The Teams

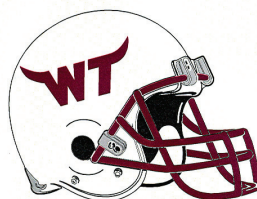
WTAMU is 0-2 on the year, seeking their first win and avoid opening the season 0-3 for the second time in three years. The Buffaloes lost their home-opener last Saturday, Sept. 11, falling to 10th-ranked University of Central Oklahoma, 38-27. WTAMU spotted UCO a 17-0 advantage and never recovered in front of 10,289 festive fans.

Southwestern Oklahoma is also winless on the season, bringing an 0-3 ledger into Saturday's game. The Bulldogs were shutout, 39-0, Saturday at Eastern New Mexico University, as ENMU head coach Bud Elliot collected his 200th career victory. SWOSU has been outscored 79-21 in its three games.

This will be an interesting match-up between WTAMU's top-ranked passing offense in the LSC and SWOSU's top-ranked passing defense in the conference.

New Look Buffaloes

WTAMU is sporting its new helmet logo unveiled this season. The Buffaloes' helmets will remain white, but adorned with a maroon "Horned WT" logo this season {left}, after having the players' numbers on the side of the helmets the past two seasons.



The Buffaloes also have their name on the back of their jerseys this season for the first time since the mid-80s.

Closing In On 400

WTAMU is closing in on its 400th all-time win, as the Buffaloes are currently 395-452-22 (.467), in their 92nd year of play.

The Coaches

Ronnie Jones (Northwestern Oklahoma State, 1978), enters his third season at the helm of the Buffs. Jones is 3-21 (.125) at WTAMU and has a four-year career record of 9-25 (.265), after spending one season directing the Ottawa (Kan.) University program. Jones has 25 years of coaching experience at the NCAA Division I level and in the National Football League. Jones is 0-2 vs. SWOSU.

Jones has been a part of seven collegiate conference championships, one Rose Bowl championship and two National Football League division titles. He has coached teams that have made four NFL playoff appearances.

SWOSU head coach Paul Sharp (Ouachita Baptist University, 1974) is his 19th year at the leash of the Bulldogs. Sharp is SWOSU's all-time winningest football coach with a 92-94-1 (.495) ledger. Prior to SWOSU, Sharp was an assistant coach at Lamar University and before that at his alma mater, Ouachita Baptist.

WTAMU On The Road

The Buffaloes have won two of their last two games in the road-whites, dating back to last season.

WTAMU has lost in its last two trips to Weatherford, dropping last year's meeting, 30-14, and 25-20 in 1999. The Buffaloes are 2-4 all-time at Weatherford since 1992.

Bulldogs and Buffaloes Series

SWOSU leads the all-time series, 10-4-2, winning the last three meetings, including last year's 30-14 victory at Weatherford.

The series began in 1920, and the Bulldogs-Buffaloes series is WTAMU's oldest LSC-opponent rivalry. The teams did not meet from 1936 until 1992, resuming the rivalry in 1992.

Buffaloes Lose To Southwestern Oklahoma, 30-14**

Missed Opportunities Lead to Loss

The West Texas A&M University Buffaloes lost to Southwestern Oklahoma State University Bulldogs, 30-14, Sept. 6 at Weatherford, Okla.

It was a game of missed opportunities for the Buffaloes, as they had several chances, but couldn't capitalize. For example, on the first play from scrimmage, junior tailback Aubrey Lacy busted through for a 23-yard scamper. The WTAMU drive was thwarted by SWOSU's Dustin Wall's interception of a WTAMU junior quarterback Derek Maupin's pass at the 2-yard line.

After the Bulldogs scored on a Danny Howard 13-yard pass from Reade Box, junior wide receiver Anthony Armstrong returned the ensuing kickoff to the SWOSU 40-yard line, only to have that drive stall as well.

SWOSU kicked a 25-yard field goal one second before halftime, to take a 16-0 lead into the lockerroom.

On the second-half kickoff, freshman defensive back Jason Jones stripped SWOSU's Chase Pratt of the ball, and WTAMU recovered at their own 27-yard line. The Buffaloes were able to take advantage, as WTAMU got on the scoreboard on a 16-yard pass from Maupin to Armstrong with 14:00 to play in the third quarter, drawing to 16-7.

However, the Bulldogs rattled off the next 14 points, started by a one-yard run by Box on a busted play on 4th-and-one.

On the ensuing drive, Wall intercepted a Maupin pass and waltzed into the endzone from 14-yards out, to put the Bulldogs up 30-7.

The Buffaloes closed the scoring with 47 seconds left in the third stanza, on a 60-yard catch-and-run for a touchdown from Maupin to freshman wide receiver Canelius Jackson.

Maupin finished 19-46 passing, for 196 yards. Lacy had 11 carries for 53 yards on the night.

Junior linebacker Adam Shaw led the defense, with 14 tackles, including two for loss and blocked one extra point.

SWOSU accumulated 448 yards of offense (278 passing and 170 rushing), compared to 247 yards (196 passing, 51 rushing), for WTAMU.

Junior punter Chad Kennedy had nine punts for a 45.3 yard average, helping out the Buffalo defense by pushing the Bulldogs back.

The Buffaloes committed nine penalties for 68 yards and were 1-of-15 on third down conversions.

About The WTAMU Buffaloes

WTAMU takes an 0-2 record into Weatherford, after a 38-27 loss to #10 Central Oklahoma last Saturday.

WTAMU leads the LSC in passing offense (296.0 ypg) and is seventh in total offense (345.0 ypg).

Leading the offense is the senior tandem of Harlon Hill candidates quarterback Derek Maupin (6-3, 210, Canadian, Texas/Canadian HS) and wideout Anthony Armstrong (6-0, 180, Carrollton, Texas/Newman Smith HS).

Maupin has moved up to No. 3 on the WTAMU career passing list with 5,061 career yards, passing Victor McGee's 4,529 yards from 1981-82. Last year as a junior, Maupin threw for 2,789 yards, a total which by itself would rank ninth on the school career passing list.

Maupin set a new WTAMU and Lone Star Conference record with 43 completions in a game against Texas A&M-Commerce, and also led the nation in passing attempts and was third in completions. In the game against TAMU-Commerce, Maupin also had 447 total yards of offense, the highest output in the LSC last season.

Maupin was 24-42 for 318 yards with three TD and one INT on Saturday against UCO. The 318 yards is Maupin's third-highest passing total in his career and the three scoring strikes ties a career-high.

On the season, Maupin leads the LSC in passing offense (296 ypg) and is second in total offense (307 ypg).

Armstrong was the most highly decorated Buffalo last year, as the wideout collected LSC South Receiver of the Year honors as well as first-team All-LSC South accolades, to go with second-team Daktronics All-West Region and second-team d2football.com All-West Region kudos.

Armstrong had four catches for 56 yards (14.0 ypc) with a long of 27 yards against UCO Saturday. On the season, Armstrong has 12 receptions for 129 yards (10.8 ypc/64.5 ypg).

In the conference statistics, Armstrong ranks second in receptions/game with 6.0.

Junior transfer Jordan Grant (6-2, 195, Del Rio, Texas/Navarro College) had a successful debut in a Buffalo uniform, snaring five catches for 71 yards (14.2 ypc) in the season-opener and added two catches for 22 yards (11.0 ypc) against UCO.

Fellow transfers, sophomore wideout Johnathan Walker (6-1, 180, Mendenhall, Miss./Copiah-Lincoln College) and junior wideout Tonaé Martin (Aledo, Texas/Kilgore College) had big games against UCO. Walker had four catches for 101 yards, including two for 43 and 44 yards respectively. Martin snagged six catches for 46 yards and two TD's.

WTAMU's running game has been sluggish in the first two games, as the Buffaloes have amassed just 98 yards this season (49.0 ypg).

The Buffaloes will look to senior tailback Aubrey Lacy (5-8, 185, Center, Texas/Ottawa Univ.) and junior fullback Dominique Bibben (5-9, 200, Houston, Texas/Alief Hastings HS) to get the running game going this Saturday. Lacy rushed for 727 yards (6.7 ypc/90.9 ypg) last season, and tied for the team-lead in scoring with 60 points on 10 TDs, while Bibben was second on the team in rushing last year behind Lacy with 341 yards on 43 carries for a pair of TDs, with a team-leading 7.9 ypc.

The WTAMU defense has showed dramatic improvement this season, ranking ninth in the LSC in total defense (364.5 ypg).

Senior linebacker Adam Shaw (6-2, 225, Cooper, Texas/Cooper HS) recorded a game-high 12 tackles against UCO and leads the team with 20 tackles (six solo, 14 assists).

Junior defensive end Darrell Lewis (5-11, 225, Muleshoe, Texas/Muleshoe HS) is second on the team with 17 tackles (four solo), including two tackles for loss, tallying both of them in the UCO game.

Senior Chad Kennedy (6-4, 225, Amarillo, Texas/University of Texas-El Paso), a Don Hansen Football Gazette Preseason All-American, had five punts for 231 yards, a 46.2 yards per punt average, including a 68-yarder and a 52-yarder. On the season, Kennedy has punted nine times for 400 yards, for a 44.4 ypp average, ranking second in the conference, with three inside the 20.

Sophomore punt returner Jason Jones (5-9, 170, Killeen, Texas/Killeen HS) had a 66-yard return for a TD against UCO, getting several decleating blocks from his convoy on the way to the endzone. Jones would lead the conference in punt return average, but only has two returns for a 34.5 average, but doesn't have enough to reach the minimum.

About the Southwestern Oklahoma State University Bulldogs

The Bulldogs of Southwestern Oklahoma enter Saturday's match-up 0-3 after suffering a devastating 39-0 loss to Eastern New Mexico last weekend, accumulating a paltry 147 total offensive yards, including just 27 yards rushing. SWOSU is not ranked within the Top 10 in the LSC in any offensive categories, except penalties (fourth, 50.3 penalty yards per game)

Time has been split between two sophomore quarterbacks this year as Ryan Breeze (5-11, 240) has thrown thus far for 20 completions on 43 attempts and a total of 218 yards (one TD and two interceptions). Against Eastern New Mexico, Breeze was 8 of 18 for 80 yards and sacked nine times. Beau Dodson (6-2, 210) is 25 of 50 for a total of 199 yards and five interceptions, and was 5 of 12 for 40 yards last Saturday. Dodson was sacked once and threw two interception passes.

Leading the rushing for the Bulldogs is junior tailback Jimmy Jenkins (5-9, 195) with 110 yards on 41 attempts. Against the Greyhounds, Jenkins rushed for 42 yards on 15 carries for an average of 2.8. Jenkins needs 66 yards to become just the sixth player in SWOSU history to reach the 2,000-yards rushing plateau.

Running the backs for SWOSU are junior wideouts Chase Pratt (5-10, 175) and Danny Howard (6-2, 185). Howard led the team in receptions (four) for just 23 yards and also leads the team in total receiving with 14 catches for 154 yards, averaging 11.0 ypg. Pratt has caught a pass in 22-consecutive games.

Defensively, the Bulldogs are ranked first in the pass defense, fifth in pass efficiency, fourth in total defense and 10th in rushing defense.

Senior middle linebacker Charles Thomas (5-11, 220) leads the team and LSC in tackles with 44 total (16 solo and 28 assisted). Thomas tallied up 15 tackles (six solo and nine assists), with one tackle for a loss of one yard against the Greyhounds.

Senior punter Scott Poole (5-9, 184) leads the Bulldogs in special teams with 18 punts for 687 yards, averaging 38.2 ypg. Poole is sixth in the LSC in punting.

WTAMU's Last Game: UCO 38, WTAMU 27 - Sept. 11, 2004, Canyon, Texas

Buffaloes Bucked By No. 10 Bronchos, 38-27, On Patriot Day

Festive Crowd of 10,289 Watches UCO Jump Out To 17-0 Lead; Maupin Throws For 318 Yards In Loss

The West Texas A&M University Buffaloes spotted the 10th-ranked University of Central Oklahoma Bronchos a 17-point advantage and never recovered in the Buffaloes' 38-27 home-opening loss on Patriot Day Saturday, in front of a festive crowd of 10,289 at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium.

For the second game in a row, WTAMU amassed over 300 yards of offense, but couldn't put enough points on the board for a victory, as the Buffaloes chalked up 361 yards of offense.

UCO proved that their Top 10 ranking is no fluke, as the Bronchos compiled 441 yards of offense, including 295 through the air by quarterback Justin Allgood, who cashed in on his first start of the season by completing 24 of 32 passes with a pair of TD's.

WTAMU senior signal caller Derek Maupin was 24-42 for 318 yards with three TD's and one interception, marking the third-highest passing total in his career. Maupin completed passes to nine different receivers, including four to junior Jonathan Walker who tallied 101 receiving yards, 43 of them on a deep pass in which Walker made an acrobatic catch, outjumping the UCO defender for the ball.

Senior linebacker Adam Shaw registered a game-high 12 tackles to lead the WTAMU defense, which had eight players with five or more tackles, including two tackles for loss by junior defensive end Daryl Lewis.

The teams opened the game like a boxing match begins, with not much action, as the Bronchos went four-plays and out, and the Buffaloes went three-and-out, as senior preseason All-American punter Chad Kennedy boomed a 68-yard punt.

WTAMU dealt the first punch of excitement by recovering a Jarrod Manoy fumble at the UCO 27, giving the Buffaloes prime field position, however they couldn't get a first down and junior kicker Jacob Felton's 39-yard attempt sailed wide right.

UCO then punched back, putting together a seven-play, 78-yard drive, capped by a five-yard run by Darnell Sims, followed by A.J. Haglund's PAT to give the Bronchos a 7-0 lead with 5:29 left in the first quarter.

After another WTAMU punt, UCO compiled a six-play, 76-yard drive, punctuated by a 30-yard scoring pass from Allgood to Jared Meers. Haglund's PAT made it 14-0 with 13:02 on the second quarter clock.

The Buffaloes took the ensuing kickoff and drove just past midfield when Anthony Byrd picked off a Maupin pass at the UCO 30 and darted 63 yards the other way. A WTAMU face-mask penalty on the play gave the Bronchos first-and-goal at the Buffaloes' 3-yard line.

That would be the closest that UCO would get to the goal line, as the Buffalo defense flexed its muscles and pushed the Bronchos backwards. Two plays for a loss and an incomplete pass set up a 24-yard Haglund field goal to make it 17-0 with 7:59 remaining until halftime.

WTAMU had to punt again and Kennedy booted a 52-yarder that was smothered by the Buffalo coverage, nailing UCO return man Chad McGaugh for a one-yard loss.

The Bronchos drove into Buffalo territory, but was denied by the WTAMU defense on a fourth-down, turning the ball back over to the Buffaloes.

WTAMU used the weight of the momentum to go down the field, mainly on Walker's dramatic catch, moving the ball to the UCO 16, culminating in a seven-yard scoring pass from Maupin to junior wideout Tonae Martin. Felton's drilled the PAT to pull the Buffaloes within 17-7 with 22 seconds until intermission.

WTAMU took the second half kickoff and drove to UCO 38, including a 41-yard jaunt by senior running back Aubrey Lacy on a screen pass, but the drive stalled and the Buffaloes had to punt again.

The Bronchos regained momentum with a lengthy 12-play, 87-yard march that ended with a three-yard run by Manoy with 6:56 left in the third stanza. Haglund tacked on the extra point to resume UCO's 17-point cushion at 24-7.

WTAMU responded with a 10-play, 80-yard scoring drive, ending with another Maupin to Martin pass combo, this one covering 10 yards, only to have UCO bounce back with a nine-play, 80-yard drive, resulting in a Manoy four-yard run, his second TD of the night.

Later in the game, the Bronchos took 16 plays to cover 62 yards, ending in a 11-yard pass from Allgood to Zach Edwards to open their biggest lead of the night at 38-14 with 7:33 left in the game.

WTAMU answered on an 8-yard pass from Maupin to Lacy, but Maupin's two-point conversion pass was incomplete, leaving the Buffaloes trailing 38-20 with 4:10 to play.

After a botched return by UCO's Edwards, who downed the fake onside kick at the Bronchos' 5-yard line, the Buffalo defense held strong, forcing UCO to punt.

Sophomore Jason Jones fielded the punt at the WTAMU 34, and had a convoy rolling the other way, being sprung by a decleating block, and 66 yards later hit payturf. Felton kicked the PAT and the Buffaloes closed to 38-27 with 2:24 left.

Felton's pooch-onside kick rolled out-of-bounds, giving UCO the ball at the WTAMU 35, and the Bronchos ran out the clock for the victory, as UCO improves to 3-0 on the young season, as the Buffaloes remain seeking their first win at 0-2.

On The Horizon

WTAMU continues its road trip by heading to Kingsville, Texas to tangle with the 4th-ranked Texas A&M University-Kingsville Javelinas on Saturday, Sept. 25 at 7 p.m. in WTAMU's LSC South opener. The Javelinas' game Saturday in Thibodaux, La., has been cancelled due to concerns related to Hurricane Ivan.
