## University of Wyoming Cowgirl Volleyball Notes ... 4/4/4

### Player and Team Notes

-The Cowgirls return three starters (Dani Bedore, JennaRae Jester, Lauren Whitney) along with one other returning letterwinner, who saw significant playing time in 2008. In all, they return four letterwinners.

-Of those returning players, all four played in 24 matches or more in 2008, including one junior and three sophomores.

-One of those top returners is junior Dani Bedore, who led the team in kills (3.06 kpg), which was third in the league, points (3.57 ppg) and service aces (.19 sapg). In conference matches, she averaged 3.20 kps, which was fourth in the MWC, in addition to averaging 3.76 points and .25 service aces.

-Two other individuals that will play in the mix are outside hitter Lauren Whitney and middle blocker JennaRae Jester. Whitney averaged 2.90 kills and almost one dig, while playing in 24 matches during her sophomore campaign. Jester led the way in hitting percentage (.203) and blocks with 61 (.65 bps). Senior Jessica Kagarise and redshirt freshman Nikky Sapp will also be looked upon to contribute

-Wyoming returns five of seven major statistical category leaders to the team from a year ago. Bedore was first in kills, service aces and points, while Jester led the way in blocks and hitting percentage. They will look to rebuild in a couple of key areas mainly assists and digs with the loss of setter Tasha Weishahn and libero Carissa Lee to graduation.

-The Cowgirls welcome eight newcomers, seven freshmen and one junior college transfer, to this year's squad. Makenzie Bartsch (6-1, MB, Casper, Wyo.); Camille Coffman (6-3, MB/OPP, Peculiar, Mo.); Brianna Crowe (5-3, LIB, Casper, Wyo.); Barbara Lasic (5-9, S, Livno, Bosnia); Calli Miller (6-1, OH, Bullard, Texas); Jodi Purdy (5-11, OH, Winterset, Iowa); Reese Roehrkasse (6-2, MB, Ft. Collins, Colo.) and Emily Rochelle (6-1, MB/OH, Casper, Wyo.) will join the team this fall.

-Wyoming schedule features two teams that participated in the 2008 NCAA Tournament, both who come from the Mountain West Conference in Colorado State and Utah. Both also finished the season ranked in the final AVCA Coaches Poll.

-They will also play in four pre-season tournaments to start out the season before venturing into MWC play. UW will host the UniWyo Cowgirl Classic, August 28-29, with competition against Idaho State, Rutgers and South Dakota State. That will be followed by the UniWyo Cowgirl Invite, Sept. 4-5, with Fresno State, Montana State and North Dakota coming to Laramie. Out on the road for the first time in 2009, they will travel to Arizona for the NAU Fiesta Bowl Classic with matches against The Citadel, Northern Arizona and Utah State. Things get wrapped up Sept. 18-19 at the New Hampshire tournament. They will play Arizona State, Harvard and the host school New Hampshire.

-Four individuals garnered Academic All-MWC honors this past season as well. JennaRae Jester, Carissa Lee, Tasha Weishahn and Lauren Whitney all earned the award.

**MWC Announces Post Season Honors:** The Mountain West All-Conference Volleyball awards as selected by the league's nine head coaches were announced Tuesday, November 25. New Mexico senior Jeanne Fairchild and Utah senior Lori Baird were named Co-Players of the Year, while UNLV's Cursty Jackson was voted Freshman of the Year, and Utah's Beth Launiere was selected Coach of the Year.

**Last Time Out:** In their final match of the season, the Wyoming Cowgirl Volleyball team (5-20 overall, 4-12 in the MWC) fell in three sets (19-25, 20-25, 16-25) against the BYU Cougars (14-12 overall, 7-9 in the MWC) in Provo.

Wyoming was led by sophomore Dani Bedore with a match high 16 kills, while hitting .250 (16-6-40). Lauren Whitney finished with six kills and two block assists and Jenna Arneson added five kills. As a team, the Cowgirls hit just .115 (33-21-104) and had four total blocks.

The Cougars were led by Rachel Dyer and Kayla Walker with ten kills each. Dyer hit a match high .500 (10-1-18) while Walker finished with 12 digs. BYU hit .356 (44-13-87) for the match and had nine total team blocks.

BYU jumped out early in the match to a 6-2 advantage. The Cowgirls battled back by scoring six of the next seven to pull ahead by one, 8-7. After the Cougars scored the next two points, Wyoming went on a 6-2 run to make their lead three, 14-11. BYU responded with a 7-2 run of their own to regain a two-point lead, 18-16. They would never look back as the Cowgirls were only able to score three points as the Cougars took the first set 25-19.

In the second set, the Cougars scored the first four points before Wyoming scored their first. They would extend the lead to six, 8-2. The Cowgirls scored the next three to pull within three, 8-5, but BYU continued to maintain that three to four point margin. After Wyoming closed the margin to 14-11, the Cougars scored five unanswered to extend the lead to eight, 19-11. The Cowgirls tried to battle back and scored the next 7 of 11 to pull within five, 23-18. Unfortunately, their comeback would fall short as BYU win the set, 25-20.

The Cougars stormed out to a 7-3 lead to begin the third set, but the Cowgirls scored three of the next five to pull to within two, 9-7. BYU answered with an 8-3 run to extend the lead back to seven, 17-10. Despite playing even the remainder of the way, the Cowgirls would fall 25-16 in the set and 3-0 in the match.

# Carrie Yerty

(Washington State, 1992)

University of Wyoming, Head Volleyball Coach

Carrie Yerty, who spent 12 years at the University of Memphis, is entering her second season as the head coach with the Wyoming Cowgirl program. She was named the head coach on January 22, 2008 and is the 12th head coach in school history.

In her first season with the Cowgirls, they went 5-20 overall and 4-12 in league play. She recorded her first victory at the University of Wyoming over Cleveland State (9/13/08), while her first Mountain West Conference win came with a 3-0 sweep of the Utah Utes (9/20/08). Four Cowgirls earned Academic All-MWC.

The longest tenured head coach in Memphis volleyball history, she posted the best record among all Conference USA head volleyball coaches from 2001-2007, accumulating a 164-77 (.680) record during that time span. She is also the winningest volleyball coach in University of Memphis history, posting a career head-coaching mark of 233-174 (.572). Under Yerty's leadership, she amassed 123 wins in the previous five seasons, including a school record 30-6 finish in 2003 and two appearances in the C-USA Championship title match.

In 2007, she helped lead Memphis to another 20-win season with a mark of 23-12 overall and an 11-5 record in conference play. Three Tigers garnered post-season honors, including Shelby Burton who was named AVCA All-Midwest Region for the second straight year. She was also named First Team All-Conference USA, while her teammates Laura Côté and Ashley Liford were recognized on the Second Team.

Under her guidance in 2006, the Tiger volleyball program produced three AVCA All-Americans and First Team All-Conference USA performers in Shelby Burton, Laura Côté and Heather Watts. In other post-season honors, Christen Clayton was tabbed as the conference's Libero of the Year and Heather Watts was the Setter of the Year. Yerty's emphasis on athletic performance and academic achievement resulted in ESPN The Magazine naming Côté and Clayton to their list of Academic All-District honorees, as well as Ashley Liford's selection to the C-USA All-Academic Team. In addition to individual student-athlete academic honors, her teams have been recognized three times by the AVCA for their team GPAs. The 2006 team received the C-USA Sport Academic Award after posting a 3.485 GPA for the 2006-07 school year—the highest GPA ever to be recorded by any team in Memphis history. The squad also garnered the Game Plan/AVCA Team Academic Award for the second consecutive year. The 2005 squad was tabbed as one of 54 Division teams to win the Game Plan/AVCA Team Academic Award. The 2005 Tiger team had a 3.327 cumulative GPA for the school year.

Yerty began the rebuilding process when she took the helm of the Tiger volleyball program on July 15, 1996, replacing former head coach Penny Lucas-White less than six weeks before the start of the season. She inherited a squad that finished 13-20 the previous year and featured just five returning players. In her first year, the Tigers finished 8-27 overall and 1-13 in Conference USA.

In just her second season as head coach, Yerty made one of the biggest turnarounds in the program's history. Never had a Tiger squad won less than 10 matches one year and finished above .500 the next. She guided the 1997 Tigers to a 19-14 overall record, 6-10 conference mark and a fourth place finish, including a victory over the Australian National Team at the Montana State Tournament. The Tigers also made strides in the Conference USA postseason tournament, winning their first-round meeting with UAB and advancing to the second round, where they dropped a 3-1 decision to top-seeded and eventual NCAA participant Houston.

In 1998, Yerty led her team to their first win in school history over the University of Houston, and for the second-straight season, Memphis advanced to the second round of the C-USA Tournament. The Tigers finished the season with an 18-14 overall record and a 6-10 mark in conference. It was the first time since 1994 that a Tiger volleyball team had recorded back-to-back winning seasons. Memphis had its second All-Conference USA honoree in 2001 when senior Armie Hamilton earned Second Team accolades, the first Tiger to earn an all-conference honor under Yerty and the first to do so since 1995.

Yerty saw her commitment to long-term success move forward in 2003 when she guided the Tigers to a 30-6 mark and its' first-ever appearance in the Conference USA Championship match. That team was just the second team in C-USA history to hit the 30-win mark. The Tigers' .833 winning percentage was the best single-season mark in school history. Three student-athletes were named to the Conference USA All-Conference teams in 2003. Senior Brittany Barnett was named to the Second Team, while Heather Watts and Tiara Gilkey both earned Third Team honors. For her stellar senior campaign, Watts garnered C-USA Setter of the Year and First Team honors, while Gilkey earned Second Team All-Conference accolades that same year.

Yerty led Memphis to its second-consecutive 25-win season in 2004, as the Tigers advanced to the semifinals of the Conference USA Tournament for the second-straight year. Memphis' 27-10 mark in 2004 marked the third time since 1990 that the Tigers won 27 matches in a school-best 7-0 start. The .730 winning percentage is the third-highest since 1994.

Through it all, Yerty continued to stress academic excellence as well as athletic achievement. Heather Watts earned her third-straight Academic All-District First Team honor in 2004. Watts became the program's second Academic All-America recipient, earning Third Team honors in 2003 and First Team in 2004. Watts joined former Tiger April Harriman, who earned Second Team honors in 2000, as the program's Academic All-America honorees. Watts also earned ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American Second Team honors in 2004, before receiving an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship, which was the first ever in school history. Over her 12 seasons, Yerty blazed recruiting trails that have resulted in four Academic All-America honorees, seven All-Conference USA honorees, two C-USA All-Freshman Team honorees, one C-USA Defensive Player of the Year, one C-USA Libero of the Year and four AVCA All-Region and three AVCA All-American honorable mentions. Additionally, since the 1996-97 school year, players on Yerty's squads that have completed their eligibility have received their college diplomas at a 93 percent clip.

Prior to becoming the Tigers' head coach, Yerty was an assistant coach at the University of Arizona during the 1995 season where, among her on-court coaching duties, she also served as the recruiting coordinator. One of her recruiting classes at the University of Arizona was ranked in the top five in the nation by recruiting magazines. On the court, she worked closely with the squad's middle blockers as she helped lead the Wildcats to a 14-14 overall record. She also supervised the academic study table and assisted with scheduling and travel, as well as working closely with camps and clinics. Yerty broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1992 when she accepted an assistant coaching position at Eastern Washington in Cheney, Wash. Yerty served under former head coach

Yerty's coaching background goes much deeper than the collegiate level. She, along with her husband, Lee, founded the Northwest All-Star Volleyball Touring Camp in 1991, in which they managed and conducted in excess of 25 customized instructional clinics and camps for junior high and high school athletes and coaches. Two years later, Yerty founded and coached the New Balance Volleyball Club team in Spokane, Wash., for girls 16 and under. She directed that squad from 1993-95, and then served as the head coach for one year of the Club Cactus Juniors Volleyball Club in Tucson, Ariz., for the 18-Elite age group. A seasoned club team coach, Yerty was selected as a representative on the Junior Olympic National Team selection committee, evaluating and selecting players for the elite squad at the Southern California tryout. Yerty has been very active in the community with FCA and has volunteered at several FCA camps for young women. She also served a three-year term on the AVCA Coaches' Committee and chaired the Policy and Procedures Committee with the AVCA.

As a college student-athlete, the former Carrie Couturier (Yerty) was a four-year standout as a middle blocker during her collegiate days at Washington State University. She earned Pac-10 All-Freshman honors following the 1988 season when she set a school record with 69 solo blocks. In 1991, she earned First Team All-Pac-10 honors in her final collegiate season after helping the Cougars to a 23-12 finish and a then school-best fourth-place showing in the Pac-10. As a senior, she led the Pac-10 in hitting percentage (.333) and in service aces (55). She was third in the league in kills with 432 and ranked fourth with an average of 3.8 kills per game. An All-West Regional and Honorable Mention All-America selection, Yerty received an invitation to participate on the U.S. Olympic Developmental Team in San Diego in 1992. Yerty is currently second in school history in career kills (1,548), while holding the school marks in solo blocks (196) and block assists (431). In the Pac-10, Yerty still ranks as the league's sixth all-time blocker with 617 total blocks, while also ranking second in all-time solo blocks (196). Most recently, Yerty was named to the Pac-10 All-Decade Team, as well as the WSU All-Decade Team.

A standout at Sam Barlow High School in Boring, Ore., she was named to the Reebok All-America team and was Oregon's Female Athlete of the Year in 1988. Yerty also played on the Portland Volleyball Club while in high school. Her squad is still the only club outside of California to ever win the Davis Volleyball Festival, which continues to rate as the largest women's athletic event in the world.

A 1992 graduate of Washington State, Yerty earned her degree in secondary education. She then completed her graduate studies to earn her master's degree in sport and leisure commerce from the University of Memphis in December of 2004. Born March 4, 1970, she is married to Lee Yerty, who is the Director of Operations for the Cowgirls. The couple has two sons, WesLee, Jace and Cade, who was born June 17, 2008.

## **Jill Stucky**

### **Assistant Volleyball Coach, Wyoming, 1996**

Jill (Jones) Stucky is beginning her second season as an assistant coach at the University of Wyoming. Stucky came from the University of Kansas in Lawrence where she spent ten seasons as an assistant coach. Among her many duties, she was the main recruiting coordinator, travel coordinator, responsible for opponent scouting and video breakdown, along with being a liaison for the student-athletes with many facets of the athletics department such as team equipment, housing, academic services and the training room. In 2004, she had one of the Top Ten recruiting classes in the country. She was also the Big XII Conference Representative for the Assistant Coaches Committee through the American Volleyball Coaches Association. One of their best seasons was a 22-11 overall record and a third place finish in the Big XII in 2003. They also made three NCAA Appearances.

Prior to that, she spent one season as an assistant coach at Barton County Community College in Great Bend, Kan., under current Kansas head coach Ray Bechard. During that year, she helped the Cougars to a 59-3 record and a Final Four appearance at the NJCAA Tournament. Her duties included assisting with practice, strength and conditioning, along with day to day operations. While at BCCC, she also served as an athletics academic advisor on top of her coaching duties. As an athletics academic advisor, she oversaw the academic advisement for baseball, men's and women's track and volleyball.

Her playing career began at the University of Wyoming where she was a three-year letterwinner for the Cowgirls. She was a team captain as a junior. In 1994, she helped the Cowgirls to a 17-13 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. As a senior, she led the team in service aces, digs and kills, and still ranks among the Top 15 in each of those categories in school history. She also holds the record for digs in a three-game match. An excellent student, she earned Western Athletic Conference Scholar Athlete honors in addition to being named to the School of Education's Dean's List. Stucky received a bachelor of arts and sciences degree in English from Wyoming in 1996 and continued her education by earning a master's degree in sports administration from Kansas in 2002.

She has also been involved in several volleyball camps throughout the region. She has worked camps at Wichita State, Wyoming, Colorado State and Barton County Community College in addition to the University of Kansas camps and satellite clinics.

Her coaching experience also reaches beyond the collegiate ranks, as she previously served as the head coach of the USAV Sport-2-Sport 17-and-Under Elite Team in Lawrence, Kan., and the 18-and-Under Elite Volleytech Sports Club team in Great Bend, Kan. She was also the head coach of the Snowy Range 18-and-Under Volleyball Club team in Laramie, Wyo. in 1997.

She and her husband, Kyle, were married in the spring of 2002. They have two daughters, Alexis and Madeline.

## **Tony Suñga**

### **Assistant Volleyball Coach, Drake, 1988**

Tony Suñga is entering his second season as an assistant coach with the Wyoming Volleyball program. Suñga came to Wyoming from Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa where he spent two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. His duties included recruitment of student athletes, practice and match preparation along with the day to day operations of the program. It was his second stint with the Bulldogs as he also served as a graduate assistant with the program in 1991 and 1992. During that time, he was also the head coach of the USA Volleyball-Iowa High Performance team. He trained some of the top players in Iowa to compete in an international style of competition. Suñga also served as an educator in the Des Moines Public Schools, which he had done since 1992.

From 2002-2006, he was the head coach and setter's coach for the Iowa Power Volleyball Alliance and also served as the head coach at Des Moines Lincoln High School (2001-04), which is the largest high school in the Des Moines Public School District. In 2004, he also served as a volunteer assistant coach at Iowa State. Prior to that, he spent seven years with the highly successful volleyball and basketball programs at Simpson College (Indianola, Iowa) as an assistant coach.

Suñga is a 1988 graduate of Drake, earning his bachelor's degree in international relations and political science and his master's in teaching in 1992. As an undergraduate, he served as a manager for Drake men's basketball team under former coach Gary Garner. He also helped restart the Drake men's volleyball club and was a setter/middle blocker on the team.

He has been a member of the USA-Iowa Region Volleyball Association since 1984 and was honored in 2006 by the Iowa Region of the United States Volleyball Association for Meritorious Service. Suñga has also been involved in several camps including Drake, Iowa HP and Simpson College among others.

## **Lee Yerty**

### **Director of Volleyball Operations, Washington State, 1986**

Lee Yerty, who is a 23 veteran of Division I Athletics, begins his second year at the University of Wyoming. He joined the Cowgirl staff after spending 11 years at the University of Memphis as an assistant strength and conditioning coach. He oversaw several sports including the Tiger volleyball program, and for two years he was the Director of Strength and Conditioning for Olympic Sports. He also served as an assistant for women's athletics where he was responsible for game management of the Tiger volleyball and Lady Tiger basketball squads.

Prior to Memphis, he served as the marketing director at Eastern Washington University for two years before being elevated to an assistant athletics director. He was in charge of marketing, fundraising, event management along with daily administrative planning and other functions. In 1995, he was an assistant volleyball coach for Pamela Parks at EWU.

From 1985-90, Yerty was an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Washington State University in Pullman, Wash. Yerty earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science in 1986 and his master's degree in education administration in 1988 both from Washington State University. A member of the Washington State football team (1983-85), he was also a First Team All-State athlete in football and pole vault in the state of Washington. A native of Naches, Wash., Yerty and his wife, Carrie, have three sons WesLee, Jace, and Cade.
