**ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE (11-0) vs. AUBURN TIGERS (5-6)**  
**Saturday, Nov. 29, 2008 - 2:30 p.m. (CST) - CBS**  
**Bryant-Denny Stadium (92,138) - Tuscaloosa, Ala.**

**SATURDAY'S GAME:** The University of Alabama football team closes out the 2008 regular season with the annual Iron Bowl against Auburn. The top-ranked Crimson Tide host the Tigers for a 2:30 p.m. (CST) kickoff from Bryant-Denny Stadium. The game is will be televised nationally by CBS with Verne Lundquist (play-by-play), Gary Danielson (color analyst) and Tracy Wolfson (sideline) calling the action. The Tigers are 5-5 on the season and 2-5 in the Southeastern Conference and coming off of a bye week after a 17-13 loss to No. 13 Georgia in Auburn.

**HEAD COACH NICK SABAN:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban (Kent State, 1973) is in his second season with the Crimson Tide. He was named the school's 27th head coach on Jan. 3, 2007. Saban has compiled a 109-48-1 (.693) record as a collegiate head coach, including an 18-6 (.750) mark at Alabama and an 11-0 record in 2008. He captured his 100th career victory in week two against Tulane and coached his 150th game as a collegiate head coach in week three vs. Western Kentucky. Saban led LSU to a 13-1 record and the BCS National Championship in 2003. Overall, Saban has coached three conference championship teams (1990 Mid-American, 2001 SEC and 2003 SEC) and nine of his 12 teams have played in post-season bowl games and his 2008 team is qualified for a bowl. Saban is the only current Football Bowl Subdivision coach to coach for at least 10 years and have never suffered a losing season. **RANKINGS:** Alabama remains No. 1 in this week's *Associated Press* poll and *USA Today Coaches* poll after the Crimson Tide recorded a 32-7 win over Mississippi State at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tide also held their top spot in the Bowl Championship Series standings and the Harris Poll. Alabama's current stint at No. 1 in the *Associated Press* football poll is the first since the final AP poll of the 1992 season after the Crimson Tide knocked off Miami 34-13 in the 1993 Sugar Bowl. The last time the Crimson Tide was ranked atop the AP poll during the regular season (prior to the LSU game) was the ninth week (Oct. 26-Nov. 1) of the 1980 regular season. UA has a 21-5 (.808) all-time record as the nation's top-ranked team.

**AUBURN SERIES:** The Alabama Crimson Tide and Auburn Tigers meet in the 73rd Iron Bowl on Saturday, Nov. 29, 2008 at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa. Alabama holds a 38-33-1 lead in a series that dates back to the 1893 season. The Crimson Tide and Tigers first met on Feb. 22, 1893 at Birmingham's Lakeview Park with the Tigers claiming 32-22 victory in the inaugural meeting. Auburn brings a six-game series winning streak into Saturday's game, the longest in series history by the Tigers. Their previous long was a five-game winning streak over Alabama from 1954-58. Alabama owns the longest series winning streak at nine games from 1973-81. Alabama's last win in the series was a 31-7 victory in Auburn on Nov. 17, 2001.

**NEXT GAME:** Alabama will participate in its first SEC Championship Game since 1999 on Saturday, Dec. 6 at 3 p.m. at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. The Tide will face the Eastern Division champion Florida Gators.

**SEC WESTERN DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP:** Alabama's 27-21 victory over LSU clinched Alabama's first SEC Western Division championship for Alabama since 1999. The victory secured a berth in the 2008 Southeastern Conference Championship Game in Atlanta, scheduled for Saturday, December 6, with kickoff slated for 3 p.m. (CST). CBS will televise the SEC Championship Game to a national audience. The Western Division Championship by Alabama is the Crimson Tide's sixth since expansion created the divisional format in 1992. Alabama also won division titles in 1992, 1993, 1994, 1996 and 1999.

**NEW BCS RANKINGS OUT:** Alabama garnered the No. 1 position in the Bowl Championship Series standings for the fourth straight week on Sunday, Nov. 23, when the fifth BCS rankings of the season were released. The Crimson Tide have a BCS average of .9872 with Texas (.9209) ranked second and Oklahoma (.9125) ranked third. The Tide is No. 1 in the Harris Interactive poll, the USA Today Coaches poll and the computer rankings.

**HARRIS INTERACTIVE POLL RANKING:** Alabama remained at the top of the eighth Harris Interactive College Football Poll that was released on Sunday, Nov. 23. The Harris Interactive rankings consist of a panel of former coaches, players and administrators along with current and former members of the media. Alabama garnered 2,839 points for the top spot with Florida (2,644) second, Oklahoma (2,598) third, Texas (2,577) fourth and Southern California (2,387) fifth. The Crimson Tide received 108 of 114 first-place votes with Florida getting three, Oklahoma two and Utah one.

**TIDE RANKED NO. 1:** Alabama is ranked No. 1 in this week's *Associated Press* football poll for the fourth straight week. Prior to the LSU game, it was the first time the Tide had been at the top since the final *AP* poll of the 1992 season after the Crimson Tide knocked off Miami 34-13 in the 1993 Sugar Bowl. The last time the Crimson Tide was ranked atop the *AP* poll during the regular season was the ninth week (Oct. 26-Nov. 1) of the 1980 regular season. The Tide has a 21-5 (.808) all-time record as the nation's top-ranked team. Alabama was ranked No. 1 for eight straight weeks during the 1980 season, with its last No. 1 ranking coming prior to 6-3 loss to Mississippi State at Mississippi Memorial Stadium in Jackson on Nov. 1, 1980. The loss to MSU ended Alabama's school and SEC record 28-game winning streak.

**HISTORY OF NO. 1 RANKINGS:** The Auburn game will mark Alabama's 27th game when sitting atop the *Associated Press* college football poll. The Crimson Tide's first regular-season No. 1 ranking came during the 1961 season after a 10-0 win over Georgia Tech at Birmingham's Legion Field. The Tide then defeated Auburn 34-0 on Dec. 2, 1961, before a 10-3 win over Arkansas in the 1962 Sugar Bowl to win the national championship. UA was ranked No. 1 three times during the 1962 regular season, posting a 2-1 record. The Tide suffered a 7-6 loss to Georgia Tech on Nov. 17, 1962, at Grant Field in Atlanta and would not be ranked No. 1 again until after the 1964 regular season. The No. 1 ranked Crimson Tide fell 21-17 to Texas in the 1965 Orange Bowl. Alabama was ranked No. 1 two times in 1973, beating Auburn 35-0 at Legion Field on Dec. 1 and then losing to Notre Dame 24-23 in the Sugar Bowl. The 1978 season marked the only time Alabama was the No.1 team in the preseason poll. The Tide opened the year with wins over Nebraska and Missouri before losing to Southern California at Legion Field to end its run at No. 1. Alabama won its final nine games in 1978, including a 14-7 win over Penn State in the Jan. 1, 1979, Sugar Bowl. Alabama ascended back into the No.1 spot in the *AP* poll after winning its first five games of the 1979 season. The Tide played six games as the No. 1 ranked team in 1979 before slipping to No. 2 after a 25-18 win over arch-rival Auburn to end the season. Alabama beat Arkansas 24-9 in the 1980 Sugar Bowl for the national title. After opening the 1980 season as the No. 2 ranked team, Alabama's 26-3 win over Georgia Tech at Legion Field vaulted the Tide to No. 1 where they remained for seven weeks until a loss to Mississippi State. Alabama has been ranked atop the *Associated Press* poll at the end of the season six times, including the final *AP* poll in 1961, 1964, 1965, 1978, 1979 and 1992.

**COFFEE ECLIPSES 1,000 RUSHING YARDS FOR THE SEASON:** Junior running back Glen Coffee moved past the 1,000-yard total for rushing yards for the season in the 10th game of the year against LSU. He now has 1,091 yards on 179 carries. The performance marks only the 13th time - by nine players - in Alabama football history that a running back has rushed for more than 1,000 yards in a season, the first time since Kenneth Darby rushed for 1,242 yards in 2005. Coffee eclipsed the 100-yard barrier against the Tigers, marking the third time he has done so this season and the fourth such performance of his Alabama career. Coffee is 17th on the school's all-time rushing list with 1,815 yards on 356 carries with 12 touchdowns.

**TOP 10 TERROR:** Alabama is one of just four teams in the country with two wins over top 10 teams during the 2008 season. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a 34-10 drubbing of No. 9 Clemson in the Georgia Dome before dismantling No. 3 Georgia 41-30 in Athens on Sept. 27. It marks the first time since 1999 that Alabama has beaten two top 10 teams in the same season. The Tide beat No. 3 Florida 40-39 in overtime in Gainesville on Oct. 2 before again beating the No. 5 Gators 34-7 in the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta on Dec. 4. Texas owns wins over then-No. 1 Oklahoma and then-No. 6 Oklahoma State, Florida has wins over then-No 4 LSU and then-No. 8 Georgia and Texas Tech has knocked off No. 1 Texas and No. 8 Oklahoma State in back-to-back games.

**STOPPING THE RUN:** Alabama is 12-2 under Coach Nick Saban when holding opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in a game, including an 9-0 mark in 2008. The Tide held Clemson (0), Tulane (86), Western Kentucky (42), Arkansas (92), Georgia (50), Kentucky (35), Tennessee (36), Arkansas State (91) and Mississippi State (35) to less than 100 rushing yards in nine-of-11 games this season. Going back to 2007, the Tide has held 10 of their last 12 opponents below 100 yards rushing with Colorado amassing just 75 yards in the 2007 Independence Bowl. Alabama was 3-2 last year when opponents failed to reach 100 rushing yards in a game. In Coach Saban's 24-game tenure at Alabama, the Tide has held its opponent under 100 yards rushing 14 times.

**TIDE 3RD NATIONALLY IN RUSHING DEFENSE:** The Crimson Tide ranks third nationally in rushing defense 11 games into the 2008 season. Alabama opponents have 295 rushing attempts for 826 yards, an average of 75.1 yards per game and 2.80 yards per attempt this season. The top five teams in the nation in terms of rushing defense are No. 1 TCU (48.7), No. 2 Nevada (64.5 ypg), Alabama, No. 4 Texas (82.5 ypg) and No. 5 South Florida (89.4 ypg). The Crimson Tide defense opened the season in impressive fashion by holding Clemson to zero rushing yards. In the Crimson Tide's second game Alabama held Tulane to 86 rushing yards on 32 attempts, then allowed just 42 yards on 22 carries vs. Western Kentucky, 92 yards on 31 rushes at Arkansas, 50 yards on 16 carries at Georgia, 35 yards on 20 attempts to Kentucky, 36 yards on 21 carries at Tennessee, 91 yards on 37 attempts to Arkansas State and 35 yards on 22 carries to Mississippi State.

**RUNNING ON THE TIDE IS TOUGH:** Running has been tough against the UA defense this season, as evidenced by the fact that no running back has surpassed the 100-yard barrier and all 11 opponents' leading rushers have fallen significantly short of their season run totals when playing Alabama. Here is a look at the Tide's opposing running backs this season and how they have fared against Alabama, compared to their season totals.

**UA AMONG DEFENSIVE LEADERS:** Alabama is in the top seven nationally in four defensive categories after 11 games this season. The Crimson Tide ranks third nationally in total defense, allowing just 255.64 yards per game. The rushing defense is also third in the country, giving up just 75.09 yards per contest, while the scoring defense ranks sixth nationally, allowing just 12.55 points per game, which is second in the SEC (Florida, 12.0). The pass efficiency defense comes in at No. 7 this week, allowing an efficiency rating of just 97.71 to opposing quarterbacks. The pass defense also moved up this week to No. 27, allowing 180.55 yards per game.

**TIDE LEADS NATION'S IN NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** Alabama is tied for the Football Bowl Subdivision lead with eight non-offensive touchdowns in 2008. The Crimson Tide has four interceptions returns for touchdowns - a 74-yarder by Justin Woodall, a 63-yarder by Javier Arenas and a 32 and 54-yarder by Rashad Johnson - to go along with an 87- and 80-yard punt returns from Arenas, a 17-yard return of a blocked punt by Chris Rogers and a four-yard fumble return by Rolando McClain. Alabama and Kansas State (5 PR, 1 KOR, 1 INT and 1 FR) lead the nation with Florida (5 INT and 2 PR) second with seven non-offensive touchdowns.

**TOUGH TO FIND THE END ZONE:** Alabama has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the country. The Crimson Tide have allowed three touchdowns on the ground this season with two coming at LSU and one at Georgia. The UA defense is allowing just 75.1 yards rushing per game and 12.6 points. Auburn is second nationally, allowing just four rushing touchdowns, while Tennessee is for third, surrendering five rushing touchdowns this season.

**SABAN REACHES 11-0 FOR FIRST TIME:** Nick Saban moved to 11-0 for the first time in his head coaching career with last week's win against Mississippi State. Saban had fielded two teams that reached 6-0 and two teams that reached 5-0. His 1990 team at Toledo posted wins in the first six games before falling at Central Michigan 13-12 and then his 1999 team at Michigan State went 6-0 before a 19-17 loss at Northwestern. Saban's 1997 Michigan State and 2003 LSU squads started the year at 5-0.

**SABAN EQUALS YEAR TWO RECORD:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban has guided the Crimson Tide to a No. 1 national ranking and 11-0 record this season. That is an improvement of four wins over last year's 7-6 record. With his win over Mississippi State, Saban tied the school record for largest increase in wins from year one to year two. The record is presently held by W.B. Blount (1903-04) and Gene Stallings (1990-91), who won four more games in their second year with the Crimson Tide than in year one. Blount went from three wins in 1903 to seven wins in 1904, while Stallings saw an increase from seven wins in 1990 to 11 wins in 1991.

**SABAN JOINS ELIETE LIST:** Coach Saban is one of only two Alabama coaches to lead the Tide to an 11-win season in his second year as head coach. He joins Xen Scott, Gene Stallings and Dennis Franchoino on that short list. Stallings is the only other coach to accomplish the feat, leading the Crimson Tide to an 11-1 in his second season at UA in 1991.

**BEST COACHING STARTS:** Saban has compiled a 18-6 (.750) record in his career with the Crimson Tide and the 18 wins rank in a tie for the fourth-most for any Crimson Tide head football coach after 24 games. Gene Stallings and J.W.H. Pollard also posted 18 wins through their first 24 games with the Crimson Tide. Xen Scott holds the record for most wins after 24 games, with 22 victories. **ANOTHER FIRST-HALF EXPLOSION:** Alabama once again broke out to an early lead against Mississippi State with a 5-0 first-quarter lead. That continued a trend of quick starts by the Crimson Tide in 2008. The Tide has scored on its first possession of the game in six of 11 games this season. The Crimson Tide had a 35-point first half at Arkansas and then a 31-point first half at Georgia. The 35 points at Arkansas was the most by an Alabama team since the Tide scored 42 points in the first half of a 56-7 win over UTEP on Oct. 6, 2001, at Legion Field, game UA lead 42-0 at halftime. **JULIO JONES AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE BEST:** Alabama true freshman wide receiver Julio Jones has quickly made a name for himself throughout the Southeastern Conference and across the country. Not only does the 6-foot, 4-inch, 210-pound wide out lead the Crimson Tide with 43 catches for 687 yards and four touchdowns, but he has played his best against Alabama's toughest competition and in the toughest environments. Against ranked teams Clemson, Georgia and LSU the Foley, Ala., native has caught 16 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns. His seven-catch, 128-yard performance at LSU was key in the Tide's 27-21 overtime win in Death Valley. His play has also been impressive on the road in tough environments with 23 catches for 378 yards and two touchdowns away from Bryant-Denny Stadium. Both of his 100-yard receiving games came on the road with 103 yards on six catches at Tennessee and then at LSU.

**RASHAD JOHNSON A DIFFERENCE-MAKER IN THE SECONDARY:** Alabama free safety Rashad Johnson has turned his play up a notch over the last five games. Beginning with the Mississippi game on Oct. 18 and continuing at Tennessee (Oct. 25), vs. Arkansas State (Nov. 1), at LSU and vs. Mississippi State last Saturday, Johnson has performed at a consistently high level. During that five-game stretch, the senior has five interceptions that have resulted in 34 points for the Crimson Tide, including two interceptions returned for touchdowns. He also has 38 total tackles (25 solo), five tackles for loss (-15), one sack (-7), two pass breakups and one forced fumble during that stretch. Overall, he ranks tied for 12th nationally in interceptions (.45 per game) and tied

eighth in passes defended (1.36 per game). His 68 total tackles rank second on the team while his five TFL are third. Johnson's three interceptions against LSU tied the single-game school record while his two interception returns for touchdowns (one vs. Arkansas State and one at LSU) ties the Tide's single-season record.

**ANDRE SMITH A FINALIST FOR THE LOMBARDI:** Alabama left tackle Andre Smith is one of four finalists for the 39th Rotary Lombardi Award, which goes to the nation's top lineman or linebacker. The junior from Birmingham, Ala., anchors a powerful offensive line that has been a key to the Crimson Tide's success in 2008. Smith has surrendered just one sack all season and only seven in his 36-game Alabama career. Smith has also helped clear the way for 198.5 rushing yards per game this season, which ranks 23rd nationally. Smith is the only junior and the only offensive player selected as a finalist. Joining Smith on the list of finalists is Ohio State linebacker Ray Laurinaitis, Texas defensive end Brian Orakpo and USC linebacker Rey Mauluga. Smith is the sixth Crimson Tide player to be named a finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award and the first since Demeco Ryans in 2005. Cornelius Bennett is the only Alabama player to win the Lombardi Award, capturing the honor in 1986.

**JOHN PARKER WILSON A FINALIST FOR THE UNITAS:** Alabama senior quarterback John Parker Wilson was selected as one of five finalists for the 2008 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award. The prestigious Golden Arm Award is presented annually to the nation's top senior quarterback by the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Educational Foundation, Inc. and Transamerica. The list of five finalists for the 2008 Golden Arm Award is: Wilson, Chase Daniel (Missouri); Graham Harrell (Texas Tech); Brian Johnson (Utah); Pat White (West Virginia). Wilson is the Crimson Tide's season and career leader in completions, passing yards, passing touchdowns and attempts. The Hoover, Ala., native has passed for 1,775 yards while completing 59.1 percent of his passes with eight touchdowns this season. The 2008 winner will be presented with the Golden Arm Award at the Tremont Grand Meeting & Banquet Facility in downtown Baltimore, Md., on Dec. 5.

**COFFEE A DOAK WALKER SEMIFINALIST:** Alabama running back Glen Coffee was named a semifinalist for the 2008 Doak Walker Award by the Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum Board of Directors. He is one of 10 semifinalists for the Doak Walker, which goes to the nation's top running. Coffee has rushed for 1,091 yards in the first 11 games of the 2008 season to lead the top-ranked Crimson Tide. It marks only the 13th time - by nine players - in Alabama football history that a running back has rushed for more than 1,000 yards in a season. Coffee ranks fourth in the SEC and 27th nationally at 99.2 yards per game while leading the conference in yards per rush at 6.1. The 162 members of the Doak Walker Award National Selection Committee will cast their votes to determine the 2008 finalists. Three finalists will be named on Nov. 24 and a second vote by the Doak Walker Award national Selection Committee will determine the recipient. The 2008 Doak Walker Award recipient will be announced live on The Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards on Thursday, Dec. 11, in Orlando, Fla.

**RASHAD JOHNSON WINS PONTIAC GAME CHANGING PERFORMANCE:** Rashad Johnson, a senior free safety from Sulligent, Ala., won the Pontiac Game Changing Performance for his three-interception, six-tackle effort in a 27-21 overtime win at No. 15 LSU on Nov. 8. Johnson garnered over 62 percent of the vote from college football fans across the country. The Pontiac Game Changing Performance recognizes the most dramatic moments that occur in NCAA games across the country, moments that change the outcome of the game or define a season. As a result of their win, Alabama has earned a \$5,000 contribution from Pontiac to their general scholarship fund. Additionally, as one of the 14 weekly "Pontiac Game Changing Performance" winners, UA has the opportunity to compete for the Pontiac Game Changing Performance of the Year. The play selected in fan voting as the best of the year will earn a \$100,000 general scholarship contribution from Pontiac.

**JOHNSON NAMED NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Alabama senior safety Rashad Johnson was named the Walter Camp Foundation and the FWAA National Defensive Player of the Week, after a school-record tying three interceptions in a 27-21 overtime win over LSU in Baton Rouge on Nov. 8. Johnson finished the game with four tackles, three interceptions and one tackle for loss. He had 64 yards in interception returns, including a 54-yard touchdown that tied the game at 14-14 in the second quarter. He tied an Alabama single-game record for interceptions with three vs. LSU, equaling the mark held by Bobby Wilson vs. Georgia in 1951, Dicky Thompson vs. Mississippi in 1966, Jeremiah Castille vs. Tennessee in 1982 and Kevin Jackson vs. Georgia in 1995. All three interceptions directly led to points. His first interception, on LSU's third offensive play at the Tigers' 15-yard line, led to a 1-yard sneak by quarterback John Parker Wilson. Johnson also intercepted a third-down pass in the end zone in overtime to set up the Tide's game-winning drive.

**JOHNSON RETURNS INTERCEPTION FOR TD - TIES SINGLE-SEASON MARK:** Senior safety Rashad Johnson returned a pass interception 54 yards for a touchdown with 4:33 left in the second quarter to tie the LSU game at 14-14. That marked the second consecutive game in which Johnson has scored on an interception return (Arkansas State and LSU). He took a pickoff back 32 yards for a score last week against Arkansas State. That ties Johnson for the Alabama single-season record for interception returns for a score with four others - Hootie Ingram (1952), Bobby Johns (1966), Antonio Langham (1992), and Cedric Samuel (1995). In his career, Johnson has intercepted 11 passes for 179 return yards, a total that ranks sixth in Alabama history.

**JOHN PARKER WILSON NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR DAVEY O'BRIEN:** Alabama quarterback John Parker Wilson is among 13 Football Bowl Subdivision quarterbacks selected as semifinalists for the 2008 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award. The native of Hoover, Ala., has completed 59.1 percent of his passes for 1,775 yards and eight touchdowns. Wilson is UA's all-time leader in completions, yards and touchdowns. The Davey O'Brien Award focuses on accomplishments both on and off the field. Fans are able to vote for semifinalist candidates once daily at [www.VoteOBrien.org](http://www.VoteOBrien.org). The voting will continue throughout the semifinalist and finalist rounds with five percent of the final tally coming directly from the fan vote.

**TIDE BOASTS 12-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Alabama's 32-7 win over Mississippi State gives the Crimson Tide an 12-game winning streak, the longest by an Alabama team since also winning 12 in a row from 1993-94. That 12-game winning streak began with a 24-10 over North Carolina in the Dec. 31, 1993 Gator Bowl. The Tide won all 11 regular season games in 1994 before losing to Florida 24-23 in the 1994 SEC Championship Game at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. The Tide's current 12-game winning streak began with a 30-24 win over Colorado last season in the Independence Bowl. The current streak marks the 21st winning streak of 10 or more games in school history, an NCAA record.

**10-WIN SEASONS:** Alabama posted its SEC-leading 29th 10-win season following its 27-21 overtime win at LSU on Nov. 8. The 2008 season marks the UA's first 10-win season since posting a 10-3 record in 2005. The 29 10-win seasons rank second to Oklahoma in NCAA history. The Sooners currently have 30 10-win seasons. Nebraska and Michigan are tied for third place with 25 10-win seasons and USC is fifth with 23. Alabama ranks as the SEC leader in 10-win seasons, holding a sizable lead over second-place Tennessee, who has 19. Georgia is third with 17 10-win seasons, followed by Florida (11), Auburn (11) and Arkansas (10) all of which rank among the Top 20 nationally.

**MCCALL, WALKER PLAY 50TH GAME:** A pair of Alabama seniors will play their 50th all-time game when the Crimson Tide hosts Auburn on Saturday, Nov. 29. Senior tight ends Travis McCall and Nick Walker will both play their 50th game for the Crimson Tide and become the 13th and 14th players in school history to see action in 50 games. Former fullback Tarrant Lynch (1990-94) holds the Alabama record with 52 career games, which included a fifth year of eligibility due to a medical hardship. Former offensive lineman Matt Hammond (1990-93) and linebacker Lemanski Hall (1990-93) are second on the list with 51 games played.

**ALABAMA 7-0 IN SEC FOR 1ST TIME SINCE 1994:** The victory over Mississippi State improved Alabama to 7-0 in Southeastern Conference games this season, marking the first time since 1994 that the Crimson Tides has started conference play with a 7-0 record. That year, Alabama completed the regular season with an 8-0 SEC mark before falling to Florida in the SEC Championship Game.

**FIRST 11-0 START SINCE 1994:** With the win over Mississippi State, Alabama moved to 11-0 on the season. That is the Crimson Tide's first 11-0 start since the 1994 season, a year that finished with the Tide 12-1 overall including a 24-17 win over Ohio State in the Florida Citrus Bowl. That Alabama team finished the season ranked 5th in the final post-bowl rankings.

**INGRAM BREAKS RECORD FOR RUSHING TDS BY A FRESHMAN:** Freshman running back Kareem Ingram rushed for 78 yards and one touchdown against Mississippi State, scoring on a run of 1 yard with 7:58 left in the fourth quarter to give him nine rushing touchdowns this season. That set a new Alabama record for touchdown runs by a freshman, eclipsing Terry Grant's eight rushing touchdowns in 2007.

**JACKSON'S BLOCKED PUNT NOTCHES FIRST SAFETY SINCE 2007:** Sophomore cornerback Kareem Jackson opened the scoring for Alabama against Mississippi State with a blocked punt out of the end zone for a safety to give Alabama a 2-0 lead with 10:03 left in the first quarter. The safety was the first recorded by the Crimson Tide this season, and the first since an intentional grounding call awarded two points to Alabama against Houston on October 6, 2007.

**JPW ON THE ROAD:** Alabama's John Parker Wilson has quarterbacked the Crimson Tide to a 10-0 record and a No. 1 national ranking as a senior. His play on the road in 2008 has been key to his team's performance. The Hoover, Ala. native has completed 63.4 percent of his passes away from Bryant-Denny Stadium for 862 yards, four touchdowns and one interception. Wilson boasts a passing efficiency rating of 136.18 in five games away from home this season. He led the Tide to wins over top 10 foes Clemson (at the Georgia Dome) and Georgia away from home, as well as a 49-14 win at Arkansas and a 29-9 triumph at Tennessee. Wilson threw for 180 yards against the Tigers in Atlanta with two touchdowns and then passed for 205 yards and a score against the Bulldogs in Athens. In Wilson's trip to Neyland Stadium, he completed 17-of-24 passes for 188 yards. At LSU, Wilson completed 15-of-31 passes for 215 yards and against the Tigers.

**SECOND-HALF STANDOUT:** UA quarterback John Parker Wilson's 59.1 completion percentage is a career best and a big part of his outstanding game management in 2008. But that number is even better in the fourth quarter. Wilson is completing 70.0 percent of his passes in the fourth quarter this year (21 of 30) for 293 yards and two touchdowns. Wilson is 18 for 26 (.692) for 255 yards in the fourth quarter in his last seven games. He did not have a fourth quarter incompleteness against Georgia (3 for 3, 66 yards), Kentucky (1 for 1, 14 yards), Tennessee (2 for 2, 17 yards) or Mississippi State.

**WILSON TIES SCHOOL RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE COMPLETIONS:** Senior quarterback John Parker Wilson tied the Alabama record for consecutive passes completed with a 6-yard completion to Mike McCoy with 10:06 left in the first quarter on the Tide's second play from scrimmage vs. Arkansas State. Parker's chance to break the record went awry when receiver Julio Jones failed to catch what would have been the 13th straight completion just a couple of plays later.

**WILSON SURPASSES 7,000 CAREER PASSING YARDS:** John Parker Wilson surpassed the 7,000-yard mark in career passing yardage vs. Arkansas State on Nov. 1. Entering the game with 6,911 career passing yards, Wilson passed for 85 yards in the first half to move that total to 6,996 yards at halftime. Alabama's all-time career passing yards leader, Wilson surpassed the 7,000-yard barrier on a six-yard pass completion to tight end Travis McCall on the first play from scrimmage in the third quarter. Wilson now has 7,426 yards after throwing for 215 yards in a win at No. 15 LSU and 148 yards vs. Mississippi State.

**INGRAM TIES RECORD FOR RUSHING TDS BY A FRESHMAN:** Running back Mark Ingram rushed for 113 yards and two touchdowns against Arkansas State, scoring on runs of 5 and 17 yards to give him eight rushing touchdowns this season. That ties the Alabama record for touchdown runs by a freshman, matching Terry Grant's eight rushing touchdowns in 2007.

**SMITH, CODY ON SPORTING NEWS MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICAN TEAM:** Alabama was one of four schools nationally to place two players on *The Sporting News* Midseason All-America team with left tackle Andre Smith and nose guard Terrence Cody garnering first-team honors. Smith is the cornerstone of the Crimson Tide's offensive line while Cody has been a game-changer in the middle of UA's defensive front. "Andre Smith is the best pass protector in the game, and better than many current NFL starting left tackles," *Sporting News Today* college football writer Matt Hayes said.

**TIME OF POSSESSION:** An Alabama trademark this season has been its ability to control the line of scrimmage offensively and, consequently, control the tempo of the game. This has been particularly evident in games with Clemson, Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee and Mississippi State. Alabama (32:16) currently leads the SEC and ranks 10th nationally in time of possession. The Crimson Tide have won the time of possession battle in eight of 11 games this season.

**POINTS OFF TURNOVERS:** The Alabama defense has forced 21 turnovers this season and 14 of those turnovers have resulted in points for the Crimson Tide. The offense has scored nine times, including four touchdowns and five field goals. The defense has five touchdowns as well, including interception returns by Javier Arenas and Justin Woodall at Arkansas (Sept. 20), two by Rashad Johnson vs. Arkansas State and LSU and a fumble return by Rolando McClain against Kentucky (Oct. 4). Alabama has forced at least one turnover in nine of 11 games this season (no turnovers vs. Tulane and Tennessee). The Crimson Tide recorded a season-high four turnovers, all interceptions, in its 49-14 win at Arkansas (Sept. 20) and converted three of those turnovers into 21 points. UA then scored 20 points off four interceptions at LSU in a 27-21 win on Nov. 8. Alabama scored 10 points off three turnovers in the 24-20 win over Mississippi (Oct. 18) and scored six points off two turnovers in its 34-10 season-opening win over Clemson (Aug. 30). By comparison, Alabama has 14 turnovers this season, but only five have directly led to points. Western Kentucky, Arkansas, Mississippi and LSU all scored one touchdown following an Alabama turnover this season while Tennessee kicked a field goal.

**O-LINE EXPERIENCE:** Alabama's offensive line has been a dominant force early in the 2008 season. The Crimson Tide ranks 23rd nationally in rushing - with the No. 27 individual rusher Glen Coffee (99.18) - and have physically dominated their opposition. A big reason for their success - beyond physical talent - is their ability to play as a cohesive unit. Coming into the Auburn game, the five have combined to start 139 games over their careers - Antoine Caldwell (45 starts), Andre Smith (36 starts), Mike Johnson (24 starts), Marlon Davis (23 starts) & Drew Davis (11 starts).

**COFFEE HAS TWO OF THE SEC'S LONGEST RUNS:** Glen Coffee has two of the longest runs in the Southeastern Conference this season. He busted loose on an 87-yard touchdown run at Arkansas, which was the fourth-longest run in Crimson Tide history and a career long for him at Alabama. He then ripped off a 78-yard touchdown run against Kentucky, which is the third-longest in the league. Coffee has three rushes of 50 yards or more, including a 51-yard touchdown run against Western Kentucky. Coffee ranks fourth in the SEC and 26th nationally in rushing at 99.18 yards per game and is second among the top 10 SEC rushers at 6.1 yards per carry.

**MR. COFFEE:** Alabama junior running back Glen Coffee set the Alabama single-game record with a 16.2-yard per carry average (minimum 10 attempts) at Arkansas on Sept. 20. Coffee ran 10 times for 162 yards and scored on runs of 87 and 31 yards in the Tide's 35-point first half. The previous record was 14.9-yards per carry average by Santonio Beard against Mississippi in 2002. Beard had 10 rushing attempts for 149 yards and a school-record tying five touchdowns against the Rebels.

**COFFEE HAS CAREER-BEST RUSHING DAY:** Junior running back Glen Coffee rushed for a career-high 218 yards and one touchdown on 25 carries against Kentucky. The performance, the sixth-best single-game rushing performance in Alabama history, outpaced his previous single-game high of 162

yards accomplished against Arkansas on September 20 in Fayetteville. This season, Coffee has rushed for 838 yards on 127 carries (6.6-yard per carry average) and has scored five touchdowns. The performance vs. Kentucky marked Alabama's first 200-yard rushing performance since Kenneth Darby rushed for 200 yards against Mississippi State on October 6, 2004, and the most since Shaun Alexander went for a school-record 291 yards against LSU on Nov. 9, 1996, in Baton Rouge.

**COFFEE/CODY ADDED TO WATCH LISTS:** Juniors Glen Coffee and Terrence Cody were added to the 2008 Maxwell Football Club Awards Watch list on Oct. 7. Coffee is on the watch list for the 2008 Maxwell Award, presented annually to the top offensive player in college football, joining Tide senior quarterback John Parker Wilson. Cody was named a 2008 Chuck Bednarik Award semifinalist, presented annually to the best defensive player in college football.

**JONES SETS FRESHMAN TD CATCHES AND YARDAGE RECORD:** Freshman receiver Julio Jones hauled in a John Parker Wilson touchdown pass with 1:25 left in the second quarter at Georgia, his fourth touchdown catch of the season. That set an Alabama record for touchdown catches by a freshman. The previous mark of three was shared by David Palmer (1991) and A.C. Carter (1999). Jones set the freshman yards receiving record at Tennessee with 103 yards on six catches. He now has 687 yards receiving on the season, passing Ozzie Newsome, who had 374 yards in 1974. Jones also set the season receptions record with 43, passing Carter who had 29 in 1999.

**TRUE FRESHMAN PARTICIPATION:** Alabama is tied for third nationally in true freshman participation. The Crimson Tide has played 16 true freshmen during the 2008 season. Alabama has had two true freshman starters while 15 others made contributions. Florida State leads the nation with 22 true freshmen seeing time in its opener while Miami has started 21 and Arkansas 16.

**NINE SCHOLARSHIP SENIORS FEWEST IN NATION:** Alabama boasts just nine scholarship seniors on the 2008 team and that mark is tied with Middle Tennessee for the fewest in the country. Antoine Caldwell, Marlon Davis, Bobby Greenwood, Rashad Johnson, Travis McCall, Will Oakley, Nikita Stover, Nick Walker and John Parker Wilson make up the Crimson Tide's nine scholarship seniors.

**FRESHMAN IMPACT:** Several members of the Crimson Tide's touted 2008 recruiting class have already made a significant impact on the field. Freshman running back Mark Ingram (Flint, Mich.) ranks second on the team in rushing and eighth in the SEC with 56.1 yards per game (617 yards on 112 carries) and a team-best nine touchdowns. Rookie wide receiver Julio Jones leads the team in receptions (43), receiving yards (687 and 62.5 per game) and touchdowns (4). He is sixth in receptions per game in the SEC and fourth in yards per game. On the other side of the football, Don'ta Hightower is third on the team in tackles with 55 stops - 22 solo - in 11 games (5.0 tackles per game). Hightower has also forced one fumble and recovered two more. Junior college transfer Terrence Cody has also cast a large shadow for the Tide defense, the 6-5, 365-pound nose guard has 17 tackles on the season

with 3.5 tackles for loss (-8) while also causing and recovering a fumble.

**TIDE SCORES 2 DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** Alabama's defense scored two touchdowns against Arkansas, both on interception returns. That marked the first time in Alabama history that the Crimson Tide had scored two touchdowns on interceptions returns in the same game. Since 2001, Alabama has had four games in which the Tide scored two defensive touchdowns:

- Sept. 20, 2008 - at Arkansas (Javier Arenas 63-yard interception return; Justin Woodall 74-yard interception return)
- Nov. 5, 2005 - at Mississippi State (Matt Miller 15-yard fumble return; Rudy Griffin 17-yard interception return)
- Oct. 4, 2003 - at Georgia (Charles Jones 30-yard interception; Juwan Garth 10-yard fumble return)
- Sept. 22, 2001 - Arkansas (Reggie Myles 42-yard fumble return; Thurman Ward 60-yard interception return)

**ARENAS SETS SINGLE-GAME MARK FOR PUNT RETURN YARDAGE:** With 153 yards on six punt return yards against Mississippi State, junior Javier Arenas set a new Alabama single-game record for punt return yardage. That total bettered the previous mark of 147 set by Arenas on September 6 against Tulane. Prior to this season, the Alabama record for single-game punt return yards was held by Harry Gilmer, who compiled 122 yards on punt returns in a 17-7 win at Georgia on October 25, 1947.

**ARENAS SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR CAREER PUNT RETURN YARDAGE:** With 153 yards on six punt returns against Mississippi State, Javier Arenas set an Alabama career record for punt return yardage as his career punt return yardage is now at 1,146 yards. Arenas is averaging 13.0 yards per punt return for his career (1,146 yards on 88 returns), an average that has him on pace for second place in Alabama history. Harry Gilmer's average of 13.5 yards per punt return (1,119 yards on 83 returns from 1944-47) is the best in Alabama history.

**ARENAS GOES THE DISTANCE:** Javier Arenas returned a Mississippi State punt 80 yards for a touchdown with 12:14 left in the third quarter to put Alabama in front, 19-7. That return tied for the 10th-longest punt return in Alabama history, and was Arenas' fifth punt return for a touchdown in his Alabama career, moving ahead of David Palmer's (1991-93) school record. Palmer actually had a fifth punt return for a touchdown against Colorado in the 1991 Blockbuster Bowl that came prior to the NCAA recognizing bowl statistics. Arenas has had three punt returns of more than 80 or more yards in his career, including an 86-yarder vs. Oklahoma State in the 2006 Independence Bowl and an 87-yarder against Tulane this season. The junior also owns three of the 10 longest punt returns in Alabama history.

**FITZGERALD FLIPPING FIELD FOR TIDE:** Junior punter P.J. Fitzgerald's performance at Arkansas was one of his best punting games at Alabama. He averaged 45.2 yards on five punts, including a 56-yarder that was his longest kick of the season. Fitzgerald also pinned the Razorbacks inside their 20-yard line twice. He is averaging a career-best 41.96-yard per kick to rank fifth in the SEC with 13 punts inside the 20. Fitzgerald has been outstanding in seven SEC games, averaging 42.8 on 34 punts with 11 inside the 20-yard line. He averaged 45.2 at Arkansas, 44.5 at Georgia, 43.2 against Kentucky, 42.1 with three inside the 20-yard line at LSU and 43.0 with three more inside the 20 vs. Mississippi State.

**TIGHT END TANDEM:** Alabama's senior tight end duo of Nick Walker and Travis McCall have played an important role in the Crimson Tide's 11-0 start. Walker is the Tide's No. 2 receiver with 25 receptions for 256 yards and two touchdowns. McCall, has just six catches on the year for 43 yards, but has good hands and is an outstanding blocker whose contributions are many times overlooked. While McCall is helping the Crimson Tide roll up 198.5 yards per game on the ground, Walker is compiling impressive numbers through the air. Walker's 25 receptions are a career high and the most receptions by an Alabama tight end since Lamonde Russell had 28 in 1990. Russell set the school record for tight ends in 1989 with 51 receptions.



**WILSON BREAKING RECORDS FOR TIDE:** John Parker Wilson became Alabama's all-time leader in pass completions against Clemson on Aug. 30. Wilson found UA tight end Nick Walker for a five-yard completion in the second quarter to pass Brodie Croyle's record of 488 set from 2002-05. Wilson now has 627 career completions. Wilson also surpassed the Alabama career pass attempts mark vs. Clemson and now has 1,104, exceeding Croyle's 869. His eight touchdown passes this season have also moved him ahead of Croyle on that list with 45 career TD strikes to Croyle's 41. Wilson also captured the school record for career plays (now 1,323) and then surpassed the career total yards mark (now 7,630). Wilson broke the UA record for career passing yards at Georgia on Sept. 27. With 205 passing yards, Wilson surpassed Brodie Croyle (6,382; 2002-05) on the Alabama list. Wilson now has passed for 7,426 yards, after a win over Mississippi State.

**TIFFIN A SEMIFINALIST FOR LOU GROZA AWARD:** Alabama place-kicker Leigh Tiffin was named a semifinalist for the 2008 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the FedEx Orange Bowl. Tiffin is one of 20 place-kickers selected as semifinalists by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission. The Muscle Shoals, Ala., native has connected on 16 of 23 field goals this season and all 39 extra points. He is second in the SEC and tied for 20th nationally in field goals per game at 1.45. Tiffin also ranks fourth in the league in scoring at 7.91 points per game. He is 13 for 16 this season from inside 40 yards with a long of 54 yards vs. Clemson. His 54-yarder against the Tigers ranks third in UA history, exceeded only by a 57-yarder by his father, Van Tiffin, against Texas A&M in 1985 and a 55-yarder by Ryan Pflugner against Arkansas in 1998. Tiffin is responsible for 87 points this season and 234 in his Crimson Tide career, which ranks sixth on the all-time list. Tiffin has twice been named a Groza 'Star of Stars' with his performances vs. Clemson and Mississippi State.

**SEC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** Alabama has had 13 SEC Players of the Week in 2008. The Crimson Tide got things started with two SEC Players of the Week after its 34-10 victory over then-No. 9 Clemson. Junior Mike Johnson was named the Offensive Lineman of the Week and nose guard Terrence Cody garnered Defensive Lineman of the Week honors. In week two, following a 20-6 win over Tulane, Javier Arenas was named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week. He had a school record 147 punt return yards, including an 87-yard return for a touchdown. Julio Jones then captured Freshman of the Week accolades against Western Kentucky. Andre Smith was named the Offensive Lineman of the Week after his performance against Arkansas and John Parker Wilson was tabbed as the Offensive Player of the Week following the win over No. 3 Georgia where he completed 13-of-16 passes for 205 yards. Bobby Greenwood then won UA's second Defensive Lineman of the Week honor after the Kentucky game. Johnson claimed his second SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week following his performance in the Tide's 24-20 win over Mississippi. Jones then garnered his second freshman of the week honor after catching six passes for 103 yards in a 29-9 win at Tennessee. Alabama garnered its second straight freshman of the week honor, this time for Mark Ingram, who rushed for a career-high 113 yards and two touchdowns against the Red Wolves. Rashad Johnson nabbed his first honors of the 2008 season following his three interception game vs. LSU while Jones garnered his third freshman of the week honors with seven catches for 128 yards. Arenas then won his second special teams player of the week honors following the Mississippi State game where he accounted for a school record 153 punt returns yards, including an 80-yard return for a touchdown.

**ALABAMA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** The Alabama coaching staff recognized eight players of the week following the Tide's 32-7 win over Mississippi State. On offense, junior right tackle Drew Davis and senior tight end Travis McCall were recognized for their blocking on the offensive line. The duo helped the Tide average 4.1 yards per carry on the ground as UA finished with 198 rushing yards against a physical MSU defensive front. On defense, sophomore linebacker Rolando McClain and junior linebacker Brandon Fanney were honored for their play against the Bulldogs. McClain had a game-high 11 tackles, including a career-high two sacks (-12 yards) and one pass break-up in the win. Fanney added five tackles, forced a fumble and added one quarterback pressure. Junior return specialist Javier Arenas, senior Rashad Johnson, junior punter P.J. Fitzgerald and junior kicker Leigh Tiffin were honored for their play on special teams, which proved to be the difference in the game. Arenas had six punt returns for 153 yards and one touchdown. He set Alabama records for punt return yards in a game, punt return yards in a career and punt returns for touchdowns in a career. Fitzgerald averaged 43.0 yards on five punts and landed three inside the 20-yard line. Tiffin connected on three field goals and three extra points while Johnson downed two punts inside the 2-yard line.

**WILSON NAMED AT&T NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Alabama senior quarterback John Parker Wilson was named the AT&T All-America Player of the Week following the Crimson Tide's 41-30 win over Georgia. The award is the only major college football honor chosen exclusively by fans. Wilson led the Tide to victory in Athens with 205 yards through the air on 13-of-16 passing and a touchdown. He received 40 percent of the votes to beat out Oregon State running back Jacquizz Rogers (23 percent), Oklahoma quarterback Sam Bradford (21 percent) and Texas quarterback Colt McCoy (16 percent).

**CALDWELL AND WILSON ON LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS LIST:** Alabama senior center Antoine Caldwell and senior quarterback John Parker Wilson are among 30 Division I players that make up the preliminary list for the 2008 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for NCAA football teams. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages those leaders to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact on their circle of influence. This prestigious awards program was launched during the 2001-02 basketball season, added six additional sports in 2007, and has now expanded this year to include NCAA football. Alabama, Georgia Tech and Ohio State are the only Division I programs with multiple candidates. These 30 student-athletes will be narrowed down to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will then be placed on the official ballot. The ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select the candidate that best exemplifies excellence in the "Four C's" of Classroom, Character, Community and Competition.

**FIRST-TIME PLAYERS:** Alabama has played 16 true freshmen and seen 26 different newcomers contributing early in the 2008 campaign, including seven redshirt freshmen and one junior college transfer. The Crimson Tide had 12 players make their Alabama debuts against Clemson: true freshman Julio Jones (WR), true freshman Mark Ingram (RB), true freshman B.J. Scott (WR), redshirt freshman Marquis Maze (WR), true freshman Chris Jackson (WR), true freshman Dont'a Hightower (LB), true freshman Chris Jordan (LB), junior transfer Terrence Cody (DT), true freshman Mark Barron (DB), redshirt freshman Chris Underwood (TE), true freshman Marcel Dareus (DL) and true freshman Robby Green (DB). Three more true freshmen made their debut in the home opener against Tulane with linebackers Jerrell Harris and Courtney Upshaw along with place-kicker Corey Smith. The Tide then played three more true freshmen against Western Kentucky as offensive tackles, John Michael Boswell, Barrett Jones and Tyler Love got playing time. Redshirt freshmen Robert Ezell, Brandon Gibson, Demetrius Goode, and Sam Snider have also seen action. True Freshman Brad Smelley made his first appearance against Mississippi with a catch for 16 yards.



**ESPN.COM RECOGNIZES CRIMSON TIDE:** ESPN.com's Chris Low praised the Crimson Tide in his midseason report on the Southeastern Conference. Low named junior nose guard Terrence Cody the SEC's Newcomer of the Year while tagging linebacker Rolando McClain as the conference's Defensive Player of the Year. Low also named left tackle Andre Smith as Alabama's offensive player of the year. Low called Smith "perhaps the best left offensive tackle in college football, but he's been the cornerstone of an offensive line that has punished people this season. He's been as dominant as an offensive lineman can be."

**JONES & HIGHTOWER RIVALS.COM MIDSEASON FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICANS:** Alabama is not only among the leaders in true freshmen played nationally, but a couple of those freshmen are proving to be among the best in the country. Rivals.com selected Crimson Tide wide receiver Julio Jones and linebacker Dont'a Hightower as Midseason Freshman All-Americans. Jones has 43 catches for 687 yards and four touchdowns while Hightower has registered 55 tackles with two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble. It is the second straight year that Alabama has had two Midseason Freshman All-Americans after Rolando McClain and Kareem Jackson were honored last season.

**PHIL STEELE'S MIDSEASON ALL-SEC:** Alabama had nine players on Phil Steele's 2008 Midseason All-SEC Football Team. The Crimson Tide had five offensive selections, four defensive selections and one special teams' honoree with junior Javier Arenas being named as both a cornerback and kick returner. Junior left tackle Andre Smith was the Tide's lone first-team All-SEC representative on offense while junior running back Glen Coffee, freshman receiver Julio Jones and senior center Antoine Caldwell were second-team honorees. Left guard Mike Johnson was named to the third team. Junior nose tackle Terrence Cody and sophomore linebacker Rolando McClain were named first-team All-SEC defensive players with Rashad Johnson selected to the second-team.

**300 IN TUSCALOOSA:** Alabama captured its 300th win in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 18 vs. Mississippi in just the 362nd game played in the city. The Crimson Tide currently boasts a 302-59-3 (.834) record in Tuscaloosa and a 217-46-3 (.822) at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama's first game on campus was a 4-0 loss to the Birmingham Athletic Club on Oct. 14, 1893. The Tide's first game at what was then known as Denny Stadium was a 55-0 win over Mississippi College on Sept. 28, 1929.

**TOSTITOS FIESTA BOWL TEAM OF THE WEEK:** The Crimson Tide was selected as the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl Team of the Week after a dominating 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic in the Georgia Dome. The Alabama defense held Clemson to just 188 total yards and zero rushing yards while the offense controlled the clock with 41:13 of possession time and 419 total yards. It was the Crimson Tide's first win over a top 10 team since beating No. 5 Florida 31-3 in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 1, 2005.

**GLEN COFFEE IS SI COVER BOY:** Alabama running back Glen Coffee adorned the Sept. 8 cover of Sports Illustrated after he and his Crimson Tide teammates hammered No. 9 Clemson on Aug. 30 in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic. Coffee rushed for 90 yards on 17 carries to help UA rack up 419 yards of total offense and 41:13 of possession time. John Parker Wilson threw for 180 yards on 22-of-30 passing with two touchdowns. The Tide defense allowed just 188 yards of total offense, including zero on the ground.

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama enters the 2008 season with six graduates on its football roster, including five of the nine scholarship seniors. Senior All-SEC safety Rashad Johnson, senior quarterback John Parker Wilson and junior offensive lineman Drew Davis all graduated this August from the Capstone, Johnson received his degree in Criminal Justice, Wilson and Davis earned their degrees in Marketing. The trio joins senior All-SEC center Antoine Caldwell and senior wide receivers Will Oakley and Nikita Stover, who graduated last May. In addition, five other former Crimson Tide players earned their undergraduate degrees from UA this August, including Charles Hoke (Finance), Zeke Knight (Human Environmental Studies), Terrence Jones (Human Environmental Studies), Tyrone Prothro (Human Environmental Studies) and B.J. Stabler (General Business).

**FRESHMAN ACADEMICS:** Alabama placed five freshmen on the 2007 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll, the fifth-highest total in the SEC. The Tide's freshman academic honorees were Josh Chapman, Rolando McClain, Jennings Hester, Nick Fanuzzi and Alfred McCullough.

**FORBES RECOGNIZES UNIVERSITY:** The University of Alabama was rated No. 7 by *Forbes* magazine on the Top 100 National Public Universities list. "The University of Alabama, which got great reviews from its students, came in No. 7 on our national public university ranking," the magazine wrote.

**NICK'S KIDS:** At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Saban's continue in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise more than \$650,000 - including over \$350,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 140 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

**COVERING EVERYTHING:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban's success has spread beyond just football and into the business world. He was on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* prior to the 2007 season, and prior to the start of the 2008 season he was featured on the cover of the Sept. 1 issue of *Forbes* magazine. The article inside the magazine, written by Monte Burke, examines Saban and his guidance of Crimson Tide program. The cover features Saban with Bryant-Denny Stadium in the background. Saban is the first college football coach to be featured on the cover of *Forbes* since the publication began in 1917.

**MILLION DOLLAR PLEDGE:** Coach Saban and his wife, Terry, pledged \$1 million to The University for scholarships in June of 2008. The Saban scholarships are designed specifically for first-generation college students. Six first-generation college students have already benefitted from the \$100,000 gift the Saban's made upon their arrival at the Capstone in January 2007.

**COACHING CLINIC SUCCESS:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 2008 coaching clinic featured some of the top minds in football across all levels and over 1,000 high school coaches were on hand for the event in early April. The featured speakers included Bill Belichick, Al Groh, Dean Pees, Fernando Bryant, several Alabama assistant coaches and keynote speaker Vince Dooley.

**NEW HIRES:** The Alabama football staff features three new faces in 2008, including offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jim McElwain, tight ends and special teams coordinator Bobby Williams and Associate Athletics Director for Football Mike Vollmar. McElwain joins the Tide staff after spending last season at Fresno State where the Bulldogs averaged 419.5 yards of total offense per game that ranked 38th nationally and was a 24 percent increase over the previous year. He spent the 2007 season as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders. Williams rejoins Saban's staff after spending the 2005 and 2006 seasons as the Miami Dolphins running backs coach. Prior to that Williams was Saban's associate head coach and wide receivers coach at LSU in 2004. He was the head coach at Michigan State from 2000-04, taking over for Saban when he left for LSU. Vollmar comes to the Capstone after 12 years as an Assistant Athletics Director for Football at Michigan State.

**TOP AIDES:** Alabama's coaching staff has a wealth of knowledge across all levels of football. The nine-man Crimson Tide staff features two former head coaches at the Bowl Subdivision level in Kevin Steele (Baylor) and Bobby Williams (Michigan State). The staff also has six coaches that have spent time as assistant coaches in the NFL in Bo Davis (Dolphins), Jim McElwain (Raiders), Joe Pendry (19 years with multiple teams), Kirby Smart (Dolphins), Kevin Steele (Panthers) and Bobby Williams (Lions and Dolphins).

**PLAYBOY ALL-AMERICAN:** Alabama junior left tackle Andre Smith was named to the 2008 Preseason *Playboy* All-American team this summer. He was the winner of the 2007 Jacobs Trophy, presented to the SEC's most outstanding blocker. Smith was named to the 2008 Outland Trophy watch list. He was also named preseason All-American by *ESPN.com*, *Blue Ribbon College Football Yearbook*, *Phil Steele*, *Athlon's Sports* and *Lindy's*. He is rated as the No. 2 offensive tackle in the nation by *Lindy's*. Smith has started all 27 games in his UA career. He earned the Paul Crane Offensive Lineman Award following spring practice.

**ALABAMA'S TV RECORD:** Alabama has compiled a 176-113-5 (.604) all-time record in 293 televised games. This does not include pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts. The Crimson Tide owns a 151-95-3 (.612) record in 249 regular-season televised games.

# ALABAMA/AUBURN SERIES NOTES

**THE ALABAMA-AUBURN SERIES:** The Alabama Crimson Tide and Auburn Tigers meet in the 73rd Iron Bowl on Saturday, Nov. 29, 2008 at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa. Alabama holds a 38-33-1 lead in a series that dates back to the 1893 season. The Crimson Tide and Tigers first met on Feb. 22, 1893 at Birmingham's Lakeview Park with the Tigers claiming 32-22 victory in the inaugural meeting. Auburn brings a six-game series winning streak into Saturday's game, the longest in series history by the Tigers. Their previous long was a five-game winning streak over Alabama from 1954-58. Alabama owns the longest series winning streak at nine games from 1973-81. Alabama's last win in the series was a 31-7 victory in Auburn on Nov. 17, 2001. Andrew Zow completed 22 of 29 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns in the win. Santonio Beard (20-199-2) and Ahmaad Gal-allow (14-127-0) both eclipsed 100-yards rushing in the win.

**MORE SERIES LORE:** Just about everyone knows of the rich history and tradition associated with the Alabama-Auburn series, but some people may not be aware that the rivalry was discontinued for more than 40 years in the first half of the 20th century. A few seemingly minor disagreements between the teams resulted in the series being cancelled in 1908. It was not resumed until the 1948 season. Though there are myths about fighting and other violence necessitating a dismissal of the series, the truth is that the only problems between the two teams emerged over the referee and per diem money for the players. In winning the 1906 game, Alabama used an offensive formation that Auburn head coach Mike Donahue declared illegal. After Alabama implemented a similar formation in 1907, Auburn insisted that their next meeting be officiated by an umpire from outside the South. Alabama thought this request to be ludicrous, and that became the first matter of disagreement between the two schools. The second conflict, which was over per diem, essentially amounted to \$33. Each team was allowed 22 players on its roster. Auburn wanted each player to receive \$3.50, while Alabama thought the amount should be only two dollars. After arguing for several months over these two matters, the teams finally reached a compromise and decided not to play in 1908. By this point, however, their schedules had been set for the season, and neither team's opponents were willing to move. Alabama suggested playing the game after Thanksgiving, but Auburn's Board of Trustees would not allow them to play beyond the holiday. Thus, the game was not played in 1908, and it was not placed on the schedule the following year. Attempts to revive the game in 1911, 1919, 1932 and 1944 all failed. Finally, in the spring of 1948, behind the initiative of Alabama President John Galilee, an agreement was reached to resume the series in Birmingham that fall. Prior to the game, student body presidents Gilis Cammock of Alabama and Willie Johns of Auburn participated in a symbolic "burying of the hatchet" ceremony at Woodrow Wilson Park in Birmingham. The two teams rekindled their rivalry at Legion Field on Dec. 4, 1948 and have played annually since then.

**UA-AU WINNER GETS "FOY TROPHY":** On July 13, 1948, the two circles of Omicron Delta Kappa, national leadership honor society from the University of Alabama and Auburn University joined together to sponsor a trophy devoted to sportsmanship between the two universities. The ODK-James E. Foy V Sportsmanship Trophy is a tradition which symbolizes the good relationship between the two schools. Originally the trophy was displayed in Birmingham in Loveman's store window the week prior to the football game between the two universities. Then, in a parade preceding the game, the trophy would be carried in a convertible with the Omicron Delta Kappa presidents from each school on either side. The parade was stopped in the 1960s but the trophy has continued to be awarded every year. The trophy is now awarded to the winner at halftime of the Alabama-Auburn basketball game on the winner's home court. The trophy remains in their care until the next year's presentation takes place. In January 1978, the trophy was dedicated to Dean James E. Foy V upon his retirement as the Dean of Student Affairs at Auburn University. He began serving in that position in 1950 after serving as Assistant Dean of Students at the University of Alabama.

**IRON BOWL RANKINGS:** For the 25th time since 1980 at least one team is ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 entering the annual Iron Bowl. Neither team was ranked in 1982, 1998 and 2003. Alabama is No. 1 in the current AP poll and is ranked entering the Iron Bowl for the 35th time in history. The Crimson Tide is 24-10 against the Tigers when ranked in the AP

poll. Auburn has been ranked a total of 26 times in Iron Bowl history and has compiled an 18-8 record when ranked in the AP Top 25. The highest ranked team owns a 39-10 record in the series since 1955.

**TELEVISED GAMES:** The 2008 Alabama-Auburn game will be the 34th televised game in the series, dating back to the series' first televised game in 1964. Alabama owns a 17-16 record in the previous 33 TV games. The Alabama-Auburn game is being televised for the 15th consecutive year and for the 27th time in the last 29 years. CBS Sports will televise its 10th Iron Bowl this season from Tuscaloosa.

**SABAN VERSUS AUBURN:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 2-4 (.333) in his career against the Auburn Tigers. He made his Alabama debut in last year's Iron Bowl on Nov. 24 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Saban was 2-3 against the Tigers while the head coach at LSU from 2000-04.

**TUBERVILLE VERSUS ALABAMA:** Auburn head coach Tommy Tuberville is 7-6 in his head coaching career against Alabama. He is 7-2 against Alabama as head coach at Auburn, including an AU series record six-game winning streak. Tuberville was 0-4 against Alabama while the head coach at Mississippi from 1995-98. He also faced Alabama twice as an assistant coach in his career, losing both games. In 1982, he was an assistant coach under Larry Lacewell at Arkansas State when the Tide beat the Indians 34-7 at Legion Field. In 1992, he was an assistant coach under Dennis Erickson at Miami when the No. 1 Hurricanes lost to No. 2 Alabama, 34-13, in the Jan. 1, 1993 Sugar Bowl.

**IRON BOWL CITIES:** The Alabama-Auburn football rivalry has had four homes in its 73-year existence, including Birmingham, Montgomery, Tuscaloosa and Auburn. The city of Birmingham has served as host for the annual showdown 53 times, including every year from 1904-88. The Alabama-Auburn game has been played nine times in Auburn, six times in Tuscaloosa and four times in Montgomery. The first meeting in Montgomery took place during the 1893 season, with Auburn winning 40-16. The two teams last played in the state capital in 1903, with the Tide claiming an 18-6 victory. Below is a breakdown of the series at various sites:

**TIDE-TIGER FAST FACTS:** Here are some tidbits about the Alabama-Auburn game: Alabama and Auburn have never had losing records in the same season since the series renewed in 1948 ... In the previous 72 meetings, Alabama has outscored Auburn, 1,383 to 1,217 ... The average score of the Alabama-Auburn game is 19.2 to 16.9 in favor of the Crimson Tide ... The team leading at halftime has won 73.6 percent (53 of 72) of the games ... The game has been tied at halftime seven times, with Alabama winning six of those seven games ... There have been 22 shutouts in the series ... Alabama has 14 shutout wins, most recently a 17-0 win in 1992 ... Auburn has eight shutout wins with their last coming in 2000 ... From 1958-62, Alabama shut-out Auburn five years in a row ... The two teams have played five one-point games. Auburn is 4-1 (.800) in those games.

# ALABAMA/AUBURN SERIES NOTES

**ALABAMA-AUBURN HISTORY BOOKS:** One of the nation's most storied football series, the Alabama-Auburn series has had two books written about its great rivalry. Bill Cromartie (Atlanta, Ga.) has written a book entitled *Braggin' Rights*, a game-by-game history of one of the nation's greatest rivalries. The book is now in its fourth printing. In addition, Scott Brown and Will Collier co-authored the book *The Uncivil War*, a look at the rivalry that divides family, friends and the entire state. The book was published in 1995. Most recently, Sports Illustrated's Ivan Maisel and Kelly Whiteside co-authored a book, *War in Dixie*, on the Alabama-Auburn rivalry.

**CROSSING ENEMY LINES:** Auburn alumnus G.H. Harvey is the only person to serve as head football coach at both Auburn and Alabama. He coached Auburn to a 3-0-2 record in his lone season with the Tigers in 1893. Included in that record was a 40-16 win over Alabama on Nov. 30 at Montgomery's Riverside Park. Harvey also served as head coach at Alabama during the 1901 season, compiling 2-1-2 record, which included a 17-0 loss to Auburn in the first ever meeting in Tuscaloosa on Nov. 15, 1901. Harvey's combined coaching record with Auburn and Alabama was 5-1-4 in 10 games as head coach. Bill "Brother" Oliver, who played at Alabama in 1960s and then later served as an assistant coach under Bryant and Stallings at Alabama, was Auburn's interim head coach in 1998. Oliver took over midway through the season for Terry Bowden, who resigned in October, and coached the Tigers to a 2-3 record, including a 31-17 loss to the Crimson Tide.

## ALABAMA HEAD FOOTBALL COACH NICK SABAN

\*Saban brings a 109-48-1 (.691) record as a college head coach to Tuscaloosa. He has three conference championships and nine teams have played in post-season bowl games.

\*His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

\*Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

\*In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

\*Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

\*A native of Monongah, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen.

\*Saban also is a published author. He co-authored "Tiger Turnaround" in 2001, a book documenting his first two years as head coach at LSU, and co-authored "How Good Do You Want to Be" in 2005, a book that offers real-life principles for success at work and at home.

\*At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise more than \$650,000 - including more than \$350,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 140 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

\*Saban and his wife, Terry, supported several charitable and civic projects in Louisiana. The largest of those efforts was with the Children's Miracle Network, for which Terry and Nick raised more than \$100,000 a year for children.

\*Saban was on the cover of the Sept. 1 issue of Forbes magazine. The article, written by Monte Burke, examines Saban and his guidance of Crimson Tide program. The cover features Saban with Bryant-Denny Stadium in the background. Saban is the first college football coach to be featured on the cover of Forbes since the publication began in 1917.

\*The Saban's pledged \$1 million to the University for scholarships in June of 2008. The Saban scholarships are designed specifically for first-generation college students. Six first-generation college students have already benefitted from the \$100,000 gift the Saban's made upon their arrival at the Capstone in January 2007.

\*Saban was inducted into the 2008 Independence Bowl Hall of Honor last spring at a ceremony at the East Ridge Country Club in Shreveport, La. The honor came six months after Saban's Crimson Tide defeated the Colorado Buffaloes 30-24 in the 2007 PetroSun Independence Bowl. Saban has made two appearances as a head coach in the Independence Bowl and has a 1-1 all-time mark. He coached Michigan State in 1995 when the Spartans fell to LSU by a final score of 45-26. The Independence Bowl Hall of Honor is comprised of players and coaches who have exemplified positive achievements both on and off the field, and who participated in the Independence Bowl at some point in the game's history.

## HISTORY OF ALABAMA FOOTBALL

\*The University of Alabama is in its 114th football season and has compiled a 798-314-43 (.710) all-time record in 1,155 games.

\*The Crimson Tide played its first football game on Nov. 11, 1892 with a 56-0 win over Birmingham High School in Birmingham.

\*Alabama is sixth among Division I schools in terms of all-time wins.

\*The Crimson Tide football legacy includes 12 national championships, 21 SEC championships and 92 All-Americans.

\*UA also ranks among the best in post-season play, holding the NCAA record for most bowl games (55) and most bowl wins (31).

\*Alabama ranks second all-time in NCAA history with 29 10-win seasons. Alabama's enduring success on the gridiron is further reflected in the fact that the Crimson Tide has recorded seasons with 10 or more wins in nine different decades since the first double-digit win season in 1920 (10-1).

\*Alabama has compiled a 348-159-20 (.681) record in 527 SEC games since 1933.

\*Alabama has played in more games (527), has more wins (348) and has won more league titles (21) than any team in SEC history. The Tide also has more SEC wins than Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Arkansas and South Carolina combined.

\*Alabama is the only SEC school to win a championship in every decade since the 1930s. The Crimson Tide's last SEC Championship came in 1999.

\*Alabama became the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in a decade in the 1970s. The Crimson Tide posted a 103-16-1 (.863) record from 1970-79, which included eight SEC Championships and three national titles.

## BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM

\*Alabama's on-campus home since 1929, Bryant-Denny Stadium is one of college football's most scenic venues.

\*The Crimson Tide has compiled an all-time record of 217-46-3 (.821) in 266 games at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

\*The stadium was originally named for former University of Alabama President Dr. George H. Denny. Dr. Denny was named UA President on Jan. 1, 1912 and amassed an extraordinary career that spanned almost a quarter of a century.

\*Bryant-Denny Stadium and Denny Chimes (located on the UA quadrangle) stand as reminders of Denny's legacy to the Capstone.

\*In 1976, the State of Alabama Legislature and the UA Board of Trustees added coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's name to the stadium, thus calling Alabama's football home Bryant-Denny Stadium.

\*Alabama's Sept. 2, 2006 season opener against Hawai'i drew a state-record 92,138 fans. The previous Bryant-Denny Stadium record was 86,869 on October 23, 1999 against Tennessee.

## ALL-TIME TUSCALOOSA RECORD

\*In addition to its impressive record at Bryant-Denny Stadium (1929-present), Alabama has made Tuscaloosa a very difficult place to play for opposing football teams.

\*Alabama has compiled a 302-59-3 (.834) record in 364 games in Tuscaloosa. The Crimson Tide captured their 300th win in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 18, 2008 vs. Ole Miss.

\*Alabama's first game on campus was a 4-0 loss to Birmingham Athletic Club on Oct. 14, 1893.

\*From 1911-28, Alabama posted a 55-2 (.965) record in Tuscaloosa. The 1929 season marked the opening of what is now known as Bryant-Denny Stadium.

\*Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant posted a remarkable 72-2 (.973) record in Tuscaloosa, losing only to Florida (1963) and Southern Miss (1982). The USM game was the last game Bryant coached at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

\*From 1963-82, Alabama posted an NCAA record 57-game home winning streak.

\*Miami has since broken that record with a 58-game home winning streak, but the Hurricanes' record also includes three wins in the post-season Orange Bowl game. All of UA's 57 wins were in the regular season.

\*The 57-game winning streak is one of seven winning streaks longer than 15 games for the Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa.

\*Alabama posted a 19-game unbeaten streak in Tuscaloosa from 1928-35.
