Key Notes to Consider

► Wisconsin will be making its seventh appearance in the Rose Bowl and fourth since 1994. The Badgers are 3-3 in their six previous Rose Bowl appearances, but have won their last three games in Pasadena. Only USC, with five Rose Bowl wins, has won the Rose Bowl more times than Wisconsin since 1994.

► UW averaged 45.2 points per game in Big Ten play, a school record and the second-best mark in conference history (Penn State averaged 48.1 points in 1994). UW scored on 55 of 86 possessions (64.0 percent) in league play, not including six possessions on which they ran out the clock to end the half.

► Wisconsin is the only team in the country to have three running backs who have gained at least 800 yards on the ground this season. James White (1,029), John Clay (936) and Montee Ball (864) have combined for 2,846 yards on 465 carries (6.12 yards per carry). The Badgers have an outside chance to become the first team in FBS history to have three RBs run for at least 1,000 yards in the same season.

► Wisconsin is one of just five teams in the country to rank among the top 25 in both total offense and total defense. The others are Boise State, TCU, Stanford and Ohio State. The combined records of those five teams is 56-4.

► There have been 20 major individual FBS award winners announced thus far. Wisconsin is the only team in the country to have three different players win awards. LT Gabe Carimi won the Outland Trophy, QB Scott Tolzien won the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and DE J.J. Watt won the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Auburn (QB Cam Newton and DT Nick Fairley) and Oklahoma State (WR Justin Blackmon and K Dan Bailey) are the only other schools with multiple winners this season.

Badgers in Bowl Games

► UW will be making its ninth-straight bowl appearance, including all five of head coach Bret Bielema's seasons. There are only 11 schools in the country, including just one Big Ten team (Ohio State), with longer active streaks.

► In addition to making nine straight bowl appearances, the Wisconsin men's basketball team has also played in the NCAA tournament 12 consecutive years. UW is the only school in the country to make a bowl game and the NCAA tournament in every season since the 2002-03 academic year. The next longest such streak is four years by both Michigan State and BYU (see box on page 5).

► Head coach Bret Bielema was a walk-on defensive lineman and played in the 1991 Rose Bowl for Iowa.

► Tight ends coach Joe Rudolph was the starting left guard on Wisconsin's 1994 Rose Bowl team that defeated UCLA 21-16.

► Wide receivers coach DeV Vaughn Alexander was a graduate assistant for USC when the Trojans won the 1996 Rose Bowl.

► UW Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez was inducted into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame last year. He guided the Badgers to three Rose Bowl wins (1994, 1999 and 2000), becoming the first Big Ten coach to lead his team to Rose Bowl victories in consecutive seasons.

► Bielema was an assistant under two Rose Bowl Hall of Fame coaches, Alvarez and Iowa's Hayden Fry, who will be inducted this year.

► Former Badger RB Ron Dayne set the Rose Bowl career record for rushing yards with 446 and scored five TDs in Wisconsin's back-to-back Rose Bowl wins in 1999 and 2000. He is one of just four players in history to be named Rose Bowl MVP on two occasions.

► Bielema has coached on teams that have reached bowl games 10 straight years, spanning three different schools (Iowa, Kansas State and Wisconsin).

► Since 1993, Wisconsin has won 10 bowl games, including six games in January. That is second-most among schools in the country during that time span (Boston College - 11).

General Notes

► The Badgers shared the Big Ten title with Ohio State and Michigan State, courtesy of a school-record-tying 7-1 conference record. It was Wisconsin's 12th Big Ten title and first since 1999.

► Wisconsin won 11 regular-season games for just the second time in school history. With a win in the Rose Bowl UW would tie the school record for wins in a season with 12 (set in 2006).

► The Badgers have won at least 10 games just seven times in school history. Head coach Bret Bielema has been on staff for four of those seasons (three as head coach, one as defensive coordinator). UW has won at least 10 games in back-to-back seasons just three times. With a win in the Rose Bowl, Wisconsin would tie the school record for victories in consecutive seasons (22 set in 2005-06).

► The Badgers have won seven straight games, all of them in the Big Ten. That is tied for the fourth-longest current winning streak in the country and the fifth-longest conference winning streak in the country. It is the third time UW has won seven conference games in a row in the same season (1999 and 2006 are the others).

► Over the past two years, the Badgers have compiled a 21-4 (.840) record. That is the sixth-best record in the country over the last two years, trailing only Boise State (25-1), TCU (24-1), Alabama (23-3), Ohio State (22-3) and Oregon (22-3).

► For just the second time in school history, Wisconsin defeated Ohio State, Iowa and Michigan in the same season. The only other time was in 1959, a season that ended with the Badgers' second appearance in the Rose Bowl.

► Wisconsin defeated A.P. top-15 teams in consecutive weeks (No. 1 Ohio State and No. 13 Iowa) for just the second time in school history. The only other time was when the Badgers defeated No. 11 Rice and No. 5 Purdue in 1954.

► Wisconsin's 31-18 win over Ohio State on Oct. 16 was the Badgers' fourth-ever victory over the nation's No. 1-ranked team and the school's first since beating Michigan, 21-14, on Sept. 12, 1981.

► The Badgers have been ranked at least 20th in the Associated Press Poll every week this season. UW has accomplished that only four previous times in school history (1952, 1954, 1958 and 1998). Wisconsin's No. 4 ranking in the current A.P. poll is its highest since Nov. 7, 2004. The highest the Badgers have ever been ranked in the post-bowl A.P. poll is second following the 1962 season.

► Wisconsin has 50 players (out of 114) on its roster from the state of Wisconsin. Of the 24 starting positions on the current depth chart (11 offense, 11 defense, 2 special teams), 13 are Wisconsin-born players.

Senior Leadership

► Wisconsin has just 14 seniors on their roster but 12 of them have started at least 11 games in their careers. They have combined to play 539 games, including 297 starts. This season alone they have accounted for 116 starts. In the last four years, they have helped the Badgers to a 37-14 record, tied for the fifth-most wins in a four-year span in school history.

► Wisconsin's six captains (Carimi, Kendrick, Moffitt, St. Jean, Tolzien and Valai) are all fifth-year seniors. They have combined to start 194 games in their careers and have started 68 games this season.

► Seven Badger seniors, WR Isaac Anderson, CB Niles Brinkley, TE Lance Kendrick, LG John Moffitt, OL Bill Nagy, LB Culmer St. Jean and SS Jay Valai, earned their degrees during Wisconsin's December Commencement.

Badgers Don't Beat Themselves

► The Badgers have committed just nine turnovers this season, tied with Iowa for the fewest in the country. UW has lost just three fumbles on the season, second behind Ohio State for fewest in the country. The school record for fewest turnovers in a season is 10 (1998) and fewest fumbles is five (2005).

► The Badgers' top three running backs (John Clay, James White and Montee Ball) have combined for 510 touches (465 carries, 28 receptions and 17 KO returns) and fumbled the ball just once.

► UW leads the country in fewest penalties per game, averaging just 2.9 flags per game. Wisconsin's 29.8 penalty yards per game is good for second in the country.

► Wisconsin is tied for third in the country in turnover margin at +14. In Big Ten play, the Badgers were an astounding +15, tied for the fifth-best in conference history (dating back to 1980) and best since Iowa's +16 in 2002.

Honors and Awards

► The Badgers had five different players (RB John Clay, LT Gabe Carimi, TE Lance Kendrick, QB Scott Tolzien and DE J.J. Watt) and two coaches (head coach Bret Bielema and offensive coordinator Paul Chryst) named finalists for major national awards. The five different players were the most of any team in the country. Only Oklahoma State, which had four different finalists, had more than three players.

► Tolzien became the first Wisconsin QB to earn a major national award when he was named the winner of the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm award. The award is presented annually to the nation's top senior signal-caller.

► Carimi became the second Badger in history and second in the last five years to win the Outland Trophy, presented to the nation's top interior lineman. He follows in the footsteps of the player he replaced on the left side of the line, Joe Thomas, who won the award in 2006.

STARTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

► UW is 37-4 under head coach Bret Bielema when it scores first, including wins in 16 of the last 17 games in which it has put the first points on the board. The Badgers have scored the first time they have touched the ball in eight of 12 games this season and are outscoring their opponents 100-40 in the first quarter. Here are their game-opening drives thus far:

- o Michigan – 7 plays, 50 yards, 4:07 (punt)
- o Northwestern – 5 plays, 74 yards, 2:30 (Ball 32-yard TD run)

► The Badgers have also scored points the first time they have touched the ball in the second half in nine of 12 games this season and are outscoring opponents 146-61 in the third quarter. Below is a look at their first drives after halftime:

► Watt is the first Badger to win the Lott IMPACT Trophy, given to the top defensive player in the country, recognizing a player's success both on and off the field. Former Badger Jim Leonhard was a finalist for the inaugural Lott Trophy in 2004.

► Three different Badgers, Carimi, Moffitt and Kendricks, have earned first-team All-America honors this season. Five players were named to the Associated Press All-America team (first-, second- or third-team) the most of any team in the country and the most in school history.

► Carimi was a unanimous consensus All-American, the eighth in Wisconsin history and first since Joe Thomas in 2006. Kendricks was also a consensus All-American, giving the Badgers 23 in school history and two in the same season for just the third time (1998 and 1999).

► When the Big Ten announced its annual award winners, a total of 18 Badgers were honored, the highest number among conference teams. Five UW players were named first-team all-conference (Moffitt, Carimi, Kendricks, Watt and Fenelus).

► Carimi was named the Big Ten's Offensive Lineman of the Year, becoming just the second third Badger to earn that honor (joining Jeff Dellenbach in 1984 and Chris McIntosh in 1999).

► RB James White earned Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors, the seventh Badger to do so, and third in the last five years. Wisconsin is the first team in conference history to have consensus Freshman of the Year in consecutive seasons. LB Chris Borland was the conference Freshman of the Year last season.

► UW had a school-record 22 Academic All-Big Ten honorees in both 2009 and 2010 (breaking old record of 19 set in 2007, Bielema's second year as head coach). Included among the 2010 honorees are two COSIDA Academic All-District honorees (FB Bradie Ewing and C Peter Konz) and a National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete (QB Scott Tolzien).

Explosive Offense

► Wisconsin leads the Big Ten and is tied for fourth in the country (with TCU behind only Oregon, Boise State and Oklahoma State) in scoring offense, averaging 43.3 points per game. The Badgers will break the school record of 34.3 points per game, set in 2005.

► Entering this season, Wisconsin had not scored 70 points in a game since 1915. The Badgers did it three times this year. Since 2000, only one team (Texas Tech in 2004) has even scored 70 points twice in the same season. Other than Wisconsin, there were just four 70-point games in the country this season. Wisconsin scored 70 against two conference opponents. The only other team to score at least 70 points against a conference foe was Northern Illinois (71 vs. E. Michigan).

► In consecutive weeks, Wisconsin scored 31 points against both Ohio State and Iowa. Both teams rank among the top seven in the country in scoring defense, yielding a combined 29.8 points per game. The Badgers are the first Big Ten team to score 30 or more against OSU and Iowa in the same season since UW did so in 1999.

► During its seven-game winning streak, UW is outscoring its opponents by more than 26.0 points (48.3-22.1). The Badgers have averaged 253.3 yards on the ground while QB Scott Tolzien has completed 78.7 percent of his passes. They have converted 52.8 percent of their third downs (38-of-72) and scored touchdowns on 84.2 percent of their red zone opportunities (32-of-38).

► The Badgers are averaging 450.2 yards of total offense per game, second in the Big Ten. That would be second-best in school history, trailing only the 1993 team (455.2 ypg).

► Wisconsin is second in the country in red zone touchdown percentage, converting 80.0 percent (52-of-65) of its trips inside the 20-yard line into touchdowns (behind only Kansas State at 81.4 percent, 35-of-43). During Big Ten play, the Badgers converted 34 of their 40 red zone trips into touchdowns (85.0 percent). Last year's team set a school record for red zone TD percentage at 75.0 percent.

► Overall in the red zone, Wisconsin is tied for fifth in the country, converting 90.8 percent of its trips (59-of-65) into points. Three of its failed red zone opportunities came in end-of-game situations where they ran out the clock. In the last nine games, UW is 47-of-49 inside the 20-yard line. One of those failed red zone attempts came when the Badgers knelt on the ball at the end of the Northwestern game.

► Wisconsin is eighth in the country and leads the Big Ten in third-down percentage, having converted 66-of-130 opportunities (50.8 percent). UW has converted at least 50.0 percent of its third downs just twice (1983 and 1993) in school annals (records since 1981).

► The Badgers rank seventh in the country in time of possession this season at 32:39. UW is 9-0 this season when holding the ball longer than its opponents.

► On offense, the only three players who have started every game for the Badgers this season are QB Scott Tolzien, LT Gabe Carimi and LG John Moffitt.

► Four of the top eight scorers in the Big Ten are Badgers. RB Montee Ball is second in the conference, K Philip Welch is third while RBs John Clay and James White are seventh and eighth, respectively. Ball, Clay and White all rank among the top four in the conference in TDs.

▶ Wisconsin has set a school record with 46 rushing TDs this season, just two shy of the Big Ten record (48 by Ohio State in 1974). That is second-best in the country, behind Nevada's 52. Ball (17), White (14) and Clay (13) each have at least 13 rushing TDs this year.

▶ The Badgers are averaging 5.52 yards per carry this season (eighth in the country). The school record for yards per carry is 5.38 set in 1994. The last time they averaged at least 5.0 yards per carry was during the Big Ten title season of 1999, behind the running of Heisman Trophy winner Ron Dayne.

▶ Against Ohio State and Iowa, the fourth and sixth-ranked rushing defenses, respectively, in the country, the Badgers ran for a combined 326 yards and six TDs.

▶ UW is one of just six teams in the country to have averaged at least 200.0 yards rushing per game in each of the last three seasons (2007 - 200.8, 2008 - 211.2 and 2009 - 203.8). Nevada, Air Force, Navy, Oregon and Florida are the others. Wisconsin is 27-2 under head coach Bret Bielema when running for at least 200 yards.

▶ Against Michigan, the Badgers attempted just one pass in the second half, ending the game with 29 consecutive running plays (not including two kneel-downs to run out the clock). Those 29 rushing attempts yielded 171 yards (5.9 yards per carry).

▶ Earlier in the season, RB Montee Ball carried the ball on 20 consecutive offensive plays, spanning the end of the Purdue game and the beginning of the Indiana game.

▶ Wisconsin has had two running backs run for at least 100 yards in the same game five times this season. In each of the last three games, both Ball and White have reached the century mark as the duo has combined for 977 yards and 16 TDs. Against Michigan, Ball finished with 173 yards while White had a career-high 181 yards. It was just the second time in school history that two players rushed for at least 150 yards in the same game. The only other time was against Wyoming on Oct. 6, 1973, when Billy Marek had 226 yards and Ken Starch had 184 yards.

▶ After not playing at all against Ohio State, Ball is averaging 161.2 yards and has scored 13 TDs in the last four games. He also scored the game-winning TD on an eight-yard run against Iowa and caught a career-high five passes in that game.

▶ With all of its success on the ground, the Badgers also have four players with at least 1,000 career receiving yards, junior WR Nick Toon (1,475), senior TE Lance Kendricks (1,124), senior WR David Gilreath (1,054) and senior WR Isaac Anderson (1,038).

Gaining Ground

▶ Wisconsin ranks 12th in the country in rushing offense, averaging 247.3 yards per game on the ground. In the past three games, UW has rushed for a combined 1,024 yards (341.3 ypg.).

The Golden Arm of Senior QB Scott Tolzien

▶ **Unitas Golden Arm Award winner**
National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete
Second-team All-Big Ten

▶ QB Scott Tolzien leads the country and is on pace to break the Big Ten single-season record (67.8 percent by Darrell Bevell in 1993) for completion percentage, having completed 74.3 percent of his passes this season.

▶ He also ranks fourth in the country (behind Cam Newton of Auburn, Kellen Moore of Boise State and Ryan Mallet of Arkansas) with a passer rating of 169.8, which would be tops in school history.

▶ During the Badgers' current seven-game winning streak, he has completed 107-of-136 (.787) passes for 1,322 yards, 10 TDs and four interceptions. That equals a passer rating of 178.7.

▶ The Badgers are 21-4 with Tolzien as the starting QB over the past two seasons. In those 25 games, UW is averaging 36.5 points and 432.9 yards of total offense. Wisconsin has also converted 151 of its 309 third-downs (48.9 percent) in those games. In the red zone, UW is 112 of 121 (92.6 percent), including 94 touchdowns (77.7 percent).

▶ Tolzien's career pass efficiency rating of 154.4 is the best in school history and third-best among active FBS quarterbacks with at least 25 games played (behind Moore and Case Keenum of Houston).

▶ Tolzien's career completion percentage of .685 is the best in school history and second-best among active quarterbacks with at least 15 games played (behind only Houston's Keenum - .688).

▶ In the red zone this season, Tolzien has completed 27-of-32 passes for 256 yards and 15 touchdowns with just one interception. That translates to an efficiency of 300.0. Last year, Tolzien was 20-of-35 for 175 yards and nine TDs and no interceptions in the red zone (pass efficiency of 184.0).

▶ On third down this year, Tolzien is 42-of-60 for 550 yards with three TDs and an interception. That equals a pass efficiency of 160.2. In the last five games, Tolzien is 20-of-24 on third down for 251 yards.

▶ Tolzien completed 24 straight passes at one point, completing his final 11 against Indiana and starting the game against Michigan with 13 consecutive completions.

The Anchor on the Line, Senior LT Gabe Carimi

▶ **Outland Trophy winner**
Unanimous consensus All-American
Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year
Consensus first-team All-Big Ten

▶ Has started 48 games at left tackle over the last four years, taking over for former Outland Trophy winner Joe Thomas.

▶ Has spearheaded an offensive line that has paved the way for the 12th-ranked rushing offense in the country (247.3 ypg.) and given up just 12 sacks in 12 games.

▶ Carimi has lined up against OSU's Cameron Heyward, Iowa's Adrian Clayborn and Purdue's Ryan Kerrigan for the majority of those games, all Wisconsin victories. The combined stats for those three players was 12 total tackles and 2.0 TFLs. Wisconsin was the only team to hold Kerrigan, the nation's leader in tackles for loss, without a TFL this season.

The All-Around Tight End, Senior Lance Kendricks

- ▶ **John Mackey Award finalist**
Consensus All-American
Consensus first-team All-Big Ten
- ▶ Kendricks leads UW in receptions (39), receiving yards (627) and receiving TDs (5). He ranks fourth in the country in receiving yards by a tight end.
- ▶ Kendricks was named the John Mackey Award Tight End of the Week two straight weeks after recording 13 catches for 234 yards and two TDs vs. Arizona State and Austin Peay. He was the first Badger to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since TE Travis Beckum did so against Michigan and Ohio State in 2007.
- ▶ A tight end has ranked first or second on the Badgers in receptions in five of the last six years. In that span, UW has had four TEs that have gone on to play in the NFL (Owen Daniels, Jason Pociask, Travis Beckum and Garrett Graham).

Bringing the Power, Junior RB John Clay

- ▶ **Doak Walker Award finalist**
Third-team Associated Press All-American
Consensus second-team All-Big Ten
- ▶ Clay, the 2009 Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year, is averaging 93.6 yards per game and has scored 13 TDs in 10 games. He injured his knee at Purdue and had just 16 carries for 49 yards over the last four games (sat out vs. Indiana and Michigan). He needs 64 more yards to become the sixth running back in school history to record consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.
- ▶ Clay has run for at least 100 yards in 12 of his last 15 games. He became the first running back in 29 games to go over the 100-yard mark against Ohio State when he had 104 yards vs. the Buckeyes on Oct. 16.
- ▶ Clay has also scored at least one touchdown in 13 of his last 16 games, including a combined four against Ohio State and Iowa in consecutive weeks. The Buckeyes and Hawkeyes have only given up 20 rushing TDs this season.
- ▶ Clay has 3,337 career yards, just the eighth Badger running back to rush for at least 3,000 career yards. His yardage total is good for 12th among active backs in the country (third-best among juniors).
- ▶ Clay has run for 40 TDs in his career, tied for seventh in the country among active backs and fifth-best in school history.
- ▶ Clay is one of 17 players in the country with at least 3,000 career rushing yards. Among those players, his 92.7 yards per game is seventh-best.
- ▶ Wisconsin is 16-2 when Clay runs for at least 100 yards. The two losses came by a combined three points.
- ▶ Wisconsin is 21-3 when Clay rushes for at least one touchdown. Those three losses came by a combined five points.
- ▶ After rushing for just 134 yards and no TDs against Ohio State and Iowa in 2009 (both losses), Clay ran for 195 yards and four TDs against the Buckeyes and Hawkeyes this season, both UW wins.

Bringing the Speed, Freshman RB James White

- ▶ **Big Ten Freshman of the Year**
Freshman All-American
Second-team All-Big Ten
- ▶ With a team-leading 1,029 yards this season, White is just the fourth freshman (second true freshman) in school history to run for at least 1,000 yards, joining Ron Dayne (2,109 in 1996), P.J. Hill (1,569 in 2006) and Anthony Davis (1,466 in 2001).

- ▶ Third among freshmen in the country (behind Ronnie Hillman of San Diego State and Marcus Lattimore of South Carolina) with 93.5 rushing ypg.
- ▶ Averaged 108.6 yards per game in Big Ten play (despite just six carries for 10 yards vs. Iowa), good for fourth in the conference.
- ▶ Tied for second among all freshmen in the country with 14 rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ His 6.95 ypc. is third-best in the country among RBs with at least 100 carries (Alex Green of Hawaii – 8.78 ypc. and Allen Bradford of USC – 7.22 ypc.) and is on pace to break the school record (6.75 by Troy King in 1982). He has nine runs this season of at least 20 yards, including two 60+-yard TD runs.
- ▶ Had 75 rushing yards and a TD in win over No. 1 Ohio State.
- ▶ Leads the Badgers and ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 131.5 all-purpose yards per game.
- ▶ After missing the Purdue game with a knee injury, White is averaging 153.0 yards and has scored five TDs in the last three games.

Opportunistic on Defense

- ▶ After forcing just seven turnovers in the first eight games of the season, Wisconsin has 16 takeaways in the last four games.
- ▶ CB Antonio Fenelus, a first-team All-Big Ten selection by the media, has had a hand in seven of Wisconsin's takeaways this season (four interceptions, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble). Fenelus' four interceptions are tied for the Big Ten lead and are tied for 31st in the country. In the last four games, he has two fumble recoveries, two interceptions and a forced fumble.
- ▶ Another playmaker in the Badgers' secondary has been FS Aaron Henry. Henry, a converted corner in his first full season at safety, has scored three defensive touchdowns this season, returning a fumble 20

yards against UNLV, taking back an interception 37 yards against Indiana and returning another INT 50 yards vs. Northwestern. On the year he leads the Badgers with 44 solo tackles, has six pass breakups, three fumble recoveries, two interceptions and a forced fumble.

▶ Wisconsin has allowed just 202 first downs, second-fewest in the Big Ten and 14th-fewest in the country.

▶ Heading into its game with Wisconsin, Indiana led the Big Ten and ranked 11th in the country in passing offense (302.8 ypg.). The Badgers limited the Hoosiers to just 149 yards through the air.

▶ Wisconsin's defense has been whistled for one pass interference penalty all season, in the second quarter of the second game of the season, vs. San Jose State.

Tough Against the Run

▶ Wisconsin's opponents have scored just seven rushing touchdowns this season. That is tied for fourth-fewest in the country. Dating back to last year, UW has allowed just 12 rushing TDs in the last 22 games. The only time UW allowed less than seven rushing TDs in a season was 1998 (5).

▶ In the last two seasons (25 games), Wisconsin has allowed just three running backs to gain 100 yards. Fresno State's Ryan Matthews, who led the country in rushing in 2009, gained 107 yards on Sept. 12, 2009, Arizona State's Deandre Lewis had 122 yards in week three and Iowa's Adam Robinson had 114 yards.

▶ Wisconsin's defense held Michigan scoreless in the first half, the only time this season the Wolverines have been shut out in the first half. It was also the first time this season Michigan hadn't scored a point in the first quarter.

▶ Michigan entered the game ranked ninth in the country in rushing offense, averaging 266.3 yards per game. The Badgers limited them to 168 yards on the ground, the Wolverines' second-lowest total of the season.

The Heart and Soul of the Defense, Junior DE J.J. Watt

▶ Watt leads the Badgers, ranks second in the Big Ten and third in the country with 21.0 tackles for loss on the year.

▶ He also leads the Badgers and is tied for second in the Big Ten with 7.0 sacks on the season. Watt is tied for second on the team with 59 tackles and is tied for third on the team with eight pass breakups.

▶ Watt has registered a stat in every defensive category except "safety" this year. Going across the stat sheet he has 40 solo tackles, 19 assists (59 total), 21.0 TFLs for 91 yards, 7.0 sacks for 56 yards, an interception for 15 yards, seven pass break ups, 10 QB hurries, two fumble recoveries, three forced fumbles and three blocked kicks.

▶ Watt was named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week for the second consecutive week and picked up the Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week award after recording one sack and two tackles for loss, part of a five-tackle day against Iowa. In addition, he blocked an extra point in the first quarter, which proved to be the difference in the game.

▶ Going up against the No. 1 and No. 13 teams in the country in the consecutive weeks (Ohio State and Iowa), Watt put up nine tackles, 3.0 sacks, 5.0 TFLs, one quarterback hurry and one blocked kick.

▶ Watt blocked an extra point following Iowa's first touchdown that proved to be the difference in UW's 31-30 win. Watt's three blocked kicks this season are tied for second-most in school history. His four career blocks are third-best.

▶ In the Badgers' last game, vs. Northwestern, Watt had seven tackles, including three TFLs, forced two fumbles, had three QB hurries that all resulted in interceptions and blocked an extra point. He was named Lott IMPACT Player of the Week for the third time this season.

"Special" Teams

▶ Wisconsin's special teams have had a major impact on three wins this season. In a 20-19 win over Arizona State, Jay Valai blocked an extra point and Shelton Johnson made a touchdown-saving tackle on a kick-off return at the 1-yard line as the first half expired. In the Badgers' upset of No. 1 Ohio State, David Gilreath returned the opening kickoff for a touchdown. And in UW's 31-30 win at Iowa, J.J. Watt blocked an extra point and punter Brad Nortman picked up 17 yards on a crucial fake punt that kept the game-winning touchdown drive alive.

▶ Gilreath's 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on the game's opening kickoff against Ohio State is tied for the fourth-longest KO return in school history and was the longest for the Badgers since Aaron Stecker's 100-yard return against Minnesota on Nov. 11, 1995. It was also the first time UW returned the opening kickoff of for a touchdown since Oct. 28, 1989 (Fred Owens vs. Illinois).

▶ Gilreath now has 2,959 career kickoff return yards, tops in Big Ten history and second-best in the country among active FBS players. Against Ohio State and Iowa, Gilreath averaged 63.8 yards on eight kickoff returns. In the last four games, Gilreath has been kicked to just seven times (of 16 total kickoffs).

▶ Gilreath's 72 career punt returns are third-most in the nation. He is fourth in the country and fifth all-time at Wisconsin with 708 career punt return yards and is third in school history and 11th in the country with 4,995 all-purpose yards.

▶ K Philip Welch has scored 39 points in the last three games and has 111 on the season (second in the Big Ten). He is just the seventh Badger in history to go over the 100-point mark in a season. He has 308 career points, second only to Ron Dayne (426) in school history. Welch's 52 career field goals is also second in Wisconsin annals (Todd Gregoire - 65) as is his .776 FG percentage (Matt Davenport - .868).

▶ P Brad Nortman has punted just 35 times this season, the second-fewest among the top 10 punters in the Big Ten. He does not qualify for the NCAA statistics but his 42.8-yard average this season is sixth-best in school history.

Wisconsin - 14, TCU 14**

In the only meeting between Wisconsin and TCU, both teams missed short field goals in the fourth quarter as the Badgers and Horned Frogs played to a 14-14 tie at Camp Randall Stadium.

Wisconsin fumbled the opening kickoff and TCU capitalized right away, scoring three plays later on an end-around to go up 7-0.

A 1-yard QB sneak by UW's Neil Graff in the second quarter capped a 15-play drive and tied the score at 7-7 at halftime.

The Badgers opened the second half with a 77-yard drive, capped by a 50-yard TD pass from Graff to Larry Mialik.

TCU tied the score with 1:39 left in the third quarter on a 4-yard TD run. Both teams had a chance to take the lead in the final stanza but Wisconsin was wide right on a 34-yard FG and TCU came up short on a 37-yard attempt.

The Wisconsin-TCU Notebook

▶ This will be just the second meeting between Wisconsin and TCU. The teams tied, 14-14 on Sept. 26, 1970 at Camp Randall Stadium

▶ Wisconsin is 16-6-1 all-time against teams currently in the Mountain West Conference. The Badgers opened the season against a Mountain West opponent, defeating UNLV, 41-21, on Sept. 4 in Las Vegas.

▶ The two teams have each scored exactly 520 points in their 12 games. They are tied for fourth in the country in scoring offense (43.3 points per game).

▶ Both teams are among the top 12 in the country in rushing offense, averaging more than 245.0 yards per game on the ground, but neither has a running back averaging more than 100.0 yards per game.

▶ Both teams have senior quarterbacks (Scott Tolzien for Wisconsin and Andy Dalton of TCU) who rank among the top five in the country in pass efficiency.



Senior SS Jay Valai, one of the Badgers' six captains, hails from Euless, Texas, approximately 20 miles from TCU's campus in Ft. Worth.

▶ Wisconsin and TCU are two of just five teams in the country to rank among the Associated Press Top 25 and the top 25 of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). The other three are Ohio State, Stanford, and Boise State.

▶ The Badgers have five players on their roster from Texas (SS Jay Valai, CB Devin Smith, CB Marcus Cromartie, SS Shelton Johnson, DB Josh Peprah).

▶ This will be the fifth time in school history Wisconsin is involved in a game between two teams ranked in the top five in the Associated Press Poll. The Badgers are 2-2 in the previous four games. The last game between two top-5 teams involving UW was the 1963 Rose Bowl when No. 1 USC defeated No. 2 Wisconsin, 42-37, a game in which the Badgers nearly rallied from a 42-14 fourth-quarter deficit.

Background on Bielema

- ▶ Bielema has compiled a 49-15 (.766) record in his five seasons at Wisconsin, the fifth-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches.
- ▶ With 49 wins in his first four seasons, Bielema is already fourth in Badger history for head coaching victories (among 27 coaches in UW history).
- ▶ For leading this year's Badgers to an 11-1 record and their first Big Ten title since 1999, Bielema was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards as well as a semifinalist for the Joseph V. Paterno Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Bielema's 49-15 record is second-best among the 11 head coaches hired prior to the 2006 season. He trails only Chris Peterson of Boise State (59-5). Bielema and Peterson are the only two of those 11 head coaches to have led their teams to five straight bowl appearances.
- ▶ Wisconsin has won at least 10 games seven times in school history. Bielema has been a part of four of those seasons (head coach in 2006, 2009 and 2010, defensive coordinator in 2005). He has coached UW to the only two 11-win regular-seasons in school history (2006 and 2010).
- ▶ Bielema was just the third rookie head coach in NCAA Division IA history to guide his team to 12 victories. The 12 wins also were a Wisconsin record.
- ▶ Bielema was named 2006 Big Ten Coach of the Year and was one of five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year Award. He also was a finalist for the 2006 Schutt Sports Division IA Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Wisconsin is 68-21 (.764) since Bielema arrived in Madison as defensive coordinator in 2004. He served in that role for two years before taking over as head coach in 2006. That is the 12th-best record in the country and second-best in the Big Ten over that time span.

▶ The four head coaches for whom Bielema worked (Hayden Fry, Kirk Ferentz, Bill Snyder and Barry Alvarez) have combined to win 598 games and guide their teams to 43 bowl games.

▶ Bielema coached Wisconsin to wins in 17 of his first 18 games. That represents the second-best start to a head coaching career in Big Ten history. Only Michigan's legendary Fielding Yost, went 55-0-1 from 1901-05, had a better beginning to a career.

▶ Bielema was 21-5 in his first two seasons at the helm at UW. Only two other men in Big Ten history — Michigan's Fielding Yost (22) and Ohio State's Jim Tressel (21) — guided their teams to as many as 21 wins in their first two seasons as Big Ten head coaches.

Clay registered his eighth-consecutive 100-yard rushing game and found the end zone twice, while the Badgers' defense held the Spartans to just 55 yards rushing and a pair of touchdowns. It was enough to overcome a day that saw the UW offense fumble the ball four times and convert on only four of seven red zone chances. Clay finished the day with 137 yards to go along with his scores, while Montee Ball contributed 31 yards and true freshman James White added 25 more out of the backfield. Senior quarterback Scott Tolzien went 15-for-22 for 191 yards and finished with a touchdown and an interception.

MADISON, Wis. -- It was the special teams unit that saved the day for the No. 11 Badgers in a 20-19 win over Arizona State in front of a sellout crowd of 81,332 at Camp Randall Stadium. Senior safety Jay Valai -- at just 5-foot-9 -- got a hand on the extra-point attempt of Arizona State kicker Thomas Weber late in the fourth quarter and kept what would have been the game-tying point off the board. UW's defense held the Sun Devils to just 12 offensive points while the Badgers piled up 440 yards of offense. Senior tailback John Clay posted his ninth-consecutive 100-yard rushing game with 123 yards on 22 carries -- including the go-ahead touchdown in the third quarter. #16 Wisconsin 31, #1 Ohio State 18 Oct. 16 (Camp Randall Stadium / 81,194)

MADISON, Wis. -- David Gilreath's 97-yard touchdown return on the game's opening kickoff set the tone, but it was a late scoring drive that sealed the deal as the Badgers scored a 31-18 win over No. 1 Ohio State late Saturday inside a raucous Camp Randall Stadium. It was a sequel 29 years in the making, as Wisconsin (6-1, 2-1) claimed its first win over a No.1-ranked team since downing top-ranked Michigan in 1981. Junior tailback John Clay - who became the first player to rush for 100 yards on Ohio State in 29 games - finished the day with 104 yards on 21 carries and rushed for two scores. Freshman backfield mate James White added another rushing score in addition to 75 yards on the ground. Through the air, senior quarterback Scott Tolzien was nearly unflappable. Despite an early interception, Tolzien completed 13 of 16 passes for 152 yards. He connected with junior wide receiver Nick Toon six times for 72 yards. After Wisconsin jumped out to a 21-3 lead, Ohio State cut that lead to 21-18. The Badgers' counter-punch came in the form of a 10-play drive that covered 73 yards on the way to a 12-yard rushing touchdown for freshman tailback James White.

IOWA CITY, Iowa -- Wisconsin's encore after knocking off No. 1 at home last week? Rallying for a win on the road in a thrilling rivalry showdown. Badgers head coach Bret Bielema stunned his alma mater with a fake punt midway through the fourth quarter, and Montee Ball ran 8 yards for a touchdown with 1:06 left as the 10th-ranked Badgers rallied to beat No. 13 Iowa 31-30 on Saturday. The victory followed UW's triumph over then-No. 1 Ohio State last week and allowed the Badgers to secure the Heartland Trophy for the first time in three seasons. Scott Tolzien threw for 205 yards and a touchdown and John Clay added a pair of touchdowns for the Badgers (7-1, 3-1 Big Ten), who pulled out a special teams gadget at just the right time. Punter Brad Nortman ran 17 yards up the middle into wide-open field on fourth down from his own 26 with Wisconsin trailing 30-24. The Badgers converted another fourth down with 3:23 left and Ball capped an 80-yard drive with the game-winning score, barely breaking the goal line with an outstretched arm holding the ball.

Purdue led 10-6 at halftime, but Wisconsin's defense dominated the second half. A 44-yard field goal by Welch cut Purdue's lead to 7-3. Welch made another field goal as time expired in the first half, but Purdue led 10-6 at the break. MADISON, Wis. -- Behind six rushing touchdowns and three more through the air, a dominant offensive attack led the No. 5 Wisconsin football team to a decisive 83-20 win over Indiana at Camp Randall Stadium. In addition to rolling their fifth-consecutive win, the Badgers matched the most points ever scored in a Big Ten Conference game - and the most by a UW team since 1915 - while taking their sixth-straight win over the Hoosiers. The Badgers piled up 598 offensive yards, including 338 on the ground behind the two-headed tailback attack of Montee Ball and James White. ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Montee Ball and James White combined for 354 yards rushing and six touchdowns, helping the fifth-ranked Badgers pound Michigan in a 48-28 victory. Wisconsin, which hadn't won at the Big House since 1994, built a 24-0 lead at halftime against the Wolverines and essentially traded scores in the second half. Ball ran for 173 yards and four TDs on 29 carries, while White had a career-high 181 yards rushing and two scores on 23 carries to become the second pair of Badgers to run for 150-plus yards in a game in school history. Scott Tolzien completed his first 13 passes -- 24 straight including the end of last week's 83-20 win against Indiana -- and finished 14 of 15 for 201 yards with an interception. Wisconsin essentially sealed the victory early in the fourth quarter when defensive end J.J. Watt deflected a pass near midfield and intercepted it.

MADISON, Wis. -- The Badgers secured a share of the Big Ten title for the first time since 1999 by running past Northwestern, 70-23. UW rolled up 559 yards of total offense and scoring, at one point, on seven consecutive possessions. Montee Ball paced the Badgers by becoming just the second UW player to rush for four touchdowns in consecutive games, churning up 178 yards along the way. Senior quarterback Scott Tolzien completed 15 of 19 passes for 230 yards and four touchdowns. Wisconsin forced turnovers on Northwestern's first three drives and had seven takeaways in all, including four interceptions. Junior Aaron Henry claimed the fourth and returned it 50 yards for a touchdown that put a cap on the Badgers' scoring. Defensive end J.J. Watt could share credit for three of the Badgers' picks with three quarterback hurries to go with three tackles for loss and a pair of forced fumbles. He also blocked an extra-point attempt.
