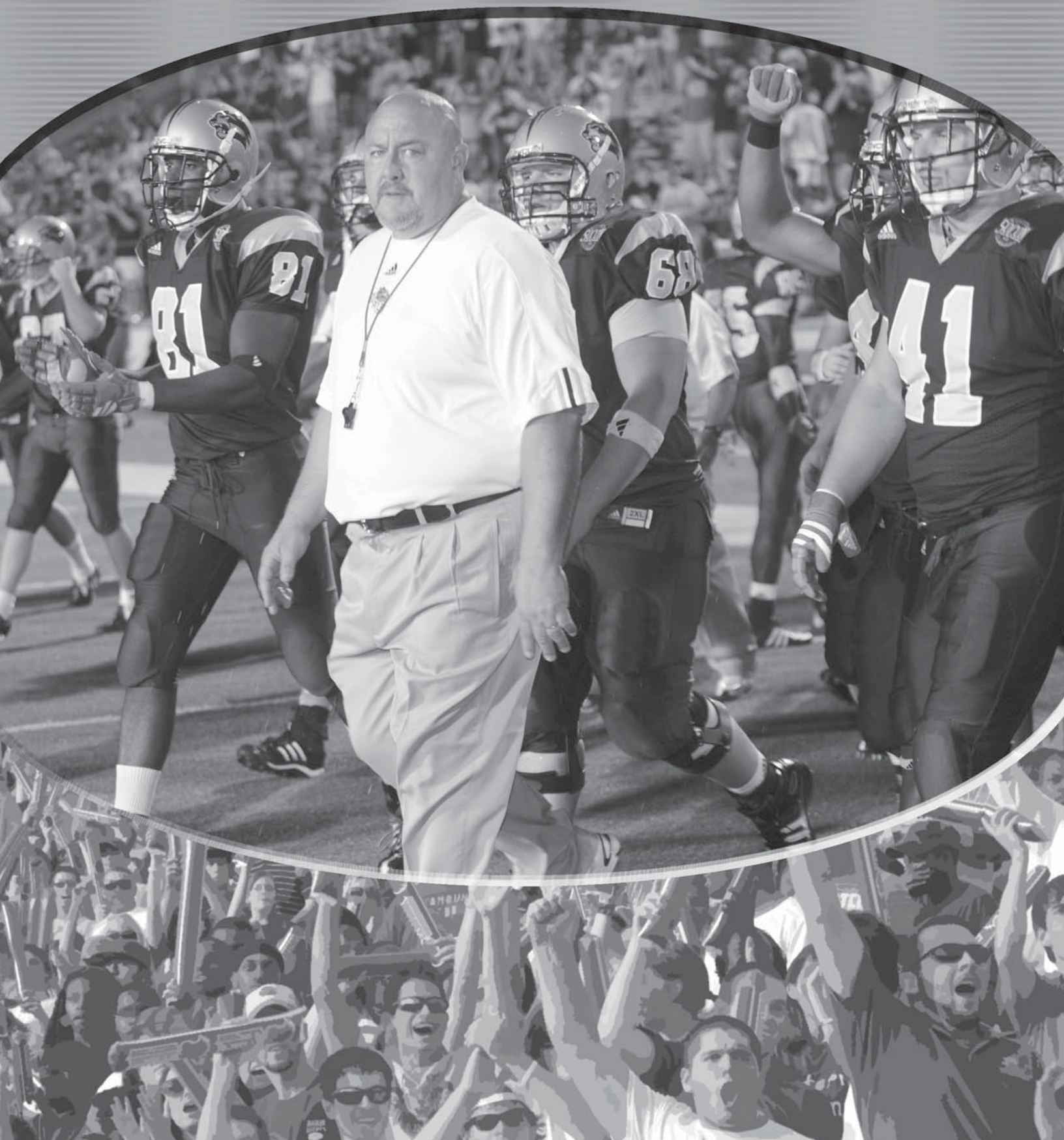

Cullowhee, N.C. - Five different Catamounts reached the end zone - including three tallying their first scores as Catamounts - as Western Carolina opened the Dennis Wagner era with a 35-0 shutout victory over the Shorter College Hawks at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

The win snapped a seven-game losing skid which dates back to last season, while also extending Western's winning streak in home openers to 11-straight.

Wagner becomes the fifth WCU head coach all-time to be victorious in his inaugural game. The shutout victory, Western's first since blanking Chowan in the opener in 2006 (42-0), also marked the first-time that the Shorter College Hawks - in the fourth year of NAIA football competition - had been shutout.

Senior quarterback Andy Horn, who was not only making just his second career start, but also his second-career appearance, completed a career-best 22-of-33 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns.

Horn's counterparts also got into the mix under center with red-shirt sophomore Adam Hearn and red-shirt freshman Zack Jaynes each seeing a series apiece. Hearn, who found himself all over the field offensively Thursday night, tallied 34 yards on the ground and completed 5-of-6 passes for 34 yards and a scoring strike. Jaynes, in his collegiate debut finished 3-for-4 for 22 yards, having his lone time under center end on a failed fourth-and-long conversion attempt.

Two plays into its first offensive series of the year, Western Carolina found pay-dirt en route to the victory. Horn found red-shirt sophomore Marquel Pittman on a 56-yard strike down the far sideline to set up Hearn, seeing his first snap of the season lined up as a tailback, for the opening score. Hearn scampered off left tackle for a four-yard touchdown and the early, 7-0, lead.

Horn hooked up with Pittman from six yards out to extend the Catamount lead to 14 on their second possession as WCU officially drove 80 yards in 12 plays to go up two scores. Pittman led all receivers with 106 yards on six catches.

Leading 14-0, the Catamounts were pinned back inside the shadow of their own goal posts after a holding penalty on a Hawk punt pushed WCU back to the four-yard line. However, 12 plays later, junior transfer Jayson Williams spun his way 24 yards into the end zone for the 21-0 advantage. Williams accounted for 44 yards on the drive and led all rushers with 90 yards on 14 carries.

Senior Donald James, who hauled in a 14-yard TD reception, and red-shirt freshman Josh Cockrell each tallied their first collegiate scores on receptions in the victory.

Defensively, the Catamounts played well against their old nemesis - the triple-option. WCU limited Shorter to six first downs and just 142 yards of total offense including 109 on the ground and 33 through the air. WCU also forced two fumbles despite not coming up with a take-away.

The Catamounts were led by junior Quintin Phillips with seven and a half tackles, including five solo stops, while juniors Antoine George and Chris Collins each finished with five and a half tackles apiece.

Tallahassee, Fla. - Trailing by just one touchdown, 7-0, late in the first half, Western Carolina surrendered a trio of scores inside the final 6:54 to allow Florida State to take a commanding advantage into intermission. The Seminoles added four third quarter touchdowns, including three inside the opening 5:15 minutes of the second half, to open the season with a 69-0 victory in front of 73,024 at a rain-soaked Bobby Bowden Field at Doak S. Campbell Stadium.

After concerns during the week preceding the game focused on Tropical Storm Hanna, it was individual storm cells that wreaked havoc on the start of Saturday's game. The teams were chased from the field during pre-game warm-ups for a delay of nearly an hour and a half as thunderstorms, including torrential downpours and lightning, delayed the start until 7:30 pm.

Much like the bolts of lightning that danced all around the stadium initially delaying the start, Florida State struck less than two minutes into the game. Western went three-and-out on its opening possession setting up the score on a punt return. Freshman Blake Cain's boot sailed 44 yards where FSU's Tony Carter raced 68-yards to the end zone and the early lead.

However, before the teams could line up for the ensuing kickoff, a second weather-related delay was put into effect which lasted just under an hour.

Once play resumed, a see-saw, back-and-forth pattern emerged as neither side could manage to scratch the scoreboard. WCU put together one of its better sustained drives of the game with an eight-play, 43 yard drive that stalled at the FSU 37 yard-line and resulted in a punt.

The Seminoles, however, were able to add to their lead midway through the second quarter, capitalizing on a defensive stop of its own. With WCU moving into Seminole territory for the third time in the half offensively, the Catamount offense stalled on fourth and inches at the FSU 44-yard line. As the Florida State defense pinched, Western tried to lob one down the sideline to junior Kyle Garland in one-on-one coverage on the near sideline, but the pass fell incomplete.

Five plays and 56 yards later, FSU's Antone Smith danced around the left edge and plunged into the end zone for the score, pushing the home squad ahead by two touchdowns, 14-0.

Just before intermission, the fast-strike `Nole offense went 41 yards on a swing pass play to make it a three-TD lead for Florida State, 21-0, and carried a 28-0 advantage into halftime.

The Seminoles (1-0) posted a 54-yard pass from Ponder to Greg Carr and a pair of D'Vontrey Richards runs - from 52 and seven yards out, respectively - in the opening 5:15 to blow the game open early in the third.

Red-shirt sophomore Marquel Pittman led Western Carolina with five catches for 89 yards, including an impressive 28-yard, catch-and-run in which he juked past several Seminole defensive backs. Red-shirt freshman Quan Warley rushed a career-best 14 times for 38 yards, while classmate Josh Wright touched the ball five times for 23 yards, all positive plays.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Trailing by a dozen entering the fourth quarter, Western Carolina scored nine unanswered points in the final frame - including a 78-yard touchdown pass from senior Andy Horn to Marquel Pittman and the first career field goal from junior Blake Bostic. But it was not enough as the 25th-ranked Liberty Flames escaped with a three-point, 19-16, victory at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

Western (1-2) dropped its second-straight contest while Liberty extended the nation's second-longest winning streak dating back to last season by winning its eighth straight, improving to 3-0 on the season. The loss also evened the all-time series between the two schools at three.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Horn and Pittman ignited the crowd of 7,289 on a 78-yard, pass-and-run to pull within six points, 19-13. After catching the pass roughly 12 yards from the line of scrimmage, Pittman ran through four arm tackles, juiced his way past an additional would-be tackler and raced down the left sideline into the end zone.

The Catamount defense forced a three-and-out on the ensuing possession, taking over at its own 25-yard line. Western then drove 54-yards in 12 plays, including a 19-yard strike from Horn to red-shirt sophomore Adam Hearn on a fourth and five from the Liberty 26 yard line.

However, with WCU looking at a first and goal from the Liberty seven-yard line, consecutive losses on a nine-yard sack and a delay of game penalty pushed the Catamounts back to the 21. Back-to-back incomplete passes forced WCU into a 38-yard field goal, a career-long for Bostic to pull within three, 19-16.

Western's defense only allowed the Flames to gain one first down on its next possession, with the Catamounts taking over at their own nine-yard line with 3:34 showing on the game clock.

Staring at the ball game on fourth and three, Horn found red-shirt freshman Quan Warley - who tallied his first collegiate score in the loss - for six yards to keep the drive alive. A pass interference call against Liberty gave the Catamounts the ball at their own 37. Yet, inside the final two minutes, three-consecutive incomplete passes, including the last on fourth and six, ended WCU's quest to pull off the upset.

Western Carolina limited the Flames' offense, which came in averaging 46.5 points per game through its first two wins, to three first-half field goal attempts. Liberty took an early, 3-0, lead after its drive stalled the WCU 19-yard line. Red-shirt freshman Ben Shipp's 29-yard boot split the uprights for the 3-0 lead.

The Catamounts countered, though, just before the end of the opening period. Taking over near midfield, Western moved 54-yards in five plays to take the lead. Warley, sprung by text book blocks on the left side and one thrown by Hearn on the edge, scampered in from 15 yards out. The Thomasville, N.C., native finished with 58 yards rushing on 12 carries, gaining positive yards every time he touched the ball.

On the other two field goal attempts, WCU red-shirt freshman Chris Everett blocked one and Shipp connected on the second to provide the halftime tally, 7-6.

Defensively for WCU, junior Quintin Phillips led all defenders with 16 tackles, while classmate Chris Collins recorded 11, including half a tackle for loss and forced a fumble.

Clinton, S.C. - Red-shirt sophomore Marquel Pittman hauled in an acrobatic four-yard scoring strike with just over three minutes showing on the Bailey Memorial Stadium clock. But it wasn't until Presbyterian's Cam Miller hooked a 23-yard field goal wide left that the Catamounts were able to celebrate their first road win since late October, 2005, downing the Blue Hose, 23-21.

The victory snapped Western's 14-game road losing skid which dated back to '05 when the Cats defeated Chattanooga. It also was WCU's eighth-straight over Presbyterian dating back to 1970, and its first in Clinton since 1976, snapping PC's six-game home winning streak.

But the big story of the day was the running of red-shirt freshman Quan Warley. The Thomasville, N.C., native rushed for 202 yards on 29 carries to help lead the Catamounts back to the .500 mark on the season at 2-2. He added 17 yards receiving on three catches.

Warley became just the eighth different Catamount to surpass 200 yards rushing in a single-game, eclipsing the century mark for the first time in his collegiate career. His performance was also just the 10th, 200-yard rushing performance in school history and WCU's first since Fred Boateng rushed for 213 against Georgia Southern in 2000.

Western Carolina held a 483-to-313 yard advantage in total offense, amassing 28 first downs to Presbyterian's 14. The Catamounts monopolized possession on the day, tallying just under 40 minutes in time of possession (39:07) with all five scoring drives taking at least eight plays and three encompassing 70 yards or more including a season-best, 97-yard drive that culminated in the end zone.

Catamount junior placekicker Blake Bostic booted three field goals - from 26, 32 and a career-long 39-yarder - in the victory.

Presbyterian (1-3) pushed across its second touchdown of the opening 30 minutes with just 43 seconds showing on the game clock, capping a seven-play, 77-yard drive to lead at intermission, 14-6.

Late in the third quarter, Western cut into the Blue Hose advantage on Bostic's third triple of the game on a career-long 39 yarder to pull the Catamounts to within five points, 14-9. WCU reclaimed its lead midway through the third quarter on its longest drive of the season. The Catamount offense moved 97 yards in eight plays, including double-digit Warley runs of 16, 11 and 12 yards, and a 29-yard pass from senior quarterback Andy Horn to classmate Donald James. The duo again hooked up to cap the drive with a 16-yard, pass-and-catch into the end zone to push WCU to the lead, 17-14.

Presbyterian moved back in front with a four-yard touchdown strike to lead 21-17 before what proved to be the game-winning drive. Starting at its own 30 yard line, Horn marched the Catamounts down the field capitalizing on an 11-yard pass to Hearn and a game-long, 39-yard strike to Pittman.

After moving inside the 10-yard line, Horn again found Pittman on a fourth-and-goal on a lob pass into the right corner of the end zone where the Maxton, N.C., native skied and pulled it in between two PC defenders for the go-ahead score, 23-21.

Charleston, S.C. - Western Carolina's offense was unable to get rolling, nor could it capitalize on a trio of turnovers including the first two interceptions of the season as it dropped its Southern Conference opener, 34-14, to No. 13/24 The Citadel at Johnson Hagood Stadium. Bulldog quarterback Bart Blanchard accounted for three touchdowns and wide receiver Andre Roberts tallied 135 yards receiving and a score to lead The Citadel.

The loss for Western was its 16th-straight in conference play spanning the past three seasons. It was also the Catamounts fifth-straight loss to The Citadel which represents the longest streak for either side in the all-time series.

The Bulldogs (3-1, 1-0 SoCon) opened the game with 31-straight points, including a pair of Blanchard TD runs, before the Catamounts were able to scratch the scoreboard late in the third quarter. Capping a 10-play, 80-yard drive, red-shirt senior quarterback Andy Horn found red-shirt sophomore receiver Adam Heams from eight yards out for the score, the first receiving TD for Heams.

Horn finished 15-of-28 for 115 yards with a long pass of 33 yards to senior Donald James, which is his career-long reception.

Western (2-3, 0-1 SoCon) pushed across a second touchdown late in the fourth quarter as red-shirt freshman QB Zack Jaynes found freshman Nate Harris over the middle for a 10-yard strike to provide the final tally. The score was the first career TD pass for Jaynes and both the first career reception and touchdown for Harris.

All told, Western was outgained offensively 541-to-207 in total yards with the Bulldogs racking up 28 first downs to the Catamounts' 15.

Defensively, the Catamounts forced a trio of turnovers, but were unable to capitalize on any of the takeaways. Late in the first quarter, junior Chris Collins forced his third fumble of the season, stripping Bulldog back Ashton Jordan at the WCU 45. Sophomore Mitchell Bell pounced on the loose football giving WCU possession trailing, 7-0. However, the offense went three-and-out and was forced to punt.

Midway through the second quarter, junior Antoine George picked off his fourth career pass, intercepting Blanchard in the Bulldog end zone to give Western possession at the 20-yard line. Yet, three plays and a holding penalty later, the drive stalled and the Catamounts were forced to punt again.

Senior defensive lineman Jeff Bradley helped set-up the third turnover as he tipped a Blanchard pass at the line of scrimmage early in the fourth quarter with Bell laying out to snag the ball out of mid-air for his first career interception. But much like its first two takeaways, WCU was limited to a three-and-out and forced to punt.

Junior transfer Adrian McLeod led the Catamount defense with nine tackles, including six solo stops and one for loss. Bell and freshman Brandon Vaught--who left the game late with an injury--each tallied eight stops with Bell accounting for two of WCU's three takeaways.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Samford running back Chris Evans rushed for 166 yards on 34 carries and a touchdown and quarterback Dustin Taliaferro threw for two scores within a minute and 51 second span in the third quarter as the Bulldogs spoiled Western Carolina's Homecoming with a 21-6 win in front of 9,174 fans at E. J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

Junior placekicker Blake Bostic was 2-for-2 on the day, including a career-long 43 yarder in the second quarter, to provide WCU's lone scoring.

The loss - Western's fifth-straight to Samford since 1969 - extends WCU's Southern Conference losing skid to 17-straight games, one shy of tying for the second-longest such streak in conference history. It was also Samford's first conference triumph since joining the SoCon this season.

Senior wide receiver Donald James posted a career-best 82 yards receiving on eight catches to lead WCU, while red-shirt freshman running back Quan Warley was held to 47 yards on 16 carries on the ground for the Catamounts.

Western Carolina (2-4, 0-2 SoCon) forced three turnovers on the day as the Bulldogs put the ball on the new turf four times, losing three fumbles. However, the Catamounts, who committed three giveaways of its own, were only able to turn the takeaways into three points in dropping their second-straight game.

Red-shirt freshman quarterback Zack Jaynes, who came on in the first quarter, opened the game a perfect 9-for-9 before consecutive incomplete passes stalled a WCU drive at the Samford 26. Bostic then booted his career-best field goal to put Western on the board, trailing 7-3 which is where the scoreboard stood at the half.

Jaynes finished with a career-best 162 yards on 20-of-33 through the air with one interception.

The Catamounts closed to within a point on their opening drive of the second half, utilizing a 24-yard kickoff return by freshman Levon Curtis to open the possession at their own 32-yard line. Horn, who finished with 90 yards passing on eight completions with his first INT of the season, connected on double-digit pass plays to red-shirt sophomores Marquel Pittman (13 yards) and Adam Heams (29 yards). However, with WCU threatening the red-zone, the drive stalled and Bostic again was called upon, splitting the uprights from 35 yards out to make it, 7-6.

Samford (3-2, 1-1 SoCon) then used consecutive scores within a decisive minute and 51 second frame to put the game away. The Bulldogs turned a 38-yard Richie Fordham punt return into points as Taliaferro found Jonathan Lowery on the very next play for a 22-yard scoring strike to push the game to 14-6.

Following a three-and-out for the Catamounts that consumed just over a minute of game clock, Taliaferro connected with Hawkins from 38 yards away to provide the final tally, 21-6.

For Western, junior Adrian McLeod led the defensive attack with a career-high 14 tackles, including eight solo stops and 2.5 tackles for loss. Classmate Chris Collins finished with 11 stops in the loss, while senior Jeff Bradley was credited with three tackles, all for losses that combined for nine yards.

Greenville, S.C. - Red-shirt freshman quarterback Zack Jaynes threw for a career-high 302 yards on a career-best 33 completions, distributing the ball to 10 different Catamounts, but it wasn't enough to overcome an early 21-0 deficit as Western Carolina fell on the road, 28-21, to No. 21/20 Furman Paladins.

After falling behind by three scores midway through the second quarter, Western twice cut Furman's lead to seven points in the second half. Jaynes drove the Catamounts from their own 26 yard line to the Paladin 18 on its final possession before a fourth down pass fell incomplete at the goal line with 24 seconds remaining.

Jaynes completed 33-of-48 passes for 302 yards and two touchdowns and also ran for another score for the Catamounts, who managed only 24 yards in the first quarter before finishing the contest with a 398-316 advantage in total offense. Of his 10 targets on the day, sophomore TE Andrew Rogers was his favorite as the Alpharetta, Ga., native pulled in a career-best eight catches for a career-high 40 yards on the day.

A pair of second quarter scores gave the Paladins a comfortable, 21-0, lead before the Catamount offense found its spark. Jaynes went 6-of-7 for 58 yards on an 11-play, 80-yard drive which was capped by the first receiving touchdown for freshman Andrius Thomas. Jaynes found the Stone Mountain, Ga., native alone over the middle of the field in the end zone for the score, trimming the deficit to two scores, 21-7.

Capitalizing on a defensive stop, the Catamounts drove down the field inside the final 1:15 of the opening half, but Jaynes had a pass sail on the breezy afternoon and was intercepted by Furman's Max Lerner to end the threat and sending the teams to the locker room separated by two scores.

Western opened the second half with a scoring drive to cut the Paladin edge to seven, moving 75 yards in nine plays including a perfect 5-for-5 passing for Jaynes including a 12-yard pass to junior Kyle Garland for his first career receiving touchdown. Garland finished with five catches for a game and career-high 60 yards.

Again, trailing by 14, the Catamounts methodically moved down the field with red-shirt sophomore Adam Hears making a tight-rope catch for 14 yards down the near sideline to set up Jaynes from the four-yard line. The QB then called his own number on a scramble up the middle, diving for the goal line for the third score of the game—and the first rushing TD in his career—to pull within seven, 28-21.

Furman missed a field goal and were unable to capitalize on a Catamount fumble as Western's defense held strong to give the offense one last chance inside the final five and a half minutes of regulation.

WCU moved into its own 26 yard line into the red zone before the Paladin defense, which entered the game leading the SoCon in sacks, broke through for its first and only sack of the game, dropping Jaynes back at the 26-yard line. An offensive pass interference penalty moved WCU back to near midfield before freshman Nate Harris pulled down an 18-yard completion to set up the Cats from the 23.

However, back-to-back incompletions on third and fourth down ended the drive and allowed the Paladins to run out the remaining seconds off the game clock.

Spartanburg, S.C. - Back-to-back 98-yard scoring drives and an 86-yard interception return setup a third first half score as the sixth-ranked Wofford Terriers scored 42 unanswered points to erase an early touchdown deficit in a 42-14 win over Western Carolina at Gibbs Stadium.

Four of the scoring drives for Wofford (5-1, 3-0 SoCon) were three-plays or less. Conversely, Western Carolina had two would-be scoring drives thwarted by turnovers including a fumble following a completed pass and an interception on a batted ball at the line of scrimmage.

Red-shirt freshman quarterback Zack Jaynes, who started his second-consecutive game before being lifted midway through the third quarter, finished 13-of-22 for 126 yards with a TD pass and an interception. Senior QB Andy Horn completed 11-of-18 passes for 79 yards and a TD in relief.

Red-shirt sophomore Marquel Pittman led eight Catamount receivers with 84 yards on a career-best nine catches with a touchdown, while sophomore Andrew Rogers had five catches for 29 yards and a score. On the ground, running back Quan Warley just missed the century mark with 91 yards on 18 carries.

Western Carolina (2-6, 0-4 SoCon) drove the opening kickoff 86 yards in 16-plays to take an early, 7-0, lead over the nationally-ranked Terriers. The drive was keyed by 30 rushing yards by Warley and 5-of-7 passing by Jaynes, who had a touchdown scamper erased by a holding penalty. However, on the next play, Jaynes found Pittman on a corner fade route.

On the ensuing possession, the WCU defense forced the Terrier offense into a three-and-out. However, a muffed return attempt on the punt set up Wofford's first scoring drive, knotting the game at seven.

The Catamounts again methodically drove down the field the next time they touched the football, embarking on a 13-play drive to threaten to reclaim the lead. However, Wofford kept WCU off the board as Rogers was hit and fumbled at the two-yard line going in while stretching for the goal line.

The Terriers cashed in on the first takeaway by moving 98 yards in just three plays, capped by a 74-yard scoring run by Andy Strickland, to take a lead it would never relinquish. Strickland found pay dirt on Wofford's next offensive possession as QB Ben Widmyer threw a 29-yard strike up the middle to culminate a second 98-yard drive for a 21-7 advantage.

Down two scores, Western again made a drive just before intermission. Yet, for the second-straight week, an interception ended the threat. Jaynes had a pass batted at the line of scrimmage which unfortunately fell right into the hands of defensive lineman Alex Goltry who rumbled 86-yards to the WCU 3-yard line.

The big return set up a three-yard Dane Romero plunge to give Wofford a 28-7 break at intermission. All told, the trio of first half miscues—two that ended would-be scoring drives—led to 21 of Wofford's 28 points despite a 271-to-247 Western edge in total offense.

In the second half, it was all Wofford as the Terriers scored 1:12 into the third quarter en route to a pair of second half tallies to secure the conference win. WCU had trouble finding rhythm after the break, only mustering 110 yards of total offense after the half as compared to 271 in the opening stanza.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Georgia Southern's Adam Urbano ran for a 25-yard touchdown in overtime as the Eagles overcame a 28-point fourth quarter deficit to upend Western Carolina, 38-31, at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

The Eagles rallied after Western Carolina junior DL Gene Singletary returned an interception 31 yards for a touchdown to give the Catamounts a 31-3 lead with 14:52 left in the fourth.

Georgia Southern scored four touchdowns in over a 10-minute span, sparked by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Lee Chapple to Raja Andrews. Jarrell Crawford followed with a 1-yard rushing score, Antonio Henton connected with Andrews on a 13-yard touchdown pass and Henton capped the rally with a 5-yard passing score to Tim Camp that sent the game into OT.

On the first play of overtime, Urbano ran for the game-winning 25-yard score to give the Eagles the come-from-behind win.

Urbano led Georgia Southern with 83 yards rushing on 11 carries, while Andrews caught eight passes for 121 yards. Henton threw for 154 yards and two interceptions, and Chapple passed for 140 yards and was intercepted twice. Wide receiver Raja Andrews - who became Georgia Southern's all-time leader in pass receptions (99) - caught eight passes for a game-high 121 yards and two TDs in the victory.

Red-shirt freshman RB Quan Warley ran for 102 yards and a touchdown for Western Carolina. Classmate Zack Jaynes, who completed 13 of 35 passes, had 144 yards passing and two touchdowns along with being sacked five times - three of which came from Georgia Southern defensive end Dakota Walker.

The Eagles racked up 503 yards of total offense in the win, including a staggering 367 in the second half alone. During their second half rally, the Eagles outgained Western, 367-to-48 in total offense.

Trailing by a score, 31-24, after a reverse-option pass found the end zone for the Eagles, Georgia Southern held the Catamount offense to a three-and-out and less than two minutes of possession time to set up the eventual tying score. With just under three minutes to play from their own 35-yard line, the Eagles moved to mid-field in four plays before an 11-yard sack by red-shirt freshman Chris Everett backed GSU into a third and 20 from their own 39. An incomplete pass set up a fourth and long, but the Eagles were able to garner a drive-saving automatic first down on a pass interference call down the far sideline.

Four plays later, including a 41-yard strike from Henton to Terence Hall, Henton found Tim Camp from five yards away to knot the game at 31.

WCU had one last opportunity with the ball with 32 seconds remaining in the game, but only managed 10 yards on four plays, including a seven-yard loss on a sack before punting it away to end the half.

Senior LB Michael Shaw led WCU with a career-best 16 tackles, including one for a loss and half a sack, while also tallying his first career INT. Junior LB Adrian McLeod also recorded his first interception, while finishing with a career-high 15 stops including seven solo.

Cullowhee, N.C. - Freshman WR Andreerius Thomas caught two fourth quarter touchdown passes while classmate Levon Curtis rushed for a career-best 104 yards as Western Carolina snapped a 20-game Southern Conference losing skid with a 27-7 win over the Chattanooga Mocs.

Junior kicker Blake Bostic also booted a pair of field goals in the win which not only snapped WCU's drought in league play, but also ended a five-game seasonal slide and a two-game slump against the Mocs.

With five Hall of Fame inductees, including former football players John Ruta, Alonzo Carmichael and Brad Hoover looking on, the Catamounts-without three key starters in senior WR Donald James, red-shirt sophomore Marquel Pittman and running back Quan Warley-turned to the true freshmen Thomas and Curtis on offense. Thomas finished with three catches, two of which went for scores of 21 and 17 yards for 44 total yards in the win, while Curtis rushed 18 times for 104 and caught a pair of passes out of the backfield for 15 yards.

Red-shirt sophomore WR Adam Hearn led all receivers with seven catches for 59 yards and a touchdown. On the business end of all three TD passes was red-shirt freshman QB Zack Jaynes, who finished 14-of-25 for 146 yards, with the trio of scores marking a career single-game best. The Canton, N.C., native also rushed 11 times for 62 yards.

Defensively, the Catamounts set the tone by limiting Chattanooga to 178 yards of total offense, the second-lowest output this season (limited Shorter to 142) and did not give up a score to UTC's offense.

Junior LB Quintin Phillips posted a game-high 14 tackles including two for loss and a sack, while classmate Antoine George recorded two interceptions and sophomore Mitchell Bell tallied a third pick in the win. WCU also blocked a punt and picked up a pair of fumbles, both recovered by senior Jeff Bradley.

All told, the Catamounts forced five turnovers with four sacks, holding UTC to an opponent season-low 77 total yards on the ground including four sacks for 49 yards.

Western Carolina capitalized on one of the early Chattanooga miscues as it took a lead it would never relinquish late in the first quarter. After the two teams traded punts, the Catamount defense forced a second UTC punt inside its own five yard line. On the ensuing kick, the snap was low and punter Jeff Lloyd could not handle it, recovering before fumbling it forward where a teammate was able to jump on the loose ball, but still giving WCU possession on the turnover on downs.

One play later, Jaynes found Hearn from four-yards out for the early, 7-0, lead. The receiving score was the third of Hearn's career, and second in as many weeks. Bostic extended the Catamount lead on back-to-back field goals of 20 and 26 yards, respectively, in the second to give Western a 13-0 halftime lead.

UTC converted a Raeshon Ball interception into a 41-yard return for what would prove to be the Mocs' lone score. WCU responded, converting a Trey Selby blocked punt into the first of two Thomas TD receptions, with George's second interception leading to another Jaynes-to-Thomas TD for the final tally, 27-7.

Elon, N.C. - Elon quarterback Scott Riddle threw for 210 yards and accounted for three touchdowns to lead the 11th-ranked Phoenix to a 33-14 win over Western Carolina at Rhodes Stadium.

Riddle, who completed 17 of 26 passes and an interception, connected with Lance Camp on a 3-yard touchdown to give the Phoenix (8-2, 6-1 Southern Conference) a 10-0 lead in the second quarter. Andrew Wilcox, who made a 47-yard field goal in the first, added a 34-yarder in the second to put Elon ahead 13-0, a lead it held into intermission.

Sophomore Mitchell Bell returned an interception - his team-leading, fourth of the season - 55 yards for a touchdown to cut the Elon lead to 13-7 early in the third quarter for the Catamounts (3-8, 1-6). But Riddle scored on a 5-yard run for Elon in the third to stretch the lead back out to 20-7.

On its ensuing possession, Western drove the field to paydirt as true freshman WR Andrius Thomas hauled in his fifth touchdown pass of the season, again trimming the deficit to six points, 20-14. But that was as close as the Catamounts would pull as the Phoenix used two fourth quarter touchdowns to pull out the 33-14 victory.

Bell and junior LB Adrian McLeod led the Catamount defense with eight tackles apiece, while Kurt Clouden and C.J. Johnson combined for a full tackle for loss.

Terrell Hudgins caught seven passes for 120 yards and a touchdown for the Phoenix while Jamal Shuman ran for 51 yards on seven carries and a rushing score.

For the Catamounts, red-shirt freshman QB Zack Jaynes went 24 of 31 for 182 yards, one touchdown and was sacked seven times. He added 23 yards rushing, while freshman tailback Levon Curtis rushed 12 times for just 23 yards.

Red-shirt sophomore WR Adam Hearn all receivers with a career-high nine catches for 55 yards, while Thomas established career-highs with five catches for 81 yards and a score.

Cullowhee, N.C. (AP) - DeAndre Presley, playing for an injured Armanti Edwards, passed for 158 yards and ran for 156 to help Appalachian State rally from a three-point halftime deficit and defeat Western Carolina 35-10 in front of 14,213 - the third-largest crowd in facility history at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

The Mountaineers (10-2, 8-0 Southern Conference) complete an unbeaten conference season and clinched their fourth straight league title. Wofford defeated Furman 35-10, but needed a Western Carolina victory to gain a share of the title.

Instead, Appalachian State won its ninth straight game and likely secured a top-four seed in the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. The Mountaineers also won their fourth straight over Western - and 22nd of the last 24 meetings - to retain possession of the "Old Mountain Jug."

Western Carolina concluded the first-season under head coach Dennis Wagner with a 3-9 overall record and a 1-7 tally in Southern Conference play. It marked the most seasonal wins for the Catamounts since 2005 when WCU finished 5-4 and played at ASU for a share of the SoCon crown.

Leading 10-7 at halftime, WCU lost 14 yards in the third quarter and surrendered 28 unanswered points. The Catamounts failed to convert a first down on nine straight possessions spanning the first and second halves.

Presley, held to 65 yards passing in the first half, more than doubled his total on Appalachian State's second scoring drive of the second half, capped by a 17-yard strike to Ben Jordan for a 21-10 lead.

Presley scored Appalachian State's first two touchdowns, on 6-yard runs in each half, and added a third on a 30-yard run in the fourth quarter.

The Catamounts' last win in the series, dubbed the Battle for the Old Mountain Jug, came in 2004. Appalachian State has won 26 of 33 games since the jug's introduction in 1976. Appalachian State won last season's game 71-35.

Adrian McLeod made two big plays to stop Appalachian State and allow the Catamounts to take a 10-7 lead.

McLeod first stopped Trey Hennessee for a 1-yard loss on fourth-and-goal from the Catamounts' 5. Then, McLeod tipped a pass attempt from Presley, which Mitchell Bell intercepted at midfield. It led to Blake Bostic's 43-yard field goal late in the first half and a 10-7 lead.

Western Carolina's Zack Jaynes scored on a 1-yard run in the first quarter for a 7-0 lead. Jaynes was 5-for-26 for 63 yards and was sacked five times.

2008 SEASON - NOTES IN REVIEW

PAIR OF CATAMOUNTS NAMED ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE:

Defensive lineman Jeff Bradley and defensive back Mitchell Bell were named second team All-Southern Conference by both the league's head coaches and the voting members of the SoCon Sports Media Association. Bradley, a native of Lewisville, N.C., led the WCU defensive linemen with 31 tackles including 15 solo stops and nine tackles for loss. He also recorded a pair of sacks on the season despite receiving both double and triple teams from opposing offensive lines this season. Bradley, who was also a preseason all-conference selection, recovered a team-high four fumbles on the season.

Bell led the Catamount defense with five interceptions, including one in each of the final four games of the season. The Warner Robbins, Ga., native ranked fourth on the team with 59 total tackles including 36 solo stops and two for losses. He posted a career-high nine tackles in the home loss to Georgia Southern in late October. Also on the season, Bell blocked a kick and recovered a pair of fumbles.

FOUR CATAMOUNTS LAND ON INAUGURAL SOCON ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM:

Led by red-shirt freshman quarterback Zack Jaynes, four Catamounts were selected to the first-ever SoCon All-Freshman team as named by the league's head coaches ... Jaynes was joined on the offensive unit by running back Quan Warley, while redshirt freshman John Julien garnered defensive honors. True freshman punter Blake Cain was tabbed among the specialists.

Jaynes threw for 1,163 yards and 10 touchdowns after taking over as the starting quarterback midway through the season at Furman. He added a pair of rushing touchdowns, including one in the season finale against Appalachian State. A native of Canton, N.C., Jaynes was named SoCon Freshman of the Week following his first career start when he completed 33 passes for a career-high 302 yards and accounted for all three WCU touchdowns against No. 20 Furman.

Warley was a two-time weekly freshman honoree, rushing for 672 yards and two TDs in 11 games this season. He eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark twice this season including a career-best 202 yards in WCU's win at Presbyterian. The Thomasville, N.C., native also hauled in 30 passes for 130 yards out of the backfield.

Julien, a red-shirt freshman defensive lineman from Marietta, Ga., finished with 31 tackles including 18 solo stops, posting a career-best five against nationally-ranked Liberty. He finished his rookie season with 2.5 tackles for loss including 1.5 sacks and one pass break-up.

Cain, a freshman punter, averaged 38.9 yards per punt this season with five traveling over 50 yards. The Kennesaw, Ga, native downed 17 kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard line including a career-best five in the home win over Chattanooga helping him garner SoCon Special Teams Player of the Week accolades. He also kicked a school-record 13 times in the season finale against Appalachian State.

ANDRERIUS "TOUCHDOWN" THOMAS:

True freshman Andrerius Thomas finished his rookie campaign with a bang, tallying four touchdown receptions in the final four games of the season including a career-best two in the home win over Chattanooga ... Thomas led all Catamount receivers in 2008 with five touchdown catches.

PITTMAN ECLIPSES CAREER 1,000-YARD MARK:

Catamount WR Marquel Pittman surpassed the 1,000-yard career receiving plateau last season at Wofford ... Entering the game just 35 yards shy of the 1,000-mark, the Maxton, N.C., native reached the milestone on his third catch of the game - a 12-yard scoring strike from QB Zack Jaynes that gave Western the early, 7-0, lead.

CHRIS COLLINS - DEFENSIVE BALL HAWK:

Western Carolina DB Chris Collins forced a SoCon-leading SIX fumbles last season - one shy of tying the school's single-season record (held by Steve Yates, 1972) ... Although only officially credited with six forced fumbles this season, Collins pressured the Presbyterian quarterback helping to cause a fumble that the Catamounts took away when Jeff Bradley fell on the loose football for a would-be seventh forced fumble.

WARLEY - PITTMAN MAKE HISTORY IN PRESBYTERIAN VICTORY:

With Quan Warley surpassing the 200-yard rushing mark and Marquel Pittman going over the century mark in receiving yardage in the win at Presbyterian, it marked the first time in WCU history that the squad had a 200-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game.

SEASONAL NOTE:

Western's loss against Georgia Southern (38-31, OT on 10/25) handed the Catamounts seven losses on the season and means the third-straight losing overall record at season's end - and the 19th since joining the SoCon in 1976 ... However, the win over Chattanooga was WCU's third on the year, its most victories in a single season since winning five in 2005. MORE ON THE GSU LOSS: Georgia Southern's 28-point fourth quarter comeback on Oct. 25 matched a NCAA Division I FCS record for fourth quarter rallies ... the previous 28-point rally was by Delaware State in 1990 against Liberty as DSU overcame a 37-9, deficit in the final 13 minutes of the game ... WCU surrendered 35 unanswered points to GSU, including 28 in regulation alone, over the final 10:43 and OT.

TWO STREAKS SNAPPED IN 2008:

Western Carolina snapped two ominous streaks last season that had reached double-digits ... the Catamounts snapped their consecutive road losing skid at 14 games with its win over Presbyterian on Sept. 20 ... the win over Chattanooga snapped Western's SoCon game winless drought at 20 games ... Prior to the win over UTC, Western had not won a SoCon game since blanking Wofford, 24-0, on Nov. 5, 2005 in Cullowhee (*it was the first-time since the Terriers joined the conference in 1997 that they had been shutout in league play*) ... Western's 20-straight SoCon losses dated back to its battle with Appalachian State in 2005, which was for a share of the conference championship (L, 35-7 in Boone).

MORE ON THE LOSING SKID:

Western's SoCon losing skid was ended at 20-straight games ... It was the third-longest on conference record, eclipsing the 18-game skid by the Marshall Thundering Herd which dropped 18-straight conference games from 1977 through 1979 - ending the drought with a 13-13 tie with WCU ... Davidson, despite not playing a full conference slate, lost 28-straight SoCon games from 1974 through 1986 ... VMI holds the dubious honor of the longest skid at 32 games from 1996-2000.

NEW TURF INSTALLED AT WHITMIRE STADIUM / WATERS FIELD:

The Samford game on Homecoming was Western's first game played on the new turf surface at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field ... WCU first installed AstroTurf at the new facility in 1973 ... the surface was replaced several times before AstroPlay was installed during the summer of 2000 ... Following the Liberty game back on Sept. 13, Carolina Green Corporation removed the old surface and installed the Desso Challenge Pro 2 turf, a product of the overseas Desso Sports Systems. WCU has the same turf that is currently only being used at Oklahoma State, Wyoming and Northern Colorado.

GOLD HELMETS RETURN FOR THE FIRST-TIME SINCE 1968:

With the new brand logo for the 2008 season, Western's football team also has a new look. For just the third time in school history, WCU has gone away from the purple helmet, donning a "golden dome" in 2008. In the mid-1960s, the Catamounts had solid gold helmets, returning to purple in 1969 when former head coach Bob Waters took over. Then, in the 1989 season under first-year head coach Dale Strahm, WCU had a "yellow" look similar to LSU's helmets.

WCU BLANKS SHORTER TO OPEN THE DENNIS WAGNER ERA:

Five different Catamounts scored, including three tallying their first-ever trip to the endzone in the purple and gold as Western Carolina blanked the Shorter College Hawks, 35-0, in Cullowhee to give first-year head coach Dennis Wagner his first career victory at WCU ... WCU has won 11-consecutive home openers ... Western used four, first-half touchdowns to stake itself to a 28-0 halftime advantage, adding a fifth to provide the final tally ... the win snapped a seven-game losing skid dating back to September, 2007.
