## SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

### THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

### THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

A new rule expands the ability of a head coach to challenge a reviewable play on the field. The head coach now retains a challenge if his initial challenge is successful and thus results in a reversal by the replay official. The coach will then have a single challenge that he may use anytime during the game if his team has not used all its timeouts. Thus a team may have a total of two challenges in the game, but only if the first results in a reversal of the on-field ruling.

### THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game (CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, Raycom Sports) or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference has used instant replay since 2005.

### THE PLAYS

#### Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
  - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
  - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line
  - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
  - d. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
  - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
  - b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver
  - c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player
  - d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, play is finalized)
  - e. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
  - f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
  - g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
3. Other Detectable Infractions:
  - a. Runner ruled not down.
  - b. Runner ruled down (new in 2008 / when ball carrier is judged down by rule and the ball is fumbled, play may be reviewed if recovery of ball occurs in the immediate action following fumble and is prior to any official signaling ball is dead. Also reviewable when runner is ruled out of bounds near goal line.)
  - c. Forward progress with respect to first down
  - d. Touching of a kick
  - e. Number of players on field
  - f. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with overturned plays)
  - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays

### THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with a DVSPORT Digital Replay System. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official is selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live video feed is sent directly to the replay booth. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while capturing/digitizing it into the DVSPORT Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play as well as any replays as they occur in real time.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Communicator. As the Technician marks the incoming video, each view (by mark) will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Communicator can touch/click on a thumbnail and immediately send that play/replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a remote device controlled by the Replay Official. All replays/video are viewed on an output monitor. The touch screen is only used to select the replays.

While most plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

### THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the Digital Replay System developed by DVSPORT of Pittsburgh, Pa. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from DVSPORT.

**CBS SPORTS** - The 2008 season marks the 12th year for CBS as the league's national network television partner. CBS will televise up to 15 games per year throughout the season. CBS will normally broadcast its SEC games in the late afternoon window beginning at 3:30 p.m. ET. CBS provides exclusive national network broadcasts of conference home games during the season. CBS will televise the SEC Football Championship Game, which will be on Dec. 6 at 4 p.m. ET. The SEC and CBS announced a 15-year extension agreement in August.

**ESPN/ESPN2**, the SEC's national cable provider, may televise up to 18 regular season games each year, with a minimum of nine on ESPN through the season. ESPN GamePlan offers fans extra college football games and is available on television or online. Viewers can order ESPN GamePlan on ESPN.com

(search "GamePlan"), or by contacting their cable or satellite Pay-Per-View provider.

**RAYCOM SPORTS (Formerly Jefferson-Pilot/Lincoln Financial Sports)** will continue its highly successful SEC Football Game of the Week this season. The Charlotte, N.C. company, holds the rights to televise 13 games annually throughout the nine-state SEC region on a syndicated basis. The games will be broadcast in the early afternoon at 12:30 p.m. ET.

**FOX Sports Net South (FSNS), FOX Sports Net Southwest (FSNSW) and SUN Sports (SUN)** together form **SEC-TV**, the league's regional cable package. SEC-TV Weekly airs Thursday nights and Saturday mornings during the season, highlighting all of the SEC's athletic teams and events.

**SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS**

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send nine of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2008 season. The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One (2nd), will then make its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The Outback, Chick-fil-A and AT&T Cotton Bowls will work with the conference office to determine picks 3-5. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference. The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the selection of preference following the Cotton and Outback Bowls.

In selections 6-7, the AutoZone Liberty and Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowls will make their selections, not in any specific order, but in consultation with the SEC Office. The Bowls will rank available qualified teams in order of preference. If there are no similarities in the order of selection, the bowls will be granted its selection. If the bowls rank the same teams in preference, the team involved in the process would get its preference of which bowl to participate.

The Independence Bowl will receive the eighth selection and the Papajohns.com Bowl will have the ninth pick of available SEC teams.

**2009 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE**

Following the 2008 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the FedEx Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose presented by Citi, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

FOX Sports will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games, with the exception of the Rose Bowl, which will be televised by ABC Sports.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

At the conclusion of the 2008 regular season, the FedEx BCS National Championship Game will be hosted in Miami on Jan. 8 at 8 p.m. EST. The FedEx BCS National Championship Game will have the top two teams ranked in the BCS final regular season standings.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

Other BCS games following the 2008 regular season include the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1 at 4:30 p.m. EST, FedEx Orange Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, Allstate Sugar Bowl on Jan. 2 at 8 p.m. EST, and the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 5 at 8 p.m. ET.



## SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TEAM NOTES



## ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE

Alabama has vaulted into the top spot in all of the major polls (AP, USA Today, Harris) for the first time since the end of its National Championship season in 1992 ... It's the first time the Tide have held that spot in the regular season since Weeks 3-9 in the 1980 season ... The Tide lead the SEC and is second in the nation in rushing defense, allowing 65.56 yards per game ... Alabama is second in the SEC and fourth in the nation in total defense, allowing 251.4 yards per game ... Alabama's current 10-game win streak is its longest since winning 12 straight games during the 1993-94 seasons.

## LSU TIGERS



The Tigers have only lost two fumbles this season, the lowest total in the SEC this season ... LSU has posted at least 21 points in 30 straight games ... The last time the Tigers did not score at least 21 points was at Florida on Oct. 7, 2006 ... LSU's fumble return for a touchdown by Chris Hawkins against Tulane was LSU's first defensive touchdown of the season and first since Jonathan Zenon returned an interception for a TD against Tennessee in the 2007 SEC Championship ... WR Brandon LaFell hauled in his sixth receiving touchdown of the season and the 12th of his career.

## ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS



The Razorbacks scored a touchdown on their first drive against Tulsa ... It is the first time this season Arkansas has scored a touchdown on its first drive (Arkansas kicked a field goal against Auburn, its only other first drive that resulted in points) ... Casey Dick's passing yardage total of 385 is the second-most in school history (Trails only 387-yard effort by Clint Stoerner against LSU in 1997) ... Michael Smith now has 987 yards rushing on the season and 1,333 all-purpose yards through his eighth game played (both numbers surpass Darren McFadden's 2007 numbers after 8 games).



## OLE MISS REBELS

Ole Miss leads the SEC in tackles for loss with 75 this season (8.33 per game) ... Ole Miss' 233 yards rushing against Auburn is the most by the Rebels since running for 240 against Memphis in the 2006 season opener ... Junior RB Cordera Eason posted his first career 100-yard rushing game, running for 104 on 14 attempts ... Junior Dexter McCluster turned in career highs in rushing yards with 84 and carries with 14 ... He also hauled in four passes for 47 yards ... Ole Miss held the opposition under 82 rushing yards for the fourth time this season, limiting the Tigers to 75 yards on the ground.

## AUBURN TIGERS



Auburn has not allowed a touchdown in the first quarter this season (allowing just six points during opening frame all season) ... The Tigers trailed Ole Miss, 10-0, at halftime, marking the first time Auburn had trailed at the half this season ... Auburn is fourth in the SEC and 14th in the nation in scoring defense ... No other non-winning team in the nation this season is in the national top 24 in scoring defense ... QB Kodi Burns threw for a career-high 319 yards against Ole Miss on career-highs of 27 completions and 43 attempts (previous high - 119 yards vs. Arkansas, 2008).

## MISSISSIPPI STATE BULLDOGS



Mississippi State is second in the SEC and fourth in the nation in pass defense, allowing just 153.2 yards per game ... Jr. RB Anthony Dixon is fifth in the SEC with 647 yards rushing (71.9 yards per game) ... Sr. LB Dominic Douglas is sixth in the SEC in tackles per game (8.11) ... Douglas totaled 15 stops against Kentucky and also had his first career interception in the game ... QB Tyson Lee threw for a career-best 261 yards, the most by a Bulldog quarterback since Wesley Carroll threw for 421 yards against Arkansas last season.

## FLORIDA GATORS



The Gators have not trailed in seven of eight games and have not allowed an opponent to score in 18 of 30 quarters ... The Gators have not turned the ball over in six of the last nine games ... Florida leads the nation in turnover margin (+14 in eight games) ... The Gators lead the SEC in scoring defense (11.63 points per game), scoring offense (42.88 points per game), passing efficiency (164.51 rating) and punt returns (20.14 yards per attempt) ... QB Tim Tebow leads the SEC and is 10th in the nation in pass efficiency (162.71 rating) ... He has thrown just 2 interceptions in 177 attempts this season.



## SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCKS

South Carolina leads the SEC in pass efficiency defense (98.20 rating), kickoff returns (25.07 yards per return), pass defense (144.0 yards per game) and total defense (250.67 yards per game) ... Tennessee rushed for just 34 yards against Carolina, the lowest a Gamecock defense has allowed under head coach Steve Spurrier (Previous low - 41 allowed to Vanderbilt in 2005) ... With 2.0 tackles for loss against the Vols, junior Eric Norwood became the USC record holder for career tackles for loss with 36.0, passing the 35.0 of Andrew Provenge (1980-82).



## GEORGIA BULLDOGS

Georgia leads the SEC in net punting (38.5 yards per punt), passing offense (262.4 yards per game) and total offense (427.56 yards per game) ... WR A.J. Green ranks sixth among freshmen in receptions per game (4.89) with 44 grabs in nine games ... Green is tied for the SEC lead in the category and also leads the SEC in receiving yards per game (83.67) ... QB Matthew Stafford leads the SEC in total offense, averaging 251.0 yards per game ... Soph. LB Rennie Curran is fifth in the SEC in total tackles per game (8.22 / 74 in nine games).

## TENNESSEE VOLUNTEERS



Senior LB Elix Wilson continues to lead the SEC in total tackles per game (8.88 / 71 tackles in eight games) ... The Vols' pass defense leads the SEC with 15 interceptions ... Soph. DB Eric Berry has six of those interceptions and has the national lead ... TB Arian Foster rushed for 56 yards and a TD on 14 carries against South Carolina ... The score was his first of the season and the 23rd of his career ... Senior WR Austin Rogers caught a career-long 49-yard pass against Carolina and finished the game with a season-high 72 receiving yards

## KENTUCKY WILDCATS



Kentucky's sixth win of the season (vs. Miss. State) makes the Wildcats bowl-eligible for the third consecutive season ... The only time in school history that Kentucky has gone to three consecutive bowls was following the 1949-50-51 seasons ... The UK defense allowed just 43 rushing yards against State, marking the fifth time this season UK has held an opponent under 75 yards on the ground ... UK freshman Randall Cobb earned his first career start at quarterback after starting four at wide receiver this season ... Sr. Tony Dixon had nine carries for a season-high 58 yards.



## VANDERBILT COMMODORES

WR Sean Walker finished with career highs with six catches for 138 yards and a touchdown against Duke ... The receiving yardage was a season high for Vanderbilt receivers, besting his 66-yard effort against Auburn on Oct. 4 ... QB Mackenzi Adams threw for a career best 210 yards. It was the first time a VU QB threw for over 200 yards this season ... LB Chris Marve finished with a career high 16 tackles, including 2.5 for loss, with one forced fumble ... DE Brandon Stewart finished with two sacks, and two forced fumbles ... TE Brandon Barden recorded career highs with five catches and 53 yards.

## 2008 SEC DIVISIONAL TIE-BREAKER

In the event of a tie for the division championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties to determine the SEC Football Championship Game representative. All Conference versus Conference Games (both division and non-division) will be counted in the Conference Standings.

**TWO-TEAM TIE.** In the event two teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order:

- Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams;
- Records of the tied teams within the division;
- Head-to-head competition against the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference record, and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- Overall record against non-divisional teams;
- Combined record against all common non-divisional teams;
- Record against the common non-divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional or non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game.

**THREE-TEAM TIE (OR MORE).** If three teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order: (Note: If one of the procedures results in one team being eliminated and two remaining, the two-team tiebreaker procedure as stated in No. 1 above will be used):

- Combined head to head record among the tied teams;
- Record of the tied teams within the division;
- Head to head competition against the team within the division with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- Overall Conference record against non-divisional teams;
- Combined record against all common non-divisional teams;
- Record against the common non-divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest-ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the SEC Championship Game.

## SEC DIVISIONAL RACE UPDATE

Alabama and Florida control its own fates in its race to the SEC Football Championship Game (Dec. 6, 4 p.m. ET, Georgia Dome, Atlanta, CBS Sports).

In the Western Division, an Alabama win over LSU this weekend will clinch the divisional berth for the Crimson Tide. Should Alabama win, it would have a 6-0 conference record and no other team in the division would be able to get to six SEC wins.

In the Eastern Division, a Florida win over Vanderbilt this weekend would clinch the divisional berth for the Gators. Should Florida win, it would be 6-1 in the SEC with Georgia the only other Eastern Division team that could get to six wins. In that case, Florida would win the head-to-head tie-breaker with Georgia.

The earliest clinches in SEC Championship Game history belong were Oct. 29, 1994 (Florida); Oct. 30, 2004 (Auburn), Oct. 30, 1993 (Alabama) and Nov. 4, 2006 (Florida).

**GATORS, PENN STATE ONLY TWO NCAA TEAMS IN TOP 10 IN BOTH SCORING OFFENSE AND DEFENSE**

Florida and Penn State are the only teams ranked in the top 10 in both the NCAA scoring offense and scoring defense statistical categories.

The Gators are seventh in scoring offense (42.88) and fifth in scoring defense (11.6) while the Nittany Lions are eighth in scoring offense (41.78) and fourth in scoring defense (11.10).

The SEC has seven teams ranked in the top 25 in scoring defense while the Gators are the only SEC team in the top 25 of scoring offense.

**FLORIDA OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY NEAR SEC HIGHS**

After 9 games, Florida has averaged 3.38 points per offensive drive (308 offensive points / 91 offensive drives). The average is the second highest in the SEC since the conference started keeping the statistic in 2000. Here is a look at the top five since 2000:

1. 3.49 - Florida, 2007 (524 points in 150 drives)
2. 3.38 - Florida, 2008 (308 points in 91 drives)
3. 3.27 - Florida, 2001 (471 points in 144 drives)
4. 2.94 - LSU, 2006 (410 points in 139 drives)
5. 2.75 - LSU, 2007 (526 points in 191 drives)

The Gators offensively have also produced points on 52.75 percent of its offensive drives this season (48 scoring drives in 91 total drives). That number would be third highest in the SEC since 2000. Here is a look at the top five since 2000:

1. 54.9 - Florida, 2001 (79 of 144)
2. 54.0 - Florida, 2007 (86 of 150)
3. 52.8 - Florida, 2008 (48 of 91)
4. 47.1 - LSU, 2007 (90 of 191)
5. 46.0 - LSU, 2006 (64 of 139)

The Gators have scored touchdowns on 42.86 percent of its offensive drives this season (39 of 91). That number would be second highest in the SEC since 2000. Here is a look at the top five since 2000:

1. 47.3 - Florida, 2007 (71 of 150)
2. 42.9 - Florida, 2008 (39 of 91)
3. 40.9 - Florida, 2001 (59 of 144)
4. 39.6 - LSU, 2006 (55 of 139)
5. 37.8 - Ole Miss, 2001 (54 of 143)

The Gators are putting up the offensive numbers in 2008 while the league itself has been playing tougher defense. In 2007, SEC teams averaged 30.3 points and 385.9 yards per game. In 2008, SEC teams are averaging 25.0 points and 342.9 yards per game.

**TENNESSEE'S FULMER TO STEP DOWN FOLLOWING THIS SEASON**

University of Tennessee head coach Phillip Fulmer announced Monday he will step aside as the Volunteers head coach at the end of the season. Fulmer is the second winningest coach in school history with a record of 150-51 and has spent 28 years on Vols coaching staff – 11 years as assistant coach and 17 years as head coach.

"Coach Fulmer has been, and will continue to be, a great representative of the University and the athletics department," said UT athletics director Mike Hamilton. "He has dedicated a majority of his life to our program and brought home two SEC championships and a national championship. He has secured his place as the second winningest coach in Tennessee history behind Gen. Neyland. I personally appreciate everything he has done for Tennessee."

The dean of Southeastern Conference coaches, Fulmer has claimed a national championship, two conference titles and seven divisional crowns while winning nearly three-quarters of his games. He also retains his standing among the winning coaches with at least 10 years experience in major college football.

Fulmer also joined an elite coaching list last season when his career record improved to 100 games over the .500 mark joining Bobby Bowden, Joe Paterno, Jim Tressel, Steve Spurrier, Chris Ault and Frank Beamer as the only active coaches in that fraternity. With three games remaining, Fulmer has a chance to spring back above that plus-100 milestone before calling it a career.

Fulmer was selected the National and SEC coach of the year in 1998. The Vols won back-to-back SEC titles in 1997-98 and five Eastern Division crowns in the last 10 years. He directed the Vols to 15 bowl games, including 13 January bowl games.

Fulmer was an offensive guard at Tennessee from 1968-71. He began his coaching career at Tennessee before stints at Wichita State (1974-78) and Vanderbilt (1979). Fulmer returned to Tennessee in 1980 and was promoted to head coach in 1992. He has been enshrined in both the Tennessee Sports and Knoxville Sports halls of fame.

**ALABAMA THIRD SEC TEAM TO HOLD TOP SPOT IN BCS RANKINGS**

Alabama is the third Southeastern Conference team to hold the top spot in a weekly Bowl Championship Series ranking. The Tide hold the top spot this week with a .9747 rating.

LSU held the top spot in the BCS rankings in the Nov. 11 and Nov. 18 standings last season. The Tigers had a .9802 rating on Nov. 11 and a .9904 rating on Nov. 18.

In 1998 (first season of the BCS), Tennessee held the top spot during the last five standings (Nov. 9 - Dec. 6).

Since the creation of the BCS in 1998, 10 of the 12 SEC teams have made the rankings.

**BCS NATIONAL CHAMPIONS**

Since the inception of the BCS in 1998, the SEC leads all conferences with four national champions. Tennessee won the BCS' first national title in 1998, LSU won the crown in 2003, Florida's claimed the national championship in 2006 and LSU took the title this season. The Big 12 has two BCS national titles followed by the ACC, Big Ten, Pac-10 and Big East with one each.

**NATIONAL CHAMPIONS SINCE 1992**

Since SEC expansion in 1992, the SEC has the most national championships (AP, USA Today) with six. During that time, the SEC has had more teams with national titles than any other conference (4). Here is a breakdown:

**TOP 25 FINISHES**

Since 2000, the Southeastern Conference has had more teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Poll than any other conference. The SEC has had 39 teams ranked in the last eight final USA Today Coaches polls, an average of almost five per season. The Big 12 is second with 31 teams ranked since 2000. The SEC has led or tied for lead in most teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Polls in seven of the last eight seasons.

In 2007, a total of 6,687,342 fans attended 89 games, an average of 75,139 per contest, also tops in the nation. SEC stadiums were filled to 97.69 percent of capacity for each home game in 2007. The SEC had six of the top 10 schools in total attendance in 2007 - Tennessee (4), Auburn (5), Georgia (6), LSU (7), Alabama (8) and Florida (9).

**SEC LEADS NATION WITH 263 FORMER PLAYERS ON 2007 NFL OPENING DAY**

**ROSTERS**

The Southeastern Conference had 263 players on the 2007 National Football League opening day active rosters, which led all conferences.

The Atlantic Coast Conference was second with 238 players, followed by the Big Ten with 234 players, Pac-10 with 183 players, Big 12 with 176 players and the Big East with 84 players.

Among SEC schools, Georgia was first with 37 former players on NFL rosters, followed by Tennessee with 36, LSU with 33, Florida with 31 and Auburn with 30. Alabama had 21 players on NFL rosters, while South Carolina had 19, Ole Miss and Mississippi State had 17 each, Arkansas had 12, Kentucky six and Vanderbilt with five.

The SEC had five of its schools with 30-or-more-players on NFL rosters. No other conference had two.

Nationally, Miami (Fla.) leads with 46 former players on NFL rosters, followed by Ohio State with 44, Florida State with 41, Tennessee with 36 and Georgia with 35.

The NFL Kickoff Weekend numbers were furnished by the National Football League and does not include any former SEC players that may have been activated after the opening weekend.

- The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports - 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

### ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- During the last six years, the SEC has had more student-athletes honored as CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans than any other conference. The league has had 211 student-athletes named CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans, including 95 named to the first-team.
- During the last 12 years, the SEC has had 19 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since 1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award.
- Kentucky's Jacob Tamme was named by the National Football Foundation as a National Scholar-Athlete. During the last six years, the SEC has had 12 student-athletes honored, the most of any conference. LSU's Rudy Niswanger won the Vincent dePaul Draddy Award given by the National Football Foundation in 2005 as the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Niswanger became the sixth SEC student-athlete to claim the "Academic Heisman" since the award was established in 1990.

### FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The 12 member institutions of the SEC provide nearly \$65 million in scholarships for the more than 4,200 student-athletes each year.
- The SEC distributed nearly \$675,000 during the 2006-2007 academic year from the NCAA Special Assistance Fund for Student-Athletes. This program was implemented to provide financial aid to student-athletes with specific needs such as clothing and shoes, medical or vision care, academic course supplies and family emergencies.
- During the 2008-09 academic year, the SEC will distribute more than \$1 million to directly benefit student-athletes from the Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund.
- The SEC awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Alabama golfer Joseph Sykora and Auburn swimmer Kristen Hastrup were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners in 2007-08.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community. South Carolina football player William Brown and Vanderbilt lacrosse player Brooke Shinaberry were named recipients of this award in 2007-08.

### A LEADER IN WOMEN'S SPORTS

- The SEC has developed a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The SEC had three sport winners of the Collegiate Woman of the Year Award sponsored by Honda. Tennessee's Candace Parker won for women's basketball, Katie Heenan of Georgia took top honors in gymnastics and Florida's Carolina Burckle was the top student-athlete in swimming & diving. Parker was the winner of the Honda National Collegiate Woman of the Year honor in 2007-08.
- Since 1987, SEC schools have won 69 NCAA women's national championships, an average of more than three per year in the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors. Nine of the 12 SEC institutions have won a national women's team championship since 1987.

### COMPLIANCE AND EDUCATION

- The SEC Task Force Committee on Compliance and Enforcement has issued a report of recommendations that represents an important initial step in a formal process of establishing a new standard of compliance excellence within the Southeastern Conference. Among the recommendations included in this report was how institutions will handle reports of allegations, strengthening the relationship between the league's institutions and the conference office, developing new orientation programs and establishing an annual review of compliance issues.
- The SEC also conducts a New Coaches Orientation Program four times a year, which supplements institutional orientation programs and enhance the professional development of coaches. Topics of discussion range from the role of the SEC and NCAA to the role of athletics in higher education.

### SPORTSMANSHIP

- The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states:  
 "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

### IN THE COMMUNITY

- The SEC launched its education initiative in 2002, utilizing the platform of intercollegiate athletics to provide elementary school teachers with relevant resources they can use to educate and prepare children for life. The SEC became the nation's first conference to develop customized educational software, providing a CD-ROM containing SEC-branded content correlating to national educational standards. Since the CD-ROM was produced, the SEC has initiated an online program for K-8 students on education content and character development.
- SECKids.com is a website uniquely designed for school-age students. Now fans of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECKids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights. Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's college software in their classroom. The SEC is the only conference in the country to develop a site of this kind.

### OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS

- In 2007-08, the SEC had 168 teams in 20 sports take part in NCAA post-season play, an average of almost eight teams per sport. Along with those numbers, the league also produced 457 first-team All-Americans, won five team and 46 individual national titles.
- Since 1990, the SEC has won 123 team and 851 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally in 76.2 percent of the total sports win which the league has competed (281 of 369). Ten of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the SEC's 20 sponsored sports since 2000, the SEC has won 55 team titles. The SEC has won team titles in 16 different sports since 2000, the most of any conference.

Mark Richt is in his eighth season at Georgia and overall with a record of 79-21 (.790). The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator is Mike Bobo and the defensive coordinator is Willie Martinez.

Rich Brooks is in his sixth season at Kentucky with a record of 31-38 (.449) and 24th overall with a record of 122-147-4 (.454). The Wildcats' offensive coordinator is Joker Phillips and the defensive coordinator is Steve Brown.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA HAS THE BALL**

Matthew Stafford is 24-6 as a starter and has thrown for 6,483 yards with 38 TDs and 31 INTs in his Bulldog career. Georgia's top two receiving threats are freshman FLK A.J. Green (44 rec., 753 yds., 5 TDs) and senior SE Mohamed Massaquoi (33 rec., 478 yds., 4 TDs). Green leads the SEC in receptions and yardage. Knowshon Moreno is 10 yards short of becoming only the second Bulldog in school history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons.

Trevard Lindley, who holds the school record for career pass breakups (32), leads the SEC and is tied for sixth in the nation in passes defended. He has charted nine pass breakups, including three against Alabama, and four interceptions (T-17th in the nation) this season. Braxton Kelley currently leads the team and ranks ninth in the SEC in tackles with 68. Jeremy Jarmon currently has 6.5 tackle for loss, three sacks, four pass breakups and three quarterback hurries.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN KENTUCKY HAS THE BALL**

Rennie Curran continues to lead the team in tackles with an SEC-best 74 stops, including a career-high 14 against No. 11 LSU and No. 8 Alabama. Curran has been the Bulldogs' top tackler six times this season and also leads the team with 3.0 sacks. Darryl Gamble ranks third on the team with 48 tackles. Gamble tied an NCAA Record for a linebacker with two interception returns for touchdowns at LSU. Reshad Jones is second in the team with 49 tackles, including a career-high 12 in the win over LSU.

Randall Cobb earned his first collegiate start at quarterback vs. Mississippi State becoming the first Kentucky freshman to garner an SEC road win since freshmen became eligible to play in the early 1970s. He both rushed and passed for a touchdown in the 14-13 win. Cobb also leads the receiving corps with 21 catches for 197 yards and two touchdowns. He caught two TD passes in the final four minutes vs. Arkansas.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Blair Walsh is 13-for-20 on the year in field goal attempts with three of his misses from 50+ yards. Brian Mimbs is averaging 43.6 yards a punt with 11 inside the 20 and seven covering 50+ yards. Georgia leads the SEC in net punting at 38.5 yards with Mimbs ranking second in the league with a 43.6 average. Ramarcus Brown is averaging 23.5 yds./KO return. Brown had a season-long 44-yarder at Arizona State.

Tim Masthay leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally in punting with a 46.0 ypp. UK ranks second in the SEC in kickoff coverage with 47.2 net yards per kickoff. Masthay led the SEC last season with 23 touchbacks and is on pace to surpass that total as a league-high 19 of his 41 kicks have been touchbacks already this season.

Bobby Petrino is in his first season at Arkansas and sixth overall with a record of 48-23 (.676). The Razorbacks' offensive coordinator is Paul Patrino and the defensive coordinator is Willy Robinson.

Steve Spurrier is in his fourth season at South Carolina with a record of 27-19 (.587) and in his 19th season overall with a record of 169-59-2 (.739). The Gamecocks' offensive coordinator is Spurrier and Spurrier Jr. and the defensive coordinator is Ellis Johnson.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ARKANSAS HAS THE BALL**

Casey Dick completed 25-of-38 passes for career-high 385 yards with a touchdown and an interception in the Razorbacks' 30-23 win vs. #18 Tulsa. His passing yardage total was the second highest total in Razorback history and was only two yards shy of school record (387, Clint Stoerner, vs. LSU, 1997). Dick recorded his third 300-yard passing game of the season. Michael Smith leads the SEC and is ninth nationally with 123.4 yards rushing per game.

Eric Norwood is second on the team with 45 tackles, including a team-high 7.5 TFL's. He also has a team-leading 4.0 sacks and nine quarterback hurries. Emanuel Cook leads the team and is seventh in the SEC in tackles with 72 tackles this season (8.0 per game). Captain Munneryn has made 23 starts over the past three seasons, recording five interceptions. He has recorded 28 tackles, has a team-leading five pass break ups, has recovered two fumbles and forced another.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN SOUTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL**

Jerry Franklin had his second fumble recovery of the season on Ramon Broadway's first forced fumble in the second quarter last week. Franklin also intercepted his second pass of the season in the third quarter to halt Tulsa's first drive of the half inside the 10-yard line. Isaac Madison intercepted his first pass of the season and career, returning it 26 yards in the fourth quarter. Franklin leads the team with 65 tackles this season. Malcolm Sheppard leads with nine TFLs, while Adrian Davis has four sacks.

Kenny McKinley ranks first in career receptions (181), second in career receiving yards (2,472) and is fourth in receiving touchdowns (18) in Carolina history. Redshirt freshman quarterback Stephen Garcia has started each of the last two games, getting the starting nod in a loss to LSU and a win over Tennessee. He has completed 46-of-80 passes (57.5 percent) for 654 yards with five touchdowns and three interceptions. Mike Davis has carried 123 times for 435 yards, an average of 3.5 yards per carry.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Jeremy Davis booted two punts over 50 yards in the game versus Tulsa. It is the fifth game this season in which he has had a punt of 50 yards and gives him 10 50-yard punts this season. Prior to 2008 Davis had eight punts of 50 yards or more. Dennis Johnson's 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown was Arkansas' first kickoff return for a score this season and Arkansas' first since Felix Jones returned a kick 82 yards against Kentucky in 2007.

Ryan Succop is 15-for-23 in field goal attempts this season (both marks lead the SEC) and is 44-for-62 in field goal attempts in his career (71.0 percent) and is 25-for-29 (86.2 percent) inside 40 yards. He has converted 35 of his last 44 attempts (79.5 percent) from inside 47. He is seventh in the league (fourth among the kickers) in scoring at 7.6 points per game. Spencer Lanning has averaged 43.1 yards (fourth in the SEC) on 30 punts with a long of 52.

Joe Glenn is in his sixth season at Wyoming with a record of 29-39 (.426) and 24th overall with a record of 187-98-1 (.656). The Cowboys' offensive coordinator is Bob Cole and the defensive coordinator is Mike Breske.

Phillip Fulmer is in his 17th season at Tennessee and overall with a record of 150-51 (.746). The Volunteers' offensive coordinator is Dave Clawson and the defensive coordinator is John Chavis.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN WYOMING HAS THE BALL**

Devin Moore was named MWC Player of the Week on Monday for his performance in a 35-10 Wyoming win over San Diego State. Moore rushed for a career high 234 yards in the 35-10 home victory over the Aztecs. It not only marked Moore's career high for rushing yards, but it was the third best single-game rushing performance in Wyoming history. His 234 rushing yards is a MWC high this season, and is the only 200-yard rushing game by an individual in the conference this season. It also ranks as the eighth best single-game rushing performance among (FBS) teams this season.

Senior DE Robert Ayers has 10 TFLs through nine games after posting 6.5 in the last three games. Elix Wilson has led the team in tackles in four of his eight games including a career-high 16 at Georgia. He leads the team for the season with 71 stops. Rico McCoy is third on the team with 58 tackles after posting a team-high 13 vs. Alabama and leading the team with nine at South Carolina. Wilson has 4.5 TFLs this season and one sack. Eric Berry has 11 career interceptions (six this season) and is the SEC record holder in career interception return yards with 442.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL**

Chris Proinski leads a Wyoming defense that ranks No. 39 in the nation, giving up only 332.4 yards per game to opponents. Individually, Proinski enters this week ranked among MWC leaders in four different categories -- passes defensed, solo tackles and tackles -- and ranked nationally in one -- passes defensed. John Fletcher recorded 2.0 sacks for a -13 yards against San Diego State to improve his career sack total to 16.0 sacks. Fletcher has 3.5 sacks this season for a -36 yards -- second best for the Cowboys. Mike Juergens leads the team this season with 4.0 sacks.

Nick Stephens will start his sixth career game after winning the job during the week before the Northern Illinois game. He is 60-of-103 for 813 yards and four touchdowns this season. He has thrown one interception in five starts. Arian Foster He is 226 yards from being UT's all-time leading rusher. Gerald Jones has emerged as a go-to receiver this season with three receiving TDs.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Jake Scott is 5-7 on field goal attempts this season, including a perfect 2-2 from beyond 40 yards. His longest field goal was from 49 yards. Austin McCoy averages 37.2 yards per punt. Moore averages nearly 22 yards per kickoff return.

Daniel Lincoln is 8-of-15 this season after making 21 of 29 a year ago. Britton Colquitt returned to take over the punting duties at Georgia and has kicked 28 times for 45.3-yard average in four games. Jones is averaging 10.3 yards per punt return this season. Dennis Rogan is averaging 24.5 yards per kickoff return this season.

Jason Simpson is in his third season at Tennessee-Martin and overall with a record of 20-12 (.625). The Skyhawks' offensive coordinator is Doug Ruse and the defensive coordinators are Kevin Corless and Jack Curtis.

Tommy Tuberville is in his 10th season at Auburn with a record of 84-38 (.689) and in his 14th season overall with a record of 109-58 (.653). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Steve Ensminger and the defensive coordinator is Paul Rhoads.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE-MARTIN HAS THE BALL**

UT Martin ranks second nationally in the Football Championship Subdivision in scoring offense, averaging 40.7 points per game. 370 of Brandyn Young's 576 yards rushing have come in the last two games. Roren Thomas leads the OVC in all-purpose yardage (160.3). Quarterback Cade Thompson, a transfer from South Carolina, ranks ninth nationally in the FCS in passing efficiency (159.11). Mike Hicks, a transfer from Ole Miss, hauled in two touchdown passes and piled up 112 receiving yards on five catches in his last outing.

Antonio Coleman has collected six sacks and 10.5 tackles for loss so far this season, with both marks ranking tied for first in the SEC. Coleman, who also has a team-high 12 quarterback hurries this year, now has 14.5 sacks during his career, and needs just one more to crack Auburn's career top 10. He has 30 tackles for loss during his career. Sen'Derrick Marks has nine tackles for loss, including two sacks, which is tied for fifth most in the SEC this season. Marks, who has started all 35 games since the start of the 2006 season, now has 29 tackles for loss during his career.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN AUBURN HAS THE BALL**

Dontrell Miller's four interceptions ranks tied for second in the OVC. Miller has scored five touchdowns this season. He has returned two interceptions for TDs and three fumbles for scores. He needs two more interception returns for touchdowns to tie Clay Blalack's (1975-76) school record of four. Josh Bey leads the team with 71 tackles and 13 TFLs. Ray Williams has four sacks on the season.

Kodi Burns had Auburn's first 300-yard passing game since the 2005 season opener with a 319-yard effort at Ole Miss Nov. 1. Ben Tate leads the team with 573 yards rushing and ranks 16th in Auburn history with 1,868 career yards. Tate needs 132 yards to become the 13th player in Auburn history with 2,000 career rushing yards. Rodgeriquis Smith, who leads the team with 25 catches for 246 yards and a score this season, now has 109 career catches, which ranks sixth in school history. Smith also has 1,512 career receiving yards, which ranks ninth best in Auburn history.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Junior wide receiver and kickoff return specialist Roren Thomas has scored 10 touchdowns this season. He has 17 career touchdowns for 102 points. He is four touchdowns away from tying Larry Shanks (1964-67) for 10th on the school's career list for scoring. Adam Ivey averages 41.2 yards per punt. Tom Hansen is 4-8 on field goals this season.

Auburn's return specialists have excelled this season, as the Tigers rank tied for 10th nationally in kickoff returns (25.1) and 11th in punt returns (15.6). Individually, Tristan Davis is third in the SEC and 23rd nationally in kickoff returns (26.9) and Robert Dunn averages 21.4 yards per punt returns but does not have enough returns (nine) to qualify for the NCAA leaders. Both have returned kicks for touchdowns.

**THE COACHES**

Nick Saban is in his second season at Alabama with a record of 15-6 (.714) and 15th overall with a record of 121-65-1 (.650). The Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator is Jim McElwain and the defensive coordinator is Kirby Smart.

Les Miles is in his fourth season at LSU with a record of 40-8 (.833) and eighth overall with a record of 68-28 (.708). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gary Crowton and the defensive coordinators are Doug Mallory and Bradley Peveto.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALABAMA HAS THE BALL**

Mark Ingram (Flint, Mich.) ranks second on the team in rushing and seventh in the SEC with 59.2 yards per game (533 yards on 94 carries) and a team-best eight touchdowns. John Parker Wilson has completed 69.0 percent of his passes away from Bryant-Denny Stadium for 647 yards, four touchdowns and no interceptions. Wilson boasts a passing efficiency rating of 149.46 in four games away from home this season. Glen Coffee ranks fourth in the SEC and 30th nationally in rushing at 99.33 yards per game and is second among the top 10 SEC rushers at 6.6 yards per carry.

Rahim Alem leads the SEC in both total sacks (6.0) and sacks per game (0.75). In eight games, Alem's six sacks have accounted for 48 yards in losses. He's also added eight tackles for losses, four QB hurries, two forced fumbles, two PBUs and a blocked field goal. Alem's eight tackles for losses tie for the sixth-highest total in the SEC. With a pair of sacks vs. South Carolina, LSU DE Tyson Jackson ran his career total to 18.5, which ranks eighth in school history. This year, Jackson has 4.5 sacks to his credit to rank fourth in the SEC.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL**

Rashad Johnson made Homecoming 2008 one he will remember forever. He matched his career high with 13 tackles and found the end zone for the first time in his career with a 32-yard interception return. He also registered a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss and broke up his team-high 10th pass of the season. Dont'a Hightower is third on the team in tackles with 42 stops - 19 solo - in nine games (4.4 tackles per game). Hightower has also forced one fumble and recovered two more to rank tied for fifth in the SEC at .22 per game.

Charles Scott has rushed for 100 or more yards six times this year and he ranks second in the league with 111.1 yards per game. LSU QB Jarrett Lee has thrown for 1,427 yards and 12 scores, while WR Brandon LaFell is tops on the team with 39 catches for 572 yards and 6 TDs.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Leigh Tiffin has connected on 13 of 18 field goals this season and all 33 extra points. He is tied for second in the SEC and tied for 24th nationally in field goals per game at 1.44. Tiffin also ranks tied for fourth in the league and tied for 38th nationally in scoring at 8.00 points per game. He is 9 for 11 this season from inside 40 yards with a long of 54 yards vs. Clemson. P.J. Fitzgerald has been outstanding in five SEC games, averaging 42.6 on 19 punts.

Colt David is the school's all-time leading scorer, moving past Kevin Faulk's total of 318 points. David now has 329 points during his career, a figure that ranks No. 6 in SEC history. David has kicked 46 field goals during his career, third-most in LSU history. Of his 46 field goals, 13 have come from at least 40 yards out, including the career-long 51-yarder he connected on against Georgia to break the school record for scoring. David is currently riding a streak of 98 successful PATs, which is the 13th longest streak in SEC history.

**THE COACHES**

Urban Meyer is in his fourth season at Florida with a record of 38-8 (.826) and in his eighth season overall with a record of 77-17 (.819). The Gators' offensive coordinator is Dan Mullen and Charlie Strong serves as the defensive coordinator.

Bobby Johnson is in his seventh season at Vanderbilt with a record of 25-53 (.321) and in his 15th season overall with a record of 85-89 (.489). The Commodores' offensive coordinator is Ted Cain and the defensive coordinator is Bruce Fowler.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN FLORIDA HAS THE BALL**

This season, Tim Tebow has rushed for eight touchdowns. The total is equal to or more than 23 Division I-A teams. He is one of six players nationally to have thrown two-or-less interceptions this season (min. 125 att.). Jeff Demps' average of 10.2 yards per carry leads the nation (min. 30 attempts). His average touchdown run this year is 47 yards. Percy Harvin has scored a touchdown in each of the last 10 games he has played in. Over the span, he has scored 16 touchdowns and touched the ball 127 times for 1,419 yards (11.1 yards per touch).

Broderick Stewart leads the team with 4.5 sacks. Chris Marve played one of the finest games of his young Vanderbilt career versus Duke, contributing 16 total tackles, including 10 solo stops. Marve's tackle total is a team high for the Commodores this season. Marve also contributed 2.5 tackles for loss, a 6-yard QB sack and the team's lone forced fumble recovered by Commodore teammates. Reshard Langford and D.J. Moore leads all Commodores with 10 career interceptions each.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN VANDERBILT HAS THE BALL**

Brandon Spikes is fourth in the SEC in tackles per game this year and is 52nd nationally with 8.43. Spikes has led the Gators in tackles in eight of the last 12 games he has played in. Joe Haden (56.0) and Ahmad Black (46.0) rank first and fourth, respectively, in interception return avg. this season among all players nationally. Carlos Dunlap is third in the SEC in sacks per game (.62) and is tied for 48th nationally. His five sacks lead all Gators this season.

Sean Walker produced a career outing against the Blue Devils, catching six passes for 138 yards and one TD. It marked Walker's first career effort of 100+ receiving yards, and the first by a Commodore receiver since Earl Bennett had 100 receiving yards vs. Ole Miss on Sept. 15, 2007. Walker and QB Mackenzi Adams hooked up for a 79-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. Moore is the SEC's only athlete this year to see action at five positions (CB, WR, QB, PR and KR) and serve as a four-way contributor (Def./Off./PR/KR).

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Brandon James is one of four players in the country to return two punts for touchdowns this season. He is first nationally in punt return avg. (15.0) and third in punt return yards (980). Demps blocked the second punt of his career in UF's last game against Kentucky. Jonathan Phillips improved to 9-of-9 on field goals by connecting on all three of his attempts against LSU. UF is the only school in the SEC and one of four nationally to be perfect on field goals in 2008.

Brett Upson is averaging a career-high 40.2 yards. His net average of 36.9 yards ranks fourth in the SEC and 28th in the NCAA. He has eight punts of 50 yards or more, and has succeeded in pinning opponents inside their 20-yard line at an 38.8% rate. Moore is the SEC's No. 3 punt returner with a 16.4-yard average. Bryant Hahnfeldt is 7-of-11 in field goals, including three beyond 40 yards. He is also 21 of 21 on extra point attempts.
