WHAT'S AHEAD

The Wisconsin women's soccer team will await its fate on Monday, Nov. 9 when the NCAA announces the tournament selections live on ESPNNews starting at 7 p.m. CT. Wisconsin is vying for one of 30 at-large bids to make the 64-team field at the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2005.

► The first and second round of the NCAA Tournament will kick off on Nov. 13 and 15.



LAST TIME OUT

► In the final minute of regulation, sophomore Erin Jacobsen drilled the game-winning goal to clinch the 2-1 victory over Northwestern. Jacobsen added to Paige Adams' goal to clinch third place in the Big Ten and conclude the regular-season on a seven-game unbeaten streak.

► Erin Jacobsen notched her second game-winning goal with the game-winner on Monday while Paige Adams scored a goal in three of the last four games.

BADGER NOTES

► The Badgers clinched third place in the Big Ten with the win over Northwestern. The Badgers' third-place finish in the Big Ten marks the program's best finish since the 2000 season, when UW took second place in conference.

► Wisconsin concluded the regular season on a seven-game unbeaten streak (4-0-3) for its longest streak since 2005 when UW won seven straight games on its way to capturing the Big Ten Tournament title.

► Wisconsin went 5-1-4 in the Big Ten putting them in sole possession of third place, a vast improvement from its 10th place finish last season. UW's 19 points (three points for a win and one for a tie) are the most since the 2000 season when UW finished with a 7-3-0 record (21 points) taking second in the Big Ten.

► The last time UW went through a Big Ten season with fewer than two losses was in 1996, when the team posted a 5-0-2 record.

► Fittingly, Wisconsin finished the season ranked third during Big Ten play for goals, goals per game, assists and assists per game.

► Wisconsin's nine wins matches its win total from a year ago with. The win over Northwestern gives UW the total number of conference wins from the last two seasons combined, five.

► Wisconsin sits at No. 31 in the latest edition of the official Ratings Percentage Index, which was released last Tuesday (Nov. 3) by the NCAA. That rating was before the Badgers earned a 2-1 win over Northwestern.

► Wisconsin's tough non-conference schedule paid off in the end, going 5-1-4 in conference play and posting their best conference record under head coach Paula Wilkins.

► The tie against Penn State snapped the Badgers 12-game losing streak against Wilkins' former Nittany Lions during the regular season. The last time the Badgers tied Penn State during the regular season was Sept. 27, 1996. The Badgers' win over Illinois snapped a seven-game losing streak against the Fighting Illini, dating back to November, 2002.

► Wisconsin went 5-1-4 on its home field this season, dropping just one game to Minnesota in overtime. The Badgers improved to 4-2-1 on the road this season after dropping its first two road and neutral matches.

► Sophomore Laurie Nosbusch leads the Badgers in every category this season after returning as the top leading scorer from a year ago. Nosbusch has six goals and five assists on the season including three game-winning goals. Nosbusch had a five-game scoring streak before the Badgers played to a scoreless draw against Michigan. She has notched points in seven of the last nine games.

► With all of her goals coming during Big Ten play, Nosbusch stands in third in the Big Ten for shots, goals and points during conference play while tying for second in game-winning goals.

► Eight of UW's 18 games have gone into overtime this season, marking the program's most overtimes in a season. The Badgers hold a 2-1-5 overtime record this season after going 1-0-1 last season. Both of the overtime wins came in the second overtime period of 1-0 victories.

► Nosbusch recorded her first career hat trick against Indiana on Oct. 4. It was the teams' first since Taylor Walsh recorded one last year against Vermont and she is only the third Badger to record a hat trick at McClimmon. Erica Handelman (1994) and Amy Vermeulen (2004) were the only priors. Handelman's hat trick also came against Indiana on Oct. 2, 1994.

► Michele Dalton has made 17 starts for the Badgers including six shutouts, with a .775 save percentage and a 1.25 goals-against average.

► The Badgers have had a staggering 123 corner kicks through 18 games this season, including an NCAA-record 23 against Green Bay. The Badgers rank third in corner kicks behind Minnesota (145) and Ohio State (140). Wisconsin tallied 99 corners in 2008.

► Twelve of UW's 19 matches have been decided by one goal, including seven by the score of 1-0. The Badgers have won six and lost one by a score of 1-0. The Badgers have

only scored more than one goal in a game four times this season, going 3-1 when scoring more than one goal.

► UW has scored 20 goals this season and allowed 23, with 15 of those coming from ranked opponents. Nine different Badgers have scored for UW, with four Badgers netting more than one goal. Nosbusch has six while sophomores Erin Jacobsen and Paige Adams each have three. Meghan Flannery and freshmen Alev Kelter have two apiece.

► Wisconsin went 303 scoreless minutes, the longest to start a season in program history, before netting its first goal of the season in its second overtime period against Green Bay. Since its scoreless streak, the Badgers have netted at least one goal in 14 of its last 17 games.

► With a 3-2 win over the No. 19 Hoosiers on Oct. 4, Wisconsin picked up its first win against a ranked opponent this season and first under third-year head coach Paula Wilkins. The last time the Badgers defeated a ranked team was Nov. 3, 2005 against No. 20 Purdue. After dropping its first three games, UW went 1-3-2 against ranked opponents this season.

► The Badgers held teams scoreless through 327 minutes before allowing a goal since its first match of the year against No. 3 Notre Dame. The Badgers held opponents scoreless for 459 minutes at McClimmon, earning four shutouts on their home field to start the season.

► The Badgers have a young squad with a total of nine freshmen and sophomores in the starting lineup. Four Badger freshmen have taken a starting role for Wisconsin, Alev Kelter, Monica Lam-Feist Lindsey Johnson, and Paige Adams.

BADGERS IN THE NCAA

► The Badgers look to make its 15th appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1985. The Badgers hold an 11-14-0 NCAA Tournament record.

► Their most recent appearance was due to an automatic bid after winning the Big Ten Tournament title in 2005. The Badgers lost in the first round to Marquette, 1-0.

► In 1991, UW made it to the finals beating Harford and Colorado College on the way. In the finals the Badgers fell to North Carolina, 3-1. The furthest UW has gotten since then was the second rounds which they have made it to six times.

► Head coach Paula Wilkins is no stranger to the NCAA Tournament. In her six years as head coach at Penn State, her team made it to the tournament every year. The Nittany Lion's tournament record under Wilkins is an outstanding 18-5-1.

NOTEWORTHY

► To be the best, you have to play the best. The Badgers' 2009 schedule included eight 2008 NCAA Tournament participants featuring four conference champions. The varied non-conference schedule included NCAA runners-up Notre Dame and College Cup participants Stanford. Six of UW's opponents were ranked in the NSCAA preseason top 25.

► The Badgers were picked to finish seventh in the Big Ten preseason coaches' poll, which marked Wisconsin's highest appearance since Wilkins took over as head coach in 2007. Penn State was picked as the preseason favorite for the seventh-consecutive year with Michigan State and Illinois closing out the top three spots.

► The Badgers' 27-player roster returns 15 letterwinners, including eight starters from the 2008 squad. Leading the Badger attack, Laurie Nosbusch returns as the leading scorer and team MVP from a year ago. Nosbusch and sophomore Erin Jacobsen will pick up where they left off, returning as Big Ten All-Freshman Team honorees.

► The UW captains are senior Krista Liskevych and junior Taryn Francel in their first season as captains.

► Since 2000 four sister duos have stepped on the field at McClimmon to play soccer, and this season brings a new pair with twins Derya and Alev Kelter. The Kelter twins hail from Eagle River, Alaska, and both look

to play soccer and hockey for the Badgers. Alev was a standout at the 2009 U18/U20 Women's National Team Camp and was a member of the U.S. under-17 national team and played with Team USA in Germany and England. The last Badger to play both soccer and hockey was Amy Vermuelen from 2001-05.

HEAD COACH PAULA WILKINS

Paula Wilkins enters her third season with the Wisconsin women's soccer program. In only two seasons Wilkins has already made giant leaps in rebuilding the program. In her second season, UW finished with a 9-9-1 record finishing the season at .500, and narrowly missed a berth into the Big Ten Tournament. In her first season Wilkins led the Badgers to a 6-11-1 record, marking a three-game improvement overall and a one-game improvement in the Big Ten from 2007 to 2008.

Following the conclusion of her first season Wilkins scored one of the top recruiting classes for 2008, ranking 21st in the nation and marking the highest ranking in UW history. In her first recruiting class, two were named to the 2008 Big Ten All-Freshman Team, Laurie Nosbusch and Erin Jacobsen.

Wilkins has compiled a remarkable 134-39-13 (.755) record, the eighth-highest winning percentage in the nation among active NCAA coaches, in her eight seasons as a head coach. Prior to her start at Wisconsin, Wilkins was the head coach at Penn State for six years. The Nittany Lions earned six NCAA tournament berths, which included two College Cup appearances during her tenure. In addition, Penn State won six Big Ten regular season championships, along with a pair of Big Ten tournament titles.

Wilkins coached nine All-Americans at Penn State, including four-time All-American Christie Welsh, the 2001 player of the year and winner of the prestigious M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Wilkins also recruited and guided Tiffany Weimer, a three-time All-American, two-time Big Ten offensive player of the year and the conference's record holder in career goals.

Wilkins earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science from UMass in 1994 and was a CoSIDA Academic All-American. Wilkins was inducted into the UMass Hall of Fame in 2009. She later received her master's degree in physiology from Penn State. A native of Middletown, Pa., Wilkins was an NSCAA youth All-American at Middletown Area High School. She also played on a national Olympic Development Program team.
