LOBOS TURN IN ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SEASON

No. 12 New Mexico had its memorable 2006 season come to an end as it fell to No. 13 national seed California 3-1 Wednesday (Nov. 15) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. With the Bears ahead 3-0, junior **Blake Danaher's** second goal of the season put the Lobos on the scoreboard in the 82nd minute, assisted by junior **Joey Vitagliano**, his second of the tournament and his third of the season. The trip to Berkeley marked the third consecutive season UNM had advanced to at least the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Down three points in the standings entering the final weekend of the season, New Mexico (14-4-3 overall/8-1-1 MPSF) came back to steal its third straight MPSF Championship and a conference record fifth overall, while placing an all-time program-best 11 players on the 2006 All-Conference list. Senior defender **Andrew Boyens** was named MPSF Player of the Year for the second time, finishing with seven points (2G/3A) and leading a dominant backline that ranked No. 6 nationally in goals against average and 12th in shutout percentage following the NCAA first round. Junior first-team All-MPSF goalkeeper **Mike Graczyk** finished the season with 11 shutouts and a 0.64 goals against average, both tops in the conference. Sophomore second-team honoree **Chris Wright** led the offense this year with 15 points (6G/3A), ranking in the top-five amongst all MPSF players in goals per game (0.29) and points per game (0.71)...
