### ARKANSAS RETURNS TO SEC PLAY AGAINST AUBURN

- ▶ The Razorbacks return to Fayetteville and SEC play as Arkansas hosts Auburn on Saturday, Oct. 10, at 11 a.m. CT. Arkansas enters the game with a 2-2 record after a 47-19 victory over Texas A&M in Arlington, Texas, last Saturday. Auburn is 5-0 on the year after defeating Tennessee, 26-22, in its last outing. The game breaks up a stretch of four of five games away from home for the Razorbacks.
- ▶ Arkansas and Auburn will meet for the 19th time in the history of the series. The Tigers hold a 10-7-1 advantage overall, and the Razorbacks have won two of the last three meetings. Last season, Arkansas defeated then-No. 20 Auburn, 25-22 in Jordan-Hare Stadium. Running back Michael Smith carried the ball 35 times for 176 yards and one touchdown.
- ▶ Auburn was one of two ranked teams Arkansas defeated under head coach Bobby Petrino last season (No. 19 Tulsa, No. 20 Auburn). Last year, Coach Petrino was one only four of the 18 first-year head coaches nationally who led his team to more than one win over a ranked opponent.

### ARKANSAS FACES TOUGH SCHEDULE

- ▶ Arkansas continues one of the demanding schedules in the nation this week against Auburn. According to NCAA rankings, the 2009 slate ranks as the third-toughest in the nation.
- ▶ Auburn will be the third ranked opponent the Razorbacks have faced in the first five games this season. Six teams on the Arkansas schedule are currently ranked inside the AP top 25: (No. 1 Florida, No. 3, Alabama, No. 4, LSU, No. 17 Auburn, No. 20 Ole Miss, No. 25 South Carolina). Georgia was ranked No. 23 when Arkansas played the Bulldogs. UA's remaining road schedule includes games at No. 1 Florida, No. 4 LSU and No. 20 Ole Miss.

- Arkansas has passed for 13 touchdowns through the first four games, which more than twice as many as it threw during the first four games of 2008 (six).

### ARKANSAS RAZORBACK FOOTBALL

- ▶ Against Texas A&M, the Razorbacks scored 47 points, which were the most Arkansas has ever scored against the Aggies. Arkansas' 28-point margin of victory was the most since it shut out the Aggies 28-0 in 1982. The win was the first for Arkansas over Texas A&M since since Nov. 24, 1989, a 23-22 thriller showcasing No. 9 ranked Arkansas and No. 14 ranked Texas A&M. The win was also Arkansas' first in a dome since Oct. 22, 1988, when the Razorbacks defeated Houston in the Astrodome, 26-21.
- ▶ Arkansas has thrown for 300-or-more yards in six of 16 games under head coach Bobby Petrino. Prior to his arrival. Arkansas had thrown for 300-or-more yards 16 times in school history.
- ▶ Arkansas is +2 in turnover margin this season after finishing the 2008 campaign -9.
- ▶ Prior to 2009 August practices; the squad selected its captains for the 2009 season. They are Ryan Mallett (RSo., QB), Michael Smith (RSr., TB), DeMarcus Love. (Jr., OT), Malcolm Sheppard (Sr., DT), Adrian Davis (Sr., DE) and Wendel Davis (Sr., LB). It is believed Sheppard is the first two-time captain at Arkansas since Frank Broyles began coaching in 1958.
- ▶ Arkansas returned nine starters on defense and eight on the offense. The Razorbacks returned a total of 32 players who made at least one start in 2008 (15 on offense and 17 on defense).
- ▶ The Razorbacks returned players that accounted for 99 percent of its rushing and 97 percent of its receiving yards during the 2008 season.
- ▶ Arkansas' leaders in each of the following departments returned to the 2009 squad: rushing, receiving, scoring, all-purpose yards, tackles, tackles for loss, sacks, pass breakups, quarterback hurries, field goals, punt returns, interceptions, kick returns, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries.

### **OUARTERBACKS**

- ▶ Through four games, Ryan Mallett has thrown for 1,148 yards and 11 touchdowns. In just 16 quarters, Mallett has thrown for as many or more touchdowns than the Razorbacks did all season 35 times (records dating back to 1947).
- ▶ Ryan Mallett is tied for eighth nationally with 11 passing touchdowns this season. Of the 15 quarter-backs who have thrown for 11-or-more, Mallett is one of four that have done so in only four games.
- ▶ Ryan Mallett was 21-of-39 for 408 yards and five touchdowns against Georgia. His 408 yards were a UA single-game record as were his five passing touchdowns. Mallett has passed for more than 300 passing yards in two of four starts as a Razorback.
- ▶ Ryan Mallett owns a 5-2 collegiate record as a starting quarterback. During the 2007 season at Michigan, he was 3-0 with victories against Notre Dame, Penn State and Minnesota. He is 2-2 at Arkansas with victories over Missouri State and Texas A&M.
- ▶ In 2008, Arkansas set a school record with 3,115 passing yards. The Razorbacks ranked second in the SEC and 23rd nationally in passing offense (259.58). Razorback quarterbacks combined for four 300-yard passing games, which were the most by any team in the SEC.
- ▶ Arkansas quarterback Ryan Mallett made his first appearance in 658 days in the Arkansas season opener. His last appearance prior to the Missouri State game came on Nov. 17, 2007, against Ohio State. In the fall of 2008, Mallett got a lot of work in on Sunday nights as he had 455 reps during those workouts.
- ▶ In the season opener, UA quarterbacks combined to go 30-of-41 for 447 yards with three touchdowns. The effort marked the highest single-game passing total in school history and the first game in which the Razorbacks have ever thrown for 400-or-more yards.

#### **RUNNING BACKS**

▶ Ronnie Wingo, Jr. led the Razorbacks in rushing against Texas A&M with four carries for 86 yards and a touchdown. Wingo had the first touchdown of his career on a a 62-yard run in the fourth quarter.

## 2009 PRESEASON HONORS

▶ Arkansas has players on the watch lists for the following individual awards in 2009. This season is the first time in school history the UA offense has a player on the watch list for the O'Brien, Mackey and Walker Awards in the same year. Arkansas is also one of eight teams nationally to have a player on all three lists this year (Ohio State, Va. Tech, Oregon, LSU, Oklahoma, Florida, Notre Dame).

### BEDNARIK AWARD - DT MALCOLM SHEPPARD

Presented to the collegiate defensive player of the year by The Maxwell Football Club. Semifinalists are scheduled to be announced on Nov. 4 and three finalists will be named on Nov. 23. The winner will be announced on Dec. 10 as a part of the Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards Show. The presentation of the Bednarik trophy is slated for March 5, 2010.

#### LOMBARDI AWARD -

### DT MALCOLM SHEPPARD, TE D.J. WILLIAMS

Awarded to the nation's top football lineman, either offensive or defensive, by Houston's Rotary Club. Semifinalists will be announced Oct. 14. and four finalists will be announced Nov. 11. The awards ceremony for the honor is slated for Dec. 9, at the Hilton Americas in Houston, Texas.

#### JOHN MACKEY AWARD - TE D.J. WILLIAMS

Presented by the Nassau County Sports Commission. The Mackey Award is given annually to the nation's best tight end. This year's Mackey Award winner will be announced on December 10, 2009.

### MAXWELL AWARD -

#### **QB RYAN MALLETT, TB MICHAEL SMITH**

Presented by the Maxwell Football Club to the Outstanding Player in College Football. Semifinalists will be announced on Nov. 4 and three finalists for each award will be announced Nov. 23. The winner will be announced Dec. 10, 2009. The formal presentation of the award will be made at the Maxwell Football Club Awards Gala hosted by Harrah's Entertainment Atlantic City on March 5, 2010.

#### DAVEY O'BRIEN AWARD - QB RYAN MALLETT

Presented annually to the nation's top quarterback. Semifinalists will be announced Oct. 26; Finalists Nov. 23; and the winner Dec.10. The recipient will be honored Feb. 15, 2010 at the 33rd Annual O'Brien Awards Dinner at The Fort Worth Club in Fort Worth, Texas

### BRONKO NAGURSKI AWARD

#### DT MALCOLM SHEPPARD

Presented to the nation's best defensive player by The Charlotte Touchdown Club. Five finalists for the trophy will be announced on Nov. 18 or 19. The annual Bronko Nagurski Trophy Banquet will be on Dec. 7 at the Westin Hotel in Charlotte, N.C.

### **OUTLAND TROPHY - DT MALCOLM SHEPPARD**

The award is presented annually to the nation's top player at the tackle, guard or center position. The 2009 Outland Trophy Watch List will be updated in early October. The winner of the award will be announced at the Home Depot ESPNU College Awards Show on Dec. 10, and a presentation banquet is slated for Jan. 14, in Omaha, Neb.

#### DOAK WALKER AWARD - TB MICHAEL SMITH

The award is presented to the nation's top running back by The Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum. The recipient of the 2009 Doak Walker Award will be announced live on ESPN on The Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards on Thursday, Dec. 10. The Doak Walker Award Presentation Banquet will be held at the Hilton Anatole Hotel in Dallas, Texas, on Friday, Feb.19, 2010.

### ON THIS DATE

UA is 10-5 on Oct. 10 - notable games below

- 1964 Ninth-ranked Arkansas defeats Baylor in Little Rock, 17-6, on its way to an 11-0 season and a National Championship.
- 1992 Arkansas travels to Tennessee and defeats the fourth-ranked Volunteers. The victory was UA's first-ever Southeastern Conference win and the Razorback's first at Tennessee.

- ▶ Michael Smith led the team in receptions with five for 65 yards and a touchdown against Texas A&M. He also had eight carries for 17 yards. He has now rushed for 1,792 yards and 15 career touchdowns. In 2008, Smith finished second in the SEC with 107.2 rushing yards per game and he became the ninth Razorback to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season last year (1,072). Arkansas has had at least one 1,000 yard rusher in a school-record four-straight seasons. In addition, Smith led the league in all-purpose yards last season (141.4).
- ▶ Michael Smith has rushed for at least one touchdown in seven of the last 11 games he has played in. Smith has also had a reception in 13 of the last 14 games he has made an appearance in.
- ▶ Arkansas running backs have combined for 17 receptions for 164 yards this season (9.6 yards per reception) after averaging 8.7 yards per reception in 2008 (46 receptions for 402 yards).
- ▶ Broderick Green had his first receiving touchdown as a Razorback against Texas A&M. He also rushed for a touchdown in the season-opener against Missouri State. In July of 2009, the NCAA granted Broderick Green a waiver to compete immediately for the Razorbacks. Green transferred to Arkansas in the spring of 2009 after spending two seasons at Southern California. He was a redshirt freshman in 2007 and carried the ball 32 times for 168 yards and three touchdowns in 2008.

### OFFENSIVE LINE

- ▶ Arkansas opened the Texas A&M game with the following players on offensive line: OT Ray Dominguez, OG Wade Grayson, C Seth Oxner, OG Mitch Petrus, OT DeMarcus Love. Grayson made his first start of the season against the Aggies and it was the third different starting offensive line for the Razorbacks this season.
- ▶ The offensive line did not allow a sack in the season opener against Missouri State after not allowing one only once in 2008 (vs. Auburn). Through four games, UA has allowed seven sacks. After four games in 2008, the Razorbacks had allowed 17.
- ▶ Anthony Oden made his first start as a Razorback at Alabama. He is the first true freshman to start on the offensive line since Shawn Andrews started in 2001. Both Oden and Andrews made their first starts at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa, Ala.
- ▶ After a redshirt season in 2008, Mitch Petrus returned to action. In 2007, he played in all 13 games and had 12 starts after moving from fullback to guard prior to the season.
- ▶ Seth Oxner started the season opener for the Razorbacks at center marking the first time a player other than Jonathan Luigs had done so in 41 games. The last time Luigs did not start a game at center was against Ole Miss on Nov. 12, 2005.
- ▶ Arkansas has one fifth-year senior (Mitch Petrus) up front and three fourth-year players (DeMarcus Love, Wade Grayson and Ray Dominguez).
- ▶ The offensive line lost Jonathan Luigs, who won the Rimington Trophy in 2007, and Jose Valdez. Luigs started 49 career games and Valdez started 22. Luigs and Valdez were two of the five Razorbacks to start every game during the 2008 season.

### RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- ▶ Joe Adams made Arkansas' first reception of the game against Texas A&M, on a 67-yard pass from Ryan Mallett. Adams finished the game with three catches for 110 yards, his first 100-yard receiving game of his career.
- Greg Childs leads the team with three touchdown receptions this season (two vs. Georgia, one at Alabama). Last season, D.J. Williams and Andrew Davie led the Razorbacks with three touchdown receptions on the year.
- ▶ Joe Adams has made at least one catch in each of his 16 career games. Adams and London Crawford were the only two receivers to have one catch in each of the Razorback's 12 games in 2008. Adams has

led the Razorback wide receivers in catches in six of his 16 career games. Crawford has had at least one catch in each of the last 13 games he has appeared in.

- ▶ Last season, Joe Adams led the receivers in rushing yards with six carries for 46 yards. Between rushes, receptions and kick returns, Adams has touched the ball 57 times in his career for 815 yards (14.3 yards per touch).
- ▶ Jarius Wright had his fourth career touchdown reception against Texas A&M. Wright's touchdowns have come in four of the last six games and each has come from 31-or-more yards.
- Against Georgia, Greg Childs had five catches for 140 yards and two touchdowns, which was the first 100-yard receiving game of his career. Jarius Wright finished with four catches for 108 yards and a touchdown. The Georgia game marked the first time UA had two 100-yard receivers in the same game since the Tulsa contest in 2008 (D.J. Williams and Wright).
- ▶ Lucas Miller returned to action and started the game at Alabama after suffering a broken collarbone during practice on August 20. Miller had a career game late last season against Mississippi State as he finished with 10 catches for 201 yards and a career-long 87-yard touchdown reception. His 201 yards rank as the second-highest single-game total in school history and his reception was the longest by any receiver on a Coach Petrino team.
- ▶ Tight end Chris Gragg will miss the season after suffering a dislocated left ankle during practice on August 12. Following Gragg's injury UA coaches moved Colton Nash from defense to tight end.
- ▶ London Crawford suffered a broken right collarbone in the season opener against Missouri State. He had two catches for 44 yards against the Bears. Crawford is expected to miss four to six weeks from the time of his surgery (Sept. 7).
- ▶ In his five years as a head coach on the collegiate level, the leading receiver on Coach Petrino's teams have combined to average 70.4 receptions a season. Also, UA's D.J. Williams set the school record for receptions by a tight end in a season (61) and four of the top 10 single-season receiving marks at Louisville were set while he was with the Cardinals.
- ▶ Each of the top seven reception leaders for the Razorbacks last season returned as did 10 of the top 11. Every receiver and tight end that had at least one catch in 2008 returned to the team except Andrew Davie and Crosby Tuck. Davie left early for the NFL where he was a free agent selection by the NY Jets and Tuck decided to end his career due to a severe elbow injury he suffered in the third game of the 2007 season.

### **DEFENSIVE LINE**

- ▶ Arkansas returned each of its four starters from the 2008 season on the defensive line (Jake Bequette, Zach Stadther, Malcolm Sheppard, Adrian Davis). The Texas A&M game marked the seventh time the four started a game together.
- ▶ Defensive tackle Malcolm Sheppard leads the team with 5.5 tackles for loss this season. His career total (31.5) ranks 12th in school history. Sheppard has led the Razorbacks in tackles for loss each of the last two seasons.
- ▶ Malcolm Sheppard has had at least half of a tackle for a loss in each of the last 12 games. During the span, Sheppard has had 17.5 tackles behind the line for a combined loss of 66 yards. In 2008, he had a tackle for a loss in nine of 12 games.
- ▶ Malcolm Sheppard leads all Razorbacks in career sacks with nine. Sheppard needs five and a half more to enter the school's career chart (Randy Garner is ninth in school history, 14.5, 1997-2000).
- ▶ UA's defensive line accounted for 17.5 of the 23 sacks the team had in 2008. Returning members to the team combined for 15 of those.

### THE SCHEDULE

- ▶ Arkansas plays one of the most demanding schedules in the country. Five Razorback opponents were listed in the Associated Press Top 25 (all in the top 13). The Razorbacks traveled to preseason No. 5 Alabama and also have trips scheduled to preseason No. 1 Florida, No. 8 Ole Miss and No. 11 LSU. Arkansas also hosted preseason No. 13 Georgia.
- ▶ The slate includes matchups with seven teams that reached bowl games in the 2008 season. Two of the seven appeared in BCS bowl games and four won their bowl matchups.
- ▶ Arkansas' schedule includes games against teams that have won each of the last three national championships (Florida 2006, '08; LSU 2007). Including this year's meeting with Florida, Arkansas has played the defending national champ eight times in the last 13 years. Overall, the Razorbacks are 7-12 against defending national title winners. Last year, Bobby Petrino became the only first-year head coach in school history to lead Arkansas to an on the field victory over the national title winner from the previous season.

### **NEXT UP**

OCT, 17 at Florida, Gainesville, Fla.

Arkansas returns to the road as the Razorbacks travel to Gainesville, Fla., to take on Florida for the ninth time in school history. UF has won seven straight in the series between the two teams. Florida leads the series, 7-1, after UA won the first meeting between the two teams in the 1982 Bluebonnet Bowl, 28-24. The two teams have met twice in the SEC Championship game (1995 and 2006).

### LINEBACKERS

- ▶ Wendel Davis finished the Texas A&M game with a team-high 11 tackles and leads the squad with 30 on the season. Davis has led the team in tackles in three of four games this season (all except Alabama).
- ▶ Jerry Franklin started his 16th-straight game against Texas A&M. Last year, he was one of three defensive players to start all 12 games (Isaac Madison, Malcolm Sheppard). Franklin has had five-or-tackles in 13 of 16 games in his career and has had a pass breakup in three of his last six outings.
- ▶ Jerry Franklin returned a fumble 85 yards in the second quarter of the Texas A&M game. It was his first fumble recovery of the season and third of his career and the first touchdown of his career. It was the first fumble recovery for a touchdown by a Razorback since Antwain Robinson returned one 80 yards against Texas last season.

### SECONDARY

- ▶ Elton Ford returned to action at Alabama and started the game against Texas A&M. Ford missed the final four games of the 2008 season and dressed but did not play the first two games this year. As a true freshman last season, Ford earned the starting position at free safety for the first eight games before breaking three vertebrae in his neck during the Ole Miss game. Ford spent the next 3 1/2 months wearing a neck brace to restrict his movement. He was cleared for non-contact drills in the spring of 2009. After nearly 10 months, the first day of full contact drills for the Razorbacks was August 10, 2009.
- ▶ Andru Stewart made his first start of the season against Texas A&M. Stewart finished the game with four tackles, which ranked fourth on the squad.
- ▶ Tramain Thomas recorded his second interception of the season against Georgia. Thomas has had an interception in two of the Razorbacks' four games this season. Last year, Ramon Broadway and Jerry Franklin led the team with two interceptions each.
- ▶ The unit entered the year with 10 career interceptions and Jerell Norton made five of those during the 2007 season when he led the Razorbacks. He returned the five for 174 yards and had a school record 100-yard touchdown return against North Texas.
- After receiving a medical redshirt in 2008 due to a hernia and a hamstring injury, Jerell Norton returned to action against Missouri State. Norton was the only returning member of the secondary who had started a game prior to 2008 as he had seven starts during the 2007 season.
- ▶ Cornerback Isaac Madison suffered a knee injury during August drills. During a scrimmage on August 15, Madison tore the ACL in his left knee that will cause him to miss the 2009 season.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

- ▶ Against Texas A&M, Dennis Johnson returned three kickoffs for 69 yards to bring his career total to 1,233 yards, which moved him into third all-time in school history. Joe Adams also two kickoff returns against the Aggies for 41 yards.
- ▶ Alex Tejada has been nearly perfect this year. On the season, he is 6-of-6 on field goals and 17-of-18 on extra points.
- ▶ The Razorbacks converted their first fake punt of the season at Alabama on a nine-yard run by Ronnie Wingo, Jr. The play came on fourth and six at the Arkansas 25-yard line.
- ▶ Dennis Johnson returned the season opening kickoff 91-yards for a touchdown to join Clemson's C.J. Spiller as the only two players in the nation to return a kick for a touchdown to start the year for their team. Johnson's return for a touchdown was the second in his career (Tulsa, 2008, 96 yards). It was the first game-opening kickoff return for a touchdown by a Razorback since Felix Jones went 100 yards against Ole Miss in 2006.

### **EMBRACING ARKANSAS**

In his time at Arkansas, Coach Petrino has reached out to the community, faculty and former players through numerous initiatives including the following:

Made a personal \$100,000 commitment to the Razorback Foundation. Petrino's gift is believed to be the largest donation to the Razorback Foundation Annual Fund by a sitting Razorback head coach in school history.

Initiated a kickoff luncheon on August 14, 2009, that was attended by more than 950 fans. Coach Petrino was the featured speaker and coaches, football personnel and all 105 players attended. Two players sat at each table with fans. The plan is for the luncheon to continue in future seasons.

Asked to establish a weekly radio show, which is held Wednesday evenings throughout the fall. It will be held at a local restaurant where fans can attend.

Studied and asked for consideration for a synthetic field surface to be installed at Razorback Stadium. The installation began immediately following our spring game and was completed prior to the 2009 season.

After reading an article discussing city budget issues, Coach Petrino utilized time that was allocated for team meetings during 2009 spring football to send the entire squad to the city library. The group spent part of an afternoon cleaning, stacking books and visiting with children.

Organized a ceremony at halftime of the 2009 Red-White game honoring the senior class from the past season and naming team award winners. He invited former players back to be a part of it and the following were on hand: Darren McFadden, Felix Jones, Shawn Andrews, Ken Hamlin, Quinn Grovey and Cedric Cobbs among others.

More than 500 faculty members were in attendance at the 2009 Arkansas spring game to participate in Faculty Appreciation Day. This was the second year the event was held and the attendance was nearly double that of last year.

Spoke to the "A" Club at a breakfast the morning of the 2009 spring game. More than 200 former Razorbacks from Seattle to Atlanta traveled to attend.

Made appearances at several other Razorback sporting events including men's and women's basketball games and baseball, including the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.
