**Postgame Notes**  
**Following a 21-35 Home Loss Versus BYU on Nov. 12, 2005**

**Postgame Notes**

- Wyoming's record on the season now falls to 4-6 and 2-5 in Mountain West Conference play. The Cowboys were eliminated from any chance of becoming bowl eligible with today's loss. UW has only one game remaining this season. They will play at San Diego State on Saturday, Nov. 19 in a game that will kickoff at 6 p.m., Mountain Time and will be televised by SportsWest TV.
- Turnovers continued to plague the Wyoming Cowboys. UW committed five turnovers on the day (three fumbles and two interceptions), but was unable to force any opponent turnovers. On the season, Wyoming has committed 29 turnovers, while forcing 17 for a -12 turnover margin.
- The Cowboys finished their home schedule with a 2-3 home record in 2005.
- Wyoming averaged 20,650 fans for the 2005 season. That ranks as the best home attendance average for Wyoming since 1990 when Wyoming averaged 21,375 fans.

**Defensive Notes**

- The Cowboys limited BYU to seven points in the second half. The Cougars had scored 143 coming into the game in the second half this season.
- Ward Dobbs made 16 tackles versus BYU. In the four games Dobbs has started since taking over for an injured Jeff Tatnall, Dobbs has averaged 13.5 tackles per game.
- Senior Ron Rockett had 15 total tackles on the day. It was Rockett's third double-digit tackle day of the season. He had 17 tackles versus New Mexico and 10 at Utah.

**Offensive Notes**

- Wyoming's 407 yards of total offense vs. BYU was the Cowboys' fourth 400-yard game of the 2005 season. The Cowboys also had 464 vs. Louisiana-Monroe, 441 vs. UNLV and 467 at Colorado State.
- The Cowboys 166 net rushing yards was UW's second highest output on the ground this season. UW ran for 210 against Louisiana-Monroe.
- Jovon Bouknight moved into third place in career receptions at Wyoming with 7 receptions for 87 yards vs. BYU. Bouknight now has 236 career receptions. He passed former Cowboy Ryan McGuffey, who caught 231 passes in his career from 2000-03. Bouknight needs only four more receptions to pass former Cowboy All-American Ryan Yarborough for second place on the career list. Yarborough caught 239 passes for UW from 1990-93.
- Bouknight also moved into a tied for ninth place in career scoring at Wyoming with one touchdown reception vs. BYU. Bouknight has 29 receiving TDs and one rushing touchdown during his career for 180 total points. He moved past Steve Tobin, a place-kicker who scored 178 points from 1980-82. Bouknight tied former Cowboy quarterback Phil Davis, who scored 180 points during his career from 1978-81.
- Bouknight's 87 receiving yards vs. BYU improves his season total to 973 receiving yards this season. He needs only 27 more receiving yards this season to post his second 1,000-yard receiving season of his career. The only two Wyoming receivers to have two or more 1,000-yard receiving seasons were former All-Americans Marcus Harris and Ryan Yarborough, who each posted three 1,000-yard seasons.
- Bouknight caught a pass in his 46th consecutive game.
- Corey Bramlet completed 11 consecutive passes at one point of the BYU game on way to a 20 for 25 night for 241 yards, one interception and one TD pass.
- Redshirt freshman running back Wynel Seldon posted the third 100-yard rushing game of his career with 110 against the Cougars. Seldon ran for 124 yards at Ole Miss and 121 against Louisiana-Monroe earlier this season.

- #18 Wynel Seldon, RFr., RB Suffered an abdominal contusion.
