BADGERS BACK IN JANUARY BOWL GAME

- No. 17 Wisconsin (10-3) makes its 13th-consecutive bowl game appearance by facing No. 19 Auburn (8-4) in the Outback Bowl on Jan. 1. It will mark the fourth meeting between the schools, and third in a bowl game.
- The Badgers, champions of the Big Ten West Division, make their fifth-consecutive appearance in a January bowl game. Alabama is the nation's only other team to play in a January bowl in each of the last five seasons.



Heisman Trophy finalist Melvin Gordon has rushed for 2,336 yards this season, the fourth-highest total in NCAA history, to go along with 29 touchdowns.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- The runner-up for the Heisman Trophy, Wisconsin junior RB Melvin Gordon leads the nation in rushing at 179.7 yards per game and is also the nation's leading scorer with 29 total touchdowns.
- Gordon also won the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back and became the ninth player in UW history to earn unanimous Consensus All-America honors.
- Gordon's 2,336 rushing yards are the fourth-most in a season in NCAA history, while his 29 touchdowns represent the eighth-best single-season total ever.
- With one touchdown, Gordon can join Oklahoma State's Barry Sanders (1988) and UCF's Kevin Smith (2007) as the only players in FBS history with at least 2,000 rushing yards and 30 TDs in a season.
- Wisconsin's defense is allowing just 283.2 yards per game to rank No. 4 in the FBS. The Badgers also rank No. 13 in scoring defense (20.0 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (118.9 ypg) and No. 5 in passing defense (164.3 ypg).
- The Badgers seek their 50th win in the last five seasons, with their 49 victories since the start of the 2010 ranking as the 10th-most in the nation.
- UW won 10 games in the regular season for the fourth time in school history. The Badgers also did so in 1998, 2006 and 2010. Overall (including postseason games), it is the ninth double-digit victory season in school history and sixth in the last 10 seasons.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

3,818

Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon (2,336) and Auburn's Cameron Artis-Payne (1,482) have combined for 3,818 rushing yards this season, the highest total of any duo of team-leading rushers facing off in a bowl game.

Wisconsin's streak of 13 consecutive bowl game appearances is the longest active run in the Big Ten and ranks as the seventh-longest in the nation. Only Florida State (32), Virginia Tech (21), Georgia (17), Georgia Tech (17), Oklahoma (15) and LSU (14) have longer active bowl streaks.

GORDON'S SEASON

- This season, Gordon:
 - Leads the nation in rushing, at 179.7 yards per game
 - Leads the nation in rushing average, at 7.56 yards per carry (min. 200 carries)
 - Leads the nation in scoring, with 29 touchdowns
- On his first carry vs. Minnesota, Gordon broke the Big Ten and school rushing record of 2,109 yards, set by Ron Dayne in 1996. Gordon now has 2,336 this season, good for fourth best in FBS history. Gordon only trails Oklahoma State's Barry Sanders (2,628 in 1988), UCF's Kevin Smith (2,567 in 2007) and USC's Marcus Allen (2,342 in 1981).
- Gordon has topped the 100-yard mark in 11 games this season and 21 times in his career, good for fourth place all-time at Wisconsin.
- Gordon's 2,336 rushing yards are 300 more than Indiana RB Tevin Coleman, who ranks No. 2 nationally this season with 2,036.
- Gordon became the 17th player in FBS history to rush for 2,000 yards in a season, and the eighth to eclipse the 2,000 mark in 11 games, joining Marcus Allen (USC, 1981), Barry Sanders (Oklahoma State, 1988), Rashaan Salaam (Colorado, 1994), Troy Davis (Iowa State, 1995, '96), Byron Hanspard (Texas Tech, 1996), Ricky Williams (Texas, 1998) and LaDainian Tomlinson (TCU, 2000).

- Gordon reached 2,000 yards in a season in fewer carries than any player in FBS history, doing so on his 241st attempt of the season:

- With one more touchdown, Gordon will join an exclusive club as one of the few players to rush for more than 2,000 yards and score at least 30 touchdowns in a season. The only two players in FBS history to accomplish that are Oklahoma State's Barry Sanders (1988) and UCF's Kevin Smith (2007).
- Gordon has rushed for 200 yards in a game five times this season, the most of any FBS player. Ron Dayne, who had five 200-yard games in 1996 and 1999, is the only other UW player with at least four 200-yard games in a season.
- Gordon has rushed for at least 120 yards in 11 of 13 games this season.
- In 10 games against Power 5 conference opponents, Gordon has averaged 186.4 yards per game, 7.55 yards per attempt and scored 19 touchdowns — leading the nation in both rushing categories and ranking No. 2 in scoring against Power 5 foes.



- Gordon rushed for 1,092 yards in the month of November — more than all but 17 of the other 124 FBS teams.
- Gordon’s rushing totals from just the first three quarters of games would still be enough to give him 2,081 yards on the season. Gordon has had just 48 carries in the fourth quarter this season (3.8 per game) and ranks 42nd in the country with 255 rushing yards in the fourth quarter.
- Gordon leads the country in runs of 10+ (54), 20+ (31), 30+ (20), 40+ (16), and 50+ (9) yards. His 31 runs of 20 or more yards are 12 more than the players with the next highest total (Indiana’s Tevin Coleman has 19).
- Indiana (17) and New Mexico (17) are the only TEAMS in the FBS with more 40-yard runs than Gordon this season.
- Gordon is averaging an astounding 8.74 yards per carry in the second half this season, including an amazing 10.57 yards per carry in the third quarter. He averages “only” 6.61 yards per carry in the first half.
- Gordon leads the nation in yards from scrimmage at 191.3 per game. Tevin Coleman ranks No. 2 at 181.4 yards from scrimmage per contest.
- With 1,648, Gordon broke Northwestern RB Damien Anderson’s Big Ten record for rushing yards in a conference season (1,549 yards in 2000). Gordon averaged 206.0 yards per conference game, smashing Anderson’s Big Ten record of 193.6, also set in 2000.
- Gordon’s 29 touchdowns this season rank No. 2 on the Big Ten’s single-season list, trailing only the 39 scored by Montee Ball in 2011 to match the FBS record for TDs in a season.

- Gordon has nine multiple-touchdown games, matching Boise State’s Jay Ajayi for the most of any FBS player this season.
- Gordon has scored 27 touchdowns in his last 11 games (2.5 per game).

GORDON’S CAREER

- For his career, Gordon:
 - Leads all active players with 4,664 rushing yards
 - Leads all active players in rushing average at 7.81 yards per carry and is on pace to break the FBS career record
 - Ranks No. 4 in Wisconsin history and No. 9 all-time in the Big Ten with 4,664 rushing yards. He needs 13 yards to pass Anthony Davis for third on UW’s and seventh on the Big Ten’s all-time list.
 - Ranks in a tie for fourth in Wisconsin history and 10th all-time in the Big Ten with 46 total touchdowns. He needs three to move past James White for third on UW’s and ninth on the Big Ten’s all-time list.
- At 7.81, Gordon is on pace to shatter the FBS record for career rushing average by a player with at least 415 rushing attempts (7.32 by USC’s Reggie Bush).
- Among active players with 400 career rushing attempts, Indiana RB Tevin Coleman ranks a distant second to Gordon in rushing average at 7.12 yards per attempt:

- Gordon is the fifth player in school history to surpass 4,000 rushing yards in a career but the third in as many seasons, joining Montee Ball (5,140; 2009-12) and James White (4,015; 2010-13).
- With 45 for his career, Gordon needs one touchdown to match former Badger Billy Marek (46, 1972-75) for 10th on the Big Ten's all-time touchdowns list.
- Gordon has rushed for a 200 yards in a game six times, the most 200-yard games of any active FBS player.
- Gordon's 21 career 100-yard rushing games are the fourth-most in Wisconsin history.
- Gordon has 26 runs of 40+ yards for his career, in addition to 16 runs of 50+ and 11 of 60+ yards.

FOUR-ON-EIGHT

- Gordon broke the FBS single-game record with 408 rushing yards vs. Nebraska on Nov. 15, topping the mark of 406 yards by LaDainian Tomlinson (TCU) vs. UTEP on Nov. 20, 1999. The Big Ten record was 377 set by Indiana's Anthony Thompson at Wisconsin on Nov. 11, 1989.
- According to ESPN Stats & Info, Gordon's nine carries outside the tackles totaled 262 yards (29.1 yards per rush).
- Gordon's performance dropped Nebraska 55 spots in the national rushing defense rankings, from 20th entering the game (123.8 yards allowed per game) to 75th (169.5).
- Gordon's 189 rushing yards in the second quarter broke the Wisconsin record for rushing yards in a quarter of 170 set by Ron Dayne vs. San Jose State on Sept. 13, 1997. Gordon also had 170 yards in the third quarter.

- Gordon is the fifth UW running back to eclipse 3,000 career rushing yards since 2006 (Montee Ball 5,140; James White 4,015; P.J. Hill 3,942; John Clay 3,413). Gordon eclipsed 1,000 yards for the season in just six games, breaking the school record of seven originally set by P.J. Hill in 2006, which Gordon matched in 2013.
- Gordon gave UW a 1,000-yard rusher for the 10th-straight year and became the ninth player in UW history to post multiple 1,000-yard seasons.
- UW's run of 10 consecutive seasons with at least one 1,000-yard rusher is the longest active streak in the nation. Oregon has the next-longest active streak at eight. The Badgers have had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in 20 of the past 22 seasons.

DYNAMIC DUO

- The tailback tandem of sophomore **Corey Clement** (844 yards) and junior **Melvin Gordon** (2,336) have combined for 3,180 rushing yards this season, the most ever by a pair of FBS teammates.
- Gordon and Clement broke the record of 3,053, which was set last season by Gordon (1,609) and James White (1,444).
- Gordon and Clement have combined to average 244.6 rushing yards per game this season.
- Indiana's Tevin Coleman (2,036) and De'Angelo Roberts (493) rank No. 2 in terms of rushing yards by teammates this season with 2,529 yards.
- Clement needs 156 yards to reach 1,000 for the season and give UW a pair of 1,000-yard rushing running backs for the third time in five seasons.

- For the second time in three seasons, College Football Hall of Famer Barry Alvarez will return to the sideline to lead Wisconsin in its bowl game. UW Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez, who became the program's winningest head coach by compiling 118 wins from 1990 to 2005, will serve as interim coach for the Outback Bowl. Alvarez also served as interim coach for UW's appearance in the Rose Bowl following the 2012 season.
- The final game of Alvarez's 16-year run as head coach of the Badgers came against Auburn, when he guided No. 21-ranked UW to a 24-10 upset of the seventh-ranked Tigers in the 2006 Capital One Bowl.
- Alvarez's Badgers also recorded a 28-14 loss to Auburn in the 2003 Music City Bowl.
- At 8-3 when he retired following the 2005 season, Alvarez owned the best bowl winning percentage in NCAA history (minimum 11 games) at .727. He is now 8-4 in bowl games after serving as interim head coach for UW's appearance in the Rose Bowl following the 2012 season.
- With Alvarez leading the Badgers, redshirt freshman S Joe Ferguson will have the opportunity to play for his grandfather. The Madison native has played in all 13 games this season, including one start.

EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICANS

- A finalist for both the Heisman Trophy and Maxwell Award for national player of the year and the recipient of the Doak Walker Award as the nation's best running back, junior RB **Melvin Gordon** also became the 25th player in Wisconsin history to earn Consensus All-America status, as recognized by the NCAA.
- By sweeping first-team nods from the American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press, Football Writers Association of America, *Sporting News* and Walter Camp All-America teams — the five used by the NCAA to determine Consensus status — Gordon became the ninth player in UW history to earn unanimous Consensus All-America honors.
- Two of the offensive linemen that paved the way for Gordon's record-setting season also earned All-America laurels, with senior RT **Rob Havenstein** (AFCA), and senior RG **Kyle Costigan** (ESPN.com) being named first-team All-Americans. Havenstein also earned second-team All-America nods from the FWWA, *Sporting News* and *USA Today*.
- Junior S **Michael Caputo** was named a second-team All-American by the FWWA.

SEASON SNAPSHOT

- Wisconsin claimed the inaugural Big Ten West Division title and advanced to the Big Ten Football Championship Game for the third time in the event's four-year history

(UW also won the first Big Ten Leaders Division championship in 2011).

- Before falling in the Big Ten title game, the Badgers put together a seven-game win streak that saw them average 40.0 points and 482.7 total yards per game — outscoring opponents by 22.4 points and outgaining them by an average of 240.4 yards.
- The Badgers finished the Big Ten season with a 7-1 record, tying the best conference mark in school history. UW also won seven league games in 1998, 1999, 2006 and 2010.
- Wisconsin went a perfect 7-0 at home this season, equaling the school record for best single-season home mark. The Badgers also went 7-0 in 2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011.

SENIOR SALUTE

- UW's senior class has posted a record of 38-16 (.704) over the past four seasons, including a 23-9 (.719) mark in Big Ten play and a 25-3 (.893) mark at Camp Randall Stadium.
- One more win would tie this year's class with the 2011 seniors for the second-most victories in school history (39). This year's class is the ninth-consecutive group of seniors to win at least 37 games over a four-year span.

WINNING WAYS

- Wisconsin is 59-21 (.738) since the start of the 2009 season, with nearly half of those wins (28) coming by at least 25 points and all but two of the losses coming by seven points or less.
- UW's 59 wins over the last six years match Oklahoma for the seventh-most by a Power 5 conference program. Only Alabama (72), Oregon (69), Florida State (65), Ohio State (65), LSU (61) and Stanford (61) have won more games during that span.
- At 10-3, Wisconsin has at least nine wins for the fifth time in the last six seasons.
- Wisconsin has recorded at least nine wins in 9 of the last 11 seasons, making UW one of just five schools to achieve that level of consistent winning. Only Boise State (10 years) has hit the nine-win plateau more often than Wisconsin since 2004.

GROUP EFFORT

- Wisconsin is winning on defense despite losing its entire starting front seven after last season and despite a lack of "star power" in terms of individual statistics.
- UW ranks No. 4 in the nation in total defense and 14th in scoring defense despite having just one player among the nation's top 100 in terms of tackles — junior S **Michael Caputo** ranks in a tie for 78th nationally with 99 tackles.
- The Badgers' leading tackler, Caputo ranks 18th in the Big Ten at 7.6 tackles per game. Senior ILB Marcus Trotter (T-20th, 7.1), and senior ILB Derek Landisch (T-34th, 5.9) are the other Badgers ranked among the Big Ten's top 50.
- Wisconsin's four starting linebackers (Vince Biegel, Derek Landisch, Joe Schobert and Marcus Trotter) have combined for 323 tackles, 52.0 tackles for loss and 22.0 sacks.

A TOTAL DEFENSE

- Including limiting Nebraska to 180 total yards, the Badgers have held four opponents to fewer than 200 yards this season. Only Clemson (5) has done so more often.
- Wisconsin's opponents are averaging just 4.76 yards per play, the 14th-best mark in the country. Clemson (4.03) leads the FBS.
- Wisconsin allows an average of just 8.9 plays of 10-plus yards per game, the best mark by an FBS defense. Clemson (9.4 per game) has allowed the second-fewest plays of 10-plus yards this season.

POINTS AT A PREMIUM

- The Badgers have allowed an average of 20.0 points per game this season. UW has held opponents to 20.0 points or fewer per game in each of the last four years — joining Alabama and Michigan State as one of three FBS teams to achieve that feat.
- Nebraska entered its game with UW averaging 40.4 points per game and was held to 24 — all coming on four drives in which the Huskers started in Wisconsin territory, with an average starting field position of the UW 26.
- Purdue had scored 16 touchdowns in its previous four games but was held to a single TD by the Badgers.
- Rutgers entered its game with UW averaging 27.3 points per game and was shut out for the first time since 2002.
- Maryland entered its game against UW averaging 35.1 points per game and having

scored at least 24 in every game. UW held the Terrapins to 7 points — a touchdown in the final minute against the Badgers' No. 2 defense.

- On average, the Badgers are holding opponents to 74.2% of the average scoring output of their other games. That relative scoring defense mark ranks 17th in the FBS.

JUST A SHORT DRIVE

- On the season, the Badgers have allowed just 35.3% of drives that started in opponents' territory to cross the 50 yard line. That's the seventh-best mark in the FBS in a category led by Penn State (30.6%).
- Wisconsin has limited 67.1% of opponents' drives to six plays or fewer, the second-best mark in the FBS behind only Ole Miss (70.0%).
- Wisconsin has forced opponents to punt on 54.4% of their possessions this season, the best rate of any FBS defense. LSU ranks No. 2 at 53.9%.

NOWHERE TO RUN

- The Badgers have held 6 of their last 12 opponents to less than 100 rushing yards, something they've accomplished in 10 of 25 games under defensive coordinator Dave Aranda. UW is 10-0 in those games.
- The Badgers have allowed an opposing player to rush for 100 yards just five times over the last two seasons. Offensively, Wisconsin has produced 32 100-yard rushers in that time span.

RED LIGHT IN THE RED ZONE

- Wisconsin has allowed just 16 red-zone touchdowns this season, tying for the ninth-fewest in the nation. Only Ole Miss (12) has allowed fewer.
- The Badgers have allowed opponents an average of just 2.23 red-zone trips per game, the second-best mark in the FBS behind only Clemson (2.17).

THIRD DOWN AND OUT

- UW has forced its opponents to go three-and-out on 34.4% of their possessions this season — the best mark by an FBS defense. LSU ranks No. 2 at 33.6%, followed by TCU (33.0%), Clemson (31.2%) and Penn State (30.3%).
- Wisconsin's defense ranks No. 2 nationally in opponents' third-down conversion rate at 28.1%. trailing only Virginia Tech (27.3%).
- The Badgers' third-down defense mark is the best by a UW team since at least 1981. The only other Badgers squad to hold opponents to a third-down conversion rate below 30% was the 2006 team's mark of 28.2%.
- Opponents have successfully converted just 28 of the 109 (25.7%) third-down attempts they've made through the air against Wisconsin's defense.
- On the ground, UW opponents have rushed 70 times on third down for a total of 29 net yards (0.41 yards per attempt). Only Clemson (0.38) and Michigan (0.38) have

held opponents to a lower rushing average on third down this season.

PRESSURE BUILDING

- The Badgers' defense has dialed up the pressure in 2014. Through 13 games, UW has 85.0 tackles for loss (64 in 13 games in 2013) and 36.0 sacks (26 in 2013).
- UW ranks in a tie for 20th nationally with its 85.0 TFLs and in a tie for 17th with its 36.0 sacks.
- Wisconsin's 85.0 TFLs are the most by a Badgers team since UW recorded 92.0 in 2009.
- The Badgers' 36.0 sacks are the most since the 2009 team recorded 37.0.
- The Badgers are averaging 2.8 sacks per game, which ranks UW third in the Big Ten and in a tie for 24th nationally. UW ranked in a tie for 65th nationally in sacks last season, at 1.9 per game.
- The Badgers have recorded sacks on 36 of their opponents' 324 passing attempts this season. That rate of 11.1% ranks as the fifth-best by an FBS defense:

- Wisconsin is the only team in the Big Ten with four players ranked among the league's top 20 in tackles for loss: sophomore OLB Vince Biegel (2nd, 15.5), senior ILB Derek Landisch (3rd, 15.0), senior ILB Marcus Trotter (T-14th, 11.0) and junior OLB Joe Schobert (T-19th, 10.5).
- Landisch ranks in a tie for third in the league with 8.0 sacks, while Biegel is tied for fifth with 7.5.

UNDER CONTROL

- Wisconsin has held the ball for an average of 33:41, the seventh-best time of possession mark in the FBS.
- That ball control, combined with UW forcing a nation-leading 34.4% of opponent drives to end as three-and-outs, has resulted in UW opponents averaging just 59.5 plays per game. That's the second-lowest total for an FBS defense (UTEP, 58.5 plays allowed per game).
- On average, UW runs 8.9 more plays per game than its opponents.

ON THE OFFENSIVE

- Through 13 games, Wisconsin has averaged 464.8 yards of total offense per game, which would rank No. 3 in school history behind only last season's average of 480.8 yards and the 2011 mark of 469.9.
- Including this year's average, four of the top five total offense marks in school history have come in the past five seasons:

- Wisconsin's offense is averaging 6.80 yards per play, ranking No. 2 in the Big Ten and No. 7 in the FBS. Marshall leads the nation at 7.65 yards per play.

RUNNING AWAY WITH IT

- The Badgers have rushed for a school-record 4,082 yards in their first 13 games. The Badgers set the previous record of 3,689 yards in 13 games last season.
- UW's average of 314.0 rushing yards per game would rank fourth-best in Big Ten history and be the best mark since Ohio State set the league record of 349.9 in 1974.
- Wisconsin has run for at least 250 yards in 10 of its first 13 games, including three 400-yard and two 500-yard performances, on its way to averaging 314.0 rushing yards per game. Georgia Tech (333.6) is the only other team from a Power Five conference averaging at least 300 rushing yards — and the only other Power Five team with at least 10 250-yard rushing games on the season.
- The Badgers own the top two rushing performances in the country this season: 644 yards vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 20 and 581 yards vs. Nebraska on Nov. 15.
- Behind Gordon (8), Clement (1) and McEvoy (1), the Badgers have had a total of 10 150-yard rushing performances this season, the most of any FBS team.

AN EFFICIENT EFFORT

- The Badgers' rushing average of 6.87 yards per carry ranks No. 2 nationally and trails only Marshall (6.88 ypc). Marshall's average would be the best mark by a team since Nevada set the FBS record at 7.39 yards per carry in 2009.
- Nevada is the only team to average 7.0 yards per carry since the previous record-holder, Nebraska, averaged 7.01 yards per carry in 1995:

- Wisconsin leads the country in runs of 20-plus (51), 30-plus (31) and 40-plus (23) — six more than second-place Indiana's 17) yards. Last season, UW led the nation with 14 runs of 40-plus yards.
- UW also ranks No. 2 in runs of 50-plus (13) and 60-plus (9) yards. Last season, UW led the nation in runs of 50-plus yards with 9.

FALLING INTO LINE

- Not only has Wisconsin's offensive line helped lead the way for a rushing attack that ranks No. 3 nationally (314.0 yards per game), but the Badgers have also boasted one of the nation's top units in terms of pass protection.
- UW has allowed just 12 sacks in 13 games, ranking in a tie for the sixth-fewest sacks allowed by an FBS team.
- The Badgers have given up a sack on just 4.1% of their pass attempts this season (12 of 295), a sack rate that ranks UW No. 9 among Power 5 conference teams. Oklahoma leads the Power 5 with a sack rate of 2.3% (8 sacks on 349 passing attempts).

STAVE STARTS AGAIN

- Junior QB **Joel Stave** started his seventh-consecutive game in the Big Ten Championship Game and suffered his first loss of the season to fall to 7-1 as UW's starter. Stave owns a 20-7 record as a starter, with his .741 win percentage ranking third all-time at UW and his 20 wins ranking sixth. He is the sixth QB in school history to win 20 games.
- Since taking over as the Badgers' starter vs. Illinois on Oct. 11, Stave has completed 55.0% of his passes for 1,115 yards, 7 touchdowns and 4 interceptions for a pass efficiency rating of 139.4.
- In his last four games prior to the Big Ten title game, Stave had completed 48-of-72 passes (66.7 percent) for 619 yards and five touchdowns against just one interception. That translated into a pass efficiency mark of 159.02.
- Stave ranked fourth in the Big Ten in pass efficiency during league play at 136.0.
- Stave completed 11 of 18 passes for 215 yards and two touchdowns vs. Minnesota.
- Stave went 11-for-14 for 139 yards through the air at Iowa and used a 12-yard run to convert a critical third down with less than 2 minutes to play and allow UW to run out the clock. Against Iowa, Stave converted 4 of 5 third-down attempts, all conversions of third-and-6 or longer.

- Stave ranks No. 7 all-time in career passing yards (4,827) and needs 163 yards to pass Mike Samuel (1995-98, 4,989) for sixth.
- With 36 for his career, Stave ranks No. 5 all-time in touchdown passes at UW and needs three to pass Randy Wright (1981-83) and Brooks Bollinger (1999-02) for third.
- Stave also ranks No. 4 all-time at UW in both passing efficiency at 134.4 and completion percentage at 59.0%.

McEVROY MAKES PLAYS

- Junior QB **Tanner McEvoy** ranks No. 2 among all FBS players in rushing average at 8.83 yards per carry and is far and away the leader in rushing average among QBs:

- McEvoy ran for a school quarterback record 158 yards and a touchdown on just 11 carries (14.4 average) against Bowling Green and was sacked just once. The previous record of 134 yards was set by Sean Wilson vs. Cal on Sept. 23, 1989. McEvoy was the first Badgers QB to rush for 100 yards in a game since Brooks Bollinger had 112 vs. Minnesota on Nov. 23, 2002.
- McEvoy has accumulated 574 rushing yards through UW's first 13 games, breaking Brooks Bollinger's single-season school record for rushing yards by a quarterback (466 in 2002):

- On its 34 punts over the last seven games, the Badgers' punt unit allowed opponents to attempt just 10 returns for a total of 29 yards (2.9 average).

- Gaglianone has converted 17 of 20 field goal attempts this season, and his field-goal percentage of 85.0% would rank second in school history (Matt Davenport, .905 (19-21), 1998).
- Gaglianone's field-goal percentage of .850 ranks 11th-best in the country this season and second-best in the Big Ten.
- Maryland entered its game with UW ranked No. 3 nationally and atop the Big Ten in punt return average at 19.0 and was held to one return for 0 yards. Rutgers had one return for 3 yards.
- Purdue entered its game vs. UW leading the Big Ten and ranking No. 13 nationally in punt returns at 14.4 yards per runback. The Boilermakers did not have a return vs. the Badgers.
- Nebraska entered its game at UW ranked No. 2 in the league at 13.6 yards per punt return and boasting the nation's top returner (minimum 15 returns) in De'Mornay Pierson-El (15.2 average). He was limited to one return for 14 yards.
- Wisconsin ranks fourth in the Big Ten in kickoff coverage, with a net average of 40.2 yards per kickoff. UW's opponents have faced an average starting field position of their own 25 yard line after kickoffs this season.

THOSE RETURNS DOE

- Senior WR **Kenzel Doe** has nine punt returns for 15-plus yards on the season, and eight have set up a score for the Badgers.
- Doe's average of 11.0 yards per punt return ranks eighth among FBS players with at least 20 returns. Nebraska WR De'Mornay Pierson-El is the national leader (17.9).
- Doe's career average of 10.0 yards per punt return ranks in a tie for seventh all-time at UW, matching Nate Odomes (1984-86).
- With 1,364 for his career, Doe is the eighth player in school history to collect at least 1,000 career kickoff return yards and now ranks No. 5 all-time at UW.
- Doe ranks No. 3 on UW's all-time list for career kickoff return average at 23.9 yards per return. Doe's former teammate, Jared Abbrederis (2010-13) holds the school record at 25.8 yards per return.

- The Badgers amassed 548 yards of total offense against a Tigers team that entered the contest allowing just 294.1 yards per game, ninth best nationally. They did it behind Calhoun, who became just the second player in Division I FBS history to record 1,500 yards rushing and 500 yards receiving in the same season.
- They also did it through the strength, poise and agility of Stocco, who connected with Brandon Williams for 173 yards and one TD. That score moved Stocco to No. 1 on the single-season list for TD passes (20) at Wisconsin.

INTERIM HEAD COACH BARRY ALVAREZ

Barry Alvarez is back on the sideline.

In the midst of his 11th year as Director of Athletics at the University of Wisconsin in 2014-15, the Badgers' longtime football coach is slipping on the headset one more time to lead UW in the Outback Bowl.

Alvarez, who filled in similarly to coach the Badgers on an interim basis for the 2013 Rose Bowl Game, adds leading UW's on-field effort in Tampa to a resume that also includes his day job of running Wisconsin's athletic department and serving as a member of the inaugural College Football Playoff selection committee.

It's not as though Alvarez lacks credentials when it comes to calling the shots, however. He became UW's winningest coach during a career that spanned 16 seasons from 1990 to 2005, going 118-73-4 (.615) during that stretch.

Elected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2010, Alvarez has been at the forefront of the revival of the Badgers athletic program during his entire tenure in Madison and piloted Wisconsin to three Big Ten and Rose Bowl titles (including back-to-back crowns in 1998-99).

Alvarez was just the 10th coach in Big Ten history to win 100 games at one conference institution. The 1993 national coach of the year, he was a two-time (1993 and 1998) Big Ten Coach of the Year and a finalist for ESPN's Coach of the Decade (1990s) honor. He received the Victor Award's 1999 National Coach of the Year and was the 2004 AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year.

Alvarez retired from coaching at the conclusion of the 2005 season in order to concentrate solely on running UW Athletics. He has made a lasting impression on the Wisconsin sports scene. His well-documented turnaround of the once-moribund Badgers football program has helped to allow the school's entire athletic department to blossom into one of the nation's finest and most respected organizations in college sports.

Wisconsin has enjoyed remarkable success during Alvarez's tenure as the head of the athletic department, winning a combined 14 team national titles and 50 conference regular-season or tournament crowns since he took over.

Alvarez was voted into the state of Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame and the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame in 2009 and was inducted into the UW Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010.

When Alvarez arrived in Madison in 1990, Wisconsin had compiled a 9-36 record during the previous four seasons and attendance at Camp Randall Stadium had dipped to an average of 41,734 per game (54 percent of capacity). The program sorely needed a boost and got it when new Director of Athletics Pat Richter hired Alvarez from Notre Dame, where he had been an assistant coach.

Over the next 16 seasons Alvarez transformed the football program and, subsequently, the culture of athletics at UW. The success of the football program ignited and heightened interest in Badgers sports.

Among Alvarez's remarkable list of accomplishments at Wisconsin:

- winningest coach in school history (record of 118-74-4, .607)
- coached three Big Ten and Rose Bowl champions
- only Big Ten coach ever to win the Rose Bowl in consecutive seasons
- just the 10th coach in Big Ten history with 100 victories at one conference school
- coached five national award winners: Ron Dayne (Heisman, Doak Walker, Maxwell), Jamar Fletcher (Jim Thorpe) and Kevin Stemke (Ray Guy)
- guided UW to back-to-back Big Ten titles in 1998 and 1999

CAMP RANDALL STADIUM

- One of the nation's most historic college football venues, Camp Randall Stadium also happens to be one of the intimidating for opposing teams, and Wisconsin has made the most of the home-field advantage that the raucous atmosphere provides.
- Since the start of the 2004 season, the Badgers have compiled a 68-7 record (.907) at Camp Randall Stadium. Only Ohio State (70) and LSU (69) and have won more games at home over that span.
- Including its 31-18 win over Ohio State in 2010 Wisconsin owns a 4-5 record all-time against No. 1 teams in Camp Randall Stadium.
- Including its unblemished home records in 2010 and 2011, UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium four times (2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011).
- Wisconsin won 21 consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium from Oct. 31, 2009 to Oct. 27, 2012. That is the second-longest home winning streak in school history, trailing only the 25 in a row the Badgers won from 1900-03.
- The Badgers have allowed 10 or fewer points at home on 24 occasions over the last 10 seasons.
- Wisconsin's six shutouts since 1999 (65-0 vs. Temple in 2005, 14-0 vs. San Diego State in 2006, 37-0 vs. Purdue in 2009, 35-0 vs. Oregon State in 2011 and 45-0 vs. UMass and 48-0 vs. Tennessee Tech in 2013) have occurred at Camp Randall Stadium.
- Camp Randall Stadium, which opened in 1917, is the fourth-oldest Bowl Subdivision stadium in the nation. The only older on-campus facilities are: Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914) and Cincinnati (1916).
- The Camp Randall grounds were used as a Civil War training site. It also held Confederate soldiers, many of whom died and were laid to rest on the west side of Madison. The area known as "soldiers rest" is the northernmost Confederate cemetery in the United States.
- Camp Randall Stadium served as a living quarters for students and military personnel during the 1940s. Dormitories were built underneath the east-side stands. Approximately 150 men lived there. In addition, there was a rifle range, as well as boxing and wrestling rooms.
- Though it has only been a tradition at Camp Randall Stadium since 1998, "Jump Around" is now a defining part of UW game day. Between the third and fourth quarters, "Jump Around" by House of Pain is played and the 80,000-plus fans delight in doing as the tune instructs. "Jump Around" was crowned the winner of *Sports Illustrated's* "Greatest College Football Traditions" bracket in 2012.

SATURDAY, AUG. 30 (NRG STADIUM / 71,599) — *ADVOCARE TEXAS KICKOFF*

HOUSTON — The Badgers seemed to have the game in hand after Corey Clement scored in the third quarter. Colby Delahoussaye kicked two field goals and Anthony Jennings threw a 35-yard touchdown pass to John Diarse to start LSU's rally. Jennings hit Trey Quinn for a 2-point conversion to cut the deficit to three.

The Tigers trailed 24-21 when Jalen Mills intercepted Tanner McEvoy's pass at the LSU 47 with 11:04 left. Hilliard ran for 53 yards on the ensuing drive, capping it with a sprint through a hole on the right side.

The Badgers dominated the game until the sudden turn of events in the final quarter. Wisconsin held LSU to 16 yards rushing and six first downs in the first half and Melvin Gordon opened the second half with a 63-yard run to set up Clement's 2-yard TD run with 12:24 remaining.

Gordon finished with 147 yards on 16 carries. Gordon had nine carries for 64 yards in the first quarter, including a 20-yarder to the LSU 45. On the next play, McEvoy faked another handoff to Gordon and gave it to receiver Reggie Love, who weaved through the LSU defense for a 45-yard score.

A 22-yard scramble by McEvoy set up a 51-yard field goal by Rafael Gaglianone and Wisconsin led 10-0.

A 14-yard TD run by Gordon in the second quarter and a 2-yard scoring plunge by Clement in the third — after a 63-yard run by Gordon on the first play of the second half — made it 24-7 Badgers with 12:24 to play in the third.

MADISON, Wis. — Tanner McEvoy threw for three touchdowns and run for another, and No. 18 Wisconsin pulled away from Western Illinois to win its home opener, 37-3.

Melvin Gordon ran for just 38 yards on 17 carries with the Fighting Leathernecks (1-1) consistently stacking the box against one of the country's best rushers. McEvoy finished 23 of 28 for 283 yards with one interception.

Leading just 9-3 at halftime, the Badgers (1-1) opened things by throwing on first down and using more play-action.

McEvoy hit fullback Austin Ramesh on fourth-and-2 for a 3-yard touchdown pass with 9:18 left in the third quarter before connecting with Gordon on an 8-yard scoring pass three minutes later for a 20-point lead.

Western Illinois could only muster a 29-yard field goal by Nathan Knuffman in the first half.

The Fighting Leathernecks got off to a rough start themselves after Kyle Hammonds mishandled the opening kickoff near the goal line and trying to kneel in the end zone. The play was ruled a safety, and Wisconsin had a 2-0 lead with just 1 second off the clock.

It was a grind from there for nearly the rest of the first half.

Wisconsin's offense finally got rolling with a three-play, 54-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard keeper by McEvoy for a 9-0 lead. That touchdown was set up by a 37-yard pass up the seam to Sam Arneson and a 10-yard run by McEvoy.

The offense kept the momentum to start the second half with a 10-play, 75-yard drive that ended with McEvoy's short scoring pass to Ramesh.

Making just his second career start for Wisconsin at quarterback, McEvoy got

MADISON, Wis. — Melvin Gordon rushed for career highs of 253 yards and five touchdowns, and No. 19 Wisconsin ran for a Big Ten-record 644 yards to trample Bowling Green for a 68-17 victory.

Gordon had 179 yards and four scores by halftime alone before dashing for a 69-yard touchdown on his first carry of the second half. He silenced any doubters worried about his 38-yard outing the previous game.

The Badgers (2-1) forced two turnovers on back-to-back possessions by the Falcons (2-2) in the first half to break open a close game.

Gordon capitalized each time with scores before closing the half with a 21-yard touchdown run for the highlight reel.

The team rushing total was the most in the Big Ten's modern era, dating back to 1946.

The only drama left in the second half was whether Gordon would eclipse the school's single-game rushing record of 339 set by Ron Dayne in 1996.

But the junior's day ended after his 13th carry with about 12 minutes to go in the third quarter. Talented backup Corey Clement took over and added two rushing touchdowns in the second half.

Clement finished with 111 yards on 16 carries, while quarterback Tanner McEvoy had 158 yards rushing on 11 attempts before departing late in the third quarter with Wisconsin leading by 52.

NORTHWESTERN 20, #17 WISCONSIN 14

SATURDAY, OCT. 4 (RYAN FIELD / 42,013)

EVANSTON, III. — Despite a career-high 259 rushing yards from Melvin Gordon, No. 17 Wisconsin was unable to overcome four turnovers in a 20-14 loss to Northwestern at Ryan Field.

Godwin Igwebuike had three interceptions and Justin Jackson rushed for 162 yards, helping the resurgent Wildcats upset the Badgers (3-2, 0-1 Big Ten), who had won their last two meetings against the Wildcats but haven't won in Evanston since 1999.

Trevor Siemian threw for a touchdown and also had a key block on Miles Shuler's 16-yard TD run as Northwestern (3-2, 2-0) earned its third consecutive win.

The Wildcats also had a nice day on special teams, with Jack Mitchell kicking two short field goals and punter Chris Gradone handing over poor field position to Wisconsin for much of the afternoon. Four of the Badgers' five first-half possessions began at its own 10 or worse.

Gordon had 27 carries for a career-high 259 yards and a touchdown, but Tanner McEvoy and Joel Stave combined for just 138 yards passing on a cold, damp afternoon at Ryan Field. It was Stave's first appearance of the season.

Wisconsin (3-2, 0-1) had scored at least 20 points in 17 consecutive games for the second-longest such streak in school history. It was the first loss for the Badgers since they dropped their season opener to LSU.

The Badgers trailed 10-0 before Gordon had a 2-yard touchdown run on their first possession of the second half. Gordon had six carries for 75 yards on the drive, including a 61-yard run on his first carry of the period.

Gordon has rushed for 140-plus yards in four games this season. He is averaging 42.8 yards on his first carry of the second half through five games this season.

Stave, who replaced McEvoy late in the first half, also was picked off by Igwebuike in the end zone with 5:55 left in the game. He tossed a 19-yard touchdown pass to Kenzel Doe with 4:16 to go, but Wisconsin didn't get the ball back until the final minute and Igwebuike put it away for Northwestern with another interception.

MADISON, Wis. — Melvin Gordon rushed for 175 yards and four touchdowns, Corey Clement added 164 yards and a 72-yard score and Wisconsin held off Illinois for a 38-28 victory.

Gordon padded his resume for a potential Heisman Trophy candidacy with another highlight-reel performance. The junior eclipsed 1,000 yards on the season in just Wisconsin's sixth game, a school record.

Wisconsin (4-2, 1-1 Big Ten) started Joel Stave at quarterback, but Gordon did most of the damage.

Illinois (3-4, 0-3) did rally in the fourth quarter with backup Aaron Bailey at quarterback. He led them to two scores to get within 38-28 with about 3 minutes left before Illinois recovered an onside kick. But Bailey threw an interception to UW safety Peniel Jean with 2 minutes left to seal Wisconsin's win.

Gordon's most impressive run may have come with 1:16 left in the second quarter, when Gordon took a first-down handoff from the Wisconsin 22 but got tripped up as he burst through a hole. But the stumbling Gordon regained his balance and ended up with a 46-yard run to the Illinois 32. Rafael Gaglianone hit a 44-yard field goal four plays later for a 24-14 lead going into the half.

Gordon had touchdown runs in the first half from 15 and 6 yards before jumping into the end zone from a yard out with 1:08 left in the third quarter for his fourth score and a 31-14 lead.

The Wisconsin defense picked up steam early in the second half.

Wisconsin held Illinois to a three-and-out on the first series after halftime, thanks to sacks by Konrad Zagzebski and Leon Jacobs.

Derek Landisch had a sack on the Illini's next drive to force a third-and-17 play that was stopped short of a first down. Gordon followed with his 1-yard scoring run on the ensuing series for the 17-point lead.

WISCONSIN 52, MARYLAND 7

SATURDAY, OCT. 25 (CAMP RANDALL STADIUM / 80,336)

MADISON, Wis. — Melvin Gordon rushed for 122 yards and three touchdowns, and Wisconsin’s restocked defense stifled mistake-prone Maryland for a 52-7 win.

Gordon had his three scores in the first half, when the Badgers (5-2, 2-1 Big Ten) raced out to a 24-0 halftime lead on a sunny homecoming weekend game. Joel Stave threw for two scores in the second half against Maryland (5-3, 2-2).

The Big Ten rookie Terrapins accomplished little with the ball in their first visit to Camp Randall Stadium. Dual-threat quarterback C.J. Brown faced pressure all afternoon from the blitzing Badgers, who were fortified on defense with the returns of top tackle Warren Herring and run-stopping linebacker Marcus Trotter from injuries.

Wisconsin brought Maryland’s five-game road winning streak to an emphatic end. The Terps were held to 175 yards of total offense, 227 below their season average. Most of the yardage came late in the blowout loss.

Fresh off a bye, the Badgers even dusted off a couple trick plays, including punter Drew Meyer’s floating pass to open tight end Troy Fumagalli over the middle for a 17-yard gain on fourth-and-9 from the Maryland 36.

It set up a 36-yard field goal by Rafael Gaglianone to give Wisconsin a 10-0 lead at 3:46 of the first quarter.

Maryland fumbled the ball away on the next drive after a handoff bounced off running back Brandon Ross’ chest. Linebacker Vince Biegel pounced on the ball, and Gordon barreled in from a yard out six plays later for a 17-0 lead on the first play of the second quarter.

Maryland had just 3 yards in total rushing at the half and finished with 46 on the day, limited by a strong performance — especially from Wisconsin’s linebacking corps.

WISCONSIN 37, RUTGERS 0

SATURDAY, NOV. 1 (HIGH POINT SOLUTIONS STADIUM / 52,797)

PISCATAWAY, N.J. — Melvin Gordon ran for 128 yards and two touchdowns and Wisconsin limited Rutgers to 139 yards in a 37-0 victory that made the Badgers bowl eligible for the 13th consecutive season.

Gordon scored on runs of 15 and 51 yards in posting his sixth consecutive 100-yard game rushing, helping Wisconsin (6-2, 3-1 Big Ten) win its third straight game.

Corey Clement, who ran for 131 yards, added touchdown runs of 43 and 36 yards and Rafael Gaglianone kicked three field goals as the Badgers dominated in sending the Scarlet Knights' Homecoming crowd home early.

The shutout loss was the first for Rutgers (5-4, 1-4) since 2002. The Badgers held the Scarlet Knights to eight first downs and didn't allow them to get inside its 26-yard line, with that coming on the final play of the game.

A.J. Jordan blocked a punt by Tim Gleeson late in the first half and the ball rolled out of bounds at the Rutgers 20. Three days later, Gordon, who came into the game as the nation's No. 2 rusher with a 166.9 yard average, broke a tackle and danced into the end zone from 15 yards out.

Wisconsin didn't make another play on offense until Clement blew through a hole in the middle of the Scarlet Knights line to score almost untouched on his 43-yard run for a 14-0 lead with 9:36 left in the half.

Gaglianone added field goals of 32 and 27 yards before the half - one set up by an interception by linebacker Marcus Trotter - and the Badgers built a 20-0 halftime lead.

The game was all but ended on the Badgers' first play in the second half, when Gordon cut back right after a sweep left was stuffed and outran the Rutgers defense to the end zone for a 27-0 lead. The junior has 17 touchdowns rushing in his last six games

#25 WISCONSIN 34, PURDUE 16

SATURDAY, NOV. 8 (ROSS-ADE STADIUM / 35,068)

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. — Joel Stave threw two touchdown passes and Melvin Gordon ran for 205 yards Saturday as No. 25 Wisconsin rolled past Purdue, 34-16.

The Badgers (7-2, 4-1 Big Ten) have won four straight overall and remained in a three-way tie atop the West Division. Wisconsin has won nine straight in the series and still hasn't lost at Purdue since 1997. The Boilermakers (3-7, 1-5) lost their fourth straight.

After Gordon ran for Wisconsin's first score, he caught a 27-yard TD pass before Stave closed the half with a 9-yard TD pass to give the Badgers a 24-6 lead.

Purdue closed to 24-16 in the third quarter. But Tanner McEvoy's 13-yard TD run late in the quarter sealed Wisconsin's win.

Gordon, one of the top Heisman candidates, posted his third 200-yard game of the season and finished with 249 yards of total offense.

Stave, who hadn't thrown a pass in Wisconsin's first four games, was brilliant early. He went 15 of 19 for 190 yards with two touchdown passes in just two quarters.

Even more impressive was the way he used a series of laser-like throws to convert third downs and then followed up with two beautiful touch passes for scores as the Badgers drove into a stiff wind. Stave played so well that coach Gary Andersen scrapped his plan to rotate quarterbacks for a while. Stave wasn't bothered one bit by the chilly, blustery conditions at Ross-Ade Stadium.

Their stingy defense was pretty good, too.

It allowed 230 total yards, limited the Boilermakers (3-7, 1-5) to 26 yards rushing on 26 carries, had four sacks, 10 tackles for loss and only one major breakdown - the long TD pass that got Purdue within 24-16.

MADISON, Wis. — Unaware he was close to setting a record, Melvin Gordon took the handoff and did what he does best.

Wisconsin’s star running back burst through the hole, made a cut and high-stepped into the end zone, capping a memorable evening with an NCAA milestone.

Gordon rushed for a major college-record 408 yards and four touchdowns and the 22nd-ranked Badgers overcame three early turnovers to take control of the Big Ten West Division with a 59-24 win over No. 11 Nebraska.

Gordon eclipsed the single-game mark held since 1999 by TCU’s LaDainian Tomlinson by two yards, setting the new standard on a 26-yard touchdown run on the final play of the third quarter and his last carry of the game.

“Yeah, I didn’t even know I was close to a record like that,” Gordon said. “I was just kind of running away.”

Outdueling Nebraska’s Ameer Abdullah in a matchup of top tailbacks, Gordon had two fumbles before he helped the Badgers (8-2, 5-1, CFP No. 20) roar past Nebraska (8-2, 4-2, CFP No. 16) with 56 straight points.

The star junior torched what had been a staunch Nebraska defense on 25 carries and delivered an emphatic statement in the Heisman Trophy race.

“How about this guy? He’s the best of the best,” coach Gary Andersen said.

Gordon never played a down in the fourth quarter with his team leading by five scores. About the most action he got was when he danced on the field in the snow with his teammates while the song “Jump Around” echoed through the stadium. “Melvin Gordon! Melvin Gordon!” the crowd roared in the second half.

SATURDAY, NOV. 22 (KINNICK STADIUM / 68,610)

IOWA CITY, Iowa — Melvin Gordon’s single-game rushing record barely lasted a week.

His Heisman Trophy hopes — and Wisconsin’s Big Ten title chances — are stronger than ever after another brilliant performance from the nation’s top running back.

Gordon surpassed 2,000 yards rushing with 200 yards and two touchdowns, and 14th-ranked Wisconsin held off Iowa, 26-24, for its sixth straight win.

Gordon became the 17th FBS player with a 2,000-yard rushing season to lead the Badgers (9-2, 6-1 Big Ten), who nearly blew a 16-point lead before hanging on behind Gordon in the fourth quarter.

Gordon reached 2,000 yards on 241 carries — faster than anyone in NCAA history — and tied Ron Dayne’s single-season Big Ten mark of 2,109.

Jake Rudock had 311 yards passing and two TDs for the Hawkeyes (7-4, 4-3), who rallied from 16 down to get to 26-24 with just more than 5 minutes left.

Wisconsin watched its 16-point lead dwindle to 19-17 early in the fourth quarter.

Gordon made sure the Badgers didn’t blow it.

He caught a 35-yard pass on third-and-13 and followed his blockers for the 23-yard TD run that put Wisconsin ahead 26-17.

Rudock’s 9-yard TD pass to Jake Duzey with 5:01 left made it 26-24. But Joel Stave’s 12-yard run with 1:55 left clinched it for the Badgers.

Stave was 11 of 14 passing for 139 yards, including 64 to Gordon, for Wisconsin.

MADISON, Wis. — Melvin Gordon ran for 151 yards and accounted for two scores, and No. 14 Wisconsin rallied from a two-touchdown deficit to beat No. 22 Minnesota, 34-24, to earn a trip to the Big Ten championship game.

"Mel-vin Gor-don! Mel-vin Gor-don!" adoring fans at Camp Randall Stadium chanted for their Heisman contender. Gordon set a Big Ten single-season rushing record on his first carry after coming in tied with former Wisconsin running back Ron Dayne at 2,109 yards.

He had lots of help.

Stave and Erickson combined to torch the Gophers secondary. Backup running back Corey Clement, playing with a right shoulder injury, scored on a 28-yard run on his first carry with 6:20 left in the third quarter to give the Badgers their first lead of the night, 20-17.

Clement, the heir apparent to Gordon in the backfield, finished with 89 yards on seven gritty carries.

Wisconsin celebrated after time expired, having secured Paul Bunyan's Axe for an 11th straight season.
