#### A WESTERN WIN WOULD...

- Give the Catamounts their second victory of the season and first win in SoCon play since blanking the Wofford Terriers, 24-0, in Cullowhee in 2005;
- End a string of 14-straight losses in SoCon play;
- Tie Kent Briggs with Bill Bleil for 5th on WCU's all-time career-wins chart for head coaches (23);
- Be the Catamounts' second-straight home win in the series over Furman since drubbing the second-ranked Paladins, 41-21, two seasons ago.

#### A WESTERN LOSS WOULD...

- Keep the Catamounts winless in Southern Conference play this season, finishing 0-7 for a second-straight season and extend the Catamounts' SoCon losing skid to 15-straight games dating back to 2005;
- Give WCU losses in 19 of its last 20 games dating back to last season.
- End WCU's season at 1-10, its worst overall record since 1958's 1-8-1 mark under Dan Robinson (WCU has had nine, 1-win or less seasons all-time).

#### WESTERN CAROLINA – FURMAN SERIES:

Western Carolina and upstate-rival, Furman, will meet for the 35th time in the all-time series with the Paladins holding a 10-22-2 advantage... Furman has won eight of the last nine meetings, and 10 of the last 12 overall meetings with the Catamounts... Western won the last game between the two played in Cullowhee, downing the 2nd-ranked Paladins, 41-21, in 2005 at E.J. Whitmire Stadium to snap Furman's seven-game winning streak in the series – the longest by either team in the series... WCU has only won five of the 16 previous meetings at home – but its last two wins in the series overall came at home.



#### WESTERN CAROLINA IN SEASON FINALES:

Since joining the Southern Conference in 1976, Western Carolina is 12-19 all-time in final regular season games, including a 10-9 mark when the season's last game is played at home... WCU is 1-4 under current head coach Kent Briggs in the season's final game, including a 1-1 mark at home with the lone victory coming in 2003 against Gardner-Webb in Cullowhee, a 39-16 victory for the Catamounts.

#### SATURDAY'S WCU-FURMAN STORYLINES:

\* Western Carolina will honor its 15 senior players, three senior equipment managers and one student coaching assistant, **Daniel Gibson**, in a pregame ceremony;

\* Western will recognize its 1949 Catamount football team and alum Dave Bristol and Jim Garrison as its most recent inductees into the WCU Athletics Hall of Fame;

\* Western is looking to prevent its second winless Southern Conference season, while Furman hopes finish above .500 for the year and a win would assure the Paladins at least a tie for 3rd place in the final conference standings;

\* WCU senior receiver Eddie Cohen needs just 30 yards to surpass former Catamount standout, Gerald Harp (1977-80), for the single-season receiving record;

\* Saturday will be the final game on the sidelines for WCU head coach, Kent Briggs... a win would tie him with former Catamount coach, Bill Bleil, for 5th all-time on the wins chart (23);

#### CATS LOOKING TO END 14-GAME SOCON SLIDE:

Including dropping seven-straight in league play last season and the six this season, Western Carolina has now lost 14-straight Southern Conference games dating back to its showdown with Appalachian State in Boone at the end of 2005, which was for a share of the conference championship and started the current slide (L, 35-7)... WCU's last SoCon victory was a 24-0 shutout victory over Wofford – the first-time and only time to date the Terriers had been blanked in league play.

Western will try and prevent consecutive 0-7 records in Southern Conference play. Last season's 0-7 conference record was the first time the Catamounts had gone winless in the league since they joined the SoCon for the 1977 season. Western does have three, 1-for seasons, going 1-7 in 1996, 1-6-0 in Bob Waters' final season (1988) and 1-4-1 the following year for the lone season under the direction of Dale Strahm.

Western is currently amidst a six-game losing skid since downing Presbyterian – the streak is the 11th longest in NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) football (N.C. A&T has lost 26-straight) – and tied with UNLV for the 19th-longest in both NCAA Division I football classifications combined.

#### STATEMENT FROM WCU AD CHIP SMITH ABOUT HEAD COACH KENT BRIGGS:

Western Carolina athletics director Chip Smith issued a statement on Tuesday evening regarding the future of Catamount head football coach, Kent Briggs:

"Western Carolina University head football coach Kent Briggs will be relieved of coaching responsibilities and assigned to another university position following WCU's football game with Furman on Saturday, Nov. 17... A national search for a new head football coach will begin immediately... Briggs, the assistant coaches, the Catamount football players and the University's executive administration were informed on Tuesday... The specific reassignment is under discussion and will be announced soon."

Briggs has compiled a 22-42 overall record in six seasons in Cullowhee, including banner wins over #2 Furman in 2005 and over #19 Eastern Kentucky in 2006 and winning the Old Mountain Jug in 2004... Briggs also led WCU to Boone in 2005 with a chance to play for a share of the SoCon regular season championship against Appalachian State.

## KENT BRIGGS WCU HEAD COACH

- Record at WCU: 22-42 Overall, 12-31 SoCon (6th year)
- Career Head Coaching Record: Same
- Personal Data: Born Sept. 22, 1957 in Asheville, N.C. Married to the former Lisa Thomas, who is from Asheville and is a Western Carolina graduate. The couple has two children; daughter Alexandra (15) and son Cody (12).
- Education: Graduated from A.C. Reynolds High School

in Asheville, N.C. in 1975. Received a Bachelor's degree in physical education from Western Carolina in 1979. Received a Master's degree from WCU in physical education in 1981.

• **Playing Experience:** Was a four-year letterman at Western Carolina (1976-79), redshirting his first season (1975) in Cullowhee. Played quarterback at WCU from 1976-79, serving as a starter in 1976.

• **Coaching Experience:** Spent nine seasons at Western Carolina (1980-88), serving as a graduate assistant (1980-81), defensive ends coach (1982-83), outside linebackers coach (1984-85) and defensive backs coach (1986-88). Spent the next 11 seasons as an assistant coach at North Carolina State, working with the defensive backs and linebackers during his tenure. Was the Wolfpack's co-defensive coordinator over his final four years (1996-99). Was defensive coordinator at Connecticut for the 2001 season before returning to Western Carolina as head coach in January of 2002.

• **Facts Worth Knowing:** In 2005, Western played for a share of the Southern Conference title, marking the first time since 1994 the Cats were in position to win at least a share of the league championship on the regular-season finale since 1994. In each of his first two seasons as the Cats' head coach, Western has led the SoCon in passing. Briggs has been associated with Western each of the six time times it has led the league in passing, including three years as a WCU quarterback (1977-79), one as an assistant with the Cats (1982) and his two seasons as WCU head coach (2002-03). His four years as a player at Western (1976-79) is the only time in school history the Catamounts have had four consecutive winning seasons. Briggs was on the coaching staff at Western when the Cats reached the NCAA I-AA title game in 1983. The following year WCU was the top-ranked team in the nation prior to the season, finishing the year ranked 14th.

In his 26 years at the collegiate level, Briggs has coached 20 players who have signed professional football contracts — 18 in the National Football League and two in the Canadian Football League. As an assistant at Western, Briggs coached All-SoCon performers Jeff Dean, Louis Cooper, Bernard Jones, Clyde Simmons, Fred Davis and Touissant Kennedy. His 1998 N.C. State defense ended the season tied for second in the NCAA with 19 interceptions. In 1989, the N.C. State defense led the Atlantic Coast Conference by allowing just 167.8 passing yards per game. He helped the Wolfpack earn seven postseason berths.

As head coach at Western, there have been 28 All-SoCon honors bestowed upon Catamounts, including seven in each of his first two years, four earning all-league honors in 2004 and 10 getting the nod in 2005. In 2002, Michale Spicer was tabbed All-American. In 2003, Jason Whaley was named All-America on the field and first team Academic All-America. Spicer, Nick McNeil and Brian Gaither each signed NFL free agent contracts after the 2003 season while Kevin McAlmont, Lamoni Reid and Wendell Singletary signed as free agents after the 2005 season. The 2004 signing class was named "Best Southern Conference Recruiting Class" by *SouthernPigskin.com*.

His wife, Lisa, is a Western Carolina graduate as well.

After being diagnosed and subsequently battling head and neck cancer last season, Briggs served as the honorary chairman for the Relay for Life for 2005-06.

## EDDIE COHEN POSTS SIXTH-STRAIGHT, 100-YARD RECEIVING GAME:

On the strength of **SIX-CONSECUTIVE, 100+ yard performances**, Western Carolina senior wide receiver **Eddie Cohen** has 62 catches for a career, single-season best 1,115 yards receiving this season and stands just **30 yards shy** of Gerald Harp's WCU single-season record of 1,145 yards (*he is just 27 yards shy of tying Eric Rasheed for second on the list at 1,142*) ... Cohen's 62 catches are tied with three others for **fifth on the WCU single-season chart** ... Cohen has posted 100+ yards in each of the last six games, including three TDs on 212 yards at Georgia Southern which set a Paulson Stadium record and ranked third all-time on WCU's single-game receiving chart ... Cohen's performance at GSU made him one of just four players to post, 200-yard receiving performances in school history ... His other 100-yard performances include 177 vs. Elon; 109 at UTC and 104 vs. The Citadel; 124 yards on just five catches with 2 TDs vs. Wofford; and 156 yards on eight catches and two TDs at Appalachian State ... His nine touchdowns this season is good enough for the fourth-best season ever at WCU and has him just three shy of first on the same list ... For his career, Cohen has 137 catches (**1 shy of 10th all-time**) for 2,080 yards (**166 shy of 10th all-time**) and 15 touchdowns (**3 shy of tying for fifth all-time**).

## MORE ON SENIOR RECEIVER EDDIE COHEN:

**Eddie Cohen** is just one of two receivers in the Southern Conference to average over 100 yards per game (111.5 yds/gm) ... He currently ranks second in the SoCon in receiving yards behind Elon's Terrell Hudgins, who leads both the conference and the nation (138.5 yds/gm) ... In addition, Cohen ranks **FOURTH nationally** in receiving yardage per game. (*For more single-season records, see page 10*).

## MALONE SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR KICKOFFS, RETURN YARDAGE:

With his first kickoff return against The Citadel, Western Carolina senior **Mike Malone** etched his name into the WCU record books for the most kickoff returns in school history ... Malone entered the weekend with 84 career kickoff returns – tied with Otis Washington (1985-88) for the most career kickoff returns – his 85th return went for 29 yards midway through the first quarter ... Malone's second kickoff return of 28 yards pushed him over the mark for career kickoff return yardage surpassing Kerry Hayes (1991-94) for the all-time career kickoff return yardage (2,058) ... He is only the second player in school history to surpass 2,000 yards in kickoff returns in a career ... **Last weekend in Boone**, Malone set the school-record for kickoff returns in a game with nine (for 171 yards) ... Malone currently has 88 career returns for 2,120 yards.

## MORE ON SENIOR ALL-PURPOSE MAN, MIKE MALONE:

In addition to tallying a **career-high 151 yards rushing** – marking just the second time in his career he had eclipsed the 100-yard rushing barrier – senior Mike Malone set a **school benchmark for all-purpose yards**, rewriting his own record with 326 (171 returns, 151 rushing and four receiving) ... Earlier this season, Malone established the record with 322 all-purpose yards (161 returns, 99 receiving and 62 rushing) at Eastern Kentucky ... Malone **LEADS THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE** and ranks **sixth nationally** with an average of 188.8 all-purpose yards per game.

## DROPPING BACK – APP RETAINS THE OLD MOUNTAIN JUG IN RECORD WIN:

Despite scoring on its opening drive for just the third time this season – taking a 7-3 lead over its arch-rival, Appalachian State – the Catamounts could not stop the balanced attack of the Mountaineers as ASU amassed 743 yards of total offense and the second-most points in school-history in a 79-35 win ... the Apps retained possession of the Old Mountain Jug for the 21st time in the last 23 meetings and handed Western its 12th-straight loss in Boone as WCU has not won on the road in the series since 1984.

**ADDITIONAL STORYLINES:** Senior WR **Eddie Cohen** posted his sixth-straight, 100+ yard receiving day ... Cohen hauled in a Southern Conference season-best, 82-yard receiving touchdown from classmate, **Todd Spitzer** ... Spitzer finished with a career-best 258 yards passing ... Senior RB **Mike Malone** rushed for a career-best 151 yards as a part of a school-record 326 all-purpose yards ... the Mountaineers scored on each of its first eight possessions.

## CATS BETTER AFTER THE BREAK; CHARTING SECOND HALF COMEBACKS:

Minus last week's game at Appalachian State, Western Carolina had put together four-straight second half rallies only to come up just short:

\* Trailing Elon, 38-23, late in the third quarter, Western posted back-to-back scores for 13 unanswered points to close to within two points only to fall by that margin, 38-36;

\* WCU trailed Chattanooga, 25-0, at halftime only to outscore the Mocs 21-to-7 in the third quarter to trail by 11 entering the fourth quarter with the football, but an interception early in the final quarter set up a momentum-seizing UTC touchdown in the 39-21 loss;

\* Coming off the bench midway through the third quarter, senior QB Todd Spitzer completed 15-of-21 passes for 195 yards and two touchdowns – both to red-shirt freshman receiver Marquel Pittman – as Western Carolina scored 21 points in the fourth quarter in a 37-31 Homecoming loss to The Citadel ... WCU trailed 31-10 entering the final quarter with two Mike Adams' field goals providing the final margin;

\* Against No. 7 Wofford, the Catamounts made their most improbable comeback, outscoring the Terriers 41-to-10 on national TV (ESPNU) in a 47-44 loss – WCU was an onsidest kick away from being able to either tie or win the game in the fourth quarter after trailing 37-3 at halftime;

\* Also – WCU scored all 21 points against Georgia Southern in the second half – all three coming on TD passes to Eddie Cohen.

## MARQUEL PITTMAN NAMED SoCon FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK:

Following the Wofford game, Western Carolina red-shirt freshman wide receiver **Marquel Pittman** was selected as the Southern Conference's Freshman of the Week ... Pittman posted six catches for a career-high 124 yards and a pair of scores in the exciting Thursday night near come-from-behind performance on

national television against the then 11th-ranked Wofford Terriers ... Pittman's selection marks the first of his career and the sixth time a Catamount football player has been recognized by the conference.

## -17 TURNOVER DEFICIENCY – WCU ONLY HAS 7 TAKEAWAYS IN 10 GAMES:

When senior **Mordy Ornguze** forced a second half fumble that was recovered by junior **Jeff Bradley** against Wofford, it marked the first-time in four games (since a fumble late in the 4th quarter at Georgia Southern) that Western Carolina had created a takeaway on defense ... Western had two takeaways in Boone, but gave it back five times (four INTs, one fumble) ... On the season, WCU has only forced five lost fumbles and two interceptions (7 takeaways) – conversely, WCU has had 13 lost fumbles and 11 picks (24 giveaways) for a negative-17 turnover ratio (-1.7 per game) which ranks **112th out of 116 FCS teams**.

## STRENGTH OF WESTERN CAROLINA'S SCHEDULE:

Glancing at the latest Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) polls, five of the top 25 teams and seven all together including those receiving votes showed up on WCU's schedule this season ... WCU visited the 6th-ranked Appalachian State Mountaineers last week coming off a close finish with then-No. 11 Wofford ... Others include No. 16/17 Georgia Southern (lost by 28); No. 12 Eastern Kentucky (lost by 24); No. 24/28 Elon (lost by two points), and No. 30/31 The Citadel (lost by 6) ... Add in the two Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams – Georgia (No. 8 AP; No. 9 USA Today; No. 9 BCS) and Alabama (No. 34, AP) – seven of WCU's 2007 opponents are ranked ... Also, Furman (No. 38), with whom WCU closes the season with today, was ranked as high as ninth this season and Chattanooga appeared in the "Others Receiving Votes" category for a couple weeks ... *Every team BUT Presbyterian and Chattanooga were receiving votes the week they played the Catamounts.*

## QUINTON PHILLIPS EARNS SECOND SoCon WEEKLY HONOR:

On the strength of his third double-digit tackle outing of the season, Western Carolina junior linebacker **Quinton Phillips** was named the Southern Conference's Defensive Player of the Week by the league office ... He led the Catamount defense with a career-best 20 tackles last Saturday against The Citadel ... Phillips' selection marks his second of this season and the fifth time a Catamount football player has been recognized by the conference including four-straight from late-September through early October ... Phillips holds the top two individual tackle performances in the SoCon this season – in addition to his 20-tackle day against The Citadel, the Charlotte, N.C., native also had a 19-tackle performance at Georgia Southern (Sept. 29) ... the Catamount defense limited Bulldog quarterback Duran Lawson to 199 yards passing marking the first time since November of last year an opponent had held the senior under 200 yards through the air ... Overall, Phillips ranks **second in the SoCon** with 84 tackles (10.5/gm), which also ranks him **13th in all of NCAA FCS**.

## WESTERN CAROLINA QUICK NOTES:

\* Western Carolina has scored at least 30 points in each of its home games this season averaging 36.0 points per game at Whitmire Stadium/Waters Field ... On the road, the Catamounts are only averaged 20 points per game after tallying a season-high 35 at Appalachian State;

\* Against The Citadel, it was the "rookie show" as **all four WCU touchdowns were scored by freshmen**: red-shirt freshman receiver **Marquel Pittman** hauled in two receiving touchdowns with red-shirt freshman quarterback **Adam Hearn**s tallying a rushing score and true freshman fullback **Andrew Rogers** hauling in his first TD catch;

\* Red-shirt freshman quarterback **Adam Hearn**s made his first career start against Elon, recording career-highs with 21 completions for 310 yards and tied his career-best with three TD passes ... Hearn also rushed for his first career touchdown, an 11-yard scamper that ended with a head-first flip across the goal line as to avoid three Phoenix defenders ... Hearn's 383 yards of total offense (310 pass, 73 rush) ranks as the seventh-best, single-game performance by a Catamount;

\* Hearn's 310 yards passing marks the most by a Catamount quarterback this season and is the most for WCU since 2004 when Justin Clark threw for 350 yards against Chattanooga ... It marks the 30th time a Western QB has eclipsed the 300-yard barrier with the 310 ranking as the 24th-best, single-game performance;

\* Senior wide receiver **Eddie Cohen** continues to set records during his final season in Cullowhee ... Cohen's 12 catches against Elon was not only a career-high, but also tied current wide receivers coach, **Lamont Seward**, for the second-most catches in a single-game (Seward did it twice: vs. Wofford, 2000 and vs. ETSU in 2003) (*school record is 15 by Eric Rasheed vs. UTC in 1984*) ... Cohen's 177 yards receiving also ranked 12th on the WCU single-game receiving performance charts.

\* Against Georgia Southern, Cohen became just the fourth Catamount all-time to record 200 yards receiving in a single game at Georgia Southern ... Cohen caught eight passes for 212 yards and accounted for all three Catamount touchdowns in the loss to the Eagles ... The Hilton Head, S.C., native became just the fourth WCU receiver all-time to eclipse the 200-yard receiving mark in a single-game, with his 212 yards ranking third among the four to accomplish the feat ... Cohen's performance was even more impressive as 149 yards and all three scores came in the second half as WCU was limited to a mere 9:07 (versus 20:53) in time of possession through the first two quarters ... All three of Cohen's scoring strikes came in the second half, tying the school-record for receiving TDs in a single half;

\* **Eddie Cohen's** 212 yards receiving at Georgia Southern also set a Paulson Stadium record, surpassing the previous benchmark by five yards (207);

\* In the win over Presbyterian, senior running back **Mike Malone** tallied a career-high 105 yards on the ground and sophomore wide receiver **Marquel Pittman** posted a career-best 107 yards receiving ... The tandem 100-yard performers marked Western's first since the 2004 outing versus the Mountaineers when the Catamounts reclaimed the Old Mountain Jug in Cullowhee;

\* The 33 points scored against Presbyterian were the most points scored by Western Carolina this season – and the most since scoring 42 in last year's season opener against Chowan ... also, the 20 were

the fewest allowed by the Catamounts in a game dating back to last year versus Chattanooga when WCU limited the Mocs to 17 points despite falling in overtime, 17-14;

\* With the home-opening win over Presbyterian, Western Carolina has posted a record of 26-8 in home openers, including **having now won 10-straight dating back to 1998**, since moving into E.J. Whitmire Stadium in 1974 ... WCU has also won 15 of the last 16 home openers going back to 1992 ... Under head coach Kent Briggs, Western is now 6-0 in home openers and has outscored foes, 265-to-37.

\* Looking back at the Georgia game, WCU's 16 points at Georgia marked the most it had scored against a SEC opponent since 1986 when the Catamounts scored 25 at South Carolina in a 45-25 loss to the Gamecocks ... the 16 points scored are the most against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) school since scoring 20 at NC State back in 2003 (L, 59-20);

\* Looking back at the season-opener, WCU faced the Nick Saban-led Alabama Crimson Tide marking the second time in Saban's 12-year head coaching career he had opened up a season at a SEC school against Western Carolina – Saban's season opener at LSU was against Western back in 2000 (WCU lost 58-0).

### CATAMOUNTS EARN FOURTH-CONSECUTIVE WEEKLY HONOR:

After turning in a career-best performance in his first career start, Western Carolina red-shirt freshman quarterback **Adam Hearn**s was named the Southern Conference Freshman of the Week by the league office ... Hearn's selection marks the fourth-straight week a Catamount football player has been recognized by the conference. Junior place kicker **Jonathan Parsons** earned back-to-back Special Teams Player of the Week honors on Sept. 17 and 24, with junior linebacker **Quinton Phillips** garnering Defensive Player of the Week accolades last week.

Hearn accounted for four Western Carolina touchdowns including three TD passes and his first-ever rushing score - an 11-yard scamper that ended with a head-first leap and flip into the end zone as to avoid three Phoenix defenders - in Saturday's exciting 38-36 game versus Elon in Cullowhee. The Philadelphia, Pa., native completed a career-best 21-of-41 attempts for a career-high 310 yards marking the first WCU quarterback to eclipse the 300-yard plateau since Justin Clark threw for 350 yards back in 2004 ... Late in the second quarter, Hearn's 11-yard acrobatic TD run gave WCU its final lead of the game, 23-21. He gained 105 yards on the ground before a pair of sacks late in the game while attempting to mount a fourth quarter comeback dropped him to 73 yards total on the ground, including a career-long 30-yard rush.

### QUINTON PHILLIPS NAMED SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

For a third-consecutive week, a Western Carolina Catamount football player was recognized by the Southern Conference office ... junior transfer **Quinton Phillips** was named the conference's Defensive Player of the Week after leading the WCU defense with a career-best 19 tackles last weekend at Georgia Southern ... Phillips, a transfer from Louisburg College, finished with six solo tackles and 13 assists at GSU ... The Charlotte, N.C., native entered the Georgia Southern game with 26 total tackles through the first four games of the season, nearly doubling his seasonal output in one game ... Phillips joins junior place kicker **Jonathan Parsons** as the second Catamount to combine for WCU's three SoCon weekly awards this season.

### WESTERN SNAPS 12-GAME LOSING SKID:

Western Carolina's 33-20 win over Presbyterian snapped its' 12-game losing skid which prevented WCU from tying its previous long of 13 games between the 1956-57 seasons. (WCU dropped nine-straight to end 1956 and the first four of 1957) ... the skid **had been the second longest losing skid in the Football Championship Subdivision** (North Carolina A&T had lost 20-straight to the date, last winning in 2005) and the third-longest in all of NCAA Division I football (1. NC A&T, L-20; 2. Florida International, L-16) ... the win - WCU's first in 378 days - also came on head coach Kent Briggs' 50th birthday (9/29/1957).

### PARSONS EARNS CONSECUTIVE SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS WEEKLY HONORS:

WCU junior place kicker **Jonathan Parsons** was recognized for the second-straight week as the Southern Conference Special Teams Player of the Week after connecting on two field goals and all three extra point attempts in the win over Presbyterian ... his two successful field goal attempts gave him seven this season, surpassing his previous single-season career-high of six made FGs last season.

Parsons was honored the week prior on the strength of three field goals, including a career-long 46 yarder at #23 Georgia in Sanford Stadium. The Summerville, S.C., native now has two weekly honors in his career ... This season, Parsons is 8-of-14 (57.1%) and currently leads Western in scoring with 40 points, including 16-of-17 PAT attempts and the eight field goals. For his career, Parsons is 17-of-27 (62.9%) on field goals and 46-of-47 on PATs.

### WCU ONLY TEAM IN AMERICA TO FACE BOTH NATIONAL CHAMPS IN 2006:

Western Carolina was the only team in the nation during the 2007 season to face both the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) and Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) National Champions, doing so on consecutive weeks. The Catamounts faced eventual FCS champion, Appalachian State, in Cullowhee on Nov. 11 (L, 31-9) before concluding the season with a trip to Gainesville and eventual FBS champion, Florida (L, 62-0) on Nov. 18.

### COACH BRIGGS CLOSES IN ON FIFTH-PLACE ALL-TIME:

With the win over Presbyterian, Western Carolina head coach Kent Briggs increased his win total to 22 games at the WCU helm ... He currently ranks sixth out of WCU's 11 all-time head coaches in terms of total victories, one shy of tying former head coach Bill Bleil who was 23-32 in five years as the Catamount leader ... Legendary coach Bob Waters leads all WCU head coaches with 116 victories, followed by Dan Robinson (51), Tom Young (39) and Steve Hodgins (31).

### EIGHT IS ENOUGH; OTHER ROSTER SNAFUS

No, you are not necessarily crazy. You are seeing two number "8's" on the field for the Catamounts. On offense, senior quarterback **Todd Spitzer** dons the "snowman" while fellow classmate **Mordy Ornguez** wears the number "8" on defense as a linebacker.

Western has one other number situations which could leave you scratching your head - two Catamounts assigned #10: First, freshman quarterback **Zack Jaynes** wears 10, as does sophomore safety **Chris Collins**.

### SCHOOL-RECORD CROWD WATCHES CATAMOUNTS AT GEORGIA:

Western Carolina has twice played in front of announced crowds of 92,000-plus this season, playing before a packed house at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa to open the 2007 season and last week at Georgia's Sanford Stadium ... The 92,746 in attendance "between the hedges" at Sanford Stadium in Athens is the largest in Western's history ... Also, in Football Bowl Subdivision play, WCU's last three opponents have had capacity crowds ... Here is Western's FBS (formerly I-A) opponent information since 2000:

## CATAMOUNT OFFENSE TO FEATURE NEW, NO-HUDDLE LOOK:

Upon his arrival in Cullowhee, WCU offensive coordinator, Doug Malone – who was hired in late March 2007 – immediately began installing a new offensive system. The “no-huddle” system is designed to help the offense control the tempo of the game, running multiple looks with different personnel while preventing the defense to immediately adjust its lineup.

Planning to simply use the no-huddle system for a half, Malone first used the system at Wingate Univ., and it stuck. He carried the system to Tennessee Tech where, in 2002, he produced the program’s first 2,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season. In 2000, the Golden Eagles racked up over 4,000 yards of offense and averaged over 30 points per game.

## CATS TABBED EIGHTH IN BOTH PRESEASON SOCON POLLS

Western Carolina was predicted to finish eighth in both the preseason coaches and media polls announced at the annual media rouser in Greenville, S.C., on July 23 ... Two-time defending champion, Appalachian State, was tabbed as the favorite to win the 2007 crown in both polls. The remainder of the polls mirrored each other with Furman (8-4 in 2006) selected as the runner-up, followed by Wofford (7-4), Georgia Southern (3-8) and The Citadel (5-6) in fifth. Elon (5-6), Chattanooga (3-8) and Western Carolina rounded out the eight-team predictions.

## CATAMOUNT 2007 INJURY LIST:

Western Carolina is coming off a season where injuries played a large role in the overall finish of the season ... The Catamounts only started one game last season with its preseason “starting” lineup – a 20-17 upset over nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky:

**PRESEASON:** RB **Quan Warley** (ankle) was injured during the first weeks of practice; had surgery to repair the break on the non-load bearing bone in his ankle; DE **Chris Everett** (forearm) suffered a broken arm early in preseason drills; has also already had surgery - UPDATE: the cast/sling were removed this week; OL **Josh Deaver** (knee) had linebacker Kadeem Morgan fall on his leg following a tackle sustaining the injury; OL **Dan Lawrence** (back) herniated disc; OL **Nick Williams** (knee) was injured prior to coming to Cullowhee in the East-West game;

**ALABAMA:** LS **John McDaris** (hip) was injured during the opener at Alabama ... he was taken off the field on a stretcher with a dislocated hip which was relocated by doctors at the stadium ... preliminary reports indicate a possible fractured hip; he was transported to a local hospital in Birmingham, Ala. ... He is currently listed as OUT for the remainder of the year.

**EASTERN KENTUCKY:** DL **John Martin** (back) had to be taken from the game with a back injury ... WR **Michael Hines** (knee) was rolled up on the sidelines and injured his knee in the second half ... DE **Levander Thomas** (knee) was injured during the game at ECU, playing most of the snaps late before reporting to the training staff.

**GEORGIA:** DL **Gene Singletary** (ankle) suffered a high ankle sprain in the second quarter and ... S **Ryan Nesby**, making his return after battling hip issues, injured his opposite knee at UGA.

**PRESBYTERIAN:** WR **Marquel Pittman** (hand) suffered a broken hand sometime during the fourth quarter of a game where he caught seven passes for a career-high 107 yards.

**GEORGIA SOUTHERN:** TE **Travis Osborne** (ankle) listed as out for Elon ... FB/TE **L.J. Davis** (ankle sprain)

## TRIO OF CATAMOUNTS LAND ON PRESEASON ALL-SOCON SQUAD

Three Western Carolina Catamounts were named to the All-Southern Conference team at the annual Football Media Rouser held in Greenville, S.C., on July 23. Seniors **John Martin** (defensive tackle), **Carlton Bailey** (cornerback) and **Mike Malone** (return specialist) were each selected to the second team All-SoCon by the league’s head coaches.

**Bailey**, a senior from Jonesboro, Ga., only played in four games last year, suffering a foot sprain against Georgia Southern that forced him to miss the final seven games of the season. Despite his limited action a year ago, his two interceptions and prowess on the defensive corner were enough to earn him second team consideration from the league’s head coaches. For his career, Bailey has 50 total tackles and four interceptions, returning one for a touchdown at Chattanooga in 2005.



**Martin**, who earned a fifth-year of eligibility for this season, ranks seventh among WCU’s returning defensive players in tackles. Last year, he recorded 20 total stops, including 11 unassisted tackles, in eight games, making six starts along the defensive front. He posted a career-best seven tackles for loss, which ranked tied for second on the squad despite missing three games due to a knee strain and bone bruise.

**Malone**, who has been a key part of the SoCon Champion WCU men’s track & field teams over the past two years and is slated as the starting running back this season, was selected to the second team as a return specialist. Last season, most teams kicked away from Malone after the Gainesville, Ga., native led the league and ranked second in the nation in kick off return average in 2005 (31.29 yards per return average). Even with teams kicking away from him, Malone ranked fifth in the SoCon and 42nd in the nation in kickoff return average in 2006. Primarily as a backup running back prior to this year, Malone has gained 253 yards on 65 carries (3.9 yards per carry) with one touchdown.

**#2 MEKO WATSON:** Ranked ninth on the team with 33 total tackles a year ago ... Earned his first career start at Elon last season and responded with a then career-high five tackles ... Was named the team's Special Teams MVP for The Citadel game ... Will split time between safety and cornerback, but will mostly play as the strong side safety: 2007: Tallied a then career-best six tackles, including four solo stops, at Alabama ... Recovered the fumble at Georgia to give WCU its first takeaway of the season ... Nearly tallied his first interception of the year, reading an out route against the 'Dogs ... **#4 ADAM HEARNS:** Fluctuated between second and third on the depth chart at quarterback during preseason ... In the final two scrimmages of preseason drills, completed 16-of-21 passes for 130 yards and a couple of touchdown strikes ... During the annual Spring Game, posted the best completion percentage after connecting on 7-of-9 passes for 68 yards ... Has also been listed as a wide receiver while at Western: 2007: Made his first appearance under center for Western at the 12:20 mark of the second quarter ... Completed his first career pass on his first career attempt to Nick Miller ... Finished the Alabama game 5-of-7 for 81 yards ... Tossed his first two touchdown passes at Eastern Kentucky, completing a career-best 14-of-21 passes while also tossing his first career interception against the Colonels ... ## – THE LAST TIME WE MET – WESTERN at FURMAN – 2006

Greenville, S.C. - Furman's **Jerome Felton** set school and Southern Conference records by rushing for six touchdowns in leading third-ranked Furman to a 42-7 win over 22nd-ranked Western Carolina in the Southern Conference season opener for both schools Saturday night at Paladin Stadium.

The previous Furman and SoCon record for TDs in a game was five.

Felton ran 20 times for 102 yards and scored on runs of 13, 2, 2, 5, and 1 yards in the first half in helping Furman build a 35-7 lead. Felton finished off his performance with a 1-yard plunge on the first possession of the second half to make it 42-7.

Felton's rushing touchdown flurry, which came on the heels of a four-touchdown performance in the Paladins' 45-42 loss to North Carolina last week, shattered the school record first set by William Gressette in a 38-7 win over Presbyterian in 1915 and matched the following year in a 60-3 triumph over Erskine. It also eclipsed a SoCon standard shared by three players and was one shy of the NCAA I-AA record.

Furman was also able to take advantage of a depleted Catamount defense. Starting with defensive tackle **John Martin** being sidelined for the game after an injury last week versus Eastern Kentucky, Western had four defensive tackles go down during the game and not return, including **Jeff Bradley**, **Randy Birch**, **Keanon Orr** and **Felipe Foster**.

Furman, which scored on its first six possessions, compiled a 305-217 advantage in total offense. Cedrick Gipson followed Felton in the rushing column with 70 yards on 11 carries, and quarterback **Renaldo Gray** connected on 4-of-7 passes for 100 yards.

## – LAST TIME IN CULLOWHEE – FURMAN at WESTERN – 2005

Cullowhee, N.C. - With just under seven minutes left to play in the game, preseason All-Southern Conference defense end Rico Reese intercepted a pass and returned it 18 yards for a touchdown, marking one of five Catamount picks in the game and essentially sealing the outcome in Western Carolina's 41-21 upset over #2 Furman at E.J. Whitmire Stadium/Bob Waters Field.

The win for Western was also its first over a team ranked as high as number two since upsetting eventual national champion Marshall (*who was ranked second at the time*) 38-30 on Oct. 31, 1992.

After Western jumped out to a 27-0 lead midway through three quarters, Furman reeled off three unanswered touchdowns and had all the momentum with just over seven minutes left in the game. However, Reese read a screen pass in the flat, tipped it to himself and raced 18 yards for the score. On the Paladins ensuing drive, senior Francis Brown picked off a Paladin pass on the first play of the series. Then, with WCU facing third and 10 on Furman's 36, Western ran its third "trick" play of the game as running back Lamont Reid completed a 36-yard pass to J.C. Brown. One play later, John Bush scored to provide the final margin.

Western Carolina had 363 yards versus Furman, thanks largely to 133 rushing yards by Darius Fudge. Fudge set the tone early, having a 26-yard run, followed by an eight-yard touchdown run on Western's first series.

Western started the second the same as it did the first, scoring on its first two possessions. First, with Fudge gaining 44 yards to the Furman two, Bush scored on fourth-and-goal from the one to put Western up 20-0. Then, the Cats' pulled off their second "trick" play as freshman kicker **Jonathan Parsons** bloomed a kickoff, which was recovered by Shelton Gaffney on the Furman 15. Three plays later, Reid scored from three yards out to make the score 27-0.

The Paladins used some trickery was well on the ensuing kickoff as Scott Beckler squibbed the ball off a WCU front-line player, which was recovered by Furman's Maurice Duncan. During that drive, Furman took advantage of back-to-back, 15-yard penalties by Western to get to the Catamount 13. Martin made it a six-point game (27-21) with 8:43 left by hitting Stepp for a 13-yard score.

After only keeping the ball for 1:07 and punting, Furman looked to have all the momentum. However, Martin threw back-to-back interceptions, one to Reese for his TD and one to F. Brown, and the Cats held on for the win.

In addition to Fudge averaging 10.2 yards per carry, Western was led on offense by Justin Clark, who completed 17-of-27 passes for 138 yards. **Michael Hines** was Clark's top target, hauling in six passes for 29 yards, while J.C. Brown had 86 yards on four receptions. Defensively, Western had numerous standouts. Primus Glover recorded six tackles with a sack, an additional tackle for loss and a pass break up. Mitchell Dukes also had six stops. Reese added five tackles and a sack to go along with his interception, while F. Brown had five stops, a TFL and a pick. Bruce Lee, Andre Hemphill and Gaffney each registered interceptions as well.

For the Paladins, Carter had five carries for 43 yards and a score. Martin finished the night by completing 24-of-42 passes for 249 yards with two touchdowns and five interceptions, while Rust had nine receptions for 109 yards. Defensively, Shelton Riley led the way with eight tackles, including seven solo stops, while reigning SoCon Defensive Player of the Year William Freeman had seven tackles on the night. Corner back Austin Holmes added three tackles, three pass break ups and an interception.

**#10 (A) ZACH JAYNES:** Freshman quarterback who was a three-time All-Western North Carolina and All-Western Athletic Conference selection who ranked ninth in the North Carolina state record books for career passing yards (7,591 yds) ... Was a two-time All-State selection ... Ran an offensive style similar to that which WCU has implemented this season for two years at Pisgah High. **2007:** Yet to see game action this season – is expected to red-shirt and battle for the starting job next season.

**#10 CHRIS COLLINS:** Changed his number from 34 to 10 prior to this season ... Played safety as a true freshman a year ago and is the favorite to earn the starting nod at free safety in the season opener at Alabama. **2007:** Ranks tied for second on the team in tackles after tallying a career-high 12 at Eastern Kentucky ... Led WCU at Georgia with 10 tackles, including a career-best eight solo stops ... Finished second on the team with 10 tackles against The Citadel, two shy of his career-best.

**#11 KYLE GARLAND:** Changed his number from 85 to 11 prior to this season ... Although he did not see game action a year ago, has three career receptions, all coming during his freshman season ... Caught two passes for 24 yards in the final preseason scrimmage this season. **2007:** Hauled in a career-best four passes for a career-high 38 yards at EKU ... Surpassed the 100-yard receiving barrier this season with 36 yards at Georgia Southern ... Caught one pass, a sliding grab for 13 yards, at Chattanooga.

**#15 KURT CLOUDEN:** A transfer from Morrisville State who did not see game action a year ago ... Enters the season second on the depth chart at corner back ... Should add experience to the position. **2007:** Primarily spells corner Carlton Bailey for the defense ... Although has yet to record a tackle, does have one pass defended.

**#16 ANTOINE GEORGE:** With an injury last year to Carlton Bailey, saw extended playing time as a true freshman ... Returns as the fourth-leading tackler from a season ago while also ranking tied for second with two interceptions ... Earned his first career start versus Chattanooga and had six tackles with two pass breakups ... Over a span of 16 plays in the second half against eventual FCS national champion, Appalachian State, recorded his first two career interceptions: **2007:** Was second on the team with nine tackles in the season opener against Alabama ... Talled Western's first interception on the season, ending a would-be PC scoring drive late in the second quarter with a pick in the end zone.

**#19 MICHAEL HINES:** Possesses good size for a wide receiver and enters his senior season eight catches shy of 100 for his career ... Led Western's receivers a year ago with 60 catches and was the second-leading scorer with five TDs ... Finished the season ranked third in the SoCon and 16th nationally with his average of 5.8 receptions per game ... Career-high for TD receptions in a single-game is two coming last year versus Georgia Southern with his career-high receptions of 10 occurring at Wofford ... Has one career pass completion, tossing a 31-yard pass on the first play from scrimmage in the season opener against Chowan; **2007:** Caught two passes for 22 yards at Alabama ... Moved within FIVE catches shy of 100 for his career ... Had his string of 21-straight starts snapped at Georgia, missing the game due to injury ... More than likely out the rest of the season with a knee injury ... While attempting to make a comeback for his final two games as a Catamount, suffered a broken leg which will keep him sidelined through both the App State and Furman games.

**#21 WILLIE HARPER:** Saw playing time as a true freshman ... Shifty running back with good speed ... Played on the kickoff return team at Elon for the first time responding with six returns for 122 yards (20.3 avg.), including an 83-yard kickoff return for his first collegiate touchdown ... Saw limited touches in the backfield a year ago, but is listed along side senior Mike Malone as the first-team running back entering the '07 season opener. **2007:** Continues to be the number two running back for Western behind Malone ... Was WCU's leading rusher at Georgia, carrying the ball eight times for 20 yards as the starting running back ... Hauled in his career-long pass out of the backfield on a 20-yard swing pass against Elon ... Carried the bulk of the load against Wofford ... Suffered a knee injury that hampered him in the second half at ASU before forcing him to the sidelines - is questionable for the Furman game.

**#22 DARRELL GRAY:** Saw time at both safety to corner back last season due to the injuries in the secondary ... Picked off his first career pass last year at Liberty ... Battled a shoulder/collar bone injury throughout preseason. **2007:** Earned his first career start last week against Presbyterian, starting in place of Antoine George at corner ... Responded with a team-best eight solo tackles, including one for a loss, and three pass break-ups in the win over Presbyterian ... Nearly had a pick at Chattanooga after the Mocs receiver fell down - however, he was turned around on the play and stumbled as the ball reached him.

**#25 ANDREW ROGERS:** Freshman fullback who has also spent most of the season as the long snapper after a season-ending injury to pre-season starter, John McDaris ... One of few true freshmen seeing ample playing time: **2007:** Made his first career start at fullback at Georgia Southern ... Caught his first career pass late in the second quarter against The Citadel ... Two plays later, QB Adam Hearn targeted him again and he hauled in his first career TD from six-yards out.

**#26 ANGELO BROWN:** Entered last season mainly as a special teams contributor, but saw more action at safety due to injuries a year ago ... Picked off his first career pass at The Citadel and returned it 45 yards for

a TD to give WCU an early 14-0 lead. **2007:** Posted his second career touchdown after blocking a punt at Chattanooga, scooping up the loose ball and racing 27 yards for WCU's first points in the second half against the Mocs.

**#27 ABRAM SCOTT:** Was with Western during spring drills ... Is the younger brother of defensive end coach – and WCU alumna – John Scott. **2007:** Primarily a safety, but is learning a new position and is listed on the two-deep as a linebacker ... **Named the Special Teams Player of the Game** after the Presbyterian game by the WCU coaching staff and was a team captain at Georgia Southern.

**#28 MARCUS NELUMS:** Came to WCU to play outside linebacker but was forced to move to rush end late in the preseason in an attempt to have "the best 11" on the field ... Could return to linebacker/edge this season depending upon the situation ... Battled nagging injuries during preseason drills that limited his live scrimmage action. **2007:** Has yet to see game action this season due to injury.

**#30 SHONTE BARNES:** A young running back who had his biggest impact during spring drills, rushing 114 times for 30 yards with a long run of seven ... Could see time in the backfield spelling Mike Malone and Willie Harper. **2007:** Primarily used on special teams this season.

**#32 L.J. DAVIS:** A versatile player, seeing time as both a tight end and running back ... Scored his first career TD, a one-yard plunge, at Furman ... Listed as a fullback, saw times in the tailback position during preseason drills giving Western a different look from Mike Malone and Willie Harper. **2007:** Saw an increased role in the Catamount backfield as a third tailback, rushing eight times for a combined 15 yards at Alabama ... Missed the Elon and Chattanooga games due to a slight ankle sprain.

**#33 JOE CLARK-DEAR:** Played in all 11 games, starting 10 at fullback a year ago ... Is an excellent lead blocker who scored his first career TD, a nine-yard reception at Wofford ... Was adopted days prior to the Chattanooga game and added "Dear" to his last name as his adopted parents do not have a son and it was their wish to see the name continued; **2007:** Caught his career-long pass of 35 yards against Elon when he was found downfield by quarterback Adam Hearn after a scramble in the backfield ... Played versus Elon despite being hampered by a sore ankle and knee.

**#34 ZEB JOHNSON:** A standout for Western's track & field team who came out for football during his senior season ... Is a short-distance and relay champion for WCU who helped the Catamounts finish ninth – just missing the eight-team finals – in the NCAA Championship 4x100-meter relay in Sacramento, Calif., a year ago. **2007:** Primarily used on special teams thus far this season.

**#36 JONATHAN PARSONS:** A solid placekicker who should handle all field goal and PAT attempts, and is a leading candidate for kickoffs ... Made two career-long, 41-yard field goals at Elon last year. **2007:** Was a perfect 2-for-2 at Alabama to improve to 8-for-12 in his career on field goals ... Voted the game MVP by fans on CatamountSports.com following the Alabama game ... Was unsuccessful on a pair of field goal attempts at EKU, having one blocked and the second blown off-course by a stout, swirling wind ... **Named the Southern Conference Special Teams Player of the Week** after connecting on three field goals, including a career-long 46-yarder at #23 Georgia ... Connected on a pair of field goals and all three extra point attempts to earn a back-to-back SoCon Special Teams Player of the Week accolades ... Missed his first career PAT against Elon making him 43-of-44 in his career ... **#41 JEFF BRADLEY:** A hard-nosed defensive end who was twice named WCU's Defensive MVP a year ago ... His 44 tackles on the season is the fifth-best total on the team, including four TFL, with a PBU ... Recorded seven stops at Elon with two tackles for losses ... Had five stops versus Chowan and seven versus Georgia Southern ... Had four tackles and a caused fumble versus App State. **2007:** Missed the Georgia game due to an injury ... Return this season is in question due to a shoulder injury.

**#48 DREW WALKER:** Did not play his first two years due to a back injury and missed time last season with a knee injury ... Will see more playing time this year and enters the opening weekend atop the depth chart at

"Mike" – or middle – linebacker ... His younger brother, Cody, plays for the WCU men's golf team. **2007:** In the first extended action of his career, tallied a career-best 11 tackles, including six solo stops at Alabama ... Continues to rank atop WCU and the SoCon tackles chart ... Missed the past five games due to injury – had hoped to suit up for The Citadel game but was in street clothes.

**#49 DONALD JAMES:** Was listed as a defensive back a year ago, but was switched over to wide receiver during 2006 Spring Drills to help with numbers ... Has taken to his new role as a wide out, leading the team in the second scrimmage of this preseason with eight catches for 62 yards and a touchdown. **2007:** Made his first career reception – a 20-yard grab from Adam Hearn – in the second half at Georgia Southern.

**#50 QUINTON PHILLIPS:** Transferred to WCU from Louisburg College prior to the season. **2007:** Posted six tackles, including three solo stops, in his first career game at Alabama ... Recorded a then career-best nine stops at Eastern Kentucky, including 1.5 TFLs ... Made his first career start at Georgia ... Got his first career sack – combining with Jeff Bradley – against Presbyterian ... Named **Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Week** after tallying a career-best 19 tackles at Georgia Southern ... Again led the Catamount defense with 10 tackles, including five solo stops, against Elon ... Continues to lead WCU in tackles after tallying nine stops and forcing a fumble at Chattanooga ... Posted a career-high 20 tackles against The Citadel which earned him his second **SoCon Defensive Player of the Week** accolade ... Led the team with 17 tackles vs. Wofford for his fourth double-digit tackle outing ... Intercepted his first WCU career pass at Appalachian State but fumbled after a 19-yard return giving the ball back to the Apps.

**#53 JOHN MARTIN:** After not playing football as a true freshman at WCU, gained a fifth-year of eligibility this season as per NCAA rules by remaining on pace towards graduation ... Ranks seventh among the returning defensive players in terms of total tackles from a year ago ... Was named co-Defensive MVP for Wofford with four tackles, including two TFLs. **2007:** Was injured and taken from the field at ECU with a back injury... Missed the Georgia game due to an injury – his return is doubtful.

**#58 LEE STANLEY:** A walk-on who made the squad this season ... a vital special teams contributor who could be called upon to step into a role for the defense. **2007:** Fell on the loose ball and recovered a Georgia Southern fumble late in the game in Statesboro.

**#80 MARQUEL PITTMAN:** A sophomore wide receiver who is expected to have a break-out year by the coaching staff ... Hauled in three passes for 95 yards – including a 54 yarder on a streak route from QB Andy Horn – in the first scrimmage of the '07 preseason ... Has good speed and good size; **2007:** Made his first career reception, good for just one yard, midway through the third quarter at Alabama ... Caught a career-high seven passes for a career-best 107 yards in the home win over Presbyterian ... Sometime in the fourth quarter, suffered a broken hand that was surgically repaired on Tuesday (9/25) ... Missed the Georgia Southern game but could return as early as this week ... Just days after surgery to repair his broken hand, returned to the lineup and caught one pass against Elon ... Posted his first multiple TD game, hauling in two scoring strikes of 18 and five yards against The Citadel ... Named **Southern Conference Freshman of the Week** after recording 124 yards and two TDs against Wofford ... Limited to one catch at Appalachian State, a 33-yard gain.

**#82 GENE SINGLETARY:** Played in all 11 games, starting the final seven along the defensive front as a true freshman ... His brother, James, plays offensive line/light end ... Their cousin, Wendell Singletary, played offensive line for the Catamounts and is a 2005 graduate of WCU. **2007:** Recorded a sack and a forced fumble when he blind-sided Georgia quarterback, Matthew Stafford, creating WCU's first turnover of the season ... Later at UGA, was injured, suffering a high ankle sprain that forced him to miss the Presbyterian and Georgia Southern games.

**#84 NICK MILLER:** A speedy receiver who can also serve as a kick return specialist ... Caught Todd Spitzer's first career completion at Furman a year ago ... In the second preseason scrimmage this season, caught a pair of touchdown passes during red-zone situation drills. **2007:** Hauled in his second career touchdown pass at Eastern Kentucky ... A viable wide out who missed snaps due to a hip pointer ... Re-injured his hip during the first half of the Presbyterian game, but played at Georgia Southern and Elon.

**#88 SHAMAR ALLEN:** An excellent blocker who is a mainstay on special teams ... Despite only having five catches for 37 yards (7.4 yards per catch), look for the tight end position – and Allen in particular – to have an increased role in the new offensive system ... During his time in Cullowhee, has also been a part of the Track & Field team, throwing the shot put on the 2004 SoCon indoor championship squad. **2007:** Caught a career-long 34-yard pass in a "water bucket" formation against Elon ... Hauled in his first career touchdown pass – a four-yard strike – on WCU's opening drive of the second half against Wofford.

**#90 KEANON ORR:** With an injury along the defensive front, was given his first starting nod in last year's season opener, starting at defensive tackle ... Was injured in the Furman contest, forcing him to miss the next four games ... Returned to the lineup at Wofford ... Is a wide body that can clog holes up the middle; **2007:** Earned his first start of the season at ECU, tallying three tackles.

**#95 DARREN CURTIS:** Missed most of last preseason with mononucleosis and played just a few snaps late in the game versus Chowan ... Got his starting spot back for the second game of last year, registering four stops ... Tallied a career-high seven stops twice in 2006 ... Ranks as WCU's sixth-best returning tackler from a season ago and is the top-ranked defensive lineman; **2007:** Finished the Alabama game with three total tackles including the season's first sack ... Missed the Georgia, Presbyterian and Georgia Southern games due to injury ... returned to the lineup against Elon recording four tackles, including two solo stops and a tackle for loss ... Made his first start of the season at Chattanooga.

**#97 LEVANDER THOMAS:** An athletic defensive end who is seeing his first career playing time this season at WCU; **2007:** Started back-to-back games to open the season ... Named the **Defensive MVP** by the coaching staff after the ECU game ... Suffered a knee injury in Richmond, Ky., and missed the Georgia and Presbyterian games, but is expected to return to the lineup at Georgia Southern ... Started as a middle linebacker instead of his normal defensive end spot at Chattanooga, earning the WCU coaches' **Defensive MVP honor** after leading the team with a **career-high 11 tackles**, including 10 solo stops ... Battling a shoulder injury since The Citadel game that may limit his action against Appalachian State ... Suffered a separated shoulder early at Appalachian State – is doubtful for the Furman game.

**#99 BRANDON DRUMGOOLE:** Transferred from Wake Forest just prior to two-a-days a year ago ... An athletic defensive end, with good size (6-6, 240) ... Is the seventh leading tackler from a year ago, and second along the defensive line ... Last season, caused fumble, recovered a fumble and a broke up a pass; **2007:** Led WCU's defensive linemen with five tackles, including one TFL, at Alabama ... Started at UGA and PC ... Leads the Catamount front line with 22 tackles including 14 solo stops and 1.5 TFLs ... WCU's top tackling lineman with eight stops against Elon.

## WESTERN CAROLINA'S 1949 FOOTBALL TEAM HEADLINES 2007 HALL OF FAME INDUCTION CLASS

*Jim Garrison and Dave Bristol to be inducted with  
WCU Career Achievement Award*

Cullowhee, N.C. (Sept. 5, 2007) –Western Carolina University will induct its 1949 championship football team and a pair of 1950s graduates who had nationally recognized coaching careers during its annual athletics Hall of Fame ceremony on November 17. Joining the '49 squad are alums Jim Garrison and Dave Bristol – both Western North Carolina natives – who will be the first recipients of the WCU Athletics Hall of Fame Career Achievement Award, which recognizes WCU graduates who have distinguished themselves in athletics leadership positions.

The 18th Annual WCU Athletics Hall of Fame induction ceremony will be held prior to the WCU-Furman University football game on Saturday, Nov. 17 at a site to be announced.

The 1949 football team will be the fourth WCU team to be inducted. The 1963 men's basketball team, the 1969 women's basketball and the 1983 football team - all of which played in national championship games - were enshrined in 2003. The '49 Catamounts won the North State Conference championship by going unbeaten in league play, and finished regular season play with an 8-2 record. It was also the first Western football team to play in a postseason game, competing in the Smoky Mountain Bowl in Bristol, Va.

Hall of Fame head coach Tom Young led the Catamounts to a sweep of conference rivals Appalachian State, East Carolina and Lenoir-Rhyne, holding them to a combined 12 points. The team featured All-America lineman Arthur "Ott" Byrd and three other players - Dan Robinson, Tommy "Bromo" Selzer and Hugh "Pee Wee" Hamilton - who have been inducted into the WCU Athletics Hall of Fame and All-North Conference selections Hugh Constance, Ralph McConnell and Ralph "Buffalo" Humphries.

Garrison transferred to Western from Gardner-Webb, then a junior college, and played two seasons (1953 and 1954) for the Catamounts as a halfback. He was an All-North Conference selection and co-captain of the '54 team. The native of Weaverville and 1955 Western graduate became head football coach at Chowan College, located in Murfreesboro, NC, in 1958. He built that junior college program into a national power, winning 182 games in the process, third all-time among the nation's junior college coaches.

He has already been inducted into four halls of fame - the National Junior College Athletics Association, North Carolina Sports, Gardner-Webb, and Chowan. The football stadium at Chowan University was named to honor Garrison's career.

He retired as head coach after 43 seasons, but continues to serve as an assistant football coach.

Bristol signed with the Cincinnati Reds out of Andrews High School in 1951 and played in the Reds minor league system as an infielder for 11 seasons and was a player/manager for five of those seasons. While playing and managing during the 50s, he completed his undergraduate degree requirement and graduated from Western in 1959. Bristol won five league championships in nine years as a minor league manager and coached numerous future major league all-stars including Pete Rose, Tony Perez and Tommy Helms.

Bristol became Major League Baseball's youngest manager at 33 when he was named the Reds field boss in 1966. After four seasons in Cincinnati, he became the Milwaukee Brewers manager for three seasons, 1970-72. He managed the Atlanta Braves in the '76 and '77 seasons, concluding his managerial career with the San Francisco Giants in the 1979 and '80 seasons. He later coached for the Philadelphia Phillies and Reds before retiring in 1993.

The veteran of 42 years of professional baseball was elected to the Western North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2000 and the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2006. Currently residing on his horse and cattle ranch in Andrews, Bristol continues to be a regular at WCU's athletics contests.

## WHAT IS A CATAMOUNT?

Western Carolina University's unique mascot and nickname for its athletics teams seem to always bring about the same question when the Western plays on the road ... "What is a Catamount?" Webster's Dictionary defines "catamount" as "any of various wild cats, such as a cougar or lynx." Cats of the catamount variety, including the bobcat, roam the southern Appalachian Mountains where Western Carolina University is located.

The nickname evolved from a contest that was held on the Cullowhee campus in 1933. The school was called Western Carolina Teachers College at that time and its teams were known as "the Teachers."


Everyone on campus was invited to participate, and the usual names were suggested — Bears, Indians, Panthers. However, the college wanted an unusual name; a name that few others had and that everyone would not copy.

The contest came down to Mountain Boomers, a small ground squirrel that scampers about the woods and is extremely difficult to catch, and Catamounts. Catamounts was the favorite of Head Football Coach C.C. Poindexter and was the nickname chosen. Poindexter wanted his players to be Catamounts with "fierce spirit, savage attacks, and lightning quick moves."

## WESTERN CAROLINA UNIVERSITY – DID YOU KNOW...?

- Western Carolina has two current NFL players. Brad Hoover is the starting fullback for the Carolina Panthers and receiver David Patten, who won two Super Bowl titles with New England, in his first year with the New Orleans Saints. Two other former Catamounts have Super Bowl rings, including defensive back Willie Williams with 2005-06 Pittsburgh Steelers and tackle Tony Jones with the Denver Broncos in 1998 and '99. Other Catamounts to play in the NFL include Dean Biasucci (kicker for the Colts and Rams), Louis Cooper (linebacker for the Chiefs, Dolphins and Eagles), Tiger Greene (defensive back for the Packers), Andrew Jordan (tight end for the Vikings, Buccaneers and Falcons), Nick McNeil (linebacker for the Packers and Redskins), David Rivers (quarterback for the Rams, Falcons and Raiders), Clyde Simmons (defensive end for the Eagles, Cardinals, Jaguars, Bengals and Bears) and Steve Williams (lineman with the 49ers and Colts).

- Western Carolina is the home of two current NBA players. Kevin Martin, who left WCU after his junior year after being a first-round pick with Sacramento, averaged over 22.0 ppg as the Kings' starting shooting guard. Also, 2003 lottery pick Jarvis Hayes of the Washington Wizards was the 2000 Southern Conference Freshman of the Year while at Western before transferring to Georgia and playing two years with the Bulldogs.

- Western Carolina's Ronnie Carr hit the first 3-pointer in NCAA history during the 1980-81 season. Last year was the 25th Anniversary of "The Shot" and was featured throughout the nation, including ESPN.

- Western Carolina was the first predominately white university in the South to sign African-American athletes. Western's Henry Logan, the school's all-time leading scorer in basketball, was the first to break the color barrier in the South, playing his first season in 1964-65. In the fall of 1965, Western's Keith Elliott became the first football player in the South to break the color barrier.

- Since its inception for the 1978 season, the Southern Conference has produced seven FCS (I-AA) national championships, including Furman (1988), Georgia Southern (1999 and 2000), Marshall (1992 and '96) and Appalachian State (2005 and '06). (Note: Georgia Southern won four national titles prior to joining the SoCon.) Also, on eight different occasions, a SoCon team has finished national runner-up, including Western Carolina in 1983. In 2007, Appalachian State became the first FCS team to defeat a FCS nationally-ranked Top 25 team when it downed #5 Michigan in Ann Arbor.

The Catamounts did manage to score against the Nick Saban-led Tide squad, notching a pair of Jonathan Parsons field goals to snap a five-quarter, 76-minute scoring drought.

Senior running back Mike Malone accounted for 134 all-purpose yards, including 38 on 11 carries on the ground, two catches for 14 yards and five kickoff returns for 82 yards. Seeing his first career action, sophomore quarterback Adam Hearn rushed four times for 24 yards while also completing 5-of-7 passes for 81 yards.

Starting signal caller, senior Todd Spitzer, finished 9-for-20 for 90 yards with his classmate, receiver Eddie Cohen, hauling in four passes for 84 yards.

Trailing 7-0 after the opening flurry from Alabama, Cohen nearly knotted the game on WCU's second possession. Spitzer found Cohen across the middle on third and long on a pass play that went for 67 yards and a score - however, a holding penalty negated the score, but did give WCU a first down in Tide territory, the first time they'd crossed midfield in the game. The drive stalled three plays later and the Catamounts were forced to punt.

On the ensuing possession, the Crimson Tide mimicked WCU and went to a no-huddle offense itself, driving 94 yards in 10 plays, including several for double-digit yardage, in 3:51 to push ahead by two scores, 14-0, just before the end of the first quarter.

The Catamounts opened the second quarter with a fourth-down conversion on a three-yard run by L.J. Davis, and kept the drive alive with a third-down strike from Spitzer to senior Michael Hines. Malone slipped through the Tide defense on a draw play, rumbling 18 yards to get the Catamounts into the red zone. Yet, three-straight incomplete passes stalled the drive and Parsons put WCU on the board with his successful 34-yard attempt, cutting the lead to 14-3.

Just before the half, Alabama drove 69 yards in 17 plays but were stymied by the WCU defense at the four-yard line, and were limited to a 22-yard field goal to push their halftime advantage to 21 points, 24-3.

At the outset of the second half, Alabama lengthened, again using a methodical drive to march down the field before a 1-yard TD dive by sophomore Glen Coffee to pull ahead, 31-3. The Tide rolled 73 yards in 10 plays in extending its advantage.

Western added a second Parsons' field goal in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter. On third and five from its own 21 yard line, Hearn found freshman tight end Travis Osborne for a 28-yard strike, followed by a 35 yard completion to Cohen to move inside the red zone at the Alabama 16 yard line. Yet, Western stalled and Parsons' was called on to cap the eight play, 72-yard drive with a 29-yard field goal.

Richmond, Ky. - Eastern Kentucky rushed 53 times for 326 yards, with two backs each eclipsing the 100-yard mark on the ground as the home standing Colonels weathered an early charge by Western Carolina before pulling away for a 45-21 victory in front of 9,300 fans at Roy Kidd Stadium.

WCU senior running back and kick return specialist Mike Malone led Western's charge with a game-high 322 all-purpose yards, including a career-best 99 yards receiving - 90 of which came in the first half - and his first career touchdown reception. The Gainesville, Ga., native added 62 yards on the ground with 161 yards in kickoff returns.

Western Carolina (0-2) opened the game set on moving the football on the ground, rattling off seven-consecutive - and nine out of its first 10 - running plays out of a myriad of formations including the shotgun and I-formation. Malone carried the ball four times for 32 yards, including a long scamper of 20-yards on the opening drive as the Catamounts moved the ball down into scoring position. However, after the drive stalled, junior Jonathan Parsons's 47-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Eastern Kentucky keeping the game scoreless early in the first.

After the Catamount defense forced a three-and-out on EKU's first possession, WCU again moved the ball down the field, going 49 yards in 11 plays before coming up short on a third down setting up Parsons from 40-yards out. Battling a swirling head wind, his attempt sailed just left of the upright keeping the game deadlocked at zero.

Having dodged two WCU scoring opportunities, Eastern Kentucky (1-1) capitalized on the Catamounts' inability to convert. On third down and four to go, Colonel quarterback Allan Holland ran an option right where he was greeted by a host of Catamount defensive linemen. He appeared to be stuffed by the purple and gold surge, but at the last second he managed to flip the ball to the outside where senior tailback Bobby Washington skirled around the WCU defense and raced 67 yards for the game's first score.

The Colonels extended their lead to double-digits early in the second quarter with a 20-play, 87-yard marathon drive that consumed 7:39 that ended with a 24-yard Taylor Long field goal to give the home team a 10-0 lead.

Trailing 17-0, WCU clawed back into the game, tallying its first offensive touchdown in nine quarters dating back to last season when Spitzer hit Malone on a screen pass that went for 69 yards capping the two-play drive and cutting the halftime deficit to 10, 17-to-7.

Back-to-back touchdowns by Eastern Kentucky to open the second half, with the latter set up by Spitzer's first interception, pushed the Colonels ahead by 24 points, 31-7, late in the third before the Catamounts managed to scratch the scoreboard for a second time. With red-shirt freshman quarterback Adam Hearn under center, Western drove 74 yards in 13 plays capped off when he found Miller for a nine-yard strike to close the gap to 31-14.

Despite forcing two-consecutive Colonel punts following its second score, Western was unable to consistently move the ball as a failed fourth-down conversion and Hearn's first career interception thwarted WCU drives. Hearn, who was under duress, made an ill-advised pass intended for Malone on a screen play in traffic with EKU's Justin Curry snagging the batted ball for the pick. After the INT and subsequent 63-yard return, Eastern Kentucky managed to capitalize on a 14-yard touchdown strike from Holland to Kyle Barber to stretch the lead to 38-14.

**Cullowhee, N.C.** - Junior kicker Jonathan Parsons connected on all three field goal attempts and senior tailback Mike Malone slipped in for the Catamounts' first rushing touchdown of the season as Western Carolina concluded its three-game road swing to open its schedule with a 45-16 loss to the No. 23 Georgia Bulldogs Saturday afternoon at Sanford Stadium.

By pushing across the late touchdown, Western (0-3) became the first team to post a second half touchdown against Georgia this season. Also, WCU's 16 points were the most the program had scored against a Southeastern Conference (SEC) foe since tallying 25 at South Carolina in 1986 (L, 45-25) and the most against a NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team since tallying seven at Louisville in 2001 (L, 31-7).

Trailing 3-0 after limiting the Bulldogs to a field goal on its first possession, Western's defense forced its first turnover of the season which led directly to the Catamounts' first score. On third and three near midfield, sophomore Gene Singletary - who was credited with an eight-yard sack on the play - broke free and blindsided Georgia QB Matthew Stafford, jarring the ball loose. Junior Jeff Bradley nearly scooped up the loose ball on the run but was unable to corral the bouncing orb. However, with the ball bounding closer to the 'Dog end zone, WCU senior Meko Watson came out of the pile with the ball for the Catamounts at the Georgia 14-yard line.

Three plays later, Parsons was called upon to split the uprights from 29 yards out, knotting the game at three apiece where it stood through one quarter of play.

As the second quarter opened, Georgia drove down for a touchdown, moving 65 yards in 11 plays to surge ahead, 10-3. On the ensuing kickoff, Malone raced out of his own end zone on a season-long 46-yard return to give the Catamounts possession near midfield. WCU captured its first, first down of the game two plays later after an eight-yard pass to Nick Miller and a seven-yard spurt by Willie Harper. The Catamounts drove 31 yards in eight plays with Parsons connecting from 40 yards out to trim the deficit to four, 10-6.

That was as close as the Catamounts would get, however, as Stafford drove the 'Dogs down the field on the next possession, moving 62 yards on four pass plays before a 15-yard TD strike from Stafford to Sean Bailey pushed the advantage to 11.

Just before intermission, Western (0-3) was again able to trim the deficit with a 13-play, 40-yard drive that culminated with Parsons' career-best field goal of 46 yards, pulling the Catamounts to within eight, 17-9. However, on Georgia's next possession, Stafford drove the Bulldogs 65 yards in three plays for a touchdown to push the advantage to 24-9 at halftime.

In the second stanza, Georgia scored on two of its first three possessions en route to building an insurmountable 45-9 lead until the Catamounts were able to punch one in during the fourth.

Guided by red-shirt freshman QB Adam Hearn, Western moved the ball 69 yards in nine plays, highlighted by a pair of wide receiver screens to Pittman - one for 12 yards and another for 22 yards - and two L.J. Davis runs for 14 yards to post its first rushing score of the season as Malone split the seam on the left side for six.

**Cullowhee, N.C.** - Senior tailback Mike Malone rushed for a career-best 105 yards and two touchdowns while his backfield classmate Todd Spitzer threw for a career-high 239 yards on 19 completions as Western Carolina snapped its 12-game losing skid with a 33-20 win over the Presbyterian Blue Hose at E.J. Whitmire Stadium/Bob Waters Field. The win, which ends the nation's third-longest winless drought, was Western's 10th-straight victory in home openers and improved head coach Kent Briggs to 6-0 in home openers during his WCU tenure.

Eight Catamounts caught passes for the Catamounts led by sophomore Marquel Pittman who hauled in a career-best seven passes for 107 yards, including a long catch of 42 yards, while red-shirt sophomore Marcus Brown tallied his first career touchdown on a 16-yard strike.

Malone's 100-yard rushing day was the first for WCU since Darius Fudge rushed for 102 at Liberty in 2006. Pittman's 100-yard receiving output was the first since Eddie Cohen recorded 109 yards in 2004 against Appalachian State. The tandem 100-yard performers marked Western's first since the same '04 outing versus the Mountaineers when the Catamounts reclaimed the Jug in Cullowhee.

Western (1-3) scored on its first two possessions on the night to stake itself to a 10-3 lead late in the first quarter. The Catamounts drove the opening kickoff 71 yards in an impressive 13 plays, including a 14-yard pass to senior Nick Miller and a 13-yard delivery to Pittman. The drive was capped by an eight-yard touchdown scamper by Malone to give Western the 7-0 lead.

On the ensuing possession, the Catamount defense held Presbyterian to three and out, but a muffed punt and fumble recovery by the Blue Hose at the WCU eight-yard line set up PC first and goal. However, in the shadow of their own goal posts, Western again stiffened as red-shirt sophomore Darrell Gray broke up a third-down pass play from the three-yard line to limit the Blue Hose to a field goal.

After Presbyterian closed to within four points, 10-6, with a second Cam Miller field goal, the Catamounts closed the half with a 45-yard scoring drive as Spitzer found Brown streaking down the middle from 16-yards out to push WCU ahead, 17-6, with under two minutes to play before the break.

Out of the halftime locker room, the Blue Hose (1-3), under the direction of new quarterback junior Tim Webb, used an aerial attack to move 82 yards in nine plays, seven of which were passes. The scoring drive was capped by a 30-yard strike from Webb to sophomore Matt Quinn, who transferred to PC from Vanderbilt during preseason workouts. Presbyterian's two-point conversion attempt failed leaving WCU ahead, 17-12.

Parsons' second field goal of the game - a 34 yarder with a minute remaining in the third quarter - pushed the Catamounts ahead by eight, 20-12. Yet, for the second time this season, Presbyterian tied the game with an early fourth quarter score as junior Terrence Butler scampered in from seven-yards out on an end around and Webb found Butler for the two-point conversion to leave the game knotted at 20.

Tied at 20, WCU consumed nearly 10 and a half minutes of the fourth quarter clock, scoring on consecutive possessions -- rushing scores by Malone and Spitzer -- to secure the victory.

Statesboro, Ga. – Four lost fumbles, including three on three consecutive possessions in the second quarter, led to a combined 24 Georgia Southern points and overshadowed a career performance for Catamount senior Eddie Cohen as the Eagles bounced back from last week's home loss to Chattanooga to drop Western Carolina, 50-21, n at Paulson Stadium.

Western's woes against GSU in Statesboro continued as the Catamounts dropped their 13th-straight to the Eagles and suffered their ninth consecutive defeat at Paulson Stadium. WCU was also relegated to its ninth-straight Southern Conference defeat.

Cohen caught eight passes for 212 yards and accounted for all three Catamount touchdowns in the loss. His trifecta of scoring strikes all came in the second half, tying the school-record for receiving TDs in a single half. The Hilton Head, S.C., native became just the fourth WCU receiver all-time to eclipse the 200-yard receiving mark in a single-game, with his 212 yards ranking third among the four to accomplish the feat.

Cohen's performance was even more impressive as 149 yards and all three scores came in the second half as WCU was limited to a mere 9:07 (versus 20:53) in time of possession through the first two quarters.

Trailing 10-0 after one quarter of play, three fumbles on three-consecutive possessions in the second quarter allowed Georgia Southern to stretch its lead by 17 points to 27-0. On the first play of the second quarter, Spitzer fumbled on a drop-back pass play which the Eagles turned into three points on a 27-yard field goal. The next time Western touched the ball, receiver Marcus Brown caught a pass for a three-yard gain before fumbling, which Georgia Southern drove down for a touchdown and a 10-point edge.

The third time Western touched the ball in the quarter senior running back Mike Malone gained three yards off a pitch to the right side, but fumbled near the end of the play with the Eagles recovering. Nine plays later, the Eagles punched it in for six from three yards out.

Inside the final minute of the first half, Western (1-4, 0-1 SoCon) took advantage of an Eagle kick out of bounds, moving the ball down the field in the hurry-up offense. Spitzer found Cohen over the middle and the Hilton Head, S.C., native drug Eagle defenders to the one-yard line but could not get in. On the ensuing play, Harper was stood up at the goal line and Western was held off the scoreboard, trailing at the break, 27-0.

Georgia Southern (3-1, 1-1 SoCon) stretched its lead to 30 by scoring on its opening possession of the second half before the Catamounts were able to put points on the board. Behind red-shirt freshman quarterback Adam Hearn, the Catamounts drove 80 yards in six plays with Hearn finding Cohen across the middle for a 52-yard scoring strike – the longest completion in Hearn's career.

However, the Eagles answered with a nine-play, 64-yard drive that only took a 1:06 off the clock to again stretch the score to 30, 37-7.

WCU managed to scratch the scoreboard two additional times inside the final 10 minutes of the fourth quarter on scoring passes from Hearn to Cohen from 48 and 13 yards out.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Western Carolina red-shirt freshman quarterback Adam Hearn threw for a career-best 310 yards and three touchdowns, adding 73 yards and his first career rushing score as the Elon Phoenix held off the Catamounts, 38-36, in Southern Conference action at E.J. Whitmire Stadium.

The loss snapped Western's unbeaten mark against Elon at Whitmire Stadium (7-1) and relegated the Catamounts to their 10th-straight defeat in SoCon play.

Hearn, who was making his first collegiate start, helped the Catamounts out gain Elon, 462-to-404 in total offense, including a 152-to-28 yard edge in the rushing game. Senior Eddie Cohen was the rookie's favorite passing target on the night, hauling in a career-high 12 passes for 177 yards and a touchdown.

In what started out as a high-scoring track meet with both teams combining for 51 first half points, it was the play of the respective defenses in the closing quarter that proved to be the difference in the outcome.

After staking itself to a two-point, 23-21, lead with 2:13 to play in the second quarter, Western witnessed the Phoenix post three-consecutive unanswered scores - including one with just 16 seconds on the clock before intermission - to surge in front by 15, 38-23, midway through the third quarter. A second lost Catamount fumble at the 8:15 mark gave Elon the ball with a chance to cement its lead. But the WCU defense rallied, allowing just one first down in forcing an Elon punt.

Six plays and 68 yards later, Hearn found senior Mike Malone on a 17-yard touchdown reception to shrink the deficit to eight, 38-30. On the ensuing Elon possession, back-to-back sacks by sophomore Kadeem Morgan and a combined sack by junior Jeff Bradley and senior Levander Thomas helped get Western the ball back as the third quarter closed. Four plays into the final 15-minute session, Hearn found Cohen from 10-yards out to pull WCU to within two, 38-36, but the two-point conversion attempt failed.

Over the remainder of the fourth quarter, the Catamounts held the ball four more times but were never able to cross midfield. Conversely, Western's defense did its part forcing two, three-and-outs by the Phoenix defense and forcing four punts.

Receiving the opening kickoff, Western Carolina opened the high-scoring first half as the Catamounts drove 57 yards in just five plays. The drive was sparked by a 38-yard hook-up from Hearn to Cohen, with sophomore tailback Willie Harper finishing off the drive with his first career TD run from two yards out. It marked just the second time this season - both coming at home - that WCU had scratched the scoreboard on its opening possession. Elon and its frosh signal caller, Scott Riddle, answered on its first possession, knotting the game at seven with a seven-play, 59-yard drive.

However, in the simmering back-and-forth, see-saw slugfest, it was Western which first flinched. Leading by six, 13-7, after Hearn connected with sophomore Marcus Brown for his second career TD reception, the WCU defense forced a Phoenix punt setting up the offense with good field position. Yet, four plays later, a fumble cost the Catamounts a chance to extend its lead.

**Chattanooga, Tenn.** - Despite a strong second half which saw the Catamounts rack up over 200 yards of offense and score 21 points in the third quarter alone, Western Carolina could not overcome a sluggish opening effort to fall at Chattanooga, 39-21, in Southern Conference action at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field.

Down by 11 points and having seized momentum in the second half, UTC's Joseph Thornton reversed the tide by intercepting Western red-shirt freshman quarterback Adam Hearn - his second pick of the night - and returned it to the one-yard line to set-up an Erroll Wynn touchdown run to stretch the lead back out to 18, which is where the game would end.

Western (1-6, 0-3 SoCon) fell behind early as Chattanooga capitalized on two Catamount miscues. First, the Mocs - aided by a downfield offensive pass interference call on WCU, forced a three-and-out on WCU's opening drive. The Mocs then blocked the punt setting themselves up with great field position. However, the Catamount defense limited UTC to a 41-yard field goal and an early, 3-0, lead.

After a second WCU punt which Stephen Brown downed inside UTC's 20 at the 10, Chattanooga extended its lead to 16 by moving 90 yards in just four plays, keyed by a career-long, 79-yard rush by Fitzgerald, who was corralled at the one-yard line after a long run down by Carlton Bailey preventing the score. Yet, one-play later, the Mocs quarterback slipped across the goal line for the score.

The Mocs again went deep into their play book early in the second quarter to extend their first half lead to 23. After Western had seemingly earned a defensive stop, forcing an apparent field goal attempt, UTC's Blue Cooper raced around the right end on a fake, pulled up and found Joseph Pittman in the end zone for the 23-0 advantage.

UTC's defense extended the Moc lead late in the second quarter with their third safety in the past three games. Harper could not handle a toss sweep pitch from Hearn, fumbling on the run. He was able corral the bouncing ball but was pulled down in the end zone for the two-points.

The Catamounts found a little life out of the halftime locker room. Forcing a three-and-out by the Mocs offense, sophomore Angelo Brown blocked a Jonathan Wright punt for his first career blocked kick. The Columbia, S.C., native scooped up the loose ball and stumbled into the end zone from 27-yards out to put Western on the board, 25-7. However, the Mocs quick-strike offense answered right back with a 59-yard scoring strike to cap a brief four-play, 78-yard drive to stretch the lead to 32-7.

Down 32-14, Hearn again orchestrated a scoring drive, moving the offense 62 yards in seven plays with sophomore Willie Harper plunging in from four yards out to narrow the gap to 11, 32-21. The drive was kept alive after Jonathan Parsons nailed a 41-yard field goal, but was roughed by the UTC special teams. WCU opted to pull the points off the scoreboard and capitalized on the new life with Harper's second career rushing TD, both coming in consecutive weeks.

Thornton's second interception of the game ultimately sealed the win for Chattanooga, the Mocs second in league play this season.

**Cullowhee, N.C.** - Coming off the bench midway through the third quarter, senior quarterback Todd Spitzer completed 15-of-21 passes for 195 yards and two touchdowns - both to red-shirt freshman receiver Marquel Pittman - as Western Carolina scored 21 points in the fourth quarter in a 37-31 Homecoming loss to The Citadel at E.J. Whitmire Stadium/Bob Waters Field.

The loss was WCU's fourth-straight to the Bulldogs, and 12th-consecutive in Southern Conference play and relegated the Catamounts to 1-7 overall, 0-4 in league play.

Spitzer, who guided the Catamounts on their final six possessions after subbing for red-shirt freshman signal caller Adam Hearn at the 7:07 mark of the third quarter, nearly surpassed the 200-yard passing mark in less than a half of work. His favorite two targets were classmate Eddie Cohen, who hauled in seven passes for 104 yards and Pittman, who tallied a pair of receiving TDs. For Cohen, it marked the fourth-straight game he had surpassed the century mark in receiving (212 at Georgia Southern; 177 vs. Elon; 109 at Chattanooga).

Two Western Carolina turnovers - both coming on its opening possessions of each half - proved to be the difference in the game as it led to 14 Bulldog points. After forcing The Citadel to punt on its opening possession, the Catamounts coughed the ball up as Hearn scrambled to his right, alluding a trio of Bulldogs before Joshua Lawson jarred the ball loose and Tillman Millhouse scooped up the ball and rumbled 21 yards for the early, 7-0 lead.

The second turnover was a Hearn's interception on the fourth play from scrimmage after intermission. The Citadel's Mel Capers split two WCU receivers and picked off the pass to switch the field. Four plays later, the Bulldogs scored for an 18-point, 28-10, lead.

Trailing by three touchdowns, 31-10, late in the third quarter, Western outscored The Citadel 21-to-6 over the final quarter in mounting another second half rally. Spitzer capped off a 10-play, 69-yard drive, which featured a pair of double-digit Cohen receptions, with an 18-yard touchdown pass to Pittman to close the deficit to 14, 31-17. On the ensuing possession, the Catamount defense stiffened after the Bulldogs had moved into the red-zone, limiting The Citadel to a 29-yard Mike Adams field goal and a 34-17 advantage.

Spitzer again moved the offense down the field, this time going 69 yards in just seven plays with Hearn finishing off the drive under center with a head-first plunge over the goal line to trim the deficit to 10, 34-24.

After The Citadel answered with a third Adams' field goal to pull back in front, 37-24, Spitzer orchestrated his third scoring drive of the quarter. Aided by a 33-yard kickoff return by senior Mike Malone, Spitzer drove the team 54 yards in seven plays, finding Pittman in the purple and gold clad end zone to tie the score, 37-31. However, WCU's on-side kick attempt failed and the Bulldogs were able to run out the final 1:56 of the game clock.

WCU used a 36-yard Jonathan Parsons field goal in the waning moments of the first quarter to keep pace with the Bulldogs. Down 14-3, WCU turned to freshman fullback, Andrew Rogers, on its next drive. Two plays after recording his first career reception - a nine-yard gain with the Catamounts in the red-zone - Rogers hauled in his first career touchdown, a six-yard score from Hearn to pull WCU back within four, 14-10 late in the first half.

**Cullowhee, N.C.** - Outsoring the 11th-ranked Wofford Terriers 41- to 10 in the second half, Western Carolina mounted a monstrous comeback after intermission for the third-consecutive week before falling by three, 47-44, in front of a national television audience on ESPN2 at E.J. Whitmire Stadium/Bob Waters Field.

The WCU receiving tandem of senior Eddie Cohen and red-shirt freshman Marquel Pittman each eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark with 124 yards and two touchdowns apiece to lead the second stanza charge. Of the combined 248 yards between the duo, 210 of it came in the second half as Pittman was limited to just 23 yards on a pair of catches and Cohen had just one reception for 15 yards in the first 30 minutes of play. It was the first time since 2004 that two Catamount receivers had surpassed the 100-yard plateau in the same game. For Cohen, it was his fifth-straight game with 100-or-more yards receiving.

For WCU (1-8, 0-5), the loss kept it winless in SoCon play this season and was its 13th-straight in league play. It also snapped a perfect 6-0 record in games played on Thursday night dating back to 1988.

After watching Wofford score on each of its first six possessions - which translated into surrendering 21 first quarter points and 16 in the second - Western trailed at intermission, 37-3, only mustering a 31-yard field goal by junior Jonathan Parsons with under a minute to play in the half. But after the break, Western scored twice for every one Terrier score during its comeback.

The Catamounts' first defensive takeaway since recovering a Georgia Southern fumble late in the going in Statesboro four games ago sparked things early on. With Wofford backed up on a third down and 10 to go situation, senior Mordy Ornguze burst through on a blitz, sacking Terrier QB Ben Widmyer and jarring the ball loose. Junior defensive end Jeff Bradley scooped up the bouncing ball and rumbled 23 yards to set up the offense with perfect field position at the Wofford 18-yard line. Three plays later, two of which were rushes by sophomore tailback Willie Harper including a 15-yard scamper, Hearn's found senior tight end Shamar Allen from four yards out for his first career touchdown reception, trimming the deficit to 37-10.

Western forced the first Terrier punt on the ensuing possession with Spitzer orchestrating the shortest drive of the evening. After an incomplete pass on first down, Spitzer found his classmate Cohen over the middle and he did the rest, weaving 61 yards for the score to pull Western within 20, 37-17, midway through the third.

Late in the third quarter, with both Spitzer and Hearn's in the game, WCU moved 63 yards in seven plays with Pittman making a diving stab at a Hearn's pass over a Terrier defender in the near end-zone for six points. Hearn's would also pilot the next possession driving 79 yards in 11 plays with Malone plunging in from two yards out for his fourth rushing score of the season to claw the Catamounts to within 13, 44-31.

All told, Western held a 298-to-142 yardage edge in the second half over the Terriers.

The Terriers capitalized on an early WCU fumble and blocked punt inside the opening six minutes of the game to stake itself to a 14-point lead in which it would never relinquish. Also, Western had a goal line situation midway through the second quarter, but was stopped on four-consecutive plays to keep the game scoreless.

**BOONE, N.C.** - Appalachian State scored the second-most points in a single game in school history Saturday, running up a 79-35 victory over rival Western Carolina to capture the Old Mountain Jug for the 21st time in the last 23 meetings.

The loss was WCU's sixth-straight on the season. Western Carolina has not won in Boone since 1984 - a string of 12 straight losses, with Saturday's defeat marking the Catamounts' 14th-straight in Southern Conference play dating back to 2005.

On a Saturday when Nebraska posted 73 points and Navy got 74, the Mountaineers (8-2, 4-2 Southern Conference) produced the most points in a game since a 115-0 beating of Piedmont in 1936.

The final score was also the most points in the series by a big margin.

At the half, Appalachian State held a 45-7 edge, matching the most points it has scored in the opening two quarters since it took a similar lead over West Virginia Tech in 2001.

Kevin Richardson had 230 all-purpose yards for Appalachian State, including a career-high 215 yards rushing on 22 carries and three touchdowns. Armani Edwards completed a career-high 26 passes in 31 attempts for 295 yards and two scores, and he also ran for three more touchdowns.

Corey Lynch collected his 21st career interception, which he turned into Appalachian State's last score on a 65-yard return with 4:10 left to play.

Western Carolina (1-9, 0-6 SoCon) actually led 7-3 when Adam Hearn's scored on a 5-yard run with 7:21 left in the first quarter to cap an 80-yard opening drive marking the Catamounts' first opening drive for a score since the Elon game, three games ago. All told, WCU has only scored on three of its opening drives this season, all rushing touchdowns.

Richardson scored on a 4-yard run on the ensuing possession to put the Mountaineers up for good.

Catamount senior Mike Malone rushed for a career-best 151 yards and two touchdowns for the Catamounts, recording a pair of rushing touchdowns and amassing a career-best 326 total all-purpose yards.

Appalachian State finished with 743 yards of offense, including 347 yards passing on 32-of-40 attempts. The defense intercepted four Western Carolina passes, three of which were thrown by Hearn's.
