HORIZON LEAGUE



In its 28th year, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.

The Horizon League's primary focus is on adding value to the educational experience through its four platforms of athletic performance, academic achievement, community outreach, and personal responsibility and accountability. It is the League's belief that athletics is a powerful and visible tool that can be used to enhance student-athletes' collegiate experience.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports - nine for men and 10 for women. In all sports, all teams participate in their respective postseason League championships regardless of regular-season performance, allowing all

student-athletes an opportunity to qualify for NCAA championships. The League receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in 10 sports, including women's soccer.

Founded in 1979 as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name.

Horizon League student-athletes excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to the Academic Honor Roll each of the past three semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.25 or better. Thirty-five student-athletes were named to *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District teams in 2005-06 and 11 earned Academic All-America honors.

In addition to its athletics success, the Horizon League has secured a well-earned reputation for its community service initiatives. On campus, student-athletes have raised money and aware-

ness for such causes as breast cancer, diabetes and hurricane relief, while hosting blood drives, neighborhood clean-ups, Big Brother/Big Sister programs and more.

MEN'S HISTORY

In 1967, UW-Green Bay made an historic decision that laid the foundation for the success of the men's soccer program. That year, the University administration, with the assistance of a successful local football coach, Vince Lombardi, decided that men's soccer would be the priority fall sport at UW-Green Bay.

The result was instant success for the men's soccer program. In its first season in 1969, the Phoenix (which, for that season, held the moniker "Bay Badgers") went 11-2-1, winning its inaugural match over Colorado College, 3-0. Over the next nine seasons, the Phoenix would go 92-33-11 (.717 winning percentage) and make six postseason appearances. During that time, the Phoenix finished fourth in the NCAA Division II national tournament twice.

Over their 38-year history, the Phoenix men have posted 15 10-win seasons and eight postseason appearances. Of those 10-win seasons, UW-Green Bay notched a program-best 16 victories in 1992, which included an NCAA record-tying 10 consecutive shutouts.

In all, the men's soccer team has featured seven All-Americans, 25 All-Great Lakes Region selections and a program record of 342-265-58. Fifteen men associated with men's soccer,

including two coaches, are in the 58-member Phoenix Hall of Fame:

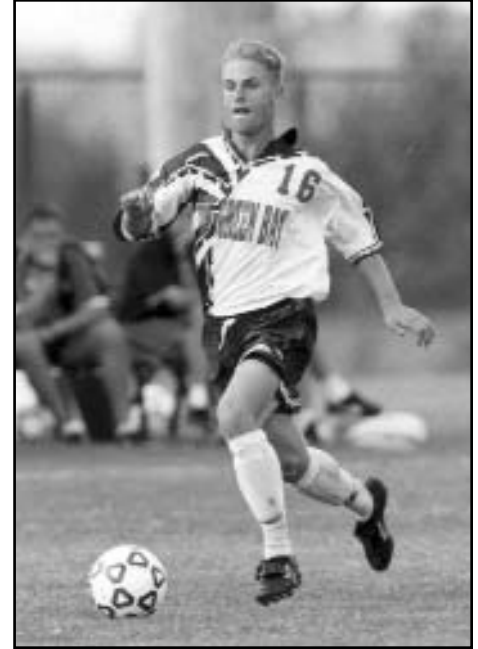
SANTAGA STADIUM

With its wide and long dimensions and its location between the bay of Green Bay and the Niagara Escarpment, Santaga Stadium has provided UW-Green Bay with a fantastic home field advantage over the years.

The Phoenix men are tough to beat at home, with an overall record of 140-61-22 at Santaga Stadium. The squad has played many memorable games at its home pitch, from its overtime victory over regionally ranked Central Florida in 1999 to its overtime thriller against Wisconsin four seasons ago.

Storied rivalries have grown on Santaga Stadium, including those with its in-state foes. UW-Green Bay has 10 wins all-time against Marquette at the field, has defeated Wisconsin in three of four overtime games and has battled with UW-Milwaukee in seven one-goal games, including last year's epic overtime Phoenix win.

From 1981 to 1984, UW-Green Bay had a 22-game undefeated streak at Santaga Stadium, including a 1-1 tie with UCLA in 1983 and a 2-1 win over powerhouse Akron during the same season. During that time, the Phoenix outscored its opponents 62-14 with nine shutouts.

UWGB NIKE SOCCER CLASSIC

The UW-Green Bay men's soccer team will host the 2006 UWGB Nike Soccer Classic at Santaga Stadium Sept. 16-17, coinciding with this year's homecoming weekend. This year's field features Eastern Illinois, Sacred Heart and Georgia State. Under the guidance of head coach Tom Poitras last season, the Phoenix got off to a 2-0 start on the year with a pair of UWGB Nike Soccer Classic wins.

The four-team tournament began in 1999 and has featured both regional and national soccer powers including UW-Milwaukee, Central Florida and Loyola (Md.).

CHANCELLOR'S CUP

Every year, the men's soccer team battles with in-state and Horizon League rival UW-Milwaukee for the rights to the Chancellor's

Cup. The trophy's travels began in 1976, with the Phoenix winning the inaugural contest, 2-0.

UW-Green Bay kept the cup in Tiletown in 2005 thanks to a thrilling 1-0 overtime win against UW-Milwaukee, returning the trophy to the Phoenix after a four-year absence. The all-time Chancellor Cup record is 17-9-3 in favor of UW-Milwaukee.

SENIOR DAY

The final home game of each season is a special day for UW-Green Bay seniors and their parents. Seniors are honored in a pregame ceremony at the center of Phoenix Field, receiving thanks for their hard work and commitment to the UW-Green Bay men's soccer program.

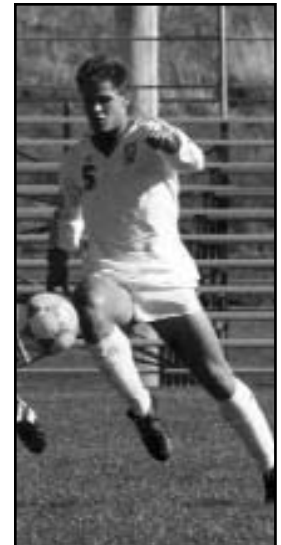

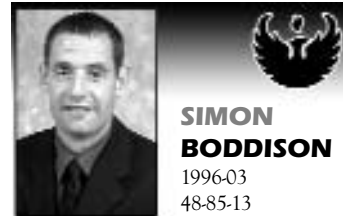
