## SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

### THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

### THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

Each head coach is allowed one Instant Replay challenge per game, which is exercised by requesting a team timeout. A head coach may issue a challenge only if his team has one or more timeouts remaining in the half. If the challenged ruling is overturned, the timeout is not charged, but the coach has no more challenges during that game.

### THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game (CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, Lincoln Financial) or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference, following approval by the NCAA Football Rules Committee, will implement the use of video replay on an experimental basis beginning with the 2005 football season.

### THE PLAYS

#### Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
  - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
  - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line
  - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
  - d. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
  - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
  - b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver
  - c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player
  - d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, play is finalized)
  - e. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
  - f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
  - g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
3. Other Detectable Infractions:
  - a. Runner ruled not down.
  - b. Forward progress with respect to first down
  - c. Touching of a kick
  - d. Number of players on field
  - e. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with overturned plays)
  - f. Fourth-down/try fumble plays

### THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with a DVSPORT Digital Replay System. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official is selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live video feed is sent directly to the replay booth. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while capturing/digitizing it into the DVSPORT Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play as well as any replays as they occur in real time.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Communicator. As the Technician marks the incoming video, each view (by mark) will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Communicator can touch/click on a thumbnail and immediately send that play/replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a remote device controlled by the Replay Official. All replays/video are viewed on an output monitor. The touch screen is only used to select the replays.

While most plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

### THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the Digital Replay System developed by DVSPORT of Pittsburgh, Pa. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from DVSPORT.

**2007 SEC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME**

The SEC's Eastern and Western Division winners will meet in Atlanta's Georgia Dome to battle for the league championship and the right to represent the conference in the Bowl Championship Series. The 16th-annual title game is set for December 1 and will be nationally televised by CBS Sports at 4:00 p.m. ET.

The game is a result of conference expansion, which saw Arkansas and South Carolina become the first members added in SEC history. Under NCAA regulations, a conference with 12 members may play a 12th football game to determine its champion, provided the regular season is played in divisions.

The participants of the game are determined each year during the eight-game regular-season conference schedule as the teams with the best overall SEC winning percentage in each division.

The 1994 SEC Championship Game earned a 10.5 rating and a 26 share, the highest rated SEC Championship Game in history.

The SEC Championship Game has also drawn capacity crowds in its history. 1,120,836 fans have witnessed first-hand the pageantry of SEC Football at the 15 previous Championship Games.

Attendance at the 15 previous championship games has been 102.3 percent of stadium capacity, including 13 sellouts.

**THIS WEEK IN SEC FOOTBALL HISTORY**

As the Southeastern Conference celebrates its 75th anniversary, here is a look at some of the highlights during the upcoming game dates in its history:

**Oct. 13**

**1945** -- Unranked LSU defeats #17 Texas A&M, 31-12, in Baton Rouge. The Tigers move to #13 in the polls the following week.

**1984** -- #16 Auburn defeats #9 Florida State, 42-41, in Tallahassee, Fla. The Tigers go on to finish the season 9-4 with a victory over Arkansas in the Liberty Bowl.

For the fifth time in its history, two Florida running backs go for more than 100 yards each (Neal Anderson-178; John L. Williams-100) in the #18 Gators' 43-30 win at Tennessee.

**2001** -- Eli Manning tossed a three-yard touchdown pass to Joe Gunn with 46 seconds left to cap a 13-point fourth-quarter comeback as Mississippi downed Alabama, 27-24, in a Southeastern Conference contest.

**2001** -- Carlos Hall blocked Daniel Weaver's 32-yard field goal with 48 seconds remaining as Arkansas knocked No. 9 South Carolina from the ranks of the unbeaten with a 10-7 win.

Alabama is 10-3 on Oct. 13, having posted seven shutout victories on the date. In the Tide's 10 wins, it has outscored its opponents, 366-23. In its three losses, Alabama has been outscored, 30-73.

**SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE LEADS ALL-CONFERENCES IN NFL PLAYERS ON OPENING DAY ROSTERS**

The Southeastern Conference had 263 players on the 2007 National Football League opening day active rosters, which led all conferences.

The Atlantic Coast Conference was second with 238 players, followed by the Big Ten with 234 players, Pac-10 with 183 players, Big 12 with 176 players and the Big East with 84 players.

Among SEC schools, Georgia was first with 37 former players on NFL rosters, followed by Tennessee with 36, LSU with 33, Florida with 31 and Auburn with 30. Alabama had 21 players on NFL rosters, while South Carolina had 19, Ole Miss and Mississippi State had 17 each, Arkansas had 12, Kentucky six and Vanderbilt with five.

The SEC had five of its schools with 30-or-more-players on NFL rosters. No other conference had two.

Nationally, Miami (Fla.) leads with 46 former players on NFL rosters, followed by Ohio State with 44, Florida State with 41, Tennessee with 36 and Georgia with 35.

The lists do not include players who were not on opening day rosters and since been activated.

**CBS SPORTS** - The 2007 season marks the 11th year for CBS as the league's national network television partner. CBS will televise up to 15 games per year throughout the season. CBS will normally broadcast its SEC games in the late afternoon window beginning at 3:30 p.m. ET. CBS provides exclusive national network broadcasts of conference home games during the season. CBS will televise the SEC Football Championship Game, which will be on Dec. 1 at 4 p.m. ET.

**ESPN/ESPN2**, the SEC's national cable provider, may televise up to 18 regular season games each year, with a minimum of nine on ESPN through the season. ESPN GamePlan offers fans extra college football games and is available on television or online. Viewers can order ESPN GamePlan on ESPN.com (search "GamePlan"), or by contacting their cable or satellite Pay-Per-View provider.

**LINCOLN FINANCIAL SPORTS (LFS)** (Formerly Jefferson-Pilot Sports) will continue its highly successful SEC Football Game of the Week this season. The Charlotte, N.C. company, holds the rights to televise 13 games annually throughout the nine-state SEC region on a syndicated basis. The games will be broadcast in the early afternoon at 12:30 p.m. ET.

**FOX Sports Net South (FSNS), FOX Sports Net Southwest (FSNSW) and SUN Sports (SUN)** together form **SEC-TV**, the league's regional cable package. SEC-TV Weekly airs Thursday nights and Saturday mornings during the season, highlighting all of the SEC's athletic teams and events.

**SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS**

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send eight of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2007 season. The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One (2nd), will then make its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The Outback, Chick-fil-A and AT&T Cotton Bowls will work with the conference office to determine picks 3-5. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference. The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the selection of preference following the Cotton and Outback Bowls.

In selections 6-7, the AutoZone Liberty and Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowls will make their selections, not in any specific order, but in consultation with the SEC Office. The Bowls will rank available qualified teams in order of preference. If there are no similarities in the order of selection, the bowls will be granted its selection. If the bowls rank the same teams in preference, the team involved in the process would get its preference of which bowl to participate.

The PetroSun Independence Bowl will receive the eighth selection of available SEC teams.

**2008 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE**

Following the 2007 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the FedEx Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose presented by Citi, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

FOX Sports will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games, with the exception of the Rose Bowl, which will be televised by ABC Sports.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

At the conclusion of the 2007 regular season, the Allstate BCS National Championship Game will be hosted in New Orleans on Jan. 7 at 8 p.m. EST. The Allstate BCS National Championship Game will have the top two teams ranked in the BCS final regular season standings.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

Other BCS games following the 2007 regular season include the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1 at 4:30 p.m. EST, Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, and the Orange Bowl on Jan. 3 at 8 p.m. ET.

## 2007 SEC DIVISIONAL TIE-BREAKER

In the event of a tie for the division championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties to determine the SEC Football Championship Game representative. All Conference versus Conference Games (both division and non-division) will be counted in the Conference Standings.

**TWO-TEAM TIE.** In the event two teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order:

- Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams;
- Records of the tied teams within the division;
- Head-to-head competition against the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference record, and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- Overall record against non-divisional teams;
- Combined record against all common non-divisional teams;
- Record against the common non-divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional or non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game.

**THREE-TEAM TIE (OR MORE).** If three teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order: (Note: If one of the procedures results in one team being eliminated and two remaining, the two-team tiebreaker procedure as stated in No. 1 above will be used):

- Combined head to head record among the tied teams;
- Record of the tied teams within the division;
- Head to head competition against the team within the division with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- Overall Conference record against non divisional teams;
- Combined record against all common non divisional teams;
- Record against the common non divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through other common non divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest-ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the SEC Championship Game.

## ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE

Alabama defeated the Houston Cougars 30-24 for a homecoming win Saturday. Alabama held on to the win thanks to an interception by Simeon Castille with no time left on the clock. This marked the fourth consecutive game that has come down to the final play. This four-game stretch of games decided by a total of 19 points marks the closest four-game stretch for an Alabama team since 1999. The Tide jumped ahead early as they scored 23 points in the first quarter, the most in a single period since 1990. Senior receiver DJ Hall set the Alabama career record for receptions with three. Hall now has 153 catches and surpassed Freddie Milons' (1998-2001) former record of 152. Hall has caught at least one pass in 25 consecutive games dating back to the Ole Miss game of 2005. Hall currently leads Alabama with 26 catches for 439 yards and three touchdowns. John Parker Wilson's streak of pass attempts without an interception ended at 132 with a fourth quarter interception. It was the fourth-best streak by an Alabama passer in school history. Wilson was 15 of 27 for 157 yards and two touchdowns for the game. Sophomore Glen Coffee also had a career day as he rushed for 121 yards on 30 carries.

## FLORIDA GATORS



In what was probably the biggest game this season so far, the defending national champion Florida Gators took on the No. 1 LSU Tigers and fell short in the final minutes of the game. The Gators lost 28-24 to LSU after a 2-yard touchdown run by Jacob Hester with 1:09 remaining, clinched the win for the Tigers. It marked the second straight loss for the Gators, the first time since 2004. It also marked the first back-to-back SEC losses. Head Coach Urban Meyer is now 10-2 in games after a loss in his seven-year career. It marks the first time a Meyer-coached team has lost consecutive games since he was the head coach at Bowling Green in 2002. The Gators scored in each quarter but the fourth and had a 17-7 lead at halftime. Sophomore quarterback Tim Tebow was 12-of-26 for 158 yards and two touchdowns. He also had 67 yards on 16 carries and one touchdown. Kestahn Moore totaled a season high 79 yards on 12 carries and caught a two-yard pass in the second quarter to put UF up 10-0. Moore had two catches for 21 yards. Percy Harvin led the team with four catches for 58 yards, giving him 32 on the year. Defensive end Jermaine Cunningham recorded a career-high and team-best 17 tackles.

## ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS



Arkansas took a break from SEC action and downed Chattanooga 34-15 Saturday in Little Rock, Ark. Arkansas improved to 21-2 when they play in Little Rock under head coach Houston Nutt and 11-0 in non-conference games. Darren McFadden posted 122 yards on 25 carries to set an Arkansas school record for 100-yard rushing games with 17 for his career, surpassing Ben Cowins for the record. McFadden moved up two positions on the SEC career rushing chart to 11th with 3,539 yards. He passed Alabama's Bobby Humphrey (3,420) and Auburn's James Brooks (3,523). Next on the list at No. 10 is Shaun Alexander of Alabama, who had 3,565 yards. Felix Jones carried the ball 13 times for 144 yards, recording his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season and the eighth time this season the two have both had 100-yard games. The Razorbacks rushed for 257 yards against the Mocs and have rushed for at least 200 yards in 10 of the last 13 games. The Arkansas defense held Chattanooga to 172 total yards and seven first downs during the game. Alex Tejada made a 47-yard field goal, a career long, the longest for any Razorback since David Carlton hit from 47 against UT in 2002.



## GEORGIA BULLDOGS

The Georgia Bulldogs fell to 4-2, 2-2 in the SEC after suffering a 35-14 loss to the Tennessee Vols Saturday. The loss snapped a three-game win streak for the Bulldogs at Neyland Stadium. Head coach Mark Richt is now 23-4 in an opponent's stadium. The Bulldogs offense managed only two first downs in the first half and did not cross midfield until the third quarter. The Bulldogs prevented the shutout in the third quarter when Demiko Goodman caught a 26-yard TD pass from quarterback Matthew Stafford at the 9:39 mark. Georgia scored again in the fourth when Stafford connected with Tripp Chandler for two-yards with just over six minutes left in the game. Knowshon Moreno was held to only 30 yards and Thomas Brown only had 20 yards before a shoulder injury caused him to sit the second half. Stafford threw for two touchdowns and went 16-of-33 for 174 yards and had an interception. The interception came in the fourth quarter when Georgia tried to rally but Jonathan Hefney picked off Stafford at the UT45 with 3:34 to go in the game and gave the Vols possession of the ball until just under a minute to go. The Bulldogs will travel to Nashville this week for a matchup against Vanderbilt.

## AUBURN TIGERS



Auburn improved to 4-2, 2-1 in the SEC, as they defeated Vanderbilt 35-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The win also marked the 100th victory as a collegiate head coach for Tommy Tuberville. He is 75-31 in nine seasons at Auburn and 25-20 in four years at Ole Miss. With the 35 points, Auburn is now 42-0 under Coach Tuberville when scoring at least 30 points in a game. The Tigers scored TDs on four of their first five possessions and racked up 162 yards in the first quarter en route to a 28-0 lead at halftime. That is the most yards in any quarter by the Tigers this season. The 28 points at the half is the most in the first half by an Auburn team since 2005. Auburn had success from all three running backs. Sophomore running back Ben Tate rushed for 96 yards on nine carries and a touchdown, his third on the season, while junior running back Brad Lester had 77 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns in his season debut. Tate also had a 44-yard run on Auburn's second possession of the game, marking the longest of his career. Mario Fannin had 54 yards on 11 carries and three catches for 26 yards. Fannin had a 22-yard TD run in the second quarter, his fifth rushing TD of the season.

## KENTUCKY WILDCATS



Kentucky suffered its first loss of the season when they fell 38-23 to the South Carolina Thursday night in Columbia. The loss snapped a six-game win streak for the Wildcats, dating back to last season. It is only their second loss in their last 12 games. Kentucky also had a streak of nine-straight games with at least 400 yards of total offense snapped as they finished with 384 total yards. The Wildcats outgained the Gamecocks in the third quarter 161 to minus-15, but South Carolina's Eric Norwood recovered a costly fumble by Andre Woodson to return it 53 yards for a TD. Woodson finished the night 23 of 40 for 227 yards and became only the third quarterback in Kentucky history to throw for 7,000 yards in a career. Woodson has thrown for 200 yards in 12 consecutive games. Wide receiver Keenan Burton surpassed Anthony White for eighth place on UK's career all-purpose yardage list. He now has 3,552 yards as he finished with 76 yards receiving and 80 yards on kick returns. Running back Rafael Little rushed 25 times for 135 yards and now has 2,665 yards, passing George Adams for fourth place on the UK career rushing list.

## SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TEAM NOTES

## LSU TIGERS



The undefeated LSU football team was the unanimous No. 1 team in the nation according to the Associated Press Top 25 released Sunday afternoon, as the Tigers received all 65 first-place votes. Coming off a heart-stopping 28-24 victory over No. 9 Florida on Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers widened their lead over the No. 2-ranked team from two to 87 votes in the AP Top 25. LSU and Florida combined for 139 plays Saturday night, but ultimately the game boiled down to just one. Tigers tailback Jacob Hester rushed for 106 yards against the Gators, but perhaps his last two will seal his fate as a hero in the annals of LSU football. In arguably the most exciting game ever played in LSU's storied Tiger Stadium in front of the largest crowd in its history, the No. 1-ranked LSU Tigers overcame a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit to beat ninth-ranked Florida, 28-24, in front of record 92,910 emotionally spent fans. Hester crossed the south endzone goal line with 1:09 remaining in the contest to give LSU its first lead of the game. Hester was helped off the field by the Tiger medical staff after he laid exhausted on the turf and while the home-town crowd chanted his name following the touchdown.

## SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCKS



South Carolina is ranked seventh in the latest Associated Press poll, 9th in the Harris Interactive poll, and 12th in the USA Today/Coaches' poll. The AP ranking is the highest for the Gamecocks since the final regular season poll in 1984 when they were 10-1 and ranked seventh in the nation heading into a Gator Bowl date with ninth-ranked Oklahoma State. The Gamecocks vaulted as high as No. 2 in the nation that season after winning their first nine contests before dropping a 38-21 decision at Navy. The Gamecocks are in the top 10 in the country for the first time since the 2001 season when they climbed to ninth in the AP poll after a 5-0 start. The Gamecocks (5-1, 3-1 SEC) are coming off a convincing 38-23 win over previously undefeated and eighth-ranked Kentucky. DE Eric Norwood was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week and QB Chris Smelley was named the league's Freshman of the Week. South Carolina will put its ranking on the line this week when the Gamecocks travel to Chapel Hill to face the North Carolina Tar Heels (2-4, 1-2 ACC). The Tar Heels are coming off an impressive win over Miami (Fla.). ABC will regionally televise the game as part of the ACC package.

## OLE MISS REBELS



Seth Adams threw two touchdowns Saturday and the Ole Miss defense notched the Rebels' first shutout since 2003 in a 24-0 win over Louisiana Tech on homecoming. Ole Miss (2-4) snapped a four-game losing streak while holding the Bulldogs to 301 yards of total offense. Adams completed 16 of 32 passes for 167 yards and touchdowns to Dexter McCluster and Shay Hodge. It marked only the second game this year in which he threw for under 200 yards. It was Ole Miss' first shutout since a 31-0 win over Mississippi State on Nov. 27, 2003. The 24-point winning margin marked the Rebels' largest under head coach Ed Orgeron. Ole Miss scored first for the third straight game and has outscored the opposition 27-7 in the first quarter this year. Junior WR Mike Wallace did not catch a TD pass Saturday, ending his streak at four straight games. Wallace led the team with five receptions for 72 yards. Junior LB Ashlee Palmer led the team with career-highs of 15 total tackles and 11 solos. Both marked the most by a Rebel this season. Junior DB Dustin Mouzon recovered a blocked field goal and returned it 55 yards for a TD in the fourth quarter ... It marked his second non-offensive TD of the year.

## TENNESSEE VOLUNTEERS



The Vols answered back on Saturday with a decisive 35-14 victory over No. 12 Georgia. Arian Foster rushed for 98 yards and three scores, and the Tennessee defense never let Georgia get moving. Foster has rushed for six touchdowns the past two seasons against Georgia. The 35 points were the most allowed by the Bulldogs this year, and the loss snapped their three-game winning streak at Neyland Stadium. It also was Georgia's worst loss since the 2003 SEC Championship, a 34-13 loss to LSU. Tennessee went after the Bulldogs from the opening kick. It scored on four of its first five possessions. Montario Hardesty rushed for 68 yards and a score, and Erik Ainge was 17-of-22 for 165 yards. Tennessee even broke out a trick play, with wide receiver Lucas Taylor throwing for a 56-yard touchdown on his second career pass. Georgia managed only two first downs in the first half, and didn't cross midfield until after halftime. Tennessee head coach Phillip Fulmer now owns a 44-14 record in home SEC games, a 44-14 record in road SEC games and a 2-2 mark in the SEC Championship Game. His combined SEC record stands at 90-30 (.750) in his 15th season with the Vols.

## MISSISSIPPI STATE BULLDOGS



Mississippi State (4-2) scored three fourth-quarter touchdowns, including two in a late 15-second span, to hold off a pesky UAB team for a 30-13 victory Saturday afternoon at Scott Field. MSU is 4-2 for the first time since the 2000 season. State trailed 10-3 at halftime and 13-9 after three quarters of play before putting together an impressive 11-play, 80-yard drive early in the fourth period that lasted seven minutes. The possession ended in a 10-yard Anthony Dixon touchdown run to put State up 16-13. The Bulldogs would then shut down UAB's offense the remainder of the day, while producing two more scores of their own. After forcing a punt, State drove 60 yards for another score, capped by a 12-yard Dixon run. On the Blazers' next drive, State's Anthony Johnson picked off Sam Hunt's pass on the first play and return it 30 yards for a score. Dixon led MSU's offensive performance on the day, registering a career-best 152 yards and three touchdowns on 32 carries. It was his fifth career 100-yard contest on the ground, the third of 2007.

## VANDERBILT COMMODORES



With the loss at Auburn, Vanderbilt moves to 3-2 overall, and 1-2 in Southeastern Conference play. Vanderbilt's three league games have come against SEC Western Division foes: vs. Alabama (L, 10-24), vs. Ole Miss (W, 31-17) and at Auburn (L, 7-35). The series, though close in terms of all-time record - Vanderbilt now trails 19-20-1 - has been a recent struggle for the Commodores. The Auburn win was their 13th consecutive victory in the series. Earl Bennett became the all-time Commodore receptions leader during the game. He finished with 4 catches for 31 yards. His 7-yard reception for a first down with 6:30 left in the third quarter was the 201st of his career, one more than Keith Edwards' 200-catch total (1980, 82-84). Vanderbilt's 28-point deficit at halftime was the biggest margin at intermission since Tennessee held a 41-0 advantage over the Commodores on Nov. 22, 2003. Cassen Jackson-Garrison moved over 1,500 rushing yards for his career. He finished with 45 yards on 13 carries and a touchdown. He has 1,510 rushing yards for his career.

## THIS IS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

### THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports - 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

### ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- During the last five years, the SEC has had more student-athletes honored as CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans than any other conference. The league has had 171 student-athletes named CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans, including 79 named to the first-team.
- During the last eleven years, the SEC has had 19 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since 1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award. In 2006, Alabama track & field athlete Beth Mallory was named a recipient of this award.
- Florida's Chris Leak was named by the National Football Foundation as a National Scholar-Athlete. During the last five years, the SEC has had 11 student-athletes honored, the most of any conference. LSU's Rudy Niswanger won the Vincent dePaul Draddy Award given by the National Football Foundation in 2005 as the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Niswanger became the sixth SEC student-athlete to claim the "Academic Heisman" since the award was established in 1990.

### FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The 12 member institutions of the SEC provide nearly \$65 million in scholarships for the more than 4,200 student-athletes each year.
- The SEC distributed nearly \$675,000 during the 2006-2007 academic year from the NCAA Special Assistance Fund for Student-Athletes. This program was implemented to provide financial aid to student-athletes with specific needs such as clothing and shoes, medical or vision care, academic course supplies and family emergencies.
- During the 2007-08 academic year, the SEC will distribute more than \$1 million to directly benefit student-athletes from the Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund.
- The SEC awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Alabama baseball player Emeel Salem and Vanderbilt track & field athlete Erika Schneble were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners in 2006-07.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community. Tennessee swimmer Brad Boswell and Florida softball player Stacey Stevens were named recipients of this award in 2006-07.

### A LEADER IN WOMEN'S SPORTS

- The SEC has developed a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The SEC had four sport winners of the Collegiate Woman of the Year Award sponsored by Honda. Tennessee's Candace Parker won for women's basketball, Courtney Kupets of Georgia took top honors in gymnastics, Georgia's Kara Lynn Joyce won in Swimming & Diving and Tennessee's Monica Abbott was the top athlete in softball.
- Since 1987, SEC schools have won 66 NCAA women's national championships, an average of more than three per year in the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors. Nine of the 12 SEC institutions have won a national women's team championship since 1987.

### COMPLIANCE AND EDUCATION

- The SEC Task Force Committee on Compliance and Enforcement has issued a report of recommendations that represents an important initial step in a formal process of establishing a new standard of compliance excellence within the Southeastern Conference. Among the recommendations included in this report was how institutions will handle reports of allegations, strengthening the relationship between the league's institutions and the conference office, developing new orientation programs and establishing an annual review of compliance issues.
- The SEC also conducts a New Coaches Orientation Program four times a year, which supplements institutional orientation programs and enhance the professional development of coaches. Topics of discussion range from the role of the SEC and NCAA to the role of athletics in higher education.

### SPORTSMANSHIP

- The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states:  
 "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

### IN THE COMMUNITY

- The SEC launched its education initiative in 2002, utilizing the platform of intercollegiate athletics to provide elementary school teachers with relevant resources they can use to educate and prepare children for life. The SEC became the nation's first conference to develop customized educational software, providing a CD-ROM containing SEC-branded content correlating to national educational standards. Since the CD-ROM was produced, the SEC has initiated an online program for K-8 students on education content and character development.
- SECKids.com is a website uniquely designed for school-age students. Now fans of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECKids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights. Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's college software in their classroom. The SEC is the only conference in the country to develop a site of this kind.

### OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS

- Since 1990, the SEC has won 118 team and 805 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally in 76.8 percent of the total sports win which the league has competed (268 of 349). Ten of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the SEC's 20 sponsored sports since 2000, the SEC has won more team national championships than any other conference in the nation. The SEC won 50 team titles since 2000, while the Pac-10 won 45 and the Big 12 won 21. The SEC won team titles in 16 different sports since 2000, also the most of any conference.

**THE COACHES**

Nick Saban is in his first season at Alabama and in his 14th season overall with a record of 110-60-1 (.646). The Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator is Major Applewhite and the defensive coordinator is Kevin Steele.

Ed Orgeron is in his third season at Ole Miss and overall with a record of 9-19 (.321). The Rebels' offensive coordinator is Dan Werner and the defensive coordinator is John Thompson.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALABAMA HAS THE BALL**

Freshman Terry Grant leads the Tide ground game with 88.5 yards per game and five TDs and is a three-time SEC Freshman of the Week honoree. Sophomore back Glen Coffee has also rushed for 372 yards and three scores. Junior quarterback John Parker Wilson has completed 115 of his 213 attempts, good for 1,248 yards, eight TDs and four interceptions. Wilson's top target is senior WR D.J. Hall, who has 26 receptions for 439 yards and three TDs this season.

Junior LB Ashlee Palmer is second in the SEC in tackles (9.8 per game) and is coming off a career-best 15-stop performance against Louisiana Tech. It marked the most tackles by a Rebel since Patrick Willis' career-high 15 against Auburn a year ago. Palmer has posted 12 or more tackles in three games and is also tied for the team-lead in pass break-ups with four.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN OLE MISS HAS THE BALL**

The Crimson Tide defense is led by freshman LB Rolando McClain with 42 total tackles, including 4.5 TFLs, while junior FS Rashad Johnson has recorded 31 stops with three interceptions. Senior DE Wallace Gilberry has team-highs of nine TFLs and nine QB hurries to go with 37 tackles.

Seth Adams is enjoying the best season by an Ole Miss signal-caller since 2003. He is currently on pace to throw for 2,715 yards. He ranks fourth in the SEC in total offense (225.0 ypg), passing average (226.6 ypg) and passing efficiency (137.9). At his current average of 95.0 rushing yards per game, RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis is set to finish with 1,140 yards, which would be the second-highest single-season total in school history.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Sophomore K Leigh Tiffin has connected on 9-of-14 field goals and all 20 PATs. Tiffin is third in the SEC in field goals per game (1.5) and 11th in scoring (7.83). He leads the SEC with four field goals of 40 or more yards this season. Javier Arenas is third in the SEC in punt returns (13.29) and sixth in kickoff returns (22.4).

Ole Miss scored off a blocked kick Saturday for the second time this year. Senior DL Brandon Jenkins registered his first career block on a Bulldog 37-yard FG attempt, and junior DB Dustin Mouzon recovered and returned it 55 yards for the TD. The Rebels also scored on special teams in the opener at Memphis, blocking a punt for a TD for the first time since 1995. Junior DB Jamarca Sanford got his first career block, and sophomore DB Kendrick Lewis recovered it in the end zone for his first TD.

Ole Miss received a win by forfeit for Alabama's 19-14 victory in 1993... Alabama has won 17 of the last 20 on-the-field meetings and three straight... The Tide has escaped each of the last two meetings by three points including last year's 26-23 overtime game in Tuscaloosa... Ole Miss has won two of the last three Oxford encounters with Alabama, although the Tide enjoys a 5-2 on-the-field edge at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

**THE COACHES**

Phillip Fulmer is in his 16th season at Tennessee and overall with a record of 140-42 (.769). The Volunteers' offensive coordinator is David Cutcliffe and the defensive coordinator is John Chavis.

Sylvester Croom is in his fourth season at Mississippi State and overall with a record of 13-26 (.333). The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator is Woody McCorvey and the defensive coordinator is Ellis Johnson.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL**

Erik Ainge leads SEC in both passing yards (259.0) and completions (25.0) per game. His completion percentage of 67.6 (125-of-185). He has an efficiency rating of 142.04, which is the third-best mark in the SEC this season. Arian Foster rushed 17 times for 98 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns vs. Georgia.

Defensive end Titus Brown, who has recorded 143 career tackles, including 31.5 for loss (minus 142 yards), 16.5 of which were sacks (minus 97 yards), stayed among the SEC leaders in both hit-behind-the-line categories. Brown, who has recorded at least one tackle for loss in five of the season's first six games, is fifth in the league with 1.3 TFL per game. His 1.0 sack-per-game average is second best in the SEC. Brown also is tied for third in the SEC in fumbles forced (.33 per game).

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN MISSISSIPPI STATE HAS THE BALL**

Jerod Mayo and Rico McCoy led the team with 11 tackles apiece vs. Georgia. Mayo leads the team with 36 tackles this season. McCoy is second with 33. The line has five sacks and 14 TFLs for 51 yards through five games. Xavier Mitchell leads the unit with 16 tackles. Tennessee's defense has allowed just eight opposing ballcarriers to rush for at least 100 yards in the last 42 games.

Anthony Dixon has now rushed a SEC-high 138 times for 586 yards, good for fourth in the league in rushing. His nine rushing touchdowns this season are a league best among running backs and match Florida's Tim Tebow to lead the conference in scoring. He rushed the football 32 times for 152 yards, a 4.8-yard per carry average, and three touchdowns this past Saturday against UAB. All three rushing numbers marked career highs for the talented running back.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Daniel Lincoln converted all five of his extra points to keep his perfect season to date intact. Lincoln has made all eight of his field goal attempts this year and is 21-of-21 on PATs to lead the Vols in scoring with 45 points. Lincoln has been consistent no matter the distance, having converted three kicks from the 20- to 29-yard range, three from the 30s and two from the 40s, including a 47-yarder against Southern Mississippi.

Derek Pegues has been a threat in the return game, ranking third on the school's all-time kick return (67) and yardage (1,456) lists, and eighth all-time at the school in punt return yards (409). Bernard Euell (1992-95) currently ranks seventh with 411 yards.

**THE COACHES**

Les Miles is in his third season at LSU with a record of 27-4 (.871) and in his 7th season overall with a record of 55-25 (.688). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gary Crowton and the defensive coordinator is Bo Pelini.

Rich Brooks is in his fifth season at Kentucky with a record of 21-31 (.404) and in his 23rd season overall with a record of 112-140-4 (.445). The Wildcats' offensive coordinator is Joker Phillips and the defensive coordinator is Steve Brown.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL**

RB Jacob Hester is coming off the best game of his career, rushing for 106 yards and the game-winning TD in LSU's win over Florida. Hester leads the Tigers in rushing with 433 yards and TDs. QBs Matt Flynn and Ryan Perrilloux have combined to connect on 95 of 159 passes for 1,219 yards and 10 scores. Perrilloux has also added 166 yards and 2 rushing TDs for the Tigers.

Defensive end Jeremy Jarmon leads the SEC and is tied for ninth nationally in sacks with 6.5 on the year. The sophomore has recorded at least one sack in seven of the last eight games. Senior linebacker Wesley Woodyard has recorded at least four tackles in 30 consecutive games. Woodyard currently leads the SEC in tackles per game with 10.83. He is the only player in the SEC averaging double figure tackles this season.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN KENTUCKY HAS THE BALL**

Defensively, S Craig Steltz leads the Tigers with 41 tackles and 4 interceptions, while DE Kirston Pittman is tops on the squad with 6.5 TFL and DT Glenn Dorsey has recorded 30 tackles and a team-best 4 sacks. As a group, LSU has 20 sacks and 11 interceptions to its credit.

Quarterback André Woodson has thrown for 7,187 career yards, joining Jared Lorenzen and Tim Couch as the only quarterbacks in Kentucky history to throw for 7,000 yards in a career. Woodson has thrown for at least 200 yards in 12 consecutive games. Keenan Burton is tied for the SEC lead in touchdown receptions (five) and second in the league in receptions with 37 catches for 498 yards. Rafael Little has over 100 yards rushing in five of Kentucky's six games this season.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

LSU PK Colt David continues to lead the SEC in scoring with a total of 59 points. David, who has kicked 8 field goals and has 29 PATs, scored the first touchdown of his career on a fake field goal against South Carolina in week 4. David's 9.8 points per game is second in the SEC.

Tim Masthay is averaging a career-best 42.2 yards per punt and UK ranks third in the SEC in net punting, averaging 37.3 net yards per punt. With Masthay's excellent punting height and placement, along with good kickoff coverage, UK has allowed only 19 punt return yards this season. Masthay leads the SEC with 12 touchbacks and UK ranks second in the SEC in net kickoff coverage (44.1 net yards per kickoff).

**THE COACHES**

Steve Spurrier is in his third season at South Carolina with a record of 20-11 (.645) and in his 18th season overall with a record of 162-51-2 (.758). Spurrier serves as the offensive coordinator and the defensive coordinator is Tyrone Nix.

Butch Davis is in his first season at North Carolina and seventh overall with a record of 53-24 (.688). The Tar Heels' offensive coordinator is John Shoop and the defensive coordinator is Chuck Pagano.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN SOUTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL**

In his second straight start at quarterback and his third of his career, Chris Smelley completed 17-of-30 passes for 256 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions. The freshman from Tuscaloosa, Ala. directed two fourth quarter scoring drives that both ended on TD passes. For the season, Smelley has completed 58-of-107 passes for 810 yards with six TDs and three interceptions. Kenny McKinley has caught at least one pass in 27 consecutive games.

Defensive end Hilee Taylor leads the team with 6.0 sacks. That is the most for a Tar Heel since Tommy Davis had eight in 2005. No player last season had more than three. Safely Deunta Williams recorded his team-best third pick last week, and Durrell Mapp, Quan Sturdivant and Charles Brown each added their first career interceptions against the Hurricanes.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN NORTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL**

Defensive end Eric Norwood became just the fourth player in NCAA Division I history to return two fumbles for touchdowns in a single game last week versus UK. He also registered five solo tackles, notched one tackle for a loss, had two pass deflections and a quarterback pressure. The Gamecock defense forced four turnovers in the win over the eighth ranked Wildcats.

WR Brandon Tate has 955 all-purpose yards halfway through the 2007 season. He is on pace to have the second-highest single-season all-purpose total at UNC and could challenge Don McCauley's record of 2,021 all-purpose yards set in 1970. Tailback Anthony Elzy rushed for a career-high 95 yards in last week's game vs. Miami.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

The 29-yard field goal late in the first quarter last week was the seventh of the season in nine attempts by Ryan Succop. For his career, Succop has made 23 field goals in 31 attempts. He added five PATs against Kentucky, giving him a perfect 20 for 20 on the season.

Against Miami, Connor Barth made all four field goal attempts to extend his school record to 19 consecutive field goals made. It is the first time Barth has made four field goals in a game. Barth, whose streak dates to the 2005 season, broke the previous mark of 15 straight set by Kenny Miller in 1984. In 2006, Barth was the only player in the country with a perfect 1.000 field goal percentage in the NCAA rankings.

Bobby Johnson is in his sixth season at Vanderbilt with a record of 18-45 (.286) and in his 14th season overall with a record of 78-81 (.491). The Commodores' offensive coordinator is Ted Cain and the defensive coordinator is Bruce Fowler.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA HAS THE BALL**

Georgia sophomore QB Matthew Stafford is 10-4 as a starter. Redshirt freshman Knowshon Moreno has provided a spark for the Bulldog offense behind seniors Thomas Brown and Kregg Lumpkin. He leads the Bulldogs in rushing with 462 yards. He garnered more playing time after Lumpkin missed three games with a thumb injury. Lumpkin returned to the backfield against UT. However, Brown got injured in the first half against the Volunteers and now he's out.

One of the SEC's leading active tacklers, Jonathan Goff contributed six total tackles in the Commodores' loss at Auburn. He has at least six tackles in every game this year and 10 of his 11 last outings. Reshard Langford topped the Commodores with six solo tackles in the loss and Auburn. A starter in 28 consecutive games, Langford leads the Vanderbilt secondary with seven career interceptions.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN VANDERBILT HAS THE BALL**

Dannell Ellerbe, who leads the team with 47 tackles, had a career high 12 in the loss to Tennessee. He has been the leading tackler for the Bulldogs in four games this year. Junior Jeff Owens and sophomores Geno Atkins and Kade Weston have been the starters of the interior of the defensive line. Owens earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance in the win over WCU. Marcus Washington leads UGA with two sacks.

Vanderbilt junior Earl Bennett needs just seven receptions to become the SEC all-time leader. Bennett contributed four receptions for 31 yards in the Commodores' 35-7 loss at Auburn. Through five games, Bennett leads the SEC with 41 receptions and 499 receiving yards. He is also tied for fourth with four touchdown catches.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

For his career, Brandon Coutu is 43-for-54 in FGs including 5-for-10 from 50+ yards. Also, he is a perfect 86-for-86 in PATs. This season, Coutu is 8-11 in FG attempts and 21-for-21 in PATs. Georgia ranks first in the SEC in net punting at 38.8 yards. Redshirt sophomore Brian Mimbs is third in the SEC with an average of 43.7 yards on 27 punts, placing 12 inside the 20 yard line.

Junior PK Bryant Hahnfeldt currently ranks fourth in career scoring at Vanderbilt and on pace to overtake former standout John Markham as the all-time Commodore leading scorer. For his career, Hahnfeldt has converted on 61.3% of his field goal attempts (27/44) and 72 of 75 PATs. He needs nine points to overtake Johnny Clark (1986-89).

**THE COACHES**

Tommy Tuberville is in his ninth season at Auburn with a record of 75-31 (.707) and in his 13th season overall with a record of 100-51 (.662). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Al Borges and the defensive coordinator is Will Muschamp.

Houston Nutt is in his 10th season at Arkansas with a record of 70-46 (.603) and in his 15th season overall with a record of 106-68 (.609). The Razorbacks' offensive coordinator is David Lee and the defensive coordinator is Reggie Herring.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN AUBURN HAS THE BALL**

After a rough start to the season, senior QB Brandon Cox has excelled during Auburn's three-game winning streak. In the last three weeks, Cox has completed 44-of-62 (.710) passes for 527 yards, two scores and just one interception, for a quarterback rating of 149.79. The return of junior RB Brad Lester has benefitted an already improving running game for Auburn. The Tigers averaged just 93.5 yards rushing in their first two games, but have averaged 195.8 in their last four.

Jerell Norton and Michael Grant are both tied for fifth nationally and lead the SEC with 1.80 passes defended per game. Norton also ranks tied for 17th in interceptions per game at .60 with three picks through Hogs' first five games. Malcolm Sheppard ranks fourth in the SEC and tied for 36th nationally with an average of 1.40 tackles for loss per game.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ARKANSAS HAS THE BALL**

Junior linebacker Chris Evans, who leads Auburn with 35 tackles this season, earned his first career start against South Florida Sept. 8. The result was the highest tackles total by an Auburn player in almost five years. Auburn is ranked 14th nationally in total defense (293.3) and passing defense (177.0) and is 17th in scoring defense (17.0).

Arkansas has the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense, averaging 338.4 yards per game. Darren McFadden ranks third in the NCAA in rushing (155.8), and teams with Felix Jones (126.2 yards per game which ranks No. 8) to form the top rushing duo in the NCAA. McFadden has rushed for at least 100 yards in all five games this season, while Jones has four 100-yard efforts.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

True freshman Wes Byrum has made eight field goals in 10 attempts, including the game winner from 43 yards on the final play at No. 4 Florida Sept. 29, and a season-long 49-yard field goal against South Florida. He also resumed the kickoff duties Sept. 22 against New Mexico State and has had seven touchbacks in the last three games. Redshirt freshman Ryan Shoemaker leads the SEC in punting, averaging 45.1 yards per punt.

Jones has two kickoff returns for touchdowns this season on 90-yard and 82-yard bursts. He ranks fourth nationally in kickoff return average at 34.4 ypr. He currently leads the SEC in career kickoff return average at 28.8 yards per on 50 career returns. Alex Tejada is 10 for 11 on field goal attempts and 25 of 26 on PATs. Tejada is tied for eighth nationally in scoring at 11.0 points per game.
