## Deposits & Cancellations

Please enroll as soon as possible because space is extremely limited. A **nonrefundable** deposit of \$200 is required to hold your spot. Full tuition (minus the deposit) is due no later than two weeks prior to the starting day of the camp. Refunds will not be given after the two week deadline unless the camper must cancel due to medical injury. Proper medical documentation must be sent to Camp Administration in order to receive refund (minus deposit).

## Important Information

Each camper will receive a confirmation letter, including a map and directions, campus parking information, camp rules, required medical forms and check-in information.

## Medical Forms

After we receive your application and nonrefundable deposit, you will receive the required medical forms from UW Sports Medicine. Fill out these forms and return them in the prepaid postage envelopes. You can also fax them to UW Sports Medicine at 608-265-4736. UW Sports Medicine will need these completed forms **before** campers can participate in the camps. These forms are available on the uwcamps.com web site. Trainers are on staff to assist with any and all medical treatments.

## Camper Conduct

Campers will be supervised 24 hours per day. Any serious violation of regulations, such as willful damage to property or other behavior deemed detrimental to the group, will result in immediate dismissal. There will be no refund of registration fee upon expulsion.

## Instructional Facility



University Ridge Golf Course will be the official facility for all Badger golf camp activities. Located in Madison, University Ridge is the official home to the University of Wisconsin men's and women's golf teams. In the fall of 2011, University Ridge was ranked No. 5 nationally by *Golfweek* among university-owned golf courses as well as being named 47th nationally for all golf facilities by GolfLink.

At just under 7,300-yards, the Robert Trent Jones, Jr., layout provides several sets of tee boxes which will challenge any type of player. The private practice area for the golf teams provides a large practice tee and short game area including three practice greens and bunkering. This short game practice facility is one of the finest in the nation.

## Meet the Staff



**Michael Burcin**  
Head Golf Coach

Michael Burcin (BUR-sin) was named the men's golf coach at Wisconsin on May 31, 2011, after seven years at the University of South Carolina.

He was named the 2010 Golf Coaches Association of America's Jan Strickland Assistant Coach of the Year.

In April, he was selected to serve as an assistant at the 2011 Palmer Cup at the Stanwich Club in Greenwich, Conn. The Palmer Cup is a Ryder Cup-style competition for teams of collegiate golfers from the United States and Europe which square off in a three-day match play event.

In Burcin's time on the men's staff, South Carolina was a major player on the national scene. The Gamecocks made six-straight NCAA regional appearances (2005-10), including winning the school's first NCAA regional title in 2007. They advanced to the NCAA championship three times in Burcin's seven seasons, with their top finish being a share of 11th place in 2007. In 2008-09, Burcin helped South Carolina win a school-record four tournament titles.

In addition to assisting coaches with day-to-day coaching duties, Burcin's primary role at South Carolina was to implement and coordinate a recruiting program conducive to winning championships.

Before going to South Carolina, Burcin spent seven years as a golf professional in Lancaster, Pa. While in Lancaster, Burcin kept an active playing schedule of section and chapter PGA events.



**Bryant Odom**  
Assistant Golf Coach

Bryant Odom, a former University of Georgia All-American and All-SEC performer, joined the Badgers as the assistant men's golf coach in 2011 after serving two years as the graduate assistant for UGA during the 2010 and 2011 seasons. The Cartersville, Ga., native lettered for the Bulldogs from 1999-2002. In 2001, he was the 13th Georgia player to win the Southeastern Conference individual title.

Odom garnered All-America honors in 2001 and 2002, and he was an All-SEC selection in 2000, 2001 and 2002. During Odom's playing career in Athens, the Bulldogs won 13 tournaments, including the 1999 national championship and the 2000 and 2001 SEC titles.

Odom played professionally from 2002 through 2005 and again in 2008 on the NGA Hooters, Tarheel and Nationwide tours. From 2006 to 2007, Odom was the PGA Apprentice Professional at Ocean Forest Golf Club on Sea Island, Ga.
