WCC PLAYERS OF THE MONTH FOR OCTOBER SELECTED

CO-WOMEN'S SOCCER - Marian Dalmy, Santa Clara University

Santa Clara senior defender Marian Dalmy turned in a big month for the Broncos, leading SCU to a 5-1-1 record. With the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy Award nominee leading the way, the Broncos' logged three shutout victories during October to bring the team's season total to 11. A dual threat, Dalmy netted three goals and recorded five assists on the month, making her the WCC's leading scorer among defenders.

CO-WOMEN'S SOCCER - Michelle Enyeart, University of Portland

Portland's Michelle Enyeart enjoyed an outstanding month of October, establishing herself as one of the top players in the nation and arguably the best freshman in the country. Enyeart guided Portland to a 6-1-1 record during the month with a WCC-best eight goals to go along with two assists for 18 total points. The Hemet, CA native scored the game-winner in five of UP's six wins. She either scored or assisted on 10 of Portland's 19 goals during the month, and tallied at least one point in all eight matches.

MEN'S SOCCER - Joseph Buttitta, Santa Clara University

Goalkeeper Joseph Buttitta led a stifling Santa Clara defense during the month of October, as the Broncos posted an undefeated 6-0-2 mark and clinched the program's ninth WCC men's soccer title. The sophomore kept clean sheets in four of Santa Clara's eight matches, increasing his conference-leading shutout total to seven, and did not allow more than one goal in any game as the Broncos posted the program's first undefeated month since 2003. The San Jose, CA native surrendered just four goals in 764:54 minutes in net, posting a 0.47 goals against average to lower his season GAA to a WCC-best 0.76. The Broncos clinched the WCC Championship at Loyola Marymount (10/29), as Buttitta made five saves and withstood a 10 shots in the opening 20 minutes of the game to lead SCU to the 2-0 win. He was tabbed for WCC Player of the Week honors on October 30 for his role in the title-clinching weekend.

VOLLEYBALL - Kristen Carlson, University of San Diego

During the month of October Carlson helped lead the Toreros to a perfect 7-0 record to take first place in the WCC. The senior outside hitter recorded 134 kills for a 5.58 kills per game average, while hitting at a .331 clip and chipping in 4.08 digs per game in October. Carlson posted a double-double in each of the seven matches, notching her biggest match against Pepperdine when she recorded 26 kills and 19 digs. The Purcellville, VA native laid down at least 19 kills in five matches last month and added 19 total blocks. Carlson earned back-to-back WCC Player of the Week honors and the Collegiate Volleyball Update National Player of the Week award during October.
