faculty. The fully networked campus offers convenient access to computer support, and students are required to have networkable computers. The university offers more than 120 majors and areas of concentration for undergraduates, and graduate students may choose from 51 areas of study at the master's level, as well as pursue doctoral studies in education.

Western's residential Honors College, the first of its kind in the North Carolina system, now enrolls more than 900 students, providing a focused living and learning environment for those seeking advanced academic challenges and more choices for independent study. Honors Scholars are exceptional students who take tutorial classes to prepare for regional and national research projects and compete for national and international scholarships.

Freshmen admitted to Western are automatically considered for available scholarships, based on their academic achievements. The university annually awards \$1 million in merit-based scholarships and more than \$30 million in needs-based aid to students. About half of the university's students receive financial assistance through scholarships, grants, loans or work-study.

Students participate in a wide range of non-academic activities, including clubs and honor societies, community service and volunteer organizations, concerts and performances at various venues on campus, Greek life, student-operated media and student government. The university also sponsors outdoor recreational programs such as hiking, rafting and snow skiing that take advantage of the university's location in one of the nation's most popular vacation areas. Western also offers club sports and intramurals that involve about one-quarter of the student body.

WHAT IS A CATAMOUNT?

Western Carolina University's unique mascot and nickname for its athletics teams seem to always bring about the same question when the Western plays on the road ... "What is a Catamount?" Webster's Dictionary defines "catamount" as "any of various wild cats, such as a cougar or lynx." Cats of the catamount variety, including the bobcat, roam the southern Appalachian Mountains where Western Carolina University is located.

The nickname evolved from a contest that was held on the Cullowhee campus in 1933. The school was called Western Carolina Teachers College at that time and its teams were known as "the Teachers."

Everyone on campus was invited to participate, and the usual names were suggested — Bears, Indians, Panthers. However, the college wanted an unusual name; a name that few others had and that everyone would not copy.

The contest came down to Mountain Boomers, a small ground squirrel that scampers about the woods and is extremely difficult to catch, and Catamounts. Catamounts was the favorite of Head Football Coach C.C. Poindexter and was the nickname chosen. Poindexter wanted his players to be Catamounts with "fierce spirit, savage attacks, and lightning quick moves."

Western Carolina University is the only football-playing school in the nation using the nickname, "Catamounts," with the University of Vermont in Burlington, VT, being the only other school playing under that moniker.

MEDIA INFORMATION

INTERVIEW POLICY

Head Coach Larry Hunter is available to meet with members of the media prior to or following each practice session. WCU practices are open to the media, but advance notice regarding your attendance is required. WCU assistant coaches and players may also be requested before or following most practices, however, please inform the media relations office at least 24 hours in advance. Those covering practice are asked to use discretion in reporting practice in areas such as plays, formations and injuries. Also, all dialog between coaches and players is considered confidential.

For photographers, like a game, no tripods may be used and photographers are asked to stay off the court.

WCU BASKETBALL PLAYERS AND ASSISTANT COACHES ARE NOT AVAILABLE FOR INTERVIEWS ON GAME DAYS UNLESS PERMISSION IS GRANTED WELL IN ADVANCE. THE DEADLINE TO ARRANGE INTERVIEWS WITH PLAYERS AND ASSISTANT COACHES IS 24 HOURS PRIOR TO TIP-OFF OF THE NEXT GAME. HEAD COACH LARRY HUNTER WILL ONLY DO INTERVIEWS WITH OPPOSING RADIO THE DAY OF A GAME IF PERMISSION IS GRANTED WELL IN ADVANCE.



DROPPING BACK – WCU DOWNS NC CENTRAL, 84-64

Cullowhee, N.C. - Freshman point guard **Michael Porrini** equaled his previous career best in the first 20 minutes of play, finishing the game with a career-high 17 points as Western Carolina cruised to a 20-point, 84-64, victory over the feisty North Carolina Central Eagles last Wednesday night in non-conference action at the Ramsey Center ... Porrini scored 15 points in 17 minutes of action in the first half and established a new benchmark on a slicing drive and lay-in with six minutes remaining in the game to pace three Catamounts in double figures. His front court classmate, **Blake Gallagher**, tied his career-high for the second-straight game with 11 points while posting his first collegiate double-double with 12 boards in the win ... Coming off a career-high 32 points, sophomore **Brandon Giles** posted his third-straight double-digit performance tallying 10 to round out WCU's double-digit scorers. **Brigham Waginger** just missed double figures with nine points and three steals.

MORE FROM THE NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL GAME:

* Three Catamounts tied or set career-highs in the win over the Eagles – **Michael Porrini** tied his career-high in the first half and surpassed it with 17 points on the night ... **Blake Gallagher** tied his career-high, posting his first career double-double with 11 points and 12 boards ... **Tim Magowan** set his career-best with four points including his first career 3-pointer;

* Western made a season-high 16 free throws on a season-best 28 attempts;

THE RAMSEY CENTER – HOME SWEET HOME:

In four home games thus far this season, WCU is averaging 82 points per game, thrice eclipsing the 80-point barrier including a season-high 87 points against Methodist back on Nov. 14 ... At home, Western is shooting 44.8-percent from the field and 37.6-percent from beyond the 3-point arc – conversely, away from Cullowhee, including games played on neutral floor, the Catamounts are only averaging 61.5 points on 36-percent shooting from the field.

FLASHBACK TO THE 2005-06 SEASON:

Western entered the NC Central game with an overall record of 2-5, equaling their start from Larry Hunter's first season at the helm in 2005-06 ... that '05-06 squad went on to win five of its next six games and ended the season with 13 wins, the most for Hunter since coming to WCU (the Catamounts went 11-20 in Hunter's second season) ... WCU improved to 3-5, winning its first game after the similar start.

CATAMOUNT KITTENS LEADING THE WAY:

The Catamounts' current top five scorers are all underclassmen – three sophomores and two freshmen ... WCU is led by freshman point guard **Michael Porrini**, who has posted seven-straight, double-digit scoring outings – scoring in double-figures in all but one of his career games thus far ... Porrini's six-straight double figure scoring performances is currently the longest on the team ... sophomore **Brandon Giles**, who has three-straight, double-digit scoring outings

including his career-high 32 points against the College of Charleston, has also led WCU in scoring this season.

MORE ON DIAPER DANDY, MICHAEL PORRINI:

In addition to leading the team in scoring, Porrini ranks second on the team in rebounding – as a guard – with six boards per game ... the Massillon, Ohio, native also leads the team with 4.13 assists per game to rank fourth in the Southern Conference, while also averaging 2.38 steals per game to lead the SoCon and rank 52nd in the NCAA ... Porrini is one of the **top candidates for SoCon Freshman of the Year** honors.

NICK ALDRIDGE LEAVES CATAMOUNT PROGRAM:

Western will be without the services of sophomore Nick Aldridge who left the program prior to WCU's SoCon opener on the road at Elon ... WCU head coach **Larry Hunter** addressed the situation with the following statement: "Nick Aldridge has made a decision to no longer be a part of our basketball program. Nick had some issues that we felt were being detrimental to the development of our team and we have for some time been trying to help him work through these issues. He has chosen not to work with us any longer. Bottom line is he has quit our team. We are moving forward as a team and program."

Aldridge was an All-Southern Conference performer who had been leading the team this season with an 18.8 points per game scoring average, ranked second in the SoCon ... He also had posted 25-straight double-digit scoring outings.

TRACKING WCU'S CAREER 3-POINT CHARTS:

Western Carolina sophomore Jake Robinson made 64 3-pointers during his rookie season, which was tied for seventh on the WCU single-season chart ... He entered this season just 30 made treys shy of 10th place on the career 3-pointers made list – with 18 3-pointers on the year, **stands just 14 shy** of tying for 10th-place ... senior **Negus McKenna** entered the year with 94 made 3-pointers and has three this season to rest two shy of tying – and three from taking sole possession of – 10th all-time:

CATAMOUNTS CRYING FOUL:

With Western Carolina's youth this season come some growing pains ... Entering the weekend, WCU has been whistled for 175 fouls – with six disqualifications – while its opponents have only been flagged 136 times, with three players having fouled out ... WCU ranks 293 out of 328 NCAA Division I teams in terms of fouls per game (21.88) ... WCU's opponents have made more free throws (140) than they have attempted (136).

CATAMOUNTS TIE SCHOOL, FACILITY RECORD FOR 3'S:

Western Carolina tied both a school and a WCU Ramsey Center record with 15 made 3-pointers on a record 34 attempts

Catamount Basketball Signs Explosive Wing, Harouna Mutombo

On October 26, Western Carolina head men's basketball coach Larry Hunter announced the signing of 6-4, 190-lbs., wing **Harouna Mutombo** (pronounced HUH-roon-uh Ma-TUM-bow) to a National Letter of Intent.

"Harouna is an outstanding athlete and an exceptionally skilled basketball player," said Hunter, who begins his third season at WCU. "He is powerfully built, quick and explosive and is a terrific shooter with range. He has the ability to make others better, as well as create his own shots. Harouna is very passionate about working and competing at the game."

Mutombo, who will skip his final year of high school eligibility in Ontario, **will enroll at Western this December, but will take a red-shirt** and will practice with the team but not compete this season.

"While he is eligible to compete immediately, we have decided to red-shirt him the second semester so he will have four full years to play in our program," Hunter said.

A native of Pickering, Ontario, Canada, Mutombo helped lead Pickering HS to the gold medal at the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations (OFSAA) AAAA provincial championships. He will be the fourth Canadian-born player to play for the Catamounts since 2001 joining Rans Brempong (2001-05), Corey Muirhead (2003-06) and current Catamount, Negus McKenna.

This past summer, he played with the Toronto Mission AAU team in both Las Vegas, Nev., and Indianapolis, Ind. Additionally, he played in the Nike Global Challenge in Portland, Ore., with Team Canada. In August at the Nike Top 20 Camp held in Toronto, Mutombo was labeled as one of the top 20 players in the country.

In an article published on HoopstarsCanada.com, Mutombo cited the chance to play in the Southern Conference for Coach Hunter and that Western Carolina's Business Entrepreneurship program - his chosen field of study - was top-ranked by Fortune Magazine as reasons he chose WCU.

Last season, WCU set the benchmark when it connected on 15-of-32 in a home win over Atlanta Christian ... the record-breaking performance came **exactly one-year to the date – on Nov. 20, 2006** – the Catamounts also attempted 34 against conference-foe, Chattanooga, on Feb. 12 ... Davidson holds the Ramsey Center record for made treys in a game with 16 last season.

MORE FROM DOWNTOWN:

Western Carolina – which is the home of the 3-point shot since Ronnie Carr's fateful offering in 1980 – has made at least three 3-pointers in a game this season ... the most it has made were the 15 against UNCA with the lowest total coming at Elon with just three ... WCU is averaging 8.3 treys per game.

LOOKING AHEAD FOR WESTERN CAROLINA:

Following tonight's road game at Indiana, Western will continue its four-straight, non-conference games with a trip to Champaign and a date with Illinois on Monday, Dec. 17 ... the Catamounts return home on Dec. 27, just after the Christmas holiday to host Presbyterian before visiting N.C. State at the RBC Center in Raleigh on Saturday, Dec. 29.

WCU GOES 1-2 AT PEGGY CRONIN CLASSIC:

Western Carolina opened its 2007-08 season in tournament action in Cincinnati, Ohio ... WCU earned its third-straight season opening victory under head coach Larry Hunter, downing Bowling Green for the second time in three seasons to start the campaign ... Hunter's first win at WCU was also over BGSU two years ago in Blacksburg, Va. ... Western took tournament host, the Cincinnati Bearcats, down to the wire before falling by two on a last second shot ... In a battle of two,

500-win coaches – Western's Larry Hunter (533) and Belmont's Rick Byrd (516) – the Catamounts were edged by the Belmont Bruins, 79-70 ... WCU trailed by as many as 17 in the first half, but rallied in the second, using back-to-back Brandon Giles 3-pointers to take a four-point lead ... WCU led by as many as five in the second before the Bruins used the three-ball to rally.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS AT THE PEGGY CRONIN CLASSIC:

Through the three-game weekend tournament, Western Carolina held a three rebound per game advantage over its opposition, 116-107 ... WCU averaged right at 39 rebounds per outing, including 15.7 offensive boards and 23 defensive rebounds per game ... Against the teams it played in the tournament, Western averaged 8.3 3-pointers per game on 37-percent shooting from beyond the arc – conversely, WCU's opponents only averaged 6.7 treys per game, shooting under 30-percent from long range.

Western Carolina Signs Guard Keaton Cole on Early Signing Day

Western Carolina head men's basketball coach Larry Hunter announced the signing of **Keaton Cole** to a National Letter of Intent during today's early signing period. Cole is a 5-10, 170-pound guard from Toronto, Ontario, Canada and will join the Catamount roster next fall.

Cole is the second Canadian to sign to play for Hunter's Catamounts next season joining 6-4 wing, Haruona Mutombo, out of Pickering, Ontario who signed with Western in late October and will join the squad after exams in December but red-shirt the remainder of this season. In addition to Mutombo, Cole will be the fifth Canadian-born player to play for the Catamounts since 2001 joining Rans Brempong (2001-05), Corey Muirhead (2003-06) and current Catamount, Negus McKenna.

Last season, Cole averaged 12 points and six assists per game for Eastern Commerce Collegiate Institute helping lead head coach Roy Rena's squad to a 36-3 overall record. He was also the tournament MVP at the Humber College Classic, scoring 29 points in the finals.

Listed as one of the top point guards in Ontario by HoopTownGTA.com, Cole was also a member of the 19-and-under Canadian National Team that competed in the World Championships this past summer in Serbia. Team Canada finished 10th overall with wins over China, Nicaragua and South Korea. He was additional the MVP at the 17-and-under 2007 National Championships last summer, leading Ontario to the gold medal making his third-straight gold medal appearance, doing so with the 2004 and '05 under 17 provincial teams as well.

championship ... Rounding out WCU's returning class are backup point guard **Brigham Wagering**, who is a floor general and takes great care of the basketball, and **Brandon Giles** who was one of the most improved players at the end of last season as an athletic swing player who can handle the ball and has size for posting.

Western has a highly touted incoming class with four freshmen and a junior transfer ... guard **Michael Porrini** is the favorite to start at the point, with athletic forward **Camden Miller** expected to see time as a swing man ... Rookie posts **Richie Gordon** and **Blake Gallagher** will be leaned upon for rebounding ... Junior **Tim Magowan** is a solid guard with a solid touch shooting from the perimeter.

WCU employs a "Princeton style" offense that focuses on movement, precision passing and cuts ... but don't let the moniker "Princeton style" offense fool you – the Catamounts will look to push the basketball up the floor to get buckets in transition, as well as to establish its offensive set before the defense is fully in place in the half court flow.

CATAMOUNTS SPEND LABOR DAY IN COSTA RICA:

Hunter's Catamounts spent their Labor Day weekend with 10 days of practice in late August and were rewarded with a four-day holiday jaunt to Costa Rica, defeating two of that country's national teams – defeating two-time Costa Rican champion, Liceo, 85-36, and Goicoechea, 94-59 ... **Arnold Gore** posted a team-high 20 points in the first game, with freshman **Michael Porrini** leading the team in the second outing with 18 points ... the trip was not all work as the team took a rainforest canopy tour, gliding along zip lines from platform-to-platform to gain a unique view of the vegetation and wildlife in the region ... Hunter used the trip to not only garner early preseason practices, but to also foster team bonding and creating a sense of family with the new players.

WCU TABBED THIRD IN SoCon's NORTH DIVISION:

Western Carolina was **tabbed third in the Southern Conference's North Division** by both the league's 11 head coaches and the voting members of the SoCon Sports Media Association (SCSMA) ... it is the highest preseason prediction for the Catamounts under Larry Hunter after being tabbed fifth in the division each of the past two seasons only to finish third each time ... UNC Greensboro was the favorite picked in the North while Davidson, which is among those receiving votes and ranked 33rd in the preseason AP media poll, was favored to win the South Division title.

CATS SET SCHOOL RECORDS FOR 3'S UNDER HUNTER

In each of Larry Hunter's first two seasons in Cullowhee, the Catamounts have rewritten the school's record books for 3-pointers made ... In his first season, Western Carolina had a record-setting season last year in terms of shooting the 3-pointer. Early last season, in a 105-40 victory over Atlanta Christian, **Western tied both a school and Ramsey Center record by draining 15 treys on 39 attempts**, a standard that had just been set the season prior in a win over Chattanooga.

In 2005-06, Western set school record for 3-pointers made (221), 3-pointers attempted (625) and 3-pointers made per game (7.36) last season. Last year, the Catamounts rewrote the record book with **226 made treys, 699 total attempts**, but just fell short of the 3-pointers made per game record draining an average of 7.29 per contest last season.

Of course, Western Carolina is the birthplace of the 3-point shot as on Nov. 29, 1980, Catamount-great Ronnie Carr drained the first official 3-pointer in NCAA history. The historic shot came in Reid Gymnasium at the 16:09 mark of the first half of a 77-70 Western victory over Middle Tennessee State.

SoCon MOVES TO 20-GAME CONFERENCE SCHEDULE:

The Southern Conference coaches and athletic directors voted to keep the two divisions, North and South, in men's basketball – however, still with an odd number of teams until Samford joins the league next year, they voted to even the playing field by having every team play a home-and-home with the conference schools ... the result is a 20-game conference schedule this season as every team, regardless of division, will play the other.

LARRY HUNTER GRANTED TWO-YEAR EXTENSION:

In early June 2007, the Western Carolina University Board of Trustees approved multi-year contract extensions for both of the University's head basketball coaches, Larry Hunter and Kellie Harper. The board approved a two-year contract extension for **Larry Hunter**, head coach of the men's Catamount basketball team since April 2005. Hunter's employment agreement is extended through April, 2012.

His Catamounts won their first Southern Conference tournament game in five years this past season, and he is bringing in a recruiting class of five players to join a squad that includes All-Southern Conference selection Nick Aldridge.

Harper was granted a three-year extension that also agrees to employ through April, 2012.

WESTERN CAROLINA HEAD COACH LARRY HUNTER



LARRY HUNTER

Larry Hunter, one of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) leaders in coaching victories, was named Western Carolina University's 17th head men's basketball coach all time on April 29, 2005. His impact was felt immediately. Known for his offensive prowess, Hunter brought an up-tempo offense to Cullowhee and the Catamounts responded by making a school-record 221 3-pointers – and then surpassing that benchmark one season later with 226 made treys during last season.

Hunter, whose teams posted winning records in 23 of his 27 seasons as a head coach, enters the 2007-08 season boasting an overall record of 533-261 and currently ranks as the 12th winningest active coach in the country. He additionally ranks 58th on the NCAA Division I all-time head coaching victories list and is 97th on the NCAA all-division list for head coaching victories. During his time as a head coach, Hunter has made 11 overall NCAA tournament appearances, while making seven as an assistant coach.

While his first year at Western was just his third losing season as a head coach, posting a 13-17 mark, Hunter's inaugural season with the Catamounts saw many positives. Western nearly doubled its win total from the previous season. Also, its 7-7 record and third place finish in the SoCon North was its best in the league since posting the same record for the 1996-97 season, while placing second that season. Key wins in his first season included: a win over Bowling Green in the season opener — WCU's first season opening win over an NCAA Division I team since defeating Georgia Tech to start the 1980-81 season; a win over Chattanooga — snapping an eight-game losing streak to the Mocs; a win at Davidson — snapping Davidson's 19-game home winning streak which was the third longest in the NCAA at the time; and defeating SoCon North Champion Elon late in the season — setting up a battle for a first-round bye at the league tournament.

Early indications are that Hunter will keep the Catamounts going in the right direction as nationally respected Dave Telep of Scout.com tabbed Hunter's first full set of newcomers as "the best recruiting class in the Southern Conference." One year later, the web site boasted, "Hunter's at it again" with reference to the 2007-08 incoming class.

Hunter came to Western Carolina after four years as an assistant coach at North Carolina State, the final three serving as associate head coach. In his first season at N.C. State (2002), the Wolfpack reached the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) championship game and received their first NCAA Championship bid since 1991. N.C. State would go on to reach at least the ACC Tournament semifinals in each of the last three years as well as receiving bids to the NCAA Championship. In 2004, Hunter

coached Julius Hodge, who was tabbed ACC Player of the Year and consensus All-America. This past season, the Wolfpack made an impressive run at season's end and defeated defending NCAA Champion Connecticut to reach the Sweet 16. N.C. State was just one of 21 teams in the nation to play in the NCAA Championship in each of the last four years.

Hunter spent 12 years (1989-2001) as head coach at Ohio University prior to his stint in Raleigh. Five years after taking over the Bobcat basketball program (1993-94), he led Ohio to a 25-8 record and was tabbed the Mid-American Conference (MAC) Coach of the Year, winning both the league's regular season and tournament titles. The following year, the Bobcats won the preseason National Invitation Tournament (NIT), went 24-10 and reached the second round of the postseason NIT. At Ohio, he coached 16 All-MAC performers and four first-team Academic All-MAC selections. Among those standout players were Player of the Year honorees Dave Jamerson (1990), Gary Trent (1993, '94 and '95) and Brandon Hunter (2003). Trent additionally earned MAC Freshman of the Year honors in 1993, duplicating the feat of Rush Floyd in 1991 during his freshman campaign with the Bobcats.

Jamerson set a MAC record with 874 points in 1990 while taking home first team Academic All-America honors that season. Later in 1990, Jamerson was an National Basketball Association (NBA) first round selection (15th pick overall) by Miami. Trent, a third team Associated Press All-America in 1995, would leave Ohio after his junior season to become a NBA first round selection (11th overall pick) of the Milwaukee Bucks. Brandon Hunter also moved on to play professionally, being an NBA second-round pick in 2003 and currently playing for the Orlando Magic. Jamerson (third with 2,336), Trent (seventh with 2,108) and Brandon Hunter (11th with 2,012) all rank among the MAC's top 11 in scoring, while Brandon Hunter and Trent rank fifth (1,103) and ninth (1,050), respectively, on the MAC's career rebounding list.

Thirty of the 38 players he coached at Ohio who completed their eligibility there graduated, including 12 who went on to earn their Master's degrees, posting an overall graduation rate as a head coach of 85 percent. In his last season at Ohio, the Bobcats were 19-11, with a 12-6 mark in MAC competition, and his overall record with the Bobcats was 204-148.

After winning his 500th career game as a collegiate head coach (Jan. 23, 2001), Hunter said, "My approach has been simple: Arrive early, work late and chop wood all day long. I've been fortunate to be surrounded by some great people and I've worked at two great institutions, Wittenberg and Ohio. Add all those things together over 20 years and you start to have a small pile of wood."

From 1976-89, Hunter was the head coach at Wittenberg University, playing a key role in the school being the winningest NCAA Division III basketball program in terms of victories and percentage. Hunter made an immediate impact after taking over the helm, winning National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) National Coach of the Year honors in 1977 after becoming the first coach in NCAA history to win a national championship in his first season at a school. During his 13 years in that position, his team turned in a 305-76 record and made four NCAA Division III Final Four appearances (national title in 1977, national runner-up in 1983 and third place in 1980 and 1987).

He coached three national players of the year at Wittenberg, including Tyrone Curtis (1981), Tim Casey (1985) and Brad Baldrige (1991), as well as having 21 all-conference honors bestowed upon his players. In addition to coaching those national players of the year, four of Wittenberg's top five career scorers were coached by Hunter, including the school's all-time leader Steve Iannarino (1,973). Hunter won a total of 12 Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) titles, six regular-season championships and six tournament championships. For his success, Hunter was inducted into the Wittenberg University Hall of Honor in 1996 and received the school's Honorary Alumnus Award in 1997.

Hunter, who got his start in coaching as an assistant coach at Marietta College from 1971-73, graduated from Ohio in 1971 with a B.S. in Education, majoring Social Studies Comprehensive. He earned his Master of Science in Physical Education from Ohio in 1973, then spent three seasons (1973-76) as an assistant coach at Wittenberg. He got his first taste of postseason play while serving on the Wittenberg staff, reaching the NCAA Division III championship game in 1976.

In addition to his coaching resume, Hunter produced a basketball instructional video, "Drills, Skills and Moves: Post Play Moves & Drills."

Hunter is married to the former Mary Kay Friedrich of London, Ohio.

WITTENBERG UNIVERSITY NOTES:

- Hunter played a key role in Wittenberg becoming the winningest NCAA Division III basketball program in terms of victories and percentage.
- Four of Wittenberg's top five scorers played for Hunter, including all-time leader Steve Iannarino (1,973).
- Had 21 all-conference honors bestowed upon his players during his 13 years.
- Recruited Brad Baldrige and coached him for his first two years. Baldrige went on to be named NCAA Division III Player of the Year in 1991.

OHIO NOTES:

- Three of the top 11 scorers in MAC history played for Hunter, including Dave Jamerson (3rd with 2,336); Gary Trent (7th with 2,108) and Brandon Hunter (11th with 2,012). Hunter (1,103) and Trent (1,050) rank fifth and ninth, respectively, on the MAC career rebounds list.

- Jamerson was an NBA first round pick and played three years in the NBA. Trent was an NBA first round pick and played nine years in the NBA. B. Hunter was a second round NBA pick in 2003 and played three years in the league.

THIS IS THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE



The Southern Conference, which enters its 87th season of intercollegiate competition in 2007, has become known as one of the nation's leaders in emphasizing the development of the student-athlete and defining the league's role in helping to build lifelong leaders and role models.

The Southern Conference has excelled as the premier NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) conference since earning that classification in 1981. The Conference currently consists of 11 members in four states throughout the Southeast and sponsors 19 varsity sports and championships that produce participants for NCAA Division I Championships.

The Southern Conference is the nation's fifth-oldest NCAA Division I collegiate athletic association. Only the Big Ten (1896), the Missouri Valley (1907), the Pacific 10 (1915) and the Southwestern Athletic (1920) conferences are older in terms of origination.

Throughout its history, the Southern Conference has been an innovator in college athletics. The SoCon was the first "super conference" with its charter membership including the likes of Alabama, Auburn, and North Carolina. The SoCon, as it has come to be known by headline writers throughout the country, is the league that gave birth to the three-point shot in college basketball at Western Carolina University, and was the college home of such sporting greats as Arnold Palmer, Jerry West and Charlie "Choo Choo" Justice.

Academic excellence has been a major part of the Southern Conference's tradition. League athletes have been recognized countless times on Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-America and district teams. A total of 19 Rhodes-Scholarship winners have been selected from the conference.

MEMBERSHIP HISTORY

The Southern Conference was formed on February 25, 1921 at a meeting in Atlanta, Ga. Fourteen institutions from the 30-member Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association (SIAA) reorganized as the Southern Conference. Those charter members included Alabama, Auburn, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi State, North Carolina, North Carolina State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Washington & Lee. Athletic competition began in the fall of 1921.

In 1922, six more schools - Florida, Louisiana State, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tulane and Vanderbilt - joined the fold. A year later, the University of the South joined the ranks. Virginia Military Institute became a member in 1925 and Duke University came into the fold in 1929. Since then, conference membership has experienced a series of membership changes with 42 institutions having been affiliated with the league. The league has undergone two major transitions during its history.

The first occurred in December 1932 when the Southeastern Conference was formed out of the 23-school Southern Conference. The league's 13 members west and south of the Appalachian Mountains reorganized to help reduce the extensive travel demands that were present in the league at the time. In 1936, the Southern Conference invited The Citadel, William & Mary, Davidson, Furman, Richmond and Wake Forest to join the membership.

The second major shift happened in 1953 when Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest officially withdrew from the league to form the Atlantic Coast Conference. This change was brought about due to the desire of many of those schools to schedule a greater number of regular season basketball games against their local rivals.

Today, the league continues to thrive with a 11-school membership that spans four Southeastern states.

Current league members are Appalachian State, College of Charleston, The Citadel, Davidson, Elon, Furman, Georgia Southern, UNC Greensboro, Chattanooga, **Western Carolina** and Wofford. The most recent addition, Elon University, joined the Southern Conference on July 1, 2003. The Phoenix replaced Virginia Military Institute which left the conference on June 30, 2003. East Tennessee State, which joined the SoCon in 1978, left the conference following the conclusion of the 2004-05 academic year.

CHAMPIONSHIPS HISTORY

The first Southern Conference Championship was the league basketball tournament held in Atlanta in 1922.

The North Carolina Tar Heels won the tournament to become the first recognized league champion in any sport. The Southern Conference Tournament remains the oldest of its kind in college basketball.

The Southern Conference began sponsoring women's sports during the 1983-84 season. That year, volleyball, basketball and tennis championships were held in the league. Cross country joined the mix in 1985 and the league began holding indoor and outdoor track championships in 1988. Most recently, the conference instituted golf and softball championships in the spring of 1994 and added soccer in the fall of 1994.

The Southern Conference currently declares champions in 10 men's sports - football, soccer, cross country, basketball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, baseball, tennis and golf - and nine women's sports - soccer, volleyball, cross country, basketball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis, golf and softball.

Women's sports are relatively young in the league's history. In 1992-93, the Southern Conference celebrated its 10th Anniversary of women's athletics. Furman golfer Dottie Pepper was named the SoCon Women's Athlete-of-the-Decade in conjunction with that event. Appalachian State's Mary Jayne Harrelson won the NCAA Outdoor title at 1500 meters in 1999 and 2001. Most recently, Furman's Brandi Jackson won the NCAA Women's Golf East Regional in the spring of 2003.

Freshman **Camden Miller** scored off a fastbreak alley-oop, and Aldridge had a driving layup off a spin move for a 51-45 lead midway through the second half. Bowling Green's Nate Miller made a layup and a pair of free throws that tied it at 55 with 3:27 to go.

Consecutive 3-pointers by Waginger and **Jake Robinson** put the Catamounts ahead to stay. Arnold Gore's two free throws with 19.1 seconds left made it 63-60, and Hamblet missed a pair of 3-point shots - the last one off an offensive rebound - in the closing seconds.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Playing its fourth game in six days, Western Carolina overcame early struggles with a strong second half run to build a double-digit lead, and then held off the feisty Methodist University Monarchs for an 87-76 victory in the 2007-08 home opener in the Ramsey Center.

WCU snapped its two-game losing skid to move to 2-2 on the young season, while also improving its record to 15-6 in home openers since moving into Ramsey in the 1986-87 season.

Sophomore Nick Aldridge posted his 24th-consecutive double figure scoring night with a game-high 22 points to lead the Catamounts. The South Webster, Ohio, native added five rebounds, four assists, three blocked shots and three steals in 29 minutes of action. Freshman guard **Michael Porrini** finished with his first career double-double tallying 15 points and 10 rebounds, just missing the triple-double with a career-best seven assists and four steals. Rounding out WCU's double-digit scorers was sophomore **Brandon Giles** with 13 points and four assists.

Using a 9-2 run midway through the first half, Methodist staked itself to a seven-point, 19-12 lead on one five Billy McDade 3-pointers. However, the Catamounts rallied over the next two minutes to reclaim the advantage with eight unanswered points, going inside for four points from Aldridge, a Porrini jumper and a dunk by freshman **Richie Gordon**.

Tied at 26, a 7-0 spurt by the Catamounts marked the sixth lead change of the opening stanza and gave WCU its largest lead of the half, matching the Monarchs' largest advantage at 33-26. Methodist was able to trim Western's advantage to three at the break, 35-32.

In the second half, Western was able to balloon its lead to a game-high 20 points, 74-54, with just under seven minutes remaining on the Ramsey Center clock. However, the Monarchs, who drained a total of 10 3-pointers on the night, chipped away and even cut it to single-digits, 85-76, on a pair of Eric Thomas free throws with 1:24 remaining. Yet, the Catamount defense helped preserve the win forcing five missed shots and a pair of turnovers inside the closing seconds for the final, 87-76, tally.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Trailing by a game-high 18 points with just less than seven minutes remaining on the clock, Western Carolina drained five-consecutive 3-pointers as a part of a 15-1 run to slice mountain-rival UNC Asheville's lead to just four, 70-66, with three minutes to play. However, the rally fell just short as the Catamounts only connected on two of their final seven field goals while the Bulldogs made 9-of-10 from the free throw line to outscore WCU, 13-7, down the stretch in an 83-73 loss at the Ramsey Center.

The loss is Western's first at home in the series since 2001 and also snaps its two-game winning streak over the 'Dogs. UNCA remained perfect on the season moving to 5-0 for the first-time ever in school history. The Bulldogs also earned their first point in this season's 2nd Annual Parkway Series to trail 4-1.

Sophomore **Jake Robinson** found his stroke from long-range in the second half, connecting on five of his game-high six 3-pointers after intermission to lead the Catamounts with 19 points. Front court classmate Nick Aldridge stretched his consecutive double-figure scoring outings to 25 with his fifth-straight double-digit performance of the season finishing with 13 points and a team-high eight rebounds. Freshman **Michael Porrini**, who was saddled with early foul trouble, rounded out WCU's leading scorers with 12 points and three assists.

Western held one lead in the game as Porrini stripped Bulldog senior point guard K.J. Garland and raced in for a lay-up one minute in for the early, 2-0, advantage. However, the Bulldogs responded with a 14-0 run, including three 3-pointers, to grab a 14-2 lead they would never relinquish. The first half deficit for WCU ballooned to as many as 14 with four and a half minutes to play before the break and was sustained at 11, 44-33, at intermission.

Aided by Robinson's six triples, Western tied both a school and a WCU Ramsey Center record with 15 made 3-pointers on a record 34 attempts. WCU connected on 15-of-32 last year against Atlanta Christian exactly one-year to the date and attempted 34 against conference-foe, Chattanooga, on Feb. 12.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Freshman point guard **Michael Porrini** equaled his previous career best in the first 20 minutes of play, finishing the game with a career-high 17 points as Western Carolina cruised to a 20-point, 84-64, victory over the North Carolina Central Eagles in non-conference action at the Ramsey Center.

Porrini scored 15 points in 17 minutes of action in the first half and established a new benchmark on a slicing drive and lay-in with six minutes remaining in the game to pace three Catamounts in double figures. His front court classmate, **Blake Gallagher**, tied his career-high for the second-straight game with 11 points while posting his first collegiate double-double with 12 boards in the win.

Coming off a career-high 32 points, sophomore **Brandon Giles** posted his third-straight double-digit performance tallying 10 to round out WCU's double-digit scorers. **Brigham Waginger** just missed double figures with nine points and three steals.

Western (3-5) started out well the Catamounts' first four baskets of the game came from behind the 3-point arc. Sophomore **Jake Robinson** scored six of his nine points on the night within the opening four minutes, with Porrini sinking the other two treys as WCU rallied from down two, 5-3, to take the lead for good, 6-5, at the 16:40 mark of the first half.

The Catamounts outscored the Eagles 20-to-7 over the final eight minutes of the half after NCCU had trimmed the WCU advantage to just one, 21-20, to lead at the break by 14, 41-27.

Out of halftime, WCU continued to stretch its lead with junior transfer **Tim Magowan** connecting on his first field goal as a Catamount with a 3-pointer that ballooned the advantage to a game-high 28 with 9:20 remaining in the game. Magowan finished with four points in his first substantial action of the year.

N.C. Central continued to battle, however, and trimmed the lead back into the teens with three-unanswered baskets to pull within 17, 75-58. Yet, WCU used a dunk by **Camden Miller** and two field goals by **Negus McKenna** to push the lead back in to the 20s, ending at 84-64.
