**THE WEEK AHEAD FOR
 WYOMING SWIMMING AND
 DIVING:**

Senior swimmer Brandon Fischer will make his first appearance at the NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships, on Thursday in Seattle, Wash. Fischer will be racing at the Weyerhaeuser King County Aquatic Center. He will swim the 100 and 200 breaststrokes as well as the 200 individual medley.

Fischer, a native of Livermore, Calif., will begin competition at the NCAA Championships on Thursday, with the 200 individual medley. He has the 57th-fastest 200 IM time in the country of 1:47.91. He will continue racing on Friday, with the 100 breaststroke, in which he enters with the 32nd-fastest time in the NCAA (54.67). He will finish the championships on Saturday, with the event that qualified him for the NAAs, the 200 breaststroke, and enters with the 16th fastest time of 1:55.75.

Fischer is the first Cowboy swimmer to compete at the NCAA Championships since Olympian Scott Usher (2003-05). He becomes the 13th Cowboy to qualify for the NCAA Championships and sixth to qualify in the breaststroke events.

A RECAP OF THE NCAA WOMEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Senior Cowgirl swimmer Kelsey Conci began racing at the NCAA Women's Swimming and Diving Championships in Auburn, Ala. Conci began competition with the 50-yard freestyle tying for 31st with a time of 22.61.

For the second time in as many seasons, Conci earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in the 100-yard backstroke. Conci placed ninth in the 100 back with a time of 52.12. With her second-consecutive Honorable Mention All-America honor Conci becomes the first-ever Cowgirl swimmer to earn back-to-back All-America honors. Her finish also scored nine team points for Wyoming finishing it in 37th place of the 50-team field (Only 50 teams scored at the championships).

Conci earned a spot in the consolation final by placing ninth in the morning's preliminaries, one place out of the championship final. She finished the prelims with a time of 52.36 and moved on to the consolation final. In the consolation final, she touched the wall first (52.16) giving her ninth place overall. Her finals time of 52.16 not only gave her Honorable Mention All-America honors it is also the fastest swim in Mountain West Conference and Wyoming school history.

Conci finished her tremendous Wyoming career at the 2012 NCAA Championships with the 100 freestyle. She finished the 100 freestyle preliminaries in 51st place with a time of 50.01.

A RECAP OF THE NCAA ZONE "E" DIVING

Wyoming Cowboy divers Derek Campbell and Dalton Haas competed at the NCAA Zone "E" Diving Championships on Thursday-Saturday, March 8-10, at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Thursday's competition was on the 3-meter springboard. Campbell finished the competition in 24th place with a mark of 272.60. Haas finished in 27th place with a final score of 253.75.

Freshman Haas made Friday's finals on the 1-meter springboard and finished in 17th place overall with a mark of 539.65. In the 1-meter preliminaries, Haas finished 17th with a mark of 273.90, which put him in the finals. Campbell finished the preliminaries one place out of the finals in 19th with a mark of 267.05. In the finals, Haas finished 17th overall (539.65).

In the platform preliminaries, sophomore Campbell finished in 11th place with a mark of 265.75 earning him a spot in the finals. Also in the preliminaries, freshman Haas finished 16th with a score of 232.70. Campbell went on to the finals and placed 12th with a mark of 527.25.
