Gonzaga's Vandersloot Third Pick In 2011 WNBA Draft



Senior point guard Courtney Vandersloot became the first Bulldog player in school history to be drafted in the first round of the WNBA draft, as she was taken third overall by the Chicago Sky on Monday, April 11th.

Vandersloot is the second overall Zag to be drafted in the WNBA. Former Gonzaga star Vivian Frieson was taken 31st overall in the 2010 Draft by the Tulsa Shock.

#8 Gonzaga Bulldogs (31-5 / 14-0 WCC)



★ 11th-seeded Gonzaga advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in school history in the 2011 NCAA Basketball Championships. The Bulldogs upset no. 6 Iowa 92-86, upended no. 8 UCLA 89-75, and defeated no. 7 Louisville 76-69.

★ Senior point guard Courtney Vandersloot became the first player in Bulldog and West Coast Conference history to be named Second Team AP All-America and was also named to the John R. Wooden Award All America Team. In addition, she was drafted third overall by the WNBA's Chicago Sky.

★ Vandersloot was selected as the 2011 Nancy Lieberman Award winner, which recognizes the nation's top point guard in women's NCAA Division I basketball.

★ Junior forward Kayla Standish is one of 35 players who have accepted invitations to participate in the USA Women's World University Games Team Trials, which will take place May 22-25 at the U.S. Olympic Training Center (USOTC) in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Loyola Marymount Lions (11-18/ 5-9 WCC)



★ Loyola Marymount fell 73-43 to San Diego in the opening round of the 2011 Zappos.com WCC Basketball Championships in Las Vegas, Nev.

★ Senior guard Renahy Young was named to the 2010-11 All-Jesuit All-American team on Friday, April 8th. Young was an Honorable Mention selection and one of just 18 players nationally to be recognized.

★ After posting a 4.00 grade-point-average in her Master's of Education graduate program, senior guard Jessica Vargas was named to the 2010-11 National Jesuit All-Academic team on Tuesday, April 12th. She was one of just six players in the country to receive the honor.

★ LMU finished the season with the third-best scoring defense in the WCC, allowing 64.9 points per game. WCC Newcomer of the Year freshman Camille Buckley moved into fourth place on the LMU single-season rebounding list, finishing the season with 259.

Pepperdine Waves (18-12/ 9-5 WCC)



★ Making their second consecutive Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance, Pepperdine fell 81-74 to Oklahoma State in the first round of the WNIT in Stillwater, Okla. on Wednesday, March 16th. Junior guard Katie Menton scored a career-high 29 points in the loss.

★ The Waves tallied 12 steals in their WNIT first round contest, including five from junior guard Lauren Bell. Pepperdine finished first in the WCC and fourth in the NCAA with 12.8 steals a game.

★ Sophomore forward Kelsey Patrick and junior center Alex Jarrell earned West Coast Conference All-Academic honors. Patrick received first-team honors, while Jarrell received honorable mention for the second consecutive season.

★ The Waves dropped a quarterfinal contest at the WCC Basketball Championships on Saturday, March 5th at the Orleans Arena, losing 77-68 to San Diego.

Portland Pilots (16-15 / 6-8 WCC)



★ Portland defeated Santa Clara 75-64 on Saturday, March 5th in the quarterfinals at the Orleans Arena. The Pilots then fell 96-71 in the semifinals to top-seeded Gonzaga.

★ Junior guard ReZina TecleMariam was named to the 2011 WCC All-Tournament team. TecleMariam averaged 21 points in two days for the Pilots, including a career-high 28 points in the second round win over Santa Clara.

★ Senior Tara Cronin was named to the West Coast Conference Winter All-Academic Team, while sophomore Sarah Kliever earned honorable mention. Cronin was also selected to the 2010-11 Capital One Academic All-District 8 First Team.

★ TecleMariam finished the season ranked second in the WCC and 28th in the NCAA with 5.2 assists per game. As a team, the Pilots led the WCC and were 19th in the NCAA with 7.3 three-point field goals made per contest.

Saint Mary's Gaels (19-13 / 11-5 WCC)

★ Saint Mary's was edged by Nevada in the first-round of the WNIT, losing to the Wolf Pack 65-62 on Thursday, March 17th in McKeon Pavilion. In the loss, senior forward Louella Tomlinson became SMC's all-time career rebounding leader with rebound 1,122. That number is a West Coast Conference record as well.

★ Tomlinson finished atop the NCAA leaderboard with 4.7 blocked shots this season.

★ Saint Mary's fell 72-46 to top-seeded Gonzaga in the Championship Game of the 2011 Zappos.com WCC Basketball Championship on Monday, March 7th on ESPNU.

★ Sophomore guard Kate Gaze was named to the 2010-11 WCC Winter All-Academic Team. Gaze received honorable mention after maintaining a 3.208 GPA in the classroom. The sophomore guard led the WCC in three-point percentage, converting at a 42.4 percent clip.



San Diego Toreros (17-14 / 5-9 WCC)

★ San Diego won two games in two days before falling 71-68 to Saint Mary's in the WCC Basketball Championships semifinals. The Toreros defeated LMU 73-43 on Friday, then upset third-seed Pepperdine 77-68.

★ Senior guard Sam Child was named to the All-Tournament team after averaging 18.3 points in a three-game stretch for the Toreros. With 55 points over the weekend, Child ended her four-year career with 1,393 points, which is the third most in program history.

★ Senior forward Emily Hatch and junior guard Morgan Woodrow were both selected to the West Coast Conference All-Academic team. Hatch carried a 3.64 GPA as a psychology major. Woodrow, who also had a 3.64 GPA, is a communication studies major.

★ Senior forward Emily Hatch pulled down 37 rebounds in three games, which is a new WCC Tournament record, surpassing former Torero Amber Sprague's previous mark of 35 set it in 2009.



San Francisco Dons (4-25 / 1-13 WCC)

★ San Francisco fell 62-58 in the first round of the Zappos.com West Coast Conference Basketball Championships at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas.

★ Junior guard Rheina Ale led the Dons with 13 points, seven rebounds, two assists and a block. Redshirt senior guard Kelly Jo Mullaney added nine points with three steals, while junior guard Vania Singleterry tallied seven.

★ For the second consecutive year, San Francisco was named one of 33 winners in the NCAA Division I "Pack the House" Challenge, as announced by the NCAA national office. USF was named the West Coast Conference winner for the nation-wide contest in which conferences and institutions compete to build attendance at women's basketball games.

★ Redshirt senior Kelly Jo Mullaney and junior Vania Singleterry were named to the WCC All-Academic team, while sophomore Ashley Boggs garnered honorable mention honors.



Santa Clara Broncos (11-19 / 6-8 WCC)

★ Junior guard Alyssa Shoji scored a season-high 18 points and redshirt-senior forward Lena Gipson had 14 points and 14 rebounds as Santa Clara defeated USF 62-58 in the opening game of the 2011 Zappos.com WCC Basketball Championships. The Broncos then fell 75-64 to Portland in the quarterfinals on Saturday, March 5th.

★ Shoji made five 3-pointers in the win over the Dons. For the year, Shoji knocked down 2.1 three-point field-goals per game, which was third in the West Coast Conference.

★ Senior forward Lena Gipson led the WCC and finished seventh in the nation with 11.2 rebounds per game. In a 52-47 victory over Pacific back in December, Gipson pulled down 22 boards, just one shy of an all-time school record.

★ Sophomores Ashley Armstrong, Meagan Fulps and Lindsay Leo were named to the 2011 West Coast Conference Winter All-Academic team.

Vandersloot First Ever to 2,000 points, 1,000 assists in NCAA D-1 History

Gonzaga senior point guard Courtney Vandersloot became the first NCAA Division I basketball player with at least 2,000 points and 1,000 assists in her career. Vandersloot already had 1,085 assists heading into Monday's game, but reached the 2,000-point mark with her 10th point in Monday night's NCAA second-round victory against no. 3 UCLA on March 21st.

Former Penn State star Suzie McConnell previously had the most points for any player with 1,000 assists after scoring 1,897 in her career. The most of any men's player with 1,000 assists was Bobby Hurley, who scored 1,731 points in his Duke career to go along with 1,076 assists.

The Records Keep Breaking

Vandersloot can add two more records to her list. Vandersloot dished out seven assists Saturday night, March 26th, against Louisville, bringing her season total to 358. That's an NCAA women's record, breaking Penn State's Suzie McConnell's 355 set in 1986-87.

She also broke the West Coast Conference career steals mark in Saturday night's Elite Eight victory over the Cardinal. Vandersloot went into the game needing three steals to become the all-time leader and finished with seven. She broke San Francisco's Toni Russell's mark of 359 set during 2001-05. Vandersloot now has 364 career steals.

Vandersloot Receives National Recognition

Gonzaga senior point guard Courtney Vandersloot became the first player in Bulldog and West Coast Conference history to be named Second Team AP All-America and was also named to the John R. Wooden Award All-America Team. In addition, Vandersloot was named to the 2011 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I State Farm Coaches' All-America Basketball team and was selected as the 2011 Nancy Lieberman Award winner which recognizes the nation's top point guard in women's NCAA Division I basketball. Vandersloot also participated in the USA Women's National Team Training Camp from May 10th through 12th in Las Vegas, Nev. She was one of only three players in attendance that played college basketball last year.
