Liability and Health Information

Liability waiver

In consideration of my child's participation in the camp, I hereby release the University of Wisconsin System Board of Regents, its officers, employees and agents from any and all liability arising out of any injury or illness my child incurs while participating in camp activities. I understand the rigorous athletic activity in which he will be involved. I understand that participation is voluntary and I choose freely to have my child participate. I understand that some overnight accommodations for resident campers are private facilities, not University facilities.

Health insurance

Campers are encouraged to have their own health insurance as limited accident insurance is provided by the University. I understand that the Camp provides limited accident insurance, which is primary on the first \$1,000 and excess up to \$7,500.

Health

By applying for this camp I agree to complete and return to the Sports Medicine Department the confidential Consent for Medical Administration and Medical Treatment Form and Health History Questionnaire. I understand these forms need to be completed and on file **prior** to my child's participation in the Camp activities. (These forms can be completed online at UWCamps.com. They can also be printed from the UWCamps.com web page and mailed in with the paper application. If these forms are missing when the paper application is received, the forms will be mailed to parents / guardians.)

Our camp has qualified sports medicine staff on duty 24 hours, in addition to the UW Hospitals and Clinics. Every effort is made to protect the health and safety of our campers. It is important that campers come physically prepared to take full advantage of their camp experience. This includes breaking in their basketball shoes to help avoid blisters and other foot ailments.

How You Can Be a Badger Camper

1. Register online with a credit card payment at our www.uwcamps.com website. A health form is completed during the online registration process. Or, send in a check payment with a completed application form. Be sure to sign the liability waiver. (The Sports Medicine office will mail a health form directly to you after a mail-in application is received).
2. If you indicated a roommate preference, make sure that person signs up for the same camp. Remember we can only accommodate TWO campers per room.
3. After a camp application is processed, the following will be mailed to you: confirmation letter, map, registration date, time and location.
4. Break in your basketball shoes, pack your bag using the equipment checklist below, and come to camp ready to have a great basketball experience.
5. Double-check your registration time and date. Camp starts immediately following the registration.
6. Camp applications are processed on a first come, first serve basis. Our camps are open to any and all entrants. Camps are restricted by enrollment limitations, grade levels and gender.

Supervision and conduct

Campers will be supervised at all times to ensure a secure environment. Any misconduct by a camper is grounds for immediate dismissal from the camp without a refund.

Parking

Parking is available for a daily fee for campers who drive to campus. Contact the camp office for details.

Housing

University Housing residence halls provide student-style housing conveniently located on campus near camps. Each air-conditioned room includes twin beds with bed linens and pillows, microfridges, desks, Internet and cable television connections (via personal laptop) and shared bathroom facilities. Floor lounges include televisions and telephones with free local calls. Laundry and vending machines are located within most halls. Meals provide a variety of youth-friendly and healthy selections, including vegetarian options.

Roommates

If you have indicated a roommate on your camp application, make sure that person submits his application. Only **TWO** campers per room allowed.

Cancellations/refunds/changes

Should you have the unfortunate circumstance of having to cancel your camp attendance prior to May 15, 2011, there is an administrative fee (\$25 for the Shooting Camp, Advanced Instruction Camp, Father/Son Camp, and Day Camp and \$50 for the Commuting/ Residence Camp and Team Camp) that will be deducted from your refund. After May 15, up until your arrival at camp, refunds (minus the administrative fee) will only be given for written medical reasons when accompanied by a licensed physician's letter and signature. The reason for this is we have to guarantee our number of campers for housing, meals, staff, and transportation. No refunds given for any reason once camp starts. Written notice must also be given if changing camp sessions and/or roommate requests.

Commuter drop off/pick up/registration

Drop off commuting campers at the designated UW campus residence hall for the Overnight, Father/Son, Shooting and Advanced Instruction camps. Drop off campers at the Kohl Center for our Day Camp. Breakfast is not included for commuters. Pick up commuters at the end of each day at the same place they were dropped off. If commuters leave camp between 8 a.m. and 9:00 p.m., the camp director must be notified.

Each camp session will begin immediately following registration/check-in, which is required of ALL campers.
