CAMP INFORMATION

The 2012 Wisconsin Men's Rowing Camp is a six-day introduction to competitive collegiate rowing. Campers will be instructed on the basic skills required to succeed at a top rowing college. Our campers represent a variety of athletic backgrounds. Many have never rowed before, while some have extensive high school experience. We will tailor the camp experience to fit the needs of the individuals.

The camp will be staffed by University of Wisconsin coaches and oarsmen. The staff/camper ratio will be kept low to ensure safety and individual attention. UW Athletic trainers will also be on call to offer assistance.

Campers will reside two to a room in Lakeshore Student Housing. Counselors will live in the dorms with campers for the sake of safety and supervision.

A strong desire to excel is the only skill required of campers

University Housing residence halls provide student-style housing conveniently located on campus near camps. Each air conditioned room includes twin beds with bed linens and pillows, microfridges, desks, Internet and cable television connections (via personal laptop) and shared bathroom facilities. Floor lounges include televisions and telephones with free local calls. Laundry and vending machines are located within most halls. Meals provide a variety of youth-friendly and healthy selections, including vegetarian options.
