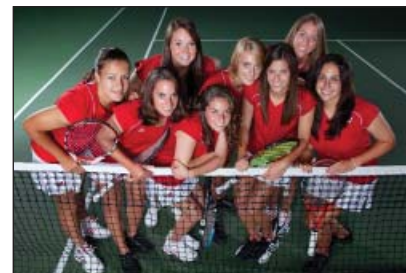
WISCONSIN IN THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

► Wisconsin finished the regular season ninth in the conference standings. The Badgers ended the season in similar fashion to last year with a final 3-7 conference record.

► Eight of the 11 teams in the Big Ten conference finished the season ranked in the top 75 spots in the country, according to the Intercollegiate Tennis Association rankings.

► The Badgers earned conference wins over Michigan State, Penn State, and No. 60-ranked Minnesota. Wisconsin's first conference win came over MSU midway into the season as they shut out the Spartans, 7-0. The win gave the Badgers momentum with a close 4-3 loss to No. 47 Purdue, and a 4-3 win over No. 60 Minnesota for their second win over a ranked opponent on the season.

► UW finished the regular season with a 2-2 record when playing at home against Big Ten teams.

BADGERS SEASON ENDED IN SECOND ROUND OF BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

► Wisconsin women's tennis team advanced to the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament for the second consecutive year, after defeating Minnesota in the first game. The eighth-seeded Badgers took out ninth seed and No. 71-ranked Minnesota in a decisive 4-0 victory to claim their spot in the quarterfinal round against No. 1 seed Michigan.

► Wisconsin got to work early clinching the doubles point with victories at the No. 2 and 3 slot. Alaina Trgovich paired with Hannah Berner to knock out Minnesota's Jackie Sperling and Tijana Koprivica. UW's Jessica Seyferth and Kathleen Saltarelli grabbed UW's first point of the day with the 8-5 victory over Minnesota's No. 3 tandem.

► Angela Chupa kept pace with an easy 6-0, 6-0 victory at the No. 4 spot, while Alaina Trgovich secured her second win at the No. 1 slot with a 6-3, 6-3 victory to put the Badgers up by three.

► Seyferth clinched the match with a three set victory at the No. 5 slot. After dropping the first set, Seyferth came back strong with 6-1, 6-0 sets to clinch the Badgers spot in the quarterfinals.

► In the quarterfinal round, top-seeded Wolverines proved too much for the Badgers as No. 4th-ranked Michigan downed Wisconsin 4-1, ending UW's run in the tournament for the second year in a row.

► Senior Katya Mirnova went out on a winning note, claiming UW's lone singles win against the top-seeded Wolverines. Mirnova finished her UW career strong, winning seven of her last eight matches in singles play.

WISCONSIN SPLITS FINAL MATCHES TO END REGULAR SEASON

► Wisconsin finished off its regular season on the road taking on No. 32 Ohio State and then Penn State. Despite the Badger's early loss, the team came back to end their season on a high note defeating Penn State.

► The Badgers found themselves in a hole early on against the Buckeyes after falling in the Nos. 1 and 2 doubles spots. With an early 1-0 deficit, the Badgers then fell in the Nos. 2, 6, and 3 singles slots for the Buckeyes to take the heartbreaking win.

HEAD COACH BRIAN FLEISHMAN

The Badgers will be led this year by third year head coach Brian Fleishman. He coached the Badgers to a 9-15 record in his second season, moving them up two spots in the Big Ten standings with a seventh place finish.



From 1999 to 2005, Fleishman served as the head coach at Wake Forest where he guided the Demon Deacons to six NCAA tournament appearances and an overall record of 105-68. The 2002 National Wilson/ITA Coach of the Year and 2000 ACC Coach of the Year, Fleishman coached four national champions, including 2002 NCAA singles champion Bea Bielik. He also earned the PTR/Jim Verdieck Award for College Coaching in 2003.

More recently Fleishman served as the Director of the World Class Junior Academy at the Van der Meer Tennis Academy.

- ▶ The remaining Wisconsin players didn't give up despite the next two losses in the Nos. 5 and 4 spots. Alaina Trgovich kept the match interesting after a close 7-6 loss in the first set before falling in the second set, 6-2, to give the Buckeyes the 7-0 win.
- ▶ Despite the tough loss, UW was able to pick itself up to come back for a 5-2 win over Penn State on Sunday afternoon. The Badgers finished out their regular season earning their third conference win.
- ▶ Although Wisconsin started off the day with Mirnova and Chupa edging out the Nittany Lion duo in first doubles, 8-3, UW wasn't able to earn the doubles point, falling in the Nos. 1 and 3 spots to put Penn State up 1-0.
- ▶ Wisconsin fought back to grab four straight wins to clinch the victory. Jessica Seyferth earned the first Badger victory in singles play to tie up the match at one. Seyferth cruised past PSU's Sarah Lotto in the No. 5 slot, 6-0, 6-2. Katya Mirnova followed suit with her 6-0, 6-1 win over Maria Prishlyak.
- ▶ With the small lead in Wisconsin's favor, the remaining Badgers had a little more of a challenge finishing off the match. Angela Chupa took out Denisa Zobeideh, 6-0, in the first set, but the Nittany Lion fought back with a 5-5 and then 6-6 tie in second set. Chupa was able to finished things off though with the 7-6 win.
- ▶ Freshman Hannah Berner earned the close win in the No. 2 singles spot before UW saw its first singles loss on the day in the No. 1 slot. Kathleen Saltarelli then finished off the day with a 6-3, 6-4 win in the No. 6 spot.

KEY NOTES

- ▶ Wisconsin faced 15 ranked opponents this season going 2-13. The Badgers were challenged throughout the season with eight of the 10 Big Ten teams ranked nationally during competition.
- ▶ Wisconsin ended the season 6-3 when winning the doubles point. The Badgers' losses came in close 4-3 battles to UIC, No. 38 Indiana, and No. 47 Purdue.
- ▶ Freshman Hannah Berner has UW's best record with a 14-9 singles mark this season. Berner jumped around in the lineup throughout the season but ended at the No. 2 slot with a 5-4 record.
- ▶ Berner earned her first win over a ranked player during the ITA Tournament, picking up the Badgers lone win against No. 1 Duke. Berner upset No. 63 Monica Gorny 0-6, 6-2, 10-6.
- ▶ Senior Katya Mirnova finished off the season strong winning seven of her last eight matches. Mirnova finished the season with an 11-13 mark and a team-best 6-4 record in conference play.
- ▶ After some shuffling in the lineup, junior Alaina Trgovich emerged as UW's top player. Starting the season in the No. 6 position, Trgovich has played the last two matches in the No. 1 slot going 1-3. Trgovich sits at 10-10 on the season.
- ▶ Wisconsin's winningest doubles pair consists of Mirnova and sophomore Angela Chupa. The duo earned a 9-5 record on the season going 8-4 playing in the No. 2 and 3 slot and 1-1 at the No. 1 slot.
- ▶ Wisconsin served as the host institution for the 2010 ITA Women's Indoor Championship for the 23rd consecutive year. Wisconsin entered the tournament as the only unranked team. However, gained valuable experience going up against the top teams in the country. UW went 0-3 in the outing but saw big wins from Alaina Trgovich, Jessica Seyferth and Hannah Berner.
- ▶ Angela Chupa fell in her match in the No. 1 spot in Wisconsin's match against No. 9 Georgia Tech, but was able to gain valuable experience as she took on the No. 1 player in the country Irina Falconi. Chupa fell 6-1, 6-0, against top-ranked Falconi. Chupa came back last weekend to earn the win in the No. 1 singles spot against Western Michigan's Emily Dudzik.
- ▶ Wisconsin closes out the season with a 9-16 overall record including a 3-7 mark in the Big Ten. With Mirnova as UW's lone senior, the Badgers return seven for the 2011 season.
