Key Notes to Consider

▶ Saturday will be the first matchup of top-10 teams at Camp Randall Stadium since Nov. 24, 1962 when the No. 3 Badgers defeated No. 5 Minnesota, 14-9.

▶ UW has won its last 11 regular-season games, its longest streak since winning 13-straight during Bret Bielema's first two seasons. The Badgers have won their last seven regular-season games by an average of 44.4 points.

▶ Wisconsin is 27-3 in its last 30 night games, winning the last six. The Badgers are 9-2 in their last 11 night games at Camp Randall Stadium.

▶ Wisconsin is one of three teams in the country averaging at least 240.0 yards rushing and receiving this season (Baylor and Missouri are the others).

▶ UW has allowed only 34 total points, its best four-game start to a season since surrendering only 19 points in 2004. The Badgers have given up 17 total points in their last three games, the team's best three-game stretch since allowing 17 total points in wins over Arizona (9-7), Penn State (16-3) and Illinois (24-7) in 2004.

▶ The Badgers have scored at least 40 points in six of their last seven regular-season games. After averaging a school-record 41.5 points per game last year, UW ranks sixth in the country at 48.5 points per game.

▶ The Badgers lead the Big Ten in both scoring offense and scoring defense. Wisconsin and Stanford are the only three teams in the country to rank among the top 10 in both scoring offense and scoring defense.

▶ Wisconsin has started the season 4-0 for the third straight year. That is the longest streak of 4-0 starts for the Badgers since 1914-16.



QB Russell Wilson's 12.5 yards per pass attempt is the best in the country among QBs with at least 50 pass attempts.

General Notes

► Wisconsin's 25-5 record over the last three seasons is tied for the fifth-best record in the country, trailing only Boise State, TCU, Alabama and Ohio State.

► Bret Bielema is 24-0 in regular-season non-conference games. That is the second-best start by a Big Ten coach, trailing only Fielding Yost, who started 41-0 at Michigan from 1901-06.

► Wisconsin has won 12-straight home games, tied for the fourth-longest streak in school history. It is tied for the sixth-longest current home win streak in the country.

► With the win in the season-opener over UNLV, Bielema became the sixth-fastest Big Ten coach since 1946 to reach 50 career wins. Only Bo Schembechler, Joe Paterno, Earle Bruce, Lloyd Carr and Jim Tressel reached 50 wins faster than Bielema.

► The 20-point mark has become significant for UW under Bielema. The Badgers are 35-2 in his tenure, including 12-straight wins, when limiting its opponent to 20 points or less. Conversely, Wisconsin is 48-5 under Bielema when scoring more than 20 points.

► The Badgers elected four team captains during fall camp, all seniors: DT Patrick Butrym, FB Bradie Ewing, FS Aaron Henry and QB Russell Wilson.

► One year after having five players named as finalists for major individual awards and three players win awards, nine different Badgers have been named to 2011 National College Football Awards Association Watch Lists. That is the highest number of players of any Big Ten school and tied for sixth-most in the country. (*Box on page 5*)

► Wisconsin has made a bowl game and an NCAA tournament men's basketball appearance every season since the 2002-03 academic year. The Badgers are the only school in Division I that can make that claim.

► Wisconsin has been ranked in the top-10 of the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for a school-record 12-straight weeks. The previous record was 10-straight from the end of 2006 through the beginning of 2007.

► Of the 25 players listed as starters on UW's current depth chart (12 on offense, 11 on defense and two kickers), 14 of them are from the state of Wisconsin. That includes all five offensive linemen and three of the four defensive linemen.

Dynamic (Rushing) Duo

► RBs Montee Ball and James White were both named to the Doak Walker Award watch list. Only two other schools have multiple players on that list and Wisconsin is the only school in the country to return a pair of running backs that each gained more than 900 yards last season.

► This season, the duo has combined to run for 663 yards on 108 carries (6.14 yards per carry) and 12 TDs. They have also caught 12 passes for 211 yards (17.6 yards per catch) and a score. White and Ball rank second and fourth, respectively, in the Big Ten in all-purpose yardage.

► Ball has scored at least one touchdown in each of his last 10 games, having scored 25 TDs since Oct. 23, 2010. Here are the FBS players with the most total TDs since Oct. 23, 2010: Montee Ball - 25, LaMichael James (Oregon) - 21, Mikel Leshoure (Illinois) - 17.

► Ball's 31 career rushing TDs (in 25 career games) ranks seventh in UW history. He ranks third in the NCAA with 10 touchdowns this season.

► Ball now has 1,747 for his career, placing him 16th all-time at Wisconsin. He is averaging 5.39 yards per rush in his career, which is tied for fourth all-time at UW (min. 300 attempts).

► Despite being one of the most productive RBs in the country at the end of last season, Ball has lost about 25 pounds since the Rose Bowl. He was listed at 236 pounds last year and weighted in at 210 prior to the start of fall camp.

► Ball and White have each run for TDs in each of the last two games. That has happened seven times in the last two seasons and Wisconsin has won all seven of those games.

► White became the third Big Ten Freshman of the Year under Bielema, joining RB P.J. Hill (2006) and LB Chris Borland (2009). White was Wisconsin's sixth Big Ten Freshman of the Year since 1996, twice as many as the next-closest team in that span (Michigan, 3).

► White led the Badgers with 1,469 all-purpose yards as a true freshman and paces the squad with 512 yards this season. He ranks second in the Big Ten with 128.0 all-purpose yards per game, trailing only Michigan's Denard Robinson.

► White was fourth among all FBS freshmen in rushing yards last year. He trailed only San Diego State's Ronnie Hillman (1,532), South Carolina's Marcus Lattimore (1,197) and Auburn's Michael Dyer (1,093).

► White's 6.7 yards per carry was second among FBS players who had at least 150 carries last season. Only Nevada quarterback Colin Kaepernick (7.0) averaged more. After rushing for 95 yards on just nine carries against South Dakota, he is once again averaging 6.7 yards per carry. The school record for average yards per carry for a career is 5.84 by Ron Dayne. White is at 6.74 with 201 carries.

► White's 49-yard touchdown run against USD was the longest run by a Badger this season and the longest for UW since White's 61-yard run against Michigan on Nov. 20, 2010.

► UW's running backs combined to catch 10 passes for 126 yards against Northern Illinois. On the season, Badger running backs have 19 receptions for 325 yards. Last year, Wisconsin running backs combined to catch 36 passes for 307 yards.

New Kid on the Block

► QB Russell Wilson ranks second in the country in pass efficiency (218.4) and is fifth in the country in completion percentage (.758). Scott Tolzien shattered the school record in both those categories a year ago with a pass efficiency of 165.9 and a completion percentage of 72.9 percent.

► The South Dakota game was the 15th time in Wilson's 40 career starts that he has thrown for at least three TDs in a game. He has thrown at least two TDs in all four games this season, including three TDs in each of the last three games. He is the first UW quarterback to throw multiple touchdown passes in four-straight games and the first to throw at least three TDs in three consecutive games. He has 11 TD passes through four games. The school record is 21 (John Stocco, 2005).

► Wilson has thrown at least one TD pass in 28-straight contests, the longest active streak in the country. The NCAA record is held by Graham Harrell of Texas Tech (36 in a row).

► Wilson passed for 347 yards against Northern Illinois, becoming the ninth Badger QB to throw for at least 300 yards in a game. That is the seventh-best performance in UW history.

► The next game, against South Dakota, Wilson passed for 345 yards. He is the fourth UW QB to throw for at least 300 yards in consecutive games, joining Randy Wright (3 times – Oct. 29, Nov. 5 and Nov. 12, 1983), Darrell Bevell (Nov. 11 and Nov. 18, 1995) and Jim Sorgi (Nov. 8 and Nov. 15, 2003). He is the first Badger to throw for at least 325 yards twice in the same season.

► Wilson's 384 yards of total offense against Northern Illinois were good for the fifth-best single-game performance in UW history.

► Wilson is 49-of-64 for 809 yards with eight touchdowns in the first half of games this season. That equates to a pass efficiency of 224.0.

► Wilson is averaging 12.5 yards per pass attempt. That is tops in the country among QBs with at least 50 pass attempts. Wilson also leads the country, averaging 11.6 yards per play.

► Wilson's pass efficiency of 292.5 in his Badger debut vs. UNLV was a school record for a quarterback in his first start and the third-best performance by a quarterback this season.

► Wilson is just the second UW quarterback to throw for at least 250 yards and run for at least 50 yards in the same game (255 passing, 62 rushing vs. UNLV), joining Mike Kalasmiki, who threw for 252 yards and ran for 72 yards vs. Minnesota on Nov. 17, 1979.

- ▶ Wilson ranks third among active FBS players in total offense. Wilson has 10,872 yards in his career, trailing only Case Keenum of Houston (16,000) and Kellen Moore of Boise State (11,791).
- ▶ Wilson has started 40 career games between Wisconsin and NC State, going 23-17 in those performances. Wilson leads all active Big Ten players in quarterback starts. Kirk Cousins of Michigan State is second with 29 starts.
- ▶ Wilson has thrown 87 touchdown passes in his career. That trails only Keenum (119) and Moore (111) for the most among active FBS players. Wilson leads all current major conference players.
- ▶ Wilson's 9,336 career passing yards ranks fourth among active FBS players, trailing only Keenum (15,120), Moore (11,862) and San Diego State's Ryan Lindley (10,412). Wilson also ranks fourth in career attempts (1,271) and fifth in career completions (751).
- ▶ Wilson has accounted for 105 touchdowns in his career with 84 passing and 18 rushing. That is third among active FBS players, trailing only Keenum (139) and Moore (115).
- ▶ Wilson accounted for 76.1 percent of NC State's total offense last season, the highest percentage of any FBS player. Wilson had 4,002 yards out of the Wolfpack's 5,258. This year he has 1244 of Wisconsin's 2129 yards (58.4 percent).
- ▶ NC State totaled 45 touchdowns from scrimmage last season. Wilson was responsible for 37 of those scores (28 passing TDs/nine rushing TDs). He accounted for 82.2% of NC State's touchdowns from scrimmage, the highest percentage among FBS players. This year, Wilson has had a hand in 12 of Wisconsin's 27 TDs (44.4 percent).
- ▶ Wilson has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 37 of his 40 career starts games. He has thrown for at least two touchdowns 28 times and at least three touchdown passes 15 times.
- ▶ Wilson holds the NCAA record for most consecutive passes without an interception (379), set at the end of his freshman season through the beginning of his sophomore year. His interception on his final pass attempt against Northern Illinois broke a personal streak of 150 attempts without an INT.
- ▶ Wilson has directed 38 drives as UW's quarterback, leading the Badgers to 180 points (25 touchdowns and two field goals). That is 4.7 points per drive and a touchdown percentage of .658.

Wisconsin Offense

- ▶ A week after rolling up 621 yards of offense vs. Northern Illinois, Wisconsin churned out 612 total yards of offense against South Dakota. That marks the first time in school history that UW has posted back-to-back games with 600 yards of offense.
- ▶ Wisconsin is averaging 7.9 yards per play, third-best in the country behind only Georgia Tech and Baylor. Last year, with the most prolific offense in school history, the Badgers averaged 6.7 yards per play.
- ▶ The Badgers are tied for third in the country in third-down percentage, converting 28 of its 46 third-down attempts (60.9 percent). UW has also converted three of its four fourth-down attempts, resulting in just eight punts for punter Brad Nortman. That is tied with Georgia Tech for the fewest punts among teams that have played four games.
- ▶ Wisconsin has converted 21 of its 24 red zone trips into touchdowns this season (.875). Northern Illinois, Texas Tech and Michigan are the only teams in the country with better TD percentages inside the red zone.
- ▶ A year after leading the country and setting a school record with just nine turnovers, UW is tied for fifth nationally with just two giveaways this season.
- ▶ Wisconsin is one of eight teams in the country to have not lost a fumble this season. The last time a UW running back fumbled was James White against San Jose State in the second game of last season. Since then, Badger running backs have carried the ball 607 times, caught 51 passes and returned 28 kickoffs (686 total touches) without putting the ball on the turf (not just fumbles LOST, they have not fumbled at all).
- ▶ Senior WR Nick Toon tied a career high with seven catches for a career-best 155 yards and two TDs against South Dakota, his second career game with at least 100 receiving yards (123 yards at Indiana on Nov. 7, 2009). He is the 14th Badger to have at least 150 receiving yards in a game, and his total of 155 was the most by a UW player since Travis Beckum's 160 yards at Illinois on Oct. 6, 2007.

- ▶ Wisconsin is now 9-0 in games when Toon scores a touchdown.
- ▶ Toon has now caught at least one TD pass in three straight games, the longest streak of his career. His 59-yard TD catch in the second quarter was the longest catch of his career. Toon's five TD receptions this year are a career high and tied for fourth in the country. He needs just 106 yards to match his receiving yardage total of last season. He is sixth among WRs with at least 20 catches, averaging 16.8 yards per reception.
- ▶ For his career, Toon has 128 catches for 1,874 yards and 13 TDs. He is just three catches behind his father, Al, for fourth place on UW's all-time receptions list. He also ranks eighth in UW annals for career receiving yards and eighth in TDs.
- ▶ Sophomore WR Jared Abbrederis recorded his first career 100-yard game against South Dakota, catching five passes for 101 yards with one TD. It was the first time two Badger wide receivers each went over the 100-yard mark in the same game since Lee DeRamus and J.C. Dawkins against Minnesota in 1993.
- ▶ Sophomore TE Jacob Pedersen has 19 career catches and six of them have gone for a touchdown. Pedersen is tied for eighth in the country among all players with four receiving touchdowns (T1st among TEs). He is also seventh in the country in receiving yards for a tight end. His 15.9 yards per catch is second-most among tight ends with at least 10 catches.
- ▶ Despite losing three players who started for their NFL teams on opening weekend (Gabe Carimi, John Moffitt and Bill Nagy) the Badgers still have eight offensive linemen who have combined to start 94 games in their careers (RG Kevin Zeitler - 26, C Peter Konz - 24, RT Josh Oglesby - 18, LT Ricky Wagner - 14, LG Travis Frederick - 7, LG Ryan Groy - 3, RT Rob Havenstein, RT Casey Dehn - 1).

Wisconsin Defense

- ▶ Wisconsin's defense has been on the field for 45 possessions this season. Of those, the opposing offense has failed to get a first down 19 times (42.2 percent). The Badgers have recorded 17 3-and-outs and two drives ended halves.
- ▶ Through four games, UW's defense has allowed just five total yards on the first drive of the game. Oregon State is the only team to get a first down against the Badgers on their initial possession.
- ▶ UW intercepted a pair of South Dakota passes, the Badgers' first INTs since picking off four passes vs. Northwestern on Nov. 27, 2010.
- ▶ The UW defense allowed just 173 total yards to South Dakota, the team's fewest allowed since Austin Peay posted 157 yards on Sept. 25, 2010.
- ▶ The Badgers relented just 49 yards passing to South Dakota, the team's fewest allowed since giving up 45 yards to Wofford on Sept. 19, 2009.

- ▶ Wisconsin limited Northern Illinois to just seven points and 237 yards of offense. In its other three games, NIU is averaging 46.0 points and 504.3 yards. NIU senior quarterback Chandler Harnisch was held to just 162 total yards. He is averaging 328.0 yards in the other three games.
- ▶ Wisconsin is the only team in the country to shut out a BCS team this season. With their 35-0 win over Oregon State, the Badgers recorded their first shutout since a 37-0 over Purdue on Oct. 31, 2009. It marked the third time UW shut out an opponent under Bret Bielema.
- ▶ The Badgers have held their first four opponents under 300 yards of total offense, a feat they accomplished just three times last season. UW is now 27-2 under head coach Bret Bielema when holding its opponent to less than 300 yards.
- ▶ Wisconsin has allowed just one rushing touchdown this season (Florida is the only team in the country that hasn't allowed one) and has only given up 18 rushing TDs since the start of the 2009 season. That is the third-lowest total in the country. Only Alabama (12) and West Virginia (15) have lower totals in this span.

- ▶ LB Chris Borland recorded 11 tackles against Northern Illinois, matching his career high set against Michigan on Nov. 14, 2009. In his first season at middle linebacker, Borland paces the Badgers and is fifth in the Big Ten with 35 tackles. He recorded his first interception of the season vs. South Dakota. He also leads the team and is tied for second in the conference with 5.0 tackles for loss.

► Junior LB Mike Taylor was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after recording nine tackles, 1.5 TFLs, a sack and a forced fumble in the Badgers' shutout win over Oregon State. Taylor is second on the team and tied for seventh in the Big Ten with 30 tackles.

► Senior CB Devin Smith suffered a season-ending foot injury against Oregon State. Junior Marcus Cromartie took his place and ranks third on the team in tackles with 19 tackles.

► Despite losing its leading sack producer from last year (J.J. Watt), Wisconsin is tied for second in the Big Ten with 10 QB sacks. Six different players have combined on the 10 sacks. Junior DE David Gilbert is tied for third in the Big Ten with 3.0 sacks.

► Wisconsin was in the bottom-half of the Big Ten last season in opponents' third-down percentage, allowing opponents to convert 40.4 percent of its attempts. This season, UW's opponents have converted just 19-of-56 third downs (.339).

Wisconsin Special Teams

► Senior punter Brad Nortman has handled every punt for Wisconsin over the last four years, starting as a true freshman. He ranks third in school history with a career punting average of 42.2 yards and sits seventh in UW history with 6,787 career punting yards. Nortman has punted just eight times this season and has not had one returned. UW's net punting average of 40.9 is 17th-best in the country.

► With senior kicker Philip Welch battling a quad injury sustained during fall camp, sophomore Alec Lerner and redshirt freshman Kyle French have handled all the kicking duties for UW. French is 26-of-27 on extra points and 2-of-4 on field goals (both misses from 50). Lerner has handled all 30 of the 32 kickoffs with five touchbacks.

► WR Jared Abbrederis has returned six punts for 101 yards (16.8 avg.) this season. He is currently 10th in the country in punt return average (14.8). Abbrederis has an 12.9-yard career average on punt returns (13 returns for 168 yards).

Taking it to the Next Level

► With J.J. Watt going No. 11 to Houston and Gabe Carimi at No. 29 to Chicago in the 2011 NFL Draft, UW was one of just five schools in the country to have multiple first-round picks

(Alabama, Auburn, Colorado, Missouri). Alabama was the only other school in the country with at least three players drafted among the top 50 (Watt, Carimi and Lance Kendricks).

► Wisconsin has had 10 first-round picks in the 2000s, tied for second-most in the Big Ten.

► UW had three offensive linemen drafted this year. That gives the Badgers 13 NFL Draft selections on the offensive line since 1999. That is tied with Boston College for the second-most of any school in this span. Only Notre Dame (15) has more. Wisconsin and Florida were the only two schools in the country with multiple offensive linemen selected in 2011 (both had three).

► Lance Kendricks was the fifth Wisconsin tight end selected in the NFL Draft since 2006. It's a list that consists of Owen Daniels, Jason Pociask, Travis Beckum, Garrett Graham and Kendricks.

► A total of 20 former Badgers made opening-day NFL rosters (see chart on this page). Of those 20, 12 started during the NFL's opening weekend (Carimi, Daniels, Evans, Kendricks, Leonhard, Levy, Moffitt, Nagy, Shaughnessy, Thomas, Urbik, and Watt) and four others saw action (Casillas, Graham, Pressley and Schofield).

Wisconsin 21, Nebraska 20**

A 77-yard touchdown pass from Gregg Bohlig to Jeff Mack with 3:29 left in the game gave Wisconsin a 21-20 upset of No. 4 Nebraska at Camp Randall Stadium.

Nebraska's final drive was thwarted by a Steve Wagner interception with 2:40 left in the game.

Bohlig passed for 242 yards and two TDs as the Cornhuskers held UW's leading rusher, Billy Marek, to just 45 rushing yards.

On the other hand, Nebraska completed just five passes but ran for 258 yards.

The two teams combined for seven turnovers, including four by Nebraska.

Wisconsin trailed 17-7 heading into the fourth quarter but Marek quickly cut the deficit to three points with a one-yard TD plunge. After Nebraska kicked a 22-yard field goal, Bohlig needed just two plays to put UW ahead.

The Wisconsin-Nebraska Notebook

► This will be sixth meeting between Wisconsin and Nebraska and the first since 1974. It is also the first between the teams as members of the Big Ten.

► Wisconsin and Nebraska rank 1-2 in the Big Ten in scoring offense with both teams entering Saturday's game averaging more than 42.0 points.

► Nebraska head coach Bo Pelini served as a graduate assistant at Iowa in 1991, while Wisconsin head coach Bret Bielema was a junior defensive lineman.

► Current UW Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez played at Nebraska from 1965-67 for legendary head coach Bob Devaney. Alvarez

was the leading tackler for the 1967 Cornhuskers, who led the nation in total defense and created a school-record 40 turnovers. Alvarez played in both the Sugar and Orange bowls at Nebraska (the Cornhuskers were 25-7 during his three varsity seasons).



UW Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez, who coached the Badger football team from 1990-2005, played football at Nebraska from 1965-67 under the legendary Bob Devaney.

Alvarez is a 1969 graduate of the University of Nebraska, where he played linebacker and went on to earn his master's degree. He received a Distinguished Alumnus Award from his alma mater in 2003.

In the 1966 matchup between Wisconsin and Nebraska in Madison, Alvarez had two tackles and returned an interception 25 yards.

Background on Bielema

- ▶ Bielema has compiled a 53-16 (.768) record in his five seasons at Wisconsin, the fourth-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches.
- ▶ With 53 wins in his first six seasons, Bielema already ranks third in Badger history for head coaching victories (among 27 coaches in UW history).
- ▶ For leading last year's Badgers to an 11-2 record and their first Big Ten title since 1999, Bielema was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards as well as a semifinalist for the Joseph V. Paterno Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Bielema's 53-16 record is second-best among the 11 head coaches hired prior to the 2006 season. He trails only Chris Peterson of Boise State (64-5). Bielema and Peterson are the only two of those 11 head coaches to have led their teams to five straight bowl appearances.
- ▶ Wisconsin has won at least 10 games seven times in school history. Bielema has been a part of four of those seasons (head coach in 2006, 2009 and 2010, defensive coordinator in 2005). He has coached UW to the only two 11-win regular-seasons in school history (2006 and 2010).
- ▶ Bielema was just the third rookie head coach in NCAA Division IA history to guide his team to 12 victories. The 12 wins also were a Wisconsin record.
- ▶ Bielema was named 2006 Big Ten Coach of the Year and was one of five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year Award. He also was a finalist for the 2006 Schutt Sports Division IA Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Wisconsin is 72-22 (.766) since Bielema arrived in Madison as defensive coordinator in 2004. He served in that role for two years before taking over as head coach in 2006. That is tied for the 12th-best record in the country and second-best in the Big Ten over that time span.

▶ Bielema was 40 years old when he led the Badgers to the Big Ten title last season. He was the youngest coach to win the Big Ten title since Michigan's Bo Schembechler in 1969.

▶ Bielema coached Wisconsin to wins in 17 of his first 18 games. That represents the second-best start to a head coaching career in Big Ten history. Only Michigan's legendary Fielding Yost, went 55-0-1 from 1901-05, had a better beginning to a career.

Camp Randall Facts, Folklore and Traditions

- ▶ Since the start of the 2004 season (when head coach Bret Bielema joined the UW coaching staff as defensive coordinator) the Badgers have compiled a 46-4 record at Camp Randall Stadium. That is the best home record in the Big Ten over that span and the third-best in the country (behind only Boise State and Oklahoma).
- ▶ Wisconsin is 35-3 in home games since Bielema became coach in 2006. The only three teams to win road games at Camp Randall Stadium in this span all went to BCS Bowls (Ohio State and Penn State in 2008 and Iowa in 2009).
- ▶ Including its 31-18 win over Ohio State last season, Wisconsin owns a 4-5 record all-time against No. 1 teams in Camp Randall Stadium.
- ▶ Including last season, UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium just four times (1898, 2006, 2007 and 2010).
- ▶ Wisconsin won 16 consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium from Sept. 9, 2006 to Sept. 6, 2008. That was the second-longest home winning streak in school history, trailing only the 25 in a row the Badgers won from 1900-03.
- ▶ The Badgers have allowed fewer than 10 points at home on 14 occasions over the past six seasons.
- ▶ Wisconsin's only four shutouts since 1999 (65-0 vs. Temple in 2005, 14-0 vs. San Diego State in 2006, 37-0 vs. Purdue in 2009 and 35-0 vs. Oregon State) have occurred at Camp Randall Stadium.
- ▶ Camp Randall Stadium, which opened in 1917, is the fourth-oldest Bowl Subdivision stadium in the nation. The only older on-campus facilities are: Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914) and Cincinnati (1916).
- ▶ The Camp Randall grounds were used as a Civil War training site. It also held Confederate soldiers, many of whom died and were laid to rest on the west side of Madison. The area known as "soldiers rest" is the northernmost Confederate cemetery in the United States.
- ▶ Camp Randall Stadium served as a living quarters for students and military personnel during the 1940s. Dormitories were built underneath the east-side stands. Approximately 150 men lived there. In addition, there was a rifle range, as well as boxing and wrestling rooms.
- ▶ One of the newest traditions at Camp Randall Stadium is "Jump Around." Between the third and fourth quarters, the song "Jump Around" by House of Pain is played in the facility and the 80,000-plus fans delight in doing as the tune instructs.

MADISON, Wis. -- Russell Wilson threw two touchdown passes and ran for another in his Wisconsin debut and Montee Ball scored four times to lead the 11th-ranked Badgers over UNLV 51-17. Wilson shined, taking off on a 46-yard TD run that had him slipping into the end zone untouched just before halftime. He finished 10 of 13 for 255 yards and had two rushes for 62 yards. Ball caught Wilson's first TD pass as a Badger from 4 yards out. It was 20-0 when Wilson found top target Nick Toon for completions of 39 and 15 yards before White punched it into the end zone from a yard out. Ball, who finished with 63 yards rushing, also scored on a pair of 1-yard runs, making it 51-3 midway through the third quarter.

MADISON, Wis. -- Wisconsin pounced on special teams mistakes and leaned on Russell Wilson and the defense to do the rest in a 35-0 victory at Camp Randall Stadium over Oregon State. In his second start for the Badgers (2-0), Wilson was 17 of 21 for 189 yards and the three touchdowns, including a pair to tight end Jacob Pedersen. Wisconsin's running game eventually wore down Oregon State, and Montee Ball had a pair of touchdowns in the second half. It was Wisconsin's first shutout since a 37-0 defeat of Purdue in October 2009, a point of pride for the defense. Wilson and the offense certainly got some unintended help from Oregon State. The first special teams mistake came on the Beavers' second possession, when punter Johnny Hekker bizarrely shanked a ball out of bounds for a four-yard loss that gave the ball back to the Badgers deep in Oregon State territory. Oregon State's defense held on first and second down, then gave up a 17-yard touchdown from Wilson to a wide-open Pedersen.

#7 Wisconsin 49, Northern Illinois 7 Sept. 17 (Soldier Field / 41,068)

CHICAGO, Ill. -- Russell Wilson threw for 347 yards and three scores, Montee Ball rushed for another two touchdowns and No. 7 Wisconsin piled up more than 600 yards of total offense in a 49-7 rout of Northern Illinois at Soldier Field. Ball finished with 91 yards on 18 carries, James White added 100 yards and another score, and Nick Toon had two touchdown catches for the Badgers (3-0), who have won 31 straight against non-conference opponents in the regular season. Wilson was 23-for-32, threw for 347 yards -- the seventh-best total in UW history -- and tallied three touchdowns. Wilson accounted for 384 total yards, a total that ranks as the fifth-highest total offense total in school annals. While the offense was racking more than 600 yards, the Badgers' defense responded with an equally impressive effort. UW limited the Huskies to 237 total yards -- including just 64 on the ground. Sophomore linebacker Chris Borland led the effort with a game-high 11 tackles, including a pair of tackles-for-loss.
