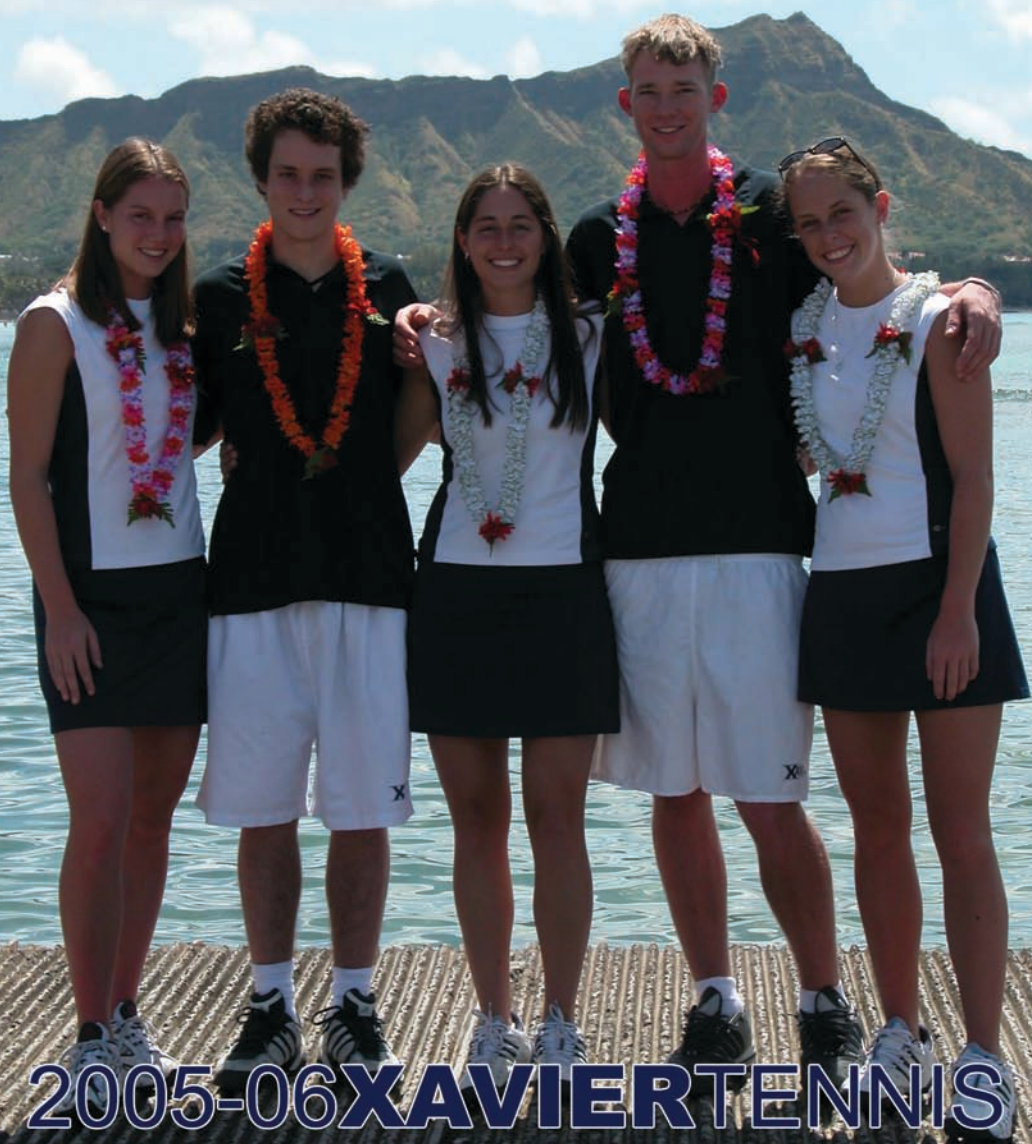

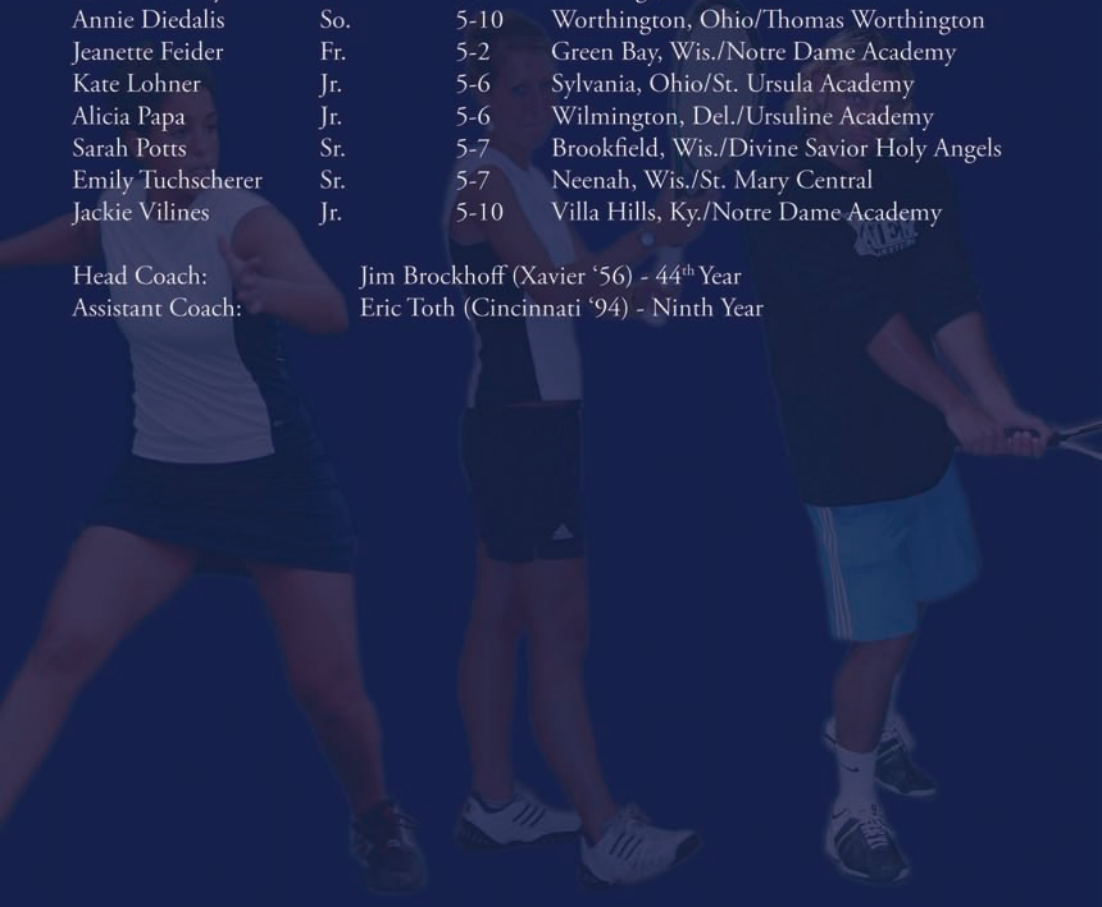

XAVIER'S JESUIT TRADITION

Xavier University provides a personalized education in the tradition of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). It is an education that goes far beyond the knowledge found in books. A Xavier education incorporates values and strengthens the body, mind and spirit of its students, teaching them to live for others and become leaders in our global society.

A Xavier education today is best characterized by its emphasis on the liberal arts with a traditional Jesuit core curriculum, which includes a minimum of 64-credit hours. Eighty percent of the university's full-time faculty hold the highest degree attainable in their field. Students choose from more than 69 undergraduate majors in three colleges, graduate degrees in 11 areas and a doctorate program in psychology. The student/faculty ratio is 13:1 and the average class size is 22 students.

U.S. News & World Report has ranked Xavier among the top 10 Midwest Masters colleges and universities for 10 consecutive years, including second in the latest issue. XU is also ranked among "The Best 357 Colleges in America" by *The Princeton Review*.



Xavier University ranks second in the nation in overall student-athlete graduation rates. Xavier's five-year graduation rate for student-athletes is 78%, versus the national average of 62% for similar sized, selective private colleges. Both the men's and women's tennis teams have been great examples of Xavier's academic accomplishments. Last season the women's team carried a G.P.A. of 3.7, while the men's side boasted a 3.1.

JIM BROCKHOFF

Head Coach • Xavier (1956) • 44th Year



Jim Brockhoff is in his 44th season as the men's head coach and 33rd season as the women's head coach. Last season, Brockhoff, the only coach the women's team has ever had, led the women to a third place finish at the Atlantic 10 Championship with 17-7 record overall. The men posted a 9-13 record and finished fourth in the conference tournament, which included a thrilling 4-3 win over George Washington in the quarterfinals.

"Once again, I am looking forward to starting the season because it is great to be able to see our teams perform so well academically as well as on the tennis court," said Brockhoff. "We lost some great senior leadership, but I know that with the combination of our talented

newcomers and seasoned veterans we will prove to be up to the challenge."

Brockhoff earned Midwestern Collegiate Conference's Women's Coach of the Year honors in 1991 and 1994. From 1991-94, XU finished second in the MCC behind nationally ranked Notre Dame. He led the women's squad to a perfect 11-0 dual match record in the fall and a 17-3 mark for the 1994-95 season. Brockhoff led the women's team to a record-high 21 wins for the 2003-04 season. He also coached XU's first-ever men's and women's conference champions in Jen Becker and John Pucin as well as its first ever Atlantic 10 Most Outstanding Performer and Most Outstanding Rookie Performer when Lauren Clary was honored at the conclusion of the 2001-02 season.

Brockhoff has enjoyed numerous highlights as a coach, including an 18-match win streak for the men's team during 1988-89 that led to a school record 22 wins (22-3) and a second place finish in the MCC Championships. The men's team also enjoyed a 22-match winning streak during the 1971 and 1972 seasons. He took two players to the 1971 NCAA Championships in singles and doubles. His players' opponents that year included Jimmy Connors and Jeff Austin.

The winning began for Brockhoff during his playing days at XU. Brockhoff, a 1956 Xavier graduate and three-year letterman, set the XU all-time record for highest winning percentage, a mark of 92 percent (46-4) over 50 matches.

Brockhoff, who was elected to the Xavier Athletic Hall of Fame in 1981 and to the Greater Cincinnati Tennis Association Hall of Fame in the summer of 2005, is a familiar face in tennis outside of Xavier as well. As a player, Brockhoff has won city championships in junior, open and senior division levels in singles and doubles. He served as deputy referee at the Western and Southern Financial Group Tennis Masters Series from its arrival in the Queen City until 2004. He has umpired the finals of the Western and Southern Financial Group Master Series Cincinnati, while also working at the U.S. Open and the National Clay Court Championships. Brockhoff, who is also a referee for the national Father-Son Championships, is a popular tennis pro at Eastern Hills Indoor Tennis Club and Coldstream Country Club.

Brockhoff was honored at the 2004 XU/TAP Pro-Am as a group of former players announced the establishment of the Jim and Mary Brockhoff Tennis Scholarship. "The presentation was a great surprise and it is thrilling to be remembered by friends, past players and alumni," said Brockhoff. "The scholarship will be a tremendous asset to the program. Also, the scholarship is a great honor because it recognizes my wife, Mary, who has been an important part of our program's success."

Brockhoff, 71, and his wife Mary reside in Cincinnati and have five children (Beth, Brad, Brian, Anne and Maure) and eight grandchildren.



ERIC TOTH

Assistant Coach • Cincinnati (1994) • Ninth Year

Eric Toth is in his ninth year working with the Xavier University men's and women's tennis teams. "It has been great having Eric as an assistant coach for the past eight years because, in addition to being a great coach, he is also an outstanding person," said head coach Jim Brockhoff. "Eric not only has a thorough understanding of the game, he also has a great understanding of our student-athletes. He has done an outstanding job over the past eight years and will make a great head coach." Toth has taken on an increasing level of responsibility with both teams each year including heading up the recruiting and scheduling efforts.

Toth graduated from the University of Cincinnati in 1994 with a bachelor's degree in secondary education. He was twice named team MVP and ranks fifth in all-time career victories at UC. Prior to playing at UC, Toth was a state runner-up in doubles at Elder High School.

Toth, 34, serves as Director of Tennis at the Ridge Club and Eastern Hills Indoor Tennis Club. In addition, he assumes many volunteer responsibilities throughout the Greater Cincinnati Tennis Area and serves as the Vice President of the Greater Cincinnati Tennis Association.

- Head Coach Jim Brockhoff, in his 44th year at Xavier, has amassed 945 wins in his career at XU including a 529-312 record as head men's coach and 416-231 as head women's coach.

- The 2004-05 season included a week-long trip to Hawaii over spring break where each team played four matches and enjoyed the beautiful sights of the island of Oahu.

- The Xavier women's tennis team posted a 17-7 record in 2004-05 along with a third place finish at the Atlantic 10 Conference Championship. XU has now recorded 15 straight winning seasons and has finished in the top four of the A-10 in each of the last five years.

- XU's men's tennis team concluded the 2004-05 season with a 9-13 mark while taking fourth at the A-10 Championship. The fourth place finish was the Musketeers' sixth consecutive top five finish at the annual Conference Championship.

- Senior Kristen Clary and 2005 graduate Lauren Clary both earned a place on the All-Conference Team for 2004-05. In addition to being named All-Conference, Kristen and Lauren Clary along with '05 graduate Stephanie Bauer earned a spot on the A-10's six-member All-Academic Team. The honors did not end there for the Clary sisters as Kristen and Lauren were each named to the District IV All-Academic Team and went on to be honored on the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America Second Team.
