## CAREY FAGAN HEAD COACH



Hometown: North Canton, Ohio  
 High School: Hoover  
 Alma Mater: Penn State, 1998 (B.A. in media studies and speech communications)

Gymnastics Career: While at Penn State, Fagan was a three-year letterwinner, serving as captain her senior year in 1998. During her collegiate career, the Nittany Lions were consistently ranked in the Top 10. She was the recipient of the "Penn State Pride" award in 1996 and 1998 for outstanding team leadership and also was a member of the "Spirit of the Lion" Academic/Athletic Honor Society in 1998 for excellence in the classroom and in the gym.

Away from Gymnastics: Carey enjoys running, shopping, spending time with her family and playing with their dog, Eddie.

The Ohio State women's gymnastics program continues to climb up the rankings under the leadership of Carey Fagan. Entering her 13th season at the helm in 2016, Fagan has produced five of the eight All-Americans in the program's history, and led the Buckeyes to the NCAA National Championships for the first time in 23 years in 2012.

With Fagan as an assistant coach in 2003-04, the Buckeyes finished with an average team score that ranked No. 42 in the nation. In 2004-05, her first season as head coach, that ranking rose to No. 38, then the Buckeyes upped their position to No. 27 and qualified for the NCAA regional championships in 2006. Fagan earned her first Big Ten Coach of the Year award in 2007 and led the Buckeyes into the Top 20 at No. 19 before tying for 18th in 2008. The 2009 squad continued the growing trend, posting four team totals that ranked in the Top 10 all-time Ohio State scores, including the fourth-best mark. Rebecca Best became the sixth Buckeye All-American and Taylor Jones was named Big Ten Rookie of the Year, the second in OSU history. With a 195.735 regional qualifying score, the Buckeyes finished ranked in the nation's Top 15 - a feat unmatched by an Ohio State squad in over a decade. For her team's success, Fagan was recognized as the 2009 Central Region Coach of the Year, her first career regional coaching laurel.

In 2011, Fagan picked up her second Big Ten Coach of the Year honor and guided the Buckeyes to their sixth-consecutive NCAA regional appearance, missing the NCAA Championships by one-tenth of a point. Fagan helped guide Sarah Miller to 2011 Big Ten Freshman of the Year laurels and first team All-Big Ten honors along with Colleen Dean.

The 2012 season saw Fagan named the first NACGC/W National Coach of the Year in program history after guiding the Buckeyes to a 10th-place NCAA finish. Under Fagan's direction, Sarah Miller and Colleen Dean were named second team All-Americans and Miller garnered first team All-Big Ten honors for the second-consecutive season. The Buckeyes set a program-record team score 197.625 in a dual meet win against Denver as 14 individual career highs were set. In addition, Ohio State almost knocked off perennial power and No. 2 Oklahoma on Senior Day in Columbus, falling 196.825-196.700.

In 2013, Ohio State notched a fourth-place finish at NCAA Regionals and saw Miller earn first team All-Big Ten honors and Aly Marohn and Melanie Shaffer garner second team laurels. Miller and Marohn each tied for the Big Ten Championship on balance beam and Miller and Shaffer went on to compete at the NCAA Championships in Los Angeles, Calif.

The 2014 season was another success as Ohio State finished fourth at the NCAA Athens Regional. Miller and Shaffer were named first team All-Big Ten while Victoria Aepli was a second team All-Big Ten pick.

In 2015, Ohio State once again advanced to an NCAA Regional as freshman Alexis Mattern garnered second team All-Big Ten honors and another freshman, Taylor Harrison, competed as an individual at the NCAA Championships after posting a fourth-place all-around finish at the NCAA Columbus Regional.

Last season, Fagan's 14th year overall in Columbus - the first two as an assistant coach and now 12 as head coach, Ohio State advanced to the NCAA Minneapolis Regional while Kaitlyn Hofland, Mattern and Jamie Stone garnered second team All-Big Ten honors.

"My coaching philosophy has always been to train the individual, not the team," Fagan said. "I believe each athlete has individual needs and my role as a coach is to figure out what each person needs to be successful and to implement workouts and training techniques to help each team member reach her full potential. In the sport of gymnastics, self confidence is critical for successful performance. I really focus on building confidence in my student-athletes so that when it comes time to perform, they know they are ready to compete."

At Ohio State, Fagan has coached two student-athletes to back-to-back All-America honors. In 2009, Rebecca Best received the national laurel on floor as a sophomore after traveling to the NCAA championships as an alternate her first season. In 2008, Kaylan Clevinger (2006-08) earned All-America honors on the uneven bars, becoming the first Buckeye to earn the accolade since 1999. Clevinger made two national appearances on bars (2007 and 2008) and earned All-Big Ten honors in the same years.

A 1994 graduate of Hoover High School in North Canton, Ohio, Fagan graduated from Penn State in 1998 with a Bachelor of Arts in speech communication and a Bachelor of Arts in media studies and also was a full-scholarship gymnast at Penn State. The Nittany Lions won the NCAA Northeast Regional championship all four years of Fagan's career (1995-98) and also qualified each year to the NCAA national championships.

While at Penn State, Fagan was a three-year letterwinner, serving as captain her senior year in 1998. She was only able to compete for three seasons of her eligibility at Penn State because of a severe leg fracture at the end of her sophomore season. Fagan returned to competition during her senior year after undergoing three surgeries and was able to compete on the uneven bars, helping the team to a Top 10 finish at the NCAA national championships in 1998.

Fagan was the recipient of the "Penn State Pride" award in 1996 and 1998 for outstanding team leadership and also was a member of the "Spirit of the Lion" Academic/Athletic Honor Society in 1998 for excellence in the classroom and in the gym. Additionally, Fagan was honored by the University with the establishment of the "Carey Hoyt Perseverance Award," which is given to athletes who overcome injuries and obstacles to return to competition and contribute to the team's success.

Prior to attending Penn State, Fagan competed at the senior elite level at the Parkette National Training Center. She also was a member of the Junior Olympic National Team and a member of the Region 5 National Team in 1994.

Fagan came to Ohio State in 2001 to join the OSU coaching staff as an assistant coach under the direction of Larry Cox. When Cox stepped down following the 2003-04 season, it was Fagan who was handed the reigns of the Ohio State program. Fagan began her coaching career as an undergraduate assistant at Penn State. After graduation from Penn State in 1998, Fagan landed a corporate marketing job in Albuquerque, N.M., with a large commercial real estate firm. In addition to this position, Fagan also coached gymnastics part-time in the evenings.

Fagan resides in Dublin with her husband, Ryan, and 14-year-old son, Brady.

## HALL OF FAME

### TRACY RINKER, 1981-84

While at Ohio State, Tracey Rinker won four Big Ten individual championships and led the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten titles. She won the all-around, balance beam and uneven bars in the 1983 Big Ten Championships and repeated on the uneven bars in 1984. She won All-America honors in 1983 when she finished second at the NCAA's on the uneven bars. Rinker was a member of three consecutive regional championship teams from 1982 to 1984.

Inducted in 1998

### DONNA SILBER, 1978-81

Donna Silber won a total of ten Big Ten Championships as a Buckeye. She won on the floor exercise, vault, balance beam and uneven bars. Silber-Berry won the all-around event three times. She was a three-time OAISW all-around champion and the 1980 MAIAW vaulting champion. A two-time OSU Scholar Athlete, Silber won the all-around competition against the Korean National Gymnastics Team her junior year.

Inducted in 1994

### JULIE SOMERS, 1986-89

Julie Somers dominated the Big Ten on vault, winning the league title in 1986, '87 and '88. In 1987, Somers earned the sports' highest honor, becoming an All-American on vault and was voted the team's Most Valuable Gymnast in 1987. She received Senior Regional Gymnast of the Year honors in 1989 and was also named a Big Ten Medal of Honor finalist. Somers ended her career as a three-time Ann Carr Award winner and Academic All-Big Ten selection.

Inducted in 2003

### LINDSEY VAGEDES, 1998-01

A three-time NCAA qualifier, Lindsey Vagedes earned two All-America honors in 1999, placing in the all-around and on vault to become the first Buckeye gymnast to earn the distinction on two events. She captured three Big Ten titles during her four-year career, winning vault titles in both 1998 and '99 and taking the balance beam crown in 1999. Vagedes left Ohio State as a four-time All-Big Ten selection, a feat just three other Buckeyes had done before.

## ALL-AMERICANS

### KATHY TEMPLE

Kathy Temple became Ohio State's first All-American gymnast when she earned the honor in the all-around in 1982. A four-time letterwinner from West Bloomfield, Mich., Temple was just a freshman when she rose to All-America status. She took eighth place in the all-around (35.80) at the 1982 AIAW Championship and also placed 10th on balance beam and 12th on floor exercise. A winner of five individual events during the season, Temple led the Buckeyes to a fifth-place finish at the 1982 AIAW Championship.

### TRACY RINKER

After Temple's All-America status in 1982, Tracy Rinker notched the same distinction in 1983 when she took home All-America laurels on the uneven bars. Rinker registered a 9.40 on uneven bars at the 1983 NCAA Championship, earning national runner-up honors. She also tied for 18th place in the all-around (36.10) at the NCAA meet. Rinker's NCAA success came just after she blitzed the Big Ten Championship record book, shattering records in the all-around, balance beam and uneven bars as she led the Buckeyes to the school's first Big Ten crown.

### JULIE SOMERS

Julie Somers became Ohio State's first All-American on vault in 1987. Like Rinker, she garnered runner-up laurels at the NCAA Championship after tallying a 9.475 on vault. Somers also was a key figure in OSU's run to the Big Ten title in 1987, the fifth consecutive for the Buckeyes. She also led the Buckeyes to an eighth-place finish at the NCAA.

### LINDSEY VAGEDES

After over a decade without an All-American, Ohio State in 1999 when Lindsey Vagedes claimed the distinction in two categories – vault and all-around – as she became the first Buckeye gymnast to reach the All-America plateau in two events. The Buckeye sophomore from Warrenville, Ill., missed by just 25 hundredths of a point of becoming OSU's first-ever three-event All-American as she fell just short on balance beam. Vagedes took 10th place on vault (9.65), and recorded a 39.1 in the all-around to garner second-team All-America status.

### KAYLAN CLEVINGER

In her second-consecutive national appearance in 2008, Kaylan Clevinger was named second-team All-American with a near-perfect 9.90 score on bars. Clevinger is only the fifth Buckeye gymnast to claim All-American honors and the first since Vagedes in 1999. Clevinger tied for fifth-place on bars in session one of her all-around competition. The 9.90 mark on bars increased Clevinger's all-around total to a 38.900, which placed 15th overall.

### REBECCA BEST

After traveling to the national championships as an alternate her freshman season, Rebecca Best made the most of her second trip, collecting second-team All-America honors on floor in 2009. Best, just the sixth Buckeye to receive the national distinction, earned a sixth-place finish on floor with a score of 9.850 en route to posting a career-high tying 39.050 in the all-around to finish 18th.

### COLLEEN DEAN

In the Buckeyes' first team trip to NCAA Nationals since 1990, Colleen Dean garnered second team All-America honors in 2012 on floor exercise after tallying a 9.850 on the event. The junior finished tied for eighth in the second session of NCAA Championships and joined Sarah Miller to become the first duo of Buckeye gymnasts to garner All-America honors in the same season.

### SARAH MILLER

Sarah Miller was named a second team All-American on both beam and floor exercise in 2012. The sophomore posted a 9.900 on beam and a 9.850 on floor exercise to finish tied for sixth and tied for eighth, respectively, in the second session. The two-time first team All-Big Ten selection also was named to the Big Ten All-Championships team after tying for third on balance beam and fourth on floor exercise in Iowa City, Iowa. Miller followed her strong 2012 campaign with an effort in 2013 that produced an NACGC/W first team regular season All-America honor.
