### Cowboys Conclude 2005-06 Season in MWC Championship Game, Fall One Overtime Period Short of Third MWC Championship in Seven Seasons and an Automatic Bid to the NCAA Tournament:

The Wyoming Cowboys concluded the 2005-06 season earning a spot in the Mountain West Conference Tournament Championship game before falling to regular-season champion San Diego State in overtime.

Wyoming lost the MWC Championship to SDSU by a score of 64-69 in one overtime. The Cowboys began the tournament defeating No. 2 seed Air Force (57-55) in the quarterfinals. UW then defeated No. 6 seed Utah (60-47) in the semifinals.

The Pokes fell one overtime period short of winning their third Mountain West Conference Championship in the first seven seasons of the Mountain West Conference. It would have been Wyoming's first MWC Tournament title. Winning the tournament championship would have also given the Cowboys an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

### Wyoming's Brandon Ewing Earns MWC All-Tournament Honors as a Freshman:

Current Wyoming sophomore guard **Brandon Ewing** ended the 2005-06 season earning All-Tournament honors at the 2006 Mountain West Conference Championships in his true freshman season.

In addition to Ewing, former senior **Justin Williams** was also named to the five-man All-Tournament team as voted by conference media members.

## 2006-07 Wyoming Cowboys Looking to Build on Strong Finish A Year Ago

By the time the dust had settled on the Mountain West Conference basketball tournament last March in Denver, Wyoming had come within an eyelash of earning its way to the NCAA's Big Dance.

It took a supreme overtime effort by league champ San Diego State to prevent the energized Cowboys from winning the tournament.

While it was an improbable run by the Pokes, it was an indication of the development of several young players during the 2005-06 season, and it gave Cowboy fans reason to be excited about the future of Wyoming basketball.

For the Cowboys to be a conference factor in 2006-07, it will take the continued development and high level of play by the team catalysts—guards Brandon Ewing and Brad Jones. But Head Coach Steve McClain will have to reshape the frontcourt with a mixture of two seniors, young inexperienced returnees and newcomers if the Cowboys are to improve their station in the league.

Six lettermen return from last year's outfit that finished 14-18 overall and 5-11 in MWC play before putting together the outstanding conference-tournament run. At home, the Cowboys were 9-8 and 3-5 in conference play. On the road, they were 2-9, and 2-6 in MWC road games. They were 3-1 in neutral-site games for the season.

After a promising beginning to the conference campaign—the Cowboys posted a 4-2 league start—that included home wins over New Mexico and Air Force and a road victory over archrival Colorado State in Ft. Collins, things went sour. Wyoming lost nine of its last 10 regular-season games, including the final six in a row.

But that record was somewhat misleading. Nine of 18 losses were by six points or less, including six by four points or fewer, four by two points or fewer, and three overtime defeats. Amazingly, 15 of Wyoming's 32 games were decided by two possessions or less.

McClain will have to direct his team without six departed lettermen including one of the school's greatest defenders of all time, Justin Williams.

The Cowboys will greatly miss Williams, whose presence in the middle of their defense was a powerful force. As a senior, he led the MWC in blocked shots and was ranked second in rebounding. He set a Wyoming single-season record with 5.43 blocked shots per game. He became only the second player in Cowboy history to surpass 200 career blocked shots. He completed his career with 244 blocked shots.

Despite losing Williams and those lettermen, McClain is excited about the new season, his ninth as head coach at Wyoming.

"Any time you return a backcourt like we are, there is a comfort level," he says. "We also have a couple of seniors and some young players who went through a lot and got better by the end of the season. We like our new players, and think they will fit in well."

McClain and his new team were able to get an early start to the season by taking advantage of the NCAA's exemption rule that allowed the Cowboys to begin practice in early fall, and play four exhibition games in Canada.

"There's no question that helped us," McClain says. "It gave our team an opportunity to play games, but it gave us a chance to come together chemistry-wise. It was 14 practices and four games to get better before we ever began preseason practice and the regular season. It was a big help.

"It gave our veteran players a great opportunity to mesh with those who hadn't had that much experience, as well as our new players. I think it will prove invaluable for us."

The Cowboy roster includes two seniors who really do not have senior experience. Both Chris Anderson (6-8, 210 forward) and Daaron Brown (6-9, 250, forward/center) were transfers who logged a lot of bench time due to injuries. They will be counted upon heavily to rebound and score. Both appear healthy and ready to have banner senior seasons. Anderson's key contributions to the Cowboys as a junior came as a defender and as the team's second-leading offensive rebounder. This will be his third season with the Cowboys after transferring from Eastern Utah Community College.

Brown was expected to provide the Cowboys with a physical presence inside last year, but back surgery forced him to miss the final 11 games of last season.

The junior class includes Jones, and two transfers, guard-forward James Spencer (6-4, 195) and forward Joseph Taylor (6-8, 210). Playing both one and two guard positions, Jones continued to improve as the season moved along, developing into a dangerous offensive and defensive force by the end of the campaign.

Not only did he reduce his turnovers, but he utilized his quickness and uncanny ability to penetrate opposing defenses to the point where there was virtually no defense he couldn't break down. He scored 20 points in the MWC semifinal victory over Utah, and concluded his first year at Wyoming with 15 points in the championship game vs. San Diego State. At six-foot even, he was equally impressive at rebounding the basketball, pulling down 11 against Air Force in the opening tournament victory. He grabbed six or more bounds in 11 games during the season. He finished his sophomore season as the Cowboys' third-best rebounder, with 4.5 per game. He was ranked 19th in the league.

Spencer and Taylor were teammates at L.A. City College before making the jump to Division I and Wyoming. Spencer is a shooting guard-small forward who played two seasons at L.A. City. He averaged 13.9 points a game there as a sophomore. He led the team in minutes played at 30.8 per game. He played his high school ball at Stoneridge Prep in Tarzana, Calif.

Taylor earned First Team All-Conference recognition as a sophomore at L.A. City. He also was named "Defender of the Year" among all California junior college players. He averaged 9.9 points, 9.8 rebounds and 2.8 blocked shots last season. He also ranked second on his team in assists. He shot 59.1 percent from the field.

Ewing tops the sophomore class, and should be one of the premier players in the Mountain West. He was nothing short of sensational during his first year as a Cowboy. He surpassed two pretty good Mountain West names by breaking Brandon Heath's (San Diego State) freshman scoring record in all games (423 points to 413), and Andrew Bogut's (Utah) freshman scoring record in conference games only (255 to 182). He was the league's leading freshman scorer in conference play, averaging 15.9 points per game versus conference opponents to rank fifth in league games among all MWC scorers. In all games, Ewing averaged 13.2 points per game to rank ninth in the MWC. He also ranked fourth in free-throw shooting (.792), eighth in assists (2.78 per game) and eighth in steals (1.56 per game). Against conference opponents, he scored in double figures in 16 of 19 games. His three-game run in the tournament was even more impressive, scoring 12 vs. Air Force, 17 vs. Utah and 22 vs. San Diego State for an average of 17 per game.

"I think the play of Brandon and Brad during the tournament proved that they could be one of the best backcourts in the Mountain West, and maybe the country," McClain says. "They were two young guys who were thrown into the starting lineup in their first year of Division I basketball, and who were driven to improve. I never saw them fail to leave it all on the court, and by the end of the season they were something."

The other two Cowboy sophomores are both "biggs" in Ike Okoye (6-8, 210) and Bienvenu Songondo (6-10, 220). Okoye appeared in 20 games as a true freshman, starting three. He scored nine points against San Diego State in early March, and scored four more against the Aztecs in the tournament game. He is a young power forward with a huge upside.

Songondo played in eight games last season as a redshirt freshman. His high game was 14 points early in the season against CU-Colorado Springs. He enters the season as healthy as he has been during the past two years. He has battled knee problems but appears stronger and more ready to take on the rigors of the long season.

There are two redshirt freshman, center Travis Nelson (6-11, 235) and forward Ryan Dermody (6-8, 205), who will become eligible at the beginning of the second semester. Nelson is a post-player whom the Cowboys are counting on to provide productive minutes during his second season in the program. Dermody is a transfer from the University of Colorado whom McClain hopes will provide an additional perimeter shooter when he becomes eligible.

The head coach is very high on his two true freshmen, Aaron Henson (6-6, 215) and Eric Platt (6-5, 205). Henson is a shooting guard-small forward from Santiago High School in Corona, Calif. He averaged over 20 points per game as a junior and senior. "He is a combination player," says McClain, "who can play either the shooting-guard or small-forward positions. He is probably more of a three. He is an athlete who can run the floor, and that fits into our system very well."

Platt is a shooting guard from Kelly Walsh High School in Casper. He was an Honorable Mention All-American and an All-Stater. He became the first sophomore in Kelly Walsh history to earn All-State honors. "Eric can really shoot the basketball," McClain says. "He is a great addition to this program because he plays the way we want to play."

McClain believes this group will be able to play faster, which is how he likes to play. "I think this group will be able to score," he says. "Teams are going to have to defend us, and stop the penetration of our guards which will make our inside play better."

"As always we will be working on defense and rebounding. There is no doubt our guards will be able to defend and rebound. But we have to improve our rebounding and defense down low. From what we saw in Canada, I think we can do that. Brown and Anderson will be big keys for us in both of those areas."

The schedule will be difficult as usual, that's how McClain likes it. This year's slate will feature four home games against opponents that earned bids to the 2006 NCAA Tournament—Alabama-Birmingham (UAB) and Montana, Air Force and San Diego State. In addition, 2006 NCAA Sweet 16 participant Wichita State will play in the Wyoming Shootout in Casper. The Pokes will play a sixth NCAA Tournament team on the road at Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

The Cowboys will resume their series against regional rival Colorado on the road in Boulder. The Buffs are coming off an appearance in last season's NIT. Wyoming and CU haven't met since the 1998-99 season, when McClain, in his first year, led the Pokes to a 67-66 win at Laramie.

The week before Christmas, the Pokes will fly to Honolulu, Hawaii, for the 43rd Annual Outrigger Hotels Rainbow Classic. Wyoming's first-round opponent in Hawaii will be the Nebraska Cornhuskers, who are coming off a season that saw them earn a berth in the 2006 NIT. Other teams participating in the Classic include Charlotte, Creighton, Houston, San Francisco, Valparaiso and host Hawaii.

"I think when you look at the opening week of the regular-season, it gives you a good indication of just how strong this schedule is," McClain says. "We host Boise State, Montana and UAB in the first week."

### **McClain's Evaluation by Position**

#### **One (Point Guard): Brandon Ewing, Brad Jones, Eric Platt**

"A couple of these guys can play either the point or the two spot. Certainly we have seen that both Brandon and Brad can play both. In Canada, Brandon started where he left off at last year's tournament. He is a leader on the court just like he was at the end of last season. He is a year older so he has a better feel for what works. He is shooting the ball better, and has been more consistent from the perimeter. He has a chance to be one of the great players in our league. He is an outstanding young man, who has a lot going for him. There is no doubt he is a crowd favorite.

"Like Brandon, Brad has a tremendous work ethic. He spent the summer working on his shot. I think he has a lot more confidence in his shooting now. He is as difficult to defend as any guard you will see. He has the great knack of knowing when to penetrate. He worked hard on cutting down his turnovers, and by the end of the season he did that. I don't think there are very many better rebounding guards, especially at this size. He has a tremendous knack for that. Now that he is shooting the ball better, he will be even more difficult. He and Brandon are a great one-two punch.

"Eric is a guy who worked very hard over the summer, and changed his body with that hard work. He has a great feel for the game. He's smart and has a good understanding of what we want done. He is an excellent shooter, and the kind of guy who wants to take the big shot because he believes he can make it. I think he will make a lot of big shots for Wyoming. He is a good defender. He knows how to play the game."

#### **Two (Shooting Guard): Aaron Henson, Eric Platt, James Spencer**

"We have a lot of guys who are interchangeable, especially at the two-three spots. A lot of guys can play both.

"Aaron is a very hard worker, who can shoot and defend. The adjustment from high school to college has been a little bit tougher on Aaron because he couldn't spend the summer here. By January he could be very effective coming off the bench. He has to adjust to the speed of the game, and he is doing that. He is a good, big guard. He is an outstanding defender, and a very good rebounder because of his size (6-6). I think he is going to be a very good player in this program.

"There is a tremendous upside to Platt. He has such a great feel for the game that I believe he will be ready, and he can contribute much earlier than the other new guards. He has a lot of work to do, there's no doubt, but he is getting better each day. I think he has an excellent chance to be a very good player in this program.

"James is a guy who can really shoot the basketball and score. We think he is going to be an outstanding scorer in transition especially shooting the ball as a trailer. He is the kind of two guard who can thrive in the way we want to play. He can post and shoot the three. He has excellent strength. He showed us in Canada that he can score. He scored in double figures in three of the four games including 29 in one game. We can play faster than we have been thanks to players like him. He certainly has to adjust to this level. His challenge will be defense and rebounding. He will get better at both, and once he does, he can be a key contributor to this team."

**Three (Small Forward): Chris Anderson, Ryan Dermody, Ike Okoye**

"We feel good about what these guys can bring to the small forward position. There are a lot of interchangeable parts here, as well. We will be even better at this spot when Ryan becomes eligible for the second semester. These guys can run the court, and I think they will be able to score. What we need from them is rebounding and defense.

"Because of injury, we held Chris out of the games in Canada. But he is now 100 percent, and he needs to play like he did at the end of last season. He became very solid down the stretch and really helped us. He needs to carry that over. He can score, and run the floor. He needs to get low and play strong. We need Chris to be a better defender, and I think that will happen. If he becomes a better defender, he will be a better rebounder. We need him to do both.

"Ryan will be eligible at the semester, and he has shown in practice that he can really stroke it. He has a very good mid-range game, and he can get to the rim. He has a very good feel for the game. We think he can be a very good addition to our wing game. Like Chris, he needs to become more committed to being a good defender, and that will help his rebounding. We are anxious to get him on the floor. He can help us.

"Ike is one of those interchangeable parts for us. He can play here, and he can play the four. We will ask him to play both. He played very well in Canada, as well as he has since he came to Wyoming. He is a key for us, and we are asking a lot of him. He played a limited amount of minutes last year, but at times we saw flashes of what he can become. He needs to slow down and let the game come to him, and he needs to really concentrate on being a good defensive player. We expect him to be a big factor for us either at the three or the four."

**Four (Power Forward): Daaron Brown, Ike Okoye, Bienvenu Songondo, Joseph Taylor**

"A couple of these guys, probably Daaron and Ike could see time here as well as at the five spot. We expect to see Daaron at both positions more than Ike.

"Daaron is a big, physical player who brings a lot to the floor. He is a guy who can score inside as well as defend and rebound. He has done a tremendous job of coming back from back surgery. He played very well on the Canadian trip. I have been very impressed with how hard he has worked on his conditioning. It is not easy for a man of his size to come back from back surgery. He has done it very well. He is a hard guy to guard in the middle. He has a nice little jump hook, and he can go to the basket effectively with that big body. He will have to rebound better for us than he did a year ago. I would expect that we will play him at the five, more than we will here, but there will be times when he plays the four."

"The Canadian trip really helped Benny. He showed us he could be productive. His biggest challenge was overcoming his lack of confidence in his surgically-repaired knee. He seems to be much more confident with it, and that will really help him contribute. He certainly feels more comfortable running and jumping than he did last year. He has improved his strength which is a key for him. He needs to slow down a little bit, and not rush things so much. We look for solid minutes from him.

"Joseph is one of the new players who really benefitted from the Canadian experience. He is a very good athlete, who can shoot effectively from 15 to 18 feet. He got into foul trouble in Canada which was a great learning experience for him. I think he has made a good, consistent adjustment to this level. We expect him to be a solid defender for us, and a good shot-blocker. He could really give us a lift in that area. I fully expect him to see considerable minutes for us."

**Five (Center): Daaron Brown, Travis Nelson**

"If things go according to plan, Brown will start at the post position for us. I think he will be hard to guard in there, and I believe his size will allow him to keep people off the low block defensively. He has the kind of displacement factor that a team needs in that spot. He may work at four every now and then, but the five spot will be his home.

"Travis is a young player who has come a long way. He is a redshirt freshman who plays very hard. He played in two games in Canada and showed great improvement. He has worked hard at becoming more physical, and he is getting there. But he has a ways to go. We feel he has a great future in the program. He made great strides last year, and he is only going to get better."

**Defense, Defense, Defense:** The Wyoming Cowboys ranked **No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference** and **No. 36 in the nation** in field-goal percentage defense, allowing opponents only **40.4 percent shooting** from the field.

**In 17 out of 32 games this season, Wyoming held its opponents to 40.0 percent shooting or less from the field.** In the games that UW held its opponent to 40.0 percent shooting, Wyoming posted a **11-6 record**. Here are Wyoming's opponents' game-by-game shooting statistics for the 2005-06 season.

**Cowboy Guard Tandem of Ewing and Jones Return in '06-'07 After Spectacular Performance in 2006 MWC Tournament:** One was a sophomore the other a true freshman, both were in their first seasons playing for the Wyoming Cowboys and together they formed one of the most exciting and effective backcourts in the Mountain West Conference a season ago.

Now junior **Brad Jones** and sophomore **Brandon Ewing** played a spectacular three games at the 2006 Mountain West Conference Tournament. Jones grabbed 11 rebounds in the Pokes' quarterfinal win over Air Force. He recorded his second career 20-point game with 20 versus the Utah in the semifinals, and he scored 15, including two free throws at the end of the second half to send the championship game to overtime versus San Diego State.

Ewing began the tournament with 12 points in the quarterfinal win over Air Force in the quarterfinals. He scored 17 points in UW's semifinal win over Utah, and he concluded the tournament with 22 against the San Diego State Aztecs in the championship game.

The two not only combined for 92 of Wyoming's 181 total points (50.8 percent) in the three games of the tournament, but they provided the leadership that lifted the Cowboys to within one overtime period of an NCAA Tournament berth.

The other remarkable aspect of their play last season is that they were interchangeable. They both handled the ball well enough to play the point. They both were also very effective scorers from the shooting-guard position.

**Cowboys to Host Four NCAA Tournament Teams in Laramie and NCAA Sweet 16 Member Wichita State in Casper:**

The 2006-07 Wyoming Cowboy Basketball schedule will feature four home games against opponents that earned bids to the 2006 NCAA Tournament. In addition, 2006 NCAA Sweet 16 participant Wichita State will play in the Wyoming Shootout in Casper, Wyo., on Dec. 9, and the Pokes will play a sixth NCAA Tournament team on the road in Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

The four NCAA Tournament teams to visit Laramie this coming season will include non-conference opponents Alabama-Birmingham (UAB) and Montana (Nov. 15). Mountain West Conference foes Air Force and San Diego State are the other two NCAA Tournament qualifiers that the Pokes will host in the Arena-Auditorium. UAB will play at UW on Nov. 18 and then four days later (Nov. 22) the two teams will meet in Birmingham, Ala.

Wyoming will resume its series against regional rival Colorado on the road in Boulder (Nov. 26). The Buffs are coming off an appearance in last season's NIT. UW and CU haven't met since the 1998-99 season, when first-year Wyoming head coach Steve McClain led the Cowboys to a 67-66 win in Laramie.

The week before Christmas, the Pokes will fly to Honolulu, Hawaii, for the 43rd Annual Outrigger Hotels Rainbow Classic. Wyoming's first round opponent in Hawaii will be the Nebraska Cornhuskers, who are coming off a season that saw them earn a berth in the 2006 National Invitation Tournament (NIT). Other teams participating in this year's Rainbow Classic include: Charlotte, Creighton, Houston, San Francisco, Valparaiso and host Hawaii.

UW will return to the mainland and travel to Wisconsin-Milwaukee, to wrap up the non-conference schedule on Dec. 27.

The 2006-07 schedule carries a very definite regional flair, with not only Boise State, Colorado and Montana, but also Montana State and Denver on tap.

Conference play will see the Mountain West Conference again play primarily on Wednesdays and Saturdays, with some Tuesday night games added into this year's schedule. Wyoming opens MWC play on Jan. 3 at San Diego State. The first conference home game will be played Jan. 10 versus UNLV.

All total, the Cowboys will face six NCAA Tournament teams and three NIT teams from a year ago for a total of 13 games against teams that reached postseason in 2006.

**Who was the Mountain West's Top Freshman Last Season -- Making the Case for Brandon Ewing:**

The 2005-06 season saw a number of great freshmen performers. Among those top MWC freshmen was Wyoming's **Brandon Ewing**.

Here are some of the accomplishments of Ewing last season.

- Ewing broke Andrew Bogut's Mountain West freshman scoring record of 182 points against conference opponents. Ewing scored 255 points this season in conference play.
- Ewing was the MWC's leading freshman scorer in conference play, averaging 15.9 points per game.
- He ranked No. 5 in conference play among all MWC players in scoring at 15.9 per game.
- He was named Third Team All-Conference as a freshman.
- The freshman ranked No. 3 in MWC play in assist-to-turnover ratio, handing out 1.37 assists for every 1.00 turnover he committed.
- Against conference opponents, he has scored in double figures in 16 of 19 games, including scoring 22 versus San Diego State in the MWC Championship Game, 17 against Utah in the semifinals of the MWC Tournament and 12 versus Air Force in the quarterfinals.
- He averaged 17.0 points in the MWC Tournament and was one of only five individuals named to the All-Tournament team.
- He scored 20 or more points seven times this season -- six of those 20-point games came against conference opponents.

**The Nation's Best -- Cowboys Rank Nationally in Three Team**

**Categories a Year Ago:** In the NCAA statistical rankings for the 2005-06 season, the Wyoming Cowboys were ranked among the nation's top teams in three key statistical categories -- blocked shots, rebounding margin and field-goal percentage defense.

Wyoming ranked **No. 4 in the nation in blocked shots (6.91 bspg)**, **No. 35 in field-goal percentage defense (.404)** and **No. 49 in rebounding margin (+4.0)**.

**Wyoming was 5-6 last season in MWC games decided by six points or less.**



**Freshman Brandon Ewing Was Outstanding in Conference Play -- Ranked No. 5 in MWC in Scoring:**

Wyoming true freshman guard **Brandon Ewing** had an outstanding freshman season in 2005-06. The native of Chicago averaged 13.2 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game, and led the Cowboys in scoring.

**At the beginning of conference play, Ewing took his scoring to a new level, averaging 15.9 points per game to rank No. 5 in the MWC.**

**In conference games only, he not only ranked No. 5 in scoring, but he ranked No. 3 in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.4 assists for every 1.0 turnover), No. 7 in assists (3.0 assists per game), No. 7 in steals (1.7 steals per game) and No. 10 in free-throw percentage (.762).**

Ewing broke the MWC single-season freshman scoring records for all games and for conference games. **Ironman Ewing Led the Pokes in Starts and Minutes Played as a True Freshman:** Not often do you find a true freshman who leads a college basketball team in games started and minutes played, but Wyoming freshman **Brandon Ewing** did just that for the Cowboys last season. Ewing was the only Cowboy to **start all 32 games** a year ago. He also **averaged 35.2 minutes per game** to lead the Pokes in that category.

**Brandon Ewing Explodes for 25 Second-Half Points Versus Utah:** In his highest scoring output in a single half, Wyoming freshman **Brandon Ewing** exploded for 25 second-half points at Utah on March 4, 2006. He scored all 25 points in the last 11:45 of the game. In the last 11:45, Ewing hit 7 of 10 field goals, including 4 of 6 from three-point range and 7 of 8 from the free-throw line for 25 points.

**2006 MWC Quarterfinals, March 9**

**Cowboys Get Back on Winning Track With Outstanding Performance**

**Versus Air Force:** The Wyoming Cowboys got back on the winning track Thursday night, March 9 in posting a 57-55 win over No. 2 seed Air Force in the quarterfinals of the 2006 Mountain West Conference tournament.

Here are some of the highlights from Wyoming's victory.

- Wyoming became the first No. 7 seed in the seven-year history of the Mountain West Conference Tournament to win a quarterfinal game.
- The Cowboys shot a season best 95.7 percent from the free-throw line (22 of 23).
- UW held Air Force to only 39.1 percent shooting from the field. The Falcons entered Thursday's game shooting 48.6 percent for the season.
- Wyoming also held Air Force to only 25.0 percent shooting from three-point range. Air Force came into the game shooting 40.5 percent from three.
- UW did not allow the Falcons a field goal in 12:52, beginning with the final 7:59 of the first half and first 4:53 of the second half.
- Wyoming allowed the Falcons to a season low 18 first-half points.
- The victory broke a six-game losing streak for the Cowboys to end the 2005-06 regular-season.

**2006 MWC Semifinals, March 10**

**Getting It Done on Both Ends of the Court Versus Utah in MWC**

**Tournament Semifinals:** Continuing their winning ways, the Wyoming Cowboys defeated Utah 60-47 on Friday night, March 10 in the semifinals of the 2006 MWC Tournament. Despite being swept in the regular-season series by the Utes, Wyoming posted a convincing 13-point win over Utah to advance to the championship game versus regular-season MWC Champion San Diego State.

Wyoming was impressive on both ends of the court against the Utes, as is evidenced by the fact that:

- Wyoming shot a season high 59.0 percent from the field -- 59.1 percent in the first half and 58.8 percent in second half.
- UW's defense held Utah to only 26.9 percent shooting from the field, which was a season low by a Cowboy opponent.
- Wyoming's 14 blocked shots as a team was a season high.
- Justin Williams notched the first triple-double of his Wyoming career with 10 points, 15 rebounds and 12 blocked shots.
- Williams 12 blocked shots set a new University of Wyoming and Mountain West Conference single-game record. Williams held the previous MWC record of 11 blocks versus BYU on Feb. 18. He also was tied with Theo Ratliff for the school record.
- Brad Jones recorded the second 20-point scoring game of his Wyoming career with 20 versus Utah.

**2006 MWC Championship Game, March 11**

**Pokes Push MWC Regular-Season Champion San Diego State to Overtime Before Falling 64-69:**

Appearing in their first Mountain West Conference Tournament Championship game, the Wyoming Cowboys faced MWC regular-season champion San Diego State to overtime before falling 64-69.

The closeness of the game was evidenced by the fact that their were 17 ties and 14 lead changes. Wyoming's largest lead of the game was four points. San Diego State's largest lead was seven.

The Cowboys' Brad Jones hit two free-throws with seven second remaining in regulation to tie the game at 56-56 and force overtime. UW then built a four-point lead in overtime, 62-58, with 2:21 remaining. But the Aztecs would outscore the Pokes 11 to two in the final 2:21 to capture the 2006 MWC Tournament title.

Several factors contributed to Wyoming's strong performance in the championship game.

- The Cowboys held San Diego State to only 28.8 percent shooting from the field. That was the second lowest shooting percentage by a Wyoming opponent all season. The lowest shooting percentage by a UW opponent came the night before versus Utah. The Utes shot only 26.9 percent from the field.
- Brandon Ewing led all scorers in the game with 22 points. It marked Ewing's seventh 20-point game of his career.
- Brad Jones added 15 points against SDSU, after scoring 20 the night before in a 60-47 win over Utah.
- For the second consecutive night, Justin Williams pulled down double-figure rebounds, with 16. He had 15 the night before against Utah.



**Chicago Point Guards Have Been Good to the Cowboys:**

For four seasons from the 2001-02 season through the 2004-05 campaign, Chicago native **Jay Straight** of Dunbar High School started at point guard for the Cowboys. During that four-year span, Straight helped lead Wyoming to a combined 69-50 (.580) record, the Second Round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament and the Second Round of the 2003 NIT. Straight concluded his Wyoming career ranked No. 10 in career scoring (1,550 points), No. 2 in career assists (453) and No. 6 in career steals.

No sooner had Straight completed his eligibility and moved on to play professionally in Israel last year, than a true freshman point guard, from where else -- Chicago, arrived in Laramie to take his spot. Wyoming's new point guard is sophomore **Brandon Ewing** of Julian High School. All Ewing accomplished in his first season as Wyoming's point guard was start every game for the Cowboys during the 2005-06 season. He earned Third Team All-MWC honors, and led UW in scoring (13.2 points per game), minutes played (35.2 minutes per game) and steals (1.56 spg). He ranked second on the team in free-throw shooting (79.2 percent) and assists (2.78 apg). He also ranked fifth in rebounding (3.47 rpg). **In conference play, he led UW in scoring, averaging 15.9 points per game to rank No. 5 in the Mountain West.**

**Chicago Connection -- Part Two:**

Of course it is not only Chicago point guards that have benefitted the Wyoming Basketball program in recent history. Former forward **Justin Williams** won two consecutive **MWC Defensive Player of the Year** awards over the past two seasons. Last season, Williams led the MWC in rebounding (11.0 rpg) and blocked shots (5.43 bspg). Williams played his high school basketball at Thornwood High School in the Chicago suburb of South Holland, Ill.

**Chicago Cowboys Come From Great High School Programs:**

Wyoming sophomore **Brandon Ewing** and former Cowboy **Justin Williams**, who signed as a free agent with the Sacramento Kings following his senior season of 2005-06, both came from great high school programs in Chicago. Ewing played at Julian High School in Chicago, where as a high school freshman he played on the same team as former Duke University guard **Sean Dockery**.

Williams played at Thornwood High School in the Chicago suburb of South Holland, Ill. Among his Thornwood teammates was current NBA player **Eddy Curry**.

**Wyoming Ranked the No. 42 Best College Basketball Program of All Time by Street & Smith's:**

In the fall of 2004, Street & Smith's published a special college basketball magazine entitled: **Greatest College Basketball Programs of All Time.**

In those rankings, the **University of Wyoming was ranked No. 42.** There are currently 330 NCAA Division I men's basketball programs in the country.

The rich history of Wyoming Basketball includes: the 1943 NCAA Championship team led by the inventor of the jump shot Kenny Sailors and Basketball Hall of Fame coach Everett Shelton; the 1987 Wyoming squad led by Fennis Dembo and Eric Leckner that earned its way to the Sweet 16; and the 2002 Cowboy squad that advanced to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament after upsetting No. 6 ranked Gonzaga.

**Doctors of Dunk:** The Wyoming Cowboys averaged **2.16 dunks per game** in the 2005-06 season, while UW opponents averaged **1.59 dunks** against the Cowboys. UW posted an **8-7 record last season when having more dunks in games than its opponents.**

In the 2004-05 season, Wyoming was **9-8 when having more dunks than its opponent.**

Wyoming had a record of **7-3 for the 2003-04 season when it had more dunks in a game than its opponent.**

Wyoming is 3-4 in postseason games during the McClain era -- 2-3 in NIT games and 1-1 in NCAA Tournament games.

**Only Four Men Have Coached the Cowboy Basketball Program Through 200 Games, Steve McClain is One of Those Four Coaches:**

In the 101-year history of University of Wyoming Basketball, only four men have coached at least 200 games as head coach of the Cowboys.

**Everett Shelton, Bill Strannigan and Jim Brandenburg** were the first three individuals to coach at least 200 games as head coach of the Cowboys. Current Wyoming head coach **Steve McClain** joined that exclusive group on Saturday, Feb. 5, 2005, with a 67-63 overtime win over Air Force.

**Steve McClain Has Won the Most Regular-Season Conference Games in MWC History:** Wyoming head coach **Steve McClain** has won **53 MWC regular-season games**. That is more conference wins in the regular season than any other coach in MWC history.

**Steve McClain Moves Into Sole Possession of Fourth Place in Career Wins At UW:**

University of Wyoming head basketball coach **Steve McClain** moved into sole possession of **fourth place in career wins** in University of Wyoming school history when he recorded his 135th victory at UW with a 55-50 home win over Air Force on Jan. 11, 2006. McClain broke a tie with **Willard Witte for fourth place**.

Wyoming's all-time leader in career victories is Basketball Hall of Fame Coach **Everett Shelton, who won 328 games in 19 seasons from 1939-40 to 1958-59**.

In his eight previous seasons at the University of Wyoming, Steve McClain has led the Wyoming Basketball program through one of its most successful periods in school history. When you begin to list the accomplishments over the past eight seasons, one begins to realize how far the Cowboy Basketball program has come.

In four of the last eight seasons, Wyoming has appeared in postseason play. The Pokes advanced to the Second Round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament and the Second Round of the 2003 National Invitation Tournament. UW also advanced to the Second Round of the 1999 NIT and appeared in the 2001 NIT.

Coach McClain has posted the fifth highest winning percentage in school history -- **58.3 percent (140-100 record)**. His teams have averaged 17.5 wins per season through his first eight seasons.

In conference play, McClain's teams have captured two of the first seven MWC titles, sharing the title for the 2000-01 season and winning it outright in 2001-02. The back-to-back regular-season conference titles were the first since the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons. The outright title in 2001-02 was Wyoming's first outright championship in 20 years. Wyoming possesses a **winning percentage of .530 (53-47 record) in Mountain West Conference regular-season games**.

McClain has coached two All-Americans in his first eight years in Laramie. Josh Davis was an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American in his senior season of 2001-02. Prior to the 2002-03 season, Marcus Bailey was one of only 50 players nationally named to the John R. Wooden Award Preseason All-America team. Bailey tragically saw his senior season and his college career come to an end in the ninth game of that season in a win over South Carolina when he tore the anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in his right knee.

In five of the seven seasons that Steve McClain has coached in the Mountain West Conference, at least one Cowboy has been named First Team All-Mountain West Conference: Josh Davis (1999-2000 and 2000-01); Marcus Bailey (2000-01 and 2001-02); Uche Nsonwu-Amadi (2002-03); Donta Richardson (2002-03) and Jay Straight (2004-05).

The high point of the Cowboys' return to national prominence was Wyoming's appearance in the 2002 NCAA Tournament. It marked the school's first appearance since 1988. Wyoming's first round win over No. 6 ranked Gonzaga, 73-66, on March 14, 2002, was Wyoming's first NCAA Tournament win since March 14, 1987, when UW defeated No. 4 ranked UCLA, 78-68. With their first round win in the 2002 NCAA Tournament, the Pokes ended the season among the Top 32 teams in the country. For his outstanding coaching, McClain was selected the 2001-02 MWC Coach of the Year by his fellow coaches.

In the 2000-01 season, he earned Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year honors from CollegelInsider.com, and earned the same honor from MWC media members for the 1999-2000 season.

Wyoming won 18 games in McClain's first season, 19 his second year, 20 his third season, 22 his fourth and 21 his fifth. The three consecutive 20-win seasons marked the first time that had been accomplished since the 1985-86, 1986-87 and 1987-88 campaigns.

His Wyoming squads have also been consistent contenders in the conference race during his tenure. UW has finished in the top half of the conference in six of McClain's eight seasons at UW.

During his first eight seasons, the Cowboys have defeated three Top 25 ranked opponents -- No. 20 TCU on Jan. 14, 1999; No. 24 Utah on Feb. 28, 2000; and No. 6 Gonzaga on March 14, 2002.

Heading into the 2000-01 season, *ESPN Magazine's* preseason issue listed McClain as a member of Dick Vitale's All-SportsCenter Team -- the five "Coaches Who Need Some PT on TV for more PR."

His 2001-02 Cowboy squad broke two of the nation's longest winning streaks. With its 73-66 win over No. 6 ranked Gonzaga in the opening round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament, Wyoming broke Gonzaga's 14-game winning streak, which was a Gonzaga school record. Earlier in the year at Utah, the Cowboys 54-46 win in Salt Lake City broke Utah's 48-game home win streak against conference opponents, which was the longest conference winning streak in the country.

On April 22, 1998, Steve McClain became the 19th head basketball coach in the history of the University of Wyoming.

McClain, 43 (Aug. 15, 1962), is a native of Orient, Iowa. He is a 1984 graduate of Chadron State College. He is married to the former Kim Van Asselt of Hutchinson, Kan. On May 27, 2001, the McClains added a new member to their family with the birth of their first child, Dylan McClain.

**Steve McClain Ranks Fifth in Winning Percentage in UW History:**

University of Wyoming head basketball coach **Steve McClain** recorded his **100th win as the Cowboy head coach with a 78-71 victory over Eastern Washington on March 20, 2003**, in the first round of the 2003 National Invitation Tournament.

McClain has coached the Cowboys for eight seasons, and has built a **career winning percentage of 58.3 percent**. That ranks **No. 5 in school history in winning percentage**. Only Willard Witte (72.4 percent), Jim Brandenburg (64.5 percent), Stewart Clark (64.2 percent) and Basketball Hall of Fame Coach Everett Shelton, who won 62.0 percent of his games at Wyoming, had higher career winning percentages.

But the most popular draw has been BYU, with 18 crowds of over 10,000. There have been 11 other opponents that have attracted one crowd each of over 10,000 to the Double A.

**Cowboys Win 260th Game in the Arena-Auditorium:**

The Wyoming Cowboys recorded their **260th victory in the Arena-Auditorium** on Wednesday, Jan. 11, 2006, in a 55-50 home victory over Air Force.

The Double A opened on Feb. 20, 1982, with a 59-29 win over Air Force in the final home game of the 1981-82 season.

Currently, the Pokes have posted **262 wins** against just **85 losses** for a **winning percentage of 75.5 percent** in the Double A.

**Three Largest Crowds in Double A History Have Come During the McClain Era:**

Over the last eight seasons of the Steve McClain era, attendance at Wyoming home basketball games has been outstanding. In fact, the three largest crowds in Arena-Auditorium history and four of the Top 10 crowds have come in the past eight seasons.

Over the 24-year history of the Arena-Auditorium, Wyoming Basketball has attracted **73 crowds over 10,000**. Of those **73 crowds, 22 have come in the last eight seasons**.

There have been 15 sellouts (crowds of 15,000 or more) in the history of the Double A, and four of those sellouts have come in the past eight seasons.

**Wyoming Cowboys Return to Championship Form During McClain Era:**

Two championships in the last six years -- that is what the Wyoming Cowboys have accomplished in the Steve McClain era. Wyoming won its 18th conference championship, capturing the 2001-02 Mountain West Conference title outright. It was Wyoming's 16th regular-season championship in men's basketball. UW's other conference championships came in the form of conference tournament titles in 1987 and '88. During McClain's tenure, the Cowboys also tied for the MWC regular-season title in the 2000-01 season with Brigham Young and Utah.

Basketball Hall of Fame coach **Everett Shelton** won the most conference titles for the Cowboys. Shelton captured eight conference titles in his 19 seasons as head coach from the 1939-40 season through the 1958-59 campaign. Coach Shelton also guided Wyoming to its one NCAA National Championship in 1943. **Jim Brandenburg** ranks next among Pokes coaches with four conference titles in the '80s. **Bill Strannigan** won two Western Athletic Championships in 1967 and '69.

Current UW head coach **Steve McClain** also has two titles to his credit. (2001 and 2002). **Benny Dees** (1988) and **Willard Witte** (1932) are the other UW head coaches to win conference titles. They each won one conference championship apiece.

**2005-06 SEASON NOTES:**

- Chris Anderson's key contributions to the Cowboy squad in 2005-06 came as a defender and as Wyoming's second leading offensive rebounder.
- Anderson enjoyed the best game of his two-year Wyoming career against Northern Colorado on Nov. 22, 2005. He scored 13 points and grabbed 10 rebounds to record his first career double-double.
- In conference play, Anderson provided Wyoming with a huge spark off the bench in a 55-50 home win over Air Force on Jan. 11, 2006.

Anderson came off the bench for the Cowboys to score seven points and pull down five rebounds, while shooting a perfect 3 of 3 from the field and 1 of 1 from the free-throw line in 17 minutes of play.

- He also was very productive in a 77-78 overtime loss at home to San Diego State. After senior Justin Williams was unable to continue due to a sprained ankle, Anderson came off the bench to score eight points and grab four rebounds, while shooting 1 of 1 from the field and 6 of 8 from the free-throw line.
- Anderson ranked fourth for the Cowboys in blocked shots, with nine, and seventh in rebounding (3.3 rpg).
- Anderson played in 28 of 32 games for the Cowboys this season, starting three -- versus UNC Wilmington, Northern Colorado and Utah.

**2005-06:** Chris Anderson enters his second season as a member of the University of Wyoming Basketball program. With a year of experience under his belt, he is one of only seven individuals on this year's team with previous playing experience at the NCAA Division I level. Anderson will compete for playing time with three other returning big men and five newcomers.

**2004-05:** Anderson played in 21 games for Wyoming in his first season as a Cowboy. He averaged 1.8 points and 1.1 rebounds per game, while playing 6.1 minutes per game. Anderson played a career high 21 minutes vs. Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne on Jan. 10, 2005. Anderson also had career highs of 9 points and 8 rebounds vs. IPFW. His best conference game came against Utah in Laramie on Jan. 15. Against the Utes, Anderson scored seven points, blocked three opponent shots and shot 60.0 percent from the field (3 of 5 field goals). He shot 56.0 percent from the field for the season to rank No. 2 on the team in shooting percentage.

**Junior College:** Anderson averaged 4.3 points and 2.9 rebounds in 23 games his redshirt freshman season at Eastern Utah Community College. He shot 45.6 percent from the field and pulled down 67 rebounds for the 2003-04 season. Eastern Utah compiled a 16-15 record for the 2003-04 campaign. Anderson redshirted the 2002-03 season at Eastern. His junior-college coach was Bryan Zollinger, who also coached former Cowboy Scottie Vines at Eastern Utah.

**High School/Personal:** Anderson had an outstanding high school career at Layton Christian Academy in Layton, Utah, where he averaged 16.8 points, 12.6 rebounds and 7.2 blocked shots per game. Anderson was named All-Region 16, All-Region 16 Most Valuable Player and All-State his senior season. He was also a team captain of his basketball team. Anderson led Layton High to a 16-10 record and the quarterfinals of the 2002 Utah State Tournament. A multi-sport athlete, Anderson also earned All-Region honors in cross country and track and field. In the classroom, he was an honor student. As a member of his school's speech and debate team, he won a State Championship. His high school basketball coach was Bobby Porter.

Born Aug. 10, 1984, he is the son of Crystal and Curtis Williams.

Anderson was also recruited by Long Beach State, Utah State and Weber State. Anderson is majoring in social science.

**2005-06 SEASON NOTES:**

- On Friday, Feb. 3, 2006, it was determined that Daaron Brown would be lost for the remainder of the season due to re-injuring his back against Utah on Feb. 1. Brown's injury is to multiple discs in his lower back. He is expected to undergo surgery later in February. Brown played 15 minutes against Utah on Feb. 1 prior to re-injuring the back.
- Brown helped lead Wyoming to a 68-64 road win over TCU on Jan. 7, 2006, recording the first double-double of his career in that game -- scoring 19 points and grabbing 11 rebounds.
- At Colorado State on Jan. 25, he came off the bench to score 14 points and grab nine rebounds, while shooting 77.8 percent from the field (7 of 9) on way to a 72-67 Wyoming road win.
- He had another outstanding game against Northern Colorado, scoring 16 points and grabbing three rebounds in 29 minutes. He shot 80.0 percent versus UNC, hitting 8 of 10 field goals.
- Brown had outstanding rebounding games against Denver, pulling down eight rebounds, and versus Southern Illinois, grabbing seven boards vs. the Salukis.
- He averaged 3.7 rebounds per game to rank fourth on the Cowboy squad.
- Brown played in 19 of Wyoming's first 21 games prior to suffering his season-ending back injury. He missed the entire second half of the conference season plus the MWC Tournament.

**2005-06:** Daaron Brown could provide the Wyoming Cowboys with a physical presence inside with his 6' 9", 260-pound frame. He will enter the 2005-06 season hoping to overcome a back injury that forced him to miss virtually all of his sophomore season at Compton Community College in Compton, Calif., last season. In fact, Brown played in so few games during the 2004-05 season it was hoped he might receive a medical hardship from the NCAA, giving him three years of remaining eligibility. Shortly before the start of the 2005-06 season, it was determined that he would not receive an extra year of eligibility from the NCAA, and so will be a junior entering this season. Wyoming head coach Steve McClain described Brown as a very competitive and tough-minded player when he signed Brown in the spring of 2005.

"Daaron (Brown) is a young man who brings a toughness to our program," said McClain. "He will provide us both rebounding and scoring inside. His competitiveness and toughness reminds me of Uche (Nsonwu-Amadi, who played for Wyoming from 2000-01 to 2002-03). I also expect Daaron to be an effective defender inside for us, much like Uche was."

**Junior College:** Brown missed almost the entire 2004-05 campaign due to a back injury. During his true freshman season of 2003-04 at Compton Community College, he averaged 9.0 points and 5.8 rebounds per game, while shooting 57 percent from the field and 72 percent from the free-throw line. Brown was a teammate of current Cowboy Kevin Lewis at Compton Community College. The two teammates helped Compton CC to the 2004 California State Junior College Championship. Compton finished the 2003-04 season with a 17-8 record. It became only the third team in California Community College history to win three regional playoff games on the road to earn a spot in the state tournament, and was the first of those three teams to go on to win the state title. The Compton Tartars trailed by five points (33-38) at halftime of the state championship game, but turned up the defensive pressure in the second half, out-scoring American River Community College 49 to 39 in the final period on way to an 82-77 victory. Brown was coached in junior college by Damaine Powell.

**Personal:** Born Jan. 11, 1984, he is the son of Angie Brown. Brown was also recruited by Oklahoma, USC, Arizona State and Creighton. He has not yet declared a college major.

**2005-06:** Brandon Ewing begins his college career at Wyoming after enjoying an outstanding high school career at Julian High School in Chicago, Ill. Ewing earned All-State, All-Area and All-City honors his senior season, while averaging 21 points, eight assists, six rebounds and four assists per game. Ewing is expected to challenge for the Cowboys' starting point-guard position as a freshman. He comes to Wyoming with the reputation as an outstanding floor leader. He played in the highest classification in Illinois, Class AA. His versatility as a scorer should also allow him to play some at the shooting-guard position at the college level.

We were looking for a point guard who could be the future of this program," Wyoming head coach Steve McClain said. "I think we found him in Brandon (Ewing). A very talented young player, he played in a great high school program for one of the best high school coaches in Chicago. Brandon is a guy who loves to compete, and has great offensive skills. The thing that impressed me the most is his ability to get other players involved in the game. He is an outstanding passer. He has good size for a point guard. He will get bigger and stronger as he gets in our weight program."

**High School/Personal:** Ewing led Julian High School to a 25-3 record and the Super Sectionals of the 2005 Illinois Class AA State Playoffs his senior season. He played in one of the most competitive leagues in the state of Illinois -- the Chicago Public League's Red-South Conference. In addition to earning All-State, All-Area and All-City honors as a senior, he was also runner-up for his conference's Player of the Year award. During his four-year playing career, he helped lead Julian High to a combined 95-28 (.772) record. The summer prior to his senior year of high school, he averaged 23 points a game for the Meanstreets AAU team which was ranked fourth in the nation, and was coached by NFL wide receiver Tai Streets. **2005-06 SEASON NOTES:**

•Brad Jones played some of his best basketball of the season in the Mountain West Conference Tournament. He averaged 13.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game on way to leading Wyoming to the tournament championship game. Jones recorded his first career double-figure rebounding game vs. Air Force with 11 rebounds in a quarterfinal victory. He tied a career high with 20 points in a semifinal win over Utah, and added 15 points in the championship game against San Diego State.

•He led Wyoming in assists, and ranked No. 5 in the MWC, averaging 3.47 assists per game. Jones averaged 10.0 points per game to rank fourth on the Wyoming squad, and averaged 4.5 rebounds per game – third best for the Cowboys.

- Including assists, he ranked among league leaders in six statistical categories: No. 7 in assist-to-turnover ratio (0.90 to 1.00), No. 13 in FT% (.710), No. 14 in defensive rebounding (3.38 pg), No. 16 in steals (1.16 spg) and No. 19 in total rebounds (4.5 rpg)
- Jones led Wyoming to a road win over TCU on Jan. 7, 2006, when he brought the Cowboys back from a nine-point deficit, with only 6:10 remaining in the game, to a four-point victory. Jones scored seven points and handed out three assists in the final six minutes vs. TCU on way to a 18 points as UW outscored TCU 18-5 in the final 6:10.
- He scored a career high 20 points on Feb. 25, 2006, in a 78-80 home loss to Colorado State. Jones shot 50.0 % (8 of 16) from the field and 66.7% (4 of 6) from the free-throw line against the Rams.
- Against San Diego State on Jan. 28, Jones scored 13 points, grabbed nine rebounds, handed out five assists, blocked two shots and made three steals in 40 minutes of play.
- Versus Utah on Feb. 1, 2006, Jones scored 15 points and grabbed six rebounds, while shooting 55.6 percent from the field and a perfect 4 of 4 from the free-throw line.
- Jones started 26 of Wyoming's 32 games during the 2005-06 season, including 20 of the last 21 games.

**2005-06:** Brad Jones comes to Wyoming after an outstanding season at Fort Smith Community College in Fort Smith, Ark. His experience playing the point-guard position will help fill a big hole left by the graduation of former Cowboy Jay Straight, who started four years at point guard for the Cowboys. Jones' excellent quickness and style of play should fit well into Wyoming's up-tempo game. Jones may also play some shooting guard, giving the Cowboys several lineup options in the upcoming season.

"With Brad (Jones) and Brandon Ewing (incoming freshman), I think our point-guard position is solidified for the next three years," said UW head coach Steve McClain. "Brad has the ability to push the basketball from free-throw line to free-throw line without committing turnovers. I think he and Brandon will really challenge each other in practice to be the best players they can be. Brad also comes to our program with three years of remaining eligibility."

**Junior College:** Jones averaged 10.7 points and 6.5 assists per game his freshman season of 2004-05 at Fort Smith Community College. Jones helped lead Fort Smith to a 29-4 record for the '04-'05 season. Fort Smith achieved a final regular-season ranking of No. 4 in the nation among National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) teams. Fort Smith captured the Bi-State Conference East Division Championship, and advanced all the way to the NJCAA Region II Championship game before losing by four points, 74-78, to Seminole State College of Seminole, Okla. Jones played for head coach Jeremy Cox at Fort Smith. Cox was a former graduate assistant basketball coach at the University of Wyoming under Benny Dees in 1991.

**High School/Personal:** Jones is originally from Marked Tree, Ark., where he played at Marked Tree High School. His senior season of 2003-04, he averaged 26.3 points, 10.1 rebounds and 6.2 assists per game. He helped lead Marked Tree High to a 20-7 record. His high school coach was Barbara Wilburn.

Born Oct. 21, 1985, Jones is the son of Jeanette and Jerry Jones. He was also recruited by Arizona State, Creighton, Middle Tennessee State and Mississippi State. Jones has not yet declared a college major.

**2005-06:** Travis Nelson redshirted his freshman season at Wyoming. The Wyoming coaching staff has been impressed with his skills and believes he has a bright future ahead. Nelson, like most freshmen big men, is making the adjustment to the speed of the college game, and the strength and quickness of college post players. With two talented seniors in Justin Williams and Derek Wabbington already on the roster, Nelson will have an opportunity to learn from those seniors, develop physically

and take some time to adjust to the college game as a true freshman.

"Travis has a big frame, and does a good job of using it to score," said Wyoming head coach Steve McClain. "He will probably add 15 to 20 pounds by next season, giving him legitimate size. He can shoot it out to 15 feet, and he's going to be a load inside by the time he's done at Wyoming. Travis runs the floor very well. He's the kind of kid who really wants to be a good player, and has the work ethic to get that done."

**High School/Personal:** Nelson earned Second Team All-State honors his senior season, while averaging 14.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. He led Linn-Mar High School to a 25-2 record and a No. 25 national ranking in the 2004-05 season. Linn-Mar lost only one regular-season game in Nelson's senior season, and advanced to its second consecutive Iowa 4A State Championship game -- 4A is the largest classification in the state of Iowa. Unfortunately, Linn-Mar was unable to defend its state title, losing to Bettendorf. Nelson shot 69.7 percent from the field his senior season, setting a school single-season record. He also set a school single-game record converting a perfect nine of nine field goals in one game. His junior season, he averaged 8.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game. His Linn-Mar squad posted a 24-3 record Nelson's junior season, and captured the Iowa 4A State Championship over Waterloo East. Nelson was named to the All-Tournament team at the state tournament as a junior, and was voted his team's Most Improved Player. His high school coach was Mark Hutchenson. He was ranked as the number two prep prospect in Iowa by Iowa Preps.com behind Ross Marsden of Ames, Iowa, who committed to Iowa State. Nelson was invited and attended the Nike Hoop Jamboree in 2003, which brings together the top 125 high school players in the nation. He also was invited and attended the Nike All-America Camp in 2004. In the summer before his senior season of high school, he averaged a double-double for the Martin Brothers AAU team, coached by Hank Huddleson. The Martin Brothers Team won the 19 & Under National Championship in the summer of 2004, marking the first time an Iowa AAU team captured a national title. Nelson was named the state of Iowa 19 & Under AAU MVP in the summer of 2004. Former Wyoming Cowboys David Rottinghaus, Alex Dunn and James Ebert also played for the Martin Brothers team during their high school careers.

Born May 13, 1987, he is the son of Belinda and David Nelson. He was also recruited by Creighton, Dayton, Iowa, Iowa State, Kansas State, Nebraska, Northern Iowa and St. John's. He is planning on majoring in psychology.

- He scored nine points at SDSU on March 1, 2006, and 10 days later versus the same Aztec team he scored four points in the MWC Championship game, hitting two of two field goals.
- Okoye had an outstanding game versus CU-Colorado Springs, as he scored 16 points on a perfect 7 o 7 shooting from the field and 2 of 3 shooting from the free-throw line.
- He led the Cowboys in field-goal percentage, making 70.0 percent of his field-goal attempts during his true freshman season (21 of 30).

"Ike is a young guy who is not done growing physically or as a player," said Cowboy head coach Steve McClain. "He popped on the scene the summer before his senior season, and Silvey (assistant coach Dominguez) did a great job of evaluating him. He's a young, big guy whose potential is unbelievable. He will have to get bigger and stronger, but has the frame to do that. He plays so hard. He's long and can score around the goal. We also see him as a very good rebounder."

**High School/Personal:** Okoye earned All-State and All-City honors in basketball his senior year at Woodcreek High School in Sacramento, Calif. He also earned All-Sierra Foothill League honors in both basketball and football as a senior. Okoye's senior season, he averaged 19.2 points and 11.0 rebounds per game as Woodcreek High School advanced to the second round of the state playoffs. He was elected a team captain his senior season. In the summer of 2004, prior to his senior season, Okoye played in one of the most prestigious summer tournaments in the country -- "The Big Time Tournament" sponsored by Reebok in Las Vegas, Nev. That summer event is the largest in the country and features teams from coast to coast. A total of 336 teams and over 3,500 players competed in the 2004 event. He led Kelly Walsh to a 16-9 overall record and an 8-2 record in the 4A North Conference to finish in second place and advance to the state tournament. For the second consecutive year, he was named the 4A North Player of the Year. His best individual scoring performances as a senior were a 40-point night at Gillette and a 35-point performance versus Cheyenne Central in the first round of the state tournament. His other season highs included: grabbing a season high 12 rebounds against Rock Springs, handing out eight assists versus Riverton and making six steals against Rapid City Central High School.

His junior season, Platt averaged 20.4 points, 8.3 rebounds, 4.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game. Street & Smith named him an Honorable Mention All-American his junior season. He became the first sophomore in Kelly Walsh history to earn All-State as a sophomore. He was the North Conference Player of the Year for the 2004-05 season.

Platt holds the Kelly Walsh school records for: most three-point field goals made in a season (72), most three-pointers made in a single game (10) and most free throws made in a single game (18). He was elected a team captain both his junior and senior seasons. Platt was coached in high school by Kreg Adams.

He played AAU basketball with the Colorado Chaos in the summers, participating in some of the top AAU tournaments in the country. He earned AAU Division I All-Tournament honors at the Hoosier Shootout, Rumble in the Bay and Top of the Rockies tournaments.

Platt was also active as a member of the SuperStars Alcohol and Drug Free Program that utilizes high school students to help encourage elementary school students to be drug free. He was a member of the Kelly Walsh yearbook and student newspaper staffs, and he was a four-year honor student.

Born May 12, 1988, he is the son of Patty Platt and the late Brian Platt. Both his mother and father were college basketball players. His mom played at Midland Lutheran College (Neb.), and his father played at Casper College and Wayne State (Neb.). Platt was also recruited by Colorado State, Nevada, New Mexico, Pepperdine, San Diego, San Diego State, Stanford, UC Santa Barbara and Utah.

## #45 Bienvenu Songondo Forward 6-10 220 Redshirt Freshman Bangui, Central African Republic (Laurinburg Institute)

### 2005-06 SEASON NOTES:

- Bienvenu Songondo played in eight games his redshirt freshman season - versus CU- Colorado Springs, Weber State, at UNLV, vs. TCU, vs. BYU, vs. CSU, at San Diego State and at Utah.
- In the UCCS game, the redshirt freshman scored 14 points on 4 of 6 shooting from the field (.667) and 6 of 9 shooting from the free-throw line (.667).
- Songondo scored his 14 points against the UCCS Mountain Lions in only 10 minutes of play.

- He also grabbed one rebound and blocked one shot versus UCCS.
- Against UNLV on Feb. 4, Songondo grabbed five rebounds in 21 minutes of play.
- Songondo appeared in six Mountain West Conference games at UNLV, vs. TCU in Laramie, against BYU in Laramie, at home versus Colorado State, at SDSU and at Utah.

**2005-06:** Bienvenu Songondo enters this season as healthy as he has been in the past two years. He spent the summer of 2005 playing for his Central African Republic national team in Europe and in the African Championships. He played throughout the summer, and his previously injured knee held up well. He tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his knee his final year at Laurinburg Institute in Laurinburg, N.C., forcing him to miss virtually all of that season. He redshirted his first season at Wyoming in 2004-05. If healthy, Songondo could give the Cowboy frontline a big boost. One of the most athletic and skilled players on the team, he is also a big man who can run the court very well. Songondo was offered scholarships by Georgetown and USC, in addition to Wyoming.

"Benny has battled some knee problems over the past two years," said UW head coach Steve McClain. "He tore an ACL (anterior cruciate ligament) while in prep school, and he probably rushed trying to come back from that injury a little bit. He has gotten so much stronger and so much better in the short period of time he has been here. I think his future at Wyoming is great. I see a big upside for Benny down the road."

**2004-05:** Songondo redshirted. He came to Wyoming with a lot of potential. He is a young man who has impressive physical skills, but is still learning the game and improving.

**High School/Personal:** Songondo was a heavily recruited player in the spring of 2004. In addition to accepting a scholarship offer from Wyoming, Songondo was also offered scholarships by Georgetown and USC where he made official visits. His Laurinburg Institute team was selected as the preseason No. 1 prep school in the nation by TheInsidersHoops website entering the 2003-04 season. While injured for most of the 2003-04 season, Songondo's talents are evident by the schools who recruited him. He played for Chris Chaney at Laurinburg Institute.

An outstanding all-around athlete, Songondo played soccer prior to turning his full attention to basketball.

Born June 19, 1984, he is the son of Pauline and Paul Songondo. He has not yet declared a college major.

**2006-07:** James Spencer is a shooting guard/small forward who could challenge for an immediate starting spot in his first season with the Cowboys. Spencer was an outstanding scorer in junior college. His athleticism will give the Cowboy perimeter three very athletic players, with Brandon Ewing, Brad Jones and Spencer. Spencer transferred to Wyoming from Los Angeles City College in Los Angeles, Calif. He comes to Wyoming with his junior-

college teammate Joseph Taylor.

**Junior College:** He averaged 13.9 points, 4.9 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game last year as a sophomore at L.A. City. Spencer earned Second Team All-Conference honors at the conclusion of his sophomore season, and was an Honorable Mention All-State selection by JCHoops.com. He helped lead L.A.
