#### After Open Date, LSU To Host SEC Western Division Rival Auburn

With the open date behind them, LSU returns to action on Saturday when the No. 9/10-ranked Tigers host Auburn at 6:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN2. LSU brings a 5-1 overall mark and a 3-1 league record into the contest. LSU is ranked No. 9 in the first BCS Standings, which was released on Sunday. The Tigers are also No. 9 in the AP Top 25 and No. 10 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. The Tigers dropped a 13-3 decision to No. 1 ranked Florida in its last contest. Auburn, which won its first five games, is 5-2 overall and 2-2 in conference action. Auburn is coming off a 21-14 setback to Kentucky last week. LSU has won two straight and three of the last four against Auburn, including a 26-21 road victory a year ago. LSU had its 32-game Saturday night winning streak in Tiger Stadium snapped against Florida. Dating back to 2002, LSU has won 32 of its last 33 Saturday night games played in Tiger Stadium. The LSU-Auburn game will feature one of the SEC's best defenses (LSU) going against one of the league's top offenses (Auburn). LSU goes into the game allowing 14.5 points and 322.5 yards per game. Auburn is averaging 464.9 total yards and 34.9 points per game, both of which rank No. 2 in the SEC. Since giving up 478 yards and 23 points in the season-opener against Washington, the LSU defense has clamped down, allowing just 291.4 yards and 12.8 points over its last five games. The Tigers are tied for first in the SEC in turnover margin at +7 (+1.17 per game). In six games, LSU has gained 12 turnovers (3 fumbles, 9 interceptions), while losing just five turnovers (2 fumbles, 3 interceptions). LSU QB **Jordan Jefferson** is fifth in the SEC in pass efficiency, having completed 91 of 145 passes for 1,016 yards, seven touchdowns and only three interceptions. LSU's **Brandon LaFell** and **Terrance Toliver** form the SEC's top receiving tandem as the duo has combined for 52 receptions for 686 yards and seven TDs. LaFell's third in the SEC in receptions per game (4.5) as he's caught 27 passes for 326 yards and five scores. Toliver is fifth in the SEC with 4.2 catches per game (25 for 356 yards, 2 TDs). **Charles Scott** leads LSU's rushing game with 327 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Defensively, LSU's trio of linebackers - **Kelvin Sheppard** (44 tackles), **Perry Riley** (42) and **Harry Coleman** (38) lead the Tigers in tackles.

#### Florida Defense Too Much For LSU As Tigers Fall To Top-Ranked Gators, 13-3

LSU's defense limited the SEC's top offense to only 13 points and just 327 total yards, but it wasn't enough as top-ranked Florida stymied the Tiger offense in a 13-3 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU managed just a second quarter field goal - an 18-yarder by **Josh Jasper** - as the Tigers suffered their first loss in a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium since 2002. Florida never trailed in the contest, taking a 3-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 28-yard field goal by **Caleb Sturgis** at the 3:50 mark. The Tigers responded two drives later, going all the way to the Florida 2-yard line before settling for the Jasper field goal to tie the game at 3-3 with 5:16 to play in the first half. The Gators extended their lead to 10-3 just before halftime when **Tim Tebow** hit **Riley Cooper** on a 24-yard TD pass. Florida stretched the lead to 13-3 on a 32-yard field goal by **Sturgis** at the 7:27 mark. LSU turned the ball over on downs on the ensuing possession and Florida was able to run out the clock for the victory. **Charles Scott** led the Tigers with 53 yards rushing, while **Jordan Jefferson** connected on 11 of 17 passes for 96 yards and one interception. LSU managed just 162 total yards, including 44 in the second half, in the loss. Defensively, **Kelvin Sheppard** led the Tigers with 13 tackles, while **Perry Riley** and **Chad Jones** added 12 each.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • FIFTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level since his arrival in 2005.

In four years at LSU, Miles has led the charge in what has been the best run in the history of football at the school. Since taking over the program in January of 2005, Miles has led LSU to a national title, a Southeastern Conference championship, two appearances in the SEC Championship Game, three straight top five finishes, and four bowl victories, two of which were BCS contests.

Throw in 47 victories and three seasons of at least 11 victories and that makes for the best four-year stretch of football in school history.

Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 47-12 with those victories representing the most by any LSU football coach over a four-year period. In addition to his 47 wins, some other notable accomplishments during his first four years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings; and a perfect 4-0 record in bowl games, which includes wins in the BCS Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 10 wins for the past four years, the Tigers have had 66 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 85 earning their college diploma.

Sixteen of the 18 seniors on the 2008 football team graduated, while 18 members of the 25-man senior class from the 2007 national championship team have earned their degree.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 25 NFL Draft picks over the past four years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being named the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American. A year later, Tyson Jackson became the highest drafted defensive player in LSU history, going No. 3 overall to the Kansas City Chiefs.

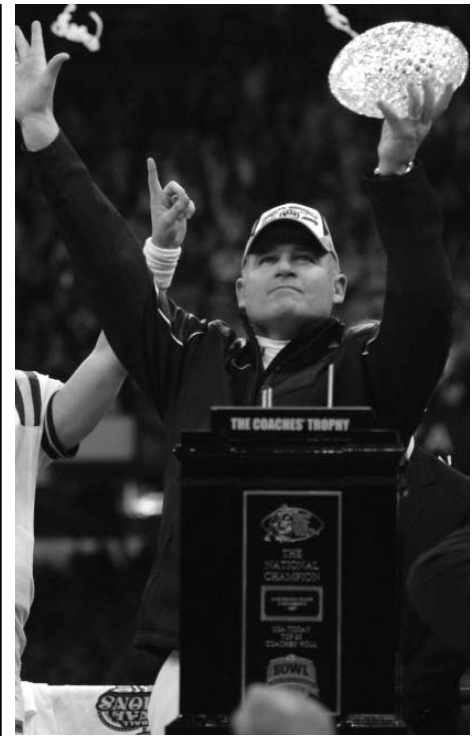
Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 47 wins, including 18 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with four-straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 class in 2009, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

## LSU To Host Auburn In Tiger Stadium

LSU returns to action on Saturday when the No. 9/10-ranked Tigers host Auburn in Tiger Stadium. Kickoff for the contest is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. and the game will be televised by ESPN2. LSU, which is coming off an open date, brings a 5-1 overall mark and a 3-1 league record into the game. Auburn is coming off a 21-14 loss to Kentucky and stands at 5-2 overall and 2-2 in conference play. The winner of the LSU-Auburn game has gone on to claim the SEC Western Division title six times since the start of the 2000 season. At least one team has been ranked in the top 25 when LSU and Auburn have met dating back to the 2000 season. This is also the first time since the 2002 that both teams head into the game ranked in the top 25 (LSU is No. 9/10, while Auburn is unranked).

## LSU Storylines This Week ...

- Against Auburn, LSU will face a head coach who is in his first year at the school that the Tigers are playing for the third time this year. The other two were Washington (Steve Sarkisian) and Mississippi State (Dan Mullen). LSU won both of those games.
- LSU's streak of 32 straight Saturday night wins in Tiger Stadium was snapped vs. Florida. Prior to the Florida game, LSU hadn't lost a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium since a 31-0 defeat to Alabama in 2002. Dating back to the 2002 season, LSU has won 32 of its last 33 Saturday night games in Tiger Stadium.
- LSU hasn't lost back-to-back home games since the 2001 season when the Tigers lost to Florida and Ole Miss. To take it a step further, LSU hasn't lost consecutive night games in Tiger Stadium since 1999.
- LSU is ranked in the top 10 during the month of October for the fifth straight year.
- Since the 2002 season, LSU is 48-11 in games which they were ranked in the Top 10.
- With its win over Georgia, LSU has now recorded 12 fourth quarter comebacks under Les Miles. Three of Miles' 12 fourth quarter comebacks have come against Auburn.
- LSU will start a different player at quarterback against Auburn for the fourth consecutive year (JaMarcus Russell, 2006, Matt Flynn, 2007, Jarrett Lee, 2008 and Jordan Jefferson, 2009).
- LSU coach Les Miles has led the Tigers to 12 fourth quarter comebacks, three of which have come against Auburn - 2005, 2007 and 2008.

## LSU Opens Up At No. 9 In The BCS Standings

The first BCS Standings were released this week and LSU came in at No. 9 in the initial standings. The Tigers accumulated a .7083 BCS average, which takes into consideration the two human elements - the USA Today Coaches Poll and the Harris Interactive Rankings - along with the computer polls. LSU is ranked No. 9 in the Harris Interactive and No. 10 in the Coaches Poll. LSU's average in the computer rankings is No. 7. LSU is one of three SEC teams in the BCS Top 10, joining No. 1 Florida and No. 2 Alabama.

## LSU-Auburn Winner Usually Wins The West

Since the 2000 season, the winner of the LSU-Auburn game has gone on to represent the SEC Western Division in the league's championship game six times. The only exception came in 2002 (Arkansas), 2006 (Arkansas) and 2008 (Alabama). The following is a look at the LSU-Auburn series dating back to the 2000 and the impact the win had on the remainder of the season:

## Home Team Streak in LSU-Auburn Series Snapped Last Year

Prior to last year's LSU win at Auburn, the home team in the LSU-Auburn series had won eight straight games played between the teams. LSU ended that streak a year ago when the Tigers scored with just over a minute left to win, 26-21, at Auburn. Prior to last year, the last time a road team won in the series came in 1999 when Auburn posted a 41-7 victory over LSU in Tiger Stadium. Ironically, that was the fourth straight game in which the road team had won in the series. LSU beat Auburn at Auburn in 1996 and 1998; and Auburn won in Tiger Stadium in 1997 and 1999.

## 19 Points Has Been The Difference In Last Four Meetings Between LSU And Auburn

Since Auburn's 10-9 win over LSU in 2004, a total of 19 points have been the difference in winning or losing between these teams. A year later in 2005, LSU held on for a 20-17 overtime win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium; in 2006, Auburn posted a 7-3 victory over LSU in Jordan-Hare Stadium; in 2008, the LSU Tigers scored with seconds left to win, 30-24; and last year, LSU scored with 1:03 left in the game to win, 26-21.

## The LSU-Auburn Connection

Sam Nader, LSU's assistant AD for Football Operations, graduated from Auburn in 1967 after playing quarterback for the Tigers ... Auburn assistant equipment manager Mike "Bones" Boniol is a 2001 graduate of LSU and served on the equipment staff at LSU from 2002-06.

## Alabama Tigers

LSU has one player on its roster who is from the state of Alabama and that's true freshman offensive lineman Josh Williford (Dothan) ... LSU secondary coach Ron Cooper is a native of Huntsville, Ala., and defensive line coach Brick Haley is from Gadsden, Ala.

## Expect The Unexpected When LSU and Auburn Get Together

Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988:

**1988:** LSU's Tommy Hodson hit Eddie Fuller in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled "The Earthquake Game."

**1994:** Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that became known as "The Interception Game."

**1995:** LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the "Bring Back the Magic" game.

**1996:** With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled "The Night the Barn Burned."

**1997:** Titled "The Comeback", Auburn QB Dameyune Craig engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.

**2004:** Titled "The Call", Auburn appeared to have missed an extra point with 1:14 left that would have left the game tied at 9-9. However, LSU was called for a penalty on the extra point, thus giving Auburn a second chance at winning the game. The second PAT was good and Auburn held on for a 10-9 win, snapping LSU's 10-game winning streak.

**2005:** Auburn missed five field goals, including one in overtime, as LSU held on for a 20-17 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The win helped propel LSU to the SEC Western Division title and the game is now known as the "Field Goal Game".

**2007:** "Can't See Me" Demetrius Byrd caught a 22-yard TD pass from Matt Flynn with just one second left to send LSU to a 30-24 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The play seemed to have caught Auburn off-guard as the Tigers could have attempted a 39-yard field goal for the win. However, LSU took one final shot at the endzone as Flynn connected with Byrd for the score, who the gave the "Can't See Me" gesture to the LSU student section after coming up with the catch.

**2008:** Freshman quarterback Jarrett Lee led LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard capped with an 18-yard TD pass to Brandon LaFell as the LSU Tigers rallied for a 26-21 win over Auburn. It marked the second straight year that LSU scored in the closing moments of the game to beat Auburn.

## LSU Leads SEC And Ranked No. 9 In Nation In Turnover Margin

LSU goes into the Auburn game tied with Arkansas for first place in the SEC in turnover margin at +7 (or +1.17 per game). The Tigers are No. 9 in the nation in turnover margin. In six games, the Tigers have gained 12 turnovers - 9 interceptions and 3 fumbles, while losing just five turnovers - 3 interceptions, 2 fumbles.

## LSU Does It Again...Records 12th Fourth-Quarter Comeback Under Miles

For the 12th time under Les Miles, LSU won a football game despite trailing in the fourth quarter as the Tigers rallied from a 13-12 deficit with just over a minute to play to beat Georgia, 20-13, in Athens. The following is a look at LSU's fourth quarter comebacks under Miles, how many points the Tigers had to overcome in the final frame to win and the quarterback who engineered the comeback:

## LSU's Won 19 Straight Overall On ESPN Family Of Networks

LSU brings a 19-game winning streak on the ESPN family of networks into the Auburn game. The 19-game streak goes back to the 2005 season when Tennessee rallied for a 30-27 overtime win over the Tigers on a Monday night in a game televised by ESPN2. Since then, the Tigers have reeled off 19 straight victories on the all sports network. Breaking down the 19-game streak has the Tigers winning 10 straight on ESPN, six in a row on ESPN2, two on ESPNU and one on ESPN Classic. LSU is 3-0 in the ESPN Family of Networks this year - beating Washington on ESPN and Vanderbilt and UL-Lafayette on ESPNU.

## Tiger Defense Continues To Be Impressive

Since allowing 23 points and 478 total yards in the season-opener against Washington, LSU's defense has been impressive, holding its last five opponents to an average of 291.4 total yards and 12.8 points per game. In its four SEC games, LSU is limiting opponents to 296.3 total yards and 15.3 points per game. In consecutive SEC games, LSU combined to limit Georgia and Florida to just 26 total points. By comparison, last year, Georgia and Florida combined to score 103 points (Georgia 52, Florida 51) on the Tigers. The 13 points that LSU held Florida to were the fewest by the Tigers against the Gators since a 36-7 LSU win in 2002. Prior to that, you have to go back to 1987 to find a game that LSU held Florida to fewer than 13 points (LSU won that game in 1987, 13-10).

## LSU's Intercepted A Pass In Eight Straight Games

LSU goes into the Auburn game having intercepted a pass in eight straight games. The streak covers all six games this year and the final two games of the 2008 season. The streak is the longest for the Tigers since going eight straight games from the final game of the 2005 season thru the first seven game of the 2006 season. During the current eight game streak, LSU has intercepted a total of 11 passes, which includes a season-best 3 in the win over Mississippi State.

## Dickson Breaks LSU Career Record For Receiving Yards by a Tight End

With his 31 receiving yards at Georgia, **Richard Dickson** shattered the school record for career receiving yards by a tight end. Dickson, who now has 898 receiving yards, eclipsed David LaFleur's old mark of 881 yards set from 1993-96. Dickson broke the mark on his 10-yard catch late in the fourth quarter that set up a **Charles Scott** touchdown. Dickson stands in second place in career receptions by a tight end with 81. He passed Malcolm Scott (77 from 1979-82) and now needs just seven catches to become the school record holder. Mitch Andrews (1982-85) is the current school record holder with 87 receptions. Dickson shares the LSU career record for touchdown receptions by a tight end with Brad Boyd (1972-74). Both own 10 career touchdown catches. The following is a look at Dickson's career receiving numbers and who he's chasing to become the most productive tight end in school history

## "Chuck The Truck" Into the Endzone; Goes Over 2,000 Yard Mark For Career

Senior RB **Charles Scott** found the endzone twice in the fourth quarter against Georgia to go along with his 95 yards rushing against the Bulldogs. His two rushing touchdowns now puts him in the LSU career top five for rushing TDs. He passed Rondell Mealey (29 from 1996-99) on Saturday and sits at 30 career rushing TDs. Scott needs one more TD to tie Terry Robiskie (1973-76) for fourth and 10 more to tie Charles Alexander (1975-78) for third place. Kevin Faulk (1995-98) holds the school record with 46. Scott also went over the 2,000-yard mark for his career. Scott goes into the Auburn game with 2,102 yards, which ranks just outside of LSU's top 10 list.

## Scott Had Big Game Against Auburn Last Year

**Charles Scott** became "Chuck the Truck" following last year's performance against Auburn as he was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his 132-yard effort in the 26-21 win over the Tigers. It marked Scott's third straight 100-yard game a year ago as he became the first LSU player to have three straight 100-yard games to open a season since Charles Alexander did it in 1978. Scott also became the first LSU running back to break the 100-yard mark in a game at Auburn. He averaged 6.3 yards per carry against an Auburn defense that was allowing just 53 rushing yards per game going into the contest. Scott had eight carries of at least nine yards vs. Auburn, including a long run of 31 yards to setup an LSU field goal in the third quarter. He also caught 2 passes for 15 yards.

## This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 211-60-4 (.775) at night under the lights compared to a 21-25-3 (.459) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 56-11 overall at home, which includes a 45-5 (.900) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-6 (.647) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Prior to the Florida game, LSU hadn't lost a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium since a 31-0 defeat to Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002. Les Miles is now 21-1 in Saturday night games in Tiger Stadium. ## With Win Over Georgia, Miles Has Victories Over Every SEC Team

With the win over Georgia, LSU coach Les Miles has recorded at least one victory over every team in the SEC. Miles is 25-10 in SEC regular season games and 27-10 in all league games (including SEC Championship Game). In addition, Miles has faced 46 different teams during his head coaching career and he's beaten all but one of them. The only team that Miles has played as a head coach and yet to beat is Texas.

## Miles is 26-6 Overall and 12-6 In SEC Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the Auburn game with a 26-6 overall mark and a 12-6 SEC record under Les Miles in games played in Tiger Stadium. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama last year.

## Miles 8-6 Against Top 10 Teams; 17-9 vs. Top 25 Opponents

With the loss to Florida, LSU coach Les Miles is now 17-9 vs. top 25 opponents at LSU. Miles is also 8-6 against top 10 foes. LSU is 1-1 vs. Top 25 teams this year. Miles and the Tigers won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. ## Miles Moves Past Dietzel As Fourth-Winningest Coach In LSU History; Saban Next

With the win over Georgia, LSU coach Les Miles won his 47th game (58 tries), which moved him out of a tie with Paul Dietzel and into sole possession as the fourth-winningest coach in school history. Miles' 47 victories came faster than any other coach at the school, a list that includes the top four winningest coaches at the school - Nick Saban (47 in 62 games), Charles McClendon (47 in 68 games), Bernie Moore (46 in 72 games) and Dietzel (46 in 73 games). Miles needs just one win to tie Saban for third place on the LSU all-time wins list. Saban posted a 48-16 mark in five years (2000-04) with the Tigers.

## Tigers Entered October Ranked In Top 10 For Fifth Straight Year

LSU entered the month of October ranked in the top 10 for the fifth straight year dating back to the 2005 season. LSU was ranked No. 4 during the first AP Poll in October in 2005; No. 9 in the first AP Poll in October 2006; No. 1 in 2007 and No. 4 last year.

## LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 48 of the 59 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis earlier this decade, LSU has recorded a 48-11 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU is 3-1 this year as an AP Top 10 with wins over UL-Lafayette, Mississippi State, and Georgia and the loss coming to Florida.

### Tiger Defense Has Goalline Stands in Back-to-Back Games; Almost Had A Third Against UGA

LSU came within one play of having a goalline stand in three straight games. However, Georgia successfully executed a 1-yard TD pass on fourth down against the Tigers last week. LSU went into the Georgia game having recorded a goalline stand in back-to-back games. Against Mississippi State, the Tiger defense turned back the Bulldogs at the goalline with just over a minute left in the game to preserve the victory. The Bulldogs had four shots at the Tigers, three coming at the 1-yard line, but LSU turned them away each time. The big plays came on third down when LSU safety **Chad Jones** tipped away a pass and then on fourth down when Jones stopped Mississippi State quarterback Tyson Lee just an inch shy of the endzone. A week earlier, UL-Lafayette was turned back after three tries from the 1-yard line. UL-Lafayette's last attempt from the 1-yard line resulted in a fumble, which was recovered by **Perry Riley**.

### LSU Defense Turned In Fine Outing In Win Over Georgia

LSU turned in an inspiring defensive effort "Between the Hedges". Sparked by Georgia natives **Perry Riley** and **Kelvin Sheppard**, the Tigers shutout one of the league's top offenses in their own stadium for three quarters. It represented the first time LSU blanked a ranked opponent on the road for the first three quarters since Nov. 6, 1993. That day Curley Hallman's Tigers stunned No. 5 Alabama in Bryant-Denny Stadium, 17-13. Alabama trailed 14-0 heading into the fourth quarter of that contest. Here are a few more notables on the Tiger defense from the win over Georgia:

- LSU held Georgia to just one first down and 49 total yards in the first half
- Georgia's 13 points were the fewest by a ranked opponent on the road since Auburn had 7 on Sept. 16, 2006.
- Georgia's 45 net rushing yards were the fewest by an SEC opponent since South Carolina had 39 last season. They were also the fewest rushing yards by a ranked opponent since Ole Miss has 27 on Nov. 22, 2003.

### Chad Jones 93-yard Punt Return Ranks Second In School History

**Chad Jones'** 93-yard punt return for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter against Mississippi State ranks as the second-longest punt return in school history. **Eddie Kennison** holds the school record with a 100-yard return against Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium in 1994. By returning a punt for a TD, LSU now has two punt returners on its roster - **Jones** and **Trindon Holliday** - who have returned at least one punt for a touchdown during their career.

### LSU Returns Another Interception For a Touchdown

LSU **CB Patrick Peterson** became the second Tiger to return an interception for a touchdown this year when he picked off a pass and returned it 37 yards for a first quarter score against Mississippi State. Peterson's interception came on Mississippi State's first offensive play from scrimmage. Linebacker **Jacob Cutrera** returned the other interception for a TD, taking a **Jake Locker** pass back 29-yards for a score in the first quarter against Washington in the season-opener.

### Brothers Jones and Alem Sparking Tiger Defense

You don't have to look any further than brothers **Chad Jones** and **Rahim Alem** (formerly Al Jones) to see who's been the key to LSU's success on defense this year. Alem is the unquestioned leader of the Tiger defensive front, while Jones is the quarterback in the secondary for the Tigers. Alem, a defensive end, leads the Tigers in both tackles for losses (4.5-19 yards) and sacks (2-12 yards), while Jones, the free safety, is first on the squad in interceptions (2) and he's fourth in total tackles (35).

### LSU's Best After Dark

Night games in Tiger Stadium seem to bring out the best in LSU. However, lately LSU has been at its best no matter the location just as long as it dark outside. Going into the Auburn game, LSU has won 26 of its last 28 night games (no matter the location). Note: NCAA determines that a kickoff at 5 p.m. or later is a night game. Last year, on Oct. 11 in Gainesville, Florida snapped LSU's streak of consecutive night wins at 19. Prior to the Florida game on Oct. 11, 2008, LSU hadn't lost a night game since a 34-14 loss to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game in 2005. Overall, LSU coach **Les Miles** has guided the Tigers to a 32-4 mark in night games.

### Jefferson Off To Fast Start

LSU sophomore QB **Jordan Jefferson** has performed well in the first six games of the season as he's connected on 91-of-145 passes for 1,016 yards, 7 TDs and just three interceptions. Jefferson has also added 106 rushing yards. Jefferson is now 6-2 as LSU's starting quarterback. The following is a look at some of Jefferson's accomplishments during his young career:

- Opened 2009 by completing 31 passes in his first two games, which were the most by an LSU quarterback since **Rohan Davey** completed 32 passes in the first two games of the 2002 season.
- Opened 2009 by throwing 3 TD passes in the win over Washington and by doing so, he joined **JaMarcus Russell** (2006 vs. UL-Lafayette), **Matt Mauck** (2003 vs. UL-Monroe) and **Davey** (2000 vs. Western Carolina) as the only quarterbacks who have tossed 3 TDs in a season opener for the Tigers in the modern (SEC) era.
- Ran his streak of passes without an interception to 100 before throwing a pick against UL-Lafayette.

### LaFell Moving Up The LSU Career Record Books

Senior WR **Brandon LaFell** continues to make an impact in the LSU career record books. LaFell, who opted to return for his senior season, leads the Tigers in receptions (27), and touchdowns (5) and he's second in receiving yards (326). LaFell goes into the Auburn game ranked No. 8 in school history in career receptions (145) and he's No. 7 in receiving yards (2,141). **Wendell Davis** holds the school record for career receptions with 183, while **Josh Reed** is the record holder in receiving yards with 3,001.

### Shepard Makes The Most Of His Touches

LSU QB **Russell Shepard** makes the most of his touches as he's averaging 5.9 yards every time he gets his hand on the football. Shepard, who has lined up at quarterback, running back and receiver for the Tigers, had rushed for 106 yards on 17 carries (6.2 avg.) and he's caught one pass for a 6-yard gain. Shepard led the Tigers in rushing against Mississippi State with 26 yards on four carries (all in the first half) and he was second on the squad in rushing against Georgia with 32 yards on six attempts.



## Jefferson Youngest Starting QB In SEC; Youngest LSU QB To Start Season-Opener Since 1945

LSU's Jordan Jefferson is the youngest starting quarterback in the SEC. Jefferson, who has five career starts to his credit, was 19 years and 11 days old when he took the first snap against Washington. Jefferson was the youngest quarterback to start a season-opener for the Tigers since Y.A. Tittle in 1945. That year, Tittle was 18 years, 11 months and 6 days when LSU opened the season against Rice. Here's a look at some of the younger quarterbacks who started season-openers at LSU:

In 58 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to figure when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 43-5 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 30-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 29-0. ## A Unique Situation At Left Tackle - 2 Players Have Accounted For Last 98 Starts

Starting left tackle Ciron Black goes into the Auburn game having started 46 straight games, all coming at left tackle. Since the start of the 2002 season, a stretch that spans 98 games, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Black and Andrew Whitworth. Whitworth, now a starting tackle for the Cincinnati Bengals, set an LSU record by starting 52 straight games for the Tigers from 2002-05. Black then picked up where Whitworth left off, starting the next 46 games at that position for the Tigers. Black's 46 straight starts ranks as the second-longest active streak in college football.

On the contrary, the Tigers are just 4-7 under Les Miles when failing to reach the 100-yard mark in net rushing yards ... The Tigers are 34-3 when leading after the first quarter with the only losses during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005, Arkansas in 2007, and Alabama in 2008 - all three of which were overtime losses ... LSU is 45-7 when scoring 20 or more points and 37-5 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 30-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, while the record goes to 16-8 under Miles when allowing opponents to go over the 100-yard mark.

## Two Brothers Start For Tigers On Defense -- Alem and Jones

LSU had two brothers starting on defense against Washington in the season-opener as DE Rahim Alem (formerly Al Jones) and FS Chad Jones both started. It is the first time brothers started in the same game for the Tigers since 2005 when FB Kevin Steltz and S Craig Steltz both started in a win over Appalachian State.

## LSU Leads Nation With 21 Straight Non-Conference Wins

With its win over UL-Lafayette, LSU has now won 21 straight non-conference games, a streak that dates back to the start of the 2005 season. LSU coach **Les Miles** is a perfect 21-0 in non-conference games at LSU. The 21-game non-conference win streak ranks first nationally. LSU's last non-conference loss came during the 2004 season when Iowa scored on the final play of the game to beat LSU, 30-25, in the Capital One Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference contest since dropping a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in the 2002 season opener.

## An Offseason of National Championships for Chad Jones and Trindon Holliday

Free safety **Chad Jones** and running back/return specialist **Trindon Holliday** became national champions during the football off-season. Jones was an outfielder and key relief pitcher for LSU's 2009 College World Series champion baseball team. Jones maintained a 2.70 ERA in 6.2 innings pitched while walking three and striking out seven. He tossed three innings and did not allow a run or a hit in three appearances at the College World Series, which earned him the nickname "Dreadlocks of Doom". Jones came on in relief of starter Anthony Ranaudo in the deciding Game 3 of the CWS Championship Series against Texas and was brilliant. He did not allow a run in 1.2 innings of work while walking none and striking out two. Prior to spring football practice, Jones played in the outfield and batted .343 (12-for-35) with a homer, six RBI and eight runs scored. Along with former WR Jared Mitchell, Jones and he became just the second and third athletes in school history to win national titles in multiple team sports. Both were members of the 2007 BCS national championship team. Holliday, meanwhile, became the 100-meter dash national champion at the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. Holliday clocked 10.00 in the national final of the 100-meter to claim the title. The time was the fastest of any player in the history of college football.

### Game 1 Notes vs. Washington

- LSU ran just 48 offensive plays in the season-opener against Washington. The 48 offensive plays were the fewest by an LSU team since the 1965 season when the Tigers mustered just 45 snaps in a 23-0 loss to Ole Miss on Oct. 30. LSU, 5-1 and ranked No. 5 in the nation at the time, managed just 52 yards of offense that day against the Rebels.
- LSU LB **Jacob Cutrera** intercepted a pass on his first play (Washington's first play of second drive) and returned it 29 yards for a TD. Cutrera became the first LSU player to return an interception for a TD since CB Jonathan Zenon did it against Tennessee in the 2007 SEC Championship Game. He's the first linebacker to do it since Kenny Hollis scored on a 3-yard interception return against Tennessee in 2005.

### Game 2 Notes vs. Vanderbilt

- LSU senior **Rahim Alem** was named defensive player of the week in the SEC for his play in the Tigers' 23-9 win over Vanderbilt. Alem recorded a career-best seven tackles, a sack and a pass breakup in the victory.

### Game 3 Notes vs. UL-Lafayette

- LSU stretched its non-conference winning streak to a nation's best 21 straight
- FS **Chad Jones** became the first Tiger to intercept two passes in a game since **Chris Hawkins** did it against Auburn in 2008
- LSU ran its streak of not allowing a TD to six consecutive quarters.

### Game 4 Notes vs. Mississippi State

- **Chad Jones** returned a fourth quarter punt 93 yards for a TD. The 93-yard punt return ranks as the second-longest in school history.
- For the second straight week, LSU's defense had a goalline stand - this time coming with just over a minute left in the contest, which preserved the Tiger victory.
- LSU CB **Patrick Peterson** returned an interception 37 yards for a touchdown on Mississippi State's first offensive play.

### The LSU-Auburn Series

LSU and Auburn face each other for the 44th time with LSU holding a 23-19-1 lead in the series ... The teams have met every year since the SEC expansion in 1992 (17 games) with Auburn holding a 9-8 advantage in those games ... Prior to 1992, the teams played only eight games from 1969 to 1989 ... Prior to last year, and dating back to 2000, the home team in the series had won every game between the teams ... LSU snapped that streak last year with a 26-21 win at Auburn ... Between 1996-99, the visiting team won each game ... The winner of the LSU-Auburn game has gone on to win the SEC Western Division in six of the last nine years (exceptions came in 2002, 2006, and 2008) ... ## Lee Comes Off Bench To Lead Tigers Past Auburn, 26-21

Jarrett Lee replaced an injured Andrew Hatch and rallied LSU from a 14-3 halftime deficit by throwing a pair of second half TDs in the Tigers 26-21 win over No. 9/10 Auburn. It was the first win by LSU at Auburn since 1998. LSU grabbed the early lead in the contest, taking a 3-0 advantage on a 46-yard field goal by Colt David late in the first quarter. That lead was short lived as Auburn responded with 14 unanswered points in the second quarter, which included a 24-yard interception return of a Lee pass for a TD by Gabe McKenzie, stretching the margin to 14-3 at halftime. LSU starting QB Hatch went down midway through the third quarter with a head injury and was not able to return, setting up the dramatic turn of events, engineered by Lee, a redshirt freshman. Lee put his first half jitters behind him to light up the Auburn secondary over the final 22 minutes of the contest as he completed 11 of 17 attempts during that span for 182 yards and two scores. Lee connected with Chris Mitchell on a 39-yard TD pass to pull the Tigers to 14-10 at the 6:28 mark in the third quarter. LSU took a 17-14 lead on the final play of the third quarter when RB Keiland Williams threw a halfback pass for a TD to Demetrius Byrd. LSU extended the lead to 20-14 on a 32-yard field goal by David with 8:27 to go. Auburn regained the lead at 21-20 with 6:40 left setting up yet another fourth quarter comeback by LSU. After a stop by the LSU defense on Auburn's next possession, Lee and the LSU offense took over at the four minute mark. Lee guided LSU on a seven-play, 54-yard game-winning drive, capped when he connected with Brandon LaFell on an 18-yard TD pass. RB Charles Scott led the Tigers ground game with 132 yards rushing, while LaFell caught four passes for 92 yards and a score.

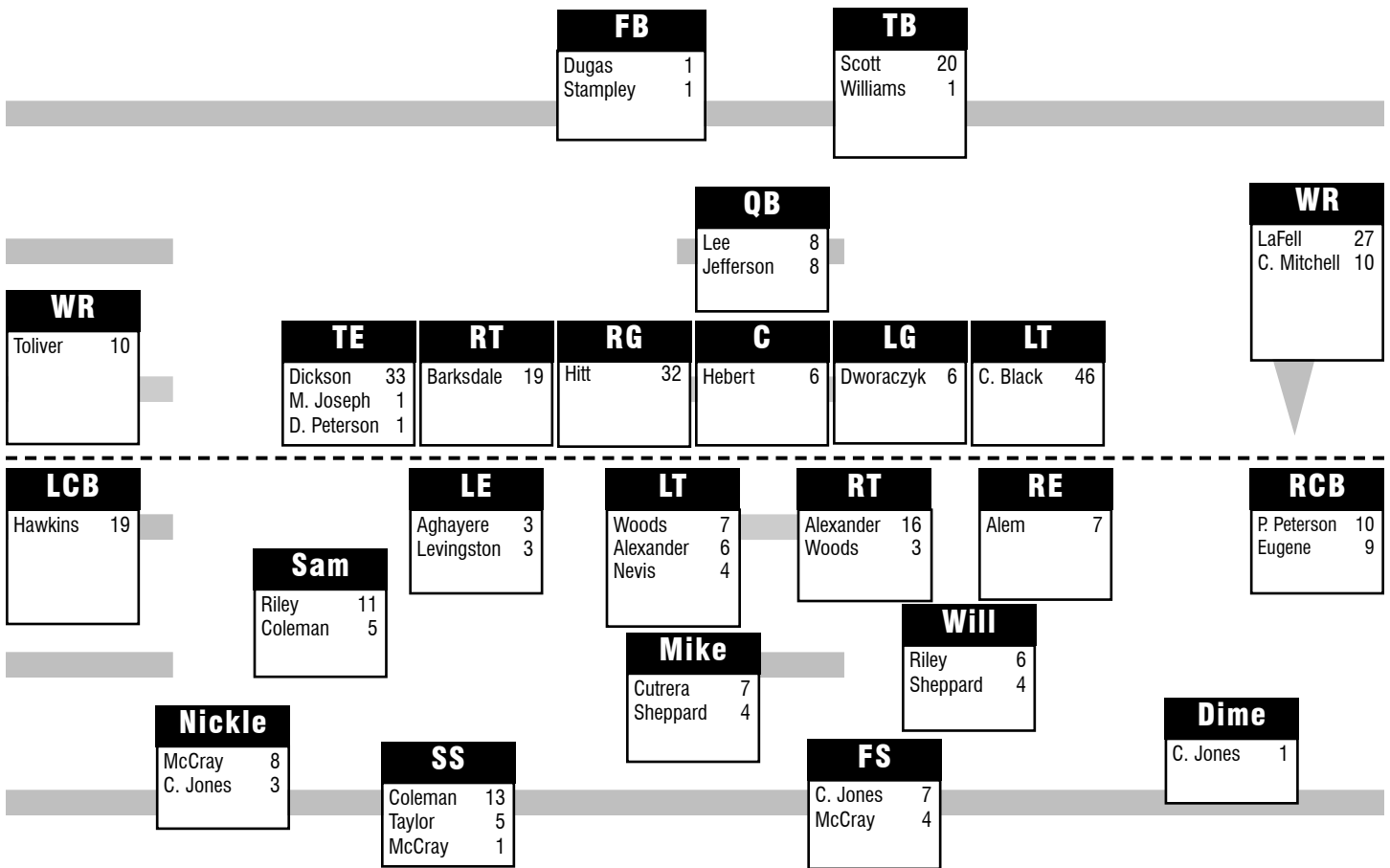

**Tigers Open Season With 31-23 Win Over Washington**

Jordan Jefferson threw for 172 yards and 3 touchdowns as he helped lead the No. 9/11 Tigers to a hard-fought 31-23 non-conference win over Washington in Seattle to open the 2009 campaign. LSU spotted the Huskies an early first quarter TD when UW went 85 yards on 10 plays to take a 7-0 advantage over the Tigers. LSU responded with a 24-yard field goal at the 6:03 mark. The Tigers took their first lead 14 seconds later when **Jacob Cutrera** returned an interception 29 yards for a score giving LSU a 10-7 advantage. The Huskies tied the game at 10-10 early in the second quarter before the Tigers took the lead for good on a 45-yard pass from Jefferson to **Terrance Toliver** at the 1:15 mark. UW added a field goal as time expired in the first half. Jefferson and Toliver hooked up for another score in the third quarter, this time a 39-yarder, as LSU stretched the lead to 24-13. The Tigers increased their margin to 31-16 on a 6-yard TD pass from Jefferson to **Brandon LaFell**. The Huskies added a touchdown as time expired for the final margin. Washington out-gained LSU on offense, 478-321, as the Huskies ran 83 plays compared to just 48 for the Tigers. LSU rushed for 149 yards and added 172 through the air. Toliver had his best game in an LSU uniform with four receptions for 117 yards and two scores. **Charles Scott** rushed for 51 yards, while **Keiland Williams** added 51 and Jefferson 42 to pace the Tigers offense.

**Strong Defensive Effort and Efficient Offense Leads LSU Past Vanderbilt, 23-9**

Keiland Williams rushed for 71 yards and a pair of TDs and the LSU defense limited Vanderbilt to just 210 total yards as the Tigers opened conference play with a 23-9 win over the Commodores on a rainy night in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead on a 6-yard TD run by Williams late in the first quarter. LSU stretched the lead to 10-0 on a 32-yard field goal by **Josh Jasper** at the 10:22 mark in the second quarter. Vanderbilt responded with a 12-play, 80-yard drive to pull to within 10-7 on a 6-yard run by Larry Smith at the 7:20 mark in the second quarter. LSU need just over a minute to go 64 yards just before halftime as another Jasper field goal extended the lead to 13-7 at intermission. A third Jasper field goal stretched the margin to 16-7 midway through the third quarter. With the Tiger defense holding Vanderbilt in check, the LSU offense couldn't put the Commodores away though. An errant snap on a punt deep in LSU territory resulted in a safety for Vanderbilt, pulling the Commodores to within 16-9 with 1:35 to go in the third quarter. LSU's defense stepped up again the fourth quarter, halting a Vanderbilt drive at the LSU 23-yard line on an interception by **Brandon Taylor**. LSU put the game away with a 7-play, 46-yard drive capped on a 14-yard TD run by Williams with 6:05 to play. **Jordan Jefferson** completed 20-of-29 passes for 138 yards, while **Charles Scott** added 49 yards on the ground for LSU. LaFell led all LSU receivers with 7 catches for 38 yards. **Harry Coleman** paced the defense with 10 tackles, while **Rahim Alem** added 7 tackles and a sack.

### Defense Leads Tigers Past UL-Lafayette, 31-3

Another solid defensive effort combined with a pair of touchdown receptions by **Brandon LaFell** helped lead LSU to a 31-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in Tiger Stadium. The win was the 21st straight non-conference win by the Tigers. LSU got on the board first, going 62 yards on six plays capped with a 16-yard TD pass from **Jordan Jefferson** to LaFell to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead at the 3:09 mark in the first quarter. Scott led the Tigers rushing attack with 63 yards and LaFell was tops in receiving with six catches for 68 yards and a pair of scores.

Chad Jones returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown to start the fourth quarter and a last-minute goalline stand by the LSU defense helped the Tigers hold off Mississippi State, 30-26, in Starkville. Patrick Peterson opened the scoring for the Tigers, returning an interception 37 yards on State's first offensive play to give LSU a 6-0 lead. Mississippi State responded on its next possession to take a 7-6 lead. LSU extended its lead on the first play of the third quarter when Jefferson connected with LaFell on a 58-yard TD pass to extend the lead to 23-14. The Bulldogs responded, going 73 yards on six plays to pull to within 23-21 on a 50-yard TD pass at the 6:33 mark. Jones' 93-yard punt return to open the fourth quarter gave the Tigers a 30-21 cushion. After a State field goal at the 10:13 mark pulled the Bulldogs to within 30-24, LSU's offense couldn't sustain drives on its next two possessions, opening the door for a Bulldogs possession that had State driving all the way to the Tiger 2-yard line with just over a minute left in the game. LSU's defense turned back State on four straight downs, including three from the 1-yard line, preserving the victory.

**Tigers Rally for Last-Minute Win Over Georgia, 20-13**

Charles Scott ran for a 33-yard TD with just over a minute left to lift LSU to a 20-13 comeback win over 18th-ranked Georgia. It was LSU's first win in Athens since the 1987 season. LSU's defense dominated the first three quarters of the contest as the Tigers took a 6-0 lead into the fourth quarter. Georgia took its first lead of the game at 7-6 less than a minute into the final quarter when Joe Cox hit Shaun Chapas with a 1-yard TD pass to cap an 18-play, 60-yard drive. The teams went back-and-forth for the next 11 minutes before Tigers cashed in on a 13-play, 88-yard drive capped on a 2-yard plunge by Scott at the 2:53 mark to regain the lead at 12-7. Georgia needed just a minute and 38 seconds to take back the lead, 13-12, this time on a 16-yard pass from Joe Cox to A.J. Green with 1:09 to play. An excessive celebration penalty combined with a 40-yard kickoff return by Trindon Holliday setup the game-winning score for the Tigers. Holliday's return gave the Tigers the ball at the UGA 38-yard line with just over a minute left. LSU needed just two plays - both rushes by Scott - to take the lead for good. Scott's 33-yard run proved to be the game-winner, giving the Tigers a 20-13 advantage with 46 seconds left. LSU linebacker Perry Riley clinched the win with an interception on Georgia's last possession. The fourth quarter scoring barrage came after both teams entered into a defensive battle - the Tigers winning the first half and Georgia the third quarter. LSU led 6-0 at halftime after holding the Bulldogs to just one first down and 49 total yards in the first half. Scott led the Tigers with 95 rushing yards and a pair of TDs, while QB Jordan Jefferson connected on 18-of-27 passes for 212 yards.

**Florida Defense Too Much For LSU As Tigers Fall To Top-Ranked Gators, 13-3**

LSU's defense limited the SEC's top offense to only 13 points and just 327 total yards, but it wasn't enough as top-ranked Florida stymied the Tiger offense in a 13-3 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU managed just a second quarter field goal - an 18-yarder by **Josh Jasper** - as the Tigers suffered their first loss in a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium since 2002. Florida never trailed in the contest, taking a 3-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 28-yard field goal by **Caleb Sturgis** at the 3:50 mark. The Tigers responded two drives later, going all the way to the Florida 2-yard line before settling for the Jasper field goal to tie the game at 3-3 with 5:16 to play in the first half. The Gators extended their lead to 10-3 just before halftime when **Tim Tebow** hit **Riley Cooper** on a 24-yard TD pass. After both teams went scoreless in the third quarter, Florida stretched the lead to 13-3 on a 32-yard field goal by **Sturgis** at the 7:27 mark. A **Jai Eugene** interception of a Tebow pass at the LSU 5-yard line with 4:55 left in the game, kept the Tigers' chances alive. However, LSU turned the ball over on downs on the ensuing possession and Florida was able to run out the clock for the victory. **Charles Scott** led the Tigers with 53 yards rushing, while **Jordan Jefferson** connected on 11 of 17 passes for 96 yards and one interception. LSU managed just 162 total yards, including 44 in the second half, in the loss. Defensively, **Kelvin Sheppard** led the Tigers with 13 tackles, while **Perry Riley** and **Chad Jones** added 12 each.
