OCTOBER 1: Alabama defeated Birmingham College on the campus by the score of 25 to 0. Moody kicked two field goals, Adrian VandeGraaff made two touchdowns and Lambert one. The Crimson also made two points on a safety.

OCTOBER 8: Alabama defeated Marion on the campus by the score of 26 to 0, the visitors playing Alabama on even terms during the first quarter, once holding for downs on their five foot line.

Bumgardner scored three touchdowns for Alabama and Adrian VandeGraaff had a 70 yard run for a touchdown.

Madden, halfback, was the star for Marion.

OCTOBER 15: The Georgia Bulldogs were too heavy and too fast for the Thin Red Line of Alabama and easily won in Birmingham by the score of 22 to 0. Alabama spent most of the afternoon on the defensive.

In the second quarter, Woodruff made 12 yards around end. A pass, Bowden to McWhorter, gained 35 yards. McWhorter circled end for 10 and McClelland went over.

Later, Georgia's speedy backs circled the ends for substantial gains and McWhorter scored another touchdown.

In the third period, McWhorter scored on a 25 yard run around end while in the final quarter Slater, who substituted for Woodruff, picked up an Alabama fumble on the Georgia 25 yard line and ran 85 yards for a touchdown.

McWhorter, Georgia's sophomore sensation, was the star of the game. Woodruff was also brilliant especially in returning punts in a broken field.

For Alabama, A. VandeGraaff, Heard, Powell, Gresham, Moody and Bumgardner were outstanding.

Penalties were numerous. Maddox, Georgia tackle, was put out of the game for referring to one of the officials as a "robber."

OCTOBER 22: Alabama was helpless in the game with Georgia Tech on the campus at Tuscaloosa as the Yellow Jackets won by the score of 36 to 0. Tech scored once in the first period, three times in the second and twice in the fourth quarter in addition to kicking six goals after touchdown.

Alabama played her best in the third period as Tech was held for downs time after time in the very shadow of the Alabama goal and Gresham would punt out of danger.

Goree scored the first touchdown on a 95 yard end run. Patterson made one touchdown and kicked two goals while Wilson, the star of the game, scored four times and kicked four goals.

Bumgardner, who intercepted a Tech pass and returned it 45 yards, Heard and H. VandeGraaff were Alabama's stars.

NOVEMBER 5: Mississippi University defeated Alabama at Greenville, Mississippi by the score of 16 to 0 in a game in which Alabama was outweighed and outclassed.

In the first quarter, Alabama received, was held and Moody punted. After an exchange of punts, Mitchell gained 15 yards. Shields carried the ball three times around ends and scored.

Long runs by Lee featured the third quarter. He ran a punt back 45 yards. Shields and Lee made 8 yards and Haxton gained 15 to Alabama's one yard line. After Barnett threw Haxton for a 10 yard loss, Lee scored on the next play.

In the final quarter, Alabama punted to Walton who returned 12 yards. Lee made 7 through the line and Powe circled end for 13 yards. Two plays later, Mitchell ran 10 yards for the final touchdown and Trotter kicked goal.

Moody, Adrian VendeGraaff, Bumgardner, Barnett and Victor Heard were outstanding for Alabama while Lee and Shields, backs, and Trotter, Kinnebrew, Carter, Walton and Cohn, linemen, starred for Mississippi.

NOVEMBER 12: Sewanee again defeated Alabama before the largest crowd of the season in Birmingham by the score of 30 to 0. Alabama was no match for such a fast and powerful team.

Alabama kicked off to Sewanee and, on the second play, "Chigger" Browne circled his own right end for 60 yards and a touchdown.

Sewanee received and Swain ran Alabama's end for 40 yards on the third play. Line bucks advanced the ball to the Crimson 20 where Jenks Gillem drop kicked for three points.

In the second period, Sewanee received and drove to Alabama's 28 where Gillem kicked another field goal.

Later, Browne drove through Alabama's line for another touchdown.

In the third period, Faulkinberry drove across in three plays from the Alabama 20 yard line. The remainder of the period was a punting duel with Gillem kicking two for 65 and 67 yards and Sewanee gaining materially on the punt exchanges. Gillem kicked another field goal from the 18 yard line.

In the fourth period, Gillem made his fourth drop kick of the day from the 30 yard line.

Browne and Gillem were the Sewanee stars while the VandeGraaff brothers and Bumgardner were outstanding for Alabama.

NOVEMBER 19: Alabama won from Tulane University in New Orleans by the score of 5 to 3.

In the first quarter, Alabama tried a field goal. The kick was short and Walmsley, Tulane halfback, tried to run the ball out from behind his goal but was trapped and thrown for a safety, resulting in two points for Alabama.

In the third period, Walmsley kicked a field goal and Tulane was in the lead by the score of 3 and 2.

In the fourth period, Walmsley fumbled and Alabama recovered on Tulane's 20 yard line. From that point Moody kicked a placement and Alabama won by the score of 5 to 3.

NOVEMBER 24: Coach "Doc" Pollard brought his team of Generals from Washington and Lee to meet the Alabama team, which he coached until 1909, at the Fair Grounds in Birmingham in a Thanksgiving Day battle. The game was the best one staged locally during the entire season. Alabama won by the score of 9 to 0.

In the first period, Alabama drove to the General's 25 yard line, where Moody missed a field goal. A few minutes later, Moody missed another attempt.

In the second quarter, Waddill missed a field goal for Washington and Lee, the ball striking one of the posts.

In the third period, Moody kicked one through the middle of the uprights for three points.

The Generals clearly outplayed Alabama during most of the final period as they plowed through the line for gain after gain. Alabama finally held and forced a punt. Moody caught the ball near the

center of the field and ran 50 yards through the General team for a touchdown and kicked goal to make the score: Alabama 9, Washington and Lee 0.

Moody, Bumgardner and the VandeGraaff brothers were the stars for Alabama while Waddill was outstanding for the Generals.
