Wisconsin won, 23-20, on Oct. 14, 1961 in Madison

Key Notes to Consider

► Wisconsin has won 29-straight regular-season non-conference games. That trails only LSU (34) for the longest active streak among FBS teams. UW's last loss was a 23-5 home defeat to UNLV on Sept. 13, 2003.

► RB Montee Ball accounted for 130 all-purpose yards (63 rushing and 67 receiving) while his backfield mate James White had 181 all-purpose yards (64 rushing, 40 receiving and 77 on kickoff returns) vs. UNLV. The two combined to score five touchdowns.

► Wisconsin accumulated 499 yards of total offense on just 53 plays vs. UNLV, averaging 9.42 yards per play. That was the second-best mark in the country, behind only Georgia Tech's 10.34 yards per play against Western Carolina.

► The 20-point mark has become significant for UW under Bielema. The Badgers are 32-2 in his tenure, including 6-0 last year, when limiting its opponent to 20 points or less. They are 18-14 when opponents score more than 20 points.

► UW has won 10-straight games at Camp Randall Stadium, only the fourth double-digit home winning streak in school history. That is tied for eighth-longest active home winning streak in the country.

► The Badgers have scored at least 37 points in the first half in each of their last three home games. In its last six home games, Wisconsin has combined to score 346 points. That is an average of 57.7 points per game.



QB Russell Wilson was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after accounting for 317 yards of total offense and three TDs in his Badger debut.

General Notes

► Wisconsin's 22-5 record over the last three seasons is tied for the sixth-best record in the country, trailing only Boise State, TCU, Alabama, Ohio State and Auburn.

► Bret Bielema is 21-0 in regular-season non-conference games. That is the third-best start by a Big Ten coach. Fielding Yost started 41-0 at Michigan from 1901-06 and Joe Paterno opened 23-0 at Penn State from 1993-99. Paterno's non-conference run started to when Penn State began Big Ten competition in 1993.

► Wisconsin has started 2-0 each season since 2002. The only other FBS team that can make that claim is USC, although some of the Trojans' results were later vacated.

► Wisconsin is 21-2 in games played before Oct. 1 under head coach Bret Bielema. Both those losses came at the hands of Michigan.

► With the win over UNLV, Bielema became the sixth-fastest Big Ten coach since 1946 to reach 50 career wins. Only Bo Schembechler, Joe Paterno, Earle Bruce, Lloyd Carr and Jim Tressel reached 50 wins faster than Bielema.

► Wisconsin has won 21-straight non-conference home games. That is the fifth-longest active streak in the FBS, trailing only LSU (32), Penn State (23), Florida (23) and Boise State (23).

► The Badgers elected four team captains during fall camp, all seniors: DT Patrick Butrym, FB Bradie Ewing, FS Aaron Henry and QB Russell Wilson.

► Thirteen returning Badgers have earned all-conference honors at some point during their careers (seven offensive players, four defensive players and both kickers). (*Box on page 4*)

► One year after having five players named as finalists for major individual awards and three players win awards, nine different Badgers have been named to 2011 National College Football Awards Association Watch Lists. That is the highest number of players of any Big Ten school and tied for sixth-most in the country. (*Box on page 5*)

► UW was ranked No. 10 in the preseason *USA Today* Coaches Poll. It is the fourth time in school history the Badgers have been ranked in the preseason top 10. Wisconsin was ranked fifth in 2000, seventh in 2007 and 10th in 1999. UW was ranked 12th in the preseason Coaches Poll last year. The Badgers' No. 11 ranking in the preseason A.P. poll was their highest since 2007.

► Wisconsin welcomes three new coaches into the fold this fall.

Thomas Hammock, a former graduate assistant at UW who spent the last four seasons at Minnesota, takes over as the running backs coach.

On the defensive side of the ball, defensive backs coach Chris Ash is now the defensive coordinator. Defensive line coach Charlie Partridge was promoted to associate head coach and co-defensive coordinator. Dave Huxtable, the former defensive coordinator at UCF, was brought in to coach linebackers. And DeMontie Cross, who spent the last five seasons with the Buffalo Bills, is the Badgers' new special teams coordinator and safeties coach.

► When Wisconsin beat Ohio State in football and men's basketball last season, the Badgers became the second team to beat the same school as a No. 1 opponent in the same school year. Florida beat Ohio State in the national championship games in both football and basketball during the 2006-07 school year. Wisconsin became the first school to get wins in conference play over No. 1 in football and men's basketball in the same academic year.

► Wisconsin has made a bowl game and NCAA Tournament men's basketball appearance every season since the 2002-03 academic year. The Badgers are the only school in Division I that can make that claim.

Looking Back at 2010

► Wisconsin won a share of the Big Ten title, the team's 12th in history and first since 1999, tying a school record with seven conference victories. The Badgers qualified for the Rose Bowl for the seventh time in school history and first time since 2000 and they won 11 games for just the third time in school history (fourth 10-win season in the last six years).

► Wisconsin finished the season ranked seventh in the Associated Press poll and tied for eighth in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll. It was the fifth time in school history UW was ranked in the top 10 to end the season and first time since 2006, head coach Bret Bielema's first year.

► The Badgers' offense led the Big Ten and averaged a school-record 41.5 points per game (fifth in the country), including 45.2 points per game in Big Ten play, second-best in conference history.

► UW nearly became the first team in FBS history to have three RBs gain 1,000 yards in a season as true freshman James White paced the team with 1,052 yards, junior John Clay registered 1,012 yards and sophomore Montee Ball had 996 yards.

► There were 28 major individual FBS award winners in 2010. Wisconsin was the only team in the country to have three different players win awards. LT Gabe Carimi won the Outland Trophy, QB Scott Tolzien won the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and DE J.J. Watt won the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Auburn (QB Cam Newton and DT Nick Fairley) and Oklahoma State (WR Justin Blackmon and K Dan Bailey) were the only other schools with multiple winners.

► UW was one of just six teams in the country to rank among the top 25 in both total offense and total defense. The others were TCU (13-0), Boise State (12-1), Stanford (12-1), Ohio State (12-1) and Alabama (10-3).

► Wisconsin was the most disciplined team in the country in 2010. The Badgers turned the ball over just nine times, the fewest in the country and the fewest in school history. They were also the least-penalized team in the country, averaging just 3.15 penalties per game.

Dynamic (Rushing) Duo

► RBs Montee Ball and James White were both named to the Doak Walker Award watch list. Only two other schools have multiple players on that list and Wisconsin is the only school in the country to return a pair of running backs that each gained more than 900 yards last season.

► Ball had four touchdowns against UNLV (three rushing, one receiving) and has scored 19 TDs in his last seven games. He has scored at least three TDs in four of his last five games. Ball has 26 touchdowns in just 22 career games (only five career starts).

► Ball was one of just three players to score four touchdowns in the opening weekend, joining Dominique Whaley of Oklahoma and Lyle McCombs of Connecticut.

► Ball rushed for 777 yards in five games from Nov. 6 through the end of the season. That was the second-most among all FBS players in that span, trailing only Illinois' Mikel Leshoure (917). Ball's 14 rushing TDs during that span led all FBS players. Leshoure and Florida International's Darriet Perry tied for second with 11.

► Ball's 6.8 yards per carry were the most in Big Ten play by any conference player since Illinois' Rashard Mendenhall averaged 7.7 yards per attempt in 2006 (the year before he was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year).

► Despite that productivity, Ball has lost about 25 pounds since the end of last season. He was listed at 236 pounds last year and weighted in at 210 prior to the start of fall camp.

► White became the third Big Ten Freshman of the Year under Bielema, joining RB P.J. Hill (2006) and LB Chris Borland (2009). White was Wisconsin's sixth Big Ten Freshman of the Year since 1996, twice as many as the next-closest team in that span (Michigan, 3).

► White led the Badgers with 1,469 all-purpose yards as a true freshman. He had 181 all-purpose yards against UNLV, the fourth-best total of his career. That led the Big Ten in the first weekend. His 25.7-yard average on kickoff returns also leads the conference.

► White was fourth among all FBS freshmen in rushing yards last year. He trailed only San Diego State's Ronnie Hillman (1,532), South Carolina's Marcus Lattimore (1,197) and Auburn's Michael Dyer (1,093).

► White's 6.7 yards per carry was second among FBS players who had at least 150 carries last season. Only Nevada quarterback Colin Kaepernick (7.0) averaged more.

► UW's running backs (Ball, White and FB Bradie Ewing) combined for four catches for 148 yards vs. UNLV (37.0 ypc.).

New Kid on the Block

- ▶ In his first career start for the Badgers, QB Russell Wilson completed 10-of-13 passes for 255 yards and two TDs. He also ran for 62 yards and a score, accounting for 317 yards of total offense, the highest total for a Wisconsin QB in his starting debut (stats since 1951). His pass efficiency rating of 292.5 and 76.9 completion percentage are also the best for a Wisconsin QB who threw at least 10 passes in his starting debut.
- ▶ Wilson's pass efficiency of 292.5 would lead the country and would have been the second-best single-game mark in UW history if he had the minimum of 15 attempts.
- ▶ Wilson is just the second UW quarterback to throw for at least 250 yards and run for at least 50 yards in the same game, joining Mike Kalasmiki, who threw for 252 yards and ran for 72 yards vs. Minnesota on Nov. 17, 1979. Just two other quarterbacks in the country (Richard Brehaut, UCLA and Zach Maynard, California) threw for at least 250 yards and ran for at least 50 during the opening weekend.
- ▶ Wilson needs just 55 yards of total offense to reach 10,000 for his career. Among active FBS players, only Kellen Moore of Boise State and Case Keenum of Houston have at least 10,000 yards of total offense.
- ▶ Wilson's 46-yard TD run vs. UNLV was the longest run of his career and the longest by a Badger QB since Scott Tolzien's 47-yard run against Minnesota on Oct. 3, 2009.
- ▶ Wilson's 317 yards of total offense came on just 15 plays, an average of 21.1 yards per play. That is 4.5 yards per play better than any player in the country who ranks among the top 100 in total offense. Wilson's 19.6 yards per passing attempt are second-best in the country behind Tevin Washington of Georgia Tech (20.9).
- ▶ Wilson started 36 career games as NC State's quarterback, going 19-17 in those performances. Wilson leads all active Big Ten players in quarterback starts. Kirk Cousins of Michigan State is second with 26 starts.
- ▶ Wilson has thrown 78 touchdown passes in his career. That trails only Houston's Case Keenum (109) and Boise State's Kellen Moore (102) for the most among active FBS players. Wilson leads all current major conference players.
- ▶ Wilson's 8,800 career passing yards ranks fourth among active FBS players, trailing only Keenum (13,896), Moore (11,128) and San Diego State's Ryan Lindley (9,740). Wilson also ranks fourth in career attempts (1,193) and fifth in career completions (692).
- ▶ Wilson has accounted for 96 touchdowns in his career with 78 passing and 18 rushing. That is third among active FBS players, trailing only Keenum (129) and Moore (106).
- ▶ Wilson accounted for 76.1 percent of NC State's total offense last season, the highest percentage of any FBS player. Wilson had 4,002 yards out of the Wolfpack's 5,258.
- ▶ With stats from three seasons at NC State, Wilson would already hold the UW school records for career passing yards (Darrell Bevell - 7,686), attempts (Bevell - 1,052), completions (Bevell - 646) and TDs (Bevell - 59)
- ▶ Wilson has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 34 of his 37 career starts games. He has thrown for at least two touchdowns 25 times and at least three touchdown passes 12 times.

trailing only Air Force's Tim Jefferson (24), Baylor's Robert Griffin (23), Southern Mississippi's Austin Davis (21), Keenum (20) and Michigan's Denard Robinson (19).

- ▶ NC State totaled 45 touchdowns from scrimmage last season. Wilson was responsible for 37 of those scores (28 passing TDs/nine rushing TDs). He accounted for 82.2% of NC State's touchdowns from scrimmage, the highest percentage among FBS players.
- ▶ Wilson holds NCAA record for most consecutive passes without an interception (379), set at the end of his freshman season through the beginning of his sophomore year.

Wisconsin Offense

- ▶ A year after finishing fifth in the country in scoring offense by averaging 41.5 points per game, UW scored 51 points against UNLV. That was the 11th-best scoring output of the opening weekend.
- ▶ Dating back to the end of the Ohio State game last year, the Badgers have scored points on 31 of their last 38 offensive possessions (81.6 percent), including 27 touchdowns, at Camp Randall Stadium. That does not include three drives that ran out the clock at the end of games.

- ▶ In its last three games at Camp Randall Stadium, UW has only punted seven times (no turnovers) in 38 offensive possessions. In the first half of those games, the Badgers have been even better, punting just twice out of 21 drives, scoring 17 touchdowns and two field goals.
- ▶ Last year, Wisconsin scored on its opening possession of the game nine times and its first possession of the second half nine times. Against UNLV in last week's season opener, the Badgers scored touchdowns on its first drive of the game and its first drive of the third quarter.
- ▶ UW was one of just nine teams in the country to run and pass for at least 240 yards in its season opener.
- ▶ Wisconsin finished last season ranked fourth in the country in passing efficiency. Against UNLV, the Badgers' pass efficiency was 261.8, fourth-best in the country after week one.
- ▶ Despite losing a pair of All-Americans in Gabe Carimi and John Moffitt, the Badgers still return starting experience on the offensive line. Seven offensive linemen have combined to start 79 games in their careers (RG Kevin Zeitler - 23, C Peter Konz - 21, RT Josh Oglesby - 16, LT Ricky Wagner - 11, LG Travis Frederick - 5, LG Ryan Groy - 2, LT Casey Dehn - 1).
- ▶ With two catches for 54 yards vs. UNLV, senior WR Nick Toon moved into the top 10 in both career receptions (109) and career receiving yards (1,575). He needs 22 receptions and 528 yards to match his father, Al's, marks. Al Toon ranks fourth in Wisconsin history in both career receptions and receiving yards.
- ▶ TE Jacob Pederson has only 10 career catches and three of those have gone for touchdowns.

Wisconsin Defense

- ▶ The Badgers held UNLV under 300 yards of total offense, a feat they accomplished just three times last season. UW is now 24-2 under head coach Bret Bielema when holding its opponent to less than 300 yards.
- ▶ Wisconsin was in the bottom-half of the Big Ten last season in opponents' third-down percentage, allowing opponents to convert 40.4 percent of its attempts. Against UNLV, the Badgers shut down the Rebels' first nine third-down attempts and UNLV finished the game just 2-of-12 on third down. That is tied for ninth-best in the country.
- ▶ Senior DE Louis Nzegwu registered his second career two-sack game vs. UNLV. He was one of just three Big Ten players to record two sacks in the opening weekend and is currently tied for fifth in the country in sacks.
- ▶ Wisconsin did not allow a rushing touchdown to UNLV and has only given up 17 rushing TDs since the start of the 2009 season. That is tied with Ohio State for the third-lowest total. Only Alabama (11) and West Virginia (12) have lower totals in this span.
- ▶ LB Chris Borland is back after playing just two games before missing the rest of the 2010 season with a shoulder injury. The 2009 Big Ten Freshman of the Year did not participate in spring practice but was cleared for the start of fall camp. He is moving to MLB after playing at OLB as a true freshman.
- ▶ FS Aaron Henry earned second-team All-Big Ten honors in 2010, his first season at free safety after spending his first three seasons at CB. He had a hand in six forced turnovers and scored three defensive TDs. Henry also scored on a blocked punt as a sophomore, giving him four non-offensive TDs in his career.
- ▶ Though the Badgers lost All-American J.J. Watt along the defensive line from last season, UW returns nine defensive linemen who have each played in at least 10 games in their careers. The nine linemen have combined to play in 178 games with 45 career starts.
- ▶ UW also returns a wealth of experience in the secondary. The Badgers' four starters (CBs Antonio Fenelus and Devin Smith, FS Aaron Henry and SS Shelton Johnson) have combined to play 139 games with 55 career starts.

Wisconsin Special Teams

► Senior punter Brad Nortman has handled every punt for Wisconsin over the last four years, starting as a true freshman. He ranks third in school history with a career punting average of 42.1 yards and sits seventh in UW history with 6,530 career punting yards. Despite those numbers he is probably most famous for executing two fake punts last year, picking up 17 yards and a critical first down on the game-winning drive vs. Iowa and picking up a first down vs. TCU in the Rose Bowl. Against UNLV, Nortman punted just twice, averaging 45.0 yards per kick. Neither punt was returned. UW's net punting average of 45.0 is tied for 11th nationally.

► Classmate Philip Welch is poised to make an assault on the UW and Big Ten record books. He ranks second in school history in career field goal percentage at .771, career field goals made with 54 and career points with 315. His 315 career points are the most of any returning player in the country while his 54 career field goals are second-best in the country. Welch's 118 points in 2010 was most ever by a UW kicker and fourth-best for one season at UW. He needs 112 points to surpass Ron Dayne as Wisconsin's and the Big Ten's all-time leading scorer.

► Welch is battling a quad injury sustained during fall camp, opening the door for sophomore Alec Lerner and redshirt freshman Kyle French. French made his Badger debut vs. UNLV, scoring nine points, making his first career field goal (29 yards) and connecting on 6-of-7 extra points. Lerner handled all the kickoff duties against the Rebels.

► WR Jared Abbrederis returned three punts for 58 yards (19.3 avg.) against UNLV, including a career-long return of 30 yards. He currently ranks eighth in the country in punt return average. Abbrederis has a 12.5-yard career average on punt returns (10 returns for 125 yards).

Taking it to the Next Level

► With J.J. Watt going No. 11 to Houston and Gabe Carimi at No. 29 to Chicago in the 2011 NFL Draft, UW was one of just five schools in the country to have multiple first-round picks (Alabama, Auburn, Colorado, Missouri, Wisconsin). Wisconsin and Alabama were the only two schools in the country with at least three players drafted among the top 50 (Watt, Carimi and Lance Kendricks).

► Wisconsin has had 10 first-round picks in the 2000s, tied for second-most in the Big Ten.

► UW had three offensive linemen drafted this year. That gives the Badgers 13 NFL Draft selections on the offensive line since 1999. That is tied with Boston College for the second-most of any school in this span. Only Notre Dame (15) has more. Wisconsin and Florida were the only two schools in the country with multiple offensive linemen selected in 2011 (both had three).

► Lance Kendricks was the fifth Wisconsin tight end selected in the NFL Draft since 2006. It's a list that consists of Owen Daniels, Jason Po-ciak, Travis Beckum, Garrett Graham and Kendricks.

► All five Badgers who were drafted in the spring have started preseason games this August (Watt - Houston, Carimi - Chicago, Kendricks - St. Louis, John Moffitt - Seattle, Bill Nagy - Dallas). In all, 15 former UW players have started for their NFL teams in the preseason (Jonathan Casillas - New Orleans, Owen Daniels - Houston, Lee Evans - Baltimore, Garrett Graham - Houston, Jim Leonhard - New York Jets, DeAndre Levy - Detroit, Chris Pressley - Cincinnati, Matt Shaughnessy - Oakland, Joe Thomas - Cleveland, Kraig Urbik - Buffalo).

► A total of 20 former Badgers appear on opening-day NFL rosters.

Wisconsin - 23, OSU 20**

After jumping out to a 23-0 halftime lead, the Badgers held on down the stretch to beat Oregon State on Oct. 14, 1961 in Camp Randall Stadium.

Wisconsin QB Ron Miller threw for 218 yards and a touchdown and also scored on a 2-yard run. WR Pat Richter caught eight passes from Miller, accounting for 138 yards.

Oregon State scored three unanswered TDs in the second half, the final one coming with 12:03 left in the game.

On its final possession of the game, OSU drove to the Badger 37-yard line with less than two minutes remaining. Facing a fourth-and-2, Oregon State's Leroy Whittle was only able to pick up a yard, giving the ball back to Wisconsin.

The Wisconsin-Oregon State Notebook

► This will be just the second meeting between the Wisconsin and Oregon State. The first meeting came on Oct. 14, 1961, with the Badgers winning, 23-20, at Camp Randall Stadium.

► UW is 21-30-2 all-time against teams currently in the Pac-12, having played each team at least once.

► In addition to a return game with Oregon State in Corvallis next year, the Badgers also have upcoming games against Pac-12 foes Arizona State (2013 in Tempe), Washington State (2014 in Pullman) and 2015 in Madison) and Washington (2017 in Madison and 2018 in Seattle).



UW offensive coordinator Paul Chryst was an assistant under Oregon State head coach Mike Riley for nine years at three different stops.

► Wisconsin offensive coordinator Paul Chryst and Oregon State head coach Mike Riley are good friends and have a long coaching history together. Riley first hired Chryst as the WRs, RBs and TEs coach for the San Antonio Riders of the World League in 1991. They coached together for two seasons there.

When Riley started his first stint as Oregon State's head coach, he brought Chryst in as his offensive coordinator. After two seasons in Corvallis, Riley was named the head coach of the San Diego Chargers. Chryst was his TEs coach in San Diego for three seasons.

Chryst and Riley hooked up again for another stint with the Beavers in 2003 and 2004. Riley returned as head coach with Chryst as his offensive coordinator before Chryst left for Madison prior to the 2005 season.

The two coached together for nine total seasons, including four at Oregon State.

Background on Bielema

- ▶ Bielema has compiled a 50-16 (.758) record in his five seasons at Wisconsin, the fourth-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches.
- ▶ With 50 wins in his first four seasons, Bielema is already fourth in Badger history for head coaching victories (among 27 coaches in UW history).
- ▶ For leading last year's Badgers to an 11-2 record and their first Big Ten title since 1999, Bielema was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards as well as a semifinalist for the Joseph V. Paterno Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Bielema's 50-16 record is second-best among the 11 head coaches hired prior to the 2006 season. He trails only Chris Peterson of Boise State (60-5). Bielema and Peterson are the only two of those 11 head coaches to have led their teams to five straight bowl appearances.
- ▶ Wisconsin has won at least 10 games seven times in school history. Bielema has been a part of four of those seasons (head coach in 2006, 2009 and 2010, defensive coordinator in 2005). He has coached UW to the only two 11-win regular-seasons in school history (2006 and 2010).
- ▶ Bielema was just the third rookie head coach in NCAA Division IA history to guide his team to 12 victories. The 12 wins also were a Wisconsin record.
- ▶ Bielema was named 2006 Big Ten Coach of the Year and was one of five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year Award. He also was a finalist for the 2006 Schutt Sports Division IA Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Wisconsin is 69-22 (.758) since Bielema arrived in Madison as defensive coordinator in 2004. He served in that role for two years before taking over as head coach in 2006. That is the 13th-best record in the country and second-best in the Big Ten over that time span.

▶ Bielema was 40 years old when he led the Badgers to the Big Ten title last season. He was the youngest coach to win the Big Ten title since Michigan's Bo Schembechler in 1969.

▶ Bielema coached Wisconsin to wins in 17 of his first 18 games. That represents the second-best start to a head coaching career in Big Ten history. Only Michigan's legendary Fielding Yost, went 55-0-1 from 1901-05, had a better beginning to a career.

Camp Randall Facts, Folklore and Traditions

- ▶ Since the start of the 2004 season (when head coach Bret Bielema joined the UW coaching staff as defensive coordinator) the Badgers have compiled a 44-4 record at Camp Randall Stadium. That is the best home record in the Big Ten over that span and the third-best in the country (behind only Boise State and Oklahoma).
- ▶ Wisconsin is 33-3 in home games since Bielema became coach in 2006. The only three teams to win road games at Camp Randall Stadium in this span all went to BCS Bowls (Ohio State and Penn State in 2008 and Iowa in 2009).
- ▶ Including its 31-18 win over Ohio State last season, Wisconsin owns a 4-5 record all-time against No. 1 teams in Camp Randall Stadium.
- ▶ Including last season, UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium just four times (1898, 2006, 2007 and 2010).
- ▶ Wisconsin won 16 consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium from Sept. 9, 2006 to Sept. 6, 2008. That was the second-longest home winning streak in school history, trailing only the 25 in a row the Badgers won from 1900-03.
- ▶ The Badgers have allowed fewer than 10 points at home on 13 occasions over the past six seasons.
- ▶ Wisconsin's only three shutouts since 1999 (65-0 over Temple in 2005, 14-0 over San Diego State in 2006 and 37-0 over Purdue in 2009) have occurred at Camp Randall Stadium.
- ▶ Camp Randall Stadium, which opened in 1917, is the fourth-oldest Bowl Subdivision stadium in the nation. The only older on-campus facilities are: Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914) and Cincinnati (1916).
- ▶ The Camp Randall grounds were used as a Civil War training site. It also held Confederate soldiers, many of whom died and were laid to rest on the west side of Madison. The area known as "soldiers rest" is the northernmost Confederate cemetery in the United States.
- ▶ Camp Randall Stadium served as a living quarters for students and military personnel during the 1940s. Dormitories were built underneath the east-side stands. Approximately 150 men lived there. In addition, there was a rifle range, as well as boxing and wrestling rooms.
- ▶ One of the newest traditions at Camp Randall Stadium is "Jump Around." Between the third and fourth quarters, the song "Jump Around" by House of Pain is played in the facility and the 80,000-plus fans delight in doing as the tune instructs.

MADISON, Wis. -- Russell Wilson threw two touchdown passes and ran for another in his Wisconsin debut and Montee Ball scored four times to lead the 11th-ranked Badgers over UNLV 51-17. Wilson shined, taking off on a 46-yard TD run that had him slipping into the end zone untouched just before halftime. He finished 10 of 13 for 255 yards and had two rushes for 62 yards. Ball caught Wilson's first TD pass as a Badger from 4 yards out. Wisconsin made it 13-0 when Ball took a handoff, busted through two arm tackles and high-stepped to avoid Quinton Porter's desperation dive for a 22-yard touchdown. It was 20-0 when Wilson found top target Nick Toon for completions of 39 and 15 yards before White punched it into the end zone from a yard out. Ball, who finished with 63 yards rushing, also scored on a pair of 1-yard runs, making it 51-3 midway through the third quarter.
