WHAT'S AHEAD

The Wisconsin women's hockey team returns home to the Kohl Center to take on WCHA rival Minnesota Duluth. The Badgers sit four points behind UMD in conference standings, marking a current third place standing. A series sweep would put UW in a tie for second place with the fifth-ranked Bulldogs. The game marks an NCAA Frozen Four semifinal rematch, in which UW advanced after a 5-1 victory over UMD.

LAST TIME OUT

- ▶ Wisconsin tallied a tie and a win in their final non-conference series last weekend against Providence College. After outshooting the Friars 76-25 over the weekend, UW skated to a 2-2 tie the first night and a 4-1 victory in the finale.
- ▶ With Wisconsin dominating the scoring attempts, outshooting Providence 36-15, the Friars took advantage on the power-play, scoring both of their goals with the man-advantage. Geena Prough and Mallory Deluce each scored for the Badgers to put UW on the board. The game officially ended in a tie, however, Providence won the shootout, 2-1 in four rounds.
- ▶ In the finale the Badgers went up 1-0 in the first half, not allowing the Friars a single shot on goal in the first frame. In the second period Providence tallied its first goal of the game, and the only goal of the period. In the final three minutes of regulation, Wisconsin finally broke through scoring three goals including an empty net tally to seal the win. Freshman Brianna Decker and Deluce each notched two goals in the victory.

BADGER NOTES

- ▶ Wisconsin has split five of its eight series this season; UW has dropped four and tied two in the first game to come back and win the second game of the series, only winning two games in the opener this season. Wisconsin's only series sweep was against the second-ranked Minnesota Gophers who sit atop the WCHA.
- ▶ The Badgers have netted 45 goals by 14 different Badgers. Wisconsin has out-shot opponents in every game but one this season totaling 565 shots compared to 391.
- ▶ Already 18 Badger skaters have contributed a point this season. Brooke Ammerman is the team's leading scorer with 18 points (11g, 7a) followed by Mallory Deluce (8g, 6a).
- ▶ The Badgers continue struggling on the power play ranked 32nd in the nation. UW is 5-for-74 on the man advantage, after coming up 0-for-15 in the last four games. Wisconsin has had 115 power play shot attempts for a .043 shot percent.
- ▶ Wisconsin ranks 10th in the nation on the penalty kill with an 88.9 percent success rate allowing only nine goals on 81 opportunities. The Badgers have netted two short-handed goals this season.
- ▶ Wisconsin relies on the strength of two goaltenders this season. Freshman Becca Ruegsegger had a shutout in her first collegiate start and has recorded a 5-4-2 record this season. Ruegsegger has 259 saves and a .918 save percentage with a 2.07 goals-against average. Senior Alannah McCready (4-1-0) holds a .926 save percentage and a 1.57 goals-against average tallying 100 saves.

- ▶ The Badgers five losses is only the second time in the last five years the Badgers have lost more than four games in a season. However, in the 2007-08 season the Badgers suffered nine losses overall but still managed to finish the season as the NCAA runner up.
- ▶ Ammerman's 11-game point streak came to an end on Friday, Nov. 27 against Providence College. During that span she had a career-high tying four-goal game against Wayne State. Ammerman ranks 17th in the nation in scoring this season, she is tied for fifth for goals, three goals behind the nation's leader, Bailey Bram of Mercyhurst. Ammerman remains a balanced forward with 38 career goals and 34 career assists in only her second season.
- ▶ Wisconsin's defense has played aggressively helping the scoring output for UW notching five goals this season. Stefanie McKeough and Saige Pacholok have been a positive asset to the Badger defense, leading the defenseman in scoring with eight and seven points, respectively. The Badger freshmen lead the team in plus/minus with a plus-14 and a plus-15 rating, respectively.
- ▶ McKeough is tied for 24th in the nation for points per game for a defenseman with Geena Prough while Pacholok ranks 34th. Prough is a versatile player who has played both offense and defense for the Badgers this season.
- ▶ The five freshman skaters have contributed 27 points this season, with Brianna Decker missing nine games due to injury.
- ▶ Since Decker's return, the freshman forward has earned six points, including three assists, all of which resulted in an Ammerman goal. Decker is quickly making her presence known scoring eight points (5g, 3a) in only seven games.
- ▶ After two months and 14 games, Alev and Derya Kelter have joined the Badgers. Alev stepped in immediately, after only one week of practice, the freshman saw significant playing time in the Providence series. The twins, who came to Wisconsin as multi-sport athletes advanced to the Sweet 16 with the Wisconsin women's soccer team. Alev earned second-team All-Big Ten honors and was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team with the Badger soccer team.

- ▶ Last season the Badgers won 23 of its games by at least four goals and only two victories were decided by one goal. This season UW has won two of its games by one goal and only won one game by a four-goal margin in the 6-2 win over Wayne State, marking the highest scoring output of the season and the most decisive UW win. The Badgers are 6-1-0 when leading after the first period, and have won eight games when going into the third frame with the lead or tied.
- ▶ Wisconsin has had three penalty shot situations this season. Brooke Ammerman took Wisconsin's fifth penalty shot in program history against Ohio State on Oct. 24. Ammerman was the first Badger to score on a penalty shot. Two weeks later, Robert Morris was granted a penalty shot, where Alannah McCready made the save. On Nov. 28, Providence's Arianna Rigano was granted a penalty shot that Ruegsegger saved. The only time a team scored on UW with a penalty shot was Feb. 14, 2009 when Nina Tikkinen of Minnesota State scored on Jessie Vetter.
- ▶ Wisconsin has participated in two shootouts this season, both in non-league play. UW dropped the first against Wayne State 1-0 in three rounds before dropping a 2-1 shootout in four rounds to Providence. McKeough is the only Badger who has scored for UW this season in a shootout.
- ▶ In the 2-0 season-opening loss, Wisconsin suffered its first shutout in an opener and fell to 8-3 in season openers since its inception in 1999. The loss marks the first-ever against the Fighting Sioux, bringing the all-time record to 25-1-0. The loss was the first shutout to start a season in program history and the first at the Kohl Center since Nov. 24, 2006 against Minnesota Duluth.
- ▶ Ruegsegger had 18 saves to shut out the Fighting Sioux in her first collegiate start. The last Badger to earn a shutout in her first collegiate start was current senior Alannah McCready against Union College on Sept. 29, 2007. McCready, who had appeared in just one game prior to that start, had 14 saves in the 11-0 shutout win as a sophomore.
- ▶ Freshmen did all the work in UW's first win of the season. Decker had Wisconsin's first goal of the season, also marking her first multi-goal game as she lit the lamp twice in UW's 3-0 win. Freshman Lauren Unser scored for Wisconsin in just her second shift as a Badger to cap the scoring for UW, while Ruegsegger played in net.
- ▶ Wisconsin lost eight players from the 2009 championship squad, including its top four leading scorers from a year ago. Six Badgers graduated including Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Jessie Vetter. Wisconsin also lost the nation's leading scorer, Hilary Knight and Meghan Duggan to train with the U.S. Women's National Team.
- ▶ The Badgers first NCAA title came during an Olympic year in 2006 when the Badgers went 36-4-1.
- ▶ Interim head coach Tracey DeKeyser is no stranger to the program, she has been with UW since its inception and has been at the helm of the program twice before as a co-coach with former assistant Dan Koch. DeKeyser is assisted by UW alums, Peter Johnson and Jackie Friesen for the 2009-10 season.
- ▶ Three seniors lead the UW squad, Jasmine Giles, the team captain is assisted by Kyla Sanders and Emily Kranz. All three Badgers are first-time captains but have plenty of experience, suiting up for every game in their three-year career.
- ▶ In preparation for the Olympics, USA Hockey hosted a National Festival Camp, which included 11 former and current Badgers on the 41-player roster. Included on the roster were current student-athletes, Duggan, Knight, sophomore Brooke Ammerman and incoming freshman Brianna Decker.

► The UW schedule is highlighted by the first-ever Wisconsin women's hockey outdoor game. Wisconsin will host Bemidji State out on Camp Randall Stadium on Saturday, Feb. 6 at 2 p.m. for the Culver's Camp Randall Hockey Classic. The game precedes the Wisconsin men's hockey team who will take on Michigan at 5 p.m. Wisconsin will also go up against two teams from the NCAA Frozen Four, Minnesota and Minnesota-Duluth. Wisconsin will also host an exhibition game against Johnson's Team USA on Jan. 5 at the Kohl Center.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

Minnesota Duluth (12-6-0, 8-4-0 WCHA)

► The Bulldogs enter the weekend after sweeping Boston College in a two-game series at Kelly Rink in Boston, Mass.

► Minnesota Duluth only surrendered one goal to BC as they defeated the Eagles 3-0 and 5-1 for the sweep.

► UMD boasts Kelly Wilson, who is ranked No. 2 in the nation for points per game for rookies. The freshman displayed her skills when she finished with a hat trick in the Bulldogs' 5-1 win over BC. Sara Tuominen and Laura Fridfinnson also recorded a goal apiece in the victory.

► In game one against BC, the Bulldogs completed each period with a goal in their 3-0 shutout win. Jennifer Harss finished with 22 saves in net for Duluth to record her third career shutout.

► Minnesota Duluth enters the series as the second contender in the WCHA behind Minnesota. The Bulldogs are led by Emmanuelle Blais and her 26 points this season (11g, 15a). In net, Harss carries a 2.28 goals-against average through 18 games, allowing 40 goals this season.

ABOUT THE SERIES

► The Badgers are 18-23-8 all-time with the Bulldogs. The last time the two faced-off was on March 20, 2009 when Wisconsin outlasted UMD 5-1 to advance to the NCAA title game for the fourth year in a row.

► On Jan. 10, 2009, the top-ranked Badgers fell to No. 3 Minnesota Duluth for its first loss of the 2008-09 season ending its 20 game unbeaten

INTERIM HEAD COACH TRACEY DEKEYSER

Ashton, Ontario native Tracey DeKeyser begins her 11th season at Wisconsin, and for the first time at UW she will lead the squad as the interim head coach while Head Coach Mark Johnson takes a one-year leave to coach at the 2010 Olympics. She has been with the program since the drop of the first puck and has done everything from recruiting to co-coaching the team during her tenure.

The energetic DeKeyser, formally known as Cornell, came to Madison after spending the previous year as girls hockey head coach at Cushing Academy in Ashburnham, Mass. DeKeyser led Cushing Academy to a 24-4-2 mark, the most successful season in the history of the program. Her team captured second during the regular season and advanced to the NEPSAC Championship. Most recently, DeKeyser volunteered as a Team Leader at Canada's Under-22 Selection Camp in August 2005.

DeKeyser's playing experiences include four years at Cornell University, as well as one year as a professional in Switzerland for the SC Reinach Lions. While at Cornell, she co-captained the hockey program her senior season and earned Academic All-Ivy honors both her junior and senior years. Cornell helped the Big Red to the Ivy League hockey title during the 1995-96 season and served as assistant captain during the title run. The one-time Cornell rookie of the year also earned team honors as most inspirational player as a sophomore and senior.

Her stay with the SC Reinach Lions was also successful. The Lions placed second overall in the top Swiss hockey league and were crowned Zurich Cup Tournament Champions during her 1997-98 season.

DeKeyser earned her bachelor of science degree in marine ecology from Cornell University in 1997. In the summer of 2007 DeKeyser earned her M.B.A. in the graduate program at Wisconsin. In addition to her time with the hockey program, DeKeyser played forward for a year with the Big Red women's soccer team and is an avid cyclist who has tried her hand competing in triathlons over the past few years, including the 2006 and 2008 Madison Ironman competitions.

Minnesota Duluth, with 38 points, was selected to finish third. All three of those teams qualified for the NCAA Frozen Four last season. St. Cloud was picked to finish fourth, followed by Ohio State, North Dakota, Minnesota State, Mankato and Bemidji State.

12 BADGERS PLAY IN ALL-STAR VS. USA GAME

► Three former Badgers scored to help the U.S. Women's National Team to a 6-1 victory over the Western Collegiate Hockey Association All-Stars Friday, Sept. 25, at Xcel Energy Center in the opening game of the Qwest Tour. Team USA outshot the WCHA, 46-15, in the win.

► Defensemen Molly Enstrom and Kerry Weiland each tallied a goal along with Jinelle Zaugg-Siergiej while Erika Lawler and Hilary Knight had an assist apiece.

► The four Badgers representing the WCHA, Brooke Ammerman, Jasmine Giles, Mallory Deluce and Brittany Haverstock joined the All-Star squad Thursday evening to prepare for the matchup.

► Altogether there were 12 Badgers between the two benches and Wisconsin head coach Mark Johnson, who is taking a year off to lead Team USA to the Vancouver Olympics.

► Jessie Vetter was in net for the Tour opener stopping 14 shots.

STAR SPANGLED BADGERS

► Two current and six former Badgers were selected to the 23-player roster for the U.S. Women's National Team. Five of the Badgers were part of the 2009 NCAA championship team, which includes Patty Kazmaier Award winner Jessie Vetter, Erika Lawler, Meghan Duggan, Hilary Knight and Angie Keseley. Former Olympian Molly Engstrom is the only Badger with Olympic experience representing Team USA. Kerry Weiland and Jinelle Zaugg-Siergiej have also had plenty of experience on a U.S. Women's National Team.

► Knight and Duggan will sit out the 2009-10 season at Wisconsin to train with the U.S. National Team. Keseley is one of two players selected who has not played on a U.S. National Team prior to the selection.

► Weiland, Engstrom, Knight, Duggan, Vetter and Lawler were members of the U.S. Women's National Team that captured back-to-back gold medals at the 2008 and 2009 International Ice Hockey Federation World Women's Championship.

► The squad, which will be centralized in the Twin Cities, will take part in the Qwest Tour, a 10-game, nine-city domestic tour that begins on Sept. 25 in St. Paul, Minn., and concludes just prior to the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, B.C.
