## KELSEY ERA BEGINS

Bobbie Kelsey was named the sixth head coach in Wisconsin women's basketball history in April of 2011. Kelsey begins her first season as a head coach after a 14-year assistant coaching career. As a player and coach, Kelsey has appeared in seven Final Fours.

## FORMER BADGER RETURNS AS ASSISTANT

Bobbie Kelsey completed her coaching staff with the hiring of three assistant coaches. Former Badger Kyle (Black) Rechlicz joins Stacy Cantley and Alysiah (a LYE sha) Bond on Kelsey's staff.

Rechlicz, who played for Wisconsin from 1998-2002, served as an assistant coach and associate head coach at Dayton for the last four seasons. As a Badger, Rechlicz aided UW to four post-season appearances, including NCAA tournament berths in 2001 and 2002.

Cantley comes to Wisconsin after serving as an assistant coach at Virginia Tech for the last seven years, including three seasons with Kelsey.

A former team captain at Ohio State, Bond has been the director of operations for the Arizona women's basketball program for the last three seasons.

## TOUGH SCHEDULE AWAITS

Wisconsin faces a challenging schedule in 2011-12, taking on six teams that were ranked or received votes in the final *USA Today*/Top 25 Coaches poll from 2010-11 and 13 teams that competed in post-season play last year.

Six teams competed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament while seven opponents competed in the 2011 Women's National Invitation Tournament. Eleven teams also won 20-or-more games in 2010-11.

## CAPTAINS NAMED

Seniors **Anya Covington** and **Ashley Thomas** as well as junior **Taylor Wurtz** will serve as tri-captains for the 2011-12 season, according a vote by their teammates.

Covington, a 6-2 forward, started nine games last season while Wurtz, a 6-0 guard, is the Badgers' top returning scorer and rebounder, averaging 8.3 points and 6.4 rebounds per game as a sophomore. Thomas, a 6-2 forward, has played in 71 games in her career.

## REPLACING ALL-BIG TEN PLAYERS

The Badgers must replace three All-Big Ten players who were lost to graduation. **Alyssa Karel** and **Lin Zastrow** were second-team All-Big Ten picks last season while Zastrow was also named to the All-Defensive team. In addition, **Tara Steinbauer** earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors.

The trio were the top three scorers for the Badgers last season while Zastrow ranked second on the team in rebounding.

## SCORING AND REBOUNDING DOWN

Wisconsin lost 61 percent of its scoring (1,127 of 1854 points) and 42 percent of its rebounding (429 of 767 rebounds) due to graduation.

Junior **Taylor Wurtz** is the UW's top returning scorer and rebounder. She averaged 8.3 points per game last season, fourth on the team. She also led the Badgers with 6.4 boards per game as a sophomore.

## FIFTH WINNING SEASON IN A ROW

Wisconsin wrapped up the 2010-11 season with a 16-15 mark, its fifth straight winning season. It was also the 20th overall winning season in 37 years of competition.

The Badgers made their fifth-consecutive post-season appearance and their sixth WNIT appearance in 2010, losing in the second round of the tournament.

## THIRD PLACE IN THE BIG TEN

The Badgers ended the regular season in a tie for third place in the Big Ten standings. No. 10 Michigan State won the conference title with a 13-3 record while Penn State finished second at 11-5. Wisconsin tied for third place with Iowa, Michigan and Ohio State at 10-6.

UW has finished third or higher in the final Big Ten standings only seven times in the 29-year history of the conference. The Badgers best finish was second in 1984 and tied for second in 2001. Wisconsin was third in 1992, 1995, 1996 and tied for third last season.

## CLOSE GAMES IN 2010-11

The Badgers were 1-2 in overtime games in 2010-11, including a 73-70 overtime loss to No. 11 Michigan State in the Kohl Center. Wisconsin lost to Kansas 93-86 in overtime as part of the Big Ten/Big 12 Challenge but pulled out an overtime win at Wyoming, 63-59.

Wisconsin also lost two games by three points or less and four other games by eight points or less.

## TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

The Badgers set season records for fewest turnovers and turnovers per game. Wisconsin averaged just 14.29 turnovers per game, which bested the mark of 15.18 per game, set in 2008-09. The Badgers had just 443 turnovers this season, which broke the current season mark of 479 set in 2007-08.

## TYING A SCHOOL RECORD

UW tied a school record by making 11 3-pointers at Purdue on Dec. 30. The Badgers were 11-of-18 from behind the arc for 61.1 percent.

The 11 treys made tied a mark set in three other games with the most recent performance coming in 2002 vs. Michigan. The 61.1 percent from deep ranks fourth on the UW single-game record list.

Sophomore **Taylor Wurtz** led the Badgers with five makes from long distance, which ties for seventh on the UW single-game record list.



**B**obbie Kelsey, who, as an assistant coach at Stanford helped lead the Cardinal to the NCAA Final Four in each of the last four seasons, was named the sixth head coach in UW women's basketball history in April of 2011.

In her four seasons as an assistant at Stanford, the Cardinal compiled a 137-14 (.907) record, including a 69-3 (.958) mark in Pac-10 Conference play, and advanced to the Final Four each year. Stanford's streak of four-straight Final Fours is tied for the second-longest streak in NCAA history.

Stanford completed its 2010-11 season with yet another Final Four appearance. The Cardinal finished with a 33-3 record, falling to Texas A&M in the national semifinal. Stanford earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA tournament after going a perfect 18-0 in Pac-10 play and winning the conference tournament.

In 2009-10, Stanford set a program record with 36 wins as the Cardinal went 36-2 and captured the Pac-10 double (regular season and tournament titles) while going 18-0 in Pac-10 play. That followed a season in which the Cardinal went 33-5 won the program's ninth consecutive Pac-10 regular season title and sixth Pac-10 Tournament crown. Kelsey's first season on the Stanford coaching staff saw the Cardinal make its seventh appearance in the Final Four, and first since 1997.

Kelsey was instrumental in transforming Stanford into one of the best defensive teams in the country. The Cardinal has not allowed more than 56.0 points for the season in the last three years.

Prior to returning to Stanford, Kelsey spent three seasons at Virginia Tech. From 2002-04, Kelsey served as an assistant coach at Western Carolina. She spent the 2000-02 seasons as the top assistant and recruiting coordinator at Evansville. Prior to her stint with the Aces, she was an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons.

Kelsey was a four-year letterwinner at Stanford from 1992-96. She helped the Cardinal to three Final Four appearances in five years as a player, including the 1992 NCAA championship. Kelsey was a team co-captain in 1995 and 1996, voted the team's Most Inspirational Player in 1992 and 1996, and named the team's most improved player in 1993.

Kelsey graduated from Stanford in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in communications. In 2010, she earned her master's degree in Sports Leadership from Duquesne University's School of Leadership and Professional Advancement.

## CAREER MILESTONES REACHED

Several Badgers reached career milestones during the 2010-11 season.

- Anya Covington went over 300 rebounds for her career. She currently has 315 rebounds in three seasons. Covington also needs only five points for 400.
- Jade Davis went over 300 career points, tallying 317 in her three seasons.
- Taylor Wurtz went over 400 career points, totaling 464 in two seasons, and 300 career rebounds, tallying 304 in two seasons.

## CAREER SEASONS FOR BADGERS

Several Badgers had the best seasons of their careers in 2010-11.

- Anya Covington averaged a career-best 4.1 rebounds per game and had a season-high 23 assists. She started nine games this season, earning her first career starts.
- Jade Davis chipped in a career best 4.6 points and 2.4 rebounds per game. She more than doubled her season assist total with 56 this season and also had a season-high 34 steals. Davis set or tied game highs in nearly every statistical category in 2010-11, including points (14), rebounds (10) and assists (6).
- Ashley Thomas averaged a career-best 1.3 points per game. She shot a season-best 55 percent from the field. Thomas set single-game highs for points and field goals this season.
- Taylor Wurtz chipped in a season-best 8.3 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. Her rebounding average is nearly double of what it was as a freshman. She has also more than doubled up her assists with 46 this season.

## BADGERS IN THE NCAA STATS

Wisconsin ranked among the top 100 teams in the nation in six statistical categories, according to the final NCAA stats released April 6.

UW was 19th in turnovers per game with 14.3 and 58th in personal

fouls per game with 15.4. The Badgers are 61st in free throw percentage at .727 and 61st in field goal percentage at 42.1. Wisconsin is 64th in scoring defense, allowing 58.2 points per game, and 79th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 0.85.

## LEADING THE BIG TEN

UW wrapped up the Big Ten season ranking second in scoring defense, allowing 58.8 points per game. The Badgers also ranked second in 3-point field goal percentage (.363) and second in turnovers per game (12.4).

Wisconsin ranked third in free throw percentage (.768); third in 3-point field goal defense (.315); third in turnover margin (+2.1); third in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.0); and third in defensive rebound percentage (.706).

## WISCONSIN RANKED 19TH IN ATTENDANCE

Wisconsin ended the 2010-11 season ranked 19th in national attendance, averaging 4,664 fans per game. It was the 17th straight season that UW has ranked in the top 20 for attendance.

The Badgers drew 69,956 fans to 15 home games in the Kohl Center. Wisconsin ranked fourth in the Big Ten. Purdue led the league and ranked eighth nationally with 7,628 fans per game.

## WHO'S THE SCORING LEADER?

**Taylor Wurtz** was the top scorer in four games in 2010-11 while **Jade Davis** was the leading scorer in two games. **Anya Covington** and **Cassie Rochel** were the top scorers in one game apiece.
