MPSF GYMNAST OF THE WEEK

March 26---Greg Stine, JR, Air Force (Houston, TX), won 3 USA Gymnastics national titles in Williamsburg, VA. He was named USAG All-American honoree in 4 events. Placed 1st in all-around team competition (49.550), and 1st in individual finals on floor (9.3) and rings (9.3). Became 1st Falcon to win 3 USAG national titles in a single meet....also was 4th on pommel horse (7.6) and high bar (8.45)....

#3 OKLAHOMA, 11-2: No. 3 Oklahoma cruised past No. 9 Iowa March 17 in Norman in the Sooners' final regular season meet, 220.500-209.800. The total team score for OU was a season-best. National all-around leader **Jonathan Horton** claimed three more event titles, taking the still rings (9.75), parallel bars (9.4) and vault (9.3). **Chris Brooks** shared the floor title (9.5), while **Kyle McNamara** won the high bar crown with a career-mark (9.5). **Jason Loughton** posted two career-highs, on the parallel bars (9.2) and high bar (9.45). **Ian Jackson** had a career-best on the floor (9.2). Senior **Brian Carr**, competing in his final home meet, tied for second on the pommel horse (8.85) and placed third on the high bar matching a career-high (9.25). OU also set a team season-high on the horse (35.200). The Sooners now prepare for the MPSF Championship meet Saturday, March 31, in Berkeley. Seven of the eight conference titles all-time belong to Oklahoma.....

#4 STANFORD, 11-2: The fourth-ranked Cardinal were impressive in their final regular season meet with wins over No. 2 Penn State and No. 9 Iowa March 10 in Palo Alto (216.700-214.800-204.750). **David Sender** grabbed an all-around title (55.55), winning the floor (9.60) and vault (9.20) and placing second on the rings (9.60) along the way. This week's national all-around leader also turned in two other events with a score of better than 9.0, on the high bar (9.25) and parallel bars (9.05). **Alex Schorsch** recorded a meet-best score on the rings (9.65). NCAA high bar champion **Dylan Carney** nailed a top-score in that event (9.70). Stanford competes at the MPSF Championships Saturday, March 31, in Berkeley....

#8 CALIFORNIA, 6-5: The No. 8 Bears had their scheduled meet at No. 2 Penn State canceled March 17 due to bad weather back east, causing travel problems. March 10, Cal stunned third-ranked Ohio State in Berkeley (213.00-212.30). Cal won the high bar and still rings events in its final home dual meet of the season. Defending pommel horse national champion **Tim McNeil** posted two career-high marks, on the horse and rings, earning a 9.65 in both events. He now ranks as the nation's leader on both the horse and bars and is seventh on the rings. Other career-marks in the upset win for the Bears belonged to **Kyson Bunthuwong** on the rings (8.80), **Kyle Litow** on the floor (9.050), and **Sean Bryan** on the parallel bars (9.050). Cal hosts the MPSF Championships Saturday (Mar. 31) at 7 pm. The Bears were last crowned MPSF champions in 2004, the only year Oklahoma did not win the meet....

#10 NEBRASKA, 3-9: No. 10 Nebraska turned in a solid meet on senior day March 17 in Lincoln with a 207.750-190.100 victory over MPSF opponent and 16th-ranked Air Force. The Huskers set a season-high total score as they swept the top three marks in four of six events along the way. In his final meet in Lincoln, senior **Jason Wassung** captured his fifth all-around title of his career (52.40). He came in second on high bar (8.95), vault (8.9), and parallel bars (8.8), and third on rings (8.75). Junior **Stephen Tetrault** claimed titles on the vault (9.0) and high bar (9.05) while sophomore **T.J. Schmidt** did the same on the pommel horse (9.20) and parallel bars (9.25). Tetrault's all around third place tally of 52.00 was a season-best. Schmidt also registered a pair of runner-up results on the floor (8.85) and the rings (8.9). The huskers now prepare for the MPSF Championships, March 31 in Berkeley....

#16 AIR FORCE ACADEMY, 3-14: The 16th-ranked Falcons competed at the 2007 USA Gymnastics Collegiate National Championships this past weekend at Williamsburg, VA. and scored a 191.300 to place third of six teams, as host William & Mary won the meet. Junior **Greg Stine** was the all-around national champion (49.550) for the second time in his career (2004). Freshman **Brennan Wolford** tied for fourth (45.900) and senior **Kurt Antonio** placed fifth (44.500). Sunday, several Falcons posted top-five results at the individual finals. Stine claimed event national titles on the floor (9.3) and the still rings (9.3), while also placing fourth on the pommel horse (7.6) and high bar (8.45). He became the first Falcon ever to win three USAG national titles. **Jacob Schonig** took third on the rings (8.8) while **Tyler Sickles** had the same placement on the high bar (8.5). **Brian Boardman** tied for fifth on the vault (7.9). Next up is the MPSF Championships in Berkeley Saturday night....
