West Chester 65, Western Carolina 39

March 23, 1969

Hollinger Field House, West Chester, Pa.



Western Carolina women's basketball was the 1969 CIAW National Tournament runner-up falling to host West Chester 65-39 on March 23, 1969 at Hollinger Field House in West Chester, Pa. It was the first national championship for women's basketball. The first tournament was a 16-team affair held at one site (top-seeded West Chester).

The Catamounts opened the tournament with a 54-37 win over Ball State. The team advanced to play Southern Illinois eeking out a 44-42 win. In the semi-finals, Western Carolina again won by two points defeating Iowa Wesleyan 38-36 to advance to the championship game against West Chester.

RUNNER-UP

Chattanooga 86, Western Carolina 68

March 6, 2004

North Charleston Coliseum, Charleston, S.C.



The Lady Mocs of Chattanooga made it four in a row on Saturday with an 86-68 victory over Western Carolina in the Southern Conference Tournament Championship at the North Charleston Coliseum.

The victory over the sixth seeded Catamounts was the second largest margin of victory in tournament history, and improved Chattanooga's season record to 28-2. The win also gave the Mocs their 26th straight victory, 12th consecutive Southern Conference Tournament win, and sixth bid since 1989 to the NCAA Tournament.

Chattanooga opened the game with a three-pointer by Southern Conference Player of the Year Katasha Brown, and went on a 17-3 run to establish an early lead. Forward Tiffani Roberson went four-for-eight from the field and two-for-two from the line for 10 points at the half, while Katie Galloway added eight with two three pointers in the period. Western Carolina answered on the inside with forwards Tiffany Hamm and Jennifer Gardner each scoring 11 before the break, but the Lady Mocs led 43-25 at half time, and outdid WCU 24-12 on the boards, and 14-8 in second chance points.

While Chattanooga scored another 43 in the second period, Western Carolina almost doubled its first-half output with 43 points of its own. Though Hamm was shut down after the break, the Catamounts went with a more balanced offensive attack, sinking six second period three-pointers with scoring by seven of eight players, including a seven-point effort by Ki-Ki Glass.

2005 SOCON TOURNAMENT CHAMPION

Western Carolina 97, Georgia Southern 95 (2OT)

March 5, 2005

McKenzie Arena, Chattanooga, Tenn.



Senior forward Jennifer Gardner scored a conference-tournament high 45 points while setting two SoCon records as the sixth-seeded Western Carolina Lady Catamounts outlasted #5 Georgia Southern, 97-95, in the tournament finals in double overtime.

The Lady Catamounts became the first team to win the SoCon championship after playing in the first round, slicing through four days to claim the top prize. Senior Jennifer Gardner was named the tournament's MVP and was joined on the All-tournament team by classmates Lori Tanner, Sigita Maleraite, and freshman Chevon Keith.

2007 SOCON TOURNAMENT RUNNER-UP

Chattanooga 84, Western Carolina 66

March 4, 2007

North Charleston Coliseum, Charleston, S.C.



Sophomore Lauren Powell drained her third 3-pointer of the game at the 5:45 mark of the second half to pull top-seeded Western Carolina even with Chattanooga at 62-62. However, sparked by back-to-back treys, the second-seeded Lady Mocs outscored the Lady Catamounts 22-to-4 the remainder of the game, stretching the lead late from the free throw line en route to an 84-66 win in the 2007 Southern Conference Women's Basketball Championship at the North Charleston Coliseum.

Western Carolina put four players in double-figures led by 14 from Brooke Johnson, all coming in the opening 20 minutes, with Powell also adding 14 including a perfect 3-for-3 showing from beyond the 3-point arc. Keith added 11 points and a team-high eight rebounds, with sophomore Kendra Eaton just missing double figures with nine points on 4-of-6 shooting, with junior Monique Dawson adding eight points and a game-best five assists.

2008 SOCON TOURNAMENT RUNNER-UP

Chattanooga 71, Chattanooga 59

March 10, 2008

North Charleston Coliseum, Charleston, S.C.



No. 2 seeded Western Carolina women's basketball (25-8) suffered a heart-wrenching loss as the Lady Catamounts fell to No. 1 seed Chattanooga (29-3) 71-59 in the Southern Conference Championships Monday at North Charleston Coliseum.

Head Coach Kellie Harper was visibly shaken in the post-game press conference as she spoke about the loss and how hard it was to go into the locker room after the game and face her players. The Lady Catamounts proved their pose by fighting back in the second half but the club just couldn't keep the hot-shooting Lady Mocs at bay.

Western Carolina was down by as much as 15 points in the second after trailing by 11, 33-22, at the half. Junior guard Lauren Powell hit a three-pointer to spark a 9-0 Lady Catamount run to trim the Lady Mocs' lead to six, 39-33 in the first four minutes of the second half.

Battle, battle, battle, is what Western Carolina did for most of the final 20 minutes of the game. The Lady Catamounts kept the Chattanooga lead to under double digits for most of the first 10 minutes of the second frame. A lay-up by junior Kendra Eaton cut Chattanooga's lead to just four, 43-39, with 12:38 left but Chattanooga did what it was able to do all night, answer, thanks to a three-pointer by senior Laura Hall.

A lay-up by freshman Emily Clarke cut the Chattanooga lead back to five, 46-41, but again Chattanooga answered this time when Alex Anderson hit a jumper to push the lead back to seven. The Chattanooga lead was 12 with 3:49 left when Ashley Pellom stole the ball and raced down the court for a lay-up, but Hall came back to hit a pair of free throws for yet another answer.

2009 SOCON TOURNAMENT CHAMPION

Western Carolina 101, College of Charleston 87 (3 OT)

March 10, 2009

McKenzie Arena, Chattanooga, Tenn.



It took three overtimes, 101 points and clutch free throws down the stretch, but Western Carolina women's basketball weathered it all, to capture the 2009 Southern Conference Tournament Title in McKenzie Arena Monday. The No. 3 seeded Lady Catamounts (21-11) defeated No. 4 seed College of Charleston (23-8) 101-87.

Western Carolina took the lead to start the third OT when senior Eaton was fouled after the tip. She drained one of two free throws, to put the Lady Catamount up by one, 86-85. The Cougars quickly retook the lead off a Deidera Jones lay-up with 3:46 remaining.

The Lady Catamounts 14-0 run to close out the third overtime began with a monster three-pointer by Heather Swayne to put WCU up 89-87 with 3.24 left. Southern Conference Tournament MVP Brooke Johnson scored seven of the Lady Catamounts final 10 points, to close out the game, and give Head Coach Kellie Harper her second tournament championship.

Johnson, who was also an All-Southern Conference Tournament selection, led all scorers with 21 points and also recorded a double-double with 13 boards. The 6-4 senior center notched four blocks and takes over the Western Carolina career blocks record and now has 130.

Four other Lady Catamounts also posted double figure scoring. Powell had 19 points, Second Team All-Southern Conference Tournament performer Emily Clarke added 18, Kristen Feenster had 15 and Heather Swayne had 12 points.

Western Carolina was down by 12 points (37-25) at the half and down by as much as 15 to start the second. The Lady Catamounts began to chip away at the Cougar lead with 13:14 left, beginning with a three-pointer by freshman Kaila'Shea Menendez. Then proceeded to go on a 17-3 run, capped by a lay-up by Eaton, to take a 55-51 lead with 6:58 left in regulation.

The tide looked to have turned in Western Carolina's favor after building an eight point advantage, 61-53, with 6:53 left. It was then College of Charleston's turn to make the comeback and cut the Lady Catamount lead down to two twice in the final minute.

Western Carolina was up by five points with 25 seconds remaining when College of Charleston's Tonia Gerty drained a three-pointer to cut it to 70-68. The Lady Catamounts turned the ball over, and Gerty hit a lay-up with two seconds remaining, to tie the game at 70 and force the first overtime.

The Lady Catamounts were down by two with 1.8 seconds remaining in the first overtime when Powell was fouled to put her on the free throw line. Powell calmly drained both free throws to tie the game at 78 and force the second overtime.

College of Charleston built as much as a five point lead in the second OT, leading 85-80 with 1:59 remaining. Powell drained a three-pointer to cut the Cougar lead to two, 85-83. Again it was up to Powell and her free throw heroics, when she was placed on the free throw line, and hit two from the charity stripe to tie the game at 85.

The game set several tournament records. College of Charleston's 88 field goal attempts broke the old record of 86 that Chattanooga set against Appalachian State in 1991. The game was the third-highest scoring game in SoCon Tournament history. Western Carolina's 101 points was also just the third 100-point game in tournament history. CofC's Jade Hughes recorded 52 minutes of action, a tournament single-game record.

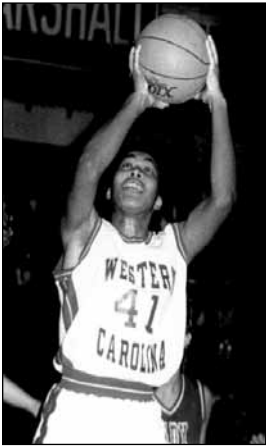

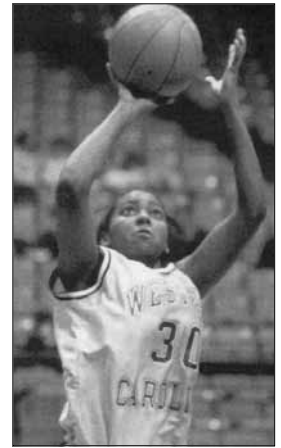
