WEB: OleMissSports.com will provide live audio, live stats and an in-game blog. The official Rebel athletics website will also provide a full game recap, a photo gallery and live postgame video.

POLLS: Neither Ole Miss nor Auburn appear in the latest top-25 polls. The Rebels received votes in both week 5 rankings, including 13 votes in the AP poll. Ole Miss last earned votes, three to be exact, in the 2006 preseason poll.

SERIES INFO: This meeting will be the 33rd all-time between the Rebels and Tigers dating back to 1928, and Auburn holds a 24-8 advantage in the series. Last season, Auburn prevailed 17-3 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Tigers have not lost in Oxford since 1992 and own a 8-1 advantage over the Rebels in games played there, including a 23-17 victory two years ago. Overall, Auburn has won 13 of the last 15 meetings dating back to 1993 and 22 of 25 dating back to Auburn's 35-28 win in the 1971 Gator Bowl.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR: Ole Miss is off to its best start and has equaled its most wins since 2003 ... The Rebels are seeking consecutive wins for the first time the 2004 season ... Ole Miss is facing its third straight SEC Western Division foe ... The Rebels are making their fourth television appearance of the year ... Mike Wallace needs nine yards to reach the Ole Miss single-season record for kickoff return yards ... Jevan Snead's 12 TD passes and Shay Hodge's six TD catches are both tied for the SEC lead ... Joshua Shene has missed only kick this year and is the SEC's top statistical kicker (92.3 percent FGs, 1,000 PATs) ... Peria Jerry is the reigning SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH HOUSTON NUTT: Houston Nutt (Oklahoma State, 1981) is in his first season at the Ole Miss helm, after being named the University's 36th head football coach on Nov. 28, 2007. During his 10 years as the head coach at Arkansas, Nutt guided the Razorbacks to eight bowl berths, three SEC Western Division titles, two SEC Championship game appearances and an average of more than seven wins per season. He also served head coaching stints at Boise State and Murray State, where he captured two OVC Championships. Nutt has never faced Arkansas as a head coach (see page 3 for more info on Nutt and the coaching staff).

AUBURN HEAD COACH TOMMY TUBERVILLE: Tommy Tuberville is in his 10th season as the head coach of the Auburn Tigers. He is 84-37 with the Tigers and has a career mark of 109-57 in his 14th season as a collegiate head coach. Tuberville has led the Tigers to eight straight bowl appearances. He capped a perfect 13-0 campaign 2004 with a 16-13

win over Virginia Tech in the 2005 Sugar Bowl. Tuberville posted a 25-20 mark in four seasons as the head coach at Ole Miss from 1995-1998. He is 7-2 facing the Rebels.

AUBURN SCOUTING REPORT: After opening the year 4-1 and rising as high as No. 9 in the national polls, the Tigers have dropped three straight, including a 34-17 loss at West Virginia last Thursday. Junior RB Ben Tate has been their top offensive weapon, averaging 67.2 rushing yards per game with a pair of TDs. Junior Chris Todd and sophomore Kodi Burns have split time at quarterback with Burns getting the starting nod last time out. Todd has completed 86-of-156 for 903 yards, five TDs and six interceptions, while Burns is 30-of-63 for 309 yards, one score and four picks. Auburn ranks fifth in the SEC in total defense and fourth in pass defense. Junior DL Antonio Coleman tops the conference in sacks (6.0) and TFLs (10.5), and sophomore DB Mike McNeil is the squad's leading tackler with 43 total stops.

LAST FIVE MEETINGS

October 27, 2007 • Auburn, Ala. • Auburn 17, Ole Miss 3: Ole Miss contained No. 23 Auburn's offense, but could not get any offense of its own going as the Tigers prevailed 17-3 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Rebels managed just 193 yards of total offense. BenJarvus Green-Ellis led the Rebels with 62 yards on 13 carries. Auburn's Brandon Cox completed 16-of-26 passes for 189 yards and a 34-yard touchdown pass to Rod Smith in the final minutes of the game that sealed the win.

October 28, 2006 • Oxford, Miss. • Auburn 23, Ole Miss 17: Ole Miss tied the game early in the fourth quarter but could not hold off No. 7 Auburn, who slipped by 23-17. The Tigers trailed the Rebels twice, but Auburn converted two third-quarter interceptions into 10 points. John Vaughn's 20-yarder put the Tigers up for good with 7:35 left in fourth quarter and his 29-yarder sealed it with 35 seconds left.

October 29, 2005 • Auburn, Ala. • Auburn 27, Ole Miss 3: No. 19 Auburn allowed only 23 yards rushing and had an early goal line stand in a 27-3 victory over Ole Miss. The Rebels managed just 209 total yards. Brandon Cox and Kenny Irons supplied most of the offense for the Tigers. Cox was 17-of-27 passing for 205 yards and a touchdown and Irons ran for 101 yards and another TD on 32 carries.

October 30, 2004 • Oxford, Miss. • Auburn 35, Ole Miss 14: Jason Campbell rushed for two TDs and passed for another to lead No. 3 Auburn to a 35-14 win over Ole Miss. The Rebels pulled to within seven points early in the fourth quarter when sophomore QB Ethan Flatt connected with junior WR Taye Biddle on a 25-yard TD pass. Ole Miss would then force the Tigers to punt on their ensuing possession, but the Rebels followed by going three-and-out. Campbell followed with a one-yard scoring run, and Williams later added a 29-yard TD run with 5:33 left to ice the game.

November 8, 2003 • Auburn, Ala. • Ole Miss 24, Auburn 20: Ole Miss tied the game at 17 early in the fourth quarter when Jonathan Nichols capped a 10-play march with a 42-yard field goal. The Tigers answered on their ensuing possession, taking a 20-17 advantage on a Philip Yost 30-yard field goal. After one empty possession and a missed Auburn field goal, Eli Manning took over, leading Ole Miss on a 10-play, 80-yard scoring march that was capped by a 1-yard TD run by Brandon Jacobs with 2:39 remaining. Ole Miss survived an Auburn drive in the remaining minutes.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- The Sept. 27 victory over No. 4 Florida was his fifth career win over a top-five opponent as a head coach. Nutt is 5-8 all-time against top-five teams, including a 50-48 triple OT victory at No. 1 LSU last year. In all five wins, Nutt's team entered the game unranked, and four of the wins came on the road.
- Named the 36th head coach of the Ole Miss Rebel football program on Nov. 28, 2007.
- Coached Arkansas to eight bowl berths in 10 years, which is the most in the SEC Western Division during that span.
- Guided the Razorbacks to SEC Western Division titles in 1998, 2002 and 2006, with Championship Game appearances in the last two.
- Directed the Razorbacks to 15 victories over top-25 opponents, with five in the top five and three in the top three.
- Mentored 15 All-America, 67 All-SEC, 153 SEC Academic Honor Roll and 33 NFL Draft selections at Arkansas.
- Led the SEC's top-ranked team in scoring offense from 2002-04. The Hogs averaged 29.8 points per game during that stretch. They were also the top-scoring team in the Western Division during Nutt's tenure. The Razorbacks averaged 28.89 points per game (3,553 points) since 1998 and scored 20 points or more 92 times in Nutt's 123 games. The Hogs averaged a school-record 39.8 points per game in 2007.
- Fielded the top rushing offense in the SEC over his 10 years in Fayetteville. UA rushed for 200.1 yards per game in that time.
- His Razorbacks led the SEC in rushing in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2007. The 2002 Hogs averaged 218.9 yards rushing per game, while the 2003 squad cranked out 241.9 yards per game. Arkansas finished second in the league in rushing in 2004, pounding out 187.4 yards per game. The 2005 Razorbacks averaged 216.9 yards per game, while the 2006 squad rushed for 228.5 yards per game, which also ranked fourth nationally. Arkansas was No. 4 in the nation in 2007 at 296.8 yards per game.
- His Arkansas teams had 28 games with 200 yards or more passing. Nutt's quarterbacks have accounted for 20 of the 36 three-or-more passing touchdown games in school history.
- Ranks second all-time in Arkansas history in coaching wins and bowl appearances.

POSTGAME

Coach Nutt will hold a postgame news conference with the media in the team meeting room of the Indoor Practice Facility. Athletics Media Relations office representatives will be available to assist in postgame interviews. Complete postgame plans will be announced on gameday in the press box by the Athletics Media Relations Director. Media Relations staff will accompany members of the press wishing to go to the sidelines, beginning with five minutes remaining in the final quarter.

TIGER TIES: Ole Miss defensive line coach Tracy Rocker starred as a player with Auburn from 1985-1988. As a Tiger, he was a two time All-American and a three-time All-SEC selection as a defensive tackle. As a senior, he was named SEC Player of the Year. His 354 career tackles, including 21 QB sacks and 48 TFLs earned him the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award. Rocker led the Tigers to two SEC titles during his stint at Auburn and was voted to the school's Team of the Century in 1993. The former Tiger was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2004 and Alabama's state Sports Hall of Fame in 2005.

ALABAMA REBELS: The Ole Miss roster features six players, all freshmen, from the neighboring state of Alabama, and only two scholarship athletes in redshirt freshman DT Justin Sanders (New Market) and true freshman OL Joshua Tatum (Marbury). Other Rebels from Alabama include redshirt freshman K Ben Meadows (Birmingham) and true freshmen LB Josh Lancaster (Mobile), S Griffin Littlefield (Pike Road) and WR Vincent Moss (Munford).

REBEL NOTEBOOK

- The last time Ole Miss had four or more wins after eight games was 2003, when the Rebels started 8-2 and finished with a 10-3 record and an SEC Western Division title.
- Ole Miss' victory over No. 4 Florida marked the 600th win for the Rebel football program ... Ole Miss became the 34th FBS school and eighth SEC member to reach 600 victories ... The Rebels boast an all-time record of 601-464-35 (.562 winning percentage).
- With the 31-30 upset at No. 4 Florida on Sept. 27, Ole Miss earned its first victory over a top-five foe since a 20-13 triumph over No. 3 Notre Dame in 1977 in Jackson ... The Rebels' previous road win over a top-five team had been a 15-7 triumph over LSU on Nov. 3, 1962, when Ole Miss was ranked No. 6 and LSU was No. 4 ... The Rebels' win over the Gators snapped a 15-game skid to ranked teams.
- This marks the 114th football season at The University of Mississippi dating back to 1893 ... Ole Miss did not field teams in 1897 due to an epidemic of yellow fever, and also in 1943 when football was abolished at all Mississippi state-supported institutions by the Board of Trustees.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: In their first season under Houston Nutt, the Rebels have cranked up the offense and the scoring. Ole Miss is posting 377.6 yards per outing, which ranks fourth in the SEC and is the most since 2003 when the team finished with a school-record 433.2 clip. The Rebels outgained Samford 424 yards to 198, Vanderbilt 385 to 202, Florida 360 to 348 and Alabama 359 to 326. Ole Miss' 27.2 scoring clip is also the highest since 2003. The 31 points against Florida equaled the most against an SEC foe since the 43-40 win over South Carolina in 2003.

SNEAD AMONG SEC LEADERS: Sophomore QB Jevan Snead is tied for the SEC lead in TD passes (12) and ranks third in passing average (209.1 ypg) and fourth in total offense (214.0 ypg). Last time out, Snead threw multiple TD passes for the fourth time this year and topped 200 yards passing for the fourth

time, completing 14-of-27 passes for 209 yards, two TDs and one interception at Arkansas. Against South Carolina, Snead set a season high in completions, completing 21-of-32 for 243 yards, one TD and one interception. At Wake Forest, Snead became the first Rebel with four TD passes since Eli Manning in the 2003 Memphis game. He finished 20-of-31 for 253 yards with one interception and was named the Scout.com SEC Offensive Player of the Week.

SHAY FOR SIX: Junior WR Shay Hodge is tied for the SEC lead in touchdown catches with six and ranks first in yards per catch (19.3) and fourth in receiving yards per game (60.4 ypg), ahead of teammate Dexter McCluster in sixth (56.4). Hodge has hauled in four catches with a TD in each of the last two outings. After five career games of 77 or more receiving yards, Hodge finally cracked the century mark at Florida with a career-high 133 yards on three catches. He also stamped his name in the Ole Miss record book, as his 86-yard, fourth-quarter catch was not only the goahead score in the upset of the No. 4 Gators, but was also the longest pass play in Rebel history. The previous record was 83 yards, set first in 1961 with Glynn Griffing to Charles Morris and again in 1994 from Josh Nelson to LeMay Thomas. Hodge's 12 career TD grabs rank third among active SEC players.

BIG PLAY MIKE: Whether on offense or special teams, senior Mike Wallace has proved to be a big play threat for the Rebels. Last time out at Arkansas, Wallace posted the fourth 100-yard receiving game of his career and second of the year with a career-high 120 yards on five catches, including a 42-yard grab and an 11-yard TD, his first of the year. He also hauled in a 42-yard pass and surpassed the century mark with 101 yards on four catches against Samford. Including his record-setting heroics on kickoffs (see page 5), Wallace ranks third in the SEC in all-purpose yards at 133.9 per game. He piled up 222 yards at Arkansas and a career-high 238 against Vanderbilt.

CATCH 22: Whether in the slot or behind center in the "Wild Rebel", junior Dexter McCluster has truly become an all-purpose threat. A native of Largo, Fla., McCluster posted 176 all-purpose yards against Vanderbilt and 139 vs. South Carolina. As a receiver, McCluster is sixth in the SEC in receiving yards per game (56.4 ypg) and eighth in receptions (3.8 per game). Against the Gamecocks, McCluster just missed his second 100-yard receiving effort of the year, finishing with six receptions for a game-high 99 yards. He recorded a career-high 132 receiving yards and equaled his career best of seven receptions against the Commodores. As a rusher, he tops the team with three TD runs and has led the rushing attack in two games, totaling 60 yards at Florida and 40 against Carolina. McCluster also ran for 64 yards against Memphis en route to a 125-yard all-purpose day.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss is 4-0 when turning the ball over two times or fewer ... The Rebels had just one turnover at Arkansas.
- The Rebels have scored first in seven of eight games this season ... Ole Miss is 4-3 in those games.

- For the first time this season, the Rebels led in time of possession at Arkansas, at 33:50 to 26:10.
- Ole Miss ranks fifth in the SEC in rushing offense (162.0 ypg) but has no individuals among the league's top 10 runners ... Four players have 40 or more attempts, each has led the team in rushing in at least one game, each has two or more TDs and three boast 295 or more yards, led by junior RB Cordera Eason's 335 yards and 81 carries.
- Junior RB Cordera Eason had a career-high 19 carries, totaling a team-high 81 yards at Arkansas.
- Junior **Dexter McCluster** equaled his career-high of 11 carries, posting 52 yards against the Razorbacks ... McCluster also hauled in two passes for 19 yards
- After no receptions in four of the first five games, sophomore WR Lionel Breaux has eight catches for 99 yards over the last three games ... He totaled a career-high 55 receiving yards on a pair of catches against the Crimson Tide.
- Ole Miss' 359 yards and 158 rushing yards marked the most surrendered this season by the Alabama defense, which entered the game giving up 262.2 yards per contest and 50.8 on the ground ... The Rebels outrushed the Tide 158-107 and was the first time Alabama had been outrushed this year.
- Ole Miss' 361 yards against South Carolina was the most allowed this year by the then top-ranked Gamecock defense, which entered the game giving up 221.4 yards per contest.

SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK AGAIN:

For the second time this year, **Peria Jerry** was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week Monday. A senior tackle from Batesville, Miss., Jerry was credited with five total tackles, including career highs of two sacks and two quarterback pressures. The Rebel defense held Arkansas to 104 net rushing yards with 38 yards lost on tackles for losses. Jerry also earned SEC defensive lineman honors following the Vanderbilt game, when he scored his first career touchdown on a 13-yard fumble return, marking the first by a Rebel since 2005. He posted six total tackles, including 2.5 TFLs and helped limit the Commodores to 202 yards of total offense.

IN THE BACKFIELD: After just four TFLs and one sack in the opener, the Rebel defense has totaled 59 TFLs (7.4 per game) and 17 sacks (2.1 pg) over the seven games since. Ole Miss posted 12 TFLs against Samford and 11 against Vanderbilt, and sacked Wake's Riley Skinner four times and Florida's Tim Tebow three. Senior DT Peria Jerry leads the team

and is fourth in the SEC with 9.0 TFLs, and sophomore NT **Ted Laurent** is tied for 10th in the league with 7.0. Jerry has 4.5 TFLs in his last two games.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss boasts 11 sacks in the last four games ... The Rebels notched three sacks at Arkansas, including a career-high two by **Peria Jerry**.
- Against the Razorbacks, sophomore S Fon Ingram notched his first career interception and returned it 38 yards in the final seconds of the first half.
- Junior S **Kendrick Lewis** topped the team at Arkansas with eight tackles, including a career high tying six solos.
- Senior S Jamarca Sanford has recorded double-figure tackles in two of the last four games and 10 times in his career ... He led the team and equaled his career high of 13 tackles against South Carolina ... Sanford is tied for seventh in the SEC in tackles per game (8.0) and is the league's active career leader (269 total stops).

STREAKING SHENE: Junior K Joshua Shene has quietly emerged as the top kicker in the SEC, ranking first in field goal percentage (92.3) and tied for first in PATs (1.000). Since his lone missed kick of the year at Vanderbilt on a 47-yard try, Shene has made eight straight FGs and is 12-of-13 overall. He matched his career bests at Arkansas, connecting on three field goals from 28, 34 and 39 yards, and scoring 11 points. Shene is a perfect 26-for-26 on PATs this year to extend his streak to 50 consecutive extra points converted, which is fourth-longest in school history. He has connected on 70-of-71 career PATs.

RECORD BREAKING MIKE: With his 85 kickoff return yards at Arkansas, senior Mike Wallace became the Rebels' all-time leader with 1,174, breaking Paul Hofer's career record of 1,133 yards (1972-75). With two more attempts, Wallace will equal Hofer and Freddie Williams (1976-79) for most returns with 51, and Wallace will likely break another record. After no kickoff returns in the first three games, Wallace has needed only five contests to pile up 643 yards, and nine more will match the single-season record, currently held by Deuce McAllister with 652 in 1999. Wallace ranks fourth in the SEC in average at 26.8 yards per return, and he has posted three of the top-11 single-game totals in school history, including the best ever. Against Vanderbilt, the New Orleans native earned his first kickoff returns of the year and responded with 202 KR yards, easily shattering the

Wallace also registered the second kickoff return TD of his career and the fifth-longest in school history with his 98-yard score. At Florida, Wallace followed up with the seventh-best total ever by a Rebel with five returns for 140 yards against the Gators, including a long of 40. His 129 kickoff return yards against the Gamecocks ranks 11th on the Ole Miss all-time single game chart.

TRULY SPECIAL TEAMS: The Rebels' special teams has provided some major highlights this season. Ole Miss registered TDs in the return game on back-to-back Saturdays with Marshay Green's 77yard punt return against Samford and Mike Wallace's 98-yard kickoff return against Vanderbilt. At Florida, the kickblock unit took its turn, as Kentrell Lockett broke through to block the Gators' potential gametying extra point with 3:28 left in the game. It was Lockett's first career kick block and the Rebels' first extra point block since John Jerry's block in the 2006 LSU game in Baton Rouge. At Alabama, Ole Miss scored off a faked field goal with Jason Cook catching a nine-yard TD pass from Rob Park in the third quarter. In the Arkansas win, Joshua Shene highlighted his outstanding season by connecting on all three field goal tries, including what would prove to be the game-clinching 28-yarder with 1:45 left.

GRADUATING REBELS: Four student-athletes on the Ole Miss football team have already received their undergraduate degrees. DE Chris Bowers has earned his B.A. in real estate, while RB Jason Cook has his B.A. in English. OL Darryl Harris has completed his B.S. in exercise science, and TE David Traxler has his B.A. in accountancy. The Ole Miss football team was well represented at the University's graduation ceremonies in May, as 12 Rebels earned degrees in the past year.

DEBUTS: A total of 20 players have made their Ole Miss debuts this season, including seven true freshmen in Brandon Bolden (RB), Enrique Davis (RB), Andrew Harris (WR), Derrick Herman (DB), Justin Smith (DL), Marcus Temple (CB) and Devin Thomas (RB). Other players seeing their first action include Brandon Green (Jr., C); Gerald Harris (Jr., TE); Rishaw Johnson (RFr., OL); Jeremy McGee (So., CB); Jermey Parnell (Sr., DE); Jerrell Powe (So., DT); Garrett Ryan (Jr., DE); Jevan Snead (So., QB); Bradley Sowell (RFr., OL); Emmanuel Stephens (Jr., DE); Billy Tapp (Jr., QB); Patrick Trahan (Jr., LB) and Alex Washington (RFr., OL).

OHER RISING UP DRAFT BOARDS: Senior OL Michael Oher decided to return for his senior season and is already drawing heavy notoriety as a 2009 NFL Draft prospect. Amongst the numerous NFL Draft websites, Oher is commonly a top-five choice for next year, and on Sept. 17, Rivals.com/nationalfootball-post.com projected the Memphis tackle to be the No. 1 overall pick. Defensive lineman Greg Hardy and Peria Jerry are also regarded as players that could be drafted on the first day. NFLDraftDog.com ranks Hardy 10th on its board, while FanNation.com has Jerry in the No. 17 slot.

REBELS ADD OSU TRANSFER: Ole Miss picked up a transfer from the Big Ten in September, as sophomore DB James Scott came to Ole Miss from Ohio State. Scott must sit out the 2008 campaign due to the NCAA transfer rule and will have three years of eligibility remaining. The 5-foot-10, 170-pounder saw special teams action as a true freshman for the Buckeyes in 2007, posting six tackles. A native of Dayton Beach, Fla., Scott was ranked as the No. 10 cornerback in the nation and the No. 11 overall recruit in Florida coming out of Seabreeze Senior High School. He totaled 121 tackles and six interception during his junior and senior seasons.

VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM HONORED: USA Today recently named Vaught-Hemingway Stadium to its list of the "10 great places to watch college football". As the article says, "the day-long party is one of the great scenes in all of college football, and it will hit a fevered pitch when the Rebels walk through on their way to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium." Other nominees include Beaver Stadium (Penn State), Camp Randall Stadium (Wisconsin), Folsom Field (Colorado), Husky Stadium (Washington), Lane Stadium (Virginia Tech), Memorial Stadium (Clemson), Neyland Stadium (Tennessee) and Royal Memorial Stadium (Texas).

SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM: Senior TE David Traxler was featured as the SEC Community Service Team Player of the Week on Sept. 27. A Jackson native, Traxler visits local retirement homes and takes part in "Reading with the Rebels", a program that helps promote reading to area students. He is currently involved in the SEC's "Together We Can" food drive for the second straight year. A two-time SEC Academic Honor Roll recipient, Traxler is an accounting major and a member of Ole Miss' Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. In 2005, he received the Scholar-Athlete Award from the Ole Miss Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. After beginning his career as an offensive lineman, Traxler moved to tight end in the spring of 2007.

OLE MISS ANNOUNCES FRESNO STATE SERIES:

Ole Miss recently announced a three-game football series with Fresno State, which will mark the first gridiron meetings between the two schools. The first game is scheduled for Oxford on Sept. 25, 2010, while Ole Miss will then return the game to Fresno, Calif., on Oct. 1, 2011. The final game of the series will be in Oxford in 2015, with the date yet to be determined.

2008 TEAM CAPTAINS: On August 29, Houston Nutt announced the team captains for the 2008 season. This year's permanent captains are fullback Jason Cook (Suwanee, Ga.), defensive tackle Peria Jerry (Batesville), offensive tackle Michael Oher (Memphis, Tenn.) and strong safety Jamarca Sanford (Batesville). Linebacker Ashlee Palmer (Compton, Calif.), cornerback Dustin Mouzon (Orlando, Fla.) and punter Rob Park (Memphis, Tenn.) will serve as substitutes.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD: Senior S Jamarca Sanford was selected as the 2008 recipient of the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a rising senior defensive player each year. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away on May 6, 1991. Sanford, who wears No. 13, has the honor of wearing a "38" patch on his jersey during his senior campaign. Mullins wore No. 38 as a player at Ole Miss.

SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior safety Jamarca Sanford was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 29. A native of Batesville, Miss., Sanford registered a game-high 11 total tackles, including four solos. Sanford helped direct a Rebel defense that stopped the Gators on downs twice and held Florida to three-plays-and-out five times. Ole Miss forced five Gator fumbles, recovering three.

SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: Brandon Bolden was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Sept. 2. Bolden led the team in rushing in his collegiate debut, racking up 76 yards on eight carries and breaking several tackles in a 10-yard touchdown run. He also completed a 37-yard pass to Jevan Snead. Bolden becomes the first Rebel to be chosen SEC Freshman of the Week since 2006, when both Dexter McCluster and Marshay Green received the honor.

• For the third straight year, Ole Miss is playing seven home games, hosting Memphis (Aug. 30), Samford (Sept. 13), Vanderbilt (Sept. 20), South Carolina (Oct. 4), Auburn (Nov. 1), Louisiana-Monroe (Nov. 15) and Mississippi State (Nov. 28).

REBELS GET NEW HD VIDEO BOARD: Ole Miss partnered with Daktronics Inc., to design, manufacture and install a \$6 million integrated system featuring a large high definition video display at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, which debuted at the season opener. The board can serve as a single giant display or be divided into multiple zones. In addition, the back of the display will use the latest LED technology to greet visitors. A complete sound system with speakers above the video display rounds out the integrated system.

AUSTIN BACK IN OXFORD: While the majority of Houston Nutt's first Ole Miss coaching staff came with him from Arkansas, one assistant coach came from north of the border and is a familiar name to Ole Miss fans. Kent Austin, who was a record-setting quarterback for the Rebels from 1981-85, is serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He joined Nutt's staff after leading Saskatchewan to the Grey Cup Championship and was named Canadian Football League Coach of the Year. Austin spent 15 seasons in the CFL and won championships as a player, assistant coach and head coach. He retired as a player in 1996 as the league's ninth all-time passer with 36,030 yards. His 57.6 yard completion average is third best, and he remains one of only four players to pass for more than 6,000 yards in a single season. As a Rebel, Austin still ranks second in career completions (566) and attempts (981), third in passing yards (6,184) and 200-yard games (11), and fourth in passing touchdowns (31) and total offense (6,179).

The historic upset of No. 4 Florida in The Swamp earned the Ole Miss Rebels the honor of starring on the cover of Sports Illustrated. The issue hit newsstands on Sept. 30.

The magazine's headline read "Rebels Rise" and the cutline of the cover photo was "Ole Miss defensive end Greg Hardy clobbers QB Tim Tebow of the Gators, No. 4 no more"

It marked the third time Ole Miss has been solely featured on the cover of SI. The Sept. 24, 1962 college football preview showcased the Rebelettes, while Archie Manning "Idol of Ole Miss" donned the Sept. 14, 1970 edition. The Manning 1970 cover was also a part of the Sept. 26, 1996 issue along with son Peyton.

In addition, several former Rebels have appeared on the front of Sports Illustrated as professional ath-

letes, including New York Giants QB Charlie Conerly on Dec. 3, 1956, PGA golfer Cary Middlecoff on June 10, 1957 and Giants QB Eli Manning on Jan. 28, 2008 and Feb. 8, 2008.





LAST GAME: OLE MISS 23, ARKANSAS 21

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) - Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, and Ole Miss held off an Arkansas rally to give coach Houston Nutt a 23-21 win over his former team.

The Rebels (4-4, 2-3 Southeastern Conference) led 23-14 with 1:45 remaining, but Arkansas quickly cut the deficit to two on Casey Dick's 22-yard touchdown pass to Greg Childs. The Razorbacks (3-5, 1-4) then tried an onside kick, and Arkansas' Aaron Fenton appeared to recover it.

Officials initially ruled the play out of bounds, but the call was reversed on review, giving the Razorbacks the ball with 1:03 to play. London Crawford caught a pass near the Ole Miss 20, but it was called back for offensive pass interference, and Arkansas didn't threaten again.

Nutt coached the Hogs for 10 seasons before leaving after last regular season to take over for SEC West Ole Miss. The Rebels took control early with a pair of scores near the end of the first half. The win was a major boost to the Rebels' bowl hopes and their first over Arkansas since 2003.

Arkansas trailed 20-14 after Dick's 8-yard touchdown pass to Lucas Miller with 4:28 remaining, but Snead found Mike Wallace for a 42-yard pass on the next Ole Miss possession, and Joshua Shene kicked a 28-yard field goal with 1:45 to play.

After that kick appeared to put the game out of reach, the Ole Miss fans in one corner of the stadium began chanting "Houston Nutt! Houston Nutt!"

The Arkansas fans booed, and a few of them began chanting `Bobby" in reference to Nutt's replacement, Bobby Petrino.

Petrino made a key call in the second quarter. The Razorbacks had already missed one field goal, so he decided to go for it on fourth-and-1 from the Ole Miss 13. Michael Smith took a pitch to the left and went untouched to the end zone for a 7-3 lead.

The Rebels answered, scoring twice in the final two minutes of the half. Snead threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge to give Ole Miss the lead with 1:58 remaining, then Fon Ingram intercepted a pass and returned it 38 yards to the 17. The Rebels had time for one more play, a 34-yard field goal by Shene that made it 13.7 at halftime

Ole Miss went ahead 20-7 with 13:21 left in the game when Snead found Wallace wide open in the back of the end zone for an 11-yard touchdown. Arkansas' offense came back to life after that with a 97-yard scoring drive.

AUBURN, Ala. (AP) -- Defensively, Ole Miss contained No. 23 Auburn but was unable to cash in on offense in a 17-3 defeat at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Brandon Cox threw a 34-yard scoring pass to Rod Smith in the final minutes and Brad Lester rushed for a career-high 96 yards, helping Auburn hold on and avoid another down-to-the-wire finish.

Patrick Lee set up the drive with an interception in the end zone for the Tigers (6-3, 4-2 SEC), who were coming off a last-second loss at No. 3 LSU.

They got a scare from the Rebels (2-7, 0-6), double-digit underdogs still seeking their first league win.

Down 10-3, Ole Miss had the makings of an impressive tying drive. Starting from their own 1, the Rebels surged from the goal line with three consecutive rushes. Quarterback Seth Adams was hurt on the third play on a hard hit by Tray Blackmon at the end of a run.

Backup Brent Schaeffer, who nearly led Ole Miss to an upset in last season's meeting, completed his first three passes and had a 7-yard run to keep the Rebels moving downfield. Then, with Antonio Coleman rushing toward him, he flung a pass into the end zone where Lee intercepted it.

That gave Cox and Auburn the ball with 7:03 to go and a chance to put the game away. Cox converted third-down plays with a 23-yard pass to Smith and a 12-yarder to Montez Billings.

His biggest throw came on third-and-8 when he again hit Smith, who spun away from a defender and sprinted into the end zone with 3:15 to play. The TD pass ensured Auburn wouldn't have a seventh game decided in the final 2 minutes.

Smith finished with a career-high 111 yards on eight catches. Lester had 23 carries, including a 1-yard touchdown in the first quarter.

Joshua Shene connected on a 51-yard field goal in the final ticks of the first half for a 7-3 Tiger lead at the break and supply the lone Rebel points.

BenJarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 62 yards on 13 carries, and Adams completed 11-of-24 passes for 84 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -Jevan Snead hit Shay Hodge with touchdown passes of 64 and 15 yards and Ole Miss beat Memphis 41-24 in Houston Nutt 's debut as Rebels coach.

With all eyes on Snead, making his first start, and Nutt, it was Dexter McCluster who provided the spark with 125 total yards and a touchdown run out of Ole Miss' new Wild Pole formation.

Despite Snead's long touchdown to Hodge in the first quarter, the Rebels struggled early. McCluster, working out of the shotgun in the same "Wildcat" role played by Darren McFadden under Nutt the last two seasons at Arkansas, got Ole Miss rolling with a 32-yard run around the right end for a touchdown and a 14-7 lead late in the first quarter.

It was the first time Ole Miss scored 40 or more points against a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent since a 43-40 win over South Carolina on Nov. 1, 2003.

The Wild Rebel had a lot to do with the point total. Ole Miss rolled up 148 yards on 10 plays out of the formation and capped off the scoring with a 10-yard run from freshman tailback Brandon Bolden. He debuted with 61 of his 76 yards rushing coming in the new formation and hit Snead with a 37-yard pass out of the shotgun.

McCluster finished with 64 yards rushing - 50 out of the $\check{\text{Wild}}$ Rebel - and four catches for 61 yards receiving.

With 56,127 fans in the stands and players making few mistakes, about the only set-back for Nutt was the overeager fan who surprised him with a chestbump as the team made its way through The Grove a few hours before kickoff.

Snead's debut was solid, though not particularly sharp as he completed 10 of 22 passes for 185 yards. He made few mistakes, but overthrew several receivers in his first action since 2006 when he played in a handful of games for Texas before sitting out last season under NCAA transfer rules.

And Nutt appears to have made a difference for the Southeastern Conference's lastplace defense. The Rebels intercepted two passes, setting up two field goals by Joshua Shene, and held Memphis in check except for a late 43-yard touchdown pass from Will Hudgens to Maurice Jones and a 1-yard scoring dive by Hudgens once the game was out of hand.

Hudgens and starter Arkelon Hall struggled. Hall finished with 159 yards passing before leaving due to injury and Hudgens passed for 102 yards. Each threw an interception

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (AP) -Sam Swank kicked a 41-yard field goal with 3 seconds left to cap a dramatic final minute and give No. 20 Wake Forest a 30-28 win over Ole Miss on Saturday.

After Jevan Snead's 5-yard touchdown pass to Cordera Eason on fourth down with 1:01 left gave Ole Miss the lead, Riley Skinner led the Demon Deacons on a 56-yard drive, keyed by a pass interference penalty against Marshay Green.

Swank, the nation's active career leader with 65 field goals, calmly drilled the gamewinning field goal for the sixth lead change of the game.

Skinner completed 32-of-43 passes for a career-high 348 yards and two touchdowns and no interceptions, and D.J. Boldin caught 11 passes for 123 yards, including a 22-yard catch on the final drive..

The Rebels (1-1) were a minute away from giving first-year coach Houston Nutt a signature win in only his second season, when Snead led a 7-minute, 80-yard drive. Facing fourth-and-3 from the Wake Forest 5, Snead was quickly flushed out of the pocket, scrambled right, then left and back right again before finding Eason in the front of the end zone.

Justin Sparks' extra-point broke the tie, but the experienced Demon Deacons weren't finished

Snead showed poise all afternoon, completing 20-of-33 for 360 yards and three touchdowns, often creating after the pocket collapsed.

Snead scrambled away from a sack and found Dexter McCluster open in the flat, who raced past three defenders for a 31-yard touchdown to give Ole Miss a 21-20 lead early in the fourth quarter.

It made up for Snead throwing interceptions on consecutive plays early in the third quarter. The second, a diving grab by Brandon Ghee, led to Swank's 27-yard field goal to get Wake Forest within 14-13.

Early, Nutt's "Wild Rebel" formation of direct snaps to running backs and receivers caused Wake Forest problems.

Nutt promised to add wrinkles to the formation, and a gimmick play set up the tying touchdown late in the first quarter. A direct snap to McCluster turned into a reverse-flea flicker, with Snead finding Brandon Bolden for a 33-yard gain. That set up Snead's 4-yard TD pass to Gerald Harris.

OXFORD, Miss (AP) - Mike Wallace returned a kickoff 98 yards and Peria Jerry scored on a 13-yard fumble return, but the Rebel offense could not capitalize in the red zone in a 23-17 loss to Vanderbilt in the Rebels' SEC opener.

Ryan Hamilton tied a school record with three interceptions, scored a touchdown on an interception return and saved a score with a goal-line tackle to help Vanderbilt remain undefeated and notch its second league victory.

The Commodores intercepted four of Jevan Snead's passes to put themselves in position to be ranked for the first time since 1984 by surviving an early and odd Rebels scoring flurry. Vanderbilt was one spot out of the Top 25 entering the week and is 4-0 for just the fourth time since World War II.

But the Commodores (2-0 Southeastern Conference) needed a pair of goal-line stands and a final interception as time expired to win.

The Rebels (2-2, 0-1) appeared as if they might run away early after forcing a fumble deep in Vanderbilt territory with a 10-0 lead. But Hamilton stepped in front of Snead's pass and returned it 79 yards for a score.

His second interception of Snead and 23-yard return helped set up a field goal that rallied Vanderbilt to a 17-17 halftime tie. The Commodores could only manage two more Bryant Hahnfeldt field goals in the second half, but Hamilton and the defense made it stand up.

Hamilton made a crucial tackle on Ole Miss' first series of the second half, when he caught running back Cordera Eason from behind on fourth-and-inches at the goal line. Hamilton later recovered a fumble on a punt return to negate another Ole Miss drive and finished the game off with a pick on Snead's pass around the Vanderbilt 10.

Hamilton also recovered a fumble, but wasn't the only playmaker on the Commodores defense. Reshard Langford killed another drive with a bobbling interception of Snead at midfield, then Chris Marve finished off another Rebels' goal-line chance for a rally when he forced Dexter McCluster to fumble into the end zone. D.J. Moore fell on the loose ball

Ole Miss had plenty of chances to pick up the program's 600th victory after an early fumble return by Peria Jerry and a kickoff return by Mike Wallace put the Rebels up 17-7. But six turnovers, poor play from an out-of-sync Snead, who finished 12-of-25 for 184 yards in his first bad game, and seven penalties for 82 yards sent them to their ninth straight SEC loss and 13th in the last 14 games.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (AP) - Houston Nutt needed just five games to get a signature win at Ole Miss. Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, ran for another score and led the Rebels to a stunning 31-30 victory at No. 4 Florida.

Snead outplayed last year's Heisman Trophy winner, and he did it in The Swamp, where Florida (3-1, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) had won 21 of its last 22 games.

In his fifth career start, Snead was 9-of-20 passing for 185 yards, not great numbers, but he made plays when the Rebels (3-2, 1-1) needed them. His biggest was an 86-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge that put the Rebels ahead 31-24 with 5:26 to play.

Tim Tebow brought the Gators back, driving them 78 yards in about 2 minutes, but the game-tying extra point was blocked by defensive lineman Kentrell Lockett. Florida coach Urban Meyer argued that Lockett illegally jumped over the offensive line, but the officials did not agree.

Florida forced a punt and had one more chance, but Tebow was stuffed for no gain on fourth-and-1 at the Ole Miss 32-yard line.

Snead took a couple of knees from there, running out the clock and setting off a raucous celebration in and around the small section of Ole Miss who made the trip.

Tebow was 24-of-38 passing for 319 yards and a touchdown. He ran 15 times for 7 yards and two scores, a far cry from the 166 yards he had in Oxford last season.

He also misfired on several long passes and underthrew one in the end zone. And on his lone TD toss to Percy Harvin, it came on a deflected pass that Kendrick Lewis nearly intercepted.

Florida's biggest problem was three turnovers and a miserable third quarter that might go down as the worst 15 minutes in the Meyer era.

Leading 17-7, Harvin fumbled on the second play of the third. Ole Miss turned it into a field goal. Tebow fumbled on the next play, and Snead found Cordera Eason on a perfectly called screen pass for an 18-yard touchdown. Eason leapt over Markihe Anderson at the 5 and rolled into the end zone to tie the game.

It got worse for the Gators, too.

Tebow, under heavy pressure all day long, just couldn't find a rhythm. Ole Miss did. Dexter McCluster, who lined up countless times in the "Wild Rebel" formation made famous by Darren McFadden under Nutt at Arkansas, busted through the line and rambled 40 yards for a touchdown that made it 24-17.

The Gators regrouped in the fourth - Tebow even tied it with a short run early in the quarter - but the defensive collapse on the long pass play and the blocked extra point turned out to be the difference.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Ole Miss put together a solid day offensively against the nation's top defense, but fell 31-24 in its homecoming game against South Carolina.

On-again, off-again starter Chris Smelley threw three touchdown passes for South Carolina. Given the starting job Thursday, Smelley completed 22 of 31 passes for a career-high 327 yards and led an 11-play, 95-yard drive midway through the fourth quarter to put away Ole Miss, which stumbled a week after knocking off then-No. 4 Florida.

The Rebels (3-3, 1-2 Southeastern Conference) appeared to take control early, but a pair of fumbles helped the Gamecocks (4-2, 1-2) earn a critical win that kept them from exiting the SEC East race in early October.

Smelley, who sat last week after coach Steve Spurrier chose to start Stephen Garcia, made several strong throws in the game and only one big mistake, a third-quarter interception that didn't hurt South Carolina.

After Smelley hit Jason Barnes with a touchdown pass on third-and-goal from the 20 early in the second quarter, Gamecocks defensive lineman Nathan Peppers scooped up Jevan Snead's fumble and returned it 29 yards for a 14-point swing in exactly a minute that gave South Carolina a 17-14 lead.

Ole Miss answered to take a 21-14 halftime lead on a 24-yard pass from Snead to Brandon Bolden, but another fumble in the second half turned the game for the Gamecocks.

Chris Culliver forced Dexter McCluster to fumble at the South Carolina 6 midway through the third quarter. Emmanuel Cook returned the fumble to the 42. It was McCluster's second critical fumble near the opponent's goal line in the last three games. A similar play at the 1 helped Vanderbilt beat Ole Miss two weeks ago.

Smelley was especially sharp on the ensuing drive, converting a pair of first downs with quarterback sneaks, including fourth-and-inches at the Ole Miss 10. That set up the second of his two touchdown passes to Barnes, a 6-yarder that put the Gamecocks up 24-21

After Ole Miss downed the ball at the 5 following a punt on the ensuing drive, Smelley and tailback Mike Davis marched South Carolina down the field. Davis rushed for 28 yards on the drive and Smelley hit 5 of 6 passes for 54 yards, including a 4-yard touchdown pass to Joe Hills.

The Gamecocks were the nation's top defense entering the game, allowing 105 yards passing and 221 total yards per game coming in. But the Rebels surpassed both marks by halftime. Snead completed 12 of 15 passes for 154 yards by the break and the team added another 78 yards rushing, including 29 yards and a 5-yard touchdown by McCluster out of the Wild Rebel formation.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (AP) -- After seeing Alabama reel off 24 straight points in the first half, Ole Miss responded with 17 unanswered points in the second half, but the Rebel drive in the final minutes stalled in UA territory as the second-ranked Crimson Tide escaped 24-20.

John Parker Wilson threw for a season-high 219 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and the Crimson Tide (7-0, 4-0 Southeastern Conference) stopped the Rebels (3-4, 1-3) on fourth-and-5 from its 43-yard line in the final minute, when Jevan Snead's pass to Dexter McCluster fell incomplete.

Ole Miss closed to within 24-20 on Joshua Shene's 35-yard field goal with 6:09 left. The Tide pushed the ball across midfield on its next possession aiming to put the game away but the drive stalled. P.J. Fitzgerald's short punt gave Ole Miss the ball at its own 24 with 3:03 left.

Snead ran it on the first three plays, including one 5-yard gain on a pass that was batted right back into his arms by Bobby Greenwood. Brandon Deaderick then had a sack, Snead threw an incompletion and hit McCluster for a 10-yard gain to set up fourth down.

Houston Nutt's team cashed in on two big gambles on the opening drive of the second half to make it 24-10. Snead ran up the middle for 17 yards on fourth-and-4. Then, Ole Miss faked a field goal, with blocking back Jason Cook taking a shovel pass from holder Rob Park for a 9-yard touchdown.

A later fourth-down try in Alabama territory didn't pay off, when Don'ta Hightower stuffed Davis on fourth-and-inches late in the third. Ole Miss got more chances, though.

After the teams exchanged fumbles in the fourth quarter, Snead hit Shay Hodge for a 17-yard touchdown with 9:27 left.

Alabama went three-and-out to give Ole Miss the ball back near midfield. Snead kept the drive alive with a 31-yard pass to Lionel Breaux on third-and-11. His next two passes fell incomplete, forcing the Rebels to settle for Shene's kick.

Enrique Davis gained 70 yards on 11 carries for Ole Miss, most of that coming on a 62-yarder that set up Shene's first field goal. It was the longest play from scrimmage yielded by Alabama this season.

The Tide had outscored opponents 88-0 in the first quarter before that.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) - Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, and Ole Miss held off an Arkansas rally to give coach Houston Nutt a 23-21 win over his former team.

The Rebels (4-4, 2-3 Southeastern Conference) led 23-14 with 1:45 remaining, but Arkansas quickly cut the deficit to two on Casey Dick's 22-yard touchdown pass to Greg Childs. The Razorbacks (3-5, 1-4) then tried an onside kick, and Arkansas' Aaron Fenton appeared to recover it.

Officials initially ruled the play out of bounds, but the call was reversed on review, giving the Razorbacks the ball with 1:03 to play. London Crawford caught a pass near the Ole Miss 20, but it was called back for offensive pass interference, and Arkansas didn't threaten again.

Nutt coached the Hogs for 10 seasons before leaving after last regular season to take over for SEC West Ole Miss. The Rebels took control early with a pair of scores near the end of the first half. The win was a major boost to the Rebels' bowl hopes and their first over Arkansas since 2003.

Arkansas trailed 20-14 after Dick's 8-yard touchdown pass to Lucas Miller with 4:28 remaining, but Snead found Mike Wallace for a 42-yard pass on the next Ole Miss possession, and Joshua Shene kicked a 28-yard field goal with 1:45 to play.

After that kick appeared to put the game out of reach, the Ole Miss fans in one corner of the stadium began chanting "Houston Nutt! Houston Nutt!"

The Arkansas fans booed, and a few of them began chanting `Bobby" in reference to Nutt's replacement, Bobby Petrino.

Petrino made a key call in the second quarter. The Razorbacks had already missed one field goal, so he decided to go for it on fourth-and-1 from the Ole Miss 13. Michael Smith took a pitch to the left and went untouched to the end zone for a 7-3 lead

The Rebels answered, scoring twice in the final two minutes of the half. Snead threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge to give Ole Miss the lead with 1:58 remaining, then Fon Ingram intercepted a pass and returned it 38 yards to the 17. The Rebels had time for one more play, a 34-yard field goal by Shene that made it 13-7 at halftime.

Ole Miss went ahead 20-7 with 13:21 left in the game when Snead found Wallace wide open in the back of the end zone for an 11-yard touchdown. Arkansas' offense came back to life after that with a 97-yard scoring drive.
