Lady Buff Soccer Going to NCAA Tournament in Denver

CANYON, Texas -- For the first time since 2004, the West Texas A&M women's soccer team will be heading to the NCAA Division II Tournament. The Lady Buffs will be the fourth seed and will play Midwest Region No.1 seed Metro State in the first round in Denver, Colo., on Friday.

The Lady Buffs, 14-3-1 overall will play at 12 p.m. CST against Metro State for only the eighth time in school history. The Roadrunners are going into the NCAA Tournament after losing in the second round of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Tournament to Fort Lewis. Similar to Metro, WTAMU is also coming off a second round loss in its conference tournament to Texas A&M-Commerce.

In the following match, Lone Star Conference rival and No. 3 seed Central Oklahoma will play second seed St. Edwards. The winners of each match will play at 1 p.m. CST on Sunday.

For the Lady Buffs, this is their fifth time in six year's to make the NCAA Tournament. They have played Metro State the last three times. The match can be heard on KWTS 91.1 and on gobuffsgo.com at 11:45 am.

NCAA Tournament Runs

From 2001 to 2004, the WTAMU women's soccer team made four straight NCAA Tournament runs. In 2003, the Lady Buffs made it to the Sweet 16 as a three seed, but fell to Metro State 1-0, which advanced to the Elite Eight. The only goal in the match was scored at 55:39. Then freshman Sarit Shenar had three shots on the day. In the last three NCAA Tournament matches for WTAMU, it has played Metro State three times, including a shoot out loss to the Roadrunners in 2002, in which they lost on penalty kicks as darkness begin to set.

Regular Season Against Metro State

The all-time record between the two schools is 2-5, with the Lady Buffs winning two of the last three regular season battles. In 2001, WTAMU defeated the Roadrunners 5-1 in Denver. In Canyon the previous year, the Lady Buffs shutout Metro 3-0. However, in 2003 Metro State pulled off the 1-0 win in Denver.

The Winner to Play St. Edwards or Central Oklahoma

On Sunday afternoon, the Lady Buffs or Roadrunners will play St. Edwards or Central Oklahoma in the Sweet 16. WTAMU has not played St. Edwards since the 2003 season in Austin. St. Ed's pulled out the 2-0 victory. In the three previous matches WTAMU shutout the Hilltoppers 6-0 from 2000-2002. Against Central Oklahoma, the Lady Buffs have not won since a 2-0 shutout in 2003. Earlier this season the Bronchos pulled out the 1-0 win in overtime.

Sarit Shenar No Goal Afternoons

This season when the senior forward does not score a goal, the Lady Buffs are 1-2-1. In the tie and win, Shenar had a foot on each of the goals, giving two of her team leading 16 assists. In both losses Shenar was shutout out from giving an assist.

Butch Laufer in the NCAA Record Books

Prior to this season Butch Laufer ranked sixth all-time in the country in winning percentage and 23rd in victories. As of the last match against Texas A&M-Commerce, he has a .725 winning percent and 146 wins.

WTAMU Wins in a Season

With one more win, the Lady Buffs will match their 2003 total for wins, but with two victories WTAMU will tie the all-time school mark for wins with 16. The Lady Buffs have had 16 wins three times, the most recent in 2002.

In 1,020:39 minutes of action between the pipes made 41 saves and amassed nine wins ... Allowed 1.06 goals a game and had three shutouts in 12 starts ... Also earned Lone Star Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 19, for her efforts against St. Mary's and Eastern New Mexico, which included a shutout and seven saves ... Member of a defense that shutout opponents seven times, allowed .088 goals a match and a .079 shot percentage.

1 Sarah Pipkin So. GK San Angelo, Texas

In 623:08 minutes of work, allowed just four goals ... Has a save percent of .909 and 40 saves ... The 40 saves ranks fifth all-time in career accolades at WTAMU ...
