SAC TIES UNM, UNLV TIES SJSU – SPARTANS STAY ATOP MPSF

With one weekend of MPSF play remaining, SAN JOSE STATE is atop the MPSF. However, the Spartans must win at SACRAMENTO STATE on Sunday and AIR FORCE and NEW MEXICO must avoid a draw in their match-up, also on Sunday, to grab the Federation's automatic qualifier into the NCAA tournament. If both Air Force and San Jose State win out this weekend, MPSF tiebreakers involving goal differential and scoring within the conference will be invoked. If New Mexico beats Air Force and San Jose State loses to Sacramento State, the Lobo's will get the AQ... San Jose State lost in their MPSF rematch to New Mexico 3-1 at Spartan Stadium on Friday before tying UNLV 2-2 on Sunday. Senior forward **Johnny Gonzalez** provided all of SJSU's vs. UNLV scoring with two goals in the first-half... No. 2 New Mexico traveled to Northern California to beat the Spartans before tying Sacramento State 1-1 in the Capitol City on Sunday. Freshman forward **Brandon Barklage** scored his first career goal against SJSU to open the Lobos' scoring. Senior forward **Jeff Rowland** nailed his 13th goal to notch the win... Air Force shutout Denver 2-0 at the Academy on Sunday with goal keeper **Brian Guyette** recording eight saves, all in the second-half to post his fourth shutout of the year; tied for second in the MPSF. The Falcons travel to UNLV on Friday before a must-win match at New Mexico on Sunday to end the regular season for both teams... Sacramento State beat UNLV 2-1 in overtime before tying New Mexico 1-1 after two overtime periods on Sunday. The Hornets' offense was led by junior forward **Eliot Ricks-Chambers** who posted his first goal of the season to tie UNLV and also notched the tying goal against the Lobos on Sunday. Sac State hosts San Jose State in the spoiler role on Sunday... Denver continued its slide with a 2-0 shutout by Air Force and hopes to end their season on a positive note when they visit New Mexico on Friday and UNLV on Sunday... UNLV tied MPSF leader San Jose State 2-2 in double overtime Sunday after scoring twice and shutting out the Spartans in the second-half. As Coach Barto put it, "The tie got us off the schvide (sp)," to close out the Rebels 12-game losing streak dating back to September 16. Junior **Martin Kenny** opened the scoring for the Rebs with senior forward **Rod Dyachenko** scored his eighth goal of the season to gain the tie. UNLV will face Air Force and Denver at home this weekend and will play the spoiler against the Falcons' bid to win the conference AQ.

GUYETTE, RICKS-CHAMBERS SHARE BRINE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Woodland, Calif. – AIR FORCE sophomore goalkeeper **Brian Guyette** (Phoenix, AZ; Brophy Prep HS) and SACRAMENTO STATE junior forward **Eliot Ricks-Chambers** (Sacramento, CA; Cosumnes River JC) were honored for their outstanding contributions in leading their teams in conference play this past weekend. Guyette made eight saves, all in the second half, to lead Air Force to a 2-0 victory over Denver on Sunday to keep the Falcons in the running for the conference title. Guyette posted his fourth shutout of the season and upped his league-leading saves per game average to 5.9... Ricks-Chambers scored twice in two games for the Hornets. His first score of the season was the game-tying goal on Friday to help set-up the 2-1 win over UNLV, before netting Sac State's only goal in the 1-1 double-overtime draw against No. 2 New Mexico on Sunday.
