KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- Wisconsin owns a five-game win streak in Big Ten play, tying with Baylor for the longest active conference win streak among BCS conference teams.
- The Badgers have won 11 of their last 13 night games away from Camp Randall Stadium, including six of their last eight true road games played at night.
- UW head coach Bret Bielema enters his seventh season of Big Ten play with a 33-15 (.688) record in conference games. Bielema is 3-3 in Big Ten openers.
- Wisconsin makes its first trip to Lincoln since 1973. UW is 0-2 all-time against Nebraska on the road.
- Wisconsin's defense is allowing just 80.8 rushing yards per game, which ranks 13th nationally.
- Junior LB Chris Borland was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after recording 12 tackles, including 3.5 TFLs, two sacks and a pair of pass breakups vs. UTEP. The fourth weekly defensive honor of his career ties Borland for the second-most of any player since the award was introduced in 1987.
- Senior RB Montee Ball enters this weekend 15 touchdowns shy of breaking the NCAA career record for TDs (78, held by Miami (Ohio)'s Travis Prentice). Ball has scored 54 touchdowns in his 22 career starts.
- Redshirt freshman QB Joel Stave went 12-for-17 for 210 yards and a touchdown vs. UTEP to become the fourth-consecutive Wisconsin QB to win in his starting debut.



Junior LB Chris Borland was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after recording 12 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 2 sacks and 2 pass breakups in the Badgers' win over UTEP on Saturday.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

- **.002:** Senior RB Montee Ball logged 711 consecutive touches (rushing and receiving) without losing a fumble to start his career, a streak that ended vs. UTEP. Ball has two fumbles in 717 career touches (0.2 percent).
- **0:** The Badgers' defense is one of three nationally that has yet to allow a run of 20 yards this season, along with Texas Tech and UConn.
- **6:** Offensively, Wisconsin had six plays go for at least 20 yards against UTEP, including 47- and 60-yard completions from QB Joel Stave to WR Jared Abbrederis. The Badgers had five plays of 20 or more yards in their first three games combined.
- **10:** Junior LB Chris Borland recorded 12 tackles against UTEP, the 10th double-digit tackle game of his career, and his first of the season.
- **58:** Ball scored the 58th rushing touchdown of his career against UTEP to surpass Marshall Faulk (San Diego State) and Tim Tebow (Florida) and move into a tie for eighth all-time in NCAA history with Ian Johnson (Boise State).

GENERAL NOTES

- Wisconsin is 3-3 in Big Ten openers under Bret Bielema, including a 48-17 win over Nebraska last season, and owns a 7-4 mark in Big Ten openers since 2001.
- The Badgers are 1-5 in Big Ten road openers under Bielema, with the lone win a 31-28 victory over Minnesota in 2009. UW's average margin of defeat in its five losses is 7.4 points.
- However, in the five seasons under Bielema in which UW lost its Big Ten road opener, the Badgers have combined to go 24-7 (.774) in their remaining conference games after suffering the initial road loss:

- Bielema went 1-1 in his previous two stops in Lincoln, a 42-13 loss to the Huskers while an assistant coach at Iowa in 2000 and a 39-8 win over Nebraska as defensive coordinator at Kansas State in 2003.
- Wisconsin's five consecutive Big Ten wins dating back to last season are tied for the fourth-longest streak in the nation. Among BCS conference teams, only Baylor (Big 12) has won at least five straight conference games. Nebraska has the Big Ten's second-longest active streak with four straight league wins.

- Wisconsin has been flagged for 17 penalties, tying the Badgers for the seventh-fewest nationally among teams that have played four games.
- UW ranks in a tie for 10th nationally with its average of 4.25 penalties per game.
- Wisconsin has been ranked in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll for 39 consecutive weeks — the longest run in school history. The Badgers have been continually featured in the poll since Dec. 6, 2009.
- During that span, Wisconsin has spent 19 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the coaches poll.
- The Badgers' previous record for consecutive appearances in the coaches

poll was set with the 36 consecutive weeks UW was ranked from the 1998 preseason through Oct. 1, 2000.

- Though they are not ranked in the AP Top 25 for the third-straight week, the Badgers are receiving votes. This is the 41st-consecutive week UW has received votes in the AP poll, dating back to Nov. 22, 2009.

ON THE OFFENSE

- After starting in opponent territory just once in its first two games combined, Wisconsin has started six drives on the opponent's side of the 50 over its last two contests (excluding a fourth-quarter drive vs. UTEP that consisted of two kneel-downs). The Badgers converted four of those six possessions into touchdowns, with the others ending in a missed field goal and an interception.
- Senior RB **Montee Ball** rushed nine times for 40 yards and a touchdown against UTEP before being sidelined by a head injury as he continued his assault on the record books:
- With the 64th touchdown of his career, Ball passed former Badger Ron Dayne for sole possession of eighth place in NCAA history (the NCAA record book does not include bowl game statistics. Dayne's school record is 71).
- With his 58th career rushing touchdown, Ball passed Marshall Faulk (San Diego State) and Tim Tebow (Florida) and moved into a tie with Ian Johnson (Boise State) for eighth in NCAA history. Ball is also No. 3 all-time in Big Ten history, trailing only Anthony Thompson (68) and Ron Dayne (71).
- Ball is the leader among active players nationally in:
 - Total touchdowns with **64** — 25 more than second place Denard Robinson of Michigan (39).
 - Rushing touchdowns with **58** — 19 more than second-place Robinson (39).
 - Scoring with **386** points — 21 more than Florida State K Dustin Hopkins (365)
- Since Nov. 1, 2010 (a span of 23 games), Ball has scored 56 touchdowns and averaged 133.0 rushing yards per game.
- Ball lost the first fumble of his CAREER against UTEP, breaking a streak of 711 consecutive touches (655 carries and 56 receptions) without losing a fumble.
- Redshirt freshman QB **Joel Stave** made his starting debut vs UTEP and completed 12-of-17 passes for 210 yards, a touchdown and an interception. His pass efficiency of 182.0 was the fifth-best ever by a UW quarterback in his starting debut.
- Stave became the fourth-straight Badger QB to throw for 200 yards in his

starting debut, joining Danny O'Brien (2012), Russell Wilson (2011) and Scott Tolzien (2009). All-time, Stave is the seventh Wisconsin QB to throw for 200-plus yards in his first career start.

- Freshman RB **Melvin Gordon** ranks third in the nation in yards per carry among players with at least 10 rushes this season, averaging 13.0 yards per attempt (130 yards on 10 carries).
- Gordon carried eight times for a career-high 112 yards and the second touchdown of his career against UTEP, averaging 14.0 yards per carry.
- Junior WR **Jared Abbrederis** returned from injury vs. UTEP after missing the Badgers' game vs. Utah State and grabbed six catches for a career-high 147 yards and a touchdown.
- With catches of 60 and 47 yards vs. UTEP, Abbrederis is tied for second nationally with three receptions of 40-plus yards this season. Only New Mexico's Austin Frankin (4) has more.
- Among players with at least 10 receptions, Abbrederis ranks No. 13 nationally with an average of 19.8 yards per catch. Nebraska's Kenny Bell is the national leader at 24.8 yards per grab.

ON THE DEFENSE

- Through four games, Wisconsin's defense is allowing 17.8 points per game, a mark that ranks the Badgers sixth in the Big Ten and 33rd nationally. UW is 42-3 under Bret Bielema when holding teams to 20 points or fewer.
- Wisconsin has held 13 of its last 18 opponents to fewer than 18 points, going 12-1 in those games.
- Wisconsin has allowed just six opponent drives to enter the red zone this season. Among teams that have played four games, UW is one of only six teams nationally to allow six or fewer trips into the red zone. Only LSU (4), Alabama

(4) and UConn (5) have allowed fewer drives past the 20.

- Wisconsin has forced its opponent to go three-and-out on its opening drive in three consecutive games. Since the start of the 2009 season (44 games), the Badgers have held 20 opponents to three plays or fewer on their opening possessions. UW has allowed an opponent to score on its opening drive just seven times in those 44 games.
- After surrendering just 77 rushing yards vs. UTEP, Wisconsin ranks third in the Big Ten and 13th nationally in rushing defense, allowing opponents an average of 80.8 yards per game.
- Of the 111 rushing attempts by UW opponents this season, nearly half (54) have gone for 2 yards or less, including 32 that resulted in no gain or negative yardage (28.8 percent).
- Of UTEP's 30 rushing attempts against the Badgers, 10 went for no gain or negative yardage. Wisconsin limited the Miners to 2 yards or less on 12 of those 30 runs (40 percent).
- Wisconsin has allowed just one rushing touchdown this season. Along with Nebraska (0), UW is one of 10 teams in the nation to allow one rushing TD or fewer through four games.
- The Badgers are one of three teams nationally that have not allowed a run of 20 or more yards this season. In four games, UW has given up runs of 10 or more yards just eight times.
- Opponents are converting just 29.2 percent of their third-down chances against the Badgers, the third-best mark in the Big Ten. Wisconsin is 34-7 under Bret Bielema when allowing opponents to convert 33 percent or fewer of their third-down tries.
- On third down, the Badgers are allowing opponents to complete just 50 percent of their passes (24-of-48) and

giving up just 2.2 yards per carry on the ground.

- On 65 third-down plays this season, the Badgers' defense has surrendered an average of 5.0 yards (rushing and passing).
- Junior LB **Chris Borland** posted the 10th double-digit tackle game of his career with 12 total stops vs. UTEP. Borland matched his career high with 3.5 tackles for loss and recorded a career-high two sacks, while also matching his career-best performance with a pair of pass breakups.
- Borland ranks sixth in the Big Ten with 34 total tackles and sixth in the league with his average of 8.5 stops per game.
- With 40 tackles on the season, senior LB **Mike Taylor** is tied for 15th nationally and ranks third in the Big Ten in total stops.
- In his last 14 games, Taylor has recorded 13 or more tackles nine times, including a career-high 22 at Ohio State (Oct. 29, 2011).
- Taylor's average of 10.0 tackles per game ties him for 21st nationally.
- Together, the Badgers' starting linebackers (**Mike Taylor**, **Chris Borland** and **Ethan Armstrong**) have combined for 100 tackles in four games, the second-most of any group of starting linebackers in the Big Ten:

- Taylor and Borland finished last season ranked 1-2 in the Big Ten in tackles. Taylor's 150 total stops was good for third in the country and eighth in school history while Borland was tied for seventh in the country with 143 tackles (11th in school history).
- Taylor and Borland were the first UW teammates to both have more than 140 stops in a season. They were the only teammates in the country to have at least 130 tackles each during 2011.

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- For the first time since the situation became a scoring opportunity in 1988, Wisconsin blocked a PAT kick and returned it for a two-point defensive conversion vs. UTEP.
- DL Konrad Zagzebski made the block on UTEP kicker Steven Valadez's first PAT attempt of the game, and CB Devin Smith returned the block to the end zone for Wisconsin's first points of the game.

- Wisconsin is 8-2 under Bret Bielema when scoring a touchdown on special teams.
- Redshirt freshman P **Drew Meyer** averaged 45.2 yards per kick on his four punts vs. UTEP, with a long of 51 yards.
- Meyer is averaging 41.7 yards per punt on the season to rank fifth in the Big Ten and has UW ranked fourth in the league in net punting at 39.6 yards per kick. Only eight of Meyer's 24 punts have been returned, for an average of 3.6 yards per return.
- Among freshman punters, Meyer ranks No. 5 nationally with his average of 41.7 yards per punt.
- Meyer punted a career-high nine times vs. Utah State for an average of 41.4 yards per kick, including a career-long boot of 55 yards.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

- Over the past three seasons (31 games), the Badgers have lost a combined 24 turnovers, by far the lowest total in the nation over that span. Alabama has the second-fewest turnovers lost since the start of the 2010 season with 28. Wake Forest, with 30, ranks third in that span.
- Since the start of the 2010 season, Wisconsin has a combined turnover differential of +26, the second-best mark in the nation over that span. UW trails only Oklahoma State, which has forced 29 more turnovers than it has lost.
- UW has committed the fewest turnovers in the nation in each of the past two seasons, leading the FBS with 9 in 2010 and matching LSU for the fewest in the nation in 2011 with 10.
- In that same time frame, the Badgers forced 23 turnovers in 2010 for a +14 margin and then forced 26 in 2011 for +16 margin.
- Wisconsin forced just one turnover in the first three games of 2011. In the last 11 games, UW forced a total of 25 turnovers. Over its final 10 games, UW converted 18 of its 23 turnovers gained into touchdowns (78.3 percent).
- The Badgers finished the 2011 season with a +1.14 turnover margin, the fourth-best mark in the nation.
- Since 1999, the Badgers have forced 68 more turnovers (318) than they've given away (250), tying for the 10th-best turnover differential in the nation over that span.

HONORS AND AWARDS

- UW had a school-record nine players named first-team All-Big Ten last season. RB Montee Ball, the only unanimous first-team All-Big Ten choice, was also named the Graham-George Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and the Ameche-Dayne Big Ten Running Back of the Year. QB Russell Wilson was a

consensus first-team all-league choice and earned the Griese-Brees Big Ten Quarterback of the Year award.

- In addition, six players earned All-America mention including first-team selections Ball, OL Kevin Zeitler and OL Peter Konz. Wilson, LB Chris Borland and PR Jared Abbrederis also earned third-team or honorable mention All-America laurels.
- Over the last two seasons, Wisconsin has had four offensive linemen earn first-team All-America honors (Zeitler, Konz, Gabe Carimi and John Moffitt).
- Ball finished fourth in the Heisman Trophy balloting, giving Wisconsin its first Heisman finalist since Ron Dayne won the award in 1999. Wilson finished ninth in the final voting, marking just the second time in school history UW had two players in the Heisman top 10. The only other time was in 1962, when WR Pat Richter finished sixth and QB Ron Vander Kelen placed ninth. UW has had nine players finish among the top 10 of the Heisman balloting.
- Ball was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award, marking the second-straight year UW has had a Doak finalist. Ball joined John Clay (2010) and Ron Dayne (1998 and 1999) as the only Badgers to be named a finalist for the award.

ON THE ROSTER

- Wisconsin's 113-player roster breaks down like this: 50 freshmen, 28 sophomores, 26 juniors and 9 seniors.
- UW's nine scholarship seniors are tied for third-fewest among FBS teams. Only three schools in the nation have fewer: Rice (7), Colorado (8) and Indiana (8).
- The Badgers elected six team captains for the 2012 season: LT **Rick Wagner**, C **Travis Frederick**, RB **Montee Ball**, LB **Mike Taylor**, LB **Chris Borland** and SS **Shelton Johnson**.
- Head coach Bret Bielema has awarded scholarships to seven former walk-ons since the conclusion of the 2011 season: senior OL **Robert Burge**, junior RB **Kyle Zuleger**, junior WR **Jared Abbrederis**, junior TE **Brock DeCicco**, junior DL **Ethan Hemer**, junior LB **Ethan Armstrong** and redshirt freshman QB **Joel Stave**.

- Eight returning Badgers have earned all-conference honors at some point during their careers. (See box on page 3)
- Eight different Badgers have been named to 2012 National College Football Awards Association Watch Lists. Last year UW had nine different players honored in the preseason and three players were named major award finalists. (See box on page 5)

ONE-TWO PUNCH

- Wisconsin is the only school in the country to have advanced to BCS bowl games in football and the NCAA men's basketball tournament in each of the last two years. UW is just the second school in the BCS era to go to BCS games and the Sweet 16 in consecutive seasons (Ohio State is the other).
- Since the 2002-03 school year, the Badgers have played in a bowl game every year while also qualifying for the NCAA men's basketball tournament. That streak of 10-straight years with both is by far the longest in the country. BYU and Michigan State are tied for second on that list at five consecutive years.

AT THE HELM

- Head coach Bret Bielema has compiled a 63-20 (.759) record in his seven seasons at UW, the fifth-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches.
- With 63 wins in his first seven seasons, Bielema already ranks third in Badger history for head coaching victories (among 27 coaches in UW history).
- In his seven seasons as head coach at UW, Bielema has been named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards as well as being a semifinalist for the Joseph V. Paterno Coach of the Year Award.
- UW is 82-26 (.759) since Bielema arrived as defensive coordinator in 2004. That is the 10th-best record in the country and second-best in the Big Ten over that time span.

WINNING WAYS

- The Badgers have made four appearances in the Rose Bowl during the BCS era (since 1998). That is the second-most in the country during that span, trailing only USC's five appearances.
- UW has appeared in a bowl game in 10 straight seasons, tied for the ninth-longest active streak in the country. It is second only to Ohio State's streak of 12-straight bowl games among Big Ten teams.
- With an 11-3 mark last year and a 3-1 start to 2012, the Badgers ran their record since the start of the 2009 season to 35-9, the ninth-best winning

- Wisconsin's 22 wins over the 2010 and 2011 seasons tied the program record for wins in a two-season span. The Badgers also had 22 wins in 2005 (10) and 2006 (12). The 2005 season was Barry Alvarez's last as head coach and 2006 was Bret Bielema's first.
- Wisconsin's 62-20 record under head coach Bret Bielema is the 12th-best mark in the country over the last six seasons. Below is the top 12:

GOOD WHEN IT MATTERS MOST

- The Badgers led the country in third-down percentage last season, converting 93 of their 170 third-down attempts (54.7 percent). That is the second-best season performance in school history (.583 in 1993).
- UW has finished among the top 10 in third-down conversions in each of the last three seasons (2009-11), the only school in the country to do so.
- Wisconsin converted 64 of its 75 red zone attempts into touchdowns in 2011, leading the country with a .853 TD percentage in the red zone. Overall, UW was second in the country in red-zone scoring (71-of-75, .947).
- The Badgers have been among the top five in the country in red zone offense in each of the last three seasons, scoring TDs on 160 of their 199 (.804) trips inside the red zone in that span.

LOOKING BACK AT 2011

- Wisconsin captured its 13th Big Ten title and second in a row, defeating Michigan State, 42-39, in the inaugural Big Ten Football Championship Game.

It was the third time in school history the Badgers have won back-to-back conference titles (1896-97 and 1998-99).

- UW made its eighth appearance in the Rose Bowl. It was the second time in school history the Badgers have played in Pasadena two-straight seasons. Wisconsin also played in the Rose Bowl in 1953, 1960, 1963, 1994, 1999, 2000 and 2010.
- The Badgers won at least 10 games for the third-straight season, the first time in school history they have done that (five 10-win seasons in the last seven years). Wisconsin is one of just six teams in the country to win at least 10 games in each of the last three seasons. The others are Alabama, Boise State, Oregon, Virginia Tech and TCU.
- UW won 11 games for just the fourth time in school history. It is the first time they have had back-to-back 11-win seasons.
- Wisconsin finished the season ranked 10th in the AP Top 25 and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. It is the first time UW has finished in the AP top 10 in consecutive seasons since 1998-99.
- The Badgers ranked sixth in the country in scoring offense, averaging a school-record 44.1 points per game. That is sixth-best in Big Ten annals.
- Wisconsin was the only team in the country to finish among the top 15 in the final NCAA stats in both total offense (14th, 469.9 ypg) and total defense (15th, 316.4 ypg).
- Wisconsin went undefeated at home for the second-straight season and has won 17 consecutive home games, the second-longest active streak in the country. UW's 51-4 record at Camp Randall Stadium since 2004 is third-best in the country and the Badgers' 51 home wins in that span is tied with LSU for most in the nation.

PILING UP POINTS

- UW averaged 44.1 points per game last season, sixth-best in the nation and the second-best total in Big Ten history. That came on the heels of the 41.4 points the Badgers averaged in 2010, a mark that ranked No. 5 nationally and stands No. 4 in Big Ten history.
- Over the past two seasons (27 games), the Badgers averaged 42.9 points per game, the fifth-best scoring average of any program in 2010 and 2011:

- The Badgers became just the second Big Ten team to average more than 40 points in consecutive seasons, joining Minnesota (1903-05).
- In Big Ten play, the Badgers averaged 43.0 points per game last season, the fourth-best mark in league history. In 2010, UW averaged 45.2 points per game in conference play, the second-best mark in conference annals.
- The Badgers' Big Ten scoring average came in spite of facing three teams ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense (No. 5 Penn State - 5th; Michigan State - 10th; Illinois - 15th). In four games against those three defenses, the Badgers averaged 36.5 points and 380.8 yards of total offense.
- Wisconsin's average point differential of +25.1 last season was the largest by a Big Ten team since Ohio State outscored its opponents by +27.0 points per game in 1996.
- Last season, Wisconsin became the first team in FBS history to have a player throw at least 30 TD passes (QB Russell Wilson, 33) and a player run for at least 30 TDs (Ball, 33) in the same season. Ball led the country in rushing yards (1,923) while Wilson led the country and set an NCAA record for pass efficiency (191.8).
- The Badgers rushed for 48 touchdowns and threw for 34 more last season, becoming the first FBS team since 1996 to hit those thresholds.
- UW's 98 rushing touchdowns over the last three seasons are tied with Oregon for the most by any team in the nation since the start of the 2010 season.
- Junior WR **Jared Abbrederis**, a former walk-on, had 55 catches for 933 yards and eight TDs last season. His yardage total was fifth-best in the Big Ten and fifth-best in school history.
- Abbrederis already has 1,497 receiving yards in his career, good for 13th in school history.
- Abbrederis is the only major conference player since 1996 to finish a season with at least 933 receiving yards, 315 punt return yards and 689 kickoff return yards. The only other two players to do it in the last 15 years are Fresno State's Bernard Berrian in 2001 and Central Michigan's Antonio Brown in 2008.
- Junior TE **Jacob Pedersen's** eight TD receptions last season were the most ever by a UW tight end and tied for second-most among tight ends nationally.
- Of Pedersen's 45 career catches, 11 have gone for a touchdown (one every 4.1 catches).

FEELING THE DRAFT

- A total of six former Badgers offensive linemen (Gabe Carimi, Peter Konz, John Moffitt, Joe Thomas, Kraig Urbik and Kevin Zeitler) were on NFL opening-day rosters, tying UW for the third-most of any college program. Only USC (9) and Notre Dame (7) had more offensive linemen on active rosters. A seventh UW offensive line product, Bill Nagy, is on injured reserve with Detroit.
- Wisconsin had six players selected in the 2012 NFL Draft, including first-round pick OL Kevin Zeitler (Cincinnati). Also selected were OL Peter Konz (Atlanta - 2nd round), QB Russell Wilson (Seattle - 3rd), WR Nick Toon (New Orleans - 4th), FB Bradie Ewing (Atlanta - 5th) and P Brad Nortman (Carolina - 6th).
- The Badgers tied for the Big Ten lead and tied for fourth nationally with their six draft picks. Only Alabama, Georgia and Oklahoma had more.
- The Badgers have produced 11 NFL draft picks over the past two seasons, tying UW for the fifth-most of any college program and the second-most of any Big Ten team.

- Of the Badgers' 11 draft picks the last two seasons, five have come from the offensive line: Kevin Zeitler (Cincinnati), Peter Konz (Atlanta), Gabe Carimi (Chicago), John Moffitt (Seattle) and Bill Nagy (Dallas) — the most offensive linemen from any program in the nation.
- Of the five Wisconsin offensive linemen who started in the 2010 Rose Bowl, two were drafted in the first round (Gabe Carimi, Bears, 2011; and Kevin Zeitler, Bengals, 2012), one in the second round (Peter Konz, Falcons, 2012) and one in the third round (John Moffitt, Seahawks, 2011). The other starter, Rick Wagner, is in his senior season at Wisconsin and a leading candidate for the Outland Trophy.
- Wisconsin has had three first-round NFL picks from its offensive line since 2007, matching USC for the most of any program in the nation.
- Wisconsin has featured five first-round NFL draft picks from its offensive line since 1999, the most of any FBS team. Boston College and Oklahoma are tied for second with four each.

- Despite starting just 22 career games, Ball's 64 career total touchdowns are:
 - the most of any active player
 - third-best in Big Ten history
 - just 7 behind Ron Dayne's Big Ten and school record
 - 14 behind Miami (OH)'s Travis Prentice for the NCAA record
- Montee Ball's 39 total touchdowns in 2011:

 - tied Barry Sanders' NCAA record set in 1988

- Ball has scored 386 points in just 39 career games. His average of 9.90 points per game in his career would rank 10th in NCAA history.
- Ball lost the first fumble of his career vs. UTEP, breaking a streak of 711 touches (655 carries, 56 receptions) without losing a fumble.
- Ball scored a touchdown every 8.5 times he touched the ball in 2011 (39 TDs on 307 carries and 24 receptions). During Barry Sanders' 39-TD season, he scored every 10.1 times he touched the ball (344 rushes, 19 receptions, 21 kickoff returns and 10 punt returns).
- Ball scored 57 touchdowns over the course of the 2010 and 2011 seasons, breaking Ricky Williams' FBS record of 53 TDs over two seasons.
- In five games against teams ranked among the top 20 in the country in total defense in 2011 (Michigan State twice, Ohio State, Illinois and Penn State), Ball averaged 143.4 rushing yards, 158.4 all-purpose yards and scored 15 touchdowns (11 rushing, four receiving).

WISCONSIN-NEBRASKA CONNECTIONS

- UW Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez is a 1969 graduate of Nebraska, where he played linebacker from 1965-67.
- Nebraska coach Bo Pelini went 3-1 against the Badgers as a player at Ohio State from 1987-90.
- UW head coach Bret Bielema was 2-0 against the Huskers as defensive coordinator at Kansas State from 2002-03. He was 0-2 against Nebraska as an assistant coach at Iowa in 1999 and 2000.
- Bielema is 1-1 in his previous trips to Lincoln: a 42-13 loss with Iowa in 2000 and a 39-8 win with Kansas State in 2003.
- UW defensive coordinator Chris Ash was 3-3 against Nebraska as an assistant coach at Iowa State from 2002-06 and 2009.
- UW tight ends coach Eddie Faulkner was an assistant coach for a Ball State team that fell to Nebraska, 41-40, in Lincoln in 2007.
- UW interim offensive line coach Bart Miller is a native of Omaha, Neb.
- Bill Callahan, an assistant coach at UW under Barry Alvarez from 1990-94, served as Nebraska's head coach from 2004-07.
- Nebraska redshirt freshman longsnapper Joseph Rotherham, from Green Bay, is the lone Wisconsin native on the Huskers' roster.
- Badgers WR Chase Hammond and Nebraska RB Braylon Heard and OL Mark Pelini are all natives of Youngstown, Ohio. Hammond attended Boardman High School, while Heard and Pelini attended Cardinal Mooney.

SERIES HISTORY

- Wisconsin and Nebraska renewed their series last season in Madison, with the Badgers claiming a 48-17 win in the Huskers' first-ever Big Ten game.
- Nebraska is 2-0 all-time against UW in Lincoln, though the teams haven't met at Memorial Stadium since 1973. The Huskers scored a 37-0 win as the nation's No. 2-ranked team in 1965 and won, 20-16, while ranked No. 2 in 1973.
- UW has won consecutive games in the series dating back to a 1974 upset of the fourth-ranked Huskers at Camp Randall.

CAMP RANDALL STADIUM

- Since the start of the 2004 season (when head coach Bret Bielema joined the UW coaching staff as defensive coordinator) the Badgers have compiled a 53-4 record at Camp Randall Stadium. That is the best home record in the Big Ten over that span and the third-best in the country (behind only Boise State and Oklahoma).
- Wisconsin is 42-3 in home games since Bielema became coach in 2006. The only three teams to win road games at Camp Randall Stadium in this span all went to BCS bowls (Ohio State and Penn State in 2008 and Iowa in 2009).
- Including its 31-18 win over Ohio State in 2010 Wisconsin owns a 4-5 record all-time against No. 1 teams in Camp Randall Stadium.
- Including each of the past two seasons, UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium five times (1898, 2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011).
- Wisconsin has won 19 consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium, dating back to Oct. 31, 2009. That is the second-longest home winning streak in school history, trailing only the 25 in a row the Badgers won from 1900-03.
- The Badgers have allowed fewer than 10 points at home on 16 occasions over the past six seasons.
- Wisconsin's only four shutouts since 1999 (65-0 vs. Temple in 2005, 14-0 vs. San Diego State in 2006, 37-0 vs. Purdue in 2009 and 35-0 vs. Oregon State) have occurred at Camp Randall Stadium.
- Camp Randall Stadium, which opened in 1917, is the fourth-oldest Bowl Subdivision stadium in the nation. The only older on-campus facilities are: Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914) and Cincinnati (1916).
- The Camp Randall grounds were used as a Civil War training site. It also held Confederate soldiers, many of whom died and were laid to rest on the west side of Madison. The area known as "soldiers rest" is the northernmost Confederate cemetery in the United States.
- Camp Randall Stadium served as a living quarters for students and military personnel during the 1940s. Dormitories were built underneath the east-side stands. Approximately 150 men lived there. In addition, there was a rifle range, as well as boxing and wrestling rooms.
- One of the newest traditions at Camp Randall Stadium is "Jump Around." Between the third and fourth quarters, the song "Jump Around" by House of Pain is played in the facility and the 80,000-plus fans delight in doing as the tune instructs.

HEAD COACH BRET BIELEMA

- Bielema has compiled a 63-20 (.759) record in his seventh season at Wisconsin, the fifth-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches.
- With 63 wins in his first seven seasons, Bielema already ranks third in Badger history for head coaching victories (among 27 coaches in UW history), trailing only Barry Alvarez (118) and Phil King (65). Alvarez was 32-32-4 in his first six seasons (1990-95), while King was 51-6-1 in his first six seasons from 1896-1901.
- Bielema's 63-20 record is second-best among the 11 head coaches hired prior to the 2006 season. He trails only Chris Petersen of Boise State (75-7). Bielema and Peterson are the only two of those 11 head coaches to have led their teams to six straight bowl appearances.
- Wisconsin has won at least 10 games eight times in school history. Bielema has been a part of five of those seasons (head coach in 2006, 2009, 2010 and 2011, defensive coordinator in 2005). He has coached UW to the only two 11-win regular-seasons in school history (2006 and 2010).
- Wisconsin is 82-26 (.759) since Bielema arrived in Madison as defensive coordinator in 2004. He served in that role for two years before taking over as head coach in 2006. That is the 10th-best record in the country and second-best in the Big Ten over that time span.
- Bielema is 27-1 in non-conference games as Wisconsin's coach. His 25-0 start was the second-best start in non-conference play in Big Ten history, trailing only the 41-0 start by Michigan's Fielding Yost.
- Bielema is 42-3 in home games as Wisconsin's coach. The Badgers' 42 home wins are the most by an FBS team since the 2006 season.
- Bielema is tied with Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald as the second-longest tenured coaches in the Big Ten at seven seasons. Only Iowa's Kirk Ferentz has a longer tenure at 14 years.
- Bielema was 40 years old when he led the Badgers to the Big Ten title in 2010. He was the youngest coach to win the Big Ten title since Michigan's Bo Schembechler in 1969.
- Bielema is the first Big Ten coach to win the Big Ten title twice before turning 42 since Iowa's Forest Evashevski in 1956 and 1958. He is also the first Big Ten coach to reach the Rose Bowl twice before that age since Evashevski did it in both of those seasons.
- For leading the 2010 Badgers to an 11-2 record and their first Big Ten title since 1999, Bielema was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards.
- Bielema coached Wisconsin to wins in 17 of his first 18 games. That represents the second-best start to a head coaching career in Big Ten history. Only Michigan's legendary Fielding Yost, went 55-0-1 from 1901-05, had a better beginning to a career.
- Bielema was just the third rookie head coach in NCAA FBS history to guide his team to 12 victories. The 12 wins also were a Wisconsin record.
- Bielema was named 2006 Big Ten Coach of the Year and was one of five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year Award. He also was a finalist for the 2006 Schutt Sports Division I-A Coach of the Year Award.

Kicker Kyle French appeared to have recovered his own onside kick that would have given the Badgers one last shot at points, but a video review ruled French touched the ball just nine yards from where it was kicked. The play came on the heels of a 11-yard touchdown pass from O'Brien to TE Jacob Pedersen that shook the cobwebs from a Wisconsin offense that struggled to move the ball most of the day. The TD strike brought the Badgers within a field goal with 1:31 to play, but UW didn't get another shot at scoring. Offensively, the Badgers were bottled up on the ground to the tune of just 35 rushing yards, and UW managed only 207 yards in total. The loss snapped Wisconsin's 33-game regular-season non-conference win streak and also ended UW's run of 11 straight non-conference road wins.
