### Key Notes to Consider

- ▶ Wisconsin will compete for both the Cochrane Cup and the Jablonic Cup on the Charles River this Saturday after a weekend off, facing No. 14 Dartmouth and MIT in the morning for the Cochrane Cup and taking on No. 11 Boston University in the afternoon for the Jablonic Cup.
- ▶ The Badgers face MIT and Dartmouth in four races, starting with the third varsity at 7:48 a.m. CT, followed by the freshmen at 8:24 and the second varsity at 9:00. The Cochrane Cup will conclude with the first varsity race at 9:36 a.m. Wisconsin will then have a two-hour break before competing in five consecutive races versus Boston University beginning at 11:24 a.m.
- ▶ The Badgers look to defend a four-year winning streak in both competitions. They swept both Dartmouth and MIT last year to win the Cochrane Cup as well as sweeping Boston University for the Jablonic Cup.
- ▶ No. 9 Wisconsin moved up two positions in the USRowing Collegiate Poll after an impressive four-win performance over then-No. 18 Oregon State and No. 12 Stanford on April 17-18.
- ▶ Since the inception of the Cochrane Cup in 1961, Wisconsin has claimed the cup 31 times in 49 years.
- ▶ The Jablonic Cup originated later in 1989 and was named after Wisconsin's former head coach Randy Jablonic. Wisconsin has claimed 17 titles in the 19 years of the trophy's existence.
