## WCC MEN'S HISTORY

The West Coast Conference has sponsored a men's tennis championship since 1958 and the Pepperdine Waves have dominated the event, taking home 41 WCC titles, including the last 20 straight. Over the last two years, Pepperdine defeated Santa Clara and San Diego, respectively, by a score of 4-1 in two of the closest championship matches to date. In 2007 and 2008, the Pepperdine men did not lose a single point in any of its matchups at the WCC Championships to take home their 38th and 39th conference crowns.

Pepperdine's 37th WCC men's tennis championship in 2006 was the year the Waves won the program's first-ever NCAA Tennis Championship. The Waves rolled to a 36-2 mark during the 2006 campaign, knocking off a previously undefeated Georgia team in the NCAA Championship match, 4-2. The title marked the first-ever men's tennis team championship for a WCC squad, and the Waves joined San Francisco as the only conference programs to win an NCAA team title. The Dons won the 1949 team championship, prior to the formation of the WCC in 1952.

The WCC has had great success at the national level. In 2010, WCC Player of the Year and three-time All-American Bassam Beidas from Pepperdine advanced to the Round of 16 after upsetting No. 8 seed Alexandre Lacroix from Florida in the second round. The year prior, the men's side had three WCC players appear at the NCAA Championships, including Beidas, his teammate Omar Altmann (2009 WCC Player of the Year), and San Diego's Dean Jackson. Jackson and Altmann reached the third round of the tournament before falling to ranked opponents, while Altmann and Beidas paired up to advance to the NCAA quarterfinals.

Back in 2005, San Diego's Pierrick Ysern advanced to the championship match of the men's singles tournament, while Pepperdine's Andre Begemann and Scott Doerner fell just short in the 2006 doubles competition, losing in the title match. Pepperdine netters have won three NCAA individual championships, with Kelly Jones and Jerome Jones winning the NCAA doubles title in 1984, and K. Jones successfully defending the doubles title the following year in 1985 with new partner Carlos DiLaura. Robby Weiss won the NCAA singles championship while playing for Pepperdine in 1988. The Waves have reached the semifinals of the team championships six times, twice finishing as the national runner-up before breaking through for a title in 2006. San Francisco has also had success in men's tennis, with Henry Likas claiming an NCAA singles crown in 1948 and the Dons reaching the NCAA final in the team tournament in both 1948 and 1949.

San Diego was the last school (and the only other school among current WCC members) to win the WCC Championship, claiming back-to-back titles in 1989 and 1990. San Diego's Jose Luis Noriega defeated teammate Dan Mattera 6-2, 6-4 to win the singles title in 1989 and was a member of the 1989 and 1990 doubles champions. Noriega added another WCC singles title in 1991, but as a team, the Toreros finished second behind the Waves. The Toreros have placed second in all but one year since.

Prior to San Diego's back-to-back titles, the Waves won 16 consecutive WCC championships. Pepperdine's Robby Weiss won singles titles in 1985 and 1988, and added a doubles title in 1987, to lead the Waves in the mid-eighties. In 1982, Glenn Michibata won a singles and doubles title for Pepperdine. San Francisco put forth its best performances in WCC championship history in 1980 and 1981. The 1981 USF squad placed four players in the singles finals, but each came up short to Pepperdine; that year, San Diego's Terry Ward became the first Torero to win a WCC singles title. The 1980 USF squad produced its only WCC champions, with the doubles team of Mike Howard and Mark Hansell defeating fellow Don teammates Eddie Barretto and Mike Jee 6-2, 6-4. Pepperdine's Mike White defeated teammate Jerome Jones 6-3, 6-4 for the 1980 singles title.

Pepperdine won the WCC men's team championship each year from 1973 through 1980. In 1975 and 1976, Pepperdine's Joao Soares won both the singles and doubles titles; Dave Mitchell did the same in 1973 and 1974 for the Waves. The two teamed up as the doubles champion in 1974.

## WCC WOMEN'S HISTORY

In the 24-year history of the West Coast Conference women's championship, Pepperdine has captured the conference crown on 22 occasions, including a run of 14 consecutive titles from 1988-2001. The only other active WCC members to have won a WCC Championship title are Saint Mary's and Loyola Marymount.

Saint Mary's emerged as the 2010 WCC Champion, winning its first ever conference title in program history, defeating Pepperdine 4-1. Both teams went on to compete at the NCAA Championships, as did San Francisco's Jenni Heinser--three-time WCC Player of the Year.

In 2009, the WCC Men's Tennis Championships and WCC Women's Tennis Championships were held as a dual event at the Barnes Tennis Center in San Diego, CA. The new setting did not disturb the Waves, as they continued their dominance at the tournament, earning their 22nd conference crown after a close title match with Saint Mary's (third time in a row these teams have met in the Championship round). The score was 4-2. The Waves went on to represent the WCC at the NCAA Team Championships but were defeated in the first round by Texas, 4-1.

In the 2008 NCAA Championships, Pepperdine advanced to the second round after sweeping UNLV. The Waves were then defeated by USC 4-0. In the doubles tournament, the Pepperdine pair of Sylvia Kosakowski and Bianca Dulgheru were defeated in the Round of 32 by the No. 3 seed Brook Buck and Kelly Teft of Notre Dame. The pair finished its season with a 20-6 record. The same Pepperdine pair of Kosakowski and Dulgheru competed in the NCAA Division I Doubles Championships in 2007, where they received All-American accolades, after advancing to the quarterfinals.

In the 2003 WCC Championships, the Waves defeated San Diego in the title match, while matches to determine third, fifth, and seventh place were cancelled due to inclement weather and ties were declared for the first time in conference history. Santa Clara's Christine Limbers also became the first Bronco to win Player of the Year honors that year. Pepperdine, Loyola Marymount, San Diego and San Francisco are the only other schools to have members of their team named WCC Player of the Year.

In 2002, No. 2 seed Loyola Marymount captured its first WCC tennis championship by upsetting No. 1 seed Pepperdine, snapping a string of 14 consecutive titles by the Waves. That year, the WCC was represented at the NCAA championships by three different schools for the first time in league history, as individuals from San Diego and LMU received at-large invitations, in addition to Pepperdine's automatic bid for the team championship.

Then in 1999, San Diego became--and still remains--the first and only program in the league to claim a national title, when four-time All-American Zuzana Lesnarova won the NCAA Singles Championship in 1999. Lesnarova, a three-time WCC Player of the Year and 2010 WCC Hall of Honor member, ended 1999 as the No. 1 ranked player in the nation, winner of three Grand Slam events, and the 1999 ITA National Player of the Year. Pepperdine and San Diego remain the only schools in the WCC to have All-Americans on their team.

The late 80's and the 90's were dominated by Pepperdine. In fact, the top three in the women's standings remained unchanged from 1988 to 2000, with San Diego finishing second and Loyola Marymount third each time. The women's championship started as an open draw format tournament and was won by US International in 1986 and 1987 (no longer a WCC member). Pepperdine then took home the title through 2001, even when the tournament was a flight format in 1994 and changed to a team dual match format in 1995. The women's tournament operates as a team dual match to this day.

## Saint Mary's Takes Home Its First Ever WCC Title

The 2010 WCC Championships proved to be a historic one with Saint Mary's winning its first-ever WCC title in program history, outplaying Pepperdine, a team that was expected to take home its 23rd WCC title. This was the fourth time that the Gaels and Waves were paired up against one another in the Championship match, and it was Saint Mary's that took home the title this year, winning by a score of 4-1.
