#### THE GAME

Auburn celebrates its 82nd Homecoming on Saturday, returning to Jordan-Hare Stadium for the first time in four weeks to host UT Martin. It will be the final regular season non-conference game of the year for Auburn, and will mark the first-ever meeting between the two schools.

#### AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ Auburn has won its last 16 homecoming contests, with an average margin of victory of 24.5 points.
- ▶ Auburn is 30-2-1 in its last 33 Homecoming games.
- ▶ Kodi Burns had Auburn's first 300-yard passing game since the 2005 season opener with a 319-yard effort at Ole Miss Nov. 1.
- Chris Slaughter had eight catches for 131 yards at Ole Miss after totaling eight receptions for 39 yards in his first 17 games as a Tiger combined.
- Auburn had 314 yards of offense in the second half at Ole Miss, which was the biggest half of the season for the Tigers and more yards than they had in any of their previous four games.
- ▶ Auburn has not allowed a touchdown in the first quarter all season, outscoring its opponents 44-6 in the quarter.
- ▶ Auburn ranks third in the nation in opponents' third-down conversion percentage, surrendering just 36 first downs in 133 attempts (27.1 percent).
- ▶ Auburn ranks 14th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 15.9 points per game.
- ▶ Auburn ranks 10th nationally in pass defense (163.1) and 20th in pass defense efficiency (105.04).
- Auburn is one of just six teams that has not allowed more than four rushing touchdowns this season.
- ▶ Auburn has nine shutouts since the 2000 season, which is tied for the SEC lead, and has played 72 consecutive games without being shut out.
- ▶ Auburn ranks tied for 10th nationally in kickoff returns (25.1) and 11th in the nation in punt returns (15.6).
- Senior Tristan Davis is Auburn's career record holder in kickoff return average (26.1).
- ▶ Junior Antonio Coleman shares the SEC lead in sacks (6.0) and tackles for loss (10.5).
- ▶ Junior Ben Tate needs just 132 yards rushing to become the 13th player in Auburn history with 2,000 career rushing yards.

#### HOMECOMING ON THE PLAINS

This Saturday's game will mark the 95th observance of Homecoming at Auburn and the 82nd homecoming game for the Tigers.

Homecoming at Auburn began in June 1913, when Dr. Charles Thach, president of what was then Alabama Polytechnic Institute, issued a proclamation calling for "the observance of a Homecoming for all those loyal sons who, as former Auburn students, have passed through her portals and received her honors."

Homecoming festivities were held in connection with the spring commencement exercises until 1924. Auburn beat Clemson, 13-0, in Auburn's first Homecoming game. The game was played on old Drake Field, which is now the parking lot for the new student union.

Until the first section of Jordan-Hare Stadium was completed in 1939, Auburn sometimes observed Homecoming in Montgomery or Columbus, Ga., since adequate campus facilities were not available. Auburn did not have Homecoming games in 1930 and 1938. There was no football team in 1943 because of WWII.

Auburn is 68-8-5 in Homecoming games. Mississippi State (16 times) has been the most common Homecoming guest.

#### AUBURN HOMECOMING COURT

At halftime of Saturday's game, the Homecoming Queen will be crowned on the east side of the field. A pool of more than 50 applicants went through two rounds of interviews and cuts before the five finalists were announced.

The queen will be elected by a vote of the Auburn student body on Friday, Nov. 7 and the winner's name is kept in anonymity until the announcement.

The five finalists are: Kellen Cooper, Meredith Gaston, Jordan Huff, Melissa Johnson and Haley Walker. All applicants must be an undergraduate with senior status and maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or better. Each applicant was also nominated by a member of one of the 300 campus organizations.

#### HOMECOMING NOTABLES

Auburn has won 16 straight Homecoming contests ... The Tigers' average margin of victory in those 16 games is +24.5 ... Auburn has scored 25 or more points in 21 of the last 25 Homecoming games, including 30 or more points in 19 of those contests ... Auburn is 30-2-1 in its last 33 Homecoming games ... This will be the seventh Homecoming game to be played on Nov. 8 and first since 1986. Auburn is 4-1-1 in its previous Nov. 8 Homecoming games, winning the last two and going 4-0-1 in the last five.

#### UT MARTIN QUICK HITTERS

UT Martin is ranked 20th in the latest FCS Coaches Top 25 poll and the Sports Network's FCS poll ... The Skyhawks lead the Ohio Valley Conference with a 5-1 league mark ... Saturday's game will set a record for the most people to ever watch UT Martin play football - the current top mark of 48,058 was set earlier this season at South Florida ... It will also be UTM's first ever game against an SEC opponent ... UT Martin ranks second nationally in the Football Championship Subdivision in scoring offense, averaging 40.7 points per game ... The Skyhawks scored a season-best 87 points earlier this season against Concordia College ... 370 of Brandyn Young's 56 yards rushing have come in the last two games ... Roren Thomas leads the OVC in all-purpose yardage (160.3) ... Quarterback Cade Thompson, a transfer from South Carolina, ranks ninth nationally in the FCS in passing efficiency (159.11) ... Dontrell Miller's four interceptions ranks tied for second in the OVC.

#### **TENNESSEE TIGERS**

The 2008 Auburn roster includes two players who hail from the state of Tennessee. Sophomore OL Mike Berry is from Antioch, while redshirt freshman OL A.J. Greene is from Madison.

#### ALABAMA SKYHAWKS

Ten members of the UT Martin squad are from the state of Alabama: senior WR E.J. Daniel (Brundidge), sophomore S Erick Daniel (Fairfield), junior OT Joe Gibbs (Brilliant), freshman DB Avery Jackson (Muscle Shoals), sophomore DL Karlos Jones (Athens), junior OL Jamar Lawrence (Fosters), junior S Dontrelle Miller (Demopolis), freshman DL Darrin Nalls (Fayette), sophomore guard Taz Tillery (Russellville) and senior DT Ray Williams (Demopolis).

#### ON THIS DATE

Auburn is 6-7-1 all-time on Nov. 8. The Tigers' last game on Nov. 8 was a 24-20 loss to Ole Miss during the 1999 season. The Tigers went 4-0-1 in their previous five Nov. 8 games, but lost five straight from 1924-1952. In an unusual coincidence, Mississippi State was the opponent on six straight Nov. 8 games from 1941-1975.

#### IN NOVEMBER

Auburn is 213-164-21 (.562) all-time in the month of November, including a 19-8 mark under Tommy Tuberville. The Tigers are 10-3 in their last 13 games in November.

#### **JORDAN-HARE STADIUM**

Now in its 69th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's ninth-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers are 263-66-7 (.793) at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including a 49-12 (.803) mark since 2000. AU went 7-0 at home in both 2000 and 2004, and posted a 6-1 mark in 2005.

#### 300 THROUGH THE AIR

Sophomore quarterback Kodi Burns threw for a career-high 319 yards against Ole Miss, completing 27-of-43 passes. Burns became the first Auburn quarterback to post a 300-yard passing game since Brandon Cox threw for 342 yards in the 2005 season opener against Georgia Tech. The Tigers had played 45 straight games without having a 300-yard passing effort.

Burns' 319 yards tied for 20th most in a game by an Auburn quarterback, his 27 pass completions tied for the eighth most in a game in Auburn history, and his 43 pass attempts are tied for 12th most in Auburn history in a single game. He entered the game with 309 yards passing for the entire season.

#### FROM START TO FINISH

Kodi Burns' 319-yard effort against Ole Miss came in just his second full game at quarterback for Auburn. He entered Auburn's previous game at West Virginia Oct. 23 with three career starts and 14 games played, but the game against the Mountaineers marked the first time in his career that Burns started and played the entire game at quarterback. Burns led the team in rushing against West Virginia with 82 yards and a score on 15 carries, and completed 13-of-21 passes for 111 yards and another touchdown. His only interception came on a desperation heave on the game's final play.

#### SLAUGHTERING HIS CAREER MARKS

Sophomore wide receiver Chris Slaughter had a career game against Ole Miss Nov. 1. Slaughter hauled in eight passes for 131 yards to lead all Tiger receivers and post the first 100-yard receiving game by an Auburn player this season. Slaughter matched the number of catches he had accumulated in his first 17 games combined as a Tiger, and more than tripled his career receiving yardage. He entered the game with eight career catches for 39 yards. He also had not previously had a reception of more than nine yards in his career, but had grabs of 42, 37 and 16 yards against Ole Miss. Seven of his catches for 126 yards came in the second half.

#### OFFENSIVE FIREWORKS

Auburn's offense put up some impressive total offense numbers during the second half Nov. 1 at Ole Miss. The Tigers had 314 yards of total offense in the second half, which was the most yards gained in a half by Auburn this season, and more yards than Auburn had gained in any of its previous four games.

Auburn had 168 yards of offense in the fourth quarter alone, which was the biggest output in a single quarter of the season for the squad. The 146 yards of offense gained by the Tigers in the third quarter were the second most at the time behind a 160-yard third quarter against Louisiana-Monroe.

Auburn also had six plays of at least 20 yards in the second half against Ole Miss, which was one more than the Tigers had in the last four games combined.

#### FANTASTIC FIRST QUARTERS

Auburn has outscored its opponents 44-6 in the first quarter this season, helping the Tigers to lead eight of their nine games at halftime. The Tigers have yet to allow a touchdown in the opening quarter this season, surrendering field goals to LSU and Arkansas.

Auburn played nearly the first seven quarters of its season without allowing a point, surrendering its first score of the season with just 2:33 left in the third quarter against Southern Miss after going 102:27 without being scored upon.

#### MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Auburn's return specialists have excelled this season, as the Tigers rank tied for 10th nationally in kickoff returns (25.1) and 11th in punt returns (15.6). Individually, Tristan Davis is third in the SEC and 23rd nationally in kickoff returns (26.9) and Robert Dunn averages 21.4 yards per punt returns but does not have enough returns (nine) to qualify for the NCAA leaders. Both have returned kicks for touchdowns.

The Tigers have not allowed their opponents as much success returning kicks, as Auburn is 17th nationally in net punting (37.4) and third in the SEC in kickoff coverage (45.3).

#### DAVIS SETTING RECORDS

Tristan Davis set an Auburn single-game record with 182 kickoff return yards Oct. 11 vs. Arkansas. Davis, who accumulated the 182 yard on five returns, brought back his first return of the game 97 yards for a touchdown, which was the sixth-longest kickoff return in school history. His 182 yards were the eighth most in a single game in SEC history.

Davis now ranks first in Auburn history with a career kickoff return average of 26.1 yards, and his 1229 career kickoff return yards is third best in school history.

### **SEC SUCCESS**

Auburn has won 28 of its last 38 Southeastern Conference games and 29 of its last 39 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back to more than just the past five seasons, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers have tied for the third-best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games, just two games behind the leader. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-08.

#### **DUNN DEAL**

In the season opener against Louisiana-Monroe, Robert Dunn snapped an Auburn streak of 144 consecutive games and 374 punt returns without a touchdown, which was the longest streak in the nation, by returning a kick 66 yards for a score.

Dunn, who was only 10 years old the last time Auburn had a punt return for a touchdown, appeared to accomplish the feat again Sept. 6 against Southern Miss, but what would have been a 65-yard return for a score was reduced to 47 yards due to a block in the back at the 18-yard line that occurred 5 yards behind Dunn, who was about to cruise into the end zone.

Dunn, who has had five of his nine returns this season go for at least 17 yards, finished the Southern Miss game with 103 punt return yards, becoming the first Tiger to have more than 100 punt return yards in a game since Joe Walkins against Ball State on Sept. 1, 2001.

#### SCORING FROM ALL AVENUES

Auburn has scored touchdowns this season the conventional way via the run and the pass, but has also found other ways to score touchdowns. The Tigers have scored touchdowns on a kickoff return, a punt return, an interception return and twice on fumble returns. According to available data, this marks the first season since 1970 that Auburn has scored on a punt return and on a kickoff return in the same season.

In the season opener against Louisiana-Monroe, Auburn scored touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams for the first time in a game since a 73-7 victory in 2003 over ULM.

#### INJURIES NOT HELPING

Injuries have played a major role in Auburn's season, as Auburn has had 13 players who have appeared on the two deep miss a combined 49 games due to injury this season, including three starters lost for the season due to injury - line-backer Tray Blackmon, offensive lineman Chaz Ramsey and defensive back Aairon Savage. Other players lost for the year include defensive back T'Sharvan Bell, defensive end Raven Gray, defensive back Marcus Jemison, wide receiver Philip Pierre-Louis and defensive end Jomarcus Savage.

#### TOUGH TO SCORE AGAINST

Auburn has allowed just 143 points through its first nine games, ranking the Tigers 14th in the nation in scoring defense at 15.9 points per game. Six of Auburn's first nine opponents have been held to 17 points or fewer.

Last season, Auburn allowed 142 points in the first nine games (15.8 per game) en route to a season in which the Tigers finished sixth nationally in scoring defense.

#### DEFENSE SHINING

Under first-year defensive coordinator Paul Rhoads, Auburn's defense has been stellar in several areas beyond scoring defense. The Tigers are ranked in the top 30 nationally in several defensive categories, including third-down conversion defense (27.1, 3rd), pass defense (163.1, 10th), pass efficiency defense (105.04, 20th), first downs allowed (16.3, T25th), total defense (303.0, 27th), tackles for loss (6.6, 27th) and red zone defense (.762, T27th).

#### THIRD DOWN DOMINATION

Auburn's defense has been terrific on third downs this season, as the Tigers rank third in the nation in opponent third-down conversions. Auburn opponents have converted just 36-of-133 third downs for 27.1 percent. Five of Auburn's nine opponents have been held to less than 30 percent on their third-down conversion attempts, including Mississippi State which was 0-of-14 on Sept. 13.

Auburn went more than eight quarters earlier this year without allowing a third-down conversion. From a first-quarter Southern Miss conversion until LSU converted in the second quarter Sept. 20, the Tigers had played 28 straight third downs without allowing a first down.

Auburn's defense has been particularly stingy in the fourth quarter, with opponents converting just 8-of-36 (22.2 percent). Forcing third and long has been the key, as 70 of the 133 attempts (52.6 percent) have come with seven or more yards needed for a first down.

#### SECONDARY TO NONE

Auburn's secondary has been solid despite a lack of depth this season, as the Tigers rank 10th nationally defensively in pass defense (163.1) and 20th in pass efficiency defense (105.04). The Tigers are allowing only 5.22 yards per pass attempt, which is the fourth best mark in the nation.

Auburn has held five of its nine opponents to 157 or fewer yards passing, including two that failed to reach 100. Tennessee threw for just 67 yards Sept. 27, and Mississippi State had 78 yards through the air Sept. 13.

Auburn opponents should be ready for more of the same in the future, as there are no seniors in the group of starters or top reserves.

#### NOT GIVING UP GROUND

Auburn's defense has allowed just four rushing touchdown this season, making the Tigers one of just six teams that have allowed four or fewer rushing touchdowns this season. Three of the other five schools have also played just eight games, while the Tigers have played nine.

#### **COLEMAN LIGHTING UP QBs**

Junior defensive end Antonio Coleman has collected six sacks and 10.5 tackles for loss so far this season, with both marks ranking tied for first in the SEC. Coleman, who also has a teamhigh 12 quarterback hurries this year, now has 14.5 sacks during his career, and needs just one more to crack Auburn's career top 10. He has 30 tackles for loss during his career.

#### **HIGH MARKS**

Junior All-American candidate Sen'Derrick Marks has been a terror on the defensive line for the Auburn defense. Marks has nine tackles for loss, including two sacks, which is tied for fifth most in the SEC this season. Marks, who has started all 35 games since the start of the 2006 season, now has 29 tackles for loss during his career.

#### SUCCESS FROM THE FIRST START

Sophomore Josh Bynes filled in for Tray Blackmon as the starting middle linebacker Sept. 27 against Tennessee, and his first start was a memorable one. Bynes led the team with 11 tackles (six solo, five assists), becoming the first Auburn player this season to record a double-digit tackle effort. Has has started the last five games, and now ranks third on the team with 44 tackles, including 35 in his five starts, which leads the team during that span.

#### DURST CONTINUING TO EXCEL

Redshirt freshman Clinton Durst, who burst onto the scene in the spring and was the Special Teams MVP of the A-Day game after averaging 48.3 yards on three punts, ranks fourth in the SEC and 30th nationally, averaging 42.1 yards per punt this year with 15 punts placed inside the 20-yard line. His kicks, which have included 18 fair catches, have helped Auburn rank 17th nationally in net punting at 37.4 yards per kick.

Durst is part of an impressive stable of young kickers that also includes sophomore punter Ryan Shoemaker, who was a first-team preseason All-SEC selection this season after averaging 42.4 yards per punt last year, before being supplanted as Auburn's punter by Durst.

Auburn's group of young kickers also includes sophomore kicker Wes Byrum, who led Auburn in scoring last year with 86 points, including 17 field goals which is tied for third most in a single season in school history. He made game-winning field goals in the closing seconds at Florida and at Arkansas last season.

In addition, sophomore Patrick Tatum averaged 43.4 yards on 16 punts last season while Shoemaker was out with an injury, and sophomore Morgan Hull has also handled the kickoff duties part-time in each of the last two seasons.

#### WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Auburn's one-point loss to Vanderbilt Oct. 4 snapped a string of five straight victories for Auburn in games decided by four points or less. It was the first one-point loss for Auburn since a 30-29 defeat at the hands of Tennessee in the 1997 SEC Championship game in Atlanta.

Under Tommy Tuberville, the Tigers are now 17-7 in games decided by four points or less, and have won eight of their last 11. Since the 2000 season, Auburn is 7-1 in games decided by just one or two points.

#### RUNNING BACK U.

Auburn is continuing its tradition of producing high-caliber running backs, with two backs on the squad that have over 1,600 career rushing yards. Junior Ben Tate leads the team with 573 yards rushing and ranks 16th in Auburn history with 1,868 career yards. Tate needs 132 yards to become the 13th player in Auburn history with 2,000 career rushing yards. Senior Brad Lester had 238 yards this season and has pushed his career total to 1,638, which ranks 20th. They were the first pair of Auburn running backs to enter a season with more than 1,000 yards rushing each since Carnell Williams and Ronnie Brown in 2004.

#### CENTURY RECEIVER

Senior Rodgeriqus Smith became the seventh player in Auburn history to accumulate 100 career receptions during Auburn's game against Vanderbilt Oct. 4. Smith, who leads the team with 25 catches for 246 yards and a score this season, now has 109 career catches, which ranks sixth in school history. Smith also has 1,512 career receiving yards, which ranks ninth best in Auburn history.

#### SPREADING IT AROUND

Auburn has had 15 different players catch passes this season, and all 15 have multiple receptions. The Tigers had 11 different players catch passes Sept. 6 vs. Southern Miss, marking the most players to catch a pass in a game for Auburn since 2005 against Ole Miss.

#### FIRST TIMERS

Auburn has had 21 players play in their first collegiate games at Auburn this season, including 12 true freshmen. The true freshmen that have seen action this season include: DB Harry Adams, WR Darvin Adams, DB Drew Cole, DB D'Antoine Hood, WR Philip Pierre-Louis, LB Spencer Pybus, DL Jomarcus Savage, RB Eric Smith, TE Vance Smith, DB Christian Thompson, DB Neiko Thorpe and WR Derek Winter. Others who have played in their first games at Auburn include: WR Quindarius Carr, OL Jared Cooper, H Clayton Crofoot, RB John Douglas, P Clinton Durst, RB Ryan Hastie, LB Adam Herring, DB Mike Slade, and QB Chris Todd.

#### NO SHUTOUTS ALLOWED

Auburn has scored in 72 consecutive games, which is the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers have not been shut out since a 23-0 loss to USC to open the 2003 season. It will be a while before Auburn could challenge the school record. The Tigers scored in 149 straight games from Oct. 4, 1980 through Nov. 14, 1992.

#### SHUTOUT CITY

Auburn shut out Louisiana-Monroe in the season opener, 34-0, for its first shutout since a 27-0 win against Arkansas State on Nov. 4, 2006. It marked the ninth shutout by Auburn during the Tommy Tuberville era, and was the first shutout in a season opener since a 31-0 victory over ULM in the 2004 opener.

Auburn's nine shutouts since the 2000 season are tied with LSU for the most in the SEC during that span. No other SEC school has more than four shutouts since 2000.

#### WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 68-9 when scoring 20 or more points in a game, including a 65-8 mark in the regular season. Dating back to 1995, Auburn is 89-16 when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

#### 30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 45-0 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Auburn has won 50 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points.

The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.

In the last 23 years, Auburn is 119-2 when scoring 30 points.

#### VS. RANKED TEAMS

Auburn is 20-20 against nationally-ranked teams during the Tommy Tuberville era, including a 12-6 record since the 2004 season. The Tigers have beaten at least one nationally-ranked team during each of Tuberville's previous nine seasons on the Plains.

#### LONG DRIVE

Auburn opened the West Virginia game Oct. 23 with a 20-play scoring drive, moving 81 yards and taking 9:54 off the clock before settling for a 19-yard Wes Byrum field goal. It was the longest drive of the year for Auburn in terms of plays, yards and time, and in fact, the 20 plays were the most in a drive by an Auburn team since records began being kept in 1970. It also tied for the most plays in a drive by any SEC team this year, and was the second longest in terms of time.

#### IN THE POLLS

For the sixth consecutive year, Auburn was nationally ranked to begin the season, although the Tigers are not currently ranked.

This season marked the first time since the 1986-91 seasons that Auburn was ranked at the start of six consecutive seasons. The Tigers, then at No. 10, were also ranked in the top 10 of the AP Preseason Poll for the third time since 2003. The Tigers were the preseason No. 6 team in 2003 and ranked No. 4 in the initial 2006 poll.

#### TUBERVILLE IN TENTH SEASON

Tommy Tuberville is in his tenth season at Auburn in 2008 and his 14th as a head coach in the Southeastern Conference. Tuberville has the third-longest tenure in the SEC (second-longest active streak) behind Phillip Fulmer of Tennessee and Steve Spurrier of South Carolina, who will each coach his 16th season in the league this year.

Tuberville has amassed a record of 84-38 in his 10 seasons at Auburn and an overall mark of 109-58. He has led the Tigers to eight straight bowl appearances.

Tuberville is fourth all-time at Auburn in wins, and is the fourth-longest tenured coach in school history.

#### 14 AND COUNTING

In his 14th year as a head coach, Tommy Tuberville has five assistant coaches who have been with him all 14 years. That group includes: defensive tackles coach Don Dunn, running backs/special teams coach Eddie Gran, wide receivers coach Greg Knox, offensive line coach Hugh Nall and defensive ends coach Terry Price.

#### **TUBERVILLE'S TOP 10**

#### ANOTHER HALL OF FAME FOR TUBS

Auburn head coach Tommy Tuberville, who was inducted into the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame in February, was announced in October as part of the Southern Arkansas University Sports Hall of Fame class of 2008. Tuberville, a 1976 graduate of Southern Arkansas, played both football and golf for the Muleriders. He was honored at halftime of Southern Arkansas' Oct. 25 football game against Delta State along with six others.

#### THE SENIOR CLASS

Head Coach Tommy Tuberville has a senior class that includes 16 players at Auburn in 2008. The Tigers' group of 16 seniors is the fourth most during the Tuberville era. The largest group of seniors was 21 in 2006, while the 2004 group had 18 and last year's squad had 17. During Tuberville's tenure, Auburn's other senior classes have consisted of: 15 in 2005, 13 in 2003, 15 in 2002, 10 in 2001, 14 in 2000 and 14 in 1999.

The 2008 seniors include: C Jason Bosley, RB Tristan Davis, DT Tez Doolittle, WR Robert Dunn, LB Chris Evans, OL Tyronne Green, LB Courtney Harden, TE Bryan Harris, FB Ryan Hastie, LB Merrill Johnson, RB Brad Lester, WR Charles Olatunji, DS Robert Shiver, WR Rodgeriqus Smith, WR James Swinton and DB Jonathan Vickers.

#### **IRON MEN**

Of Auburn's 16 seniors, eight have seen time in more than 30 games during their careers, including four that have played in at least 40. Courtney Harden leads the group, having played in 43 of a possible 47 games over the past four seasons, and is followed closely by Merrill Johnson (42), Rodgeriqus Smith (42), Robert Dunn (40), Tyronne Green (39), Brad Lester (38), Chris Evans (38) and Robert Shiver (35). Green, Smith and Shiver are the only three members of the senior class to have played in all 35 games over the past three seasons.

#### SECOND SENIOR SEASON

The 2008 season marks the third straight year that Auburn has had a player on the squad repeating his senior season due to an injury. Tez Doolittle is back for his second stint as a senior after missing last year with an Achilles injury. In 2007, Cole Bennett repeated his senior season after breaking his ankle during the third game of the 2006 season. David Irons was granted a sixth year of eligibility prior to the 2006 season due to a season-ending knee injury he suffered in the 2004 preseason.

#### STARTS STREAKS

Junior Sen'Derrick Marks currently own the longest staring streak on the squad, having started all 35 games over the past three seasons. No other player has a starting streak that dates back to the 2006 season. Rodgeriqus Smith had started 28 straight games until the Sept. 13 contest at Mississippi State.

Three other players have started all 22 games dating back to the start of the 2007 season, and all three are members of the offensive line. Seniors Jason Bosley and Tyronne Green and sophomore Lee Ziemba have all started every game since last season.

#### POSITION CHANGES

A number of players have changed positions since last season.

Junior Sen'Derrick Marks moved back to defensive tackle, where he started all 13 games as a freshman before starting every game as a defensive end last year.

Sophomore Mario Fannin, who played running back last season, has split out as a wide receiver in Auburn's new spread offense this year.

Sophomore tackles Lee Ziemba moved from right tackle to left tackles, switching spots Ryan Pugh, who in turn has changed places with Jason Bosley the last two games, moving to center while Bosley plays right tackle.

Junior Gabe McKenzie, who had played tight end during each of his first three seasons at Auburn, switched to defensive end Aug. 19 during preseason camp, and A.J. Greene moved from defensive end to the offensive line Sept. 10.

#### TIGER GRADS

Auburn began the season with eight graduates on the roster.

The Tiger graduates include: OL Jason Bosley (finance), RB Tristan Davis (criminology), DL Tez Doolittle (criminology), OL Tyronne Green (criminology), LB Courtney Harden (criminology), LB Merrill Johnson (criminology), WR Rodgeriqus Smith (business administration) and WR James Swinton (public administration).

#### AUBURN BY THE NUMBERS

The Tigers return 46 lettermen from last season, including 22 on offense, 20 on defense and four specialists. Auburn returns eight starters on offense and seven on defense.

Auburn's roster of 113 players includes 16 seniors, 18 juniors, 35 sophomores, 15 redshirt freshmen and 29 freshmen. The underclassmen (79) represent 69.9 percent of the Tigers' roster.

A number of walk-ons joined the program after the first day of classes on August 18.

#### **TIGER PROS**

Auburn has demonstrated a proficiency for placing players in the National Football League. Auburn had 27 players listed on opening day NFL rosters, which was tied for 12th most of any college in the nation. The Seattle Seahawks have the most former Tigers, with five former Auburn players on the roster, while the Washington Redskins have four.

#### TIGERS TOUGH ON TOP TEN

Auburn has won nine of its last 13 games against teams ranked in the *Associated Press* top 10. The Tigers have won five of their last eight against top-ten teams and six of their last seven at home.

Last year, Auburn won at No. 4 Florida, 20-17, and in 2006, the Tigers beat No. 3 LSU (7-3) and No. 2 Florida (27-17). In 2005, Auburn posted victories at No. 9 Georgia (31-30) and against No. 8 Alabama (28-18). In 2004, Auburn defeated No. 5 LSU (10-9), No. 10 Tennessee (34-10), No. 8 Georgia (24-6) and No. 9 Virginia Tech (16-13) in the NOKIA Sugar Bowl.

Three of the four losses against top-10 teams since the 2004 season have come in close calls against LSU - in overtime in 2005 by a 20-17 score, by a 30-24 score in 2007 when LSU scored on a 22-yard pass play with just one second left, and 26-21 this year when LSU scored a TD with 1:03 remaining.

During the Tommy Tuberville era, Auburn is 15-13 in games played against top 10 teams, and is 15-8 dating back to a 23-20 upset of No. 1-ranked Florida Oct. 13, 2001.

Dating back to the 2002 season, Auburn has played 22 games against top 10 teams.

#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

Over the past five seasons, Auburn has the nation's seventh-best record in games played away from home (road or neutral site games). The Tigers are 18-7 (.720) since the start of the 2004 season outside of Jordan-Hare Stadium. Auburn is 15-5 against SEC teams outside of Auburn since the 2004 season.

#### WINNING IN WHITE

Auburn has won 16 of its last 20 games when wearing all white uniforms, including this season's road opener at Mississippi State. The Tigers had not lost when wearing white jerseys during the entire 2004-07 seasons, until Georgia broke the 15-game winning streak in white in Athens last November. The Tigers went 5-0 in all white uniforms in 2004, 3-0 in 2005, 4-0 in 2006 and 3-1 in 2007. The streak includes the 2004 SEC Championship game against Tennessee, a 2007 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic victory over Nebraska and last year's home victory over Vanderbilt when the team wore all white to honor the 1957 national championship team. Auburn also has road wins at Alabama (twice), Ole Miss (twice), Arkansas (twice), Mississippi State (twice), Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, South Carolina and Kentucky during that span.

#### UNDER THE LIGHTS AT JORDAN-HARE

Auburn has been tough to beat in night games at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including a season-opening victory over Louisiana-Monroe this year. The Tigers have accumulated a record of 15-3 since the 2000 season in home games starting at 6 p.m. or later. That stretch includes a 4-1 record against ranked opponents, with wins over No. 1 Florida in 2001, No. 2 Florida in 2006, No. 7 Tennessee in 2003 and No. 14 Georgia in 2000.

#### **OVER TWENTY MILLION SERVED**

Auburn surpassed the 20 million mark in all-time total attendance at Jordan-Hare Stadium during the game against Louisiana-Monroe. The Tigers, now in their 69th season at Jordan-Hare Stadium, have drawn 20,421,799 fans. It took 51 seasons for Auburn to draw its first 10 million fans, but took just 18 more to draw the second 10 million. The Tigers surpassed 10 million fans during the fourth home game of the 1990 season - a 56-6 victory over Vanderbilt on Oct. 13.

#### TIGERS ON CSS

Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS) will broadcast encore presentations of Auburn football, every Sunday at 6 p.m. ET/5 p.m. CT with Andy Burcham handling play-by-play duties and Cole Cubelic doing color commentary. CSS will also air the Auburn Football Review every Tuesday at 5 p.m. ET/4 p.m. CT and the Auburn Football Preview every Friday at 4:30 p.m. ET/3:30 p.m. CT.

CSS is a 24-hour regional sports network serving approximately 5.8 million households across 12 Southeastern states.

No. 10 Auburn scored touchdowns on defense, special teams and offense and Ben Tate rushed for 115 yards as the Tigers dominated in a 34-0 seasonopening victory over Louisiana-Monroe under the lights in Jordan-Hare Stadium. It marked the first time since the 2003 season that the Tigers were able to punch the ball into the end zone on all three sides of the ball.

On the first defensive play of the game for Auburn, Antonio Coleman broke through ULM's offensive line to sack quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster and force a fumble. Sophomore Michael Goggans recovered the fumble and dashed nine yards into the end zone for the touchdown, the first of his career.

Robert Dunn closed out the first quarter with a 66-yard punt return for a touchdown to put the Tigers ahead 14-0. Dunn's punt return for a touchdown was the first for Auburn since Robert Baker returned a punt 79 yards for a touchdown against South Carolina in 1996, snapping the nation's longest streak without returning a punt for a touchdown. The Tigers had played 144 consecutive games without a punt return for a touchdown.

Following a special teams fumble recovery by freshman Spencer Pybus to start the second half, the Tigers went 30 yards in three plays on a 19-yard rush by Mario Fannin and a pair of rushes by Brad Lester, including a 3-yard run around the right side for a touchdown.

Tate's 115 yards on the ground was his fourth career 100-yard rushing game. A 49-yard left side run late in the second quarter was the longest of the junior's career, surpassing his career long of 44 yards set in 2007 against Vanderbilt. The 49-yard run was also the longest of the game for the Tigers.

Auburn finished the game with 321 yards rushing, its most since 2005 against Kentucky when the Tigers posted 338.

Quarterback Chris Todd capped off the scoring with a 3-yard touchdown pass to Chris Slaughter midway through the fourth quarter. It marked the first touchdowns at Auburn for each player.

Senior Rodgeriqus Smith finished the game with 57 yards receiving on five catches to lead the passing attack.

No. 9 Auburn had a trio of players rush for touchdowns as the Tigers routed Southern Miss, 27-13, in front of another sellout crowd of 87,451 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

After two first quarter fumbles in the red zone, Ben Tate got the Tigers on the board with a 1-yard left end rush for a touchdown early in the second quarter. Quarterback Chris Todd connected with Rodgeriqus Smith for a 21-yard reception and Brad Lester moved the ball to the 1-yard line to set up the Tate touchdown.

Following the Golden Flashes' next possession, Auburn marched 76 yards down the field with Todd hitting Mario Fannin for 18 yards, Terrell Zachery for 17 yards and Montez Billings for 13 yards. Tristan Davis capped off the drive with a 13-yard touchdown run on his first carry since the 2005 Iron Bowl against Alabama. Davis' score was his first since 2005 at Kentucky and gave Auburn a 14-0 lead at the half.

Wes Byrum knocked in a career-long 52-yard field goal on Auburn's first drive of the third quarter. His previous career-long was from 49 yards out, which he nailed last season against Southern Florida. It also marked the first time that an Auburn placekicker had hit a 50-plus yard field goal since John Vaughn in

Kodi Burns rushed into the end zone from 1-yard out for Auburn's final touchdown to give the Tigers a commanding 24-0 lead midway through the third quarter. The score was result of a 12-play, 75-yard move down the field with Todd completing 21-yard and 20-yard passes to Tate and Davis, respectively. Tate added a 13-yard rush to set up the touchdown.

Auburn allowed its first points of the season at the 2:33 mark in the third quarter. The Golden Eagles, capitalizing on an interception, were able to get into the end zone on a 1-yard pass from Austin Davis to Shawn Nelson. The Tigers had held their opponents scoreless for the first 102:27 of the season before allowing a point.

After another USM touchdown, Byrum added a 23-yard field goal to close out the Tigers' scoring efforts in the fourth quarter.

For the second straight game, Auburn limited its opponent to under 100 yards on the ground. The Golden Flashes were only able to muster 37 yards rushing on 27 attempts.

After gaining only 85 yards through the air against Louisiana-Monroe in the season opener, quarterback Chris Todd completed 21-of-31 passes for 248 yards. In all, 11 different Auburn receivers caught passes in the game, marking the most Tigers to catch passes in a single game since 2005 against Ole Miss.

Robert Dunn set a new career-high in punt return vards with 103.

With the win, Auburn now leads the all-time series against Southern Miss 17-5 and has won the last three meetings.

#### #9 AUBURN 3 GAME 2 MISSISSIPPI STATE September 13, 2008 Davis-Wade Stadium (52,911) • Starkville, Miss.

A second quarter Wes Byrum field goal held as No. 9 Auburn won its SEC opener 3-2 on the road against Mississippi State. The Tigers improved to 3-0, while MSU slipped to 1-2.

Byrum put the only points on the board for the Tigers with a 35-yard field goal midway through the second quarter for a 3-0 lead. Byrum capped off an eight play, 39-yard drive that was highlighted by Montez Billings' 30-yard reception and an 11-yard rush by Brad Lester. The Tigers stood at the Bulldogs' 11-yard line, but were flagged for back-to-back false starts and forced to kick the field goal.

Byrum looked to put Auburn up by a pair of field goals as the half closed out, but sent the ball wide left from 42 yards out.

For the third straight week, Auburn shut out its opponent in the first half. Mississippi State was only able to generate two drives in double digits, 12 and 22 yards, and was held within its own territory for the entire half.

The opening of the third quarter looked bleak for the Tigers, with the Bulldogs recovering a fumble on Auburn's first play from scrimmage. Antionio Coleman responded by sacking MSU quarterback Wesley Carroll for a 7-yard loss. It was Coleman's third sack in as many games. An Auburn pass interference penalty gave the Bulldogs a first down, but the Tiger defense held and forced a 38yard field goal attempt by Adam Carlson. A bad snap threw off the timing and Carlson was short on his attempt.

Two drives later, the Auburn defense came up big by holding MSU on an attempt to convert on fourth-and-one. Turning the ball over on downs, the Tigers started the drive from their own 37-vard line. Ben Tate rushed for 15 yards and Chris Todd connected with Montez Billings for a 31-yard completion to put the Tigers in the red zone at the 7-yard line. Unable to push into the end zone for the touchdown, Byrum faced a 22-yard field goal but missed wide left for the second

Mississippi State's only points came at the 7:05 mark in the fourth quarter when an Auburn holding penalty in the end zone resulted in a safety.

On MSU's ensuing possession, Tray Blackmon stopped the Bulldogs short on another fourth-and-one at Auburn's 41-yard line.

Walter McFadden shut the door on any further attempts by MSU to score by picking Carroll at the Auburn 18-yard line with 2:18 left in the game. It was the first interception of the season for McFadden and the second of his career.

The Auburn defense limited the Bulldogs to 116 yards of total offense, the fewest yards allowed since holding Kentucky to 110 yards of total offense in 2004. Mississippi State did not convert a third or fourth down, going 0-14 and 0-3,

Jarrett Lee's 18-yard touchdown pass to Brandon LaFell with 1:03 left in the fourth quarter lifted No. 6 LSU over No. 10 Auburn, 26-21, in a dramatic SEC West showdown in front of a sellout crowd under the lights at Jordan-Hare

True to tradition, the game was a back and forth battle with four lead changes, and came down to the final seconds on the clock. For the first time in nine meetings, the road team left town out with the win.

LSU took a 3-0 lead in the first quarter on a Colt David 46-yard field goal, but Auburn jumped ahead on its first series of the second quarter. Quarterback Chris Todd connected with Tim Hawthorne for a 29-yard completion to spark the Tiger drive, and Ben Tate followed with a 16-yard rush around the right side. After a defensive pass interference call, Tate rushed up the middle for a 1-yard touchdown run for a 7-3 lead.

The Bayou Bengals had a chance to bring the game within one, but David missed a 50-yard field goal attempt.

Auburn added to its lead on Gabe McKenzie's 24-yard interception return for a touchdown. McKenzie, who started his junior campaign as a tight end and before switching to the defensive side of the ball, recorded his first interception and first career defensive touchdown. Heading into halftime, Auburn held a 14-3 advantage on the Bayou Bengals.

On its first possession of the second half, LSU's Lee hit Chris Mitchell for 39 yards and the touchdown to put the score at 14-10 in favor of Auburn.

Following a Todd interception, LSU moved 89 yards on four plays with three passes exceeding 20 yards. The drive was capped off by a halfback pass from Keiland Williams to Demetrius Byrd from 22 yards out as time expired in the third quarter to take a 17-14 lead into the final quarter.

LSU extended its lead on a David field goal from 32 yards out to go up 20-14 with

Auburn stormed back on the ensuing possession. Starting on its own 26-yard line, Todd again found Hawthorne for a 58-yard gain. Tate rushed for three yards before Todd connected with Robert Dunn in the end zone for the touchdown to regain the lead, 21-20.

The Auburn defense forced LSU to go three-and-out on its next pos-

session, but Auburn was unable to move the ball in response and was forced to punt.

With four minutes left on the clock and working from its own 46-yard line, LSU picked up three first downs to move to the Auburn 18-yard line to set up the game-deciding touchdown.

Hawthorne finished the game as Auburn's leading receiver with 87 yards through the air. His 58-yard catch midway through the fourth quarter was Auburn's longest play from scrimmage through four games and it the longest Hawthorne's career.

Todd finished the game with 250 yards passing, including a touchdown pass.

The Auburn defense allowed LSU to convert just 4-of-14 third-down attempts.

No. 15 Auburn scored on both the offensive and defensive sides of the ball as the Tigers defeated SEC foe Tennessee 14-12 in front of a capacity crowd at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Tigers improved to 4-1 and 2-1 in league action.

It was the first meeting between Auburn and Tennessee since the 2004 season. Auburn's win gave the Tigers a 26-21-3 all-time series lead and for the first time since 1961-64, Auburn won four straight against the Volunteers.

Auburn got on the board on its second drive of the first quarter with Chris Todd connecting with Robert Dunn in the end zone from 18 yards out. The 11play, 69-yard drive saw Ben Tate rush for 25 yards on three carries and Todd find Tommy Trott and Dunn for receptions of six and 14 yards, respectively.

Tennessee closed the gap on the Tigers with a pair of Daniel Lincoln field goals in the second quarter to bring the game within a point at 7-6. Lincoln knocked in field goals from 47 and 35 yards.

Jake Ricks would put the Tigers up 14-6 before heading in for halftime on a fumble by Volunteer quarterback Jonathan Crompton on his own goal line. Ricks jumped on the ball in the end zone for his first career touchdown.

Auburn looked to tack on another score before the half closed out as Tiger quarterback Kodi Burns conducted a 10-play drive that covered 46 yards, but a Wes Byrum field goal attempt from 35 yards was wide left.

The third quarter was a back-and-forth grind between both teams. Auburn started its third drive of the quarter from its own 2-yard line and was able to put together three-straight first downs. A Tennessee personal foul pushed the Tigers into Volunteer territory, but a pass by Todd was picked off and returned for 38

Tennseesee converted the interception into points at the start of the fourth quarter with a Montario Hardesty 2-yard touchdown run, the first rushing touchdown surrendered this season by the Auburn defense. Down by two, 14-12, the Volunteers attempted a two-point conversion with a Crompton pass, but failed.

The Tiger defense was key during the entire fourth quarter, limiting Tennessee to 14 yards of total offense and four possessions that resulted in threeand-outs.

Dunn finished the game leading the receiving unit with 54 yards on six catches to set a new career high. Fannin had a trio of catches for 29 yards. Trott and Montez Billings each had three receptions and recorded 19 and 16 yards,

Aubun scored 13 points in a 60 second span in the first quarter, but Vanderbilt rallied from a 13-0 deficit, as the No. 19 Commodores defeated the No. 13 Tigers,14-13, at a sold out Vanderbilt Stadium.

The loss moved the Tigers to 4-2, 2-2 SEC, while the Commodores improved to 5-0, 3-0 SEC for the first time since 1943.

Auburn's offense looked unstoppable on the first drive with Ben Tate rushing for three straight first downs to move the ball inside the Vanderbilt red zone, but the Tigers were unable to put any points on the board on a failed fourth-andgoal rush attempt from the 1-yard line.

The Tiger defense stayed true by forcing the Commodores to go three-andout on the following possession. Auburn quarterback Chris Todd followed the defensive stand by leading a nine-play, 49-yard drive capped off by a 7-yard touchdown pass to Rod Smith to put Auburn up 7-0 at the 4:09 mark in the first

Auburn struck again in quick fashion. The first pass from VU quarterback Chris Nickson following the Auburn score was picked off by Jerraud Powers at the Commodore 27-yard line setting up the Tigers' second score in less than a

Forty-nine seconds later Todd connected with Mario Fannin from 28 yards out for the touchdown. Auburn led 13-0 after Wes Byrum's PAT hit the upright.

Facing a 13-point deficit, Vanderbilt backup quarterback Mackenzi Adams strung together a six-play, 30-yard drive at the end of the second quarter to put the Commodores on the board. Adams hit Justin Wheeler in the back of the end zone from 15-yards out to cut Auburn's lead to 13-7. It marked the first touchdown surrendered by Auburn in the first half this season.

After a quick three and out by Auburn to start the second half, the Commodores looked to narrow Auburn's lead on its first possession of the second half, but Bryant Hahnfeldt's 40-yard field goal attempt was wide left.

On Vanderbilt's ensuing posession, Adams led the offense on an 8-play, 68yard drive, capped by a 1-yard pass to Brandon Barden, giving the Commodores a 14-13 lead with 7:09 left in the third quarter.

Miscues cost the Tigers in the second half as Auburn committed 10 penalties, including eight in the third quarter. Unable to get in a rhythem offensively,

> the Tigers managed just 57 yards of total offense, including 4 yards rushing, in the final 30 minutes of play.

In a back and forth Southeastern Conference battle between No. 20 Auburn and Arkansas, it was the Razorbacks who came out on top with a 25-22 road win in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Arkansas scored first on a first quarter Shay Haddock field goal for a 3-0 lead following an Auburn defensive stand on the 5-yard line.

That lead wouldn't hold for long as Tristan Davis raced 97 yards down the Auburn sideline on the ensuing kickoff for a touchdown and a 7-3 lead. Davis' kickoff return for a touchdown was the first for the Tigers since 2005 and was the longest kickoff return since 2000.

In the second quarter with the Razorbacks at the Auburn 29-yard line, Neiko Thorpe picked off a Casey Dick pass and blazed 59 yards down the field, to the Arkansas 20-yard line, setting up a Wes Byrum field goal from 45 yards to put the Tigers up 10-3.

Arkansas' ensuing possession evened the score at 10-10 as Dick capped off an 80-yard drive on 11 plays with a 1-yard touchdown run on fourth down midway through the second quarter.

Just before the half, Auburn's Josh Bynes intercepted a Dick pass and returned it 31 yards to the Arkansas 19-yard line, and Byrum hit a 36-yard field goal and with 26 seconds left in the half for a 13-10 Auburn lead.

On the opening kickoff to the second half, Davis came up big again, forcing Arkansas' Dennis Johnson to fumble, and Auburn's Chris Evans recovered the ball at the Razorback 24-yard line.

Burns connected with Montez Billings for 13 yards and later got into the end zone from 3 yards out for a 20-10 advantage.

Arkansas began to close the gap on its second possession of the third quarter with a Dick touchdown reception. Sen'Derrick Marks blocked the PAT, the fourth blocked kick of his career, to put the score at 20-16.

Shady Haddock brought the Razorbacks within in a point on a 44-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter.

Arkansas went ahead as Razorback running back Michael Smith ran 63

Auburn started strong but couldn't finish at West Virginia, as a 17-3 secondquarter lead evaporated and the Mountaineers stormed back to score 31 unanswered points to take a 34-17 Thursday night victory in Morgantown.

West Virginia's one-two punch of Noel Devine and quarterback Pat White delivered the big blows, as Devine rushed for 207 yards and a touchdown and White threw for 174 yards and three scores.

Auburn's Josh Bynes denied West Virginia on the first drive off the game, picking off White for his second interception in as many games. Tiger signal caller Kodi Burns then drove the offense 81 yards down the field in 20 plays, completing four third-down conversions. The drive, which used 9:54 off the clock, resulted in a Wes Byrum 19-yard field goal for a 3-0 first quarter lead.

The 20-play scoring drive marked the most plays in a drive by Auburn since records began being kept in 1970.

On the ensuing possession, White was again picked off, this time by Walter McFadden, who returned it 18 yards to the West Virginia 27-yard line. Five plays later, Burns connected with Brad Lester on a 16-yard screen pass for the touchdown and a 10-0 advantage early in the second quarter.

After West Virginia's Pat McAfee booted a 23-yard field goal, Mario Fannin dashed down the sideline for 69 yards on the ensuing kickoff return. Burns found Tristan Davis for a 22-yard reception, and then rushed into the end zone from nine yards out to give the Tigers a 17-3 lead.

On the kickoff following Burns' touchdown run, Wes Byrum successfully kicked and recovered the on-side try, giving the ball back to the Tigers, but the drive resulted in a three-and-out.

West Virginia then capitalized with Devine gashing the Tiger defense with a 20-yard run and White's 44-yard completion to Alric Arnett for a touchdown to bring the Mountaineers within seven before halftime.

In the second half, the Mountaineers scored on their first two possessions as McAfee knocked in a 42-yard field goal and White tossed 2-yard touchdown pass to Dorrell Jalloh to give West Virginia a 20-17 lead with four minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The Tigers drove 52 yards on their next possession, but Byrum's 44-yard

field goal early in the fourth quarter missed wide left.

West Virginia added to its lead on a 32-yard touchdown pass from White to Jalloh at the 11:44 mark, and two possessions later it was Devine who found the end zone on a 30-yard run to close out the Mountaineers' scoring efforts.

Auburn's offense finished with 149 yards on the ground and added 111 yards through the air for 260 yards of total offense. The Tigers converted a season-high nine third downs.

Burns led the offensive attack by logging 82 yards rushing on 15 carries. Lester contributed 37 yards rushing and registered his 22nd career touchdown.

Defensively, Antonino Coleman had six tackles in the game and had his sixth sack of the year, dropping White for a loss of 7 yards.

Auburn suffered a 17-7 road loss to Ole Miss at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in Oxford, Miss. After a lackluster first half, the Tigers were able to score in the third quarter, but a trio of second half interceptions as Auburn was driving denied any chance of scoring.

Both teams struggled to find their offense in the first quarter, unable to move out of their own half of the field and punting the ball away three times each. Ole Miss broke open the scoreless game in the second quarter with a Josh Shene 34-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead at the 5:07 mark.

The Rebels added to their lead with quarterback Jevan Snead conducting an 86-yard drive in eight plays that was capped off by a 2-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge.

For the first time this season, Auburn went into the locker room at halftime trailing, 10-0.

Auburn's only score of the game came on its first drive of the third quarter. Following Tristan Davis' 15-yard kickoff return, Kodi Burns hit Chris Slaughter with a 37-yard pass to move the Tigers into Ole Miss territory. Facing a third-and-13, Burns rushed for 15 yards to keep the drive alive. Ben Tate received the hand off on the next play and dashed into the end zone from 27 yards out to narrow the Rebel lead to 10-7.

The 27-yard touchdown run was Auburn's longest rushing touchdown of the season and the Tigers' third-longest rushing play of the year.

The first six plays of the third quarter yielded 80 yards of offense for the Tigers after totaling just 80 yards during the entire first half. During the third quarter alone, Auburn's offense had four plays of 20 yards or more, two of which came during the touchdown drive. Burns also connected with Tim Hawthorne and Montez Billings for 21 and 29 yard receptions, respectively.

Auburn started the fourth quarter driving with Burns completing a trio of passes to Slaughter, including a 42-yard reception to move the Tigers to the Ole Miss 17 yard line. Following an incomplete pass and a rush for a loss, Auburn faced a third-and-12 and was eyeing a chance to put points on the board. Burns' pass was intercepted and the Tigers' scoring effort was thwarted.

The interception resulted in a Rebel touchdown as Snead connected with Derrick Davis from three yards out for the score and a 10-point advantage, 17-7, with less than seven minutes left in the game.

Burns' game marked numerous career-highs for the sophomore. He threw






