

Parking

Permit parking, as well as paid parking, is available at all home football and basketball games. Cowboy Joe Club members at the appropriate donation levels enjoy permit parking in the Stadium lot, Brown lot and Gold lot. Please refer to your Cowboy Joe Club parking information, as well as the map below.

For football and basketball, paid parking for the general public is available for \$10 per game in the X lot (off of 19th Street) and the Baseball lot (off of 30th and Willet). Season parking permits in the Baseball lot may be purchased for \$50 by contacting the UW Ticket Office at 800-922-9461.

Parking for the physically challenged is available in parking lots AA, D, S, FA and HC. The blue international wheelchair permit must be shown for admittance to the lots and then properly displayed in the vehicle while parked. The parking is on a first-come, first-served basis. There are four (4) spaces in D lot, twenty two (22) spaces in AA lot, nine (9) spaces in the S lot, five (5) spaces in FA lot, and one hundred (100) spaces in HC. Please note the HC lot is only available during football games.

Tailgating in Parking Lots

All parking lots are open to tailgating activities such as grilling, music and non-alcoholic beverages. However, only the Stadium lot, Brown lot and Gold lot have open container privileges.

Rules for Parking Lots with Open Container Permits

No kegs are permitted in the open container lots.

Beer, wine and malt beverages are the only alcoholic beverages permitted in the open container lots on game days.

All tailgating activities must be confined to your particular parking space unless you purchase additional spaces.

Open container permits run for 2.5 hours prior to kickoff (e.g. 10:30 a.m. for a 1 p.m. game). The sale of alcoholic beverages in Pepsi's Tailgate Park will cease 30 minutes prior to game time.

Consumption of alcoholic beverages in the parking areas or at Pepsi's Tailgate Park is prohibited after kickoff, during halftime and after the game.

Violations of the open container permits may result in revocation of parking privileges and removal from the open container area(s).

Open container parking areas are not provided for men and women's basketball.
