



Statement of Philosophy for Intercollegiate Athletics

The athletics program at Wright State University is recognized as an integral part of the total educational process. The athletics program is designed to contribute to the total development of the student-athlete's health, fitness, skill, leadership, and respect for others.

Wright State University's intercollegiate athletic representatives are student-athletes, coaches and staff who are instructed on and dedicated to the principles of fair play and amateur competition as defined by the rules of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. It is the responsibility of the athletics administration and coaches to insure that the entire program is in full compliance with all pertinent rules and regulations.

Objectives of the intercollegiate athletics program at Wright State University are to:

1. provide a form of student activity which is generally accepted part of collegiate life.
2. provide opportunities for the development of unique skills and abilities to a diverse segment of the male and female student population.
3. provide the opportunity and motivation for participation in sports activities for a broad segment of the male and female student population.
4. provide a vehicle which is a recognized builder of morale and esprit de corps among students, staff, and alumni.
5. create an awareness of and support for Wright State University within the region, state and nation.
6. sponsor a breadth of programs which will provide student-athletes with the opportunity to compete on a local, regional, or national level. Within this objective, programs will be funded and expectations generated which will provide each program or individual with the opportunity to achieve success.
7. provide an environment in which the student-athlete will learn the value of fair play, the necessity of obeying rules and regulations, and the necessity to perform up to prescribed academic standards.

COACHING STAFF



Sylvia KAMP

Head Coach

Second Year

Sylvia Kamp, an assistant at the University of Florida for three years, became Wright State's head men's and women's cross country and women's track coach in July, 2006.

Kamp, also a former assistant at Butler and Xavier Universities, helped mentor the UF men's cross country team to their first national ranking in 10 years. The men improved in 2005 and joined the nation's top ten. During her stint at UF, the track teams finished as high as second and no lower than fifth at the National Championships, winning conference and regional titles en route. The cross country teams did well off the field as well, winning athletic GPA and community service awards.

The Fort Wayne, Indiana, native graduated from Centre College in 1999 and from Xavier in 2001 before joining the staff at Butler where she developed 30 Horizon League individual champions, two NCAA qualifying cross country teams, eight NCAA individual track qualifiers, two All-Americans and two Academic All-Americans between 2001-2003. Kamp holds USATF certification in Level I, II and III and now serves on the USATF Coaches Education Committee.

Prior to her stay in Indianapolis, Kamp served as an assistant coach at Xavier in Cincinnati for two years while earning a Master's of Education in Sports Administration. At Centre College, Kamp earned bachelor's degrees in biology and history and was also a four-year member of the track and cross country teams. A team captain her final three years, Kamp earned All-SCAC cross country honors all four years and was named to the NCAA Division III All Southwest Region team in 1998. She set school records in the distance medley relay and the 3,000 meter run. In addition to her activities on the track, she earned several academic awards, served as a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and was the student representative on the Committee on Athletics and Recreation.

Second Year

Fabien Corbillon enters his second season as a cross country and track and field assistant coach at Wright State. Corbillon, a native of France, works with the sprinters, hurdlers, and field events specialists for the Raiders.

Prior arriving at WSU, Corbillon was a part of the staff at Lakehead University in Canada and Florida A & M University. While at Lakehead University, he worked for two years with the sprinters and helped the jumpers and throwers. During his two-year tenure at FAMU, he helped guide the Rattlers to the 2005 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference indoor and outdoor track and field titles. He also helped three athletes reach the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships and guided one athlete to the NCAA Indoor Championships.

Corbillon holds USATF Coaching certification level I and level II in jumps and combined events. He is also an active member of the National Pole Vault Coaches Association and has successfully completed their pole vault curriculum.

Throughout the 12 years of his athletic career, Corbillon experienced different track and field events before specializing in the decathlon, an event that he won at the 1998 Center of France Regional Championships.

In 1999, Corbillon graduated from the Université d'Orléans (France) with the equivalent of a Bachelor's degree in Physical Education. In 2003, he received a Master's degree in Kinesiology with an emphasis in sport psychology from Lakehead University. Corbillon is currently working on a doctorate degree in sports psychology at Florida State University. He brings to WSU more than eight years of sport psychology counseling experience and has helped many athletes in different sports (track & field, basketball, hockey, wrestling, Olympic weight lifting, road bike cycling, and fencing) improve their psychological preparation. Corbillon also teaches a course at Wright State.

Tom Vance is in his fourth year as a volunteer assistant coach for the Wright State track and field team, specializing in the women's pole vault.

A lifelong resident of Fairborn, Vance was a three-year letterman in track and field and football at Baker High School before graduating in 1975. He was a part of the 1974 track team that captured league and district titles.

A volunteer coach with Fairborn at the high school and junior high levels for 15 years, Vance has also volunteered his personal time to other high school individuals striving to make them the best they can be in the pole vault while also stressing the importance of academics.

Vance, who holds a certificate in Construction Management from the University of Cincinnati, is currently a partner in B&B Building Group located in Englewood, Ohio. He and his wife of 27 years, Janet, have one son and two daughters along with four grandchildren and one on the way.
