MPSF UNBEATENS FACE OFF AS OREGON VISITS DENVER

NO. 16 DENVER (13-2 overall/3-0 MPSF) received at least one point from 15 different players Friday in a 20-7 MPSF home win over St. Mary's. The 20 goals tied for the sixth most in program history. DU jumped out to a 6-0 lead in the first 14 minutes, and led 11-3 at the half. The Pioneers scored seven unanswered goals in the second frame to lead by as many as 14. Senior **Kristie Leggio** tallied a game-high six points on four goals, all in the first half, along with two assists. She ranks 3rd in the NCAA and 1st in the MPSF in scoring. Freshman **Ali Flury** added a hat trick with one assist. Denver can clinch at least a share of the MPSF regular season title with a Saturday 1pm home win over Oregon. The Pioneers have won all three prior meetings vs. the Ducks.

OREGON (11-5 overall/4-0 MPSF) won a pair of conference road games over the weekend, 16-10 at California and 15-7 at St. Mary's. Tied at 3 in Berkeley, the Ducks rolled off six straight goals in the last 16 minutes of the first half and never again looked back. Juniors **Jana Bradley** and **Jen May** each tallied a hat trick. Sunday in Mora, UO raced out to a 9-0 lead over the Gaels in the first 22 minutes en route to the comfortable win. Bradley recorded another hat trick along with sophomore **Ilsa Van Den Berg's** game-high five points on three goals and two assists. The Ducks can win their first MPSF regular season title outright with a win Saturday (Apr. 21) at Denver....

CALIFORNIA (5-6 overall/1-1 MPSF) played Oregon evenly at 7-7 in the second half, but was unable to recover from a 9-3 halftime deficit in falling at home Saturday, 16-10, in MPSF action. Five Bears scored twice, though senior **Liz Reifsnnyder** led all players with four points on a pair of goals and assists. Senior goalkeeper **Hilary Lynch** picked up nine saves in 51 minutes. The Bears continue conference play at Bay Area Rival Stanford Saturday (Apr. 21) at 1 pm. In 2006, Cal won the regular season meeting in a 9-6 upset in Berkeley behind Reifsnnyder's hat trick....

STANFORD (4-7 overall/1-2 MPSF) had its lone scheduled game of the week at Cornell canceled due to bad weather. The Cardinal have four players who have collected at least 20 points on the season, freshman **Lauren Schmidt** and junior **Megan McClain** with 22 and senior **Liz Piselli** and junior **Daphne Patterson** with 20. Stanford hosts rival California Saturday at 1pm. In last year's MPSF semi-final, Patterson had a game-high seven points on five goals and two assists en route to a 17-6 win....

ST. MARY'S (3-10 overall/0-3 MPSF) dropped a 20-7 MPSF Friday road game at No. 17 Denver, as **Jackie Spencer** led the Gaels with a pair of goals. Six other players grabbed one point on the day. **Hilary Gardner** registered six saves in a complete game against the second best offense in the United States. SMC concludes the regular season at California Apr. 24 at 4pm and UC Davis Apr. 28 at 1 pm in conference action....

UC DAVIS (7-7 overall/0-3 MPSF) split in Ohio over the weekend, a 17-4 loss at Ohio State Friday followed by an 18-0 Sunday shutout over DIII program Wittenberg. Sunday, junior **Katie McGovern** posted nine points on three goals and a school record six assists. Senior **Megan O' Connor** also chipped in a hat trick. Junior **Hilary Harkins** only had to make five saves in a complete game. The Aggies host Stanford on Apr. 24 and visit St. Mary's on Apr. 28 in MPSF action to finish the regular season.....

OREGON'S BRADLEY NAMED MPSF PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Woodland, Calif. – Oregon junior **Jana Bradley** (Encinitas, CA) recorded two hat tricks this past weekend in MPSF competition on the road. The six goals accounts for one-third of her season total and one-fourth of her season points to date. Bradley's three goals in a 16-10 win Saturday in Berkeley were scored in rainy conditions, while the three goals the next day in a 15-7 win at St. Mary's helped keep the Ducks unbeaten in MPSF play with the opportunity to clinch their first outright regular season title....
