On the Slate

The hard work and dedication pays off now for No. 7 Wyoming (10-3 overall, 6-0 Western Wrestling Conference) as the Cowboys hit the mats at the NCAA Championships. Action runs Thursday through Saturday in St. Louis at the year's culminating event. The six qualifiers for the NCAA Championships include senior Michael Martinez, redshirt freshman Zach Zehner, senior Shane Onufer, sophomore Pat Martinez, senior Joe LeBlanc and redshirt junior Alfonso Hernandez.

2012 WWC Championships/NCAA West Regional

It was a celebration in Cedar Falls, Iowa, on Sunday when the Pokes won their third-straight West Regional title. UW scored 93.5 points, outlasting second-place Northern Iowa, which scored 76 points. Four Wyoming wrestlers won Western Wrestling Conference crowns, and head coach Mark Branch was named WWC Coach of the Year.

History in the making

LeBlanc became UW's all-time leader in career victories at the NCAA West Regional as he picked up three wins in the event. Now with 143 wins in his illustrious career, he holds a 143-18 mark over his time at UW, and also sits in fourth place on the all-time pins list with 39.

During the 2010-11 season, LeBlanc and Onufer became the ninth and 10th wrestlers in UW history to crack the 100-career win mark. LeBlanc reached the mark against Air Force (Feb. 3, 2011) and Onufer accomplished the feat at the 2011 West Regional. His 10-2 major decision over Northern Iowa's Trevor Kittleson in the semifinals made him the 10th UW wrestler to accomplish the feat, as he now stands at 137-23 in his career. He is in fifth place

Head Coach Mark Branch



Mark Branch continued the winning ways for Wyoming wrestling in 2011-12.

The fourth-year head man pushed the Pokes to a 10-3 dual mark, and a 6-0 mark in WWC action. It got

even better at the Western Wrestling Conference Championships on March 4, as Wyoming took home four conference titles and qualified six wrestlers for the NCAA Championships. The WWC crown was the third in a row for the Pokes.

Branch now has had 16 individual titles at the West Regional under his tutelage and was named WWC Coach of the Year for the third time. His body of work also includes 30 wrestlers who have earned All-WWC honors with seven more honorees in 2011-12.

In 2011, Branch and the Cowboys found success at the NCAA Championships with six Cowboy qualifiers. Shane Onufer (165) and Joe LeBlanc (184) earned All-America honors by placing fifth and sixth, respectively, to lead Wyoming to a 28th-place team finish. UW wrestlers have earned four All-America honors under Branch, including three straight by LeBlanc.

During the season, the Cowboys rolled to an 11-7 overall dual mark and 5-1 in the WWC. UW's lone dual loss in WWC action came in the last matchup of the season at Northern Iowa and was Branch's first dual loss in the WWC. Currently, he has compiled a 22-1 mark against WWC teams with three regular-season dual titles.

In 2009-10, Branch directed the Cowboy wrestlers to the West Regional team title over the 24-time defending champion Northern Iowa Panthers with three Cowboy individual titles. The come-from-behind championship was Wyoming's first-ever West Regional team title and UW's first tournament conference championship team since 1992.

all-time, just one victory from tying for third.

Best in the West

Onufer is in a unique position among the WWC's best wrestlers: He has never lost a conference match in his Wyoming career. He's posted marks of 8-0, 9-0, 12-0 and 9-0 this season to compile a perfect 38-0 record against WWC foes.

Onufer is the only Wyoming wrestler to win four WWC titles, and just the second UW wrestler to win four conference titles in his career. The senior shares the honor with Frank Stray, who won four in 1948-51 in the Mountain States/Skyline Conference.

Back in business

Hernandez has been stellar this year after missing all of last season with a back injury. Hernandez is the Cowboy leader in wins with 36, all while establishing himself as a force to be reckoned with in the WWC at 197 pounds. He has a career mark of 81-40. The 36 wins this year puts him 13th on UW's all-time single-season wins list, just two away from entering the top 10.

Hernandez leads the Cowboys with a whopping 15 major decisions this season.

National numbers

The six Wyoming wrestlers to qualify for the NCAA tournament have been models of consistency all season. Each has seen time in the national rankings and they have compiled a 28-21 record versus ranked opponents over the course of the season. They also built up a record of 47-26 versus NCAA qualifiers.

No. 48 and counting

Wyoming head coach Mark Branch and the Cowboys beat Oregon State on Jan. 15 for Branch's 40th victory as a head coach in just three and a half years. Branch has averaged 12.6 wins per year in his three years at the helm. He has won 75 percent of his duals (48 out of 64) since 2008-09, his first season as UW's head coach. He also boasts a 22-1 record in WWC action, a winning percentage of nearly 96 percent.

Three's company

The Cowboys had three wrestlers with one loss or less in duals this season, including Alfonso Hernandez, LeBlanc and Onufer. LeBlanc finished undefeated, while Onufer and Hernandez each lost just one match. LeBlanc was 13-0, Onufer was 12-1 and Hernandez went 11-1. Four of LeBlanc's opponents were ranked, four were ranked for Onufer and Hernandez has faced two ranked wrestlers in his dual action this year.

Top dog

LeBlanc currently ranks as the No. 1 wrestler in three major polls this week, including InterMat, WIN Magazine and WrestlingReport.com. LeBlanc's run atop the rankings began Jan. 10, 2012.

Stacking up

LeBlanc has wrestled nine matches featuring ranked opponents, while Onufer has wrestled eight. LeBlanc has claimed nine wins, while Onufer has seven victories in those matchups. It's no wonder each is ranked in the top three of their weight classes, considering the tough road they've had to travel this season.

No shortage of competition

Zehner has wrestled 13 ranked wrestlers this season, the most of any Cowboy

NCAA Coaches Ranking

Seven Wyoming wrestlers were included in the top 33 of their respective weight classes in the final NCAA Coaches Rankings and RPI ratings, released Feb. 23. The final rankings will be one of the tools used as part of the selection process to determine the qualifiers for the 2012 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships.

Wrestlers in each weight class will be measured by winning percentage, rating percentage index (RPI) and coaches' rankings to earn spots for the 2012 NCAA

Division I Wrestling Championships. The coaches' rankings are compiled by a vote of coaches across the nation. Each qualifying tournament has five coaches rank the top 33 wrestlers in two weight classes. Below are the rankings and RPIs for Wyoming wrestlers.

125: Michael Martinez, 17th/15th

133: Zach Zehner, 15th/10th

157: Andy McCulley, 31st/28th

165: Shane Onufer, 3rd/3rd

174: Pat Martinez, 22nd/14th

184: Joe LeBlanc, 1st/1st

197: Alfonso Hernandez, 9th/8th

wrestler, and has gone 5-8 in those matches. He's gaining valuable experience in his first season of competition, and has taken on nine top-15 wrestlers in the nation, including the top-ranked wrestler three times, Oklahoma State's Jordan Oliver.

Zehner's biggest win came versus Ryan Mango of Stanford, who was ranked fifth in the nation at the time. Zehner dominated in a 10-3 decision in the Las Vegas Invitational.

He has performed on the big stage as well, scoring 44 dual points for UW, second only to LeBlanc.

Adding them up

Martinez has tallied 20 or more wins in each of his four seasons of Cowboy wrestling. His season-high mark was 38 in 2008-09, his redshirt freshman campaign. That mark was 10th in Cowboy history on the single-season wins list. Martinez became the third current Cowboy wrestler to win 100 career matches on Dec. 3. The senior became the 11th wrestler in Cowboy history to reach the mark. Martinez's win over David Prado in the Las Vegas Invitational gave him 100 for his storied career. He now has won 115 matches overall and moved into the top-10 all-time list with his win versus Northern Iowa on Jan. 29. He now is seventh all-time on the career wins list.

Report cards

Onufer and LeBlanc have been on top of their game over the last two seasons. Onufer has won 93 percent of his matches (65-5) over the last two years while LeBlanc has won 91 percent, going 59-6.

Proving himself

Pat Martinez has qualified for the NCAA Championships in his last two seasons by dominating the WWC in both duals and conference tournaments. He has gone 21-4 versus conference opponents over the last two seasons and has won the 174-pound WWC crown each year.

This season, he is second on UW with 34 victories, and scored 40 dual points for the Cowboys with 10 wins. Martinez's major decision in the Oklahoma dual sealed a big win for Wyoming, and he likely will be a staple at 174 pounds for the foreseeable future.

He reached the 50-win mark for his career in the Reno Tournament of Champions on Dec. 18. His 50th win was a 10-1 major decision over Southern Oregon's Brock Gutches and he now has 63 career wins.

Pouring it on

Six UW wrestlers have reached the 25-win plateau this year, and four have 30 or more.

Last season, only one UW wrestler (Onufer) had 30 or more wins. This year, Hernandez, LeBlanc, Pat Martinez and Onufer have gotten their hand raised 30 or more times.

Top-15 program

Wyoming finished the regular season ranked in the top 15 of each of the major polls. Those polls include InterMat, WIN Magazine and the NWCA Coaches Poll, a dual-based ranking. The coaches poll put the Cowboys at 11th, while WIN, a tournament-based poll, had the Pokes ranked as high as sixth in the nation.

The National Wrestling Media Association (NWMA) NCAA Division I Mid-Major Poll, had the Pokes ranked second for most of the season. Only Cornell was rated higher than Wyoming in that ranking. The NWMA Division-I Mid Major Poll includes NCAA Division-I wrestling schools that do not sponsor a football program in a BCS conference. Rankings are based on dual performance.

Big wins

Wyoming's 18-17 win over OU on Jan. 3 was its first-ever victory over the Sooners in a series that began in 1955. The Pokes now have a 1-14-2 record versus Oklahoma. It was Wyoming's first win over a top-10 ranked team since the Pokes beat Virginia, rated ninth, on Jan. 8, 2011, in the Virginia Duals. The win also was UW's first dual win of the 2011-12 season.

On Jan. 15, the Pokes used five wins and tiebreaker points to defeat No. 16 Oregon State on the road. Wyoming and OSU battled to a 22-22 tie after 10 matches, but total match points favored Wyoming 34-30 to give the Pokes another team point for the 23-22 win. The victory marked Wyoming's first over Oregon State since 2003-04.

Primetime performers

Hernandez was the third Wyoming wrestler to be honored by CollegeSports360.com for his efforts on the mats.

Hernandez was named to the site's honor roll for the week of Jan. 16 for his win versus Oregon State.

Michael Martinez also was named to the honor roll for his win over then-No. 5 Jarrod Patterson of Oklahoma on Jan. 3. That earned him the accolade for the week of Jan. 9.

Onufer was named as a "Primetime Performer," announced Dec. 20. The award made its debut the same day. Onufer's title in the RTOC earned him the honor.

This listing provides a quick look at noteworthy feats from the previous week and is a way for new or casual fans to learn about various college sports – while also paying tribute to some athletes who may be more well-known on a national level.

League recognition

Five Cowboys have been honored by the Western Wrestling Conference this year.

LeBlanc was the latest Wyoming wrestler to be named Wrestler of the Week this season, as he received the honor Feb. 21. It was the third time this season and LeBlanc's sixth career honor.

Pat Martinez earned the nod Jan. 10, while Onufer claimed the award Dec. 20 for his efforts in the Reno Tournament of Champions. Onufer also was the WWC Wrestler of the Week for the week of Nov. 15. Onufer has won the award twice this year and six times in his UW career.

Zehner was named WWC Co-Wrestler of the Week for the week of Dec. 13 for the first time in his career.

Junior Kasey Garnhart was named the Co-Wrestler of the Week by the league for the week of Nov. 22. It was the first of Garnhart's season and first of his career.

2011-12: Martinez finished second at the West Regional this season, and he was first at the Cowboy Open. He tallied a 7-2 dual record and entered Wyoming's top-10 all-time wins list with 115 in his career, good for seventh.

2010-11: Martinez started his junior campaign as Wyoming's starter at 133 pounds, but after a 4-5 start to the season he moved back to 125 pounds with his usual success. Martinez won his third consecutive West Regional/WWC individual title to qualify for the NCAA Championships for a third time. He went 20-10 overall on the season, including 11-4 in duals, with four major decisions. He posted a 7-4 mark against the WWC.

2009-10: During his sophomore season, Martinez posted a 33-9 record, with two technical falls and 10 major decisions. He won his second straight NCAA West Regional title at 125 pounds and participated in his second straight NCAA Championships.

His example on the mat helped lead the Pokes to the 2010 West Regional team title, as well as the 2010 Western Wrestling Conference regular-season dual title. Martinez had an 8-1 record against WWC opponents and he was 11-2 in duals, scoring 43 points.

In the summer prior to the season, Martinez participated in the Senior World Team Trials. He was named the WWC Wrestler of the Week on Nov. 17.

2008-09: Martinez was an NCAA Qualifier and West Regional/WWC champion as a redshirt freshman. He won his opening round match at the NCAA Tournament over No. 17 ranked Marcus Orozco of UC Davis and finished the season 38-11, which tied him for ninth all-time at UW with Reese Andy (1995-96).

Martinez had a 15-3 dual record and scored 58 team points in those matches for UW. He had 12 major decisions, three wins by technical fall and two pins. He placed second at the Cowboy Open and Omaha Open, and took fifth at Reno. Martinez was named to the Amateur Wrestling News All-Rookie Fourth Team and twice was awarded WWC Wrestler of the Week.

2007-08: Martinez took an Olympic redshirt during this season to compete for a spot on the U.S. Olympic team. He trained in Colorado Springs at the Olympic Training Center all year. Martinez won the Rocky Mountain Regional. He wrestled internationally, in addition to qualifying for and competing in the Olympic Trials.

2006-07: Martinez redshirted in '06-07. In his open matches, he went 20-8 recording three major decisions, one technical fall and one pin. Martinez took fifth at the U.S. Open. He won the Bob Smith Open and took second at the Glen Brand Open.

2004-06: Martinez did not wrestle collegiately.

High School: Martinez wrestled four years at Pagosa Springs High School from 2000-04, was a two-time state champion and was a state placer each of those years. He won state as a senior at 119 pounds, took first as a junior at 112, third as a sophomore at 112 and fourth his freshman year at 103. Martinez also lettered in football.

Personal: Born Feb. 10, 1986 in Durango, Colo., he is one of four children of Joseph and Barbara Martinez. Martinez has two brothers and one sister, all older. He is a rangeland ecology and watershed management major at UW.

2011-12: Zehner had a very successful redshirt freshman season, earning four top-three finishes in tournaments. He wrestled 13 ranked wrestlers and won five of those matches. He finished second at the West Regional to earn his first automatic NCAA bid. He had nine falls on the season, fourth among the UW starters and scored 44 dual points, second on the team.

2010-11: One of UW's top redshirts during the season, Zehner posted an impressive resume at 133 pounds in his first season in the program. He finished 25-3 with three tournament titles and a 4-2 mark against the WWC, while notching a team-high 12 pins to go with three major decisions.

Zehner opened with a second-place finish at the Northwest Open in early November, but wouldn't lose again until January. 2011-12: Onufer cemented his legacy as one of UW's all-time greats this season, eclipsing 30 wins for a third time. He won his fourth WWC crown, the only UW wrestler to accomplish that feat and finished his career unbeaten in conference matches, 38-0. He was named WWC Wrestler of the Week two times and won four tournaments. He lost only one match in the regular season and now is fifth in career wins in Wyoming history with 137.

2010-11: Onufer was a major part of UW's historic team success during the 2010-11 campaign. He earned his first All-America honor en route to posting a 34-4 overall record, including 16-2 in duals, with nine pins and seven major decisions. He also won his third consecutive West Regional title and qualified for his third consecutive NCAA tournament.

Seeded seventh entering the national tournament, Onufer went 5-2 to place fifth. Onufer qualified for the NCAAs after another dominant performance at the West Regional to earn his third first-team All-WWC accolade. During the tournament he also became the 10th UW wrestler to earn more than 100 career victories. After the season, he was named UW's Everett Lantz Most Outstanding Wrestler.

2009-10: In his sophomore year, Onufer was a major part of the Wyoming team that won the 2010 NCAA West Regional team title, as well as the 2010 WWC Regular Season Dual team title.

He posted an overall record of 28-7 at 165 pounds, 9-0 in the WWC and 10-3 in duals. Onufer scored 48 team dual points and for the season had eight pins, one technical fall, as well as 10 major decisions. He was also clearly dominant at his weight class within the league. He won five of six dual matches by bonus-point margin (two pins, two major decisions and a tech fall).

At the 2010 NCAA Tournament, Onufer earned the No. 8 seed, but ended his season with a disappointing 1-2 record at the event.

2008-09: Onufer qualified for the NCAA Tournament and won the 174-pound title at the West Regional/WWC Tournament as a redshirt freshman.

He went 2-2 at the NCAA Tournament and beat tough opponents from Virginia Tech and Penn. Onufer finished the year with a season record of 44-11. That mark tied him for fifth on UW's All-Time Single Season Victories list with Wes Gasner (1982-83).

2007-08: Onufer turned heads during his redshirt year with an overall record of 15-2, including seven pins and five major decisions.

High School: Onufer was a two-time Washington state champion and was a Cadet Freestyle and Greco-Roman Nationals All-American, placing third in both. Onufer was undefeated his senior season and won the Rocky Mountain Regional and the Tri-State Tournament. He also pinned his way through the state tournament his senior year. Onufer was runner-up at state his sophomore year and fourth as a freshman. Onufer also lettered twice in olympic weightlifting.

Personal: Born June 29, 1989 in Tacoma, Wash., he is the son of Tatiana Grace and Craig Onufer. His father Craig, wrestled at South Dakota State and earned All-American honors there. Onufer has one sister, Michalle. He is a communication major at UW.

2011-12: Martinez earned another trip to the NCAA Championships by dominating at the West Regional and earning 34 wins overall. He had four top-four finishes in tournaments and rolled through the conference dual slate, going unbeaten in WWC duals. He was second on the team with 34 wins and now has 63 victories in just two years for UW.

2010-11: Martinez had a solid first campaign with the Cowboys, as he finished 29-15 overall and 8-7 in duals to earn a West Regional title and trip to the NCAA Championships. He started the season at 165 pounds, but moved up to 174 in December and earned the starting nod. Martinez collected a team-high 10 major decisions to go with one pin and one technical fall while posting a 10-3 mark against the WWC.

Martinez went 1-2 in his first trip to the national tournament. He opened with a 10-3 loss to Minnesota's Scott Glasser, before notching a 12-3 major decision over Liberty's Royal Brettrager. His tournament ended with a 9-4 loss to No. 12 Mike Benefiel of Oklahoma State.

Martinez won his first West Regional title and first-team All-WWC honors with a major decision and two decisions at the tournament, after going 8-5 down the stretch in the dual season. He opened the 2010-11 campaign by winning the Northwest Open and placing second at the Cowboy Open. He went 2-2 at the Kaufman-Brand Open, but rebounded with a third-place showing at the UNK Loper Open. Martinez also went 3-2 at the Reno Tournament of Champions.

2009-10: Martinez used his redshirt season in his first year at UW and in open tournaments he was sometimes dominant. His record was 17-3 while competing at 165 and 174 pounds. He had one technical fall and five major decisions.

Martinez placed either first or second in every tournament he entered. He won his weight class at the Northwest Wyoming Open and the Northern Colorado Open, and was second at the Cowboy Open, the UNK Loper Open and the Utah Valley Open.

In the summer prior to starting college, he placed at Junior Nationals in both Freestyle (4th) and Greco (7th).

High School: Martinez was the 160-pound California state champion as a senior and place-winner (sixth) as a junior in arguably one of the most difficult state high school events in the nation. He is a two-time Freestyle and Greco Roman State Champion, as well as a place-winner at the Reno Tournament of Champions. His high school team, Temecula Valley, won the CIF championship four straight years and the Southern Section Masters championship those same years. Martinez was a California Triple Crown winner in 2007 and the California FILA Greco Roman state champion. Many other schools recruited him, but he chose UW over the likes of Missouri and Maryland.

Personal: Martinez is the son of Anthony Martinez and Barbara Morlan. His birthday is April 5, 1990. Martinez is a social science major at UW.

Joe LeBlanc

Senior - 184 Pounds
Meeker, Colo.

Four-Time NCAA Qualifier

2011-12: LeBlanc became the Wyoming all-time leader in wins with 143 and finished in the top two in four tournaments. He lost just one match in the regular season and beat nine ranked wrestlers, en route to making his fourth trip to the NCAAs and winning the West Regional crown for the third time. He will end his career as one of UW's most talented and decorated student-athletes.

2010-11: LeBlanc racked up another impressive season as a junior, as he became UW's third three-time All-American with a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Ranked in the top six in the nation all year, he finished 29-3 overall and 17-1 in duals at 184 pounds with nine pins, nine major decisions and three technical falls. He went 8-1 versus the WWC.

Fifth-seeded LeBlanc pinned Purdue's AJ Kissel in 6:41 to open the national tournament, but had his national title hopes dashed after losing to No. 12 Grant Gambrell of Iowa in the second round. He rebounded with four straight wins on the second day, including two major decisions, to advance through the consolation bracket, but missed weight on the final day due to a scale malfunction and was forced to forfeit his final two matches.

2009-10: LeBlanc had a dominant sophomore year, earning his second All-America honor after placing fourth at the 2010 NCAA Championships. At the national tournament, he made waves in possibly the deepest weight class by beating the No. 2 seed John Dergo from Illinois in the quarterfinals and narrowly losing in the semifinals to the eventual national champion, Max Askren of Missouri. He was the 2010 Western Wrestling Conference Wrestler of the Year.

2008-09: LeBlanc exploded onto the college wrestling scene and became the first-ever freshman All-American in the history of Wyoming wrestling by placing fifth in the 184-pound weight class at the 2009 NCAA Championships. He was the first All-American in 13 years for UW's wrestling program and the 24th in school history. LeBlanc earned a spot into the NCAA Championships by winning the 184-pound West Regional title. He posted a 45-8 overall record, which included a 15-2 mark in dual action and 7-0 against WWC opponents. He won three tournament titles in 2008-09 and scored a team-high 68 team points in duals.

His 45 wins tied for third-place on UW's single-season victories list with Wes Gasner, who had 45 wins during the 1983-84 season. A winner of numerous awards, he was named the WWC Freshman of the Year, was voted to the Amateur Wrestling News All-Rookie First Team, was D1CollegeWrestling.net's West Region Freshman of the Year and earned a spot on their national All-Freshman Team.

2007-08: LeBlanc was one of 10 Cowboys who used his redshirt year. Competing as an individual, he had a record of 8-6, with four pins and three major decisions. LeBlanc wrestled at 165 pounds most of the year.

High School: LeBlanc was a three-time Colorado state champion and the state tournament's 2006 Most Outstanding Wrestler. His wrestling team won three state titles. He was a junior All-American wrestler, an all-state football player, all-conference baseball player and was on the honor roll for three years while at Meeker. His overall record while at Meeker was 130-23 and he recorded 90 pins.

2011-12: Hernandez finished the season as the Cowboys' leader in wins and major decisions.

He proved he was fully recovered from back surgery the season before and made huge strides from his previous years to earn a 3-2 record against ranked opposition. He is one of UW's strongest and most well-conditioned wrestlers, a trait which no doubt contributed to his success.

2010-11: Hernandez redshirted the 2010-11 season and did not compete in any open tournaments after having back surgery. In the classroom, he was named to the WWC Coaches' Honor Roll. He has a two-year record of 45-34, with four total falls.

2009-10: Hernandez started for his second straight year and saw action as a sophomore at both 197 and heavyweight. He continued to improve and his overall season record was 22-16. The 2010 NCAA West Regional was bittersweet for Hernandez. He entered the event seeded No. 2 at 197, but suffered a shocking loss in the opening round. Hernandez battled back in the consolation bracket with his first pin of the season, then followed that up with his second win by fall of the year. Having seen his chances of qualifying for nationals go south in the first round, a frustrated Hernandez then beat No. 3 seed Dustin Bauman (UNI) by decision, 9-3. He placed third with the win and won the tournament's Most Pins award. Those back-draw wins and the bonus points he scored were vital to the Pokes winning the 2010 West Regional team title. Hernandez also played a big part in UW winning the 2010 Western Wrestling Conference regular-season dual team title. He placed third at the Cowboy Open and sixth at Reno. Named to the WWC All-Academic team, Hernandez posted a perfect 4.0 GPA in the spring of 2010.

2008-09: A raw talent, Hernandez was immediately thrust into the Cowboy lineup at 197 pounds as a true freshman. He placed third at the West Regional tournament, earning Third Team All-WWC honors, and forced a true second place match for a trip to the NCAA Tournament, losing in a competitive effort. His overall record was 23-19, 8-8 in duals and 3-4 in the WWC. Hernandez recorded two pins, four major decisions and got a key win for the Cowboys against Cal State Fullerton (6-3) to help secure a team dual win. He was diligent in the classroom at UW, being named to the WWC Coaches' Honor Roll.

High School: Hernandez was a two-time Idaho state champion, once at 189 and once at 215. He placed fifth as a sophomore and took third at the Junior Nationals in Virginia Beach, Va. Hernandez was a NHSCA Jr. All-American. As a senior, Hernandez was ranked as high as sixth in the nation by InterMat.com and collected 106 wins in his high school career. He only began wrestling as a freshman. Hernandez was a four-time letterwinner in wrestling, three-time letterwinner in track and a two-time letterwinner in football at Blackfoot High School. He graduated with a 3.7 GPA, was a member of the National Honor Society and was Student Body Activity Manager.

Personal: Hernandez was born on Nov. 24, 1989. He is the son of Alfonso Hernandez and Lori Galvan. He married his wife Stephanie on Aug. 16, 2008, in Blackfoot, Idaho. They are the proud parents of son, Aiden, born on Feb. 22, 2009. Hernandez is majoring in kinesiology and health promotion at UW.
