THE GAME

Auburn brings a three-game winning streak to Fayetteville when the Tigers visit Arkansas Saturday at 6:45 p.m. in a game that will be nationally televised by ESPN. Auburn was victorious in its last two visits to Fayetteville, but will be looking to avenge a 27-10 loss to the Razorbacks last season. Arkansas enters the game on a two-game winning streak, winning its last two games by a combined score of 100-22.

AUBURN HEADLINES

Auburn leads the series with Arkansas 9-6-1, and has won four of the seven games played in Fayetteville.

Over the past five seasons, Auburn has the nation's second-best record in games played away from home (road or neutral site games) with a mark of 18-5 (.783).

Auburn has won its last 14 consecutive games when wearing all white uniforms.

Over the last four seasons, Auburn has tied for the fourth-best record out of all Football Bowl Subdivision teams with a mark of 37-7 (.841).

Auburn is 2-0 this season in games nationally televised by ESPN, with victories over Kansas State and Florida.

Auburn is ranked 14th nationally in total defense (293.3) and passing defense (177.0) and is 17th in scoring defense (17.0).

Auburn has a turnover ratio of +7 in its four victories and -9 in its two losses.

In the last two games, Auburn has had six scoring drives of at least nine plays and five that covered at least 74 yards.

Brandon Cox has completed 44-of-62 (.710) passes for 527 yards, two scores and just one interception, in the last three weeks after completing 37-of-75 (.493) passes for 436 yards, two touchdowns and six interceptions in the first three games.

Auburn's freshmen kickers have excelled, as Wes Bryum has connected on 8-of-10 field goals including the game-winning field goal at Florida, and Ryan Shoemaker leads the SEC in punting, averaging 45.1 yards per punt.

Auburn started three true freshmen on the offensive line each of the past three games, and has played 26 freshmen this season (15 true, 11 redshirt).

Of Auburn's 170 points scored this season, 128 (75.3 percent) have been scored by underclassmen.

Tommy Tuberville earned his 100th career coaching victory last Saturday against Vanderbilt. Auburn has outscored its opponents 62-16 in the second quarter this season.

Auburn has won 13 of its last 17 games decided by seven points or less.

AU-ARK SERIES NOTES

Auburn won five of the first seven (5-1-1) meetings in the series, before Arkansas won four of the next five contests ... The winning team has scored 21 or more points in every game of the series except 2003 ... Eight winning scores in the series have been 30 or more points ... Seven of the 16 games between the two schools have been decided by seven points or less ... Auburn's come-from-behind victory in its last trip to Fayetteville in 2005 was the only time the team trailing at the half rallied to win since 1994 ... In the last five meetings, Arkansas has averaged 230.8 yards rushing, but only 140.8 yards passing.

ARKANSAS QUICK HITTERS

Arkansas has the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense, averaging 338.4 yards per game ... Darren McFadden ranks third in the NCAA in rushing (155.8), and teams with Felix Jones (126.2 yards per game which ranks No. 8) to form the top rushing duo in the NCAA ... McFadden has rushed for at least 100 yards in all five games this season, while Jones has four 100-yard efforts ... Arkansas' passing offense ranks 105th (169.2), yet the Razorbacks are still ranked eighth in total offense (507.6) and 10th in scoring offense (42.6) ... The Razorbacks rolled up 713 yards of offense Sept. 29 against North Texas, which was the second-best mark in school history and third-highest total in the NCAA this season ... Arkansas has only allowed four sacks all season ... Freshman kicker Alex Tejada has made 10-of-11 field goals ... Arkansas ranks fourth nationally in pass efficiency defense (91.76) ... The Razorbacks allowed UT-Chattanooga just 11 passing yards last Saturday.

AU-ARK CONNECTIONS

Arkansas defensive line coach Tracy Rocker, in his fifth year with the Razorbacks, was an All-American defensive tackle at Auburn. Rocker made history in 1988, becoming the first player in the SEC to win the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Trophy in the same year. A two-time All-American, Rocker recorded 354 career tackles, including 48 behind the line of scrimmage. Rocker was also a three-time All-SEC selection. Arkansas defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Reggie Herring was linebackers coach at Auburn from 1986-91, and he is the father of Auburn freshman linebacker Adam Herring. Reggie Herring was also the defensive coordinator at Clemson when Auburn tight ends coach Steve Ensminger was the offensive coordinator for Clemson from 1997-98. Razorback wide receivers/specialists coach James Shibest coached former Auburn players Rudi Johnson (RB) and Daniel Cobb (QB) at Butler County CC. Shibest was a receiver at Arkansas from 1983-86 and had five catches for 84 yards and a touchdown in a 21-15 loss to Auburn in the 1984 Liberty Bowl.

ARKANSAS TIGERS

Auburn head coach Tommy Tuberville is a native of Arkansas, and is joined this season by true freshmen Kodi Burns (Fort Smith), Adam Herring (Springdale) and Lee Ziemba (Rogers).

A native of Camden, Ark., Tuberville graduated from Harmony Grove High School, and went on to play free safety at Southern Arkansas University.

After graduating from SAU in 1976, Tuberville was an assistant coach at Hermitage High School for two seasons before serving as its head coach from 1978-79. From 1980-84, Tuberville was a defensive ends and linebackers coach at Arkansas State University.

ALABAMA RAZORBACKS

Four members of the Arkansas squad are from the state of Alabama. Freshman defensive end Damario Ambrose and sophomore flanker London Crawford are from Mobile, junior guard Cody Green is from Oneonta and redshirt freshman linebacker Ryan Powers is from Athens.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn owns an all-time record of 10-3 in games played on Oct. 13, and has won four in a row. The last time Auburn played on Oct. 13 was in 2001, when the unranked Tigers stunned No. 1 Florida, 23-20, on a 44-yard Damon Duval field goal with 10 seconds left. The Tigers also had a memorable game on Oct. 13, 1984, when the 16th-ranked Tigers went to Tallahassee and upset No. 9 Florida State, 42-41, when Brent Fullwood scored from four yards out with just 48 seconds left to cap a 76-yard drive.

IN OCTOBER

Auburn is 285-143-18 (.659) all-time in the month of October, including a 21-12 mark under Tommy Tuberville. The Tigers are 21-6 in their last 27 games in October.

ROAD WARRIORS

Over the past five seasons, Auburn has the nation's second-best record in games played away from home (road or neutral site games). The Tigers are 18-5 (.783) since the start of the 2003 season outside of Jordan-Hare Stadium, trailing only USC (26-4, .867), with Boise State and LSU (21-6, .778) in third. In SEC games, Auburn has won seven straight road games, and is 13-1 against SEC teams outside of Auburn since the 2004 season.

WINNING IN WHITE

Auburn has won its last 14 games when wearing all white following a 35-7 home victory over Vanderbilt in which the Tigers wore all white in recognition of the 1957 national championship team. Auburn has not lost when wearing white jerseys since the final road game of the 2003 season at Georgia. The Tigers went 5-0 in

all white uniforms in 2004, 3-0 in 2005, 4-0 in 2006 and are 2-0 in 2007 including a 20-17 victory at then-No. 4 Florida. Also included in that streak is the 2004 SEC Championship game against Tennessee and a 2007 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic victory over Nebraska. Auburn also has road wins at Alabama (twice), Ole Miss (twice), Georgia, Tennessee, South Carolina, Arkansas, Kentucky and Mississippi State during that span.

OVERCOMING INJURIES

The Auburn defense has performed admirably, despite a rash of injuries. The Tigers have played games this season without defensive starters Tray Blackmon (four missed games), Merrill Johnson (four), Aairon Savage (two), Quentin Groves (one) and Jonathan Wilhite (one), and yet still rank in the top 20 in the nation in total defense (14th, 293.3) and scoring defense (17th, 17.0)

NO PASSING ZONE

Despite playing nonconference games against New Mexico State (No. 9 in the NCAA in pass offense, 340.8 yards per game) and Kansas State (No. 27 in NCAA, threw 58 passes vs. AU), Auburn ranks 14th nationally in pass defense, allowing just 177 yards per game, and is ranked No. 13 in pass efficiency defense (101.30). The Tigers, whose defense ranks fourth nationally in yards per completion (9.0), held both Mississippi State (41 yards) and Vanderbilt (88 yards) to less than 100 yards passing this season.

20 OR LESS

Since Will Muschamp took over as defensive coordinator prior to the 2006 season, Auburn has held 16 of its 19 opponents to 20 points or less. The Tigers, who have allowed just 14.9 points per game since Muschamp's arrival, are 15-1 in games in which they hold their opponents to no more than 20 points.

Since the 2004 season, Auburn has held 35 of its 44 opponents to 20 points or less.

FOUR-YEAR DOMINATION

Auburn's senior class has had almost as much success as any in the country. Since the start of the 2004 season, Auburn has tied for the fourth-best record in the NCAA. The Tigers are 37-7 (.841) over the last four seasons. The top teams since the 2004 season are as follows:

TURNOVERS PROVE CRUCIAL

Turnovers have played a big role in determining Auburn's success this season. In Auburn's two losses, the Tigers committed five turnovers in each game while forcing just one total in the two games (-9 margin). In the four victories, Auburn has committed just five total turnovers while forcing 12 (+7 margin). Against New Mexico State on Sept. 22, Auburn forced six turnovers, which was the most by the Tigers since forcing six against Tennessee in 2004.

Auburn scored just seven points off turnovers in its two losses, but has 51 points off turnovers in its four wins.

RUSHING GAME IMPROVING

The return of junior RB Brad Lester has benefitted an already improving running game for Auburn. The Tigers averaged just 93.5 yards rushing in their first two games, but have averaged 195.8 in their last four, with three games over 200 yards rushing. Four different players (Ben Tate, Mario Fannin, Brad Lester, Kodi Burns) have rushed for at least 77 yards in a game during the last four games.

LESTER'S MIDAS TOUCH CONTINUES

Brad Lester's ability to reach the end zone continued during his first game of the season, as he scored twice on just 14 touches. For his career, Lester has now scored 19 career touchdowns (16 rushing, two receiving, one kickoff return) on only 202 touches. His rate of one touchdown for every 10.6 touches easily tops Auburn's top TD scorers such as Bo Jackson (one TD every 15.3 touches), Stephen Davis (15.4), Carnell Williams (18.3), Ronnie Brown (19.3) and Joe Cribbs (21.6).

COX TURNS THE CORNER

After a rough start to the season, senior QB Brandon Cox has excelled during Auburn's three-game winning streak. After three games, Cox had completed 37-of-75 (.493) passes for 436 yards, two touchdowns and six interceptions for a quarterback rating of 90.97. In the last three weeks, Cox has completed 44-of-62 (.710) passes for 527 yards, two scores and just one interception, for a quarterback rating of 149.79. With 5,842 career passing yards, Cox is now just 184 yards behind Dameyune Craig for fourth on Auburn's all-time passing yardage list, and needs only 442 yards to catch Pat Sullivan for third.

SECOND QUARTER SUPERB

The second quarter has been Auburn's best quarter this season, as the Tigers have outscored their opponents 62-16 during the period. Auburn has outgained its opponents 630-325 in the second quarter and has scored during the second quarter in all six games while shutting out its opponents during the quarter four times.

SEC SUCCESS

Auburn has won 24 of its last 28 Southeastern Conference games and 25 of its last 29 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back to more than just the past four seasons, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers are tied with LSU for the best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-07.

FRESH MEAT

Auburn has had 26 freshmen (15 true, 11 redshirt) play this season. The starting lineup has included four true freshmen on offense, including right tackle Lee Ziemba, right guard Chaz Ramsey, left tackle Ryan Pugh and quarterback Kodi Burns. Redshirt freshmen Craig Stevens and Zac Etheridge have started every game defensively, while redshirt freshman Mike Berry started the first three games at right guard. The kicking game features true freshman place-kicker Wes Byrum as well as redshirt freshman punter Ryan Shoemaker.

On Sept. 22 vs. New Mexico State, Burns became the first true freshman to start at quarterback for the Tigers since Gabe Gross in 1998. In his 13 years as a head coach, Tommy Tuberville had never before started a true freshman at quarterback.

In addition, redshirt freshman running back Mario Fannin is second on the team in rushing, while true freshman safety Mike McNeil has collected 21 tackles.

YOUNG BLOOD

Auburn has a lot of young talent on the squad this season, and to illustrate this point, one need look no further than the scoring column on the statistics sheet. Of Auburn's 170 points scored, 128 (75.3 percent) have been scored by freshmen and sophomores. True freshman Wes Byrum leads the team with 44 points, while redshirt freshman Mario Fannin is second with 30 points and sophomore Ben Tate is third with 24 points. True freshman Kodi Burns and sophomore Gabe McKenzie have two touchdowns each, while sophomore Antonio Coleman reached the end zone once.

SUSTAINED DRIVES

One of the keys to Auburn's offensive success the past two weeks has been the Tigers' ability to control the ball. Entering the Florida game, Auburn had just one scoring drive of at least 10 plays, but against the Gators, all four of Auburn's scoring drives reached double digits in plays. The Tigers' opening drive of 14 plays for 86 yards in 7:32 set new season highs in plays, yards and time.

Against Vanderbilt, the Tigers had three scoring drives of at least seven plays and 74 yards, including a season-long 92-yard scoring drive that took 10 plays.

FRESHMAN KICKERS SHINE

Auburn was forced to replace perhaps the nation's top kicking trio after all three kickers from last season graduated. The Tigers lost Lou Groza finalist John Vaughn, the team's all-time leading scorer with 312 career points; Kody Bliss, who ranked third in the nation in punting with a 45.7-yard average; and Matt Clark, who led the nation last season with 51 touchbacks on 66

kickoffs (77 percent). But the newcomers have excelled in the first five games.

True freshman Wes Byrum has made eight field goals in 10 attempts, including the game winner from 43 yards on the final play at No. 4 Florida Sept. 29, and a season-long 49-yard field goal against South Florida. He also resumed the kickoff duties Sept. 22 against New Mexico State and has had seven touchbacks in the last three games.

Redshirt freshman Ryan Shoemaker leads the SEC in punting, averaging 45.1 yards per punt. After Shoemaker suffered an injury against South Florida Sept. 8, his replacement, true freshman Patrick Tatum, averaged 42.0 yards per punt with seven of his 11 punts downed inside the 20-yard line. Tatum was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week against New Mexico State Sept. 22 after placing all four of his punts inside the 20-yard line and running for a first down on a fake punt.

COX LEADS ALL SEC QBs IN WINS

Brandon Cox earned his 22nd career victory as a starting quarterback during Auburn's 35-7 victory against Vanderbilt. Cox, who is 22-7 as a starter, leads all SEC quarterbacks in career victories. Tennessee's Erik Ainge is second with 20, followed by Kentucky's Andre Woodson (16).

ON YOUR MARKS

Sophomore Sen'Derrick Marks played a key role in the victory over Florida Sept. 29, blocking a field goal for the second time this season and collecting two tackles for losses. Marks, who has 24 tackles including five for losses this season, accomplished a rare double the previous Saturday against New Mexico State, collecting an interception and a fumble recovery. He became the first Tiger to intercept a pass and recovery a fumble in the same game since Karibi Dede in 2005 at Arkansas.

HOT ROD

Junior wide receiver Rodgeriquus Smith had a career night against Florida Sept. 29, setting career highs with nine catches for 102 yards. It marked the second straight game in which he set a career high in receiving yards, after totaling 86 yards and two touchdowns Sept. 22 against New Mexico State. Smith, who leads Auburn with 23 catches for 378 yards and three touchdowns this season, became the first Auburn player to catch two touchdown passes in one game since Ben Obomanu against Louisiana Tech in 2004.

Smith's 58-yard touchdown pass from Kodi Burns against the Aggies was the longest pass play of the season for Auburn, and Smith also has the team's second- and third-longest pass receptions of the season, with a 55-yard catch against Kansas State and a 36-yard reception against Mississippi State.

Darrren McFadden and Felix Jones both topped the 100-yard rushing mark as Arkansas upset No. 2 Auburn, 27-10, at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The loss snapped Auburn's five-game winning streak to start the season and dropped the Tigers to 3-1 in Southeastern Conference play. The Razorbacks, meanwhile, improved to 4-1 overall and 3-0 in the SEC.

McFadden led all rushers with 145 yards on 28 carries and a 63-yard touchdown in the second quarter. Jones was not far behind with 13 carries and 104 yards, scoring on a 1-yard scamper in the third quarter.

Quarterback Mitch Mustain and Arkansas attempted just 10 passes in the win, compared to 45 rushes. In the second half alone, the Razorbacks ran the ball 30 times and passed it just twice.

Arkansas opened the game's scoring eight minutes in with a 34-yard field goal by Jeremy Davis. A little more than four minutes later, the Razorbacks upped the score to 10-0 when Mustain tossed a 50-yard touchdown to Marcus Monk.

Auburn pulled to within three with Rodgeriquis Smith's 24-yard touchdown reception to open the second quarter, but the Razorbacks stretched their lead to 10 again midway through the second quarter when McFadden found a seam and broke away for a 63-yard touchdown run.

John Vaughn connected on his ninth field goal in 11 tries at 1:50 of the second quarter, nailing a 36-yarder that made it 17-10.

Brad Lester helped set up the field goal with a 68-yard kickoff return that put Auburn on Arkansas' 32-yard-line to start the drive.

The field goal, however, turned out to be Auburn's last points of the game.

Jones scored on a 1-yard rush with 4:54 left in the third quarter, and Davis iced it with 3:53 in the fourth with his second field goal of the game, a 22-yarder.

The Auburn offense could not get on track, managing just 60 yards rushing and 153 passing. Kenny Irons led the team with 75 yards rushing on 15 carries, but the Arkansas defense managed 11 tackles for loss for a total of 60 yards.

Brandon Cox sprayed the ball around to seven different receivers, finishing the game 17-of-29 passing.

Courtney Taylor led all receivers with five receptions and was second on the Tigers with 33 yards. Smith caught a career-high four passes for 64 yards while three others -- Irons, Gabe McKenzie and Tommy Trott -- had two receptions apiece.

Eric Brock and Aairon Savage tied for the Auburn team lead with 11 tackles in the loss, marking a personal-best for both. The Tigers did not manage a sack and were credited with two tackles for loss, one each by Karibi Dede and Marquies Gunn.

The loss snapped Auburn's three-game winning streak over the Razorbacks dating back to the 2003 season.

No. 18 Auburn scored two touchdowns a mere 50 seconds apart in the final 2:01 to come back for a stunning 23-13 season-opening victory over Kansas State before a Jordan-Hare Stadium crowd of 86,439, the most ever to see the Wildcats play.

Trailing 13-9 with 2:01 remaining, Brandon Cox connected on the Tigers first touchdown of the game, a 3-yard pass to tight end Gabe McKenzie, to give Auburn a 16-13 lead. Fifty seconds later, defensive end Quentin Groves sacked K-State quarterback Josh Freeman and forced a fumble that was scooped up by end Antonio Coleman and returned 34 yards for his first career touchdown to seal the victory.

Groves finished the game with two sacks to mark his 25th career sack and move within one sack of the Auburn career record held by Gerald Robinson (1982-85).

The Wildcats took the opening kickoff and drove 61 yards to the Auburn 2 before settling for a Brooks Rossman 20-yard field goal to give Kansas State a 3-0 lead.

A 55-yard Cox-to-Rod Smith pass to the K-State 18 set up the first of freshman Wes Byrum's three field goals, a 20-yarder with 14:07 to go in the half, to tie the game at 3. Byrum closed out the first half scoring with a 39-yard field goal with 6:22 to give Auburn its first lead at 6-3.

After allowing Kansas State 91 yards offense in its first two drives, the Tigers defense allowed the Wildcats just 34 yards over their final five drives of the first half.

With Auburn starting the second half on their own 46 after a K-State face mask penalty on the second half kickoff return, Cox threw an interception on the first play at the Wildcat 31. Kansas State then used a 6-play, 69-yard drive that was capped off by a trick play in which wide receiver Jordy Nelson threw a 21-touchdown pass to tailback Leon Patton for a 10-6 lead less than two minutes into the third quarter.

K-State lengthened its lead to 13-6 on a Rossman 40-yard field goal with 7:31 left in the third. Byrum brought Auburn to within 13-9 with a 31-yard field goal with 1:46 left in the third.

No. 17 Auburn overcame five turnovers to take South Florida into overtime, but the Bulls prevailed 26-23 on a game-winning 14-yard touchdown pass from Matt Grothe to Jessie Hester in front of a stunned Jordan-Hare Stadium crowd of 82,617.

Auburn had taken a 23-20 advantage off a Wes Byrum 39-yard field goal to start overtime, but South Florida responded with the winning score moments later.

With the game on the line, Grothe ran three times, including a sneak on fourth-and-1 to keep the drive alive. The next play would be the game winner as he connected with Hester behind the defense in the end zone.

After missing four field goal attempts in the second half, South Florida made sure its fate was left in the hands of Grothe.

Auburn gained just 2 yards in its overtime possession before Byrum took the field for his third field goal of the game and sixth of the season.

Auburn committed five turnovers, including three inside its own 25-yard line, in the game, but the Bulls did not turn any of those opportunities into points.

South Florida jumped on the board early, scoring 14 points in the first quarter off a 1-yard run by Grothe and a 2-yarder by Mike Ford. Byrum put up Auburn's only points in the first quarter, a career-best 49-yard field goal.

Auburn would regroup in the second quarter, matching the Bulls offensive total from the first period. The Tigers pulled within four early in the second quarter as Mario Fannin ran four yards for the score.

The Tigers took their first lead of the game with 29 seconds remaining in the half when Gabe McKenzie grabbed a 3-yard pass from Cox.

Missed opportunities were the story of the third quarter for South Florida as kicker Delbert Alvarado missed a 21-yarder and three other field goals, including one that was blocked by Sen'Derrick Marks on the final play of the third quarter.

South Florida evened the ledger at 17 with 7:28 left to play in regulation after a 38-yard field goal by Alvarado.

A mere nine yards separated Auburn from victory in its SEC opener versus Mississippi State. The Tigers drove the ball 67 yards and found themselves nine yards from the endzone, but four missed opportunities left the 82,129 Tiger fans stunned as Auburn fell 19-14 to the Bulldogs.

Christian Ducre scored the go-ahead touchdown with 5:15 remaining in the game to put the Bulldogs up 19-14.

It was a game of quarterbacks as Auburn and Mississippi State used a combined five different QB's during the game. Tiger fans got a glimpse of the future as true freshman Kodi Burns saw action early in the game after two quick Brandon Cox interceptions.

Mississippi State got on the board fast even after losing starting quarterback Michael Henig on the first drive. Adam Carlson booted a 32-yarder to put the Bulldogs up 3-0.

Derek Pegues intercepted Cox's first pass and returned it 20 yards for a touchdown less than a minute later, giving MSU an early 10-0 lead.

After Anthony Johnson intercepted Cox's second pass on Auburn's next offensive drive, Burns would take over the reins for the majority of the game.

The Bulldogs extended their lead to 13-0 on an Adam Carlson 30-yard field goal early in the second quarter.

Auburn responded at the 4:18 mark in the second quarter as Ben Tate put the Tigers on the board with a 28-yard touchdown run, marking the first TD run of the season for AU.

Burns' running game was effective as he put the Tigers up 14-13 on a one-yard sneak to the endzone.

The teams traded punts for most of the second half. Mississippi State's running game dominated, featured by Anthony Dixon and Ducre who combined for 44 yards on the 10-play scoring drive in the fourth quarter. Dixon finished the game with 103 yards on 29 carries, while Ducre had 63 yards on 10 carries.

Cox returned to the game in the fourth quarter and drove the Tigers 67 yards, most of which came on passes of 12 and 23 yards to Rod Smith and a 17-yard run by Tate.

On fourth down with 53 seconds to play, Cox's pass fell short of Smith in the end zone giving Mississippi State earned its first win over Auburn since 2000.

Burns threw for 65 yards, while racking up 87 yards on the ground and a touchdown. Cox completed 4-of-10 passes for 42 yards.

The Auburn defense allowed the Bulldogs' trio of quarterbacks only 41 total yards in the air.

Auburn out gained the Bulldogs 323 to 213, but five costly turnovers thwarted the Tigers offensive efforts.

The Tigers tallied a season-best 216 yards on the run, marking the most in an SEC game since rushing for 227 at Georgia in 2005.

Auburn created six turnovers and Brandon Cox led the Tigers to 41 consecutive points to finish off New Mexico State 55-20 in front of a rowdy 83,012 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Coming off the bench after 24 starts at quarterback, Cox passed for 135 yards (13-of-19) and a touchdown and rushed for another to help even Auburn's record at 2-2 on the season.

Defense put Auburn on the board in the first quarter when Zac Etheridge caused a fumble by the Aggies' A.J. Harris and Pat Sims recovered and returned it 21 yards for a score at the 7:33 mark.

The Aggies retaliated when Chase Holbrook drove 80 yards on 10 plays, including a 44-yard completion over the middle to Nick Cleaver. Holbrook turned in the Aggies' first score on a 1-yard sneak with 3:51 remaining in the opening quarter.

The Tigers didn't waste any time as Kodi Burns, who became the first freshman quarterback to start for Auburn since 1998, connected with Rod Smith on a 58-yard touchdown pass. New Mexico State knotted the score at 14 on a 5-yard pass from Holbrook to Brandon Allen in the second quarter.

Two plays later, the Aggies took the lead for the first and final time of the night when Holbrook hit Chris Williams with a 25-yard pass. Holbrook finished the first half connecting on 20-of-23 pass attempts for 207 yards and two touchdowns.

On the next possession, Cox led a 9-play, 62-yard drive that was capped off by a 1-yard touchdown run by Mario Fannin, giving Auburn a lead that it would not relinquish.

Auburn took over in the second half. Jonathan Wilhite intercepted his first of two passes on New Mexico State's first series, which led to an 18-yard touchdown pass from Cox to Smith. A minute later, Sen'Derrick Marks intercepted a Holbrook pass with the help of Josh Thompson and returned it to the 2. Cox came in and finished the deal from a yard out to put the Tigers up 35-20.

New Mexico State would have its hopes of adding a score dashed late in the third quarter when Wilhite snagged his second interception that led to a Ben Tate 2-yard score to open the fourth quarter.

Tate finished the game with 111 yards on 21 rushes, while Fannin ran 15 times for 103 yards and three touchdowns. It marked the first time since 2005 an Auburn player rushed for three TD's in a game. Auburn finished with 422 total yards.

The Tigers' aerial attack finished with 193 yards, led by Smith's career-best 86 receiving yards and two TD's.

Holbrook ended the game completing 29-of-40 pass attempts for 254 yards, but was intercepted three times.

The six turnovers was the most since 2004.

Freshman Wes Byrum kicked the game-winning 43-yard field goal as time expired to lift Auburn to a 20-17 victory over No. 4 Florida in front of 90,685 stunned fans at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. Byrum actually made the final field goal twice, but his first attempt was nullified by a timeout called just before the snap.

The Tigers snapped the defending national champion's 11-game winning streak and gave Florida coach Urban Meyer his first home loss since he took over the program in 2005. Auburn was the last team to defeat the Gators as the Tigers won 27-17 last season in Auburn.

With 3:38 remaining, the Tigers used up as much time as possible on the game clock as Brandon Cox led a 10-play, 35-yard game-winning drive that included Ben Tate running for 19 yards and Rod Smith and Prechae Rodriguez combining for 16 yards through the air.

Cox finished the game completing 17-of-26 passes for 227 yards.

The Auburn defense was the difference maker, as it held Florida to just 17 points, 312 yards of offense and 14 first downs. Entering the contest, Florida was averaging 49.2 points, 517.8 yards and 25 first downs per game.

In addition, Auburn shut out Florida in the first half, becoming the first team to hold Florida scoreless during the opening half since South Carolina on Nov. 14, 1992. The Tiger defense allowed just one play over 25 yards and held Florida without a first down on five of 10 offensive possessions.

The Tigers got on the board on their first possession as Cox took Auburn on its longest drive of the year. With the help of Tate and Mario Fannin's 42 yards on the ground and 35 yards in the air by Smith and Montez Billings, Kodi Burns was able to come in at quarterback and dart up the middle for a six-yard touchdown to cap the 14-play, 86-yard drive that consumed 7:32.

Auburn totaled 113 yards and eight first downs in the first quarter. Cox hit all five of his passes on Auburn's first drive that ended with Burns' score.

In the second quarter, Cox completed a 7-yard pass to Gabe McKenzie, a 22-yard pass to Carl Stewart and a 25-yarder to Montez Bilings to set up a fourth-and-1 on the Florida 4 that the Tigers converted. On the next play, Tate ran for three yards and gave Auburn a 14-0 lead with 6:21 remaining in the half.

Florida opened the third quarter with Tim Tebow connecting on a 52-yard pass to Percy Harvin that put the Gators on the Auburn 3. Auburn's defense stepped up and the Gators settled for a 23-yard Joey Iijas field goal.

After a Patrick Lee interception, Byrum put Auburn up by two touchdowns as he connected on a 30-yard field goal.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Tebow threw a 6-yard pass to

Scoring on its first three possessions en route to a 35-7 victory over Vanderbilt, head coach Tommy Tuberville earned his 100th career victory in front of 82,657 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On the opening drive, the Tigers marched 80 yards on nine plays and finished with a 4-yard touchdown by Ben Tate. The Commodores had to settle for three-and-out on their second drive, giving the Tigers the ball back less than a minute after the score.

Auburn responded with a 74-yard, seven-play drive that ended with Brandon Cox connecting with Rod Smith in the end zone, putting the Tigers up 14-0 with 3:07 remaining in the first quarter. Cox finished the quarter 7-of-7 for 58 yards and a TD.

The Tigers opened the second quarter with the ball on the Vanderbilt 43. It only took two plays for Auburn to score again as Mario Fannin ran for 21 yards and a 22-yard touchdown on back-to-back carries.

Less than five minutes later, Brad Lester, who returned to the lineup for the first time this season, rushed over the Vanderbilt defense for a 17-yard score. The Tigers ended the half up 28-0 and outgained Vanderbilt 324-66 in the half. Auburn's defense allowed the Commodores just five first downs in the half.

Patrick Lee intercepted a tipped pass early in the third quarter and returned it to the Vanderbilt 10-yard line. Two plays later, Lester leaped across the goal line from 5 yards out, making it 35-0.

Cox completed 14 of 17 passes for 165 yards with a touchdown and an interception in three quarters. Kodi Burns took over the reins in the fourth quarter.

Playing against Auburn's reserve defenders, Vanderbilt took up half of the fourth quarter on a 15-play scoring drive that ended with Cassen Jackson-Garrison's 1-yard touchdown run. It was the only score by either team in the fourth quarter.

The Tiger trio of tailbacks finished the game with 227 yards on the ground and three touchdowns. Tate led the charge with 96 yards and a score, while Lester had 77 yards and two TDs. Fannin finished with 54 yards and a TD on the ground and 26 yards on three catches in the air.

The Commodores used three quarterbacks during the game. Starter Chris Nickson finished the first half completing just five of 16 passes for 38 yards and was replaced by backup Mackenzi Adams. Adams didn't fare much better, connecting on four of nine for 24 yards.
