**THE X'S AND O'S**

- Xavier head coach **Sean Miller** and Miami head coach **Charlie Coles** coached together as assistants at Miami (Ohio) during the 1994-95 season under then head coach **Herb Sendek**.
- Xavier and Miami have battled 94 times on the hardwood, which is tied for the second-most games XU has played against any opponent.
- Xavier has won each of the last two meetings overall and each of the last three meetings at Millett Hall.
- Xavier won its 18th straight regular season opener by bashing Southeast Missouri State 90-59 on Saturday night at Cintas Center. Senior forward **Josh Duncan** led five Xavier players in double figures in scoring with 16 points, while sophomore forward **Derrick Brown** made his first collegiate start and scored a career-high 15 points.
- Xavier won the battle of the boards 54-36 over SEMO, including a game-high nine rebounds each from sophomore center **Jason Love** and junior forward **C.J. Anderson**, who started and made his XU debut. The board domination is even more impressive when you consider that XU lost each of its top three rebounders (**Justin Doellman**, **Justin Cage** and **Brandon Cole**) to graduation after last season.
- Xavier recorded its 64th sellout on Saturday in 106 games played so far at Cintas Center, which opened for the 2000-01 season. XU has averaged 10,011 fans for its 106 games played at the 10,250-seat Cintas Center. XU, which welcomed its millionth men's basketball fan to Cintas Center last season, is in its eighth season in its state-of-the-art on campus home.
- Xavier's senior backcourt duo of **Drew Lavender** and **Stanley Burrell** combined for 23 points, 12 assists and just one turnover in the win over Southeast Missouri State.
- Tonight's game is the first of 17 games that will be broadcast on FSN Ohio, the television home of Xavier basketball. This is the first of the 10 games that are part of the locally-produced Xavier package.

**THE SERIES:** Xavier leads the series 49-45, including wins in the last two meetings and six of the last seven meetings. Xavier and Miami have met 94 times, which is tied with Detroit for the second-most games for a Musketeer opponent. Dayton and XU have met 144 times.

**THE SERIES AT MILLETT HALL:** Miami is 28-17 against Xavier in games played in Oxford (15-6 against Xavier in games played at Millett Hall) but Xavier has won each of the last three meetings in Oxford, including a 75-65 win at Millett Hall in the 2005-06 season (12-11-05).

**LAST YEAR'S MEETING (XU 68-53 on Wednesday, November 29, 2006 at Cintas Center):** Xavier's backcourt duo of **Drew Lavender** and **Stanley Burrell** combined for 28 points and nine assists as the Musketeers beat local rival Miami 68-53 on Nov. 29, 2006 at Cintas Center. XU hit its first five shots from the field on the way to building a 35-26 halftime lead. Burrell scored 12 of his 15 points in the first half, including a pair of three-point bombs. Lavender scored nine of his 13 points before intermission to lead the Musketeer attack, connecting on 3-of-3 from three-point range. Xavier led by 13 points, 41-28, with 15:56 to go following a layup by senior forward **Justin Doellman**. Miami refused to go away, though, chipping away at the lead and getting as close as six points at 52-46 with under eight minutes left. Xavier answered with a 10-0 run over the next three minutes to take a commanding 62-46 lead as the teams approached the five-minute mark. Three-pointers by Burrell and **B.J. Raymond** helped fuel the rally and **Derrick Brown** finished off the run with a dunk. Xavier shot a season-high 54.5 percent from the field for the game, while holding Miami to 42.1 percent shooting, including 10.0 percent (2-of-20) from three-point territory.

**COACHING CONNECTIONS:** Xavier head coach **Sean Miller** and Miami head coach **Charlie Coles** coached together as assistants at Miami (Ohio) during the 1994-95 season,

the second of two seasons for Miller under then head coach **Herb Sendek**. Miami won the MAC that year and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. In the 1996-97 season, Miller followed Sendek to N.C. State while Coles took over as the Miami head coach. Xavier second-year assistant coach **James Whitford** spent 11 seasons at Miami, including 10 seasons under Coles before joining Miller's staff prior to last season. Xavier Director of Basketball Operations **Bill Comar** spent time at Miami as an academic coordinator and administrative assistant.

**FOR THE RECORD (MIAMI):** The Miami Red-Hawks, who finished 18-15 overall last season, won the Mid-American Conference Tournament Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, are playing their regular season opener.

**FOR THE RECORD (XAVIER):** Xavier, 25-9 overall last season and the Atlantic 10 Conference Regular Season Champion at 13-3, opened the 2007-08 season by rolling over visiting Southeast Missouri State on Saturday night, 90-59. Senior **Josh Duncan** led five Musketeers in double figures as he scored 16 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the field to go with seven rebounds, four assists, two blocks and two steals at a sold-out Cintas Center in Cincinnati. Sophomore **Derrick Brown** made his first collegiate start and added a career-high 15 points to go along with seven rebounds in 27 minutes of action. Junior **B.J. Raymond** came up big off the bench to score 15 points and tie his career best with four 3-pointers and set a new career mark with eight rebounds.

**ANOTHER OPENING ACT SUCCESS STORY:** Xavier has now won 18 straight regular season openers with its last loss in an opener coming in the 1989-90 "Sweet 16" season to Southern Utah State at Cincinnati Gardens (97-90 on Dec. 2, 1989). XU has won 17 straight home openers, including all eight at Cintas Center. The Musketeers are 4-0 in regular season openers under fourth-year head coach **Sean Miller**.

### KNOCKING ON THE RANKINGS' DOOR:

Xavier is ranked 28th (third among "others receiving votes") in the Associated Press Poll and 29th (fourth among "others receiving votes") in the USA Today/ESPN Poll.

**CHICAGO INVITATIONAL:** The SEMO game was the first of four games that Xavier plays as part of the 2007 Chicago Invitational Challenge. XU hosts a second round game against Coppin State on Tuesday, Nov. 20. XU will play Kent State in a third round game on Friday, Nov. 23 at Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. XU plays either Indiana or Illinois State on Saturday, Nov. 24 in the "championship round" at Sears Centre.

**EXHIBITION SUCCESS:** The Musketeers won their only public exhibition game 74-51 over NAIA power Georgetown College (Ky.) on Nov. 6 at Cintas Center. Senior **Josh Duncan** led the way in scoring with 18 points, while junior **C.J. Anderson** led all rebounders with 11 boards to go with four assists and five points.

### BASKETBALL TIMES ONCE AGAIN HAS XAVIER'S PROGRAM IN THE "TOP 10":

The Xavier men's basketball program is once again ranked among the "top 10" programs in the United States, according to the *Basketball Times* rankings released in a recent issue. In fact, the study, which BT has done every five years since 1997, shows that ninth-ranked XU is one of only four men's basketball programs that have ranked in the "top 10" in 1997, 2002 and 2007. The other three programs are Duke, North Carolina and Kansas. The top 10 programs in this year's rankings were: Duke, North Carolina, Florida, Stanford, Gonzaga, Michigan State, Creighton, Kansas, Xavier and Illinois.

**THE TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE:** Xavier, 25-9 last season, secured its second straight 20-win season last year, its 10th 20-win season in the last 11 years and its 20th 20-win season in the last 25 years. On the next page you can see the impressive 10-year and 25-year rankings for Xavier in NCAA appearances, 20-win seasons and winning percentage.

### CURRENT AND FUTURE CAREER 1,000-POINT SCORERS, INCLUDING ONE IN XU'S 1,000 POINT CLUB:

Senior **Stanley Burrell** is 25th on Xavier's all-time scoring list with 1,266 points and is just 10 points shy of taking over 24th place heading into the Miami game. Senior **Drew Lavender**, who scored 659 points in two years at Oklahoma and 390 points so far at Xavier, now has 1,049 career collegiate points. Xavier newcomer **C.J. Anderson**, who scored 752 points in his two seasons at Manhattan, is now at 765 collegiate points and is on target to reach 1,000 career collegiate points this season. **Josh Duncan** has 767 career points heading into the Miami game.

### ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE LAVENDER EARNING A SPOT AMONG THE BEST:

Xavier's 5-7 senior point guard **Drew Lavender** is a candidate for the prestigious Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard. "Drew has emerged as one of the premier players at his position in all of college basketball," said fourth-year head coach **Sean Miller**. In addition, he is on the list of candidates for two prestigious awards that bear the Naismith family name, the 50-member Naismith Trophy Pre-season "Watch List" and the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award, which is given annually to the best collegiate senior player 6-0 tall or shorter. The 2007-08 Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T preseason candidate watch list has been announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award is an award named in honor of James Naismith's daughter-in-law. Lavender, a 2007-08 preseason Atlantic 10 Conference First Team selection, a 2006-07 Atlantic 10 Conference Second Team selection and 2007 A-10 All-Championship Team pick, averaged 11.2 points and an Atlantic 10-best 4.8 assists per game in his first season as a Musketeer after transferring from Oklahoma.

**EXPERIENCE SUCCESS:** Four members of Xavier's starting lineup have combined to start

259 collegiate games: seniors **Drew Lavender** (93), **Stanley Burrell** (89), **C.J. Anderson** (44) and **Josh Duncan** (33). Redshirt sophomore **Derrick Brown**, the other member of the starting lineup, made his first collegiate start in the opener against Southeast Missouri State. The opener was also the first XU start and the first official Xavier game for Anderson, a transfer from Manhattan College who is a former standout at Cincinnati's Winton Woods High School.

**HIT THE ROAD:** Xavier is playing its first road game of the 2007-08 season. XU finished 11-8 away from Cintas Center last season, including 5-5 on opponent home courts and 6-3 at neutral sites.

**MAKE YOURSELF AT HOME:** Xavier plays a school record 17 regular season home games this season at Cintas Center. The previous high was 16 in both the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons. XU played 15 games at Cintas Center each of the last two seasons.

**LOOKING FOR ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SEASON AT CINTAS CENTER:** Xavier, off to a 1-0 start at Cintas Center this season, was 14-1 last season at Cintas Center. Xavier has compiled a 91-15 (.858) record in eight seasons at Cintas Center, including 46-10 (.821) against Atlantic 10 teams and 45-5 (.900) against non-conference teams. The only home setback last season was a semester exam week one-point loss to Bucknell.

**TOUGH TICKET:** Xavier has now sold out 64 home games since moving into Cintas Center, including the home opener this season and Saint Joseph's, Richmond, Temple, Charlotte and Dayton games last season.

**IMPRESSIVE TURNSTILE COUNTS:** Xavier has averaged 10,011 fans for its 106 games played so far in seven seasons at the 10,250-seat Cintas Center, which opened for the 2000-01 season. XU welcomed its millionth men's basketball fan to Cintas Center last season.

**LOOKING FOR MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS:** Xavier, 1-0 in its non-conference season so far, completed its 14-game regular season non-conference slate last season with a 10-4 record, including wins over Illinois, Kansas State, VCU and Villanova at neutral sites. XU wins at its home in Cintas Center included Arizona State and Miami (Ohio).

**TURN ON THE BRIGHT LIGHTS...STARTING TUESDAY ON FSN OHIO:** The Musketeers enjoyed plenty of big moments on television last season. Xavier was 8-1 last season and won eight straight games broadcast by ESPN networks. Also, XU's high-flying **Derrick Brown** made ESPN's "Top 10 Plays" twice and **Drew Lavender** once (February 3 for his half-court buzzer beater at the end of the first half against Charlotte). 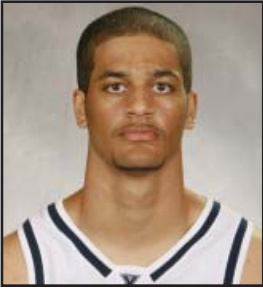

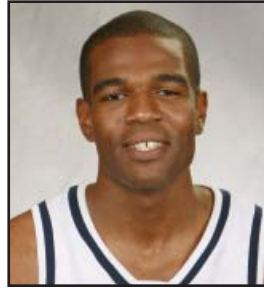

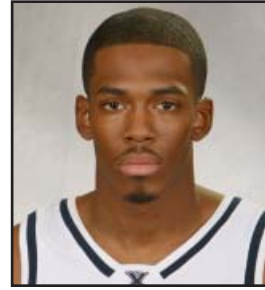

Head coach **Sean Miller**, 38, is coming off of his second straight 20-win season and his second straight NCAA Tournament appearance. Miller, who will celebrate his 39th birthday on Saturday, has raised his career record to 64-32 (.667), including 1-0 this season. Miller has won an Atlantic 10 Regular Season Championship (2007) and an A-10 Tournament Championship (2006).



Miller recently signed up to continue his success at Xavier for years to come. Xavier University and Miller have agreed to an extended contract that will run through the 2015-16 season. "We discussed our mutual desire to solidify Sean's leadership role within our men's basketball program," said Associate Vice President and Athletic Director **Mike Bobinski**. "Xavier wanted to communicate clearly to Sean how pleased we are with his leadership of this very visible component of the University. Our agreement is a comprehensive one that is designed to ensure that Sean and the entire program will have the continued ability to compete at the highest level of Division I basketball."

"I am very excited and look forward to continuing to lead our basketball program to greater success in our future together," said Miller.

Xavier finished 25-9 overall last season in Miller's third year as the Xavier University head coach. Xavier, which enjoyed its second straight 20-win season, won the 2007 Atlantic 10 Conference Regular Season Championship and advanced to the second round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament. Miller finished 21-11 in the 2005-06 season, winning the 2006 Atlantic 10 Championship and earning a berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Miller was certainly no stranger to the Xavier program or its players prior to taking over as head coach in 2004. Miller, who replaced Thad Matta, was Matta's right hand man the previous three seasons as XU's first-ever associate head coach. Miller helped XU record three straight 26-win seasons and three straight NCAA Tournament appearances that culminated in the 2004 "Elite Eight" run.

It's no surprise that Xavier enjoyed more late season success under Miller last season. In fact, since he came to Xavier for the 2001-02 season, Xavier has recorded a 29-9 (.763) record for the month of March, an impressive record that is second only to Kansas in all of NCAA Division I.

Miller came to Xavier after coaching stops at North Carolina State, Pittsburgh, Miami (Ohio) and Wisconsin. Miller has now coached on 12 teams that have advanced to postseason play in his first 15 seasons as a head coach, an assistant or an associate head coach. That now includes five NCAA Tournaments in his six years at Xavier.

The rest of the Miller family is no stranger to the coaching ranks. His father, John, is the former long-time successful coach at Blackhawk High School in the Pittsburgh area and his brother Archie, a former standout guard at North Carolina State, is an assistant coach at Arizona State.

Senior **Josh Duncan** led five Musketeers in double figures as he scored 16 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the field to go with seven rebounds, four assists, two blocks and two steals in the season opener. Xavier drilled Southeast Missouri State 90-59 at a sold-out Cintas Center in Cincinnati. The win marked XU's 18th straight win in its season opener, including 4-0 under **Sean Miller**. Sophomore **Derrick Brown** made his first collegiate start and added a career-high 15 points to go along with seven rebounds in 27 minutes of action. Junior **B.J. Raymond** came up big off the bench to score 15 points and tie his career best with four three-pointers and set a new career mark with eight rebounds. Junior **C.J. Anderson**, a transfer from Manhattan, made his XU debut with 13 points, nine rebounds and three assists. Xavier's senior backcourt **Drew Lavender** and **Stanley Burrell** combined for 25 points to go along with 12 assists against only one turnover. Burrell tied his career high for assists with seven without committing a single turnover. XU dominated throughout the contest, leading by as many as 36 points. Xavier showed similar domination on the boards, ending the showdown with a 54-to-36 rebounding advantage and a 26-to-11 edge in second chance points.
