### A WESTERN CAROLINA WIN WOULD:

- \* Snap the Catamounts' 18-game Southern Conference losing skid and be WCU's first conference win since blanking Wofford, 24-0, in Cullowhee in 2005;
- \* Be the Catamounts' first road SoCon win since defeating Chattanooga, 38-20, back in 2005;
- \* Snap the current two-game losing skid to Wofford and be WCU's first win in Spartanburg since 1981.

### A WESTERN CAROLINA LOSS WOULD:

- \* Extend WCU's current SoCon losing skid to 19-straight and make WCU's best possible finish at .500 (6-6);
- \* Be the Catamounts' third-straight to Wofford in the overall series – and 10th in the last 12 meetings.

**WESTERN CAROLINA VS. WOFFORD:** Western Carolina trails Wofford in the all-time series, 12-18, including a 3-11 mark in games played in Spartanburg ... WCU has dropped the last two meetings – and nine of the last 11 overall dating back to 1997 when the Terriers joined the Southern Conference ... Western has not defeated Wofford on the road in a SoCon match-up, last winning in Spartanburg in 1981 – a 27-year drought that includes five-straight road losses in the series.

**ABOUT WOFFORD:** The Terriers are ranked sixth in this week's Coaches Poll and fourth in this week's Sports Network poll ... the Terriers are 4-1 overall on the season and 2-0 in SoCon play with wins over Georgia Southern in OT and last week's 56-7 dismantling of Chattanooga ... Wofford's lone loss was a 23-12 decision at South Carolina

... the two do have a common opponent in Presbyterian – Wofford defeated the Blue Hose 38-21, while WCU won 23-21 back on Sept. 20.

**WESTERN VERSUS NATIONALLY RANKED FCS:** Since 1983, Western Carolina is just 11-59-3 all-time against nationally-ranked, Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA) teams ... Eight of Western's 11 wins have come at home as WCU is just 31-34-2 all-time on the road against nationally-ranked FCS teams ... Two of the three came during the 1983 season ... Western's last win over a ranked opponent came in 2006 – a 20-17 upset victory over then No. 19 Eastern Kentucky in Cullowhee which landed Western in the national rankings ... WCU's last road win – and its **ONLY** regular season victory (1-33-2) – over a nationally-ranked team came in 1984 (24 years ago) when it upended #12 Furman, 20-19.

**ONE STREAK DOWN, ONE TO GO:** WCU snapped its road losing skid at 14 games with its win over Presbyterian earlier this season ... the Catamounts will now look to snap another ominous streak – consecutive losses in SoCon play ... Western has not won a Southern Conference game since blanking Wofford, 24-0, on Nov. 5, 2005 in Cullowhee (*it was the first-time since the Terriers joined the conference in 1997 that they had been shutout in league play*) ... WCU has dropped 18-straight SoCon games dating back to its battle with Appalachian State in '05, which was for a share of the conference championship title (L, 35-7 in Boone).

**MORE ON THE SKID:** Western's SoCon losing skid at 18 is tied for the third-longest on record with Marshall ... the

### HEAD COACH DENNIS WAGNER

- **Record at WCU:** 2-5 overall, 0-3 SoCon (First Year)
- **Career Head Coaching Record:** 46-42-1 (8 Years)
- **Personal Data:** Born March 9, 1958 in Waverly, Iowa; Married to his wife, Cyndi; the couple has two children, Whitney (16) and Joshua (10)
- **Education:** Graduated from the University of Utah with a Bachelor's degree in psychology in 1982; Earned his Master's degree in athletic administration from St. Cloud State in 1987.

• **Playing Experience:** Began his playing career as an offensive lineman at Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa in 1976; Transferred to Ellsworth Community College in Iowa where he played the 1977 season, earning Junior College All-America status at center; Finished his playing career at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City during the 1978-79 seasons, garnering All-Western Athletic Conference (WAC) accolades and honorable All-America plaudits as a guard.

• **Coaching Experience:** Began his coaching career in 1980 at Luther College, a small liberal arts school in Decorah, Iowa, as an assistant coach working with the offensive line; Spent two seasons coaching the tight ends at UNLV from 1981-82; In 1983, served as the head track & field coach at William Penn University in Oskaloosa, Iowa, before returning to UNLV as the assistant strength coach in 1984; Moved back to the gridiron for three seasons (1985-88) at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach; Earned his first head coaching job in 1989 at Wayne State College in Wayne, Neb., a position he held for eight seasons ... Compiled a career record of 44-37-1 during his time at WSC; Was named assistant head / offensive line coach at Fresno State under head coach Pat Hill in 1997 where he spent the next six seasons (1997-2003); In 2004, accepted a position as the offensive line coach at the University of Nebraska where he was for three years prior to accepting the head coaching job at Western Carolina on New Year's Eve, 2007.

#### • Additional Facts Worth Knowing:

- Wagner took over a Wayne State College program in 1989 that had dropped 12-consecutive games and had only won two of its last 29 games overall

- In his last four seasons at Wayne State, the Wildcats finished now lower than third nationally in total offense, leading the nation with a 581.5 yards per game average in 1993;

- For his efforts in turning the Wayne State program around, Wagner was inducted into the WSC Hall of Fame in 2005; he was also twice named the Nebraska Coach of the Year by the Omaha *World-Herald* in 1990 and '93.

- In each of his last two years at Fresno State, one of his offensive linemen earned first-team freshman All-America honors, including tackle Logan Mankins (an eventual NFL first-round selection) in 2002 and center Kyle Young in '03 ... Wagner helped lead the Bulldogs to bowl games in each of his last five seasons (99-03);

- Went to a pair of bowl games while at Nebraska, including winning the 2005 Alamo Bowl ... he also coached two All-Big XII linemen in 2005-06 and had three players go onto the NFL.

Thundering Herd dropped 18-straight conference games from 1977 through 1979 – ending the drought with a 13-13 tie with WCU ... Davidson, despite not playing a full conference slate, lost 28-straight SoCon games from 1974 through 1986 ... VMI holds the dubious honor of the longest skid at 32 games from 1996-2000.

**TELLING STATISTIC:** All told, Western Carolina has only won five of its last 29 games (5-24) dating back to the 2006 season.

**DROPPING BACK:** QB **Zack Jaynes** threw for a career-high 302 yards on a career-best 33 completions, distributing the ball to 10 different Catamounts, but it wasn't enough to overcome an early 21-0 deficit as Western Carolina fell on the road, 28-21, to No. 21/20 Furman Paladins ... After falling behind by three scores midway through the second quarter, Western twice cut Furman's lead to seven points in the second half. Jaynes drove the Catamounts from their own 26 yard line to the Paladin 18 on its final possession before a fourth down pass fell incomplete at the goal line with 24 seconds remaining.

**JAYNES HAS CAREER-DAY IN FIRST START; NAMED SoCon FR OF THE WEEK:** Western Carolina red-shirt freshman Zack Jaynes made his first collegiate start last Saturday at Furman ... the Canton, N.C., native completed a career-best 33 passes for a career-high 302 yards and two touchdowns, accounting for all three WCU scores with his first-career rushing TD also ... Jaynes was only sacked once by the SoCon leader in the category, Furman's defense ... For his efforts, Jaynes was **named SoCon Freshman of the Week** – the second honor for WCU in that category this season (*Quan Warley after the PC game*) ... Since WCU joined the Southern Conference in 1977, Jaynes is the sixth freshman/red-shirt freshman to start at QB for the Catamounts: **Lonnie Galloway** (4 games in 1990 as true freshman); **Josh Brooks** (1 game 1994 as red-shirt freshman); **Mark Smith** (1987) ... **Russell Hemby** (3 games in 2004 as red-shirt freshman); and **Adam Hearn** (3 starts in 2007 as red-shirt freshman).

**MORE FROM FURMAN:** In addition to Jaynes tallying his first-career rushing touchdown, WCU's two other touchdowns represented the career firsts, too ... freshman WR **Andrius Thomas** hauled in a 13-yard scoring strike from Jaynes for his first career TD late in the first half ... Early in the second half, junior **Kyle Garland** caught a 12-yard pass for his first career score ... WCU's defense held Furman 100 yards below its seasonal passing average – the Paladins came into the contest averaging 235 yards per game through the air, with WCU only allowing 135 in the loss ... Furman's defense did lead the SoCon in sacks by coming into the contest (16) – however, the Paladins were only able to sack Jaynes once, and have slipped into second in that category (*Wofford, this week's opponent, now leads with 18 sacks on the season*).

**ENDING CONSECUTIVE START STREAKS:** WCU senior OL **Kevin Wiggins** had his team-leading streak of consecutive starts snapped last week at Furman with 28-straight games started ... He played in the game after injuries along the offensive line forced him into the lineup despite a groin injury ... senior DL **Jeff Bradley** currently holds the consecutive-start streak lead at 24 games – a mark that is in question as Bradley appeared on the team's injury report this week ... senior OL **James Singletary** is second at 22-straight, followed by junior S Chris Collins (18) and junior LB **Quintin Phillips** (16).

**PITTMAN CLOSING IN ON 1,000:** Catamount red-shirt sophomore WR **Marquel Pittman** is closing in on the 1,000-yard career receiving plateau ... Currently with 965 career receiving yards, **Pittman is just 35 yards shy of reaching 1,000** for his WCU career.

**INABILITY TO CONVERT TURNOVERS:** After taking three games to create its first turnover, the Catamount defense has nine takeaways in its last four games ... However, WCU has only been able to translate those nine gifts into six points on a pair of field goals. Conversely, opponents have turned 12 WCU turnovers into 26 points – four TDs with a missed and a blocked extra point. Charting Western's turnover - scoring issues:

**BOSTIC BOOTS CAREER LONG:** Catamount place-kicker, Blake Bostic, booted a career-long, 43-yard field goal against Samford ... His previous long was 39 yards at Presbyterian ... Bostic is in his first season as WCU's primary kicker.

**MORE CAREER NUMBERS FOR WCU VS. SAMFORD:** Catamount senior receiver **Donald James** caught eight passes for a career-best 82 yards in the loss against Samford ... James is a converted defensive back – making the conversion two seasons ago in spring practice to help bolster the WR numbers ... junior transfer LB **Adrian McLeod** recorded a career-high 14 tackles against the Bulldogs.

**CHRIS COLLINS – DEFENSIVE BALL HAWK:** WCU junior DB **Chris Collins** has forced a SoCon-leading three fumbles this season, tallying his third at The Citadel after ripping the ball out of the hands of Bulldog running back Asheton Jordan midway through the first quarter ... Although only officially credited with three forced fumbles this season, Collins pressured the PC quarterback helping force a fumble that the Catamounts took away when Jeff Bradley fell on the loose football.

**NEW TURF INSTALLED AT WHITMIRE:** The Samford game on Homecoming was Western's first game played on the new turf surface at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field ... WCU first installed AstroTurf at the new facility in 1973 ... the surface was replaced several times before AstroPlay was installed during the summer of 2000 ... Following the Liberty game back on Sept. 13, Carolina Green Corporation removed the old surface and installed the Desso Challenge Pro 2 turf, a product of the overseas Desso Sports Systems. WCU has the same turf that is cur-

rently only being used at Oklahoma State, Wyoming and Northern Colorado.

**CATAMOUNTS IN THE ENDZONE FOR THE 1ST-TIME:** Of Western's 11 touchdowns scored this season, **FIVE** represent the first career scores for those particular individuals:

**VS. SHORTER:** Of the five touchdowns scored in the opener against Shorter, three were recorded by Catamounts tallying their first-ever scores in the purple & gold ... Junior transfer **Jayson Williams** (Central Florida) reached pay-dirt for the first-time as a Catamount with a 24-yard romp late in the second quarter ... senior **Donald James** caught a career-high nine passes for 61 yards including a 14-yard TD strike from Horn just before halftime ... And finally, red-shirt freshman wideout **Josh Cockrell**, seeing his first collegiate action, pulled in a four-yard score midway through the fourth quarter from Hearn;

**VS. LIBERTY:** **Quan Warley** tallied his first collegiate score on a 15-yard gallop around the left side.

**AT THE CITADEL:** In a double-dip first, red-shirt freshman Zack Jaynes tossed his first career scoring strike, finding freshman Nate Harris for his both his first career reception and first career touchdown on the 10-yard play ... And although red-shirt sophomore **Adam Hearn** has rushed and passed for a career TD, his hook-up in the third quarter with senior **Andy Horn** was his first receiving score.

**AT FURMAN:** Freshman WR **Andrerius Thomas** and junior WR **Kyle Garland** each scored their first career TDs against the Paladins ... also, in his first career start, R-FR quarterback Zack **Jaynes** tallied his first rushing score.

**CATAMOUNTS END ROAD WOES:** Western's victory over Presbyterian in Clinton on Sept. 20 snapped the Catamounts' 14-game road losing skid which dated back to '05 when it defeated Chattanooga, 38-20, at Finley Sta-

dium ... Last Saturday's win was also WCU's eighth-straight over Presbyterian dating back to 1970 – giving WCU a 9-8 series advantage – and its' first in Clinton since 1976, snapping PC's six-game home winning streak overall.

**WARLEY GOES FOR 202 AT PRESBYTERIAN:** Eclipsing the 100-yard rushing barrier for the first-time in his collegiate career, R-Fr. Quan Warley racked up a **career-best 202 yards on 29 carries** in Western's road win over Presbyterian ... Warley became just the eighth different Catamount to surpass 200 yards rushing in a single-game ... His performance was also just the 10th, 200-yard rushing performance in school history and WCU's first since Fred Boateng rushed for 213 against Georgia Southern in 2000 ... Warley is the third freshman to rush for 200 yards in school history joining Darryl Jackson (vs. Mars Hill, 200 yards, 10/10/87) and Darius Hooks (vs. Wofford, 203 yards 9/14/96) ... For his efforts, **Warley was named Southern Conference Freshman of the Week**, the first weekly award in his career ... A former two-time AP North Carolina State Player of the Year who is coming off a broken ankle suffered in pre-season practice a year ago.

**PITTMAN ECLIPSES 100-YARD MARK FOR 4TH TIME:** Red-shirt sophomore receiver Marquel Pittman turned in his fourth career 100-yard receiving performance at Presbyterian last Saturday ... It is the second-time this season that Pittman has gone over 100 yards in a game, also doing so in the opener against Shorter College (109 yds).

**WARLEY-PITTMAN VS. PRESBY:** With Quan Warley surpassing the 200-yard rushing mark and Marquel Pittman going over the century mark in receiving yardage in the win at Presbyterian, it marked the first-time in WCU history that the Catamounts had a 200-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver in the same game.

**PHILLIPS EARNS DEFENSIVE WEEKLY AWARD:** Western Carolina junior linebacker Quintin Phillips was named Defensive Player of the Week by the Southern Conference on Sept. 15. It is the third time over the past two seasons that Phillips has garnered the weekly award from the conference office ... Phillips recorded a season-high 16 tackles, including four solo stops, last Saturday night against the 25th-ranked Liberty Flames. Despite the loss, WCU held the Flames' offense—which entered the game averaging 46.5 points in its first two wins on the season—to 19 points.

**CATAMOUNT SPECIAL TEAMS BLOCK PARTY:** With the blocked field goal by Catamount **Chris Everett** in the second quarter against Liberty, Western Carolina has blocked a field goal attempt by an opponent in two of its first six games of the season—both coming at home. Junior transfer **Adrian McLeod** blocked a field goal attempt by Shorter in WCU's home-opener on August 28 ... In addition, McLeod was credited with a blocked extra point in the loss to Liberty.

**ANDY HORN HONORED BY THE SOCON OFFICE:** Following Western's season-opening win over the Shorter College Hawks, senior quarterback Andy Horn was honored by the league by being **named the Southern Conference Student-Athlete of the Week** ... the honor, which recognizes both excellence both on and off the field, was the first of Horn's career and the first for WCU this season ... the Charlotte, N.C., native made just his second career start – and only his second career appearance – and found a rhythm early as he completed 22-of-33 passes for 262 yards, while also tossing his first two TD passes in the win ... In the classroom, Horn boasts a 3.943 GPA – the highest on the Catamount football team – while majoring in Philosophy. He was also named to the SoCon Academic Honor Roll in 2007-08.



#### FLORIDA STATE FALL-OUT AND FOLLOW-UP:

\* The Western Carolina-Florida State game officially endured 134 minutes – or two hours and 14 minutes – of delays ... Add in that it was televised by SunSports/FSN Florida, the game took five hours and 18 minutes to play;

\* The 69-points scored by Florida State were the most WCU had allowed to a FCS team to score since Florida lit the board for 62 back in 2006 ... it also represented the second-most points allowed by a Catamount defense in school history (79 in 2007 at ASU) ... the 69-point margin of defeat was the worst in WCU school-history, surpassing the 67-0 loss at North Carolina State in 1990.

**WCU BLANKS SHORTER TO OPEN WAGNER ERA:** Five different Catamounts scored, including three tallying their first-ever touchdowns as Catamounts, as Western Carolina blanked the Shorter College Hawks, 35-0, in Cullowhee last Thursday night ... WCU used four, first-half touchdowns to stake itself to a 28-0 halftime advantage, adding a fourth quarter score to provide the final tally ... the win **snapped a seven-game losing skid** for Western which dated back to Sept. 29, 2007 last season.

**WESTERN CAROLINA IN SEASON OPENERS:** Western Carolina improved to 13-20 in season openers since joining the Southern Conference in 1976 ... **WCU has won four of its last five season openers** (W vs. West Virginia State, 2004; Mars Hill, 2005; Chowan, 2006; Shorter, 2008; L at Alabama, 2007) ... Of the 13-20 record in season opening games, **Western is 10-1 when the game is played at home** and 4-19 on the road.

**WCU IN HOME OPENERS AT WHITMIRE STADIUM:** Including the win over Shorter College, Western Carolina is now 27-8 in home openers since moving into E.J. Whitmire

## HISTORY OF THE CATAMOUNT:

In 2008, Western Carolina University will celebrate the 75th year since becoming known as “the Catamounts.” The “Catamount” nickname evolved as a result of an on-campus contest in 1932. Up until that time, the athletic teams of Western Carolina Teachers College – changed from the Cullowhee State Normal School in 1929 – were referred to as “the Teachers.”

Through additional research, an additional moniker of “the Yodelers” used around this same time period was also discovered as documented in annuals.

In 1932, students and faculty alike on campus were invited to participate in naming the athletic teams. The usual names were suggested – Bears, Indians, Panthers. However, the administration wanted an unusual name – a name that few others had and one that everyone would not copy.

The contest came down to a final two: Mountain Boomer, which was a small ground squirrel that scampers around the wooded Cullowhee campus and was extremely difficult to catch; and the Catamounts. The latter of the two was preferred by head football coach – and the organizer of Western's first athletic department – C.C. Poindexter. He wanted his football players to be Catamounts with “the fierce spirit, savage attacks and lightning quick moves” in which the native mountain cats possessed.

Although the name was decided upon in 1932, the WCTC football team of 1933 was the first team to be deemed as “Catamounts.”

Webster's Dictionary defines “Catamount” as “any of various wildcats, such as a cougar or lynx.” Cats of the catamount variety, including the bobcat, roam the southern Appalachian Mountains where Western Carolina University is located. It is also thought to be a local vernacular term shortened from “cat-a-mountain,” or any variety of the feline species residing in the area.

WCU is only one of two schools in the nation – and the only football-playing institution – that uses the nickname “Catamounts,” with the University of Vermont in Burlington, VT being the only other school playing under that moniker. Ironically enough, through the 2007-08 athletic year Western Carolina and Vermont have not met on the playing field or court.

As Western Carolina celebrates its “diamond” anniversary of being known as “the Catamounts,” the University is amidst a branding change. To help celebrate the 75th anniversary, WCU athletics unveiled a new mark on August 13, 2008 that will become synonymous with its teams and department.

The personification of the Catamount logo has undergone numerous changes since 1933. All told, at least 14 different versions of the mark have existed since its inception in '33. Since 1975, Western Carolina has employed five recognizable logos, with new mark in 2008 representing the fifth.

From 1975 until 1981, WCU used a slightly tilted, smiling cat logo, which is still prevalent on the “Old Mountain Jug.” In '81, a new, front-view mark was introduced. That logo represented the Catamounts through the 1983 NCAA Division I-AA Football National Championship appearance; eight NCAA baseball regional appearances; as well as the 1996 Southern Conference Men's Basketball Championship and trip to Albuquerque, New Mexico for the NCAA Tournament. Its' 16-year run as the face of WCU athletics is the longest on record.

Dr. John Bardo, who became chancellor of WCU in 1995, commissioned the design of a new Catamount insignia that “depicted the more aggressive stance WCU was taking in all its academic and athletic programs.” In June of 1996, the new sleek, side-looking Catamount mark was unveiled with its variation incorporating the full body in a “leaping” motion.

In 2003, under the direction of athletic director Jeff Compher, the side-looking mark from 1996 was tweaked to again create a front-facing, “flying” or “hugging” logo that also included purple mountains in the background and the school name, “Western Carolina” in the forefront.

This year's evolution of the Catamount logo was designed the Rickabaugh Graphics in Gahanna, Ohio. It is a return to a side-view of the cat and better represents the spirit instilled by Poindexter back in 1933. Accompanying the new mark is a return to a deeper purple and old golden color as in recent years, the gold had been substituted for a brighter, yellow-gold color in most sports other than football.



Stadium in 1974 ... the **Catamounts have won 11-consecutive openers** at home since 1998 ... WCU has also won 16 of the last 17 home openers dating back to the 1992 season.

**NEW CATAMOUNT FACES:** Glancing down Western's roster, one will notice a lot of new faces. WCU returns six offensive players that started three-or-more games a year ago, with the defensive unit featuring seven players that made three-or-more starts ... Of Western's 100-man roster, 52 are new to Cullowhee; 11 are returning redshirts seeing their first action; and 37 are returning letterwinners from a season ago.

**RENAISSANCE MAN ADAM HEARNS:** Not the starting quarterback, no problem for red-shirt sophomore **Adam Hearns** ... the WCU coaching staff found a way to keep the Philadelphia, Pa., native involved – and on the field ... Hearns lined up as a wideout, catching one pass for 18 yards ... he rushed seven times for 34 yards despite suffering a 10-yard loss on a swing pass play that went behind the line of scrimmage and into the books as a rushing play ... Hearns also returned the lone kickoff 29 yards, and dropped back on punt returns, tallying three for 22 yards ... he also saw time under center, completing 5-of-6 passes for 34 yards and a TD pass – the 13th of his WCU career.

**COMMEMORATING 1983 – 25TH ANNIVERSARY IN '08:** In 2008, Western Carolina will commemorate the 25th anniversary of the 1983 Catamount Football team, which was the FIRST Southern Conference squad to advance to the NCAA FCS (I-AA) National Championship. The '83 Catamounts strung together 12-consecutive unbeaten weeks and won a school-record 11 games. WCU was also the first team in NCAA football history to play 15 games in a single-season. The Catamount Sports Network with Hall of Famer, Steve White, will highlight the season during halftime of its broadcasts this season.

**O BROTHER WHERE ART THOU?** Brothers **James** and **Gene Singletary** share more than their bloodline. Both came to Western Carolina as tight ends and have been asked to move to other positions in their time in Cullowhee to help offset injuries.

**James**, a redshirt senior who sat out three seasons ago with an injury, wears jersey number 52. Looking back two seasons, he started at three games at tight end; one at defensive tackle; and served as a backup at offensive guard while also starting twice at right tackle.

Last year, the Kernersville, N.C., native started the first three games at right tackle before moving to left tackle where he started the remaining eight games.

**Gene**, a junior, was moved to the defensive front from his tight end position during preseason two seasons ago. Last season, Gene made three starts along the front line and recorded WCU's first takeaway of the season when he sacked Georgia QB Matthew Stafford, forcing a fumble.

Catamount Football is a family affair for the Singletary's – their cousin, Wendell, was an offensive lineman at WCU during the 2003-05 seasons.

**GOLD HELMETS RETURN FOR FIRST-TIME SINCE 1968:** With the new brand logo for the 2008 season, Western's football team also has a new look. For just the third time in school history, WCU has gone away from the purple helmet, donning a "golden dome" this season.

In the mid-1960s, the Catamounts had solid gold helmets, returning to purple in 1969 when former head coach Bob Waters took over. Then, in the 1989 season under first-year head coach Dale Strahm, WCU had a "yellow" look similar to LSU's helmets. This year's metallic gold helmet features the new Catamount logo with three "cat scratch" marks down the center with a deep purple face mask.



**CATCHING THE CATAMOUNTS ON THE TUBE:** Western Carolina is scheduled to make THREE appearances on television: the Catamounts' game at Florida State was broadcast on a Pay-Per-View basis by SunSports / FSN Florida. Homecoming was broadcast by WLOS-TV out of Asheville, while WCU's season-finale—the gridiron grudge match, annual "Battle for the Old Mountain Jug"—will be featured during the Southern Conference's "SoCon Saturday" on SportSouth ... Since 2002, Western Carolina has had at least one television appearance a season, making two-or-more appearances on the tube each of the past four seasons including five TV games in 2007.

**WCU UNVEILS NEW LOGO:** Western Carolina University unveiled its new athletics logos at the "Big Reveal," held in the Liston B. Ramsey Regional Activity Center on Wednesday, August 14. As a surprise addition, WCU Chancellor Dr. John Bardo and head football coach Dennis Wagner also unleashed the new-look Catamount football helmet ... A crowd of nearly 1,000 fans and supporters were on hand to witness the unveiling, which was accompanied by a highlight video that recapped the first 75 years of Western Carolina athletic teams competing under the "Catamount" moniker. ... As part of the athletics image update, Western also is reverting to original shades of its school colors of purple and gold, with a deeper purple and traditional gold replacing bright hues of purple and yellow used in recent years.

## LAST YEAR in CULLOWHEE

Wofford 47, Western Carolina 44

**Cullowhee, N.C.** - Outsoring the 11th-ranked Wofford Terriers 41-to-10 in the second half, Western Carolina mounted a monstrous comeback after intermission for the third-consecutive week before falling by three, 47-44, on a Thursday night in front of a national television audience on ESPNU at E.J. Whitmire Stadium/Bob Waters Field.

The WCU receiving tandem of senior Eddie Cohen and red-shirt freshman **Marquel Pittman** each eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark with 124 yards and two touchdowns apiece to lead the second stanza charge. Of the combined 248 yards between the duo, 210 of it came in the second half as Pittman was limited to just 23 yards on a pair of catches and Cohen had just one reception for 15 yards in the first 30 minutes of play.

It was the first time since 2004 that two Catamount receivers had surpassed the 100-yard plateau in the same game. For Cohen, it was his fifth-straight game with 100-or-more yards receiving.

After watching Wofford score on each of its first six possessions—which translated into surrendering 21 first quarter points and 16 in the second—Western trailed at intermission, 37-3. But after the break, Western scored twice for every one Terrier score during its comeback.

All told, Western held a 298-to-142 yardage edge in the second half over the Terriers.

Junior **Quintin Phillips**, who is a two-time SoCon Defensive Player of the Week this season, led the way for the Catamount defense with his fourth double-digit tackles outing of the season finishing with 17 stops, including five solo hits and one tackle for loss.

Wofford was not without its highlights, though, as the Terriers amassed 513 yards of total offense, including 397 yards on the ground alone in the win. Running backs Kevious Johnson and Adrian Young combined for 243 yards and three scores on the ground, gaining 128 and 115, respectively. Michael Hobbs also rushed for a pair of scores with just 28 yards, while Dane Romero rushed five times for 48 yards and a score.

The Terriers capitalized on an early WCU fumble and blocked punt inside the opening six minutes of the game to stake itself to a 14-point lead in which it would never relinquish. Also, Western had a goal line situation midway through the second quarter, but was stopped on four-consecutive plays to remain scoreless, 28-0. Wofford responded to the fourth-and-goal stop with a 12-play, 98-yard drive to go up 34-0 before a Jonathan Parsons' field goal snapped the Terriers' consecutive scores.

## LAST MEETING AT GIBBS STADIUM

Wofford 35, Western Carolina 7

**Spartanburg, S.C.** - Western Carolina senior tailback Darius Fudge rushed for 132 yards on 26 carries (5.1 yards per attempt), which propelled him to 10th on the Catamount all-time rushing yards list with 2,075, but it was not enough to overcome Wofford's 337 yards on the ground as the Terriers pulled away late for a 35-7 decision over the Catamounts at Gibbs Stadium.

Also, despite the setback, junior receiver Michael Hines hauled in a career-high 10 passes, while classmate Eddie Cohen averaged 19.5 yards on his four receptions for 78 yards.

The Terriers controlled the game early. After a Stephen Brown punt backed Wofford up on its own 10, the Terriers put together a six-play, 90-yard drive - highlighted by a 25-yard Dane Romero touchdown - to take a 7-0 lead on their first possession.

Wofford looked to be backed up again early in the second quarter after a 50-yard Tim Mayse punt, but a WCU penalty allowed the Terriers to start their drive on the Catamount 39. Wofford built on that momentum with a one-play, 61-yard TD pass from Josh Collier to Justice Joslin. On its next possession, Wofford went back to its methodical style of play, grinding out a seven-play, 90-yard scoring drive, capped by Collier's three-yard run.

Western defense kept Wofford off the board in the third, thanks to a forced punt after a long drive and a missed Terrier field goal. The Catamounts were also having success moving the ball on offense and had the momentum. However, as the third quarter drew to a close, Swygert was sacked and fumbled, which Wofford's Kyle Horne recovered on the Terrier 20. Wofford only need three plays to score, coming on a Kevious Johnson nine-yard run, to make the tally 28-7 in Wofford's favor and essentially sealing the win.

Wofford did tack on a final score with just under six minutes to play to provide the final 35-7 margin.

Western, who was forced to put the ball in the air more in the second half, was sacked five times in the contest. Coming into the game, Western's offensive line had only allowed seven sacks in seven games and had not allowed a sack since the Elon game - a span of two games and 72 pass attempts.

For Western, Swygert, who left the game in the fourth quarter for the third consecutive week due to re-injuring his ankle, finished by completing 14-of-23 passes for 108 yards and a score. Todd Spitzer came off the bench to complete 5-of-9 passes for 60 yards.

**FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES IN FIRST-EVER GAME:**

After Western Carolina's season-opening, 35-0 win over Shorter College, Catamount first-year head coaches have combined to go 5-5-2 in their first-ever games dating back to 1931 ... **Dennis Wagner became the first Catamount first-year skipper to pitch a shutout in his opening game** ... Bob Waters – WCU's all-time winningest head coach – posted the best-ever first season by going 9-1 in 1969, opening the year with a victory:

**WESTERN CAROLINA TABBED 8TH IN BOTH PRESEASON SoCon POLLS:**

At the annual Southern Conference Media Rouser held in Greenville, S.C., on July 23, the Catamounts were tabbed eighth out of nine teams by both the SoCon head coaches ... Three-time defending national champion, Appalachian State, was selected as a near-unanimous choice to repeat as league champions. The Mountaineers garnered eight first-place votes and 64 total points in the poll in which coaches were not permitted to vote for the own team. Elon earned one first-place vote and 47 total points to sit in the second slot, followed by defending co-champion Wofford (45 points) in third, Georgia Southern (44) fourth and Furman (41) was tabbed to place fifth ... Rounding out the coaches' preseason tab was The Citadel (37) in the sixth spot, followed by Chattanooga (19), Western Carolina (17) and SoCon-newcomer Samford (10).

**TRIO OF CATAMOUNTS LAND ON PRESEASON ALL-SoCon TEAMS:**

Western Carolina landed three players on the 2008 preseason All-Southern Conference teams as selected by the Southern Conference's nine head football coaches and announced at the 2008 SoCon Football Rouser in Greenville, S.C. ... senior offensive lineman **Kevin Wiggins**, senior defensive lineman **Jeff Bradley** and junior linebacker **Quintin Phillips** were each named to their respective second teams. It is the second-straight year that Western has put three players on the preseason honorary team.

**Wiggins (#73, 6-4, 270, OL)** has started every game for the Catamounts on the offensive line for the past two seasons (22-consecutive entering 2008). The Charlotte, N.C., native will anchor WCU's line from a variety of positions, mostly playing as the center the past two years. Two seasons ago, Wiggins led an offensive front that allowed former running back Darius Fudge to rush for 1,000 yards.

**Bradley (#41, 6-2, 275, DL)**, a senior from Lewisville, N.C., was tabbed second team all-conference by the SoCon Sports Media Association a season ago after ranking second in the league – and 28th nationally – with a team-best 15.0 tackles for loss. He was also tied for third in the conference with 4.5 sacks. For his career, Bradley has 73 total tackles, including 43 solo stops and 19 tackles for loss, a dozen shy of making Western Carolina's all-time top 10 TFL career charts.

**Phillips (#50, 6-0, 235 LB)**, a junior from Charlotte, N.C., earned second team All-SoCon accolades from the league's head coaches and a first-team nod from the media after transferring to WCU prior to last season. With five double-digit tackle games including the top two in the conference on the year, he finished with 127 total tackles – the sixth-best, single-season in school history – and the most for a Catamount defender since 1997. He additionally ranked second in the SoCon and tied for 10th nationally. His seasonal performance earned him two weekly conference defensive honors, as well as an honorable mention on The Sports Network's All-America squad.

**#1 ADAM HEARNS:** Has done it all for Western early in the season – rushed for a touchdown ... thrown a TD pass ... been under center, split wide and in the backfield ... even returned punts and kickoffs; **Entered the Liberty game officially on the two-deep depth chart as a wide receiver** ... Averages 108 all-purpose yards per game ... Is just 25 yards shy of 1,500 passing in his two-year career.

**#5 EVAN WILLIAMS:** A junior college transfer from Santa Rosa CC ... Made his first WCU career carries late in the going at Florida State ... Has fought for playing time behind his synonym, Jayson Williams – no relation – and a pair of red-shirt freshmen in #24 Quan Warley and #20 Josh Wright.

**#6 JAYSON WILLIAMS:** Was listed as Western's starting running back – and indeed started the first two games in the backfield – however, saw limited action against Florida State after the opening series and will share more time in the backfield with #24 Quan Warley ... Transferred to WCU from Central Florida where he was a running back that was converted to the defensive secondary ... **Suffered a knee injury at Furman that could sideline him for the remainder of the season.**

**#7 ANDY HORN:** Despite splitting time under center – and even splitting out as a wideout when red-shirt sophomore #1 Adam Hearns was playing QB – the WCU coaching staff is emphatic that Horn is the Catamount field general ... Entered the season with just one career start; **2008:** The fifth-year senior has four career appearances – all are as a starter ... Has three, 200-yard passing performances this season ... After only averaging 44 yards passing in two career road games – at Florida and Florida State, respectively – Horn surpassed the 200-yard plateau at Presbyterian (239) ... Surpassed 1,000 career passing yards against Samford, doing so on a 29-yard completion to Adam Hearns in the 3rd ... Did not play at #21/20 Furman.

**#8 DONALD JAMES:** A fifth-year senior who has seen limited playing time until this, his senior season ... Was a defensive back who was sent to offense two off-seasons ago because a lack of depth at the position – he stuck and is making a difference with the youthful Catamount receiving corps. ... Caught a career-long 20-yard pass at Georgia Southern last season. **2008:** Hauled in his first career touchdown pass against Shorter ... Ranks among team and conference leaders in catches per game, averaging just over 5 ... Caught his second career TD pass at Presbyterian ... Recorded a **career-high with 82 yards receiving** on eight catches in the home loss to Samford ... **Suffered a high ankle sprain at Furman** – expected to be out at least one more week.

**#9 ROBERT PEELE:** Transferred to Western Carolina from California ... Suffered a season-ending knee injury (*was scheduled to have surgery the week following the Liberty game*) against Shorter ... Is expected to try and apply for a medical hardship through the NCAA.

**#10 CHRIS COLLINS:** One of the Catamount defensive secondary "hitmen," who ranked among the team leaders in tackles a season ago. **2008:** Ranks second on the team in tackles ... Has forced a team – and SoCon – leading three fumbles this season officially ... He also applied pressure that led to a fourth fumble at Presbyterian.

**#11 KYLE GARLAND:** A local, Western North Carolina product that is turning into a sure-handed, possession receiver ... Does not possess game-breaker speed, but is a tough, hard-nosed receiver ... Posted a career-best 13 catches for 160 yards a year ago. **2008:** Despite being held without a catch versus Liberty, already has six receptions for 56 yards through three games to date ... **Posted a career-high 60-yards receiving** in addition to **hauling in his first career receiving touchdown at Furman**, a 12-yard strike from red-shirt freshman QB Zack Jaynes.

**#12 ZACK JAYNES:** A red-shirt freshman who was a local standout at Canton's Pisgah High. **2008:** Was amidst the three-way battle for starting quarterback, and was even with Adam Hearns on the depth chart until the Liberty week ... When Hearns moved to a first-string receiver, Jaynes makes the jump to second on the QB depth chart ... Saw his first collegiate action against Shorter, completing 3-of-4 passes but saw his drive stall on fourth down ... Guided his first TD scoring drive at The Citadel, connecting with freshman Nate Harris from 10 yards out for his first career passing score ... Previously saw his most extensive action against Samford, setting career-highs for passes attempted (33), completions (20) and passing yards (162) ... Set a **career-high with 302 yards passing** on a career-best 33 completions at Furman ... Named **SoCon Freshman of the Week**.

**#16 ANTOINE GEORGE:** Missed the Florida State game with a knee injury – it was the first game in his three-year WCU career he had missed (23-straight games) ... **#20 JOSH WRIGHT:** Red-shirt freshman that has been third off the bench into the Catamount offensive backfield as Jayson Williams and Quan Warley have split carries ... Has played a big role on special teams making numerous tackles on kick coverage.

**#22 DARREL GRAY:** Has made 10-straight starts in WCU's defensive backfield, fourth among the active defenders ... One of three Catamounts on roster that have recorded an interception. **2008:** Was credited with blocking the field goal attempt by Shorter College in the season opener ... Injured his shoulder in the Liberty game, but saw limited action at Presbyterian – but started and was full-strength against The Citadel.

**#24 QUAN WARLEY:** Red-shirt freshman that is coming off a broken ankle a year ago that sidelined the highly touted recruit ... Was a two-time AP North Carolina State Player of the Year, joining the elite class of Nick Maddox (who played at Florida State) and Chris Leak (who played at Florida) as the only two-time recipients. **2008:** Earned his first collegiate touch in the Shorter College win, an eight-yard rush ... Posted a career-high 14 carries for 38 yards at Florida State, but showed the flashes of brilliance that had earned him the two AP honors ... Rushed for a then-career-best 58 yards and **tallied his first collegiate rushing touchdown** against Liberty, a 15-yard romp around the left end in the first quarter ... Rushed a **career-high 29 times** for a **career-best 202 yards** in the road win over Presbyterian ... Named **Southern Conference Freshman of the Week** following the PC win ... Did not start at Furman, and wasn't expected to play until an injury to Jayson Williams forced him into the lineup.

**#25 ANDREW ROGERS:** Was listed as a fullback last season, making the transition in the new offense to tight end ... Entering this season, had a 50-percent, catch-to-touchdown ratio with, at the time, four career receptions, two of which went for touchdowns ... Missed the Presbyterian game due to injury ... **Caught a career-high eight passes** for a career-best 40 yards receiving at Furman.

**#27 ABRAM SCOTT:** The younger brother of defensive line coach, John Scott ... spent most of the 2007 season on special teams. **2008:** In his first career start at Florida State, responded with a career-high seven solo tackles ... Missed the Presbyterian game due to injury but is expected back for The Citadel game.

**#29 CHRIS EVERETT:** Suffered a broken forearm during preseason practice in 2007, forcing him to take a medical red-shirt ... Originally listed as a defensive end, possesses great speed that is being utilized as a drop / cover linebacker. **2008:** Blocked a low-line drive Liberty Flame field goal attempt with his vertical leaping ability.

**#32 LEVON CURTIS:** A back-up running back / wide receiver who has seen most of his time on special teams ... Averaged over 30-yards per return on two kickoff returns against Florida State ... Has seen limited time in the backfield, mostly on special teams.

**#33 JOE CLARK-DEAR:** A converted fullback who was moved to the defensive line to start the 2008 season ... Has returned a couple of short kickoffs this season.

**#34 RICKY SCHWARZ:** A back-up freshman linebacker from Florida who has averaged two tackles per game ... Made his **first career start** against Presbyterian ... **Forced a fumble** that John Julien pounced on giving WCU its first takeaway of the season.

# WESTERN CAROLINA ANNOUNCES ITS 2008 ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS

Western Carolina University will induct five into its Athletics Hall of Fame the first weekend in November. WCU will honor four of its All-America selections and a veteran of the National Football League. Three former football players, a highly honored baseball player and a record setting track & field standout are included in the star-studded induction class.

The 19th-annual induction ceremony will be held prior to the Western Carolina--Chattanooga football game on Nov. 1.

The 2008 class includes former football players **John Ruta** (1962-65), **Alonzo Carmichael** (1983-86) and **Brad Hoover** (1996-99) along with track and field star **Tony McKennie** (1986-90) and baseball standout **Jason Beverlin** (1992-94).

**Ruta**, a defensive back on Western's All-20th Century Football Team, began his playing career as a quarterback in 1962 and led the Catamounts to a stunning upset of East Carolina. He was also the starting signal caller in 1963, but moved to the defensive secondary in '64 despite passing for over 1,000 yards as a freshman and sophomore.



The Plant City, Fla., product responded with a banner season as he led the '64 Catamounts in tackles and set single-season records for interceptions and pass breakups, returning two picks for touchdowns. His amazing transition season was noticed throughout the nation as he was named NAIA All-America, the first defensive back in WCU history to be so honored. As captain of the '65 team, Ruta started in both the defensive backfield and at defensive end. He led the team in three statistical categories.

In addition to All-America honors, Ruta was a two-time All-Carolinas Conference selection and an NAIA District 26 All-Star. He graduated in 1966 and is currently a partner with KRG&C Certified Public Accountants in Orlando, FL.

**Carmichael** is one of only five WCU football players to be named All-America in multiple seasons, and was selected as the tight end on Western's All-20th Century Football Team. A native of Lake View, S.C., he was a first team Associated Press (AP) All-America selection in 1985 when he caught 55 passes for 587 yards, a school record for tight ends. During that '85 season, he caught 11 passes in the Furman game and had 130 yards in receptions at Georgia Tech.

Carmichael followed up in 1986 with 31 receptions for nearly 400 yards and was named to the AP's second team All-America squad. He captained the 1985 and '86 Catamounts and was a two-time first team All-Southern Conference selection.

Carmichael is currently is an information specialist for Telamon Corporation in Martinsburg, West Virginia.

**Hoover** arrived in Cullowhee in 1996 from Ledford High as an overlooked running back. He left four seasons later as one of the most heralded players in Catamount



football history and is currently in his ninth season with the NFL's Carolina Panthers, where he has become a fan favorite.

As a Catamount, Hoover rushed for 3,616 career yards - second-most in school history - which included a WCU single-season record 1,663 yards in 1998. His

251 rushing yards and then Southern Conference record-tying five touchdowns against VMI in '98 are also school records. That same season, the Thomasville, N.C., native keyed an upset of arch-rival Appalachian State with 195 rushing yards on a school-record 49 carries.

"Hoov," as he was affectionately known, was a two-time All-SoCon selection, led his teams in rushing for three seasons and is listed in WCU's all-time top 10 in game, season and career rushing yards as well as game, season and career scoring.

**McKennie** became the first WCU's track and field athlete to be named NCAA All-America when he finished fourth in the 400-meter hurdle event at the 1989 NCAA Division I Track and Field Championships in Provo, Utah. The Riverdale, Georgia product was named All-SoCon a combined 21 times during his collegiate career from 1986-89, and placed in four indoor events (55-meter hurdles, 400-meter hurdles, 800-meter run and 4x100-meter relay) and four outdoor events (110-meter hurdles, 400-meter hurdles, 4x100-meter relay and 4x400-meter relay).

McKennie was the SoCon champion for four-consecutive years in the outdoor 400-meter hurdles while also winning three other events. He was ranked 38th in the world in the 400-meter hurdles in 1989-90, and participated in two United States Olympic Festivals.

**Beverlin** is the most honored pitcher in Western Carolina baseball history. He was a consensus All-America selection, SoCon Pitcher and Male Athlete of the Year, a two-time All-Atlantic Region All-Star and helped lead WCU to three-consecutive NCAA Regional meets from 1992 through 1994. In addition, he was named to the SoCon's 75th Anniversary Baseball Team, meaning he was voted one of the six best pitchers in the conference, 1921 to 1996.

Only pitching for the Catamounts for three seasons, Beverlin won 27 games and was the all-time, single-season leader in wins (12) and led the nation with a school and conference season strikeout record of 154. He also set league benchmark



for consecutive wins in a season (11 in 1994) and most wins in a conference tournament in 1993. In addition, Beverlin was a two-time member of the SoCon All-Academic Team.

Drafted in the fourth round of the 1994 Major League Baseball Draft by the Oakland Athletics, Beverlin pitched in Major Leagues for both the Cleveland Indians and Detroit Tigers.

The product of Royal Oak, Michigan is now the pitching coach for Georgia Southern University

where he is on staff with former Catamounts Rodney Hennon (1990-93) and Mike Tidick (1990-94).

**Cullowhee, N.C.** – Five different Catamounts reached the end zone – including three tallying their first scores as Catamounts – as Western Carolina opened the Dennis Wagner era with a 35-0 shutout victory over the Shorter College Hawks at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

The win snapped a seven-game losing skid which dates back to last season, while also extending Western's winning streak in home openers to 11-straight.

Wagner becomes the fifth WCU head coach all-time to be victorious in his inaugural game. The shutout victory, Western's first since blanking Chowan in the opener in 2006 (42-0), also marked the first-time that the Shorter College Hawks – in the fourth year of NAIA football competition – had been shutout.

Senior quarterback **Andy Horn**, who was not only making just his second career start, but also his second-career appearance, completed a career-best 22-of-33 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns.

Horn's counterparts also got into the mix under center with red-shirt sophomore **Adam Hearn**s and red-shirt freshman **Zack Jaynes** each seeing a series apiece. Hearn, who found himself all over the field offensively Thursday night, tallied 34 yards on the ground and completed 5-of-6 passes for 34 yards and a scoring strike. Jaynes, in his collegiate debut finished 3-for-4 for 22 yards, having his lone time under center end on a failed fourth-and-long conversion attempt.

Two plays into its first offensive series of the year, Western Carolina found pay-dirt en route to the victory. Horn found red-shirt sophomore **Marquel Pittman** on a 56-yard strike down the far sideline to set up Hearn, seeing his first snap of the season lined up as a tailback, for the opening score. Hearn scampered off left tackle for a four-yard touchdown and the early, 7-0, lead.

Horn hooked up with Pittman from six yards out to extend the Catamount lead to 14 on their second possession as WCU officially drove 80 yards in 12 plays to go up two scores. Pittman led all receivers with 106 yards on six catches.

Leading 14-0, the Catamounts were pinned back inside the shadow of their own goal posts after a holding penalty on a Hawk punt pushed WCU back to the four-yard line. However, 12 plays later, junior transfer **Jayson Williams** spun his way 24 yards into the end zone for the 21-0 advantage. Williams accounted for 44 yards on the drive and led all rushers with 90 yards on 14 carries.

Senior **Donald James**, who hauled in a 14-yard TD reception, and red-shirt freshman **Josh Cockrell** each tallied their first collegiate scores on receptions in the victory.

Defensively, the Catamounts played well against their old nemesis - the triple-option. WCU limited Shorter to six first downs and just 142 yards of total offense including 109 on the ground and 33 through the air. WCU also forced two fumbles despite not coming up with a takeaway.

The Catamounts were led by junior Quintin Phillips with seven and a half tackles, including five solo stops, while juniors Antoine George and Chris Collins each finished with five and a half tackles apiece.

**Tallahassee, Fla.** - Trailing by just one touchdown, 7-0, late in the first half, Western Carolina surrendered a trio of scores inside the final 6:54 to allow Florida State to take a commanding advantage into intermission. The Seminoles added four third quarter touchdowns, including three inside the opening 5:15 minutes of the second half, to open the season with a 69-0 victory in front of 73,024 at a rain-soaked Bobby Bowden Field at Doak S. Campbell Stadium.

After concerns during the week preceding the game focused on Tropical Storm Hanna, it was individual storm cells that wreaked havoc on the start of Saturday's game. The teams were chased from the field during pre-game warm-ups for a delay of nearly an hour and a half as thunderstorms, including torrential downpours and lightning, delayed the start until 7:30 pm.

Much like the bolts of lightning that danced all around the stadium initially delaying the start, Florida State struck less than two minutes into the game. Western went three-and-out on its opening possession setting up the score on a punt return. Freshman **Blake Cain**'s boot sailed 44 yards where FSU's Tony Carter raced 68-yards to the end zone and the early lead.

However, before the teams could line up for the ensuing kickoff, a second weather-related delay was put into effect which lasted just under an hour.

Once play resumed, a see-saw, back-and-forth pattern emerged as neither side could manage to scratch the scoreboard. WCU put together one of its better sustained drives of the game with an eight-play, 43 yard drive that stalled at the FSU 37 yard-line and resulted in a punt.

The Seminoles, however, were able to add to their lead midway through the second quarter, capitalizing on a defensive stop of its own. With WCU moving into Seminole territory for the third time in the half offensively, the Catamount offense stalled on fourth and inches at the FSU 44-yard line. As the Florida State defense pinched, Western tried to lob one down the sideline to junior Kyle Garland in one-on-one coverage on the near sideline, but the pass fell incomplete.

Five plays and 56 yards later, FSU's Antoine Smith danced around the left edge and plunged into the end zone for the score, pushing the home squad ahead by two touchdowns, 14-0.

Just before intermission, the fast-strike 'Nole offense went 41 yards on a swing pass play to make it a three-TD lead for Florida State, 21-0, and carried a 28-0 advantage into halftime.

The Seminoles (1-0) posted a 54-yard pass from Ponder to Greg Carr and a pair of D'Vontrey Richards runs—from 52 and seven yards out, respectively—in the opening 5:15 to blow the game open early in the third.

Red-shirt sophomore **Marquel Pittman** led Western Carolina with five catches for 89 yards, including an impressive 28-yard, catch-and-run in which he juked past several Seminole defensive backs. Red-shirt freshman **Quan Warley** rushed a career-best 14 times for 38 yards, while classmate **Josh Wright** touched the ball five times for 23 yards, all positive plays.

**Cullowhee, N.C.** – Trailing by a dozen entering the fourth quarter, Western Carolina scored nine unanswered points in the final frame—including a 78-yard touchdown pass from senior Andy Horn to Marquel Pittman and the first career field goal from junior Blake Bostic. But it was not enough as the 25th-ranked Liberty Flames escaped with a three-point, 19-16, victory at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

Western (1-2) dropped its second-straight contest while Liberty extended the nation's second-longest winning streak dating back to last season by winning its eighth straight, improving to 3-0 on the season. The loss also evened the all-time series between the two schools at three.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Horn and Pittman ignited the crowd of 7,289 on a 78-yard, pass-and-run to pull within six points, 19-13. After catching the pass roughly 12 yards from the line of scrimmage, Pittman ran through four arm tackles, juiced his way past an additional would-be tackler and raced down the left sideline into the end zone.

The Catamount defense forced a three-and-out on the ensuing possession, taking over at its own 25-yard line. Western then drove 54-yards in 12 plays, including a 19-yard strike from Horn to red-shirt sophomore Adam Hearn on a fourth and five from the Liberty 26 yard line.

However, with WCU looking at a first and goal from the Liberty seven-yard line, consecutive losses on a nine-yard sack and a delay of game penalty pushed the Catamounts back to the 21. Back-to-back incomplete passes forced WCU into a 38-yard field goal, a career-long for Bostic to pull within three, 19-16.

Western's defense only allowed the Flames to gain one first down on its next possession, with the Catamounts taking over at their own nine-yard line with 3:34 showing on the game clock.

Starting at the ball game on fourth and three, Horn found red-shirt freshman Quan Warley—who tallied his first collegiate score in the loss—for six yards to keep the drive alive. A pass interference call against Liberty gave the Catamounts the ball at their own 37. Yet, inside the final two minutes, three-consecutive incomplete passes, including the last on fourth and six, ended WCU's quest to pull off the upset.

Western Carolina limited the Flames' offense, which came in averaging 46.5 points per game through its first two wins, to three first-half field goal attempts. Liberty took an early, 3-0, lead after its drive stalled the WCU 19-yard line. Red-shirt freshman Ben Shipp's 29-yard boot split the uprights for the 3-0 lead.

The Catamounts countered, though, just before the end of the opening period. Taking over near midfield, Western moved 54-yards in five plays to take the lead. Warley, sprung by text book blocks on the left side and one thrown by Hearn on the edge, scampered in from 15 yards out. The Thomasville, N.C., native finished with 58 yards rushing on 12 carries, gaining positive yards every time he touched the ball.

On the other two field goal attempts, WCU red-shirt freshman Chris Everett blocked one and Shipp connected on the second to provide the halftime tally, 7-6.

Defensively for WCU, junior Quintin Phillips led all defenders with 16 tackles, while classmate Chris Collins recorded 11, including half a tackle for loss and forced a fumble.

**Clinton, S.C.** – Red-shirt sophomore Marquel Pittman hauled in an acrobatic four-yard scoring strike with just over three minutes showing on the Bailey Memorial Stadium clock. But it wasn't until Presbyterian's Cam Miller hooked a 23-yard field goal wide left that the Catamounts were able to celebrate their first road win since late October, 2005, downing the Blue Hose, 23-21.

The victory snapped Western's 14-game road losing skid which dated back to '05 when the Cats defeated Chattanooga. It also was WCU's eighth-straight over Presbyterian dating back to 1970, and its first in Clinton since 1976, snapping PC's six-game home winning streak.

But the big story of the day was the running of red-shirt freshman Quan Warley. The Thomasville, N.C., native rushed for 202 yards on 29 carries to help lead the Catamounts back to the .500 mark on the season at 2-2. He added 17 yards receiving on three catches.

Warley became just the eighth different Catamount to surpass 200 yards rushing in a single-game, eclipsing the century mark for the first time in his collegiate career. His performance was also just the 10th, 200-yard rushing performance in school history and WCU's first since Fred Boateng rushed for 213 against Georgia Southern in 2000.

Western Carolina held a 483-to-313 yard advantage in total offense, amassing 28 first downs to Presbyterian's 14. The Catamounts monopolized possession on the day, tallying just under 40 minutes in time of possession (39:07) with all five scoring drives taking at least eight plays and three encompassing 70 yards or more including a season-best, 97-yard drive that culminated in the end zone.

Catamount junior placekicker Blake Bostic booted three field goals – from 26, 32 and a career-long 39-yarder – in the victory.

Presbyterian (1-3) pushed across its second touchdown of the opening 30 minutes with just 43 seconds showing on the game clock, capping a seven-play, 77-yard drive to lead at intermission, 14-6.

Late in the third quarter, Western cut into the Blue Hose advantage on Bostic's third triple of the game on a career-long 39 yarder to pull the Catamounts to within five points, 14-9. WCU reclaimed its lead midway through the third quarter on its longest drive of the season. The Catamount offense moved 97 yards in eight plays, including double-digit Warley runs of 16, 11 and 12 yards, and a 29-yard pass from senior quarterback Andy Horn to classmate Donald James. The duo again hooked up to cap the drive with a 16-yard, pass-and-catch into the end zone to push WCU to the lead, 17-14.

Presbyterian moved back in front with a four-yard touchdown strike to lead 21-17 before what proved to be the game-winning drive. Starting at its own 30 yard line, Horn marched the Catamounts down the field capitalizing on an 11-yard pass to Hearn and a game-long, 39-yard strike to Pittman.

After moving inside the 10-yard line, Horn again found Pittman on a fourth-and-goal on a lob pass into the right corner of the end zone where the Maxton, N.C., native skied and pulled it in between two PC defenders for the go-ahead score, 23-21.

**Charleston, S.C.** – Western Carolina's offense was unable to get rolling, nor could it capitalize on a trio of turnovers including the first two interceptions of the season as it dropped its Southern Conference opener, 34-14, to No. 13/24 The Citadel at Johnson Hagood Stadium. Bulldog quarterback Bart Blanchard accounted for three touchdowns and wide receiver Andre Roberts tallied 135 yards receiving and a score to lead The Citadel.

The loss for Western was its 16th-straight in conference play spanning the past three seasons. It was also the Catamounts fifth-straight loss to The Citadel which represents the longest streak for either side in the all-time series.

The Bulldogs (3-1, 1-0 SoCon) opened the game with 31-straight points, including a pair of Blanchard TD runs, before the Catamounts were able to scratch the scoreboard late in the third quarter. Capping a 10-play, 80-yard drive, red-shirt senior quarterback Andy Horn found red-shirt sophomore receiver Adam Hearn from eight yards out for the score, the first receiving TD for Hearn.

Horn finished 15-of-28 for 115 yards with a long pass of 33 yards to senior Donald James, which is his career-long reception.

Western (2-3, 0-1 SoCon) pushed across a second touchdown late in the fourth quarter as red-shirt freshman QB Zack Jaynes found freshman Nate Harris over the middle for a 10-yard strike to provide the final tally. The score was the first career TD pass for Jaynes and both the first career reception and touchdown for Harris.

All told, Western was outgained offensively 541-to-207 in total yards with the Bulldogs racking up 28 first downs to the Catamounts' 15.

Defensively, the Catamounts forced a trio of turnovers, but were unable to capitalize on any of the takeaways. Late in the first quarter, junior Chris Collins forced his third fumble of the season, stripping Bulldog back Ashton Jordan at the WCU 45. Sophomore Mitchell Bell pounced on the loose football giving WCU possession trailing, 7-0. However, the offense went three-and-out and was forced to punt.

Midway through the second quarter, junior Antoine George picked off his fourth career pass, intercepting Blanchard in the Bulldog end zone to give Western possession at the 20-yard line. Yet, three plays and a holding penalty later, the drive stalled and the Catamounts were forced to punt again.

Senior defensive lineman Jeff Bradley helped set-up the third turnover as he tipped a Blanchard pass at the line of scrimmage early in the fourth quarter with Bell laying out to snag the ball out of mid-air for his first career interception. But much like its first two takeaways, WCU was limited to a three-and-out and forced to punt.

Junior transfer Adrian McLeod led the Catamount defense with nine tackles, including six solo stops and one for loss. Bell and freshman Brandon Vaught - who left the game late with an injury - each tallied eight stops with Bell accounting for two of WCU's three takeaways.

**Cullowhee, N.C.** - Samford running back Chris Evans rushed for 166 yards on 34 carries and a touchdown and quarterback Dustin Taliadro threw for two scores within a minute and 51 second span in the third quarter as the Bulldogs spoiled Western Carolina's Homecoming with a 21-6 win in front of 9,174 fans at E. J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

Junior placekicker Blake Bostic was 2-for-2 on the day, including a career-long 43 yarder in the second quarter, to provide WCU's lone scoring.

The loss – Western's fifth-straight to Samford since 1969 – extends WCU's Southern Conference losing skid to 17-straight games, one shy of tying for the second-longest such streak in conference history. It was also Samford's first conference triumph since joining the SoCon this season.

Senior wide receiver Donald James posted a career-best 82 yards receiving on eight catches to lead WCU, while red-shirt freshman running back Quan Warley was held to 47 yards on 16 carries on the ground for the Catamounts.

Western Carolina (2-4, 0-2 SoCon) forced three turnovers on the day as the Bulldogs put the ball on the new turf four times, losing three fumbles. However, the Catamounts, who committed three giveaways of its own, were only able to turn the takeaways into three points in dropping their second-straight game.

Red-shirt freshman quarterback Zack Jaynes, who came on in the first quarter, opened the game a perfect 9-for-9 before consecutive incomplete passes stalled a WCU drive at the Samford 26. Bostic then booted his career-best field goal to put Western on the board, trailing 7-3 which is where the scoreboard stood at the half.

Jaynes finished with a career-best 162 yards on 20-of-33 through the air with one interception. The Catamounts closed to within a point on their opening drive of the second half, utilizing a 24-yard kickoff return by freshman Levon Curtis to open the possession at their own 32-yard line. Horn, who finished with 90 yards passing on eight completions with his first INT of the season, connected on double-digit pass plays to red-shirt sophomores Marquel Pittman (13 yards) and Adam Hearn (29 yards). However, with WCU threatening the red-zone, the drive stalled and Bostic again was called upon, splitting the uprights from 35 yards out to make it, 7-6.

Samford (3-2, 1-1 SoCon) then used consecutive scores within a decisive minute and 51 second frame to put the game away. The Bulldogs turned a 38-yard Richie Fordham punt return into points as Taliadro found Jonathan Lowery on the very next play for a 22-yard scoring strike to push the game to 14-6.

Following a three-and-out for the Catamounts that consumed just over a minute of game clock, Taliadro connected with Hawkins from 38 yards away to provide the final tally, 21-6.

For Western, junior Adrian McLeod led the defensive attack with a career-high 14 tackles, including eight solo stops and 2.5 tackles for loss. Classmate Chris Collins finished with 11 stops in the loss, while senior Jeff Bradley was credited with three tackles, all for losses that combined for nine yards.

Greenville, S.C. – Red-shirt freshman quarterback Zack Jaynes threw for a career-high 302 yards on a career-best 33 completions, distributing the ball to 10 different Catamounts, but it wasn't enough to overcome an early 21-0 deficit as Western Carolina fell on the road, 28-21, to No. 21/20 Furman Paladins.

After falling behind by three scores midway through the second quarter, Western twice cut Furman's lead to seven points in the second half. Jaynes drove the Catamounts from their own 26 yard line to the Paladin 18 on its final possession before a fourth down pass fell incomplete at the goal line with 24 seconds remaining.

Jaynes completed 33-of-48 passes for 302 yards and two touchdowns and also ran for another score for the Catamounts, who managed only 24 yards in the first quarter before finishing the contest with a 398-316 advantage in total offense. Of his 10 targets on the day, sophomore TE Andrew Rogers was his favorite as the Alpharetta, Ga., native pulled in a career-best eight catches for a career-high 40 yards on the day.

A pair of second quarter scores gave the Paladins a comfortable, 21-0, lead before the Catamount offense found its spark. Jaynes went 6-of-7 for 58 yards on an 11-play, 80-yard drive which was capped by the first receiving touchdown for freshman Andrius Thomas. Jaynes found the Stone Mountain, Ga., native alone over the middle of the field in the end zone for the score, trimming the deficit to two scores, 21-7.

Capitalizing on a defensive stop, the Catamounts drove down the field inside the final 1:15 of the opening half, but Jaynes had a pass sail on the breezy afternoon and was intercepted by Furman's Max Lerner to end the threat and sending the teams to the locker room separated by two scores.

Western opened the second half with a scoring drive to cut the Paladin edge to seven, moving 75 yards in nine plays including a perfect 5-for-5 passing for Jaynes including a 12-yard pass to junior Kyle Garland for his first career receiving touchdown. Garland finished with five catches for a game and career-high 60 yards.

Again, trailing by 14, the Catamounts methodically moved down the field with red-shirt sophomore Adam Hearn making a tight-rope catch for 14 yards down the near sideline to set up Jaynes from the four-yard line. The QB then called his own number on a scramble up the middle, diving for the goal line for the third score of the game—and the first rushing TD in his career—to pull within seven, 28-21.

Furman missed a field goal and were unable to capitalize on a Catamount fumble as Western's defense held strong to give the offense one last chance inside the final five and a half minutes of regulation.

WCU moved from its own 26 yard line into the red zone before the Paladin defense, which entered the game leading the SoCon in sacks on the season, broke through for its first and only sack of the game, dropping Jaynes back at the 26-yard line. An offensive pass interference penalty moved WCU back to near midfield before freshman Nate Harris pulled down an 18-yard completion to set up the Cats from the 23.

However, back-to-back incompletions on third and fourth down ended the drive and allowed the Paladins to run out the remaining seconds off the game clock.

## WESTERN CAROLINA UNIVERSITY – DID YOU KNOW...?

- Western Carolina has two current NFL players. **Brad Hoover** is the starting fullback for the Carolina Panthers and receiver **David Patten**, who won two Super Bowl titles with New England, in his second year with the New Orleans Saints ... Two other former Catamounts have Super Bowl rings, including defensive back Willie Williams with 2005-06 Pittsburgh Steelers and tackle Tony Jones with the Denver Broncos in 1998 and '99. Other Catamounts to play in the NFL include Dean Biasucci (kicker for the Colts and Rams), Louis Cooper (linebacker for the Chiefs, Dolphins and Eagles), Tiger Greene (defensive back for the Packers), Andrew Jordan (tight end for the Vikings, Buccaneers and Falcons), Nick McNeil (linebacker for the Packers and Redskins), David Rivers (quarterback for the Rams, Falcons and Raiders), Clyde Simmons (defensive end for the Eagles, Cardinals, Jaguars, Bengals and Bears) and Steve Williams (lineman with the 49ers and Colts).
- Western Carolina is the home of two current NBA players. **Kevin Martin**, who left WCU after his junior year after being a first-round pick with Sacramento, averaged over 22.0 ppg as the Kings' starting shooting guard. Also, 2003 lottery pick Jarvis Hayes of the Washington Wizards was the 2000 Southern Conference Freshman of the Year while at Western before transferring to Georgia and playing two years with the Bulldogs.
- In addition to the aforementioned (Hoover, Patten and Martin), pitchers **Jared Burton** with the MLB's Cincinnati Reds and **Mark DiFelice** with the Milwaukee Brewers make Western Carolina the **ONLY** school in the Southern Conference to boast former student-athletes in all three major professional team sports in America (NFL, NBA and MLB).
- Western Carolina's **Ronnie Carr** hit the first 3-pointer in NCAA history during the 1980-81 season. Last year was the 25th Anniversary of "The Shot" and was featured throughout the nation, including ESPN.
- Western Carolina was the first predominately white university in the South to sign African-American athletes. Western's Henry Logan, the school's all-time leading scorer in basketball, was the first to break the color barrier in the South, playing his first season in 1964-65. In the fall of 1965, Western's Keith Elliott became the first football player in the South to break the color barrier.
- Since its inception for the 1978 season, the Southern Conference has produced **EIGHT** FCS (I-AA) national championships, including Furman (1988), Georgia Southern (1999 and 2000), Marshall (1992 and '96) and Appalachian State (2005, '06, '07). (*Note: Georgia Southern won four national titles prior to joining the SoCon*). Also, on eight different occasions, a SoCon team has finished national runner-up, including Western Carolina in 1983 – **WCU was the FIRST SoCon team** to play in the National Title game. In 2007, Appalachian State became the first FCS team to defeat a FCS nationally-ranked Top 25 team when it downed #5 Michigan in Ann Arbor.
