Badgers kick off spring practice

► The Wisconsin football team begins spring practice on Saturday, March 13. The Badgers will hold 15 practices, culminating in the annual Spring Game on Saturday, April 17 at 2 p.m. in Camp Randall Stadium. The complete spring practice schedule, including media availabilities, can be found in the box on the left.

Many happy returns

► Heading into 2010, the Badgers return 46 letterwinners (23 offense, 20 defense, three specialists). UW's 18 returning starters (10 offense, six defense, two specialists) from 2009 is tops in the Big Ten. A total of 28 different Badgers have started at least one game at UW.

► The Badgers' 2010 spring roster breaks down like this (eligibility refers to fall, 2010): 13 seniors, 25 juniors, 19 sophomores and 25 freshmen.

Looking Back

► Wisconsin won 10 games in a season for just the sixth time in school history. Head coach Bret Bielema has been a part of three of those seasons (head coach in 2006 and '09, defensive coordinator in 2005).

► The Badgers finished the season ranked 16th in both the Associated Press and *USA Today* Coaches polls. That is the sixth-best finish for UW since 1963. From 1942-1962, Wisconsin finished among the top 15 in the A.P. poll eight times.

► UW defeated No. 14 Miami, 20-14, in the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl. It was the Badgers' school-record eighth straight bowl appearance, the second-longest active streak in the Big Ten. Wisconsin has won 10 bowl games since 1993, tied for second-most in the country over that span.

► Sophomore running back John Clay was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year. He is the just the third Badger in school history to earn Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year honors, joining running backs Brent Moss (1993) and Ron Dayne (1999). Clay is just the sixth sophomore to win the award, joining Purdue quarterback Drew Brees (1998), Michigan running backs Tyrone Wheatley (1992) and Jon Vaughn (1990) and Michigan State running backs Tico Duckett (1990) and Lorenzo White (1985).

► Linebacker Chris Borland was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year, the sixth UW player to win the award (Tony Lowery - 1987, Ron Dayne - 1996, Brooks Bollinger - 1999, Anthony Davis - 2001, P.J. Hill - 2006). Borland is the first defensive player in UW history to win Big Ten Freshman of the Year and the first in the conference since Purdue defensive back Stuart Schweigert in 2000.

► In addition to Clay, four other Badgers earned first-team All-Big Ten recognition (tackle Gabe Carimi, tight end Garrett Graham, guard John Moffitt and defensive end O'Brien Schofield). UW's five first-team All-Big Ten selections are the school's most since 2004 and the last time the Badgers had four offensive players named first-team all-conference was in 1999.

► Over the last six seasons with head coach Bret Bielema on the coaching staff (two as defensive coordinator and four as head coach), UW has compiled a 57-20 record. That is second-best in the Big Ten and 13th-best in the country over that time.

At the helm

► UW head coach Bret Bielema is entering his seventh season at Wisconsin and his fifth year as the Badgers' head coach. He was Wisconsin's defensive coordinator for two years prior to taking over as head coach.

► Bielema has compiled a 38-14 record in his four seasons as Wisconsin head coach, including a 20-12 mark in Big Ten play. He has overseen two of Wisconsin's six 10-win campaigns. Bielema has led the Badgers to a bowl game in all four of his seasons.

► Bielema's 38-14 (.731) record in his four seasons at Wisconsin is the 12th-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches.

► With 38 wins in his first four seasons, Bielema is already seventh in Wisconsin history for head coaching victories (among the 27 coaches in UW history). His 28 victories were the most for a Badger head coach in his first three seasons (Phil King had 25 from 1896-98).

► Bielema's 38-14 record is second-best among the 11 head coaches hired prior to the 2006 season. He trails only Chris Peterson of Boise State (49-4). Bielema and Peterson are the only two of those 11 head coaches have led their teams to four straight bowl appearances. Wisconsin is tied for the 15th-best winning percentage in the country over the last four seasons.

Looking Ahead (Offense)

► The Badgers led the Big Ten in both scoring (31.8 ppg.) and total offense (416.9 ypg.). Both averages are among the top five in school history. It is the first time in conference history (records date back to 1985) that UW has led the league in both categories in the same season. Wisconsin paced the Big Ten in scoring during conference games for just the sixth time in league history (records date back to 1936).

► Behind the running of Clay, UW led the Big Ten and ranked 15th in the country in rushing offense, averaging 203.9 yards per game on the ground. The Badgers were 10-0 in 2009 when rushing for at least 150 yards.

► In addition to its 203.9 rushing yards per game, Wisconsin also passed for 213.1 yards per game, making them one of six teams in the country to average at least 200.0 yards rushing and passing. The other five were Florida (13-1), TCU (12-1), Stanford (8-5), Fresno State (8-5) and Auburn (8-5).

► Tight end Garrett Graham, who finished his career with 121 receptions, (T6th in school history), 1,492 receiving yards (11th in school history) and 16 touchdowns (5th in school history) is the lone starter not returning in 2010.

► **QUARTERBACK:** Senior **Scott Tolzien**, in his first season as the starter, led the Big Ten in pass efficiency at 143.0, the third-best mark in school history ... his 2,705 passing yards were the second-most in school history ... Tolzien completed a school-record 211 passes and his completion percentage of 64.3 was second-best in the conference, 14th in the country and third in school history ... sophomore **Curt Phillips** played in four games last year, completing 7-of-12 passes for 65 yards ... he also ran 14 times for 143 yards, including 92 yards on just four carries vs. Wofford

► **RUNNING BACK:** Clay rushed for 1,517 yards to lead the Big Ten and rank eighth in the country ... he is just the second sophomore in school history to rush for more than 1,500 yards and his single-season total ranked ninth in school history ... Clay had nine 100-yard rushing games, tied for the fifth-most in the country this season and tied for fourth-best in school history ... he also led the Big Ten with 18 rushing touchdowns, a mark that was tied for seventh in the country and tied for fourth in school history ... senior **Zach Brown** started five of the first six games last season and has rushed for 1,152 yards in his career ... the Badgers' main third-down back each of the last two seasons, Brown also has 20 catches out of the backfield ... sophomore **Montee Ball** ranked second on the Badgers in rushing as a true freshman despite sitting out the first four games ... 328 of his 391 yards on the ground came in the final five games, including a 115-yard performance at Indiana

► **WIDE RECEIVER:** The Badgers top four wide receivers have combined to play in 131 games (52 starts) and catch 215 passes for 3,220 yards and 12 touchdowns in their careers ... junior **Nick Toon** led the Badgers with 54 catches and 805 yards in 2009 ... his yardage total was 11th-best in school history and just 76 yards fewer than his father, Al's, best season as a Badger ... Toon has 1,062 career receiving yards, 19th-best in school history and 1,041 behind his father's three-year total of 2,103 ... senior **Isaac Anderson** started 11 games last year and was third on the team with 480 receiving yards ... for his career, he has more than 1,000 all-purpose yards ... senior **David Gilreath** ranks sixth in school history with 4,087 all-purpose yards ... he has scored touchdowns rushing, receiving and on a punt return ... senior **Kyle Jefferson** has 44 receptions for 636 yards in his career

► **TIGHT END:** Senior **Lance Kendricks** looks continue the tradition of productive tight ends at Wisconsin ... Kendricks, a former wide receiver, ranked fourth on the Badgers last season with 29 catches for 356 yards, including a seven-catch, 128-yard performance against Miami in the Champs Sports Bowl ... Kendricks also rushed for 102 yards last season, 91 of them coming against Purdue ... junior **Jake Byrne** has appeared in 24 games in his first two seasons and looks to play a more prominent role in the Badgers' multiple TE looks ... junior **Rob Korstin** and sophomore **Zach Davison** are two candidates to fill the hybrid TE/FB spot that Mickey Turner perfected ... **Jacob Pederson** and **Brian Wozniak** both redshirted last season as true freshmen and will battle to earn time in the tight end rotation

► **OFFENSIVE LINE:** Wisconsin started six different combinations along the offensive line last season with seven different players starting games ... left tackle **Gabe Carimi** and right guard **Kevin Zeitler** were the only two offensive linemen to start all 13 games ... Carimi was a first-team all-Big Ten selection last year and is the most experienced Badger, having started 36 games at left tackle after taking over for Outland Trophy winner Joe Thomas ... fellow senior **John Moffitt** was also a first-team all-conference choice last year and has 29 career starts at both center (15) and guard (14) ... junior **Josh Oglesby** started 10 games last season at right tackle, missing three with a knee injury ... Zeitler started every game at right guard as a sophomore ... sophomore **Peter Konz** stepped in at center in the second game of the season and started nine games there ... he missed the final two games and will sit out spring practice due to health issues (lung) ... classmate **Travis Frederick** started the first two games at center, becoming the first true freshman offensive lineman in school history to start the season opener, then started the last two games at left guard ... senior **Bill Nagy** missed most of last season following a moped injury but has started three games in his career ... he was a projected starter in the fall prior to his accident ... sophomore **Ricky Wagner**, a converted tight end, backed up both tackle positions last year and played in 12 games

Looking Ahead (Defense)

► UW ranked 17th in the country in total defense last year, allowing just 305.7 yards of offense per game. Eight of Wisconsin's 13 opponents failed to crack the 300-yard mark vs. the Badgers.

► Wisconsin led the Big Ten and ranked fifth in the country in rushing defense, allowing just 88.2 yards per game on the ground. The Badgers held each of their last 10 opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, the longest streak in the country this season and the longest streak in school history.

► The Badgers have two new coaches on the defensive side of the ball, defensive backs coach Chris Ash and nickel back/assistant linebackers coach Greg Jackson.

► Among the five starters Wisconsin must replace on defense are linebacker Jaeverly McFadden, the team's leading tackler last season, and defensive end O'Brien Schofield, whose 24.5 tackles for loss ranked second in the country and were the second-highest total in school history.

► **DEFENSIVE LINE:** Just like heading into the 2009 season, only one starter returns along the defensive line and it's a defensive end ... junior **J.J. Watt** earned honorable mention all-Big Ten honors last year, starting all 13 games and ranking second on the team and tied for sixth in the Big Ten with 15.5 tackles for loss ... classmate **Patrick Butrym** has played in 26 career games and started twice last season ... he recorded 24 tackles and 2.5 TFLs as part of a three-man rotation at defensive tackle last season with departed seniors Jeff Stehle and Dan Moore ... at defensive end, the Badgers have three players that have tasted game action ... junior **Louis Nzegwu**, with 21 career games played, has the most experience of the three ... he recorded 3.5 sacks last season in 10 games ... a pair of sophomores, **David Gilbert** and **Brendan Kelly**, should also be in the mix ... Gilbert recorded six tackles in 12 games as a true freshman while Kelly has battled injuries during his first two seasons and has 10 tackles in 11 career games ... on the inside, a number of young players will be fighting for playing time alongside Butrym ... three redshirt freshmen the coaches have mentioned are **Jordan Kohout**, **Tyler Dippel** and **Ethan Hemer** (all Wisconsin natives) ... Hemer, a walk-on from Medford, Wis., was named UW's scout team player of the year last season ... Dippel was a member of Team USA at the 2009 American Football Junior World Championships ... Kohout enrolled at UW in January of 2009 and was the top-ranked player in Wisconsin coming out of high school by Rivals.com

► **LINEBACKER:** Though the Badgers lose their leading tackler, they return four linebackers with starting experience who combined for 203 tackles a year ago ... senior **Culmer St. Jean** has started 15 games in his career, including all 13 last season at middle linebacker ... a former high school quarterback, he ranked second on the team with 63 tackles ... sophomore **Mike Taylor** started the first seven games last season and was leading the Badgers in tackles before a knee injury in the Iowa game ended his season ... Taylor had 46 tackles, 6.5 TFLs, a forced fumble, fumble recovery and interception and was named to the Sporting News Big Ten all-Freshman team ... classmate **Chris Borland** took over for Taylor when he went down and had a huge impact ... Borland made 54 tackles, 10.5 TFLs, forced five fumbles, recovered three and added an interception in being named Big Ten Freshman of the Year ... as an up back on the kickoff return team, he also ranked second on the team in kick returns and kicked three extra points in the Badgers' game at Hawaii ... Borland and Taylor will both sit out spring practice ... senior **Blake Sorensen** is the most versatile of the Badgers' linebackers having played all three positions in his 37 career games ... he spent the bulk of his time last season at middle linebacker, subbing in on passing situations and was, at one point, the primary backup at each of the three spots ... with Borland and Taylor out in the spring a couple guys to keep an eye on are juniors **Kevin Rouse** and **Kevin Claxton** ... Claxton played safety his first two seasons, making 14 tackles in 18 career games, and will be making the move to linebacker ... Rouse has been plagued by injuries in his first three years at UW but was a PrepStar All-American coming out of high school

► **DEFENSIVE BACK:** A wealth of experience returns at defensive back for UW, including five players that have starting experience ... the leader is senior **Jay Valai**, who enters his third season as the Badgers' starter at strong safety ... a two-time second-team All-Big Ten selection, Valai is known for his hard hitting and has 111 career tackles ... at the free safety position, junior **Aaron Henry** enters the spring as the favorite to take over for departed senior Chris Maragos ... Henry started the first two games at cornerback last season before making the switch to free safety in the middle on the year ... he started the Hawaii game as a fifth defensive back ... at cornerback, junior **Devin Smith** started all 13 games last year ... he led the team with 11 pass breakups, including two interceptions, and ranked fourth on the team with 55 tackles ... senior **Niles Brinkley** has 13 career starts at cornerback and six career interceptions ... junior **Antonio Fenelus** has played in 25 games and started five last season at corner ... sophomores **Marcus Cromartie** and **Shelton Johnson** played sparingly as redshirt freshmen and will try to crack the defensive back rotation

► **SPECIAL TEAMS:** Both of UW's kickers return for their third seasons ... junior punter **Brad Nortman** was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection and ranks third in school history with a 41.9 career average ... junior kicker **Philip Welch** led the Big Ten in scoring in conference games and already ranks ninth in school history with 197 career points ... his .771 career field goal percentage is second-best in school history ... junior **Kyle Wojta** handled long-snapping duties on punts last season and is back this season ... Gilreath holds the school record for career kickoff return yards and ranks second all-time in Big Ten history with 2,366 ... his 108 career kickoff returns is tops in league history ... he also ranks fifth all-time at Wisconsin with 639 punt return yards and had a 68-yard punt return for a touchdown last year at Northwestern
