Head Swimming Coach

O. THOMAS JOHNSON (WYOMING '86)



Tom Johnson is entering his ninth season as the head swimming and diving coach at the University of Wyoming. In his first eight seasons, Johnson has not only built the UW program into a yearly contender in the Mountain West Conference, but has given the program world wide exposure after helping guide Scott Usher into the 2004 Olympic Games. There is no doubt that the team has an identity that reflects Johnson's own competitive drive.

Watching Usher compete in the Olympics is one of Johnson's proudest coaching moments. He was right by Usher's side as his bucking horse swim cap raced to a second place showing in the 200-meter breaststroke at the US Olympic Team Trials, earning him a spot on the Olympic team. In support of Johnson and Usher, the Cowboy Joe Club, along with a local business, raised enough money to send Johnson to the Olympic Games where he watched Usher swim to a seventh place finish in the finals of the 200-meter breaststroke. In 2005, he helped guide Usher to the fourth First Team All-America and fifth overall honor of his career. Usher also made the US World Championship team and competed in the 2005 World Championships. He made the US National Team again in

2006.

Last season, Johnson led the men's team to a fourth place finish at the 2006 Mountain West Conference Championships which was especially impressive considering they rebounded from a disappointing sixth place regular season finish. He led a pair of Cowboys to individual MWC Championships and coached 11 men's all-conference performances. For the fifth consecutive year, a Cowboy swimmer won the MWC 200 breaststroke title. He also coached the Cowgirls to a solid 2005-06 finish as they turned in 17 all-conference performances. Following last season, 12 student athletes were named MWC Scholar Athletes and 23 were named Academic All-Conference.

Johnson is a two-time MWC Coach of the Year, as he was named the men's coach of the year following the 2003-04 season and was the women's coach of the year after the 1999-00 season.

Johnson's coaching philosophy emphasizes making student-athletes strong individuals in and out of the pool. "I am goal oriented and success driven," said Johnson. "I want our student-athletes to have the opportunity to graduate from UW with their heads held high and know that they have made a significant impact on this program and at this school."

At Wyoming, Johnson's teams have been honored academically by the College Swimming Coaches Association of America numerous times. Following last season, both teams were recognized as Academic All-America selections for the second consecutive year. Last spring, the Cowgirls combined to achieve the 20th highest team GPA in the nation while the Cowboys achieved the 38th highest team GPA in the country last Fall.

For the first time in his career, Johnson coached a student-athlete to Academic All-American status as Erin Spadinger was named Honorable Mention Academic All-America following the 2005-06 season.

The achievements his teams have made over the past eight seasons are helping Johnson to continue to build the Wyoming swimming and diving program. "Our student-athletes understand where this program is headed and the success it can accomplish and they want to be a part of that," said Johnson.

A native of Camillus, N.Y., Johnson was a four-year Wyoming letterwinner as he swam for the Cowboys from 1982-85. Prior to becoming the head swimming and diving coach at Wyoming in 1998, Johnson was the head coach and program director for the Birmingham Swim League in Birmingham, Ala., which consisted of 220 members from the novice level to Olympic trial qualifiers. He guided the Swim League from 1994 to 1997, and had 16 swimmers go on to compete at the NCAA Division I level across the United States.

After lettering at UW, and ending his swimming career as the school record holder in the 200 breaststroke, Johnson became an assistant coach at Wyoming during the 1985-86 season. In 1987-88, he became the head coach at Columbine High School in Littleton, Colo. The following year, he returned to his native state of New York as the head coach for the Liverpool Jets Swim Club in Syracuse. From 1989-94, he was the head coach of the Fort Collins Area Swim Team.

Johnson earned a number of awards during his coaching career before to coming to Wyoming. He was named Colorado Swimming Coach of the Year in 1993, was selected as a coach for the United States Swimming's Select Camps at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs in 1993, '94, '96 and '97, and was named the Southeastern Swimming Coach of the year in 1996. He has achieved a Level 5 certification by the American Swimming Coaches Association, the highest level of certification and is also a USS and NCAA Division I Level 5 certified coach. Johnson is also a USA Swimming National Team Coach.

Johnson and his wife, Cheryl, a native of Cheyenne, have two children, Tommy and Alexandra.



Diving Coach

Ben Herdt (MINNESOTA '04)

Ben Herdt is entering his third season as the diving coach at the University of Wyoming. In just two years at the helm of Wyoming Diving, Herdt has led the divers to the top of the Mountain West Conference and to the bubble of the national spotlight.

During the 2005-06 season, Herdt led the Cowgirl divers to the most team points at the 2006 Mountain West Conference Championships and the Cowboys to the second most team points. The divers earned four First Team All-MWC honors and six Second Team All-MWC accolades. For his accomplishments, Herdt was named the 2006 MWC Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

Following the 2005-06 regular season, five Wyoming divers competed in the 2006 NCAA Zone "E" Diving Championships and one, Kevin Bretting, missed making the NCAA Championships by just one qualifying spot.

Following last season, both Wyoming teams were named Academic All-America by the College Swimming Coaches Association of America. The Cowgirls achieved the 20th highest team GPA in the nation last spring while the Cowboys achieved the 38th highest GPA in the country last fall. Also, 12 student athletes were named MWC Scholar Athletes and 23 were named Academic All-Conference.

In his first year at UW, Herdt helped five divers qualify for the 2005 NCAA Zone "E" Diving Championships. At the 2005 MWC Championships, he led Ginni van Katwijk and John Lynch each to a First Team All-MWC selection, each on two different boards. Three other divers earned second team honors following his first season.

A native of East Lansing, Mich., Herdt coached the Minnesota Diving Club and the Twin City Diving Club in Minneapolis, Minn., from 2000-04.

He had a very successful diving career at the University of Minnesota where he helped lead the Golden Gophers to three Big Ten Conference Championships. Herdt earned Academic All-Big Ten honors and was named a Big Ten Scholar Athlete. He was also a team co-captain his senior year. Herdt graduated from Minnesota in the Spring of 2004 with a degree in Spanish Studies. He married Holly Hanneman on Sept. 17, 2005 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

Assistant Coach Heidi Voigt (WASHINGTON '96)

Heidi Voigt enters her second season as an assistant coach at Wyoming and her fourth overall season with the UW swimming and diving program. She was promoted to assistant coach in the summer of 2005, after serving as a graduate assistant for the Wyoming swimming and diving program from 2003-05.

In her first season as an assistant coach, Voigt helped lead the UW swimmers to six First Team All-MWC honors and to 11 Second Team honors. She also led her speciality events, the UW distance freestyle, to one First Team All-MWC accolade and to three second team honors. Both teams were also named Academic All-America by the College Swimming Coaches Association of America. The Cowgirls achieved the 20th highest team GPA in the nation last spring while the Cowboys achieved the 38th highest GPA in the country last fall. Following last season, 12 student athletes were named MWC Scholar Athletes and 23 were named Academic All-Conference.

In her two seasons as a graduate assistant, Voigt helped 30 men and 25 women earn sports on the MWC First and Second Teams. In her second season, she helped guide the men's team to their best finish at the MWC Championships in the history of the conference. She helped guide Scott Usher on to the 2004 United States Olympic Team, where he finished seventh in the 200-meter breaststroke. Following the 2004-05 season, both the men's and women's teams were recognized as Academic All-America teams by the CSCAA.

Voigt is a 1996 graduate of the University of Washington, where she was a team captain for the Husky swim team. Prior to coming to Laramie, she coached high school and age group teams in both Seattle and Montana and was named the age group coach of the year for the state of Montana in 2002.

A native of Helena, Mont., Voigt graduated from Capital High School in 1992. She received her masters degree in health and kinesiology from Wyoming in May of 2005. The former Heidi Gray, she married Eric Voigt on Oct. 8, 2005 in Helena, Mont.



Assistant Coach Kelly McClanahan (TENNESSEE '01)

Kelly McClanahan is entering her second season with the University of Wyoming Swimming and Diving program.

In her first season at Wyoming, McClanahan helped lead the UW swimmers to six First Team All-MWC honors and to 11 second team honors. Following her first season, both teams were also named Academic All-America teams by the College Swimming Coaches Association of America. The Cowgirls achieved the 20th highest team GPA in the nation last spring while the Cowboys achieved the 38th highest GPA in the country last fall. Following last season, 12 student athletes were named MWC Scholar Athletes and 23 were named Academic All-Conference.

McClanahan came to Wyoming from the College of Charleston where she spent two years as an assistant swimming coach. Before coaching at Charleston, she spent the 2002-03 year as head coach for the Robindale Woods Swim Team. Prior to that, she spent time with the Knox Central Swim Team and the Colonial Shores Ridge Raiders.

The Chattanooga, Tenn. native swam for three years at the University of Louisville. While at Louisville, she received academic honors all three years of her career and was a part of the fourth ranked team in the nation in GPA among NCAA women's teams.

McClanahan earned a B.S. in Sports Management, with a minor in Business Administration, from the University of Tennessee in 2001. She earned a Masters of Science Degree in Health and Human Performance from Tennessee in 2003.

McClanahan first swam for the Greater Chattanooga Aquatic Club and was a member of the nationally ranked Baylor High School swim team, where she was a three-time All-American. While at Baylor High School, she contributed to four consecutive state championships and to a national qualifying relay team.



Volunteer Assistant Coach Scott Usher (WYOMING '06)

Scott Usher is entering his first season as a volunteer assistant coach at the University of Wyoming. Last season, Usher was a fifth year student assistant with the swimming and diving program while he finished his degree in Criminal Justice.

Usher is without a doubt the most decorated swimmer in the history of the University of Wyoming. In 2004, he became the first Wyoming swimmer to compete in the Olympic Games when he placed seventh in the world in the 200-meter breaststroke. He was a four-time First Team All-American and earned five total All-American honors during his storied career. He was a six time Mountain West Conference Champion and holds the conference and the University of Wyoming record in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke events. During his career at Wyoming, Usher won 35 of 36 dual meet breaststroke races.

He has been a member of the United States National Team since 2004 and has competed in numerous national and international meets. Most recently, in August of 2006 he placed second in the 100 breaststroke and third in the 200 breaststroke at the ConocoPhillips National Championships, securing his spot on the US National Team.

Usher is currently continuing his training while assisting the Wyoming swimming and diving program.
