## 2008 SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

## Alabama vs. Florida

December 6, 2008 ● 4:00 p.m. ET Georgia Dome (71,500) ● Atlanta, Ga. ● CBS Sports

Alabama (Western Division Champion) and Florida (Eastern Division Champion) will meet in Atlanta's Georgia Dome to battle for the league championship and the right to represent the conference in the Bowl Championship Series. The 17th-annual title game is set for December 6 and will be nationally televised by CBS Sports at 4:00 p.m. ET.

The game is a result of conference expansion, which saw Arkansas and South Carolina become the first members added in SEC history. Under NCAA regulations, a conference with 12 members may play a 12th football game to determine its champion, provided the regular season is played in divisions.

The participants of the game are determined each year during the eight-game regular-season conference schedule as the teams with the best overall SEC winning percentage in each division.

The 1994 SEC Championship Game earned a 10.5 rating and a 26 share, the highest rated SEC Championship Game in history.

The SEC Championship Game has also drawn capacity crowds in its short history. 1,194,668 fans have witnessed first-hand the pageantry of SEC Football at the 16 previous Championship Games.

Attendance at the 16 previous championship games has been 102.4 percent of stadium capacity, including 13 sellouts.

The SEC and the ACC have put the most schools in the BCS standings in its history at 11 each. The Big 12 and the Big Ten have put 10 teams each in the BCS standings.

Three SEC teams have been ranked at one time or another as the top team in the nation in the BCS standings during its history - Alabama (4 times all this season), LSU (twice in 2007) and Tennessee (five teams in 1998) [Reminder that there are no BCS standings after the bowl games.]

Texas leads all schools in the BCS rankings, having been listed 75 times. Florida is second with 74 times while Georgia and Tennessee are tied for ninth with 52 times each. LSU is 12th with 49 times.

Here is a listing of the amount of times each SEC team has been ranked in the BCS Standings: Alabama (24), Arkansas (16), Auburn (30), Florida (74), Georgia (52), Kentucky (4), LSU (49), Ole Miss (6), Mississippi State (7), South Carolina (7) and Tennessee (52).

## SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

#### THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

#### THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

A new rule expands the ability of a head coach to challenge a reviewable play on the field. The head coach now retains a challenge if his initial challenge is successful and thus results in a reversal by the replay official. The coach will then have a single challenge that he may use anytime during the game if his team has not used all its timeouts. Thus a team may have a total of two challenges in the game, but only if the first results in a reversal of the on-field ruling.

#### THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game (CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, Raycom Sports) or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference has used instant replay since 2005.

#### THE PLAYS

#### Reviewable

- 1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
  - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
  - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line
  - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
  - d. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds

#### 2. Passing Plays:

- a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
- b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver
- c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player
- d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, play is finalized)
- e. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
- f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
- g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
- 3. Other Detectable Infractions:
  - a. Runner ruled not down.
  - b. Runner ruled down (new in 2008 / when ball carrier is judged down by rule and the ball is fumbled, play may be reviewed if recovery of ball occurs in the immediate action following fumble and is prior to any official signaling ball is dead. Also reviewable when runner is ruled out of bounds near goal line.)
  - c. Forward progress with respect to first down
  - d. Touching of a kick
  - e. Number of players on field
  - f. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with overturned plays)
  - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays
  - h. Field Goal Attempts (new in 2008 / only when ball is ruled below or above the crossbar, inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights.)

#### **THE PROCESS**

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with a DVSport Digital Replay System. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official is selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live video feed is sent directly to the replay booth. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while capturing/digitizing it into the DVSport Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play as well as any replays as they occur in real time.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Communicator. As the Technician marks the incoming video, each view (by mark) will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Communicator can touch/click on a thumbnail and immediately send that play/replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a remote device controlled by the Replay Official. All replays/video are viewed on an output monitor. The touch screen is only used to select the replays.

While most plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

#### THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the Digital Replay System developed by DVSport of Pittsburgh, Pa. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from DVSport.

CBS SPORTS - The 2008 season marks the 12th year for CBS as the league's national network television partner. CBS will televise up to 15 games per year throughout the season. CBS will normally broadcast its SEC games in the late afternoon window beginning at 3:30 p.m. ET. CBS provides exclusive national network broadcasts of conference home games during the season. CBS will televise the SEC Football Championship Game, which will be on Dec. 6 at 4 p.m. ET. The SEC and CBS announced a 15-year extension agreement in August.

ESPN/ESPN2, the SEC's national cable provider, may televise up to 18 regular season games each year, with a minimum of nine on ESPN through the season. ESPN GamePlan offers fans extra college football games and is available on television or online. Viewers can order ESPN GamePlan on ESPN.com

(search "GamePlan"), or by contacting their cable or satellite Pay-Per-View provider.

RAYCOM SPORTS (Formerly Jefferson-Pilot/Lincoln Financial Sports) will continue its highly successful SEC Football Game of the Week this season. The Charlotte, N.C. company, holds the rights to televise 13 games annually throughout the nine-state SEC region on a syndicated basis. The games will be broadcast in the early afternoon at 12:30 p.m. ET.

FOX Sports Net South (FSNS), FOX Sports Net Southwest (FSNSW) and SUN Sports (SUN) together form SEC-TV, the league's regional cable package. SEC-TV Weekly airs Thursday nights and Saturday mornings during the season, highlighting all of the SEC's athletic teams and events.

















#### **SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS**

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send nine of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2008 season. The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One (2nd), will then make its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The Outback, Chick-fil-A and AT&T Cotton Bowls will work with the conference office to determine picks 3-5. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference. The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the selection of preference following the Cotton and Outback Bowls.

In selections 6-7, the AutoZone Liberty and Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowls will make their selections, not in any specific order, but in consultation with the SEC Office. The Bowls will rank available qualified teams in order of preference. If there are no similarities in the order of selection, the bowls will be granted its selection. If the bowls rank the same teams in preference, the team involved in the process would get its preference of which bowl to participate.

The Independence Bowl will receive the eighth selection and the Papajohns.com Bowl will have the ninth pick of available SEC teams.

#### 2009 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE

Following the 2008 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the FedEx Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose presented by Citi, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

FOX Sports will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games, with the exception of the Rose Bowl, which will be televised by ABC Sports.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

At the conclusion of the 2008 regular season, the FedEx BCS National Championship Game will be hosted in Miami on Jan. 8 at 8 p.m. EST. The FedEx BCS National Championship Game will have the top two teams ranked in the BCS final regular season standings.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

Other BCS games following the 2008 regular season include the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1 at 4:30 p.m. EST, FexEd Orange Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, Allstate Sugar Bowl on Jan. 2 at 8 p.m. EST, and the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 5 at 8 p.m. ET.






#### **GEORGIA BULLDOGS**

#### 2008 SEC DIVISIONAL TIE-BREAKER

In the event of a tie for the division championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties to determine the SEC Football Championship Game representative. All Conference versus Conference Games (both division and non-division) will be counted in the Conference Standings.

**TWO-TEAM TIE.** In the event two teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams;
- B. Records of the tied teams within the division:
- C. Head-to-head competition against the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference record, and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- D. Overall record against non-divisional teams;
- E. Combined record against all common non-divisional teams;
- F. Record against the common non-divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional or non-divisional) and proceeding through other common nondivisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game.

THREE-TEAM TIE (OR MORE). If three teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order: (Note: If one of the procedures results in one team being eliminated and two remaining, the two-team tiebreaker procedure as stated in No. 1 above will be used):

- A. Combined head to head record among the tied teams;
- B. Record of the tied teams within the division;
- C. Head to head competition against the team within the division with the best over all Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- Overall Conference record against non divisional teams;
- E. Combined record against all common non divisional teams;
- F. Record against the common non divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through other common non divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest-ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the SEC Championship Game.

#### **SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME BERTHS**

Alabama and Florida have clinched a berth in the Southeastern Conference Football Championship Game (Dec. 6, 4 p.m. ET, CBS Sports, Georgia Dome, Atlanta).

In the Western Division, Alabama's 27-21 overtime win over LSU on Nov. 8 put the Tide into the championship game as it clinched sole possession of the division title.

In the Eastern Division, Florida's 42-14 win over Vanderbilt on Nov. 8 clinched at least a share of the division title and a berth into the championship game. Its' 56-6 win over South Carolina gave the Gators the sole possession of the division title.

The earliest clinches in SEC Championship Game history belong were Oct. 29, 1994 (Florida); Oct. 30, 2004 (Auburn), Oct. 30, 1993 (Alabama) and Nov. 4, 2006 (Florida).

The Nov. 8 date is the earliest that the matchup of both teams have been determined for the SEC Championship Game.

#### **EIGHT SEC TEAMS ALREADY BOWL ELIGIBLE**

Eight Southeastern Conference teams have already earned the six-win benchmark to be eligible for post-season play in 2008. Auburn has five wins and is still within reach of the six win benchmark.

The most bowl-eligible teams for the SEC in its history in one season was 10, which was last season. The SEC had nine eligible during the 2000, 2001 and 2006 seasons. In eight other seasons, the SEC has had eight bowl-eligible teams, the latest coming in 2002.

While six wins is the basic eligibility to participate in post-season bowl games, NCAA rules state that a "deserving winning team" be eligible for bowl-season play.

The SEC has agreements to send nine of its teams to post-season bowls. [A detailed list of SEC bowl agreements is on page 13. A complete listing of all bowl games is on page 15.]

NCAA Rule 30.9.2 states, "A contest (bowl game) shall be licensed only if it serves the purpose of providing a national contest between deserving winning teams. A "deserving winning team" shall be defined as wone that has won a minimum of six games against football bowl subdivision opponents and that has more wins than losses."

Exceptions to NCAA Rule 30.9.2 exist. Those are:

"An institution with a record of six wins and six losses may be selected for participation in a bowl game under the following circumstances:

(a) The institution or its conference has a primary contractual affiliation, which existed prior to the first contest of the applicable season, with the sponsoring bowl organization. In the case of a conference contractual affiliation, all conference teams with winning records must be placed in one of the contracted bowl games before any institution with a record of six wins and six losses may be placed in a contracted bowl game. There shall be no contingency agreements with other sponsoring bowl organizations intended to enable an institution with a record of six wins and six losses to become eligible for those contests; or

(b) All contractual affiliations per Bylaw 30.9.2.1-(a) have been fulfilled and all institutions with winning records

30.9.2.2 Exception—Football Bowl Subdivision Opponent. [FBS] Each year, a football bowl subdivision institution may count one victory against a football championship subdivision opponent toward the six-win minimum, provided the opponent has averaged 90 percent of the permissible maximum number of grants-inaid per year in football over a rolling two-year period.

30.9.2.2.1 Waiver. [FBS] The Football Issues Committee may approve a waiver of the 90 percent requirement to permit a football bowl subdivision institution to count a victory against a football championship subdivision opponent in football toward meeting the six-victory requirement when a unique or catastrophic situation affects the Division I-AA institution's ability to average 90 percent of the permissible maximum number of grants-in-aid per year in Division I-AA football over a rolling two-year period.

#### **SEC LEADS NATION IN DEFENSE**

Southeastern Conference defenses are leading the nation when it comes to limiting yards per play. In 132 games this season, SEC teams are giving up an average of 4.79 yards per play, which is the lowest of any NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision conference.

The SEC leads the NCAA FBS conferences in rushing yards allowed per play (3.54) and passing yards allowed per play (6.19) as well.

Going into Week 14, the SEC has six of the top 15 teams in the nation in rushing defense, five of the top 20 teams in passing defense, nine of the top 30 teams in total defense and seven of the top 30 teams in scoring defense.

#### **BCS NATIONAL CHAMPIONS**

Tennessee won the BCS' first national title in 1998, LSU won the crown in 2003, Florida's claimed the national championship in 2006 and LSU took the title this season. The Big 12 has two BCS national titles followed by the ACC, Big Ten, Pac-10 and Big East with one each.

#### **TOP 25 FINISHES**

Since 2000, the Southestern Conference has had more teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Poll than any other conference. The SEC has had 39 teams ranked in the last eight final USA Today Coaches polls, an average of almost five per season. The Big 12 is second with 31 teams ranked since 2000. The SEC has led or tied for lead in most teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Polls in seven of the last eight seasons.

## SEC LEADS NATION WITH 263 FORMER PLAYERS ON 2007 NFL OPENING DAY ROSTERS

The Southeastern Conference had 263 players on the 2007 National Football League opening day active rosters, which led all conferences.

The Atlantic Coast Conference was second with 238 players, followed by the Big Ten with 234 players, Pac-10 with 183 players, Big 12 with 176 players and the Big East with 84 players.

Among SEC schools, Georgia was first with 37 former players on NFL rosters, followed by Tennessee with 36, LSU with 33, Florida with 31 and Auburn with 30. Alabama had 21 players on NFL rosters, while South Carolina had 19, Ole Miss and Mississippi State had 17 each, Arkansas had 12, Kentucky six and Vanderbilt with five.

The SEC had five of its schools with 30-or-more-players on NFL rosters. No other conference had two.

Nationally, Miami (Fla.) leads with 46 former players on NFL rosters, followed by Ohio State with 44, Florida State with 41, Tennessee with 36 and Georgia with 35.

The NFL Kickoff Weekend numbers were furnished by the National Football League and does not include any former SEC players that may have been activated after the opening weekend

#### THIS IS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

#### THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

#### **ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS**

- During the last six years, the SEC has had more student-athletes honored as CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans than any other conference. The league has had 211 student-athletes named CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans, including 95 named to the first-team.
- During the last 12 years, the SEC has had 19 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII
  Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since
  1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award.
- Kentucky's Jacob Tamme was named by the National Football Foundation as a National Scholar-Athlete. During the last six years, the SEC has had 12 student-athletes honored, the most of any conference. LSU's Rudy Niswanger won the Vincent dePaul Draddy Award given by the National Football Foundation in 2005 as the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Niswanger became the sixth SEC student-athlete to claim the "Academic Heisman" since the award was established in 1990.

#### FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The 12 member institutions of the SEC provide nearly **\$65** million in scholarships for the more than 4,200 student-athletes each year.
- The SEC distributed nearly \$675,000 during the 2006-2007 academic year from the NCAA Special Assistance Fund for Student-Athletes. This program was implemented to provide financial aid to student-athletes with specific needs such as clothing and shoes, medical or vision care, academic course supplies and family emergencies.
- During the 2008-09 academic year, the SEC will distribute more than \$1 million to directly benefit student-athletes from the Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund.
- The SEC awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Alabama golfer Joseph Sykora and Auburn swimmer Kristen Hastrup were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners in 2007-08.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community.
   South Carolina football player William Brown and Vanderbilt lacrosse player Brooke Shinaberry were named recipients of this award in 2007-08.

#### A LEADER IN WOMEN'S SPORTS

- The SEC has developed a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The SEC had three sport winners of the Collegiate Woman of the Year Award sponsored by Honda. Tennessee's Candace Parker won for women's basketball, Katie Heenan of Georgia took top honors in gymnastics and Florida's Carolina Burckle was the top student-athlete in swimming & diving. Parker was the winner of the Honda National Collegiate Woman of the Year honor in 2007-08.
- Since 1987, SEC schools have won 69 NCAA women's national championships, an average of more than three per year in the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors. Nine of the 12 SEC institutions have won a national women's team championship since 1987.

#### **COMPLIANCE AND EDUCATION**

- The SEC Task Force Committee on Compliance and Enforcement has issued a report of recommendations that represents an important initial step in a formal process of establishing a new standard of compliance excellence within the Southeastern Conference. Among the recommendations included in this report was how institutions will handle reports of allegations, strengthening the relationship between the league's institutions and the conference office, developing new orientation programs and establishing an annual review of compliance issues.
- The SEC also conducts a New Coaches Orientation Program four times a year, which supplements institutional orientation programs and enhance the professional development of coaches. Topics of discussion range from the role of the SEC and NCAA to the role of athletics in higher education.

#### **SPORTSMANSHIP**

 The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states:

"Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

#### IN THE COMMUNITY

- The SEC launched its education initiative in 2002, utilizing the platform of intercollegiate athletics to provide elementary school teachers with relevant resources they can use to educate and prepare children for life. The SEC became the nation's first conference to develop customized educational software, providing a CD-ROM containing SEC-branded content correlating to national educational standards. Since the CD-ROM was produced, the SEC has initiated oan online program for K-8 students on education content and character development.
- SECkids.com is a website uniquely designed for school-age students. Now fans of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECkids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights.
   Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's college software in their classroom. The SEC is the only conference in the country to develop a site of this kind.

#### **OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS**

- In 2007-08, the SEC had 168 teams in 20 sports take part in NCAA post-season play, an average of almost eight teams per sport. Along with those numbers, the league also produced 457 first-team All-Americans, won five team and 46 individual national titles.
- Since 1990, the SEC has won 123 team and 851 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally in 76.2 percent of the total sports win which the league has competed (281 of 369). Ten of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the SEC's 20 sponsored sports since 2000, the SEC has won 55 team titles. The SEC has won team titles in 16 different sports since 2000, the most of any conference.

#### THE COACHES

Sylvester Croom is in his fifth season at Mississippi State and overall with a record of 21-37 (.362). The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator is Woody McCorvey and the defensive coordinator is Charlie Harbison.

Houston Nutt is in his first season at Ole Miss and in his 16th season overall with a record of 118-74 (.615). Kent Austin serves as the offensive coordinator and the defensive coordinator is Tyrone Nix.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN MISSISSIPPI STATE HAS THE BALL

RB Anthony Dixon ranks fifth in the SEC in rushing at 77.5 yards per outing with seven TDs. Tyson Lee has emerged as the starter behind center, completing 148-of-251 passes for 1,470 yards, seven TDs and four interceptions. Junior WR Brandon McRae is fourth in the conference in receptions with 50 for 512 yards and three scores. McRae is just the second MSU receiver to reach the 50-catch mark in a single season since 1995.

Senior DT Peria Jerry is second in the SEC with 13.0 TFLs and has 8.5 in his last five games. Kendrick Lewis registered his team-leading fourth interception of the year at LSU. Lewis leads the team and ranks 12th in the SEC in total tackles with 78 and is tied for fifth in the league in interceptions and eighth in passes defensed (9). Greg Hardy's fourth-quarter sack at LSU raised his team-high total to 5.5. Jamarca Sanford is the league's active career tackle leader (281 total stops).

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN OLE MISS HAS THE BALL

LB Dominic Douglas is the SEC's leading tackler with 100 total stops. He ranks first in the SEC with an 9.1 tackle-per-game average. Senior S Derek Pegues boasts two interceptions and six pass break-ups, and on special teams, he averages 23.1 yards on kickoff returns and 6.6 on punts. He holds the MSU school record with three interception returns for touchdowns in his career, which is tied for second in the SEC.

Cordera Eason is averaging 87.8 rushing yards over the last four games and has posted his first two 100-yard rushing performances. Shay Hodge, Mike Wallace and Dexter McCluster, Ole Miss has arguably the best trio of wide receivers in the SEC. Each wideout has over 30 receptions and 500 yards. QB Jevan Snead ranks second in the SEC in TD passes (19) and third in both passing average (205.2 ypg) and and pass efficiency (137.0). Snead has tossed multiple TD passes seven times this year.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

Pegues has played in 46 games during his MSU career and has set a new SEC record with 2,484 career kickoff return yards (passing Derek Abney, Kentucky, 2000-03, 2,315). His total of 111 career kickoff returns has surpassed Mark Johnson's previous SEC record of 107 (Vanderbilt, 1986-88, 90). He also stands in third all-time in the SEC with 3,276 total kick return yards.

Joshua Shene, who was recently named as one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, has now converted 62 straight PATs. He ranks first in the SEC in field goal percentage (15-of-17, 88.2) and tied for first in PATs (40-for-40, 1.000). Wallace ranks fourth in the SEC in kick return average at 24.8 yards per return. P Rob Park has notched six punts of 50-plus yards including his 51-yarder against ULM.

#### THE COACHES

Les Miles is in his fourth season at LSU with a record of 41-10 (.804) and eighth overall with a record of 69-30 (.697). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gary Crowton and the defensive coordinators are Doug Mallory and Bradley Peveto.

Bobby Petrino is in his first season at Arkansas and sixth overall with a record of 48-25 (.657). The Razorbacks' offensive coordinator is Paul Patrino and the defensive coordinator is Willy Robinson.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL

With Jarrett Lee missing the second half of the Ole Miss game, true freshman Jordan Jefferson could become the third Tiger to start at quarterback this year. Charles Scott goes into the Arkansas game with 1,081 yards and 14 TDs. Scott continues to rank among the best in the SEC in rushing as he's No. 4 in the league with 98.3 yards per game. WR Brandon LaFell currently leads the SEC in receptions per game (5.4) and he's No. 2 in receiving yards per game (77.6).

Malcolm Sheppard leads the team in tackles for loss (11.0-35) and sacks (4.5-22) and ranks third in tackles (60). He also leads the team with 12 quarterback hurries. Sheppard ranks tied for third in the SEC with 1.14 tackles for loss per game and fifth in the league in sacks with an average of 0.50 sacks per outing. Jerry Franklin leads the Hogs with 82 tackles in the first 11 games. He has garnered 52 solo tackles and 30 assisted stops. He has 3.5 TFLs (-17), 1.5 sack (-14) and two interceptions.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ARKANSAS HAS THE BALL

Rahim Alem continues to rank among the SEC's best in terms of sacks, this week coming in at No. 2 in the league with a total of 7 sacks. In 11 games, Alem has registered a total of seven, which have accounted for 57-yards in losses. He is also No. 6 in the league in tackles for losses with 10. Harry Coleman is first on the team with 60 tackles. Tyson Jackson has 4.5 sacks to his credit to rank fourth in the SEC.

Michael Smith ranks second in the SEC and 20th in the nation in rushing yards per game (107.2). Smith has racked up 1,072 yards and eight touchdowns on 207 carries thus far this season. He has five 100-yard rushing games to his credit this season. D.J. Williams ranks sixth in the nation in catches per game (4.82) among tight ends and sixth in receiving yards per game (61.1). Lucas Miller had a spectacular outing against Mississippi State hauling in 10 passes for 201 yards and a touchdown against MSU.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

PK Colt David is the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against Ole Miss. Last week, David tied a career-long with a 52-yard field goal. David also kicked a 46-yarder against the Rebels, to run his career total of field goals of 40-yards or more to 17. David, who owns the LSU career scoring mark, ranks No. 5 in SEC history in points with 349 for his career.

Jeremy Davis is averaging 42.6 yards per punt in his fi rst 11 games including a career long punt of 58 yards earlier this year against Auburn. Davis ranks third in the SEC and 20th in the nation with his 42.6 yards per punt average. He has recorded 11 punts of 50 yards or more this season.

#### THE COACHES

Paul Johnson is in his first season at Georgia Tech and 12th overall with a record of 115-42 (.732). The Yellow Jackets' offensive coordinator is Johnson and the defensive coordinator is Dave Wommack.

Mark Richt is in his eighth season at Georgia and overall with a record of 81-21 (.794). The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator is Mike Bobo and the defensive coordinator is Willie Martinez.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA TECH HAS THE BALL

Jonathan Dwyer ran for 128 yards and two touchdowns on just 10 carries in Georgia Tech's 41-23 win over No. 23 ranked Miami on Thursday. Dwyer, who sat out most of the second half, helped the Yellow Jackets produce 472 yards of rushing offense - Tech's highest total in an ACC game. For Dwyer, it was his eighth 100-yard rushing performance of the season and he remains the ACC's leading rusher (by 13 yards per game). QB Josh Nesbitt averages 65.7 yards rushing per game, which ranks ninth in the ACC. Demaryius Thomas is averaging 16.5 yards per reception.

Rennie Curran, No. 2 in the SEC with 98 tackles, followed up his career-high 15 during the road win against Kentucky with a team-high nine against Auburn. Curran is looking to become the first Bulldog to lead the SEC in tackles since 1995. Darryl Gamble tied an NCAA record for a linebacker with two interception returns for touchdowns in the 52-38 road win over No. 11 LSU. Reshad Jones added an interception against Vanderbilt and LSU to give him a team-leading three on the year. He is also second in the team with 57 tackles, including a career-high 12 in the win over LSU.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA HAS THE BALL

Morgan Burnett is tied for second in the nation in interceptions with six. Burnett has 17 more tackles than anyone on the Tech team. He has 5.5 tackles-for-loss, eight pass break-ups and one forced fumble. He has recorded double-figure tackles in a game three times this year. Derrick Morgan is tied for second nationally in fumbles recovered (4). Michael Johnson (13.0 tackles-for-loss) and Darryl Richard (10.0) both have double-digit TFLs, helping Tech rank ninth nationally as a team in tackles-for-loss.

Matthew Stafford has thrown for over 2,800 yards and 17 touchdowns this season. Georgia freshman A.J. Green (51 rec., 887 yds., 7 TDs) and senior Mohamed Massaquoi (46, 730, 5) rank first and third in the SEC in receiving yds./game. Green leads the SEC in yardage. Knowshon Moreno's 1,244 rushing yards ranks eighth best in a single season. He is only the second Bulldog in school history to rush for more than 1,000 vards in two consecutive seasons (Herschel Walker).

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

Johnson has blocked three field goals over the last two seasons. Only 10 players in NCAA history have more career blocked field goals than Johnson. Scott Blair has kicked 10 field goals this season, scored 61 points and nine of his 34 punts have been downed inside the 20. He has eight tackles on the season, including seven solo tackles, most of them coming on opponent kickoff returns.

Blair Walsh is 14-for-22 on the year in field goal attempts with three of his misses from 50+ yards. He is 2-for-5 from that range. Brian Mimbs is averaging 43.0 yards a punt with 15 inside the 20 and nine covering 50+ yards. Against Auburn, three of his four punts were inside the 20 and he averaged 45.0 yards. Richard Samuel is averaging 23.4 yards (12-281) per kickoff return.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN SOUTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL

Kenny McKinley leads all SEC active players in career receiving yards (2,639) and receiving touchdowns (19). He needs 175 yards to move into the top 10 in yardage. Mike Davis has carried 143 times for 495 yards, an average of 3.5 yards per carry. He has more than twice as many carries as any other player on the squad, and has accounted for 45 percent of the rushing yards. Chris Smelley and Stephen Garcia alternated snaps throughout the Arkansas and Florida contests.

Michael Hamlin had 10 tackles to tie for game honors among Clemson players and now has 309 for his career. He has 93 to rank second on the Clemson team this year. Safety Chris Clemons has 77 tackles this year and now has 306 for his career. Brandon Maye is the top freshman tackler with 80 stops so far. He is third on the team in tackles. Da'Quan Bowers has 36 tackles so far this season, including five tackles for loss.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN CLEMSON HAS THE BALL

Eric Norwood is second on the team with 58 tackles, including a team-high 12.5 TFL's, tying for the third-highest mark in the SEC. He is also the SEC leader with 9.0 sacks after recording 7.0 sacks in the last three games, including a career-high 3.0 sacks vs. Arkansas. Emanuel Cook leads the team and is 10th in the SEC with 81 tackles this season (7.4 per game). Captain Munnerlyn has made 25 starts over the past three seasons, recording five interceptions. This season, he has recorded 32 tackles, is second on the team with five PBUs, recovered two fumbles and forced another.

C.J. Spiller is now averaging 139 yards per game in terms of all-purpose running as he has 1,389 yards in 10 games. He leads the ACC in all-purpose running yards per game. Cullen Harper had surgery on his left shoulder the day after the Georgia Tech game (October 19 surgery) and has completed 78-120 passes for 905 yards and four touchdowns in the four games since the surgery. James Davis needs 203 yards to become the school's career leader.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

Ryan Succop is 19-for-28 in field goal attempts this season (both marks lead the SEC), is 48-for-67 in field goal attempts in his career (71.6 percent) and is 26-for-31 (83.9 percent) inside 40 yards. He has converted 38 of his last 48 attempts (79.2 percent) from inside 47. He is tied for sixth in the league (fourth among the kickers) in scoring at 7.6 points per game. Spencer Lanning has averaged 42.2 yards (fifth in the SEC) on 43 punts with a long of 53, set versus Arkansas.

Mark Buchholz has missed just two kicks all year and is 33-33 on extra points to go with 14-17 on field goals. Spiller has averaged 27.8 yards per kickoff return so far this year and is ranked 12th in the nation. Spiller returned a kickoff 96 yards for a score against Alabama in the opener, his third kickoff return for a score as a Tiger. He had a 64-yard return in the win at Boston College.

Tommy Tuberville is in his 10th season at Auburn with a record of 85-39 (.685) and in his 14th season overall with a record of 110-59 (.651). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Steve Ensminger and the defensive coordinator is Paul Rhoads.

Nick Saban is in his second season at Alabama with a record of 17-6 (.739) and 15th overall with a record of 123-65-1 (.653). The Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator is Jim McElwain and the defensive coordinator is Kirby Smart .

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN AUBURN HAS THE BALL

Kodi Burns rushed for 158 yards on just 13 carries during Auburn's 37-20 victory over UT Martin Nov. 8, becoming the first Auburn quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a game since 1976. Burns threw for a career-high 319 yards, completing 27-of-43 passes, at Ole Miss the previous week. Junior Ben Tate leads the team with 652 yards rushing and ranks 14th in Auburn history with 1,947 career yards. Rodgerigus Smith, who leads the team with 28 catches for 293 yards and a score this season, now has 112 career catches, which ranks sixth in school history.

Rolando McClain leads the defense in tackles (77) and tackles for loss (10.0). Rashad Johnson ranks tied for 12th nationally in interceptions (.45 per game) and tied for eighth in passes defended (1.36 per game). His 68 total tackles rank second on the team while his five TFL are third. He has returned two interceptions for touchdowns. Dont'a Hightower is third on the team in tackles with 55 stops - 22 solo - in 11 games (5.0 tackles per game).

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALABAMA HAS THE BALL

Antonio Coleman has collected six sacks and 10.5 tackles for loss this season, with those marks ranking fourth and sixth in the SEC, respectively. Coleman, who also has a team-high 13 quarterback hurries this year, now has 14.5 sacks during his career. Sen'Derrick Marks has been a terror on the defensive line for the Auburn defense. Marks has nine tackles for loss, which ranks him ninth in the SEC this season. Zac Etheridge currently has the lead with 64 tackles (34 solo, 30 assists), just four ahead of strong safety Mike McNeil with 60 (38 solo, 22 assists).

Glen Coffee is third in the SEC in rushing with 1,091 yards this season (99.2 ypg). He is the ninth Alabama player to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season. Julio Jones leads the Crimson Tide with 43 catches for 687 yards and four touchdowns. Andre Smith is one of four finalists for the 39th Rotary Lombardi Award. John Parker Wilson has passed for 1,775 yards while completing 59.1 percent of his passes with eight touchdowns this season.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

Individually, Tristan Davis leads the SEC and is ninth nationally in kickoff returns (29.1) and Robert Dunn is first in the SEC and fourth nationally in punt returns (17.0). Both have returned kicks for touchdowns, with Davis collecting two. Clinton Durst ranks fourth in the SEC and 29th nationally, averaging 42.0 yards per punt this year with 16 punts placed inside the 20-yard line. His kicks, which have included 20 fair catches, have helped Auburn ranks second in the SEC and 16th nationally.

P.J. Fitzgerald is averaging a career-best 41.96-yard per kick to rank fifth in the SEC with 13 punts inside the 20. Fitzgerald has been outstanding in seven SEC games. averaging 42.8 on 34 punts with 11 inside the 20-yard line. #### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN FLORIDA HAS THE BALL

Tim Tebow is Florida's active career leader in rushing yards with 1,791, which is a school record for rushing yards by a quarterback. Tebow has thrown multiple touchdowns in seven-straight games, marking the longest streak of his career. Jeff Demps' average touchdown run this year is 45.2 yards. He had the first receiving touchdown of his career against Kentucky on a 61-yard reception. Percy Harvin has scored a touchdown in each of the last 13 games he has played in. Harvin's streak leads the nation. Four of his seven touchdown receptions have come on his last 16 catches.

Everette Brown finished the game at Maryland with five tackles, 4.5 tackle for loss, 3.5 sacks and one fumble forced. Brown now has 12.5 sacks this season. He leads the nation in tackles for loss with a 1.86 average and is second in sacks. Neefy Moffett has 12 total tackles this season with 7 of those 12 counting as tackles for loss and 4.5 counting as sacks. Derek Nicholson leads FSU in tackles (70), unassisted tackles (39) and is tied for quarterback hurries (three) and recovered fumbles (two) while ranking second in tackles for loss (13) and forced fumbles (one).

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN FLORIDA STATE HAS THE BALL

Brandon Spikes is one of five linebackers in the nation to have two interceptions returned for touchdowns this season. Spikes has led the Gators in tackles in nine of the last 15 games he has played in. In addition, he has recorded 10-or-more tackles in five of his last 12 outings. Ahmad Black has returned two for touchdowns this year, which is tied with 13 others for the most in the country. Carlos Dunlap leads the Gators with seven sacks this year, which is tied for second in the SEC. This season, the Gators have 27 sacks after having 15 in 2007.

Christian Ponder scored his fourth consecutive rushing touchdown of the season in FSU's victory over Maryland. He has now thrown for 12 touchdowns and run for four more. Antone Smith has scored 15 touchdowns this season (14 rushing and one receiving). He has scored more tds in 11 games this season as he did in the first 32 games of his career. Greg Carr has 28 TDs and 2,472 yards in 48 career games.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

Chas Henry has averaged 42.5 yards per punt on his 34 kicks this season, which is third in the SEC. Brandon James is one of six players in the country to return two punts for touchdowns this season. Jonathan Phillips improved to 9-of-9 on field goals by connecting on all three of his attempts against LSU. Phillips has connected on 65 PATs this season, which ranks second nationally.

Randall Cobb is proving to be a utility player for the Wildcats this season as he not only serves as UK's starting quarterback but also is second on the team in receiving yards (197) and is second in rushing yards (294). Cobb has started four games as a receiver and three games at quarterback. Alfonso Smith has 664 rushing yards in his career with an average of 4.7 per carry.

Senior DE Robert Ayers has 14.5 TFLs through 11 games after posting three at Vanderbilt. DT Dan Williams and Ayers combined for 35 stops in the last four games. Ellix Wilson has led the team in tackles in four of his 10 games including a career-high 16 at Georgia. He leads the team for the season with 80 stops. Rico McCoy is second on the team with 79 tackles after leading the team in tackles in each of the last four games. Eric Berry has 12 career interceptions (seven this season) and is the SEC record holder in career interception return yards with 487 and single season interception return yards with 265.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL

Trevard Lindley, who holds the school record for career pass breakups (34), is second in the SEC and is tied for eighth in the nation in total passes defended. He has charted 11 pass breakups and four interceptions He is a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back. Jeremy Jarmon currently has 9.0 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, five pass breakups and four quarterback hurries. Micah Johnson is the team's second-leading tackler with 75 stops despite missing two games with injury.

Jonathan Crompton and redshirt freshman B.J. Coleman both played during the Vols 20-10 win at Vanderbilt. Arian Foster boasted 196 yards on 25 carries in his first two games (98 ypg, 7.8 ypc), but has gained just 315 yards on 85 carries in his last eight games (39.3 ypg, 3.7 ypc). CB Alphonso Smith has been named one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award. Aaron Curry leads the Deacons with 95 tackles including 14 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. For his career, Curry has amassed 322 career tackles and 43.5 tackles for loss. Curry has four games of 10 or more tackles including a career-high 16 against Duke on Nov. 1. It was his first career return for a TD

D.J. Boldin ranks first in the ACC and tied for 26th nationally in receptions per game. Boldin's 69 catches equates to an average of 6.3 per game. Boldin is the ACC leader in receptions with 69 for 709 yards and three touchdowns. Riley Skinner became just the third quarterback in Wake Forest history with three seasons of 2,000 or more passing yards. Skinner threw for 126 yards against Boston College on Nov. 22 to push his season total to 2,008 yards.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

Senior Bryant Hahnfeldt is the only active player to hold a Commodore career record. A four-year starter as the Commodore placekicker, Hahnfeldt became the Vanderbilt all-time scoring leader earlier this season. He has 241 points.

Over his first five starts, Shane Popham averaged 36.6 yards on 24 punts. However, over the last three games, he has averaged 40.9 yards on 21 punts. Popham has placed seven of those 21 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line. PK Sam Swank returned to the lineup versus Boston College.
